My Sheep Hear My Voice

"My sheep hear my voice, and I know them, and they follow me." (John 10:27). If we are .born of God, will we follow the crowd and go with the many? If we are born again of incorruptable seed, will we go any place that Christ would not go? Will we say because others do, so and so, I can do it? Will we quiet our conscience and do things that others do, just because we think that they are saints?

"Whosoever is born of God, doth not commit sin; for his seed remaineth in him: and he cannot sin, because he is born of God." (1 John 3:9). "Beingborn again, not of corruptible seed, but of incorruptible, by the word of God, which liveth and abideth forever." (1 Peter 1:2-3).

He said, "It is not so much you that wear them, but you fellowship those that do." How carefully we must walk lest we become partakers of other men's sins. We must walk carefully before our God, and not fellowship sinners, but reprove them with "thus saith the Lord." even though they claim to be saints in light. We must walk the Holy Way, and that way is not contrary to the word of God, though everybody else go astray. There is more danger of going astray when we see the Ministers and all those whom we have been taught to look up to, going with the throng, but if we stand alone with Jesus by our side we are safe and in His care, and we know His voice and a stranger will we not follow.

Keep close to God and live the word of God while we have life and breath and, can see and not be deceived and blinded by following the life of others and their teaching when they depart from the paths of right.

"My sheep hear my voice and they follow me, for they know his voice, and a stranger will they not follow, but will flee from him: for they know not the voice of strangers." (John 10: 4-5).

If we follow the crowd we will most likely go into error because Jesus never followed the crowd, but He always did what pleased the Father and we must do the same if we live the life of Christ while here below. Endowment of Power

I fear that there is a very great lack of understanding upon this all important question. I would say first of all, that the order to have this endowment, one must first be filled with the spirit and second, he must recognize his divine office and be holy yielded to Him. To speak of the Holy Ghost simply as an influence, or an it, is treating Him with the highest of ingratitude and irreverance. He the comforter, the Holy Ghost is the third person, in the trinity. His office in the great plan of redemption is co-equal with the Father and the Son. His first mission is to reprove or (convince) the world of sin. All the fine arguments and intellectual eloquence in preaching can never fill his place, in revival meetings. "Ye shall receive power after that the Holy Ghost is come upon you." The prophet Isa. 61: 1 says, "Concerning Christ's ministry, the spirit of the Lord God is upon me; because the Lord hath anointed me to preach." Also Jesus told the apostles to tarry at Jerusalem for this endowment. The evidence of their endowment was clearly seen on the day of Pentecost. And throughout their ministry the Holy Ghost working with them with signs following, first. He was in the apostles enabling them to witness for Jesus Christ. He also sent conviction home to the hearts, of wicked and ungodly men and caused them to cry out, "What shall we do to be saved?"

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Suva Fiji.-Dear Bro. Pruitt: It is a good thing to give thanks unto the Lord. We have often been grately blessed when we have had seasons of God's special dealings with us and other precious souls. I was greatly blessed to get your encouraging letter, also the two-dollars for the Lord's work here. Please give my best thanks to the dear saints, for their valuable help.

Since writing last I have had the privilege of haveing a free trip by the Governent's Boat Pioneer, to Makogai, the leper Island. The boat goes there twice a year, taking Ministers, relation and close friends to that Island to see the inmates, all have to take their own food along during the trip or pay for same. We left on May the 29th. at 10 p. m. and arrived at the Island May the 31st. at 7 a.m. The weather was all that could be desired, which gave me an opportunity to hold several open air meetings. They,in a very hearty way sang some of the old favorite hymns and listened to the message of Salvation. There were about thirteen different countries represented on the Island;

therefore many did not understand what was said. One Cook Islander expressed a desire to know more of God, so we knelt down in a lonely spot on the foot-path and prayed that light and liberty would be given. There are close on five-hundred lepers to be cared for, they have neat little places to live in, and very good attention is given. There are two Churches there one a Methodist and the other a Roman Catholic. The Island contains over 3,000 acres, plenty of food is grown on it. Amongst the different sights seen, one was a very sad one, namely two Europeans from New Zealand, who were blind, the leprosy got into their eyes and blinded them.

