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Keys of The Kingdom

"And I will give unto thee the keys of the kingdom of heaven: and whatsoever thou shalt bind on earth, shall be bound in heaven; and whatsoever thou shalt loose on earth, shall be loosed in heaven." Matt. 16:19.

Shortly after this declaration, Jesus with Peter, James, and John went up into a high mountain where our Savior was transfigured. The disciples had been down through Galilee with Jesus and had heard His wonderful discourses and had seen the amazing mir-

acles of the Lord or His marvelous works that so astonished them. The time and opportunity had now arrived that they were to no longer be content to just sit and listen to the Lord's words or to see the power of God demonstrated by Him. They were given to understand that there was a great work ahead for them to do.

The words "keys of the kingdom" in the text symbolizes and signifies wisdom, knowledge, authority, and power vested in them by the Spirit and power of God through His beloved Son, Jesus Christ, the redeemer of mankind.

How worthless is dead, cold, formal, aristocratic, dignified piety of feeling that one has nothing to do but sit still as though living in a freezing atmosphere, prayerless, and void of a heart-felt testimony to the saving power of Christ. So many professing church members in the many religious organizations appear to know little or nothing of the everlasting joy and unspeakable values of a full gospel salvation from all sin.

The great Hebrew prophet Isaiah, by revelation from God 700 years B. C., spoke of the ungodly as being in bonds and in prison at Satan's good pleasure. He fully sensed the great work and the golden opportunity and privilege of the faithful laborers who would co-operate with the Lord in that glorious new dispensation of the Lord that was to come, in the following words, "To open the blind eyes, to bring out the prisoners from the prison, and them that sit in darkness [sin] out of the prison house." (42:7) "To proclaim liberty to the captives, and the opening of the prison to them that are bound." (61:1) 2 Tim. 2:26 we also read, "And that they may recover themselves out of the snare of the devil, who are taken captive by him at his will." Dear souls, you who are locked up in the dark, foul dungeon and prisons of Satan, your greatest enemy who delights to cheat you out of your rich heavenly inheritance, get serious-minded, flee

the wrath to come by seeking with all your heart to find and to know God. "Know Ye Not That Ye Are The Temple Of God?"

"Know ye not that ye are the temple of God, and that the Spirit of God dwelleth in you?" In the Greek it reads, "Do you not know, That you are a temple of God, and that the Spirit of God dwells among you? If any one destroy the temple of God, God will destroy him: for the temple of God is holy, which you are." 1 Cor. 3:16, 17. Now let us read 1 Cor. 6:19, 20 as it is written in the Emphatic Diaglott: "What! Do you not know that your body is a temple of that holy Spirit in you, which you have from God? Besides, you are not your own; for you were bought with a price; glorify God, then, in your body." In 2 Cor. 6: 14-18 we read Paul's words from the Greek, "Be not unequally yoked with unbelievers; for what participation has righteousness with iniquity? or what communion has light with darkness? and what accordance has Christ with Belia? or what portion has a believer with an unbeliever? And what connection has God's temple with idols? for we are a temple of the living God; as God said, I will dwell among them, and walk among them; and I will be their God, and they shall be to Me a people. Wherefore, depart from the midst of them, and be separated says the Lord, And touch not the impure: and I will receive you, and I will be to you for a Father, and you shall be to Me for sons and daughters, says the Lord Almighty."

In reading about Solomon's temple, we learn how grand it must have been; made of hewn stones, cedars, and precious stones, carved to represent fruit, and overlaid with gold, and mammoth stones for its foundation. Great wealth was bestowed upon it. And while Jacob's descendants were true to God, He remained among them, and fought their battles for them: He dwelt above the mercy seat, in the Most Holy Place. And, so it is with us, so long as we keep God in our hearts and keep our hearts free from every defilement, and not fellowship the unrighteous. must keep ourselves in the love of God. All labors, thought, and toil that we have about earthly things are vain, as all earthly things will perish with the using; but when we place our affections on things above and labor, toil, and think upon things above, it is not vain, but will bring eternal rewards. Our treasures will then be laid up in heaven, where moth and rust doth not corrupt, nor thieves break through and steal.

