Comments On Colossians, Third Chapter

1st verse, "If ye then be risen with Christ, seek those things which are above, where Christ sitteth at the right hand of God."

You will take note that the first thing that we are to know is that we are risen with Christ. When Christ was here and began to preach the gospel. He said (St. John 5:24, 25), "He that heareth my word, and believeth on him that sent me, hath everlasting life. and shall not come into condemnation; but is passed from death unto life." The "IS" in this sentence conveys the meaning of present tense, so just as soon as one will hear or hearken unto the word of Jesus and believe on God who sent Him, he will pass from a dead state of sin unto life in God. In the 25th verse he repeats the same truth, "The hour is coming and now is [present tense] when the dead [those who are dead to God by their sins] shall hear the voice of the Son of God; and they that hear shall live." This coming forth from a dead state of sin unto life in God is termed in Rev. 20:6, a "resurrection" which makes a soul blessed and holy, and will set a soul free from the second death, which is eternal damnation. In John 5:28, 29 he is speaking of the bodily resurrection at the Judgment Day, and says, "Marvel not at this: for the hour is coming, in the which all that are in the grave shall hear his voice [future tense] and shall come forth; they that have done good [kept in a resurrected state in this life] unto the resurrection of life; and they that have done evil unto the resurrection of damnation."

There are three lives spoken of in the Bible, and three deaths. When one is born into the world, he has both spiritual life and physical life. When he becomes old enough to realize what God requires of him, he finds himself doing contrary to God's law for him, and he dies a spiritual death. Unless he repents and looks to God to please Him, He will continue in a dead state of sin. This is why Paul said (Rom. 7:9), "For I was alive without the law once: [before he knew right from wrong] but when the commandment came, sin revived, and I died." Then he told about his awful state and condition while he was in sin. But in the eighth chapter he told how he was freed from that awful state of sin through Christ.

As I said before, there are three lives and three deaths spoken of in the Bible. There is physical life, spiritual life, and eternal life. In contrast to this, there is physical death, spiritual death, and eternal

In Eph. 2:1, Paul speaks of the first resurrection like this, "And you hath He quickened." And he says that we were dead in trespasses and sins.

Being now resurrected from the dead, or risen with Christ, the first exhortation given us is to set our affections on things above and not on things of the earth. Verse three, "For ye are dead and your life is hid with Christ in God." Since you now have been raised from your spiritual sleep or death, ye are dead to the things of the world. Before you were resurrected to spiritual life, you were dead to God and righteousness, but now, being raised from that state to life in God, you have become dead to the world and sin and alive in God through your belief in Christ and His blood sacrifice. If we do this and keep our earthly life hid with Christ in God, "When Christ, who is our life, shall appear, then shall ye also appear with Him in glory." Col. 3:4.

In order to appear with Him in glory, we must heed the instructions which follow, telling us how to retain that new life of Christ in the soul. In verse five we are exhorted to "mortify, therefore your members which are upon the earth." To mortify means to deaden all carnal affections, such as, fleshly appetites and desires, or destroy them by keeping your affections on things above. In doing this, one will not want in his possession a single thing that he cannot use to God's glory. To want, or have (possess) things that cannot be used to the glory of God would be a weight that would be crushing to the spiritual life in the soul. He names many things which the flesh would lust after, which should be resisted and put to death.

If we do not mortify (put to death) the deeds of the body and cease from them, he says that the wrath of God will come upon us as the children of disobedience (verse 6).

In verse 7 he says we walked in fleshly lusts in times past when we lived in them before we were resurrected to a new life in Christ. Now he says to put off all these things; such as, anger, wrath, malice, blasphemy, filthy communication out of your mouth, and lie not one to the other, seeing that ye have put off the old man with his deeds. The old man would mean the carnal evil nature that Christ has delivered us from with all of his deeds of evil works. In the tenth verse he says we have put on the new man which is "Christ in you the hope of glory." Col. 1:27. And now let us be renewed in knowledge after the image of him that created him. We are now to sow to the Spirit and never any more to the flesh, which would cause death to the spiritual life.

