Ye Must Be Born Again

"Ye must be born again," were words spoken by Jesus Christ himself. His is the voice that you and I must hear and obey, if we ever get into God's heaven. In Deut. 18:19 we read a prophecy referring to Jesus. In it we learn that Jesus would speak all that God commanded him and that God requires us to hear or hearken unto his words. Jesus was baptized of John and went straightway up out of the water. The Spirit descended like a dove and lit upon him, and the heavens opened. A voice from heaven (God speaking) said, "This is my beloved son, in whom I am well pleased." Matt. 3:17. In the 17th chapter of Matthew we read where Peter, James, and John were with the Lord on the Mount. He was transfigured before them and his face did shine as the sun and his raiment was white as the light. Moses and Elias (Elijah) appeared and talked with him. Peter said it was good to be there and wanted to build three tabernacles, one for Jesus, one for ias, and one for Moses; but God spoke from heaven said, "This is my beloved Son, in whom I am pleased; HEAR YE HIM." Peter rehearsed the cy in the 18th chapter of Deut., and said, "that

every soul, which will not hear that prophet, shall be destroyed from among the people." (Read Acts 3:22, 23.) In the first chapter of 2 Peter, beginning at the 16th verse is another warning from Peter to hear his voice. He refers to the voice that they heard from the "Excellent Glory," and continued to warn us to HEAR HIM.

The voice of Jesus to you, my dear reader, today is, "YE MUST BE BORN AGAIN." Turning over a "new leaf" or making resolutions in your own strength will not do; nothing will avail but a life made NEW. Keeping many of the commandments, going to church, paying the preacher, and merely professing Christ will not do; "YE MUST BE BORN AGAIN."

A man said to me last week, "If I do this good thing and that good thing [meaning the keeping of a number of the commandments], and yet I smoke, would I be a Christian?" I told him that he might do all those good things and not smoke either, and yet he would not be a Christian; for Jesus says, "YE MUST BE BORN AGAIN." If you should do any number of good things, it would only be your self-righteousness; and the Bible says that, "All our righteousnesses are as filthy rags." Isa, 64:6. We must have the righteousness of God in our souls or we are none of His. The only way to have God's righteousness is to be "BORN FROM ABOVE," for Jesus says, "EX-CEPT A MAN BE BORN AGAIN, HE CANNOT SEE THE KINGDOM OF GOD." John 3:3. That is why so many who profess Christ today are blind and cannot see the kingdom of God, but are looking for it in When a soul is truly "BORN some future age. AGAIN," he at once enters into the kingdom of God and can see the kingdom. He will live in the kingdom of God now, and when the earthly house of this tabernacle is dissolved (2 Cor. 5:1), he will put on a glorified body, a "house from heaven," and continue to dwell in the heavenly kingdom. Thus the saying is true, "a saved soul has a heaven to go to heaven in." He is in the kingdom of God now and is reigning with Christ on earth. (Rom. 5:17 and Rev. 5:10).

Jesus told his disciples, "Except your righteousness shall exceed the righteousness of the scribes and Pharisees, ye shall in no case enter into the kingdom of God." Matt. 5:20. The only way that any man can have righteousness that will exceed that of the Pharisees, is to have the righteousness of the Lord dwelling in his soul. That brings us back to our text again: "YE MUST BE BORN A-GAIN."

To retain this born-again experience, we must keep yielded into his hands and be "led by the Spirit of God." Rom. 8:14. The Bibical definition of a Christian is, "Christ-like." If we are not Christ-like we are no Christian in a Bibical sense, no matter how much we profess or how loudly we may say we are sanctified.

While holding a meeting in another state, a man living in the country professed religion and would testify that he was saved and sanctified. But he got angry at his neighbor and they had a fight. I talked to him about it, telling him how wrong it was to fight and injure anyone and how he ought to commit the man to God and let him take care of him. He said that he thought God needed some help sometimes. I pointed out to him how Christ, when he was being slain on the cross by his enemies, said, "Father, forgive them, for they know not what they do"; and when Stephen was being stoned to death, he said, "Father, lay not this sin to their charge"; and that Paul (Rom. 8:9) said, "Now if any man have not the Spirit of Christ, he is none of his." He looked across the table at me with eyes glaring and said, "I am not afraid of you either." By his fruits we knew that he was not even saved, let alone being sanctified.

