The Cross

A man wrote to a minister, and this is what he said, "We want encouragement from pastors, not discouragement, NOT A CROSS."

Jesus said, "If any man will come after me, Let him DENY himself [or renounce himself is that thot: Let him RENOUNCE HIMSELF] and take UP HIS CROSS and FOLLOW ME." Matt. 16:24. And that, my young friends, means a CROSS IN THIS LIFE. Other words, where there is NO CROSS, NO CROWN; NO CROSS, NO CHRISTIAN; NO CROSS, NO CRIMSON FOUNTAIN; NO CROSS, NO CHRIST; NO CROSS, NO CALLING.

Friend, God Loves You

"For the Son of man is come to seek and to save that which is lost." Luke 19:10. This Scripture was uttered by the Lord immediately after he had saved Zacchaeus, the man who was chief among the publicans and was lost in sin. In the third verse of this chapter we find that he was seeking for Jesus. It reads: "He sought to see Jesus who he was." Since Zacchaeus was little of stature and the people were thronging Jesus, he could not see Him. But he was not to be baffled with such, for he was seeking the Lord. He ran ahead of the crowd and climbed up into a sycomore tree, for he knew Jesus was to pass that way. He put forth some effort to find the Lord, and gave no heed to those who would laugh at him for running and climbing up into the tree, for he was intent on seeing the Lord.

If sinners would seek the Lord now as faithfully as Zacchaeus did, they too could see and be saved from their lost condition.

The Lord was also looking for Zacchaeus. As he looked up into the tree and saw him there, he bade him come down, saying, "For today I must abide at thy house." This was more than Zacchaeus was expecting—the Lord will always do more for us than we are expecting. It is said that Zacchaeus made haste and came down. He also did something else, he received him joyfully.

Zacchaeus was so thankful at heart that Jesus would give attention to him—he felt very unworthy of the Lord's notice—that he stood before the Lord and said, "Behold, Lord, the half of my goods I give to the poor, and if I have taken anything from any man by false accusation, I restore him fourfold." Then words of comfort fell from the lips of the Saviour, and he said unto him, "This day is salvation come to this house, forasmuch as he also is a son of Abraham."

These were blessed and heavenly words to this

sinner man, for salvation means deliverance from sin. It means that the lost has been found and restored back to the Father's house and embrace. It means that the one who was dead in trespasses and sins has been resurrected to life in God and now can sense the favors and blessings of God and know that he has passed from death unto life because he loves the brethren. When Jesus saw and knew that Zacchaeus believed and was saved and restored from his lost state, he said, "For the Son of man is come to seek and to save that which was lost." Souls that really seek the Lord with a whole heart can have that same experience today, for Jesus is just the same.

We find another illustration of one getting saved recorded in the 15th chapter of Luke. In this writing, the lost one is called the prodigal son who took his portion of goods and went into a far country and there wasted all in riotous living (or sinful living). Being in a far country would mean that a sinner is far away from God and needs to do some coming back. Jesus says, "Come unto me, all ye that labor and are heavy laden, and I will give you rest" (soul rest). Sinners need to break off from their sins and come to God through Christ.

This prodigal son joined himself to a citizen of that country. Sinners do that today when they join lodges, secret orders, insurance companies, sect churches, etc. All these things are of the world and far away from God, and never satisfy the soul. While people try to feed on these husks of the world, their souls are starving to death for want of heavenly food. Swine represent men with hoggish natures that never get enough and have nothing to give to satisfy the hunger of a soul which craves the things of heaven and of God. He found no man that could give him the true riches that would satisfy his soul. Finally he came to himself or was awakened to the fact that the hired servants of his father's had plenty to eat and to spare, but he had acted the fool and left the true riches of his father's house, and now was in starvation and death. He realized, "I must do something, or perish."

