

An Exclusive People

In this time of spiritual declension, when the precious Word of God, has been turned into fables, and the people have deviated far from the real truth, the plain, unadulterated truth needs to be held up far above the many creeds and doctrines of men so that the precious may be separated from the vile. Many today say, "Oh, you make the way too straight, and the people can not come up to that," etc. But can we lower the standard of the Word and expect to obtain the freedom of the gospel? If such is done,

what will it better the power of the Word in this evening time? This has been done too long now, and still the people have not learned righteousness. "When thy judgments are in the earth, the inhabitants of the world will learn righteousness. Let favor be shewed to the wicked, yet he will not learn righteousness." Isa. 26: 9, 10.

For this very reason, so many, yea, thousands, are groping on in sin, with no hope of heaven, and do not know of this wonderful deliverance through the blood of Christ. We serve an exclusive Christ, Therefore His people are an exclusive people. They are separate from the world, worldly religions, etc., and are made unto God a peculiar people.

Should the standard of the present truth of this era be lowered by recognizing all who say they are of God or that the religion of Jesus Christ is only a religion among religions or that His Church is only a church among churches (sects), then how gladly the world would receive us! Paul had the same spirit to contend with in the early Church as he stood against all other gods, recognizing only the true God. "For though there be that are called gods, ... but to us there is but one God." 1 Cor. 8: 4-6. Had he just said, "I know you serve gods, but I believe my God is best," he would have had no persecution: but he perfectly ignored their gods as being nothing and taught that there was only one living and true God.

In Nehemiah is a beautiful type of the people of God, that is of their building up Zion (Church) in this evening time. Let us notice a few thoughts in connection. The walls of Jerusalem had been trodden down and the remnant was in affliction and reproach. As Nehemiah beheld it all, his heart was touched at seeing that mighty city in ruins, therefore he determined, after much fasting and praying, to rebuild the walls. God let His approval rest upon him, and as he moved forward no doubt many discouraging scenes came to his vision, and he had enemies from the beginning. Sanballat, Tobiah and Geshem were his opponents, and they did all they could to make havoc

of the work; first, by trying to discourage him. They said, "What do these feeble Jews? If a fox go up, he shall even break down their stone wall." Nehemiah let none of those things move him; he moved on in the name of the Lord. Then, when his enemies saw that he was decided to build. and knowing that God was going before him, they waxed valiant in fight; and the surrounding nations—the Arabians, the Ammonites, the Ashdodites, together with Sanballat and Tobiah, conspired to go against Nehemiah. But as they saw that this could not overthrow him, they said, "Come, let us meet together in some one of the villages in the plain of Ono." Ah, the spirit to compromise was behind it all, and they only designed to do him mischief, but Nehemiah replied, "I am doing a great work, so that I cannot come down; why should the work cease whilst I leave it, and come down to you."

This very same spirit is in the world today and is trying to bring all religions together to fight against the saints of the Most High God. It is only in fulfillment of the Word. Rev. 20: 8, 9. Since God's reformation of the evening time was appointed by the Holy Spirit, the devil has also built many counterfeits that teach holiness, healing and perhaps many Bible truths, yet leave off many important truths. They do not teach the truth on such subjects as the one Church (body), fellowship of the Spirit of Christ, and separation from all that is against God's Word. Such is only a deception and works much disaster. A doctrine that is nearest like the truth, and yet is not the genuine truth, is the worst counterfeit.

The body of Christ is an exclusive body (church), and those mixed up with holiness associations, sects, bands of human origin, and who mingle with most anything, just so it has the name "holiness" attached, do not discern the beautiful body of Christ, nor its oneness. nor the unity of the Spirit, nor the doctrine. etc.

Yes, the worldly religions would like for the people of God to meet down in one of the 'plains of Ono' and all work in a union (discord), but this is not the way God makes His people one! If His people would lower the standard and receive all who say they are of God, how gladly would many flock with the saints of God, but His Church is not joined by simply adhering to a certain doctrine, but by being born of the Spirit. They are baptised by one Spirit into the one body.

May God's sheep hear His voice and flee the ruins of the tottering walls of Babylon and all the "plains of Ono," and receive with meekness the engrafted Word. Amen.

Modern Tongues

That this is an age of many counterfeit religions, we must admit, and of which the New Testament writes have given us definite warning. 1 Tim. 4: 1.