In the 12th verse is a list of things to put on, which would be sowing to the Spirit and keeping spiritual life in the body. Put on bowels of mercies (pity and tenderness) kindness, humbleness of mind, meekness, longsuffering, forbearing one another and forgiving one another, if any man have a quarrel against any; even as Christ forgave you, so also do ye. And above all these things, put on charity (Divine love) which is the bond of perfectness. To do these things will bring an assurance in your soul that you are in soul-perfection here in this life, and will cause rejoicing because of the clear hope in your soul of the eternal inheritance, a glorified body with God some

When in this state, then (verse 15) continue to "let the peace of God rule in your hearts," and be thankful. Also (verse 16) let the Word of God dwell in you richly in all wisdom, teaching and admonishing one another in psalms and hymns and spiritual songs, singing with grace in your hearts to the Lord."

If you want more soul food on this line, read the 12th chapter of Romans, the 13th chapter of 1 Cor., 2nd chapter of Ephesians, and 5th chapter of 2 Cor.

"Howbeit when He, the Spirit of truth is come, HE will guide you into ALL truth." When the Spirit of truth guides us, we all see eye to eye and all speak the same things (1 Cor. 1:10), because this blessed Holy Spirit will teach all of us the same things. If we don't all speak the same things, then confusion follows, and we know that God is not the author of confusion. This Holy Spirit, or Spirit of Truth, will come into the hearts of all who prepare themselves to receive Him (Rom. 12:1), and He will guide us into ALL truth. Then we are ALL one in Christ. Notice in particular the 26th and 27th verses.

Now turn to the 2nd chapter of 1st John. Begin with verse 24 and read the rest of the chapter. It will give us more light on this all-important Bible teaching. If we would all be ONE in Christ, then we must let the Spirit of truth guide us into ALL truth. When a Spirit-filled congregation is listening to a

Spirit-filled minister, who is declaring all the counsel of God, the congregation will fruth in their hearts just like it is coming to pulpit. Then we are all one in Christ and see eye to eye,

Luke 10:2, "Therefore, said he unto them, the harvest truly is great, but the laborers are few. Pray ye, therefore, the Lord of the harvest that he would send forth laborers into his harvest." The Lord has given the gifts in the body, such as evangelists, pastors, and teachers (Eph. 4:11), in order that he might get his gospel out to all the world.

Mark 16:15, "And he said unto them, go ye into all the world, and preach the gospel to every creature. He that believeth and is baptized shall be saved; but he that believeth not shall be damned." Some may think there is no use to try any more, because people will not hear it; but Paul said he cleared himself from the blood of all men. By obeying God, we can clear ourselves and them that hear us.

Ezek. 33: "Son of man, speak to the children of thy people, and say unto them, When I bring the sword upon a land, if the people of the land take a man of their coasts, and set him for their watchman: If when he seeth the sword come upon the land, he blow the trumpet, and warn the people; Then whosoever heareth the sound of the trumpet, and taketh not warning; if the sword come, and take him away, his blood shall be upon his own head. He heard the sound of the trumpet, and took not warning; his blood shall be upon him. But he that taketh warning shall deliver his soul. But if the watchman see the sword come, and blow not the trumpet, and the people be not warned: if the sword come, and take any person from among them, he is taken away in his iniquity; but his blood will I require at the watchman's hand."

Oh, dear preacher friend, are you doing your best to deliver your soul from the blood of all men? I remember a song, which goes like this: "When in another land, Before the bar you stand, How deeply grieved your soul may be, If any lost one there should cry in deep despair, 'You never mentioned Him to me.'"

A man said he was called in the gospel work and was running a mission in Sioux City, Iowa. A man came one night to the mission and sought the Lord for salvation, but did not pray through. "He that denieth not himself and taketh up the cross and followeth me, is not worthy of me." Jonah tried to take the easiest way for the flesh, but God prepared a big fish to swallow him. 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I have been informed that in the Russian Encyclopedia they have God listed as a myth, something imaginary. In Webster's Dictionary He is listed as, "The Supreme Being, The Creator and Sovereign of the universe." The latter is the true and right definition. I understand that in many of our universities they are teaching the Russian idea of God, which makes infidels and atheists. This kind of teaching to the oncoming generation surely marks the decaying and corrupted state of our nation. They think themselves wise and filled with advanced wisdom, when in reality they have become fools.

It is written in the Word of God that some glorified Him not as God and their foolish heart was darkened and they became vain in their imaginations, and professing themselves to be wise, they became fools (Rom. 1:22). It is written that for this cause He gave them up to vile affections and they were given over to a reprobate mind and they were filled with unrighteousness, fornication, wickedness, envy, murder, haters of God, proud, and boastful. God, the Creator and Ruler of the universe, looked upon the poor man and said, "Thou fool, this night thy soul shall be required of thee: then whose shall those things be which thou hast provided?" Luke 12:20.