Peter, speaking of Jesus, said that Christ "suffered for us, leaving us an example, that ye should follow in his steps: who did no sin, neither was guile found in his mouth: who, when he was reviled, reviled not again; when he suffered, he threatened not; but committed himself to him that judgeth righteously: who his own self bare our sins in his own body on the tree, that we, being dead to sins, should live unto righteousness, by whose stripes ye were healed." 1 Peter 2:21-24. To want to fight and injure anyone, even your enemy, would cause you to forfeit your right of being a Christian. It is written, "Vengeance is mine, I will repay, saith the Lord." Rom. 12:19. One who will take vengeance is robbing God of what rightfully belongs to Him. Under this Grace day new covenant one does not have to kill a man to be a murderer, for the scripture teaches us that the one who has hate in his heart is a murderer already (1 John 3:15). The crying need of professed Christians today is to "BE BORN AGAIN." Judging by their fruits, many have never been born again, and the majority of the rest have lost their FIRST LOVE. Brethren, let us not deceive ourselves, but take heed unto the "Sure word of prophecy." Let me repeat again the voice of Jesus, "Verily, verily, [or truly, truly] I say unto thee, Except a man be BORN OF WATER AND OF THE SPIRIT, HE CANNOT ENTER INTO THE KINGDOM OF GOD." Continued obedience to the teachings of the New Testament will mean retaining the "BORN AGAIN" experience. —Fred Pruitt.

Reverence Or Profanity?

Every true child of God has a horror of anything profane. They keep as far from it as possible. They would never think of using the name of our Saviour in any way but in reverence. They would under no circumstances "take the name of God in vain."

I would like to point out that these are not the only ways of indulging in profanity. Anything that is not reverent toward God and his Son and his Word is profanity. There is a form of profanity that is not generally recognized as being such among some of the saints, and particularly the younger saints. That is, quoting from the Word of God lightly, banteringly, punningly, or in such a way as to make entertaining conversation. There are some scriptures indeed, many scriptures that are easily adapted to fit peculiar or amusing circumstances. At the time this practice may seem harmless enough, but let us look into it a little deeper.

In St. John 1:1, we read, "In the beginning was the Word, and the Word was with God, and the Word was God." Again in the 14th verse we read, "And the Word was made flesh, and dwelt among us."

The next time we hear someone quote a scripture as a kind of a pun on some material circumstance, if we should say, "You have just profaned the name of our Saviour," they would perhaps be shocked, but it that not true?

If we want the precious life-giving Word of God

to have all the sweetness and depth of meaning that God means it to hold for us, then lets shun such practices just as we would shun any other evil.

Do you think a scripture used lightly one moment and repeated again later perhaps by the same lips and from the pulpit, would have power to reach deep into the souls of the listeners?

"Thou shalt not live by bread alone, but by every word of God." Lk. 4:4. If we are to live by every word of God, should not every word be as sacred to us as the name of our God, and our dear Saviour and Redeemer, Jesus Christ? Let us keep every word of our God hallowed in our hearts that it may indeed be our meat and drink.

The pamphlets, "Information and Counsel to Conscientious Objectors Of the Church of God as It Relates to the Selective Training and Service Act of 1940," which we have been sending out upon request, are no longer available. Government men (F. B. I.) have been here at the office to investigate the work. There is objection to these pamphlets being sent out, so we have destroyed all that we had in stock, with the exception of two which we shall keep on file in the office. We shall print no more, nor any similar to them. There will be no need for anyone to send for more of them, for we shall have no more to send out. We also ask those who have them not to make use of them.

We can not see where we did any wrong in printing and sending this pamphlet to conscientious objectors as the Constitution of the United States allows one the right to worship God according to the dictates of his own conscience, and also the "Selective Service and Training Act" of 1940 provides for the exemption of truly conscentious objectors and we thought and do believe yet that from a lawful standpoint we were working in harmony with the laws and regulations of our country. We had no other motive in this but to help these poor boys that were real conscientious objectors to know how to get their case before the Draft Board in an intelligent manner to receive recognition from the Board. We thought it would be a help to the Draft Board as well as to the one making the appeal.