Yes, its very sad indeed to see people who have lost their natural eyesight by that terrible disease. But Oh, how much sader to see and know that there are millions who have lost their spiritual eyesight, blinded by the gods of this world. There are millions upon millions who have been blinded by sin and the powers of darkness so that they cannot see Jesus as the great Physician, who can open their eyes of understanding and bring light and liberty to their souls. May our hearts be touched more and more and let our prayer be like that of Elishas, "Lord, I pray thee open his eyes, that he may see."

After spending a pleasant time with the people, giving them some New Testaments, Pilgram's Progress, (Fijian) papers and tracts, which some friend helped me financially to do. We left there the same day at 3 p. m. for Levuka, reaching there a little after 5 p. m. The following day the Levuka people were taken to the Island whilst in Levuke. I held several cottage and open air meetings, which were much appreciated. The following morning June the 1st., we left at 6 a. m. arriving back to Suva at noon.

The Lord has blest our work in Suva, one young Indian boy Charlie, who has been listening to the gospel message given in the open air, found Jesus as his personal Saviour, born again and filled with the Holy Spirit. Charlie is only eighteen years of age. He speaks three different languages, therefore he is a great help, giving the message in Fiji to the Fijians. Both his father and mother have also come into the true light. His name is John, he preaches the gospel in Hindu and English. Sister John has started a Sunday school, truly our hearts have been made glad and we have every reason to say, Praise the Lord.

Two weeks ago Phillip Murry a half cast Fijian who has been attending our Bible class, expressed a desire to be baptized.

Last Sunday a week ago, we went to the Point Brighton Park, where Bro. Longley conducted a baptismal service, he baptized Phillip in the sea. May the same self-sacrificing spirit be in us, as was in the one who said, I must work the works of Him that sent me, while it is day, for the night cometh when no man can work.

Our Rights In The Gospel, Both Male And Female

Jesus the Son of God came to this world as a Savior, not only so, but as a Minister, or teacher we will say Minister, because he set the example for the Minister and he began to set the example when he went into the wilderness, and fasted forty days and forty nights. (Matt. 4: 1-11). He does not only, or did not set an example for ministers, but also for others.

Yes Jesus came as a Savior, to give Eternal Life to as many as would receive him; as we read in the first chapter of St. John. "But as many as received Him, to them gave he power to become the sons of God, even to them that believe on his name." "As thou

hast given him power over all flesh, that he should give Eternal Life to as many as thou hast given him." (St. John 17:2). God created man in the beginning, for the foundation of the human race. (Gen. 1: 26-27). God saw that man needed an help meet and He made a woman Gen. 2:18. And when the Savior came he called twelve men for the foundation of the Church, Matt. 10: 1. and when he had gathered to him the mate. rial, we find that he says I will build my Church, (Matt. 16:18) and then the Savior saw that they needed help meet and he called a woman, (John 4:16) this woman then left her water-pot and went her way into the city and said to the man. See (John 4:28). And the results were that many believed Ver. 39. Then after the resurrection; the very first one he appeared to was a woman and he sentea message by her, that was Mary, (Luke 24:10) the results was, Peter and others came to the grave. Ver. 12. When God made man he made both male and female, and when the Lord began his mission after he came here, he called into the ministry, both male and female. See (Acts 2: 17-18). Jesus the Savior had a company of both male and female and really of many women See (Matt. 27: 55-56) (Luke 8: 1-3-23:55-56-24:1-10) (Mark 15:40-41). Paul had companies of men and women. See (Acts 18: 18) (Rom. 16: 1-15). Aquila and Priscilla was man and wife who was in the Gospel as teachers. (Acts 18: 26): Certainly God has called and is calling both male and female into the work of the Lord, as ministers and other workers and if God has called them in there, no man has a right to lay his hands on them and say you keep silent; no, no, indeed not, for they have a right in there.