I repeat it: every nation, state, city, or individual that leaves God, the Creator and Ruler of the universe, out of his thoughts and life is a dunce and a fool and will reap in time to come the folly of his sowing.

In Psalm 66:18, is this Scriputre, "If I regard iniquity in my heart, the Lord will not hear me." One definition for "regard" is to hold in high esteem, and another definition is to "give heed to." In Proverbs 4:23 we read, "Keep thy heart with all diligence; for out of it are the issues of life." Those who wish to be workers together with God have a job on their hands of keeping their hearts clean in His sight so He will hear their prayers and continue to live in their souls, working in them both to will and to do of his good pleasures. In Eph. 6:11 we are instructed by the apostle Paul to put on the whole armour of God, "that ye may be able to stand against the wiles of the devil. For we wrestle not against flesh and blood, but against principalities, against powers, against the rulers of the darkness of this world, against spiritual wickedness in high places." When

Paul was getting ready to depart this life, he said, "I have fought a good fight, I have kept the faith." If one has no fight of resistance to the devil or against spiritual wickedness, the devil has either got him, or else has him going his way and is working easy with him so as not to awaken him to his cunning and deceitful working. If you are not arrayed very strongly against the devil, he will not be stirred against you much and that is the reason why we often hear souls testify that they are putting forth effort, watching and praying, and doing all they know to live close to the Lord. "But," they say, "the more I try to live for God, the harder the tests and trials." The very fact that they are putting forth this effort stirs the devil to be active against them. Every saint should often read over the 6th chapter of Ephesians and see that they have on the whole armour of God. It is said of Paul that when he went into a city, he either had a revival or a riot, and sometimes he had both. The reason for this was that he was bold and outspoken against the devil and his works of darkness and his imps were stirred against him to slay him and to stop his mouth. They would find fault with him and what he said. In Acts 17:18 some of the great men of earth encountered him, saying, "What will this babbler say?" And others said, "He seemeth to be a setter forth of strange gods." In the city of Philippi Paul and Silas were beaten with many stripes and thrown into jail because the people of that city rose up against them and said, "They teach customs which are not lawful for us to receive, neither to observe, being Romans."

Yes, my dear brother minister, sister or brother, if you hold against the evils of this world in deed and in truth, you will have plenty of opposition, and that from those who claim to follow Jesus. But we must strive lawfully if we keep our own souls saved. Paul said, "But I keep under my body, and bring it into subjection: lest that by any means, when I have preached to others, I myself should be a castaway," or as the dictionary says, "one thrown away or rejected, shipwrecked."

Brethren, let us be bold for God, but always in the Spirit of Christ, with meekness and humility of heart, striving lawfully, holding the truth in righteousness and true holiness.

Baptism, An Ordinance

Baptism is an ordinance set forth in the Word of God. God's children love to obey His Word. The Word says, "Repent and be baptized." Then 1 Peter 3:21 teaches: "the like figure whereunto even baptism doth also now save us (not the putting away of the filth of the flesh, but the answer of a good conscience toward God) by the resurrection of Jesus Christ."

Some seem to feel that baptism saves from sin. Verse 20 mentions the ark of Noah wherein few, that is, eight souls were saved by water. I believe we all understand that the ark is a type of Christ Jesus, our ark of safety. The water would not have saved the eight souls if they had not first had faith and been obedient to Noah's teaching and gone inside the ark. It is the same today: water baptism does not save, but is a figure or answer of a good conscience toward God.

Now let us read 1 Cor. 15:29, "Else what shall they do which are baptized for the dead? If the dead rise not at all, why are they then baptized for the dead?" This brings forth a doctrine taught by an organization that we should baptize for those already dead. They have a vicarious work for their apostles, also a temple for this purpose. We hope, by the Word of God, to prove this an error. The Scripture this is taken from does not intend to be a teaching on baptism; but if we will read the entire chapter, we shall find it all deals in a complete sense with the resurrection. Some were against the resurrection. Paul said (1 Cor. 15:12), "Now if Christ be preached that he rose from the dead, how say some among you that there is no resurrection of the dead?" Verse 14: "And if Christ be not risen, then is our preaching vain and

your faith is vain." Verse 15: "Yea, and we have testified of God that he raised up Christ whom he raised not up if so be that the dead rise not." Paul meant to be teaching: "Do not keep on baptizing for the dead Christ as though he had risen, IF the dead rise not at all. You know he died and if there is no resurrection, then He is not risen, and you are worshiping a DEAD CHRIST and baptizing in the name of a DEAD CHRIST. What good can He do us? All our preaching is vain, also your baptizing for the dead is no good if the dead rise not at all." Paul was reproving them and showing how absurd was their teaching of "no resurrection."