This eighth verse pictures them as dead bodies lying in the streets of the great city which spiritually is called Sodom and Egypt. Sodom and Egypt symbolize sectism or the multitude of man-made churches which are in the world today and were in the world when John wrote this book of Revelation.

These sects hold onto the Word but will not practice all of it, and in that sense the word is as a dead body. They claim to have the Holy Spirit but will not allow Him to rule in their lives, therefore this witness is dead. It is a great city because nearly all religious people are decoyed into some part of it.

This great city of Sodom and Egypt existed when Jesus was here. A number of sects then claimed to be the people of God but they had the two witnesses dead. When Christ came and began to proclaim the truth, they immediately began to seek to kill him because his life and teaching were a con-tinual reproof to their self righteousness. These builders had no place for him in their building, and the scripture was fulfilled which reads, "The stone which the builders rejected has become the head of the corner." So they slew our Lord in Sodom and Egypt, that great city of sectism or man-made churches, and they have him slain among them now, and have Barabbas loose, who makes sedition and is a murder-(Luke 23:18, 19.) The Devil has a thousand preachers in the world today to the Lord's one. Men are waxing worse and worse, deceiving and being deceived. 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(Continued from Page 3.) tomorrow is cast into the oven, shall he not much more clothe you, O ye of little faith? Therefore take no thought, saying, What shall we eat? or What shall we drink? or, Wherewithal shall we be clothed? (For after all these things do the Gentiles [unsaved people] seek:) for your heavenly Father knoweth that ye have need of all these things. But seek ye first the kingdom of God, and his righteousness; and

all these things shall be added unto you."

These words from the lips of Jesus, who has all power both in heaven and in earth (Matt. 28:18) ought to cause us who know God, or rather are known of him to have so much faith and confidence that we would do just what he told us to do: seek his righteousness and kingdom first and continue in them without any fear. When we do this, he will fulfill all of his promises to us in supplying all our needs. An abundance of scriptures in God's sacred word verify Jesus' words that he has all power both in heaven and in earth. To encourage our faith, we shall copy a few of them.

"And there was given him dominion, and glory, and a kingdom, that all people, nations, and languages should serve him: his dominion is an everlasting dominion, which shall not pass away, and his kingdom that which shall not be destroyed." Daniel 7:14.

"He shall be great, and shall be called the son of the highest: and the Lord God shall give unto him the throne of his Father David: And he shall reign over the house of Jacob [saved people] for ever; and of his kingdom there shall be no end." Luke 1:32.

"Which he wrought in Christ, when he raised him from the dead, and set him at his own right hand in the heavenly places, Far above all principality, and power, and might, and dominion, and every name that is named, not only in this world, but also in that which is to come; And hath put all things under his feet, ["Hath put" means He has already done it.] and gave him to be the head over all things to the Church, which is his body, the fulness of him that filleth all in all." Eph. 1:20-23.

"Who is gone into heaven, and is on the right hand of God; angels and authorities and powers being made subject unto him." 1 Peter 3:22.

In the face of all these plain scriptures that are so positive in their declaration of Jesus Christ having all power and dominion over all the powers that be; I say, how can any one doubt Him by putting faith in earthly things? Especially, how can saints make such a high profession of faith in God then put their trust in earthly things and companies of men by insuring their lives? When they do this, it proves they are afraid that somewhere in the future they or some of their loved ones will not have the Heavenly Father's care and will need earthly companies bound by earthly laws and regulations to supply them. Such actions are insulting to the allwise and aimighty God who has so plainly told us of His unlimited and all-mighty power and willingness to supply all of our needs according to his riches in glory.

In Jeremiah 17:5 we read, "Thus saith the Lord: Cursed be the man that trusteth in man, and maketh flesh his arm [Saints should make Christ their arm.] and whose heart departeth from the Lord." People who put their trust in earthy things depart from God and God has pronounced a curse upon such actions; not only upon the actions, but also upon the man who does such things. We are not surprised at people who are unsaved and have no faith in God doing such things, because they know no better; but for saints, who claim to know God and to believe and practice his word and teachings, to deny Him in this way would be grievous to Him, indeed, to say the least, and it would show to our fellow-men that we do not believe and practice what we teach and profess. Jesus would class us with the Pharasees of whom he said, "They say and do not." We would be saying we have faith in God, but would be practicing otherwise.