Dear sinner friend, you are in this same condition and unless you come to God in repentance as the prodigal you will perish and be banished from his presence forever. This young man was in the valley of decision, and he made the wise choice. He said: "I will arise and go to my father, and will say unto him, Father, I have sinned against heaven, and before thee, and am no more worthy to be called thy son: make me as one of thy hired servants." He put the decision into action and arose and went.

Dear one, sinner or backslider, you are going to have to do something about this condition if you want Father's forgiveness and embrace. So the prodigal started home to Father's house with a heavy broken heart, feeling ashamed of his rebellion and haughtiness and was going back just to seek favor enough to be taken in as a hired servant. But the great heart of our Father God was yearning for this wayward son and was looking for him to return. When he was yet a great way off the Father saw him, had compassion on him, ran to meet him, fell on his neck and

kissed him. Oh, can you imagine the joy that must have been the son's with his mistreated Father's arms around him and the kisses of love and affection upon his forehead? Nevertheless, the son so sorely realized the wrong he had done his Father that he said, "I have sinned against heaven and in thy sight, and am no more worthy to be called thy son." The Father freely forgave him and brought him to the house. The whole household of servants and all were rejoicing. They killed a calf and made a feast. They ate and were merry, for the Father said: "This my son was dead [folks who are in sin and of the world are dead to God] and is alive again; he was lost and is found." People who are joined up with the world are lost and on the broad way to destruction.

Dear sinner friend and backslider, the heavenly Father, who loves your soul, has prepared a love feast for you. The fatlings are killed, the dinner is prepared (Matt. 22:4); and it is up to you to return to God through repentance and belief in Jesus Christ. His blood that atones for your sins has already been shed on Calvary's cross. It is up to you now to come back, forsaking the world and all sin, believe on the Lord Jesus Christ with a penitent heart, eat of his prepared supper, and live forever with God the Father. Do it now while you have life in your body and the right use of your senses. Tomorrow may be too late. "Behold, now is the day of salvation." Today is your day; so do not harden your heart against the wooing of His Spirit. Man—His Destiny

That so encouraged our hearts, up-built our faith in God that we moved forward with the printing, and

We now have it in booklet form, so others can read and hear the message that was delivered under the anointing of the Spirit. The 16-page booklet, which exposes the modern gift of tongues, is about the best I ever read on this subject. It was delivered at Waco, Texas. These booklets are free for the asking.

In the December issue of the "Faith and Victory" paper, we wrote some thoughts on the subject of the sin nature that man received by Adam's transgression, and how through Christ we are delivered and made free from that state of polution. One brother told me that I did not explain my teaching very clearly; so, by the help of the Lord, I'll try to do some explaining to clear up the deficiency.

First, I want to say that when I am writing under the inspiration of the Spirit, I try to make it as condensed as possible in order to save space, trusting God to make the truth clear to all honest souls.

This sin nature, which passed upon all men by Adam's transgression, is the very thing that made it necessary for Christ to shed his precious blood on Calvary's cross that we might be justified and freed from every sin committed and cleansed from that unrighteousness or sin nature that had passed upon us by Adam's transgression (Rom. 5:12). The Pharisees were offended at Christ, and the Lord said, "Every plant which my heavenly Father has not planted, shall be rooted up." Some think that Christ meant that the Pharisees as a sect should be rooted up; nevertheless, be that as it may, we do know that the religious Pharisees who opposed Jesus and rejected him, not only manifested the indwelling sin, but were also full of sin and unrighteous acts, and could not have been saved at all. They were possessors of that root of evil and sin nature; they had the planting of Satan in their souls, and by their hatred and evil acts against our Holy Christ, proved that they possessed the same evil nature that Cain manifested against his righteous brother Abel. Those that believed on Christ as the Saviour who would take away that sin by his blood, became justified; not by keeping the Mosaic law, but because they believed and followed Christ and received his teachings. They became stronger and had an experience far above a law experience, and found that they could live free from committing sins and from