In this writing we do not mean to unkindly criticiany one, but the love for precious souls constrains us texpose this particular error in the light of Bible trut so that honest, truth seekers may make their escape from the realms of deception. Souls who are thus in bondar are to be pitied and persuaded by Divine love and will dom—not crushed or driven. Strictly speaking, the deviation of the author and rescue the subjects from the error's influence. There is deliverance; praise God.

The latter part of the nineteenth century marked the beginning of the full restoration of Christ's Church to be apostolic glory and power, or when she emerged from the "cloudy and dark day" into the "evening light"—fulfillment of Old Testament prophecy (Jer. 32: 39; Zect. 14: 6, 7; Ezek. 34: 12). The truth was set forth, such a sanctification, holiness, divine healing, New Testamer ordinances and the one Church separate from human organizations.

Hearing this apostolic truth, numbers began to make their escape from religious confusion and embraced the whole truth. Then the devil saw that his grip was being loosened in the religious world. Therefore, very quickly he devised and originated new theories to side-track practicus souls in their search for truth, of which the Pent costal or modern tongues, to be plain, is the most own standing counterfeit movement. It is a late movement and in recent years has swept the country, especially the Middle West and Pacific Coast. There are reasons for its spread, which we will notice later.

Dear reader, let us turn to the Bible and see if the teachings and spirit, especially the tongues-evident theory, harmonizes with the Word and Spirit of God.

Error 1. Speaking in tongues as the Spirit gives utter ance (Acts 2: 4) is different than the gift of fongues t 1 Cor. 12: 14. There is no distinction in the two express sions, for both refer to the same thing. True speaking i tongues of Acts 2: 4 is a manifestation of the Spirit 2 implied by the words, "as the Spirit gave them utterance The fact that the true tongues are given of the Spir necessarily means they are a "gift" of the Spirit. In the 12th chapter of 1 Cor. both expressions are used inte changeably and speaking of the same spiritual gift. W read, "To one is given by the Spirit . . . divers kinds (tongues," (verses 8, 10) referring to the gift of tongue Then in verse 30 we read, "Do all speak with tongues! which also refers to the same gift, just as the gift of min acles and "workers of miracles" are equivalent expression We understand that this distinguishing theory was into duced in the year of 1900 by C. F. Parham. The earl Church never taught it, for it is a strained interpretation to uphold the tongues-evidence theory.

Error 2. The baptism of the Holy Ghost is in ever instance attended by the initial physical sign of speakin in other tongues as the Spirit gives utterance. The Scrip

tures no where teach that speaking in tongues is required as evidence that the Holy Ghost is received. If you can, quote us one direct Scriptural requirement on this point. In 1 Cor. 12: 30 Paul asks, "Do all speak with tongues?" No, is the implied answer, for in the preceding verses he had explained that there were "differences of administration" in the manifestation of the Spirit, meaning that the Spirit does not manifest Himself through the same particular gift in every person, "but the manifestation of the Spirit is given to every man to profit withal." 1 Cor. 12: 7. You know that all are not apostles, all are not workers of miracles (verse 29), neither do all speak with true tongues. Speaking in tongues, which could only be "as the Spirit gives utterance," is only a manifestation or gift of the Spirit in common with other special gifts. According to this error, the Holy Spirit is denied unless He chooses to manifest Himself in a certain manner. The Holy Ghost himself is the satisfactory evidence. "Whereof the Holy Ghost also is a witness" (Heb. 10: 15). "The Spirit itself beareth witness with our spirit." Rom. 8: 16. If the reception of the Spirit must be evidenced by an outward physical sign, surely one's conversion should be determined by a special physical sign in all cases. Since such is not true, then there is no necessity of that particular witness for the baptism, or for any other special work or favor from God.

On the day of Pentecost the first disciples were given the gift of prophecy, as well as the gift of tongues, when they received the Holy Ghost. Also, the twelve disciples at Ephesus prophesied when they received the Holy Ghost and spoke with tongues (Acts 19). Therefore, the special gift of prophecy should be given preference if either of the gifts were to be accepted as the evidence of the reception of the Holy Ghost, for "greater is he that prophesieth than he that speaketh with tongues," (1 Cor. 14: 5) and Paul further exhorts, "Desire spiritual gifts, but rather that ye may prophesy." (Verse 1)