Let us now consider some things which saints should shun or they will give way to the earthly instead of the heavenly life.

Those who endorse wars, or participate in the same, are acting contrary to the Spirit of Christ and feeding the earthly man, which will bring death to the soul. My dear brother and sister, in Matt. 5:44, Jesus says, "But I say unto you, love your enemies, bless them that curse you, do good to them

that hate you, and pray for them which despitefully use you, and persecute you; [What for, Lord?] That ye may be the children of your Father which is in heaven." How plain the Lord talks to us about the matter. If we do otherwise, the inference is that we would not be the children of our heavenly Father.

James tells us very plainly why we have wars and fightings among us. "From whence came wars and fightings among you? Came they not hence, even of your lusts [carnal, earthly part of man] that war in your members? Ye lust, and have not: ye kill, and desire to have, and cannot obtain: ye fight and war, yet ye have not, because ye ask not. Ye ask, and receive not, because ye ask amiss, that ye may consume it upon your lusts. Ye adulterers and adulteresses, know ye not that the friendship of the world is enmity with God? Whosoever therefore will be a friend of the world is the enemy of God." James 4:1-4.

Another thing that is earthly and of the world is politics. The saint of God has no business giving his time and attention to such things for he is an ambassador of heaven. Saints are here to represent heavenly things to men and point souls to Jesus Christ, who we believe and know has all power both in heaven and in earth. He has power to put in earthly rulers and to take down earthly rulers. This is very plainly stated in Daniel 4:17, "This matter is by the decree of the watchers [angels], and the demand by the word of the holy ones [the Trinity. For what purpose?] to the intent that the living [you and I] may know that the Most High ruleth in the kingdoms of men [these earthly kingdoms] and giveth it to whomsoever he will, and setteth up the basest of men." In Daniel 2:20, we read, "Daniel answered and said, Blessed be the name of God forever and ever; for wisdom and might are his: And he changeth the times and the seasons: he removeth kings, and setteth up kings: he giveth wisdom unto the wise, and knowledge to them that know understanding. He revealeth the deep and secret things: he knoweth what is in the darkness, and the light dwelleth with Him."

We, as saints, know that this earth and all that is in it will perish with the using and that God is controlling above all the evil powers that are at work and letting men have earthly rulers and governors as they are in soul. Why should we trouble ourselves about such things? Jesus said, "Render therefore unto Caesar the things that are Caesar's and unto God the things that are God's." right and godly in us to obey governors and rulers so long as they do not interfere with our obedience to God. Pay honest taxes and speak not evil of rulers but honor them as God places them in these earthly places. When we honor and respect them, we honor God; but we should never obey them when God's word and Spirit teach us otherwise, for God has first place in a saint's heart, and we ought to obey God rather than man or governments; for we have been purchased with His precious blood and we are not our own. We belong to Him, soul,

body, and spirit. There is an abundance of people in the world that are earthly; let them attend to politics. To that one who wants to get into earthly politics, Jesus would say, "Let the dead take care of dead things but go thou and preach the kingdom of God." One man wanted to follow Jesus but first wanted leave to go and bury his father, but Jesus said, "Let the dead bury their dead." There are but few in the world today who will give themselves, their time and talents to God without reserve, therefore there are millions to look after politics and earthly things.

God is allowing all men to do as they please now, but He will bring them into judgment. Let us, as saints, please to please the Lord all the time.

Of all the writers and those on record in the New Testament, where do we hear of any of them mixed up in politics? When they asked taxes of Jesus and the disciples, he had Peter to catch a fish that had a coin in its mouth and the tax was paid, that they be not offended. Paul exhorts the saints to honor the rulers and not to speak evil of them; but they should not mix up in the earthly things, for Paul said, "I keep under my body and bring it into subjection lest after I have preached to others, I myself be a cast-away." He was not of the world even as Christ and the disciples were not of the world.