By the Grace of God we mean to abide by the rules and regulations of our country as far as we can without rejecting the commandments and teachings of God's sacred and Holy Scriptures. We love our country and believe this democratic form of Government to be the best in the world. Have Faith In God

I feel it is pleasing to the Lord to drop a line to the brethren abroad: Greetings—

I think myself happy to be in the present truth. To know the way of the Lord is one thing, and to do it is still better. I am delighted to be able to report the battles are raging and the victory is real. Many times I think some evade the victories by evading the battles—so it has been always: battles before victories; calm after storm.

There are many things I feel I should address you about; but one thing presses my heart very forcibly; the confidence, hope, trust, and faith in God. Lack of these is the greatest reason why so many nowadays find it hard for them to trust the Lord in sickness, as well as in other ways. Brethren, the only right thing to do when we, as the saints in light, get sick is trust the Lord. That is all that is recommended in the Bible for Christians to do; nothing else is in any degree recommended. I know that trusting the Lord in sickness is not all it takes to be a Christian, but it is a part of a Christian's duty to do so, as we are instructed in James 5:14. Quite a number of us know where the text is, and how it is worded. God has a rule for Christians to go by in His Word; and in sickness he says, "Call for the elders of the church; and let them pray over him, anointing him with oil in the name of the Lord: And the prayer of faith shall save the sick." If you and I want to be saved (meaning healed or saved from sickness) let us do as God has told us, and as sure as heaven itself, we will be healed. As sure as the prayer of faith is prayed, we shall be healed; as sure as it is not prayed, we are likely to remain sick or die.

Folks nowadays have so many excuses for failure to trust the Lord—too many to mention them all, but a few of them may let us see the condition many folks are getting into in these perilous days when we should be closer to God than ever (if any difference). It is an easy thing to profess the Lord, and when we get sick disgrace and dishonor him by resorting to the arm of flesh. I know there are some good doctors, and good men, and we respect them; but while we respect the good-hearted doctors, let us not forget to respect God who has given us, not a remedy, but a cure for all ailments. Let not what some say (perhaps the children) persuade us to do anything, but trust God clean and complete.

I do not want to be too severe on such questions, but, brethren, something must be done to redeem a lot of folks who are posing as saints in light, if they can be redeemed at all; for I am sure the ministry as a whole knows of this great disrespect that is being shown to God by resorting to medical aid, when we have it clearly told us in the Word of God what to do.

"Well," one says, "where is an elder of the church?" If I were such an one as did not know of any, I would be finding out, so if I needed one I would know how to find him. Most of the folks know where the doctor lives or where his place of business is. God has set up business located in James 5:14. He will be there when you arrive, and if prescriptions are followed closely, make your arrangements to arise and walk. If you do not want to walk, stay away from James 5:14, for there is where God meets with his people and heals them.

Some will say, "I don't believe what that old preacher is telling." If you do not believe it, you will not be bothered with healing, for it is for those that believe—and for them only. That old sickening story folks tell—"The children wanted me to have the doctor"—makes me feel faint at heart sometimes, when I know that is not the cause at all. More times than not, it is because the sick one is prone to mistrust God, hence fail to have faith in God. They would rather have the doctor than God. Well, we all can have either one we want. There are plenty of doctors and they will give you almost anything you want, dope if you want it.

No one would want me to pray for them if they knew I had light on the doctrine of divine healing if I were taking medicine and calling the doctor every time I get a little pain or a big one either. We as the ministers of God should let our people know if they do not know that we pray for the sick and that we do not approve of our people calling the medical doctor when they are sick.

"Well," one says, "I thought I was going to die." You probably have been asking God to take you to heaven, and when it begins to look like you were about to get off, you begin to say, "I don't want to go to heaven, call the doctor." In reality, what you do is to bring shame on your pastor and the cause of God fer which you have been professing to stand all these years. Prethren, these things ought not When we as the ministry know that folks know better than to call doctors when sick and know to call the elders, we should encourage them all we can and do all else we can to get their faith built up, for we know the devil is about to destroy faith. But when folks are in good touch with God, faith is one thing that goes with a bright experience of salvation. If we get lukewarm, then faith will ebb away, and there we are without faith to be healed. And this is the greatest cause of failure today when folks fail to trust God for healing when they know it to be a Bible doctrine. We also know sometimes God will and has healed sinners in answer to the prayers of his faithful ministers, and will do so yet if they will confess. And if they have committed sins, they shall be forgiven them. So divine healing is for all that believe.