condemnation, with the few exceptions, when the carnal, sinful nature, which could not be cleansed away before His blood was shed, would disturb them under temptations and lack of knowledge combined. We must remember that the disciples were with Christ for three years or more, and we only have record of a few times when the carnal sinful nature got the best of them, and they committed sin. Most all the time they were living free from sinning, and were free from condemnation. The Lord gave them power to preach the kingdom, to heal the sick, and also to cast out devils. No law experience would give them that power. They lived free from sinning, almost all the time, insomuch that Jesus told them just before he was going to be crucified (John 15:3), "Now ye are clean through the word which I have spoken unto you." No doubt, he meant by this statement, that by following him, receiving his teaching, and living free from sinning, they were clean as far as one could be in a justified state, and they would be ready for the sacrifice he was going to make by giving his blood to cleanse them from the sinful and carnal nature that they had suppressed by keeping his teachings.

In the seventh chapter of Romans, Paul was telling his experience when in sin and had that indwelling sin within him, which made him wretched and caused him to do those things that were evil and sinful in the sight of God. The experience Paul gives in this seventh chapter is not the experience of a justified man under grace; but of one living in sin, and that sin nature (or indwelling sin, as he calls it) is causing him to do evil and is bringing death to his soul. His experience, as he relates it in this seventh chapter, would be in harmony with the experience of one under deep conviction, wanting to do right, but because of the power of sin in him (or the indwelling sin that passed upon all men because of Adam's transgression) he would do evil or wrong. He could not get free from sin and condemnation until he turned to Christ. In the eighth chapter, he has found Christ, believed on Him, and is free from sin and condemnation; for he says in the first verse: "There is therefore now no condemnation to them which are in Christ Jesus, who walk not after the flesh, but after the Spirit. For the law of the Spirit of life in Christ Jesus has made me free from the law of sin and death."

No man is ready to be baptized with the Spirit, or sanctified wholly, unless he is living free from committed sins in a justified state. Jesus makes this plain in John 14:15, 16, 17. In Romans 12:1, where Paul is instructing them to consecrate, he calls them brethren, and exhorts them to present their bodies a living sacrifice, holy, acceptable unto God, which is their reasonable service.

My experience in getting saved and then sanctified (filled with the Holy Spirit) agrees exactly with the Word of God.

I was living on a farm at that time, on the plains of New Mexico. I was not attending meeting, nor did I have anyone to teach me but the Lord. I got under deep conviction because of my sins. By confessing my sins and repenting, I received peace in my soul from God and had no condemnation on my soul; neith-

er did I sin, as I was careful to please Him in everything that I knew. Day by day for two months and a half, the peace of God flowed into my soul from heaven. But one day I was faced with a strong temptation through the lust of the flesh, and the carnal nature—that sin that passed upon all, even me, because of Adam's transgression-rose up, and I was overcome, and lost the peace of God until I repented and promised God that I would not do it any more. Then God forgave me and the peace flowed into my soul again. I was exceedingly careful to watch and pray and yield to His will, and the peace flowed clear and strong in my soul. By this transgression, I began to realize that I needed a pure heart. I prayed and called upon God to give me a pure heart, and He did that very thing. He cleansed my soul from that impurity, sanctified my nature, and filled me with His Holy Spirit until it seemed to me that all heaven had come into my soul. The sin nature had been cleansed out by faith in his blood sacrifice, and the Comforter had come in to abide. Glory hallelujah! He is abiding in my heart today, and I would to God that all men would believe, not only to the saving of the soul from actual transgressions, but also that they would believe to the sanctification of the Spirit, and be cleansed from the carnal sinful nature which Jesus gave himself as a sacrifice to destroy right out of our souls. In 1 John 3:8, we read: "He that committeth sin is of the devil." And he goes on to say, "For this purpose the Son of God was manifested [slain] that he might destroy the works of the devil." Yes, my dear friend, the Lord will not only forgive you of all your transgressions, but will also destroy the works of the devil right out of your heart and give you power to live free from sin every day. Listen to the Word of God, recorded in Hebrews 7:25: "Wherefore he is [Christ] able also to save them to the UTTERMOST that come unto God by Him, seeing he ever liveth to make intercession for them."