Another thing that is very grievous in the sight of God is conforming to this world. Paul said, "Be not conformed to the world." Romans 12:2. Saints who conform to the customs, fashions, and fads of this world are earthly and show that they love and fear the world more than God. Worldly people dress immodestly, and many very indecently. Their customs should not be conformed to by saints of God. The wearing of gold, pearls, costly array; the putting on of unnecessary articles, such as ribbons, laces, and neckties is conforming to the world, and is condemned by the sacred word of God. One may say that the necktie is not a thing of the world; but that is not true, for it is a needless article and is put on for show and to be like the world. The world must have it on, and the soldiers are compelled to have it on, and those who do not want to bear any reproach will want it on; it is of the earthly man. Oh, that saints would be not of the world, then would Zion shine forth as in the morning time and God's blessings and favors would be mightily upon her! -Fred Pruitt

The experiences he has had with the Lord during this time will surely prove to be of resent and future benefit to him.

Another young man of the Guthrie congregation, oel Anderson, reported for induction into the Army 1 April 20. His classification calls for non-commant service. He and his wife, whose name was remerly Evelyn Janes, have two children. Let us any for this and the many other homes where the other has been taken away. Added responsibilities all upon the mother in caring for and bringing up the children in the fear and admonition of the Lord.

Here is some belated news of interest to the saints in regard to Bro. Marshall Tucker of the Guthrie congregation. This young man had gotten saved and was baptized some months prior to his induction into the armed forces about two years ago. Thereafter he objected to and refused to take up arms in training. For this act of disobeying a superior officer he was sentenced to five years in the Federal prison at Leavenworth, Kansas. Later the sentence was reduced to two years and on good behavior he was released in about 18 months. He arrived home last December in time for the Assembly meeting. Many prayers of the saints had gone up in his behalf, and through this test and the time in prison the Lord kept him with victory, and his testimony is an inspiration to the congregation. Though he was given a dishonorable discharge from the army, I am confident that he conducted himself honorably before the Lord. It was a case where, as the Apostle Peter expressed it, "We ought to obey God rather than man."

The writer and editor of this Young People's section was called up for his pre-induction physical examination on March 9. Having passed this examination and retained in class 4-E, I am now subject to call to be sent to a Civilian Public Service Camp. If the Lord permits and the usual procedure is followed, I will be leaving here within a period of weeks. I believe I am conscerated to do the Lord's will and tollow out His plan for my life. We solicit your earnest prayers that His will be done. Should we have to go, please pray for the protection and care of the family, a fine consecrated wife and two small sons.

Several months ago when this draft question and other problems were confronting me, I earnestly sought the Lord and His word for knowledge and consolation. The Lord gave me for my own the scripture found in Rev. 2:10; "Fear none of those things which thou shalt suffer: behold, the devil shall cast some of you into prison, that ye may be tried; and ye shall have tribulation ten days: be thou faithful unto death and I will give thee a crown of life." The first part of this text, "Fear none of those things which thou shalt suffer," keeps ringing in my soul, and I know I can go forward boldly with His neverfailing promises and presence with me. Except we deny our self, take up our cross daily and follow him, we cannot be His disciple. The way to heaven is the way of the cross. God's way is a direct cross to the way the world is going, and how few are willing to stand with the Lord in opposition to the vast worldly

Those who are called to believe on Christ to the salvation of the soul are also at the same time called to suffer for Him. This truth is expressed in Phil. 1:29, where we read, "For unto you it is given in the behalf of Christ, not only to believe on him, but also to suffer for his sake." Futhermore, we read

PAUL CROSSES INTO EUROPE Sunday, May 7, 1944

Practical Truth: Before the Christian there is a glorious future toward which he does well to press or through wholehearted service for Christ.

