Shall We, Or Shall We Not?

Shall we, the saints of the Most High, rally to the full unadulterated gospel of Christ, embracing everything He taught and practiced and thus make visible to the eyes of the world God's true Church as it was in the morning time of this gospel dispensation?

Have we been led off on some by-ways of man's? If so, will we turn our feet backward to the Bible and accept it as our only creed and thus follow Christ in the way of true holiness?

Shall we cry out in tones of anguish against the churches and creeds of men that has blurred the light and tried to cover up the church of the Living God by their own traditions and opinions? Or shall we be contented to stand by neutral and say nothing while they are opening the gate-ways of hell and receiving their multitudes?

Sectarianism will be very well satisfied with our doings so long as we do not try to rescue those of God's sheep who without sufficient light have been caught in their trap, or faithfully warn those who might be entering in to stay out. If the true Church of God is to be ever visualized to the world, false churches and false doctrines must be exposed and all human rubbish must be removed that have a tendency to obscure her light.

Shall we not drop a bomb of God's eternal truth among them with a prayer that it might be used in awakening those that are sincere of the great danger they are in of losing their souls? Even if it does bring bitter persecution upon us— David said, "Through thy precepts I get understanding: therefore I hate every false way" Psalm 119:104.

Shall we teach and practice the three ordinances of the New Testament Church—water baptism, feet washing, and the communion supper—while other so-called churches claim them to be non-essential?

Shall we, the saints of God, adorn our bodies in modest apparel as becometh people professing holiness? or shall we put on the paraphernalia of the world—finger rings, crisping pins, and such like—trying to make ourselves look pretty by bobbing our hair, painting our faces and lips, spending the money God has given us for such frivolity? All such is an abomination in the sight of God and His true people.

Shall we manifest that spirit of equality and unity which was so evident on the day of Pentecost among the saints? Equality prompted by LOVE is the fundamental teaching and principle of Christ, and must not be overlooked in the evening church. By this, the early saints proved their love one to another.

Shall we teach and submit to true church government as taught in the scriptures and have a clean people who profess Christ and bear the vessels of the Lord?

Shall we pray for and help support God's true ministers as they go forth preaching the full gospel, and do it willingly and not as under the commandment of the old tithing system which was surplanted by the law of love—"Christ is the end of the law to all who believe in Him." Do we believe? Then if we do, we shall be willing to support the truth to the extent of our ability. Shall we pray that God will endue them with divine power, a double portion of his spirit, so that they may have courage to declare the word faithfully?

This professed Christian nation is not headed for the rocks. It has already made its landing, and the rock of worldliness and unbelief has broken and shattered its hope—and the greater part of them have gone down with the tide never to become conscious of their need until the last trumpet sounds.

Babylon has fallen beyond redemption, and while she is inhabited with the rich, the proud, and the gay, her magnificent buildings, her high steeples pointing heavenward, her fancy pews and her many members, she is paving the way to hell and making it easy for the multitudes to slip into it.

Shall we cry out against such institutions (called churches) and point the sincere ones to the Bibical Church (Church of God) His divine organization in which Christ Himself is founder and builder (Matt. 16:18)?

Christ adds today to His church (not man) as He did those who were converted on the day of Pentecost (Acts 2:47). He is the only door, and true repentance is the only mode of entrance. (John 10:9.)

The writer knows if we preach and stand for these truths it will stir up Phariseeical religions with their money-loving, fashion-following, pleasure-seeking desires; but it will cause God's face to shine on us, and we shall meet the smile of His approval, and for this reason I shall continue to do so until He calls, "Come up higher."

QUESTIONS AND ANSWERS ON THE CHURCH OF GOD (Continued from Feb. Issue)

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Question: Who is the bride and the bridegroom? Answer: Read John 3: 28, 29. "I am not the Christ" (John 1:20); then in John 3:28, 29 we learn who the bridegroom is: "He that hath (past and present tense) the bride is the bridegroom" or Christ and his church. We will read from Isaiah 62:2-5, I will quote the 5th verse: "For as a young man marrieth a virgin so shall thy sons marry thee, and as the bridegroom rejoiceth over the bride, so shall thy God rejoice over thee."