If we baptize, it is as taught in Romans 6:3, 4: "We are buried with him by baptism." We only bury the dead. "That like as Christ was raised up from the dead by the glory of the father, even so we also shall walk in newness of life." Verse 5. "For if we have been planted together in the likeness of his resurrection." Verse 7, "For he that is dead is free from sin." This does not mean a natural death, but a death to the old life of sin. Then we are ready to be buried with Him, or into his DEATH, to arise as he did and walk in newness of life—a figure of his death, burial, and resurrection. Now this brings us back to our Scripture in 1 Cor. 15:29, "Else what shall they do which are baptized for the dead [or a dead Christ, for we are baptized into his death]?" If the dead rise not at all, or if Christ did not rise, then why are we baptized for the dead, or into his death? Why keep the ordinance of baptism if there is no resurrection?

This same organization which claims to have founded its doctrine on prophecies from our Holy Bible and is now teaching a form of baptism for the dead which the Scripture proves erroneous, also teaches and sends out papers to its members to fill out which continue their present marriage into eternity or continue on in heaven. Mark 12:18 makes this clearly a serious error, working on the carnal or natural desire of man. In Mark 12 one asked Christ which would be the husband of a woman who had married seven brethren. Jesus answered, "Do ye not therefore err, because ye know not the scripture, neither the power of God?" Verse 25, "For when they shall rise from the dead, they neither marry or are given in marriage, but are as the angels which are in heaven." This makes it very plain that there is not a married state in heaven. Their followers are going about baptizing for the dead and making great preparation to continue their marriage in heaven, while the Word of God, which they say their book is founded upon and prophesies of, condemns these two practices and many others. They also add that the Bible has many errors. I feel it would be a mistake to trust to any book that is filled with errors. May God bless and help us to make a careful study of the Word of God, realizing as Acts 4:12 teaches us (speaking of Jesus who was the WORD and made flesh and dwelt among us) "Neither is there salvation in any other, for there is none other name under heaven given among men whereby we must be saved." Amen.

CO Regulations Signed by President

The long-waited Selective Service regulations governing the two-year period of service by conscientious objectors were finally made official when the President signed an Executive Order, on Wednesday, Feb. 20, 1952.

Even though the regulations have been formally issued, it may be weeks, or even months, before the program gets under way. Much planning work still needs to be done by National Headquarters. Four or five forms must be drafted, printed, and distributed by National Selective Service to state and local officials. The regulations themselves must be printed and interpreted to local boards. Detailed directives and instructions must be sent to state and local units of the System. Furthermore, arrangements for procurements of job openings must be made by the National and State Directors. This may take several months. Even after the program begins to operate, it will probably take on momentum very slowly.

Definition of Work

The work to be done by conscientious objectors shall be "civilian work contributing to the maintenance of the national health, safety, or interest." This civilian work shall be limited to employment by the government—federal, state, or local—or by a nonprofit organization engaged in charitable, health, welfare, educational, or scientific activities. Private employment for profit-making organizations or business shall be excluded.

CO's May Volunteer

Any conscientious objector within the age range of draft may volunteer his services at any time. If not classified at the time of volunteering, he shall be classified at once by the local board. If found acceptable, he shall be assigned to service as soon as a job is available.

Determination of Type of Work

A conscientious objector will be given opportunity to submit to the local board three types of work in which he is interested. If none of these is acceptable to the board, it in turn will submit to the CO three types of work. If none of these is acceptable to the CO registrant, the State Director or his representative will meet with the registrant and the local board to try to find agreement on a job. If his method still does not succeed, the matter shall be brought to the attention of the National Selective Service Director before a work order is issued by the local board.

Work at Home in Exceptional Cases
A CO registrant is to be sent away from his home community except that, in special cases, the local board may order the CO to work in his home community when to do so would be in the national interest.