COMMENTS AND APPLICATION

After the Lord by His Spirit showed Paul that He had chosen him for a special work, he with Barnabas went to different cities in Asia Minor, preaching the gospel, then returned to Antioch from whence they started. Some of the results of this first missionary journey were studied April 23. The events of last Sunday's lesson took place after they had returned to Antioch. For some time they stayed in Antioch "teaching and preaching the word of the Lord." Then Paul decided to "go again and visit our brethren in every city where we have preached the word of the Lord, and see how they do." He took Silas and started his second missionary journey. They visited churches which he had established on his first trip. He had been stoned at Lystria, but his labors there had not been in vain, for when he returned he found Timothy who was such a promising young man he took him along. They had plans to go one way, but the Lord directed them another way. While spending a night at Troas, Paul had a vision. A man of Macedonia (in Europe) stood by him, and said, "Come over into Macedonia and help us." He obeyed the vision, and they (Luke joined them at Troas.) went to Philippi which is "the chief city of that part of Macedonia." The conversion of Lydia was the first visible result. Here a church was established which is well known in early church history.

The historical part of Paul's missionary journey is interesting, but let us go deeper than that for a practical application. Think what it would have meant to us if Paul had not been willing to leave home and friends and suffer the loss of all things for Christ. We can scarcely imagine what great changes took place in the world because Paul and his company crossed into Europe.

We cannot do all that Paul did, but we can all be earnest in serving the Lord and as obedient to His leadings as Paul was. We have a debt to pay to those who are unsaved, Untold suffering might be the result of just one saint neglecting his duty. It is a dangerous thing to be "at ease in Zion," yet many are guilty of this who testify that they live above sin. Untold blessings wil come to the human race by the faithfulness of one saint

The second part of our lesson is part of a letter which Paul wrote to the Philippian church when he was

prisoner at Rome.

"Mine own righteousness" is that which is worked out in one's own strength by keeping the letter of the law When one yields to Christ, the Lord gives him a new hear and he does right because it is in his heart to do so This righteousness comes by faith through the cleansing blood of Jesus.

Man can never know Christ by studying books writte about Him. A personal soul-contact is necessary. Th power of His resurrection is that power which He give His believers which enables them to triumph over th death of sin.

One must press to get into the way of the Lord, an press to keep in it. Things which hinder our pressin forward should be forgotten, or left behind.

PAUL IN THESSALONICA

- For neither at any time used we flattering wore as ye know, nor a cloak of coveteousness; God is witner
- 6. Nor of men sought we glory, neither of you, r yet of others, when we might have been burdensome, the apostles of Christ.
- 7. But we were gentle among you, even as a nur cherisheth her children.
- 8. So being affectionately desirous of you, we we willing to have imparted unto you, not the gospel of G only, but also our own souls, because ye were dear unto

- 9. For ye remember, brethren, our labor and travail: for laboring night and day, because we would not be chargeable unto any of you, we preached unto you the gospel of God.
- 10. Ye are witnesses, and God also, how holily and justly and unblameably we behaved ourselves among you that believe:
- 11. As ye know how we exhorted and comforted and charged every one of you, as a father doth his children.
- 12. That ye would walk worthy of God, who hath called you unto his kingdom and glory.

Golden Text: "Rejoice evermore. Pray without ceasing. In everything give thanks." 1 Thess. 5:16-18.

Practical Truth: Paul set for all time a worthy example of evangelistic and pastoral labors.

COMMENTS AND APPLICATION

When Paul went to a city where there was a Jewish synagogue, his custom was to preach in it first.

The fact that Jesus had been crucified kept many of the Jews from believing that He was the promised Messiah. Paul showed them from the Old Testament, which the Jews recognized as being inspired of God, that it was prophesied that He would suffer. If you had been in Paul's place, could you have proved this same thing to them?

Paul had a genuine love and concern for those who accepted Christ, and though the nature of his work as an evangelist made it necessary for him to establish a church then go on to other needy fields, yet as a good pastor, he often prayed for those left behind and often sent others to see how they were prospering in the Lord.

Some time before he wrote the letter, part of which is the second part of our printed portion, he had sent Timothy back to Thessalonica to see how the congregation there was prospering. After Timothy returned with a favorable report, Paul wrote to them to further encourage them and express his satisfaction over the good news that his labor among htem had not been in vain.

In verse two Paul refers to the time when he and Silas were beaten and put into the jail at Philippi. Tho they were severely persecuted there for preaching the gospel, they went on to Thessalonica and continued to preach boldly. Had they been seeking honor of man, they would have changed their message of truth which always brought persecution, to one which would "tickle he ears" of the hearers. It was God who called Paul and tent him forth to preach; it was God's approval that he vanted; and it was God's reward for which he was striving; therefore he was determined to fulfill his mission. It is quite natural for one to strive to please the one who has hired him if he wants to keep his job. For this reason reachers who are sent out by man-made churches, strive o please man rather than God.