Question: When are they married?

Answer: In connection with the last scripture above, read Rom. 7:4—"Wherefore (in consideration of the above scripture) my brethren, ye also are become dead to the law by the body of Christ, that

ye should be married to another, even to him who is raised from the dead, that we should bring forth fruit unto God" (spiritual legitimate children in this life); again, according to Heb. 12:7, 8, if we are not married to him, then our spiritual posterity "are bastards and not sons."

Question: What are the walls of this church or city?

Answer: Isaiah 26:1— "Salvation will God appoint for walls and bulwarks." Isaiah 60:18—"Violence shall no more be heard in thy land, wasting nor destruction within thy borders: but thou shalt call thy walls salvation and thy gates praise."

Question: Who records the names?

Answer: Luke 10:20—"Rejoice not that the spirits are subject unto you, but rather rejoice, because your names are written in heaven"; and as God takes the members in (see 1 Cor. 12:18) he evidently writes them down; for he blots them out that sins (Exodus 32:33). Names are written in the book of life (Phil. 4:3).

Question: What is the name?

Answer: Church of God. Some one says "It is the church of God, and how can he name it after himself? Well, he did do it, and all the apostles sanctioned the name. Now we shall prove this by his own words: "Holy Father, keep through (Greek in) thine own name those whom thou hast given me, that they all may be one, as we are one" (John 17: 20-23; "I have kept them in thy name" (11th verse) which had been perdicted by Isaiah 62:2-"And thou shalt be called by a new name, which the mouth of the Lord shall name." Here the church was named by the mouth of the Lord. This is in connection with Eph. 3:15, correctly rendered from the Greek reads thus: "From whom the whole family in the heavens and on earth is named." So we see the name was given by the mouth of the Lord, and was derived from God, his Father. The apostles respected the prayer of Jesus, and kept the church in his name, as we shall prove by the following scriptures: "Feed the church of God, which he hath purchased with his own blood" (Acts 20:28); "The church of God which is at Corinth" (1 Cor. 1:2, also 2 Cor. 1:1); "Give none offence, neither to the Jews, nor to the Gentiles, nor to the church of God" (1 Cor. 10:32): "We have no such custom, neither the churches of God" (1 Cor. "Despise ye the church of God?" (1 Cor. 11:22); "I persecuted the church of God and wasted it" (Gal. 1:13): "For ye, brethren, became followers of the churches of God" (1 Thess. 2:14); "We ourselves glory in you in the churches of God" (2 Thess. 1:4): "If a man know not how to rule his own house, how shall he take care of the church of God?" (1 Tim. 3:5); "But if I tarry long, that thou mayest know how thou oughtest to behave thyself in the house of God, which is the church of the living God, the pillar and ground of the truth"

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(1 Tim. 3:15). Where he speaks of churches, means different localities, while church means universal. Why should it be thought a thing incredible for God to name or call the church after himself? He is God, and yet "the God of the whole earth shall he be called" (Isaiah 54:5). Saints are saints, yet called saints. (Gr.) (1 Cor. 1:2); so "we will walk in the name of the Lord our God" (Micah 4:5).

Question: What is the test of fellowship?