Now in Paul's time we find that he and his company entered into the house of Philip the evangelist, which had four daughters, virgins which did prophesy (preach) (Acts 21: 8-9). Why? Because they had a right to, because that was their privilege in the Lord, because it was a calling from God. Paul gave them the right, See (1 Cor. 11:5) then we find also that he gave the women the right to teach. (Titus 2: 3-4). He gave them power and authority to preach. (Mark 3: 13-14). Then he called seventy others and gave the power also Luke 10: 17-19, and he taught them to pray and gave them this right, not only some, but men every where and in like manner the women. (1 Tim. 2:8-9). When they assembled at Jerusalem tarrying for the comforter they were praying in one accord and the number was about one-hundred and twenty both men and women. Dear reader, will you take notice that they were with one accord and this surely includes those women which were assembled with them. There are different creeds that teach that women should keep silent till the preacher wants a large sum of money, then he wants the women to get up the money, because they can beat the men collecting. Well the word does say for women to keep silent. (1 Cor. 14: 33). But let us see who and why they should be silent. You will note the thirtysecond verse, they were in a confusion and Paul said,

God is not the author of confusion, so the women that are in confusion should keep silent, not only so, but that the men in the same confusion to keep silent also. Now busy bodies; they should keep silent. (2 Thes. 3: 11-12). Now those that are not in a confusion, preach, teach and pray. We note that there at the Pentecost they were gathered in the upper room; they all continued with one accord in prayer and supplication, WITH THE WOMEN, and Mary the mother of Jesus and with his brethren. (Acts 1: 13-14).

Now in conclusion we will notice a prophecy of the present gospel dispensation, what the prophet said about our rights in the gospel, speaking of the Savior and His mission. "And it shall come to pass afterward, that I will pour out my Spirit upon all flesh and your sons and your daughters shall prophesy." (preach) Then why should men teach that the women should keep silent? "The prophets prophesy falsely, and the priests rule with their means; and my people love to have it so." Yes these sect prophets, tell lies in the pulpit and the sect priests will rule with their means, so to get more means. (money) Beware of such Matt. 7:15, for they will come to you in sheep's clothing and let me say right here that the devil will send some of them professing holiness of every kind, but the right kind and that is the kind that takes the whole word of God, the kind God recognizes and the only kind. "Be Ye Holy"

"But as He which hath called you is holy, so be holy in all manner of conversation;" because it is written: "Be ye holy, for I am holy."

I wish to bring a few thoughts on why we should live holy. Turn to Heb. 12: 14 and read: "Follow peace with all men and holiness, without which no man shall see the Lord." They were created with the nature of the heavenly Father; they communed with their Father in the cool of the evening. God loved them, and they were happy, until they disobeyed Him. What do we find that happened then? Well, the Word tells us that they lost their rights to holiness, and they were put out of the beautiful garden of Eden to do for themselves. God no longer came and conversed with them as He had before, and they no longer had the comforts of life. Now, they had to get out and work to make a living by the sweat of their brow; how different it was now. Before they were kept by their Father, and had such a beautiful place to abide. How much better it would have been had they not disobeyed God. They brought a reproach upon all who came into the world, for all are born with a sinful nature and without holiness; born to have sorrow, trouble and heart aches all because of sin. But oh! we see a light beaming through the light which comes from the Son of God: He is now our holiness, through Him we receive righteousness by accepting Him as our personal Saviour. He says: "Though your sins be as scarlet, they shall be as white as snow, though they be red like crimson, they shall be as wool." We need not

go on living in sin, though we were born in it, for Christ is our salvation, through His blood we have redemption. The Word says, "Blessed are the pure in heart: for they shall see God." It does not say that you can live the way you wish and see God. No, that kind will not be blessed, for God does not look upon sin. Remember Adam and Eve were put out of the beautiful garden on account of the sin they committed. God no longer came and talked with them, as He had done before. God made coats of skin and clothed them, and so it is now; God has to clothe us with His righteousness, before we are fit for the kingdom of God, and this salvation comes through Jesus Christ our Lord. Remember when Christ hung on the cross there was a time when God looked away from Him; this was when your sins and my sins were put upon Him. The Father could not look upon sin then, and He cannot now. Remember how Christ prayed, "my God, my God, hast thou forsaken me." Thinking of this it seems that God does not and can not look upon us as clean, until we are cleansed with the blood of Jesus.