Travel Provided

Meals, lodging, and travel will be provided to the registrant from his home to the place of employment, or the place of delivery to a private agency; they will also be provided when transfers are necessary, and when the man returns home after two years of service.

Transfer in Some Cases

When employment for a CO ceases, due to circumstances beyond his control, he shall be transferred elsewhere to the same type of work. This will not be regarded as a break in the continuity of his service.

The National Director may release a registrant for physical or mental incapacity or for undue hardship to a dependent.

National Director Determines Prosecutions

If a registrant fails to obey the work order of a local board, or if he fails to perform satisfactorily his duties after being on the job, the National Director in Washington will determine if he is to be reported to the Department of Justice for prosecution. This will be done after a study of the file by the National office.

State Directors Administer Bulk of Program

When a man receives a work order from the local board, he will be placed in Class I-W. The State Director of the State in which he is working will hold his file and supervise his work. If a CO is assigned to work outside the United States or its territories, the file will be held by the National Headquarters which will supervise the work. Most objectors will work in this country.

When Work Is Completed

After a CO registrant completes his service, his file shall be returned to the local board where it shall be marked 1-W-R (released) until such time when he attains an age greater than the age of liability.

There will be no CPS or national work camps as known in World War II.

State Directors of Selective Service will play a large part in the administration of the program. Many of them have already appointed staff personnel for this purpose.

There will be no private employment which may cause profits to accrue to a private individual or business.

Men nearest the top of the age limit (18 to 26) will be given work orders first. Those near 19 or 20 may not be "called" for a year or two.

Federal work will probably not be included in the beginning of the program, except in special cases. Most work at the outset may be in state institutions.

It seems there will be no sudden rush of "work orders." Orders are not to be given until job opportunities are available.

City, county, and state agencies such as mental hospitals, state training schools, TB hospitals, health projects, experimental stations, dairy testing associations, forestry and game conservation operations, flood control projects, soil conservation units, local Selective Service boards, churches, and others—in fact, almost anyone—may submit to the State Director, and National Director, for their approval, job openings for CO's.

Local boards will probably have lists of job openings available for inspection by I-O registrants in the local board office. These lists will be grouped according to regions, which usually include several states.

There is unanimous opinion among Selective Service officials that I-W registrants shall receive pay at the prevailing rate of the vocation in which they are serving. They want to avoid the charge of administering "slave labor" and "involuntary servitude," a frequent criticism of World War II. CO's are also to receive accident and other benefits.

It will be the policy of Selective Service, to provide work for CO's as far removed from the war effort as possible. Physical force by any Selective Service official seeking compliance with work orders will not be allowed.

I-W registrants will probably have the right to call upon the State Director at any time if disagreement with job conditions, etc., occur.

All CO's, before being given work orders, will probably be asked to take an Armed Forces physical examination. If they are not acceptable (do not pass the physical tests) they will be given the IV-F.

Some State Directors, have already contacted, thru the Governor, their Welfare, Education, Forestry, Interior and other departments in making a survey of jobs. Direct any inquiries or requests for further information to NSBRO, 1105 K St., N. W. Washington 5, D. C. They are keeping in touch with daily developments.

COMMENTS AND APPLICATION

The first two verses of our lesson deals with those who are spiritual and those who have lost the spiritual life out of their souls. The ones who abide in Christ are ever growing more spiritual, but the ones who lose their life of spirituality wither and die spiritually. Those who remain with Christ have the promise of the love of the Saviour and he exhorts us to "Continue ye in my love." The 13th chapter of 1 Cor. is of practical use and comment on the first part of this lesson which deals with love to Cod and man

As we read the word of God and the Holy Spirit reveals Christ to us as we read, then his words become life to our souls. It is vain to talk of Christ abiding in us if we neglect his words. Three great things are mentioned as resulting from abiding in Christ—power to bear much fruit, power to get in prayer whatsoever we ask, and fulness of joy. The world cannot give joy but Jesus can and does give his people joy. Everything in this scripture relates to Jesus—My Father, My words, My disciples, My love, My joy, and My commandments. The secret of loving one another is abiding in Jesus. His love to us is the standard and measure of our love to one another. He loved us so much he laid down his life for us.