Paul's love for the souls of men and for God's cause, rompted him to put forth every effort to set a good xample while he was among them. Notice how he desribed his conduct and see if you could truthfully recomnend yourself likewise. You don't have to be a minister of set a good example: In his speaking he used no deceit, or uncleanness, nor guile, nor flattering words. Tell he meaning of these words and discuss how and for that purpose preachers would practice them. In conduct mong them he was gentle, holy, just, and unblameable, le was affectionately desirous of them and labored night and day because his desire to do all he could for their puls was so great,

- 3. And because he was of the same craft, he abode with them, and wrought: for by their occupation they were tentmakers.

COMMENTS AND APPLICATION

Paul's stay in Athens was short, but not too short for him to deliver to them the message of Salvation. Some accepted, but we have no record of a congregation being established there.

The first part of our lesson is only an introduction to the account of his labors in Corinth. Read the full account in Acts 18:1-18. Corinth was notorious for its

wickedness. Many of the converts to Christianity there had not practiced a high standard of moral living before they were saved so Paul was confronted with many problems in dealing with them as a church. Some of these problems are mentioned in the epistle to them, which we call 1 Cor. First he mentioned many things which they should not do, then in the thirteenth chapter explains what divine love in one's heart will make of him. Is it not a good picture of a Christian? Are you so filled with divine love that people will think of you when reading this description?

Love includes patience, kindness, generosity, humility, courtesy, unselfishness; does not boast nor show off, is never glad when others go wrong, is calm under trying circumstances, does not hold grudges, and will last when everything else has failed or ceased to be.

Following is Moffatt's translation: "Love knows no jealousy; love makes no parade, gives itself no airs, is never rude, never selfish, never irritated, never resentful; love is never glad when others go wrong, love is gladdened by goodness, always slow to expose, always eager to believe the best, always hopeful, always patient."

PAUL ENCOURAGES THE CORINTHIANS Sunday, May 28, 1944

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Daily Readings and Meditations

May 22 to 27.

COMMENTS AND APPLICATION

God's true ministers have but one aim in preaching and that is to help the souls of men to see the light of the gospel of Christ. To do this each minister must kee himself hid in Christ so that only Christ may be seen

Bro. Orr has written about two ministers. After one had preached, the congregation said, "What a wor derful preacher we have." After the other preache they said, "What a wonderful Saviour we have." Thos who consciously use "enticing words of man's wisdom are preaching "self," not "Jesus."

Man's body, which is earthly, perishes, or decays, a does all earthly things; but when the soul is alive : God, it is fed by the Spirit, and age only brings to added strength. Paul's afflictions seemed to be as greas any human could bear, but he called them "light" b cause he was comparing them with the glory which I would afterward receive. If a Christian should look the trials, afflictions, and the burdens of the cross this life, he would give up in despair; but when he co siders the glory to be gained if he continues to keep the right attitude of soul in them and the shortness of th life compared to eternity, this eclipses the sufferin Let us look more at the eternal things, than the tempor things.

Paul compared our earthly bodies to a tabernacle tent, which is not a permanent dwelling; and the glo fied bodies, which the Lord will give when we succes fully complete this life for Him (He said "We know. to a building or permanent dwelling.

Satan tries to constrain people to do things f him through habit, love for the praise of men, love 1 comfort, etc.; but Jesus constrains through love. I love in coming to this world, bearing the shame a reproach which was heaped upon him by sinful m when he could have had the praise of angels, and dying for us to rescue us from our dead state of should be constraint enough to break the hardest hea Sometimes people are constrained to do right becau of respect for parents and their childhood training; 1 one is not where God wants him to be until he is mov to act right because Christ's dying love has conquered heart. Then he would do all that he does to the glory God, and not please self, but Christ.

If there has been no time in your life when things passed away and all things became new, you : not yet in Christ; you are still dead; Christ's love dying for you has profited you nothing; and the o