Answer: "God is faithful by whom ye were called unto the fellowship of his son Jesus Christ our Lord. Now I beseech you, brethren, by the name of our Lord Jesus Christ, that ye all speak the same thing, and that there be no divisions among you; but that we be perfectly joined together in the same mind, and in the same judgment" (1 Cor. 1:9, 10). "If we walk in the light as he is in the light, we have fellowship one with another" (1 John 1:7); Fellowship is of the Spirit. (See Phil 2:1). Now I will quote from Bro. Warner's tract. The Church of God. page 25: "Fellowship exists where heart purity exists, it is the conscience blending of hearts filled with One may have been led into the same Holy Spirit. all truth, the other not; this does not interrupt fellowship; nevertheless, it is the duty of such who "know the truth" in meekness to instruct others who do not. Ignorance of some truth does not destroy fellowship, but resisting the truth does, because it forfeits salvation. We must not sanction people's errors: but, if saved, show our love and fellowship to them so long as they do not get the evidence that their wrong doctrines have become willful. ignore fellowship because of some doctrinal error is bigotry. To agree to disagree, or put on equality truth and error, is babel confusion. To know the truth is our privilege, to teach it our duty; but to have fellowship with the pure and upright of heart is an involuntary and spontaneous fact. Sects are the result of carnality, nothing but perfect holiness of heart destroys carnality; and thus removes both sectism and its cause, amen."

Brethren, the fire of God's love saves the soul, harmonizes all hearts that receive it, leads them into perfect and uniform obedience to all truth, and drives afar all who refuse to pass through its purging fire, and gain the plane of holy fellowship. The chief object of God's ministry is to perfect the saints "till we all come in the unity of the faith" ("once delivered unto the saints" Jude 3) Eph. 4:12, 13. The comforter guides into all truth, sanctifies wholly. God wants a sanctified church-more fathers and mothers to care for the babes as they are born into the church. "The pure in heart have perfect fellowship even though all previously educated errors have not as yet disappeared; therefore, if all saints live up to all the light they have and manifest a desire for more light, there will be no real cause of division but sin." (The last and the following sentences are Bro. Warner's.) "On the plane of bible holiness, no outward observences are made a test, for holy men judge not from appearances, but 'judge righteous judgment'; but if we all walk in all the light God gives us through his word, sanctified wholly soul and body, then we will not want to do or wear things that pertains to the world or is an offence to the brethren. But if we persist in doing and wearing or practicing those things, it may be because we want to, more than because we see no wrong in so doing."

In conclusion, here is a summary or quintessence or extract of the doctrine of the church of God: It is God's; He is the founder, foundation; He built it; He is the head, door, organizer; He named it, takes in members, blots out sinners, sets each member in his place; He does all the appointing (Isa. 44:7); all are on an equality, no one above another; it is composed of saved only (1 Jno. 3:8, 10), from every nation on earth and in Heaven. —G. E. Harmon.

KEEP THE VICTORY

The other day I received a letter from a lady in the east asking me to tell her how she might get an experience like Bro. B-. I answered that the Lord dealt with each individual according to their spiritual standing. We know of no one who was thrown to the ground like Paul. He heard the Lord speak and saw a bright light which blinded him, but from that time on Paul was a changed man. When we get to the place where we see our lost condition and sincerely ask the Lord to forgive us, turn from every known sin, make wrongs right as much as possible, and earnestly wait on the Lord, He will certainly give us the witness that we are His. Then the inbred nature, envy, jealousy, etc, will cause us trouble and we must hold on to God for entire cleansing. The carnal nature must be crucified before the Lord can have perfect control, so the abundant fruit of the Spirit can be produced (Luke 6: 45). Some of the sect preachers may be able to give advice, but it is always safer to study the word, and depend on the Lord only for guidance. The 2,000 different sects all branched off from the word of God; so eliminate all middle-men and go directly to God. He that cometh to him, He will in no wise cast out. God is love. Jesus paid the price for our redemption—for pardon, sanctifying, healing, and being strengthened in temptation to overcome. We never get to the place where we are not tempted: but like Jesus, we must say, "Get thee behind me, Satan." We are to "resist the devil and he will flee." Read the promise given to overcomers in Rev. 3. It is easy to float down stream, but it will stimulate spiritual growth to exercise faith to overcome evil with good. Yes, we must have victory over devil-power all the time. By praying all the time without ceasing it is possible to have the victory all the time.