"And they cried out all at once, saying, away with this man, and release unto us Barabbas:" (Lu. 23:18). Where The Majority Cannot Win

In Matt. 7:13, 14, our Saviour speaks about the strait and narrow way which leads unto life, and the broad way that leads unto death or eternal destruction from the presence of the Lord.

John Bunyan, in "Pilgrim's Progress" tells of Christian's great effort to get through the narrow passage of the wall to the beautiful glorious place that could be seen on the other side, but he found it so narrow that only his soul could get through, thus indicating that to be a genuine true hearted Christian, one must separate himself from hostile worldly ways and not be yoked up with sectish or apostate organizations where a full gospel doctrine that clarifies this complex of confusing selfrighteous ideas, is not preached or practiced. When Christian finally got through the passage of the wall to the eternal rest, peace and glory of that most beautiful place, he said that he was convinced that they who would seek to enter the glory world must be just down-right in earnest about their salvation.

Due to conflicting beliefs and confusion caused by the existence of so many divided bodies or religious sects all at variance one with another, it is most difficult to know who is right unless they are willing, as humble, obedient creatures to sit at the feet of Jesus and learn how to find the only true gateway leading to the realms of glory. So many conflicting beliefs and so many human creeds, ceremonial forms or man-made ways, to find the strait and narrow way to God, only tend to confuse. This is Satan's way and method, and his definite motive is to promote spiritual darkness to defeat or hinder the work of the Lord to redeem his people from the bondage of evil ways.

The true Bible way is defined and made so plain that long years before the coming of the Lord to show God's creatures a more perfect and better way, the great Hebrew prophet, Isaiah, through inspiration of God, made known the wonderful office of Christ and the nature or characteristics of this true holy way in which only Christ and the redeemed (the church) walk (Isa. 35:8-10).

Very often it is said, "Look at our great cathedrals, magnificent, costly church buildings, temples and institutions of learning; moreover, our large membership. Isn't all this an indication that our church and way is the true Bible way?" Positively, all of this does not mean a thing with God, for the followers of the heathen deity Baal perhaps made a similar boast when their wonderful temple city of Baalbeck, in Syria was finished so long ago. Their multitude of worshipers and their great buildings which are now, and have been in ruins for centuries, did not mean a thing toward carrying out God's great plan to make this world a better peaceable and more worthwhile place for mankind to dwell through the wonderful plan of redemption by Jesus Christ, His only begotten Son. John 3: 16.

Deceptive leaders, unwilling to humble and measure up to the fundamentals of a full gospel ministry, have little difficulty in working up a big membership, for so many are eager to join anything that lets down the bars and the way blindly made plain by deception or ignorance, made easy to them, for the less they have to do the better they like it. The greater the heresy deception of any religious organization, the more numerous are its members.

John Bunyan, the immortal dreamer, tells about two characters, Formalist and Hypocrisy, who climbed over the wall to get in the way that Christian was journeying on to the celestial city. When questioned about their illegal act, they replied that they saw no need of entering the strait and narrow way through the gate at the beginning of the way, so they journeyed on for a while and eventually lost their way and perished.

Sectarians say, "What does it matter what form or manner we employ to get in the way? What's the difference, we are all headed for the same heavenly place?" This is where the majority cannot rule, for their easier self-righteous way thus becomes in the end the hardest destructive way, because they have not come through the true gate into the only right way to the celestial city of God. It is this class of people (so-called church members without full salvation) that Christ condemned, Matt. 7:21-23. The Lord Jesus Christ has made it very plain that anyone who seeks a way of their own choosing and not that of the true gospel way, the same is a thief and a robber, John 10:1.