Error 3. "We receive the baptism of the Holy Ghost just like they did on the day of Pentecest" (Acts 2). Do the modern tongues people manifest the same signs as then? Let us notice more closely the Pentecost scene. The first outward sign was the coming of "a sound from heaven as of a rushing mighty wind and it filled all the house where they were sitting;" the second outward sign was, "There appeared unto them cloven tongues like as of fire, and it sat upon each of them;" the third outward sign, "began to speak with other tongues (languages) as the Spirit gave them utterance." The modern movement does not reproduce these signs as claimed in the above error. They discard the first two, and emphasize the last. However, the first sign is just as important as the last in this particular scene, being only a literal fulfillment of Old Testament prophecy at the ushering in of the Holy Spirit dispensation. The last manifestation or tongues which people generally receive today are not languages as spoken on the day of Pentecost, but only a false gibber through Satanic power or nervous derangement. Therefore, in no sense do they reproduce the Pentecostal outpouring. No hint is made at this Pentecostal scene that the disciples spoke in unknown tongues, nor to God alone, neither did they need an interpreter, but these languages were spoken direct to the people of different nations and

were given specifically for the purpose of spreading the gospel to various nations through prophecy or preaching, a special gift which they also received at this time. The Bible gift of tongues is a language, and is given as an aid to prophecy.

Evidently the disciples on this occasion did not talk in different languages a few minutes only, for the incident was noised abroad and the multitude representing different nationalities came together, and each "heard them speak in his own language," (Acts 2: 6) which no doubt continued the greater part of the day, each disciple talking in order, Peter's sermon being recorded in this chapter. If speaking these various languages was the only evidence that they had the Holy Ghost, then when they ceased to speak the apostles could have rightly concluded that they had lost the Holy Ghost. How inconsistent! Our Pentecostal friends would endeavor to satisfy us with a momentary evidence, but thank God, the infilling of the Spirit is not dependent upon transitory evidences, for the Holy Spirit in the heart is the abiding evidence Himself.

Error 4. That speaking in tongues is the only proper evidence is established by the Scriptural examples recorded in Acts. There are only three instances in the New Testament where people spoke with tongues when they received the Holy Ghost (Acts 2: 4; 10: 44- 46; 19: 6). These occasions include only a small number compared to the thousands who received the Holy Ghost in the early church, and of whom no mention is made of tongues, which points to the fact that the manifestation of tongues was not common in all cases. Furthermore, these instances being only historical accounts as they occurred cannot serve alone to establish with certainty any such doctrine. Even from a historical standpoint, we note that no mention is made of speaking in tongues when the apostle Paul received the Holy Ghost (Acts 9: 17, 18), neither with reference to the Samaritans in Acts 8: 14-17. "Only unspiritual, earthly minded people could need a physical or outward evidence of a spiritual work, and such never receive the baptism of the Holy Ghost."

Error 5. That one should "tarry" for the baptism of the Spirit, evidenced by the speaking in tongues. Jesus commanded the disciples to tarry at Jerusalem until they were endued with power from on high (Lnke 24: 49). We know that this refers to Pentecost (Acts 1: 8). To fulfill Old Testament type the Spirit would not be given until "the day of Pentecest was fully come," (Acts 2: 1) and which was the date commemorating the giving of the Law at Sinai. The Spirit dispensation began on the anniversary date of the institution of the Mosaic law dispensation. This "tarrying" applied only to the disciples before Pentecost, meaning for them to await that special time. On that day we find them in "one accord in one place," and they were "sitting"—denoting no physical exertion. Tarrying is not needed so much now as meeting the conditions for the reception of the Spirit. Divine operations are spiritual and are wrought in the heart by faith. Eph. 2: 8. Faith is receiving where there is no sight or physical evidence, for faith is "the evidence of things not seen." Heb. 11: 1. "He that believeth . . . hath the witness in himself." 1 John 5: 10. By faith the Holy Spirit is received. Gal. 3:

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In the 3rd chapter of 2 Timothy the Apostle Paul reminds us that in the last days perilous times shall come. Of a truth that time is upon us. Many are aware of this fact, yet how many are awakened to their true condition as the Apostle further describes the enemies of the truth in that chapter? "For men shall be lovers of their own selves, covetous, ...disobedient to parents, unthankful, unholy, ...despisers of those that are good, ...lovers of pleasure more than lovers of God; having a form of godliness, but denying the power thereof: from such turn away." The fact is that we are living in the last of the 'last days,' insomuch that modern spiritual Babylon (sect confusion) has not only denied the power of God, but has also forsaken even the "form of godliness" to a The final warning to the saints is: great extent. "From such turn away," do not allow those conditions to exist in our heart. We will do well to keep ourselves unspotted from the world in this peril of the "perilous times."

How Readeth Thou?

Certain passages of Scripture in the Bible are greatly puzzling some people. Much confusion and real harm is being done to Christianity by imperfect interpretations, together with making scriptures mean too much or too little.