EDITORIALS

Sunday, February the 11th was a great day in Zion here at Guthrie. It was the day set apart for fasting and praying for the sick and for the salvation of souls. Saints came in from Ripley and Hennessey and some came from other places to enter into the fast and praying for the sick. The writer had been sick with the Flu and when Sunday morning came was not really able to go to meeting, but felt burdened and pressed that I should go. I went in the name of Jesus, and before having prayer asked the saints to pray for me. While we knelt in prayer, the Lord touched my body and healed me, then gave me a message on divine healing, anointed with fresh oil and our hearts did rejoice and magnify the Lord. In the afternoon we all met together and continued in prayer for the sick. There were over one hundred and fifty requests which had been sent in for prayer on this day. Part of the congregation from here was in a revival meeting at Shawnee, Okla. so we sent fifty or more of the requests down there. They met together at the same time and we all were in agreement that God would heal these dear ones who were afflicted. We are expecting to hear of results from this day's praying with supplications.

I have been thinking lately of people who call themselves "Fundamentalists" and talk about much of the teaching of Christ and the apostles as "nonessentials." It is hard for me to understand how that any intelligent person who really loves the Lord could speak in this way. I can see how some scriptures would be, or might be termed fundamental in connection with getting saved, for it is true that one needs to understand but very little of the word of God to get saved; but in order to hold that experience, one will have to learn and practice all the word of God, and by doing this it would be important truth and none to be slightly thought of and passed up as nonessentials, "Man shall not live by bread alone but by every word that proceedeth out of the mouth of God." Matt. 4:4.

It is amazing how some will wrest the scriptures from their proper meaning in order to justify themselves in fulfilling some lust of the flesh or pride of life. For instance, take the man who uses tobacco and wants to be fellowshipped as a Christian: he will refer to the seventh chapter of Mark and say, "It is not what goes in a man and is carried out that defileth a man but that which cometh out of a man." He seems to forget that the poison nicotine fills his body and makes it smell and runs out of his mouth and is spit around making other things filthy. How filthy the stuff looks spit out on God's white snow. "Oh," he says, "Tobacco is not mentioned once in the Bible." There is a good reason why it was not mentioned, for they had no tobacco at that time. Had it

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been grown and used then as it is today, Jesus, no doubt, would have said, "Woe unto you filthy tobacco users, for you make yourselves unfit to associate with cleansed saints, therefore become unfit for the Kingdom of God." Paul, no doubt, would have said in some of his writings, "Thou shalt not use tobacco in any form for it will defile the temple of God whose temple ye are." "If any man defile the temple of God, him shall God destroy: for the temple of God is holy, which temple ye are" 1 Cor. 3:17. He tells us in the seventh chapter of 2 Cor., first verse, "Let us cleanse ourselves from all filthiness of the flesh and Spirit, perfecting holiness in the fear of God."

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Some want to put on adornments, wear gold, and superfluity of clothing to be like the world and keep from bearing any reproach for Christ. When the teaching of the Bible goes forth on these lines they will speak of it as non-essentials and many times will remark, "I will not be brought under bondage about those things." In reality they show themselves to be under bondage to their fleshly desires and pride and the world by having those things, because when we are dead to the world the desire for those things is gone and we are free from what the world might say or think, and free in spirit as God's approval is upon us in a very precious manner. The more one dies to the world and lives like the Bible teaches, the greater freedom he has. This is heavenly freedom, the other way is worldly freedom. We might illustrate it this way. Just recently a "Russellite or Rutherfordite" woman was trying to give a booklet away. She said, "If you read this and believe it you will have peace." A sister who heard her make this remark said, "You can only find peace in Jesus." She said, "I know I found peace when I read this book." She probably did find peace, but it was not the peace that Jesus gives. When they teach her that there is no real place of eternal torment and she believed it, she would have a certain kind of peace because she believed a lie and the Spirit of God would have very little chance to convict her that she needed a Saviour to keep her out of that eternal burning. Just so, those who fix up like the world will not be scoffed at or looked upon as old foggies or ones out of style and the world will love them and praise them and they will feel quite free among religious worldly minded folks, but they would feel much out of place in their worldly attire among the plain simple dressed people of God. To look at it from their standard of righteousness, they would consider it bondage to cease wearing their worldly stylish clothing, ceasing to conform to the worldly customs around them and to become simple and plain like the children of God.