COMMENTS AND APPLICATION

When we think of Thomas, we think of doubting Thomas, but there are a number of good things about him that is worthy of note. He was ready to go to Jerusalem to die with him. When he said he would not believe without evidence he required, that only proved his willingness to do so if he had that evidence. Is it not commendable that he sought personal contact? His saying "My Lord and my God," when he did have the evidence proves his honesty and sincerity. In our day we are not permitted to see the Lord with our natural eyes because we are to "walk by faith" which is "The substance of things hoped for, the evidence of things not seen." And Jesus said, "Blessed are they that have not seen, and yet have believed." "O taste and see that the Lord is good: blessed is the man that trusteth in him." Psa. 34:8. So there is plenty of evidence for us in these days when we test the word of God and do as he says, he will give to us salvation through faith, taking away all sin, just as he says he will and then cleanse our hearts, making them pure in sanctification. Jesus is still ready to convince any honest seeker that he is just what he says of himself; " I am the way, the truth, and the life: no man cometh unto the Father, but by me."

20. For I say unto you, That except your righteousness shall exceed the righteousness of the scribes and Pharisees, ye shall in no case enter into the kingdom of

Mark 10:17. And when he was gone forth into the way, there came one running, and kneeled to him, and asked him, Good Master, what shall I do that I may inherit eternal life?

18. And Jesus said unto him, Why callest thou me good? there is none good but one, that is, God.

19. Thou knowest the commandments, Do not commit adultery, Do not kill, Do not steal, Do not bear false witness, Defraud not, Honour thy father and mother.

20. And he answered and said unto him, Master, all

these have I observed from my youth.

21. Then Jesus beholding him loved him, and said unto him, One thing thou lackest: go thy way, sell whatsoever thou hast, and give to the poor, and thou shalt have treasure in heaven: and come, take up the cross, and follow me.

22. And he was sad at that saying, and went away grieved: for he had great possessions.

Memory Verse: The law was given by Moses, but grace and truth came by Jesus Christ. John 1:17.

Practical Truth: The commands and teachings of Jesus, which even go beyond those of the Old Testament, establish the validity of the moral law for all men.

COMMENTS AND APPLICATION

The laws of our land and the laws of God are to be obeyed. We are told in Acts 5:29, "We ought to obey God rather than man." But that is when the law-makers conflict with the word of God. In this country, the most of our laws are in accordance with what God says, so that the Christian can obey God and the laws of the land too. And the sinner could if he would.

Jesus fulfilled all the ceremonial laws so they are not binding on the Christian. But the moral law is even stronger than in the time of Moses. Since Jesus dwells in the heart of the Christian he helps us to keep the law that he gave while here on earth. In Jer. 31:31-34 we have the prophesy of the Lord writing the law in the heart of man, and in Heb. 10:15-22 we have the Holy Ghost repeating it with a stronger declaration that "By the blood of Jesus" we can have "A new and living way."

The young man in the last part of the lesson seemed to be willing to do everything that the law required but when Jesus told him to sell all that he had and give to the poor, he would have treasure in heaven, and take up his cross and follow him; that made him sad. His heart was on his possessions.

Exo. 20:1. And God spake all these words saying,

- 2. I am the Lord thy God, which have brought thee out of the land of Egypt, out of the house of bondage.
- Thou shalt have no other gods before me.
 Thou shalt not make unto thee any graven image, or any likeness of any thing that is in heaven above, or that is in the earth beneath, or that is in the water under the earth:

Memory Verse: Thou shalt have no other gods before me. Thou shalt not make unto thee any graven image. Exodus 20:3-4.

Practical Truth: Our supreme allegiance is due to God and to Christ.

COMMENTS AND APPLICATION

A man's god is what he loves most. If at any time we have that which we put before or equal with God, we have broken his commandment. God must have first place in our affections and devotions to him. The world or an ungodly family will not help us to do that. Everything we do should have the approval of God, then we can do it heartily as unto the Lord. God knows when we are whole-heartedly sincere. Israel was never weaned from idols until God sent them into captivity. God was longsuffering with them and told them many, many times that he would send them into captivity if they did not quit their idols. They kept persisting in it until that was just what happened. Seventy years later they were ready to go back to Jerusalem under Ezra and leave all their idols behind. They were glad to say "What have I to do any more with idols?" Hosea 14:8. God had corrected them until they saw the folly of idols. He will correct us too for our idols.

Those old Pharisees in Christ's day wanted to appear loyal to God but Jesus knew their hypocrisy so he told them just what they were. They derided him. Jesus made it very plain when he said, "And whosoever doth not bear his cross, and come after me, cannot be my disciple."