In the twelfth century, certain sects of the New Manicheans, with Pantheistic ideas, held that carnal vices are not sinful for the spiritual man, because the spirit in him, which is God, is not affected by the flesh and cannot sin.

Such teachings led to the most immoral consequences. In the 17th century five points are given as to a belief at that time. 1. They teach that the moral law is of no use at all to the believer, nor a rule for him to walk in, nor to examine his life by, and that Christians are free from the mandatory power of it: whence one of them cried out in the pulpit, "Away with the law, which cuts of a man's legs and then bids him walk." 2. That it is as possible for Christ to sin as for a child of God to sin. 3. That the child of God need not nor ought to ask pardon for sin, and that it is no less than blasphemy for him so to do. 4. That God does not chasten for sin. 5. That if a man know himself to be in the state of grace, though he be drunk, or commit murder. God sees no sin in 'him."

Such teaching is still in existence. Some have said that Christ kept the law for us, and that he imputes righteousness to us; so, if we believe in him, although we may break every law in the Bible, yet he looks upon us as though we had not sinned. Such doctrine is very convenient for people who wish to follow their own carnal desires. Such people should give heed to the stern warnings of Paul: "Know ye not that the unrighteous shall not inherit the kingdom of God? Be not deceived: neither fornicators, nor idolaters, nor adulterers, nor effeminate, nor abusers of themselves with mankind, nor thieves, nor covetous, nor drunkards, nor revilers, nor extortioners, shall inherit the kingdom of God." 1 Cor. 6:9, 10. Verily, God demands of us a righteousness that is REAL. We may be sure that God sees things as they are, and does not regard a man as righteous and take him to

heaven at last when in fact he is as bad as the devil wants him to be.

I.

"You are not your own, you have no right to yourselves. God made you. He is your Creator. He made you that you might be happy: but you can be happy only in him. And as He created you, so He preserves you; He feeds, clothes, upholds you. He has made you capable of knowing, loving, and serving Him in this world, and of enjoying Him in His own glory for ever. And when ye had undone yourselves by sin, He sent His Son to redeem you by his blood; and He sends His Spirit to enlighten, convince, and draw you away from childishness, from vain and trifling, as well as sinful pursuits.

II.

"Remember Him: consider that He is your Creator—your loving and affectionate Father. In youth memory is strong and tenacious: but, through the perversion of the heart by sin, young people can remember anything better than they can remember God. If you get a kindness from a friend, you can remember that, feel gratitude for it; and the person is therefore endeared to you. Have any ever given you such benefits as your Creator? Your body and soul came from Him; He gave you your eyes, ears, tongue, hands, feet, etc. What blessings are these! how excellent! how useful! how necessary!—and will you forget Him?

III.

"Remember Him in thy youth, in order that you may have a long and blessed life, that you may be saved from the corruption and misery into which young people in general run; and the evil they entail upon themselves by giving away to the sinful propensities of their own hearts. As in youth all the

powers are more active and vigorous, so they are capable of superior enjoyments, faith, hope, and love, will be their best tenor, their greatest vigour, and in their least encumbered state. And it will be easier for you to believe, hope, pray, love, obey, and bear your cross, than it can be in old age and decrepitude.

"There is another consideration which should weigh with you, should you live to old age: it is a very disadvantageous time to begin to serve the Lord. Infirmities press down both body and mind, and the oppressed nature has enough to bear its own infirmities; and as there is little time, so there is generally less inclination to call upon the Lord. Evil habits are strengthened by long continuance; and every appetite in the soul is a stronghold for Satan. There is little time for repentance, little for faith, none for obedience. The evil days are come, and the years, in which you will feelingly be obliged to say, Alas: we have no pleasure in them; and, what is worse, the heart is hardened through the deceitfulness of sin."