A great many teachers of the Bible today will come out strongly against the big sins and flagrant

ecclesiastical trickery and corruption practiced in human religious movements which have gone so far that it is practically a waste of time to work on them, but will pass up what they call the "little things," which by being fostered and loved have given birth to the great sins that are in so much evidence.

Many folks will transgress God's word in doing what they call "little things" or "no-harm things" and think within their heart that God is too merciful to hold us to this little thing. They presume upon God's mercy and every time they do that they will sear their consciences just that much, and soon will excuse themselves in violating more of the teaching of the sacred scriptures.

The Psalmist David said, "Keep back thy servant also from presumptuous sins; let them not have dominion over me: then shall I be upright, and I shall be innocent of the great transgression." Psa. 19:13. Brethren, if we keep the little "Foxes" out, it will be impossible for the devouring wolves and vultures to come in.

The scripture found in the 12th chapter of Rom., second verse, where it says, "Be not conformed to this world" is sufficient teaching to keep a cleansed soul made tender by his love, free from conforming to the fashions, the fads, the putting on of apparel and all kinds of revelry. His Spirit will cause them to abstain from fleshly lusts; such as, adultry, using tobacco, and all other vulgar and unclean habits; and by so doing they will be ready to put on a glorified body when He comes. One Bible definition for "Pure Religion" is to keep ourselves unspotted from the world. (James 1:27.)

During the fall and winter I have been encouraged by the Lord to make an evangelistic trip and have been holding the matter before the Lord as to when to go and who should go with us. For some time it seemed that it would be impossible for us to leave the office work, but the Lord has graciously supplied efficient help and made arrangements otherwise, and it seems now that the evangelistic effort is assured unless the Lord should definitely lead otherwise.

We have been corresponding with Bro. and Sis. Key of Hammond, La. and they feel that the Lord has made it clear for them to accompany us on the tour. There will be four of us in the company, my daughter Frances making the fourth. As near as we know the mind of the Lord at this present time, we will be leaving Guthrie the fore part of April—perhaps the 4th day of April. We expect to stop with the saints in Springfield, Mo. and have some services there. Bro. R. M. Porter is pastor there and we shall be glad to meet with the dear saints at that place. From there, our course will be through Illinois with some stops with saints in that state, and on to Chi-

cago where we expect to hold meeting, and will be in Indiana and Ohio before returning back to the 't'Lord's Print Shop."

This evangelistic trip is launched by faith in God for all of our needs. In all of our evangelistic work we have never taken up offerings nor hinted to folks about our needs and the Lord has graciously supplied so we could keep going on with the gospel work, and we are expecting Him to do the same again. We shall take a large supply of papers, tracts, booklets, and books along to use in the work to give freely to all who want them. We ask the saints to pray for us and the work He has called us to do. When we are on this evangelistic trip preaching the gospel and handing out papers and tracts, the printing will be going on at the office and literature continually going out from there. It will be like doing double duty for the Lord.

We mean to be at our very best for Him while he keeps life in this body, and spend and be spent in behalf of precious souls whom Christ died to save. Those living any where near the route I have outlined who want us to stop for an encouraging visit or a few cottage services or a meeting may write to us and we can make arrangements, if possible, to come to your place. A Man Sentenced To Be Hung

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On December 10th, 1913 I went to a jail to visit a young man with a very bad reputation, named Henry Spencer. When I arrived, the sheriff went up to Spencer's cell and said to him: "There is a lady here from Wheaton who wants to speak to you. Will you treat her right and not abuse her?" Spencer replied, "All right, send her up."

The sheriff then took me upstairs and introduced me to Spencer. I took a chair and sat down outside his cell. I wish I could describe to you what I saw—a man beaten, driven, haunted by the devil. If ever there was a man who looked as if he needed God's love, it was this poor, condemned man.

