COMMENT AND APPLICATION

The sacredness of human life is at a very low ebb in this present age. At the point of high temper or contradiction one man justifies himself in taking the life of his fellowman. For a few dollars, a man turns the switch in a penal institution which takes one life after another. While some are enraged to a high degree of revenge, called patriotism, a man with the aid of most disastrous inventions will mow human beings as grain before the reaper's sickle.

Last week's lesson was in regard to children respecting parents; today it is in regard to one man respecting another. If we consider the relationship of man to God, we can begin to realize how sacred human life is. God made man in His own image, placing within man a never dying soul. Yet in the face of these truths the census taken in 1934 covering homicides and suicides were 40,883 in the fair land of our U. S. A. Adding to this the countless hordes slain in war—past, recent, and present—the wholesale slaughter of human life is appalling.

In our lesson Jesus teaches a very deep lesson in regard to the condition of the heart. His interpretation of the sixth commandment—"Thou shalt not kill"—is not an outward restriction; but "Out of the heart proceed evil thoughts, murders, etc." The murder is not in the bullet or the deadly weapon. but the seed of it is found in the human heart.

- 14. But when Jesus saw it, he was much displeased, and said unto them, Suffer the little children to come unto me, and forbid them not: for of such is the kingdom of God.