Jesus helps us to find the only true Bible way on conditions and terms of a very reasonable nature, specified in the Word of God, which is opened for every person to search and find out themselves, not to trust deceptive, wrongly led leaders. The very first move is a sense of possessing a guilty, sinful nature or a stricken condemned conscience coupled with godly sorrow and confession leading to a definite


sense of repentance unto salvation, which opens the wicket gate into the strait and narrow way to the eternal city. To get a government position of worth, one must pass a strict Civil Service examination in which there is no deviation or possible way of anyone climbing over the wall to obtain such by misrepresentation or fraud. Certain conditions must absolutely be met by the applicant or disqualification results.

Practical Truth: He who has true spiritual discernment will see in Jesus the glorious Son of God.

COMMENTS AND APPLICATION

Our being, true selves, and hidden thoughts are expressed by our "words," if sincere; so the "eternal Word" Jesus is the expression of the thoughts, will, and being of God. He "the Word," Christ, is distinguished from the Father and yet they are one. When Jesus was here he spoke of the glory he had with the Father before the world was. He left that glory that he might come to this sin-cursed earth and reveal the true nature of God and his thoughts toward men.

A fallen man, though possessor of great intellectual and oratorical talents, could spend his life time trying to describe God, and yet not cause his fellowmen to understand more of the nature of God, because the love of God by which we "know" God would not be in his own heart. "Man by wisdom knows not God."

The law, given through Moses, was a partial and dim revelation of the will and mind of God. Moses was given only a glimpse of dinvine glory. See Ex. 33:18-23. Through the grace of Christ, partial revelations were given to the prophets and holy men of old, and they rejoiced to think of the fuller revelation which was to be made. The prophet Isaiah wrote: "And the glory of the Lord shall be revealed, and all flesh shall see it together; for the mouth of the Lord hath spoken it." Isa. 40:5. This was fulfilled in the coming of Christ, "the Word." "The prophets have inquired and searched diligently, who prophesied of the grace that should come unto you." No longer do men have to grope in darkness concerning God and His will; for he can find it when he finds Christ.

God and his working in the world are symbolized by light and its effects. Man's disobedience or departing from the workings of God is symbolized by darkness and its effects. In other words, Christ, our only means of salvation from sin, is light; sin is darkness. Sin had brought man under the dominion of death. Christ came to impart his life to men. When a soul turns to the Light, He gives them life. Because of the pitiable blindness of their fallen nature, man did not love the Light when it came for it exposed their evil hearts and deeds, so the majority of them turned from the Light and Life, and chose rather to abide in darkness and death. Though they were prepared by prophecy and promise, and warned by His forerunner to repent and get ready to receive Him, "He came to his own, and his own received him not." But, thank God, all did not reject, but repented of their evil deeds, turned to the Light, who imparted life to them. He does the same for those who believe on Him today. Can you truthfully include yourself when you read this part of the 14th verse: "And we beheld his glory?"

- 3. Jesus answered and said unto him, Verily, verily, I say unto thee, Except a man be born again, he cannot see the kingdom of God.
- 4. Nicodemus saith unto him, How can a man be born when he is old? can he enter the second time into his mother's womb, and be born?
- 5. Jesus answered, Verily, verily, I say unto thee, Except a man be born of water and of the Spirit, he cannot enter into the kingdom of God.

Practical Truth: True faith in the Son of God will result in a new birth and in everlasting life.

COMMENTS AND APPLICATION

The conversation between Nicodemus and Jesus is probably one of the most important ever recorded, for in a few simple words the Saviour told of the change which ALL-the high and low, rich and poor, moral and immoral, kings and subjects, learned and unlearned- must undergo before they can have any part in his heavenly kingdom. Many had seen the miracles which he did and were convinced that he had come from God; but probably the majority were like people that we see today. They hear the gospel and admit it is truth, but do not take it personally to the saving of their souls.

Doubtless, Nicodemus considered himself ready to be a subject of the Messiah's kingdom when He should come. But if he had this self confidence, the Lord's answer exposed its error and contradicted the Jewish idea concerning the Messiah and his kingdom. And He laid the foundation of His teaching concerning his king-

It was not to be an earthly kingdom (neither then, nor for a thousand years after he comes the second time), nor would men become its subjects by right of birth, office, or position; but it was to be a spiritual kingdom of which men would become subjects by a spiritual birth. Those who are born again (from above) are those in whom a complete change has been brought about, by means of repentance and the impartation of spiritual power from above. The eye of the soul, being made alive to spiritual things, can then "see the kingdom of God." Only a born-again person can understand the nature of the kingdom of God.