I began by saying, "You may wonder why I came to see you. I came because I had to come. I am a mother of three boys and when I think of all the low I bestow upon them and the care and guidance they receive, and then read in the newspapers that you have never known what it is to have a mether's low

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or a father's care, I felt that you had been denied the greatest blessing that any one can be denied, and that is a mother's love and care. I came because I know that for you to get the name 'a man without a soul' must have meant a hopeless and desperate life. I came because I knew that your heart must be bleeding, torn, hungry, and broken. Is not this so?" Spencer replied, "Yes, it is."

I then continued, "You have missed a mother's love, but I have come to tell you about a love that far exceeds a mother's love and if you will listen to what I have to tell you, and accept what I am going to offer you, you can be the happiest man in Wheaton, even though you are in jail and have but nine days to Spencer was interested. He gave his attention to the message while I told him the way to salvation, asking the Holy Spirit every moment to guide me that I would not make one mistake. I did not have to tell him he was a sinner; he knew that already. I told him about the prodigal son and the thief on the cross and how Christ saved that thief. Spencer made the remark that he had never heard of any one having a kind word for a thief.

After fully explaining to him the way of life, and feeling that I had made the plan of salvation as plain as I could, I told him that I was going to ask him to do the hardest thing a man could be asked to do. I said, "You have always loved to do hard things, so I am told. You have been a staunch soldier for the devil. You have been fearless in his service. Now I am going to ask you to do this-to give your heart, with all its ambitions, its sins, its hatred and wilfulness, over to God, and ask Him to take you as you are, and to cleanse you from all your sins. I want you to promise that from now on you will live for Him and serve Him as fearlessly as you have the devil. Will you do that, Spencer?" He answered, "I will." I then said, "Shall we pray?" He said, "Yes."

We knelt down, he in his cell, and I on the outside. I offered a prayer to God, and after that I I asked him to follow me in simple prayer, which he did. After that prayer was finished, he said, "While you were saying that prayer, all I could say to God was 'God, help a crook like me, as You helped the thief on the cross.' I felt forty pounds lighter after I had offered that prayer."

I then said, "Now, Spencer, you are a child of God, and I am going to show you by what authority I dare say this to you." I took from my muff a New Testament and asked him if he would like to see in print just what I had been telling him. He said very eagerly, "Oh, yes, I would. Have you got it? Can you show it to me?" I said, "Yes," and opening my Testament, read John 3:16, he said, "Oh, I have seen that passage on a 'sign' some place. Let me read it for myself."

I handed him the Testament and as he read it, I told him to make the promise of the verse his own.

Before leaving him, I said to him, "I am going to give you this Testament. I want you to read the Gospel of John, especially." I said, "May I come again to speak to you?" He said, "Yes, please do, come tomorrow; come about the same hour."

I went to the jail the next day rather anxious to know how I would find Spencer. But as I came up to his cell he greeted me with these words: "Good morning, I am twenty-four hours old." I said, "What do you mean?" He said, "I read in the third chapter of John about the new birth, about Nicodemus coming to Christ. I was born again yesterday morning. Until then I had been dead; now I am alive, and am twenty-four hours old." I said, "You surely are, Spencer, thank God for it."

Then he said, "Oh, Mrs. Evans, I have tried so hard to memorize John 3:16, and at last I have got it." And with the joy of a little child, he handed me the Testament for fear that I would not know whether he quoted it right or not, and said, "Here is the Testament. You see if I am repeating it right." He quoted John 3:16 hesitatingly, but joyously and correctly.

It was really wonderful to note from day to day the marvelous growth in grace this man made and his literally devouring passion for the study of the Bible.

Spencer had given up smoking because he did not think it consistent with his Christian life.

On December 18, 1913, Henry Spencer was granted a reprieve until January 16, 1914. Another stay was granted until July 1, 1914. It was really amazing to hear him talk about his departure the day preceding December 19th—the day set for his execution, also between those days and January 16, 1914, the day set a second time for his hanging. Strange to say he seemed keenly disappointed when he was informed of these reprieves. His lot in the world had been so hard and his life so void of happiness that this world seemed to hold nothing worth while for him; whereas the new found faith that had become his during the past few weeks had brought such peace to him that but one thought possessed him, and that was to leave this world and enter into the future life of blessedness, which he believed he would do.