New Conscientious Objector Regulations

The classification of IV-E for conscientious objectors has been abolished. All those who were in IV-E have been reclassified and placed in either a deferred class or to I-O, which means that the registrant is a conscientious objector "available for civilian work, contributing to the maintenance of the national health, safety, or interest." The regulations defining the kind, etc. of civilian work to be done by those in I-O classification have not been made by the governmental agencies. However, it is likely that the work program will be put in operation in this year, 1952.

Properly speaking, I-O is not a deferred classification; it is merely an active class waiting for the work program to begin operation. An obejctor, upon receiving the I-O classification card, should make an appeal to his local board within ten days for a deferred classification if he is entitled to such deferment because he is engaged in essential work or by reason of family status. A registrant with a child or children, even if conceived but not born, is entitled to deferment. A man with wife as only dependent is not deferred.

The local boards are instructed to place all registrants in the lowest classification for which they are eligible, basing their decision on the information in registrant's file in their office. For that reason, all C. O.'s should keep their local boards informed in writing of any condition or situation that would entitle them to a deferred or lower classification than I-O.

We will endeavor to keep our readers posted when new regulations regarding conscientious objectors become effective. —L. D. Pruitt

A Parable

Can you not see the picture of man in his sinful habits? He has a hold of a powerful chain with his hands. The other end of the chain is over the shoulder of the devil, who is leading him to the cemetery. The man has no power of his own to let loose of that

chain. Something in the chain has such a magnetic power, that no matter how hard he tries, he cannot free himself.

So is the power of habit. Where, oh, where is there deliverance? Listen to the answer that was given to that question two thousand years ago. "Thou shalt call his name Jesus, for he shall save his people FROM their sins." "Behold the Lamb of God that taketh away the sin of the world." Then, there is deliverance to those who will obey God and by faith claim the wonderful promises to sinful man.

Alcohol's Testimony

I am made directly from sugar, which contains the same chemical elements that I do, but in different proportions. I can be made from any kind of vegetable matter that can be converted into sugar. Formerly I was made from the starch of grain, so that I was commonly known as "grain" alcohol. I am also made from the "black strap" by-product of cane sugar manufacture. So I ought to be called "cane" alcohol, for many need a cane to walk with after they use me a while.

I am made from sugar by an interesting process known as fermentation. This process is due to the action of chemical substances produced by living yeast cells. These special substances are known as enzymes or ferments. In some peculiar way these enzymes change the sugar into ethyl alcohol and carbon dioxide. The latter is a gas which bubbles up through the fermenting liquid. The word ferment means to boil.

As soon as I reach your stomach, I begin to enter your blood through the process of absorption. About one-third of me is absorbed through the walls of your stomach and the balance through the intestines. Because of my initial rapid absorption, I reach my highest concentration in your blood within about an hour. Fifteen minutes, or more, are required to raise my concentration in your blood to where it noticeably affects your behavior. The speed of my absorption and the degree of my effects is increased if you drink me on an empty stomach. Conversely, a full stomach retards and lessens my effect.

I require no digestion, and therefore enter into your blood totally unchanged. Owing to the plan of your blood vessel system, I am first taken into your liver, where my oxidation must begin. From your liver, I am carried by your blood to your heart and thence pumped to all parts of your body, where I am absorbed by countless tiny cells. My effects upon your brain, however, are greater than upon most other parts of the body.—A testimony from King Alcohol

Put On The Whole Armour

God's Word instructs us to put on the whole armour that we may be able to stand against the wiles of the devil (Eph. 6:11). We are fighting in this spiritual war against a strong enemy, and if we expect to conquer we must be equipped. Jesus has told us what to do and how to prepare. Many lose the victory because they do not have on the whole armour.