The wind cannot be seen, but we hear the leaves of the trees shaking and see some of them being tossed into space, and see the trees bending to and fro, then we say, "The wind is blowing," because we see the effects of it. We cannot see the Spirit; but we see sinners who hear the gospel, repent, make wrongs right, quit their filthiness of the flesh and spirit, praise God instead of cursing Him, love their enemies instead of hating them; and behold, all things have become new to them; and we know they have been "born of the Spirit" because we see its effects.

It matters not how many good deeds you do, you'll never go to heaven unless the Spirit in you has come down from heaven. Read the account of Moses lifting up the serpent in the wilderness in Num. 21:9. Disobedience caused them to be bitten by the serpents, and obedience brought healing. Disobedience to God causes souls to be bitten by the serpent, the devil; obedience will bring healing. Many are quoting John 3:16 and clinging to it as their hope of eternal life who, by their actions, make Jesus a liar. They think they can get

to heaven without being born again. And still others are clinging to it who have been born again but have failed to obey Christ along other lines, thus failing to retain that spiritual life. If one really believes on Jesus he will obey Him.

Practical Truth: We should follow the example of our Master in seizing opportunities to win others for Christ.

COMMENTS AND APPLICATION

Jesus came to this world to seek and to save that which was lost. In the first part of the chapter he told

his disciple that he must needs go through Samaria. An ordinary Jew would have avoided this route because the Jews had no dealings with the Samaritans. But Jesus' actions were ruled with the desire to win souls and to do always those things that pleased the Father rather than human prejudice and seeking honor of men.

Some tell us that Jesus, being divine, was never tired, and that He could abstain from eating and drinking when an ordinary person could not. In this account we read that he was wearied with the journey. He was truly human as well as the divine Son of God and was tempted in all points as we are. He knows our trials, toils, and wearinesses; but he overcame his humanity, by always submitting his will to the will of his Father. The sinless needs of human nature had to be met with him as well as others. It was a sincere request when he asked for the water, but he took advantage of the opportunity to tell her of greater water. She was occupied with earthly pursuits and knew only of the pleasure of drawing water from earthly wells. A good well was prized highly; hence the question, "Art thou greater?" People cling to those things which are of the greatest value to them, so this same question comes to every individual who has a chance to accept or reject Christ. Each individual must decide the answer for himself. I'eter decided that Christ was greater than his fish; but the rich young ruler decided his riches meant more to him. This woman of Samaria was convinced that Christ was greater to the extent that she forgot her waterpot in her eagerness to tell others about Christ.

Her message was short: "Come, see a man, which told me all things that ever I did." One may try to cover his sins and even profess religion, but when he comes into contact with Christ (or the Holy Spirit), he will be told all things whatsoever he did. We do not know that Jesus spoke one word to Zacchaeus about his sins, but contact with Jesus caused him to be convicted of them and he was willing to restore fourfold all that he had robbed. When an honest-hearted person is convicted of sin, he will make restitution. There is much weight to this method of witnessing for Jesus. "Many . . . believed on him for the saying of the woman, which testified, He told me all that ever I did."

Physical food is essential, but it should not have first place in the life of anyone. Man can be satisfied and made happy to a far greater extent by doing the divine will than by continually partaking of his choice nourishment. At times, men and women who have dedicated their lives to God, have almost forgotten the "meat that perisheth" in the absorption of spiritual work.

In speaking of the harvest, Christ had reference to the spiritual harvest of souls. If they were white already to harvest in Jesus' day, what are they now? Are you concerned? The closer one lives to God, the greater burden he will have for lost souls. Also we need to have a burden for the souls already in the Father's grainery. for many are being carried captive by Satan. It seems that more are backsliding than are getting saved.

JESUS THE GREAT PHYSICIAN

Practical Truth: Christ can heal the diseases of both body and soul.