A Sister has written us asking us to give some instruction through Faith and Victory on the scripture found in the 14th chapter of 1 Cor. 34 and 35th verses. "Let your women keep silent in the churches: for it is not permitted unto them to speak: but they are commanded to be under obedience, as also saith the law. And if they will learn anything, let them ask their husbands at home: for it is a shame for women to speak in the church."

It is not heavenly wisdom to single out scriptures and lay down absolute rules or form settled opinions without first seeking to know the cause of the writer making the statement, and also comparing them with other scriptures to see that they do not conflict with other clear statements. There are many who take these scriptures and use them in a principle way by teaching that women have no right to teach, prophesy or preach, excluding them entirely from public service, and in so doing they cause this scripture to flatly contradict Paul's teaching in the 11th chapter of 1 Cor. verse 5 where Paul is instructing a woman how she should appear when praying or prophesying. Also it would be contrary to the prophecy of Joel. Read what Peter has to say about it in the 2nd chapter of Acts. He says, "Your sons and your daughters will prophesy. And on my servants and on my handmaidens will I pour out in those days of my Spirit and they shall prophesy." The scriptures also say that Phillip had four daughters (virgins) that prophesied. The greatest and most precious message that has ever been brought to man was given by Christ to a woman-His resurrection.

In 1 Cor. 15: 3 we find Paul giving us the definition of prophecy. "But he that prophesieth speaketh unto men to edification, and exhortation and comfort."

To get the true meaning of verses 34 and 35 of the 14th chapter, we need to read the teaching and instruction leading up to them. This particular congregation was in great confusion and women getting out of the order of God, no doubt influenced by wild fire. They were evidently asking questions, dictating and trying to rule over the male members of this congregation, and Paul was reproving and rebuking

to silence them. The same reproofs and rebukes would be good today where any church is in such a confused state and women were getting out of their created place, dictating and ruling over men. The general trend and truth of the scriptures throughout the Bible is against women dictating, ruling and governing in the church, but the scriptures do teach that women have and can publicly pray, teach, prophesy and exhort. Women are very useful in the church if they keep their place and not try to rule over man whom God places as head, and woman as helpmeet.

Paul says in conclusion of this verse, "As also saith the law." Turn and read Genesis 3: 14, "Thy desire shall be to thy husband and he shall rule over thee." From this reference it is evident that it was the disorderly and disobedient that the Apostle had reference to. Paul was strongly declaring to them that they were not obedient, therefore were not under the influence of the proper spirit. Paul exclaims in the 36th verse. "What? Came the Word of God out from you? Or came it unto you only?" Of the twelve apostles chosen to be leaders and rulers in the Church not one was a woman. This alone should be sufficient for a spiritually well-balanced woman to know that God was not approving of women ruling and dictating. No, the Word of God has not come out from women, so let them keep silent and not try to usurp authority over the men prophets.

It is sad to see the corrupted state of men and women of this world, and the world is growing more base, vulgar and corrupt as time continues. God created man and gave him power and authority as head of the woman and he has greatly abused this right and many men have treated women as mere brutes or worse when God exhorts them to cherish them as their own flesh, and God's wrath has been greatly kindled against man in a general sense until he has allowed women to exert much power, influence and freedom from the rule and authority of men, and now women in her turn is showing her weakness and deceitful corrupted hearts until the wrath of God is doubly kindled against the whole nation.

Forty years ago women were more in her place than now, but being deceived and in transgression and through the germ of pride developing, she cried, "woman suffrage," and kept at it until weakened, corrupted men gave way and gave her equal rights with men to vote, hold dictating offices, and so she plunged into politics with all of its corruption and bribery, and soon her corrupted heart began to manifest itself that she was no longer under the power of man by bobbing her hair. Along with it came the

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smoking of cigarettes. Many of them are practicing race suicide and nursing a poodle dog. Thirty years ago women who bobbed their hair were looked upon as harlots, adultreesses, and usually it was true. If for any good reason a woman would have to have her hair bobbed, she was very much ashamed and shy about being seen in public, but now they have so far strayed and seared their consciences that they bob their hair and brazenly show their backs, bare arms and limbs. Modesty has been killed by corrupting influences. If it were not for the great mercy and long-suffering of God He would set fire to this old world immediately. There are a few honest sincere souls to be gleaned out of the rubbish.