What is this armour? Read Eph. 6:14-18, "Stand therefore, having your loins girt about with truth, and having on the breastplate of righteousness; and your feet shod with the preparation of the gospel of peace; above all, taking the shield of faith, wherewith ye shall be able to quench all the fiery darts of the wicked. And take the helmet of salvation, and the sword of the Spirit, which is the word of God: praying always with all prayer and supplication in the Spirit, and watching thereunto with all perseverance and supplication for all saints."

The first thing necessary is to repent of sins and seek God in earnestness and faith for salvation. When a soul meets all the requirements of God's Word and believes from the heart, God will grant forgiveness and save the soul. After that, there is another step to take. Jesus tells us to go on to perfection, have the carnal nature removed. We are then equipped to face the enemy in this spiritual warfare. Jesus tells us after we have done all, to stand.

Sometimes we want to do too much in our own strength. God told his children at one time (2 Chron. 20:17) to stand still and see the salvation of the Lord. But we must be sure we have done our part; that is, all God has told us to do. There are certain conditions that we must meet before God will fight for us. The rules and instructions are all in the Bible. We are told to study the Word of God that we may be approved (2 Tim. 2:15).

Many neglect to read the Bible. This is our spiritual food. We could not expect to go out to fight a literal worldly battle when we are weak and hungry from lack of food. Neither can we expect to be victorious in this spiritual battle unless we have spiritual food.

I am persuaded that in these last days we are not going to be able to stand if we do not stir ourselves and put on the whole armour. We are in perilous times. That means dangerous times. If we knew our lives were going to be taken if we did not prepare to meet the foe in a literal battle, we would do something about it. And we are facing a greater thing. The Bible instructs us not to fear him that can kill the body and then can do no more, but to fear Him that can kill both soul and body (Matt. 10:28). Oh, dear children of God, let us watch and pray. The devil is going up and down in this earth seeking whom he may destroy. He is after the children of God. He knows we are the ones who are to carry on this great salvation work. Jesus has entrusted us with this salvation and is depending upon us to tell the whole world. If we fail, souls will go down to a lost world. Some say that is the preachers' work. But we are to help-every saved person. We are workers together. the Bible says. When we build a house, every part is needed to make a nice strong building. In our physical body, every member is needed to make a strong body. Yes, every child of God is needed, and if you fail, you not only will lose your own soul, but also will cause many other souls to be lost. Oh, it means something to be a child of God and fight in this battle against the devil and all his army. Let us fit ourselves like God tells us to and then fight a good fight.

How sad! I want to be an encouragement to all. Jesus has done his part long ago—paid the awful price on Calvary's Cross; and He is still waiting and ready to give us the victory over sin. Praise God. Let us put on the whole armour and fight to the end. God bless one and all, is my prayer.

John 1:35. Again the next day after, John stood, and two of his disciples;

COMMENTS AND APPLICATION

The finding of the Christ is well stated in the Bible so that no one need make a mistake as to just how to do it. Jer. 29:13, plainly says, "And ye shall seek me, and find me, when ye shall search for me with all your heart." Psa. 119:2, 10, 58, and 69 says with the "Whole heart." No half-hearted work will do with God, either in finding him, or keeping his approval after we have found him.

It is worthy of our observation how the first disciples found the Christ. The testimony of those who have already found him mean much to those who are seeking him. Notice the Samaritan woman in the 4th chapter, how she brought the whole city to Jesus by her testimony. First, they believed because of the testimony of the woman, then they believed with firmer assurance when they had heard him themselves. Personal contact with Christ is what convinces.

There are some conditions that must be met in order to find the Christ. In Isa. 57:15 and 66:2, we find that we must be "of a contrite and humble spirit." "But to this man will I look, even to him that is poor and of a contrite spirit, and trembleth at my word." And Jesus said, "Him that cometh to me I will in no wise cast out." John 6:37.