Spencer was never so happy as when he was near the date of his hanging. If there was ever the slightest shadow of disappointment on his face it was when he got his reprieves. When I used to ask him, "Do you really mean to say that you are anxious to go and leave this world?" He would say, "Yes, mother, this life is nothing to me. It has meant nothing but sin and shame. I never had a friend nor any one to take an interest in me or to say a kind word to me until you came to this prison to talk to me."

Those who witnessed the execution will never forget the scene nor will they ever forget the look on

the face of the condemned man and the expression of confidence, hope, and joy, which was born of faith in Christ.

Thus ends the story of the wonderful conversion of a great sinner. And there are thousands like him in and out of prison who could be saved and made useful citizens if only they had a real chance in life to make good, and if in their sin and desperation some Christian man or woman would take to them the Gospel of the loving and powerful Son of God, who came into the world to save such "Chief of Sinners." Are we His followers? "As the Father hath sent me, so have I sent you." He said, "I was in prison and ye came unto me." "Inasmuch as ye did it to one of the least (and shall we say, most unworthy) of these, ye did it unto me."

The above reading is a selected portion of an article sent in to us. The subject, Henry Spencer was arrested in Chicago in 1913 for murder and was sentenced to hang on Dec. 19th, 1913. We should do all we can to get the gospel to such as he. (Ed.)

COMMENTS AND APPLICATIONS

Divine Ordinances Instituted

The next five Sundays we are to study about the last days of Jesus here on earth before he goes back to heaven. If we take diligent heed to embrace the contents of the lesson they will prove very helpful and inspiring to us.

Many teachers give us only the Lord's Supper for this lesson but we find that John teaches the ordinance of feet washing in connection with the supper and if we turn John's teaching down then we will also have to turn down Matthew, Mark and Luke. But by God's help we will be doers of all the word.

The explanation given in the Bible on this lesson is so plain that we think it unnecessary to make more comment but we would to God that more souls would receive and apply it diligently to their lives. First, for the benefit of their own soul and second, that it might show forth his death to the world.

How solemn is this event. These ordinances stand forth as a great memorial to the world, the keeping of which in remembrance of him testifies to the world that his body has been broken and that His blood has been shed that our sins may be forgiven. May He become more real unto us and His love abound more and more in our hearts.

COMMENTS AND APPLICATIONS

The Garden, a favorite place where Jesus often

resorted with the disciples to pray, a blessed opportunity but they failed to take advantage of it. What a privilege today that we may live within the inner circles of God's love where we can hear the whisper "Come ye apart" from every care or anxiety and enjoy communion and fellowship with the Savior. In time of severe trial we may obtain grace to make a complete surrender and come forth with victory.

Notice the humanity of Jesus—exceeding sorrowful—The sins of the entire world upon him, the just for the unjust, learning obedience through suffering. An innocent, loving Saviour experiencing temptation as we do that He may be touched by our infirmities. Although disappointed by those dearest to Him yet he came forth victorious ready to meet the mob and suffer death for us that we may go free. Should we not love the Savior? Yea, with all our heart.

Consider the word "Friend" in our lesson. Strength through weakness. "When I am weak then am I strong."

Divine love brings humility and meekness of heart, melting out self and yielding unto the will of God that He may become our strength. Truly He is our strength.

COMMENTS AND APPLICATIONS

All the lessons for this month are very solemn and should be indeed serious. It is not so important that we should know the kind of material the cross was made from, nor the exact location of the crucifixion. nor just why that place was called Golgotha, nor the location of His tomb: but it behooves us to know for sure that Jesus suffered and died on the cross for us, and that He has risen for our justification. Further than this, we should know that we are covered by His atoning blood spilt on Calvary for us.

Verse 34—Christ chose to die for the sins of the world with his senses unimpaired by pain-easing and sense-dulling drugs.