In the 11th chapter of 1 Cor. Paul gives instruction to men and women, and says that women should have their heads covered when praying or prophesying, and also says that her hair was given to her for a covering and it was a shame for man to wear long hair. In years gone by women always wore a covering, which showed that she was under the power or was obedient to her husband. For women to bob their hair, which God has given them for a covering, shows a heart of rebellion in the eyes of God. Many women today will put on men's clothing, which the Bible says is an "abomination unto the Lord thy God."

In 1 Tim. 2: 11, 12 and 13th verses, Paul is again instructing the women to learn in silence and to be in subjection, not to teach and usurp authority over the man but to function in her place, impressing them with the fact that Adam was first formed and then Eve. She was created for an help-meet and not to dictate and rule over men. Adam was not deceived, but the woman, which proves her natural inability to dictate and rule over man, as God never created her for that purpose. — Fred Pruitt.

Therefore, faith is omitted when one looks to the physical evidence as the goal, and one is not satisfied until they receive the "tongues." Under such conditions of tarrying, physical exertion and omission of faith wonderful opportunities are afforded the devil to give counterfeit tongues or spirits. 1 John 4: 1. It is easy for the devil to counterfeit physical manifestations of the Spirit, and this alone makes the theory unreliable. Then too, no allowance is made for counterfeit manifestations, many of which the Word of God directly condemns. People who are demon-possessed often speak in tongues. To my knowledge a number of persons have escaped from the tongues movement, and in order to get Bible salvation they had to have the devils cast out by the power of God. In fact, in every case when they had sought and received the delusion of tongues, the power of the devil had to be

broken before they could get salvation. This is a warr ing to beware of this supernatural power of the devil.

We rightly expect those who have the Holy Ghost t bear the fruits of the Spirit-love, joy, peace, longsuffer ing, gentleness, goodness, faith, meekness, temperand (Gal. 5: 22, 23). On the contrary, we find these fruit lacking in those who claim to have "the" evidence. It i a hotbed for free-loveism, many divorces and re-marriage and indecent actions, yet at the same time they claim t have "the" evidence that they possess the Holy Ghos We are commanded to try the spirits, for there are man false ones in the world. 1 John 4: 1. How can we try th spirits? By the Word of God, for it alone will judge u in the last day. John 12: 48. The spirits must agree wit the Word and not the Word with the spirits.

- 22. But the father said to his servants, Bring forth the best robe, and put it on him; and put a ring on his hand, and shoes on his feet:
- 23. And bring hither the fatted calf, and kill it; and let us eat, and be merry: ,
- 24. For this my son was dead, and is alive again; he was lost, and is found. And they began to be merry.

Suggestion To Teachers

When a boy was sorry. Story of the prodigal son. The forgiveness of sin. When we do wrong.

EXPLANATORY NOTES

Selfishness is at the bottom of sin. The son was tired of home restraint. The parental authority, being weak, yielded to the wish of the beloved son, gave him money to squander. Not always all who have wasted their substance, sad to say, come to themselves. But this one did, thank God, and others may. The kind compassionate heavenly Father will meet all more than half way when conviction is deep and a soul's need causes a repentance and a confession, "I have sinned." There is always mercy and forgiveness for a penitent sinner, and when forgiven it is also forgotten.

This young man was granted or made free from parental authority. Dear parents, in kindness and much love, keep your authority in your home or you will be very certain to have some prodigal son or daughter to weep over. and they may never come to themselves and eternity will be a long time for you to regret that you gave loose reins. O parents, make sure of the company your children are keeping, the kind of literature they are reading, the places of amusements they are frequenting. Prodigality is increasing. Please read 2 Tim. 2: 7; Job 28: 28-32.

EXPLANATORY NOTES

20. Teaching them to observe all things whatsoever I have commanded you: and, lo, I am with you alway, even unto the end of the world. Amen.

EXPLANATORY NOTES

Baptism represents a burial and resurrection. Those who are dead to sin through repentance and faith in Jesus are fit subjects for baptism, and not while in sin, dead in sin or alive to sin. What a sad thing to be buried alive physically, yet it is more sad to be buried in baptism while alive in sin! Many dear souls get deceived, live in that deception and miss heaven. Only salvation through the Blood makes a soul a proper subject for Christian baptism, and every one who is saved from their sins should follow Jesus' example and be baptized. Read Matt. 3: 13- 17.

Some believe and teach that the baptism of the Holy Spirit is the only baptism for the church now. But listen. Jesus called and sent out his followers and told them to go and baptize all who believe. Only Jesus Himself can baptize with the Holy Ghost. He never told any one else to do that. It is His exclusive power and official right.

It is precious to be found walking in all the commandments of our Lord and water baptism is one of them.