COMMENTS AND APPLICATION

Bethesda means the house of mercy, and it is thought that this name designates the building which sheltered the afflicted while they waited for the troubling of the water, as well as the pool. How cager people are to seek mercy when their bodies are afflicted! The Bible does not deny that some were healed here, but there was one in a pitiable condition, whose case it would not reach. Can we form a mental picture of this sufferer? Thirty-eight years he had been sorely afflicted, longing to be made whole. Man had extended his mercy in building the shelter which afforded some comforts, but man's mercy was not far-reaching enough. The poet has said, "Poor are earth's comforts, and blind." Then came Jesus, the Great Physician who never lost a case and extended his mercy.

Today, man is able to do much toward comforting and relieving the sick, but there are cases which man cannot reach. No case gets too hard for God, but he can do no mighty works because of unbelief. Have faith in God.

"As he went up to the city, see him at Bethesda's pool, With the man so long in bondage, asking if he would be whole.

Instantly the Savior heals him: "Sin no more," I hear him say.

This he says to every sufferer: "Rise!" He's just the same today.

"Thus he went about his mission, healing lame, and blind,

Casting out all evil spirits, saying to the weak, Be strong. Then he died on cruel Calvary, sin and death to put away; But the tomb could not retain him—he's our living Christ today.

"Just the same today, my brother, saving, healing, cleansing all.

Ready, willing, calling, cheering, all who seek him, great and small.

Come to him, poor weary sufferer, not a moment more delay,

He will give you boundless blessing: for he's just the same today.

Jesus is able to heal body and soul. It was of far greater importance that this man heed the command, "Sin no more," than the command, "Rise, take up thy bed, and walk." Obedience to the latter brought relief to his body, which lasted only a short time and has decayed and returned to dust; but his soul lives on. His soul's comfort in eternity depends on whether he heeded Jesus' command, "Sin no more."

We have seen people, very much afflicted, come to Jesus, who had compassion on them and healed them, body and soul. After they enjoyed health awhile, they were enticed into the ways of sin. In some cases they have become more afflicted than they were at first; but in other cases they have remained well in body. But it is true in all cases that a worse thing has come upon them, for sin is worse than disease.

JESUS THE BREAD OF LIFE

Sunday, January 31, 1943

Practical Truth: Christ is able to satisfy the spiritual hunger of men.

COMMENTS AND APPLICATION

We call bread the staff of life; that is, it sustains physical life. Jesus said, "Man shall not live by bread alone." In this lesson Jesus provided material food for the multitude, but the next day the same people were desiring more material manifestations. Jesus told them that they were seeking him because they ate the loaves and fishes and were filled, and advised them not to labor for these perishing things. He did not mean that it is a sin to earn money for daily bread, for these things are necessary; but we all know that there is no lasting satisfaction in physical food; so Jesus wanted them to put first things first. "Seek ye first the kingdom of God and his righteousness and all these things shall be added unto you." Food to sustain spiritual life should be sought for first. People who are so concerned about feeding their physical body are in a state to let their. souls starve and die.

There are several good topics for discussion in the account of the feeding of the five thousand: "Benefits Derived from Giving All to Jesus," as the lad with the loaves and fishes did; "Moving at Jesus' Word," as the disciples did; and "Jesus Cares for All who Follow Him."

In the last part of our lesson Jesus explained that He was the true bread upon which the soul of man could feed and be sustained. He is the staff of spiritual life. The bread which God gave the children of Israel was a type of the true Bread, Jesus, on whom spiritual Israel (saved people) could feast and be filled with life eternal. The Israelites murmured and were not satisfied with the manna, so God gave them meat according to their request; but it was not good for them. Today, people become dissatisfied with Jesus alone, and God allows them to have their way, but it brings leanness and death to the soul. Some want a little pride, others folly, worldly pleasure, or earthly wisdom, to feed their souls upon; but try as they will to mix these things (even in small quantities) with the true bread of life, and they will make the soul sick. There is only one kind of medicine that will cure such sickness: that is, a dose of repentance to rid the soul of poison substance, then return to the former diet of the body and blood of Jesus. "Whoso eateth my flesh, and drinketh my blood hath eternal life; and I will raise him up at the last day."