Verse 35. Read the prophecy in Psalm 22:18. Did the inscription placed over Christ belittle Him or did it further show the divine arrangement of God?

Do we receive the practical application in: "He saved others, Himself he cannot save," and is it not true with us?

Our lesson today teaches that heaven and earth both witnessed that He was the Son of God. When did Christ tell the people that if they held their peace the rocks would cry out and praise Him?

In our temptations, trials, and sufferings, can we so conduct ourselves that those who are looking on will have to testify as did the centurion—Truly this man was the Son of God?

THE SEPULCHER: TRIUMPH OVER DEATH

- 59. And when Joseph had taken the body, he wrapped it in a clean linen cloth,
- 60. And laid it in his own new tomb, which he had hewn out in the rock: and he rolled a great stone to the door of the sepulchre, and departed.
- 61. And there was Mary Magdalene, and the other Mary, sitting over against the sepulchre.

Golden Text: "But now is Christ risen from the dead and become the firstfruits of them that slept." 1 Cor. 15:20.

COMMENTS AND APPLICATIONS

The crucifixion and death which we have been studying would have been a sad tragedy had it not been for the resurrection. Praise God! defeat was turned into victory; Christ was not conquered by death, but was the conqueror of death! The dawn of that first Easter morning brought new hope for life to a people upon whom the death sentence had been passed because of Adam's transgression. Now all who believe on Him can claim the comforting promise: "Because I live, ye shall live also." But before the resurrection can become a living force in the life of any one, that one must hear (believe with the heart) the gospel-good news. He who is saved not only has a precious experience, but also has something to tell others. Can you witness to a world of unbelievers?-"I know Christ lives, because He lives in me."

The death, burial, guard, and Roman seal made a fraudulent resurrection impossible. The human power that was used to keep Christ in the tomb only adds to the strength of the testimony that He arose, triumphant over all His foes. How insignificant were the soldiers and the seal when God intervened!

There are many who let their lights shine when all things are going well, but the world needs more faithful lights that will shine on regardless of dense darkness; even as the women who stood by the cross and continued to labor for Christ when his disciples were scattered and, no doubt, discouraged.

The keepers became as dead men at the appearance of the angel, but he told the women not to fear. The resurrection of Christ brings terror to the servants of sin, but consolation to His servants.

COMMENTS AND APPLICATIONS

In connection with today's lesson, read Mark 16:15-20; Luke 24:47-53; John 21:20; and Acts 11:

They worshipped him: but some doubted—Are you worshipping Him with an unbelieving heart or doubtful mind? Those doubts must be removed before you can be of service to Him. Ask Him to remove your doubts as He did theirs. He "came and spake unto them." Has He ever come to you? Has He ever spoken to you? He will if you desire it with all your heart and meet His conditions.

"All power is given unto me." In Heaven—Power to be the one and only mediator between God and man, power to send the Holy Spirit, and power of judgment.

In Earth—Power to forgive sins, sanctify believers, power over unclean spirits, power over all rulers and kings of the earth, power over all the forces of nature, and power over death.

Surely a servant should have all faith and all confidence in a king who has all power.

Go therefore and teach all nations—This is the great missionary commission, given only to His followers. The Pharisees and other religious factions heard much of Christ's teachings and doctrine but this commission was notfor them because they had not believed from the heart. Modern missionary and teacher, from whence did your commission come from God or man?

Teacher and pupil, do not carelessly pass over the latter part of verse 19. Baptism is essential not because there is merit in the water, but because the Lord commands it.

If one fails to teach all things that Jesus has commanded, deeming the omitted commandments "non-essentials," we, on the authority of God's Word can say that he is not a teacher sent from God.

Lo, I am with you alway—He with whom Jesus always abides, is the only one qualified for a mis mionary or teacher of the gospel of Christ.

What comfort and consolation these words bring to the believer—tho tempted and tried, afflicted of successful, prosperous, etc. "I am with you alway." Then surely "I can do all things through Chris which strengtheneth me."