COMMENTS AND APPLICATION

When God calls any one to work for him he always prepares that individual for the work to which he is called. One must become a follower of Jesus, follow in his steps, before he can have success as a worker. The closer we follow in the steps of Jesus, the better workers we become. David was a close follower and took care of sheep. God made him the shepherd of his people, Israel. Note the preparation of Moses and how he followed God's instruc-

When Jesus was making ready the fishermen for the task he afterward assigned them, he first let them know how they were at a loss when left to themselves to toil all night and take nothing. Notice the confidence that Simon had in Jesus when he said, "Nevertheless at thy word I will let down the net." There is no better school for God's helpers than his "WORD" being fulfilled by the direction of the Holy Spirit. As we do what he calls us to do, he can reveal other things for his servants to do. Every one that is saved from sin is a worker in God's vineyard. Farmers can have Sunday Schools or prayer meetings, etc. No one is exempted.

COMMENTS AND APPLICATION

In this lesson we find that business men are also called to work in God's vineyard. Matthew was sitting at his desk, taking in the tax money when Jesus was passing by. All Jesus needed to say was "Follow me." That was enough for him. "And he arose and followed him." Not all of God's workers are so quick to respond but all must have a willing heart. Since God knows the heart, he knows whether it is willing or not and deals accordingly. It took some time for Moses to respond to God's call and God became angry with him before he could get him to respond. Exo. 4:14. Jonah was also slow to obey God but after God put him through his school he became willing to do what God said. God's school for each one of us is the best school. We do not need that any man teach us. 1 John 2:27 and John 14:26 says "The Holy Ghost... shall teach you all things."

Matthew's feast was an occasion for Christ to make known to the Jews that he came not to call the righteous, but sinners to repentance. There was a great need then and is still a great need for men to acknowledge themselves to be sinners before God can save them from their sins. May God help us to show men their need of a Saviour.

NICODEMUS MAKES INVESTIGATION

January 27, 1952

Printed Portion......John 3:1-10; 7:45-52.

John 3:1. There was a man of the Pharisees, named Nicodemus, a ruler of the Jews:

- -2. The same came to Jesus by night, and said unto him, Rabbi, we know that thou art a teacher come from God: for no man can do these miracles that thou doest, except God be with him.
 - 3. Jesus answered and said unto him, Verily, verily, I

say unto thee, Except a man be born again, he cannot see the kingdom of God.

- 4. Nicodemus saith unto him, How can a man be born when he is old? can he enter the second time into his mother's womb, and be born?
- 5. Jesus answered, Verily, verily, I say unto thee, Except a man be born of water and of the Spirit, he cannot enter into the kingdom of God.
- 6. That which is born of the flesh is flesh; and that which is born of the Spirit is spirit.
- 7. Marvel not that I said unto thee, Ye must be born again.
- 8. The wind bloweth where it listeth, and thou hearest the sound thereof, but canst not tell whence it cometh, and whither it goeth: so is every one that is born of the Spirit.
- 9. Nicodemus answered and said unto him, How can these things be?
- 10. Jesus answered and said unto him, Art thou a master of Israel, and knowest not these things?

John 7:45. Then came the officers to the chief priests and Pharisees; and they said unto them, Why have ye not brought him?

COMMENTS AND APPLICATION

Jesus' ministry attracted the attention of one of the rulers. His coming to Jesus by night was nothing out of the way for his own work kept him busy and then Jesus was busy during the day so that he could not get to talk to him of the things that was troubling him. He wanted to have a private conversation with him and learn of Jesus, his mission to the world for he says he knew he came from God. Many of the best interviews we have with Jesus, which are very choice to us are after hours at night when all is quiet. Jesus also uses this late hour after the work of the day is done to reveal, through Nicodemus to us, and to all mankind the all important fact, of all time, "Except a man be born again he can not see the kingdom of God." He also makes it imperative by saying in the 7th verse "Ye must be born again."

Nicodemus took his stand for Jesus and was daring enough to ask the other Jewish rulers, "Doth our law judge any man, before it hear him, and know what he doeth?" John 7:51. They derided him but we find that in the 19th chapter he still holds to the Lord and does his part in the burial of Jesus. We find that his devotion was to the last and was faithful.