I want to call your attention to Heb. 9: 22, 28. "And almost all things are by the law purged with blood; and without shedding of blood is no remission of sin. So Christ was once offered to bear the sins of many: and unto them that look for him shall He appear the second time without sin unto salvation." I also want to call your attention to the churches of today; there seems to be a coldness creeping in. They probably lived at one time up to all the light they had, but somewhere down the line they sanctioned things that God cannot look upon. For instance, a great many of us can see how they take things so lightly that pertain to holiness; people do not seem to think that this is needed, for it is so inconvenient for them and out of the order of their way of living or thinking. Many believe the only way to keep the young people in their church is by bringing in things that pertained to the world, such as will please the flesh. but look here my friends the word of God is our only guide, many false guides and false prophets will go to outer darkness, and they also will take many of their congregation with them, the only way we can ever expect to go through is to get right with God and stay right if we want to make heaven our resting place, we have to give up the world and its pleasures, they will have to be put out of the church and holiness preached to the people that they may know that there is but one way to God, folks are so hungry for the real experience of knowing they are right with God. They should be taught that they must be born again, for the word of God plainly says except we are born again, we shall in no wise enter into the Kingdom. We should get the robe of righteousness on, which comes through the atonement of Jesus Christ, for surely we can not come to God at the great judgement day with our lives heaped up with sin and expect God to look upon us with pleasure, for He does not, or will not look upon sin read, (Jer. 7: 23-24). But this thing

commanded I then saying, "Obey my voice and I will be your God, and ye shall be my people and walk in all the ways that I have comminded you, that it may be well unto you." But they hearkened not or inclined their ear, but walked in the counsels and in the imagination of their evil heart, and went backward and not forward. I want to ask this question of you, do you not think that this scripture will take in many now, the day we are living in ? for it seems to me more are going backward than forward. Why is this? I believe it is because they will not pay the price, but want to live to please the flesh and therefore they can not advance in the christian life, but rather go backward, to me it seems too bad for there is more actual pleasure in a few hours in the christian life than there is in the world all put together. Why sell your soul for a measly little pleasure to please the flesh, how much better it is to have God's blessing and peace within you and then in the end have everlasting joy.

The pastors and preachers are some what the cause of many not finding the Lord, for they do not preach a pure gospel to them, and as for them they in the judgement day will have much to face, as they will have many crying, why did you not tell me the true way and help me to find the Lord Jesus Christ. Of course we all have to live for our selves, but there are many who being led astray by false doctrines, false teachers will have much to account for in the great judgement day. The word says as you live so will you die and as you sow so shall you reap.

I want to show you in the word of how it speaks of some preachers and how they live and it may-be you will be able to see more fully why we should live holy lives. "The prophets prophecy falsely and the priests bear rule by their means: and the people love to have it so: and what will ye do in the end thereof." The prophets lead one to believe that they can live to satisfy this flesh and then in the end will be saved, and of course people who just want to live moral lives this abominable thing just suits them fine, therefore they will have to take the concequences in the end. We find in Jer. 23rd. chapter, scripture that will open many eyes to some light, listen at this.! "Woe be unto the pastors that destroy and scatter the sheep of my pasture: saith the Lord." "There-fore; thus saith the Lord God of Israel against the pastors that feed my people: ye have scattered my flock, and driven them away, and have not visited them: behold I will visit upon you the evil of your doings, saith the Lord." (Jer. 23:11). "For both prophet and priest are profane; ye in my house have I found their wickedness saith the Lord." (Jer. 23: 12). "Where there way shall be unto them as slippery ways in the darkness: they shall be driven on and fall therein for I will bring evil upon them even the year of their visitation, saith the Lord." (Jer. 23: 20). "The anger of the Lord shall not return, until he have executed, and till he have performed the thoughts of his heart: in the latter days ye shall consider it perfectly." things coming to pass. (Jer. 23:21). "I have not sent these prophets, yet they ran: I have not spoken to them, yet they prophesied." These kind are not out to save souls from hell, but to make easy money for themselves. have to watch, these days and be on our guard for many are out deceiving people on the right and left. There are many who do not want the truth and these kind of preachers just suits them for these only want to be called by the name of the Lord read, (Isa. 4:1). "And in that day seven women shall take hold of one man, saying, we will eat our own bread and wear our own apparel: only let us be called by thy name, to take away our reproach.
