Church of My Choice

We are told that eighty-seven per cent of the adult population of the United States are church members, and that this number is in excess of same a few years ago. Therefore the world looks upon us as a Christian nation, and since we are living in a "freedom-ofreligion" country, there are without doubt more manmade religions in our nation than any other country in the world. Almost every person we meet with and talk to about the Lord is ready to tell us he belongs to some church. It seems to me people think the most necessary thing in their lives is to belong to the "church of their choice." And so it is, if they have made the Bible church their choice. But too many folks are not much concerned about what they belong to, so long as they have their names on a church book of some kind. But is this the teaching of the Word of God? Did Jesus say, "Upon this rock I will build several hundred CHURCHES, and the gates of hell shall not prevail against THEM?" Nay, verily. Let us read Matt. 16:18: "And I say also unto thee, thou art Peter, and upon this rock I will build my church [singular] and the gates of hell shall not prevail against IT." (only one). Jesus built only one church, and we have no record in the Bible of any other being built. He did not mean that Peter was the rock upon which he was going to build his church, for Peter had testified "Thou art the Christ, the Son of the living God." David also said, "Who is God save the Lord, or who is a rock save our GOD?" Psa. 18:31.

The prophet Isaiah prophesied of the coming of Jesus, that he would order and establish his kingdom. the same is his church. Read Isa. 9:6, 7. We find Jesus at twelve years of age in the temple sitting in the midst of the doctors, both hearing them and asking them questions; and when he was apprehended of his parents, and questioned about his behavior, he said, "How is it that ye sought me? Wist ye not that I must be about my Father's business?" Read Luke 2:42-50. At that tender age he was concerned about his Father's business which he was sent into the world to do. In those days came John the Baptist preaching in the wilderness of Judea, and saying, "Repent ye, for the kingdom of heaven is at hand." After Jesus was baptized by John in Jordan he began his public ministry, also preaching, "Repent ye, for the kingdom of heaven is at hand." He preached and taught the plan of salvation, and healed all the sick who came to him. He chose twelve men from the common walk of life to be his disciples that they might learn of him those things pertaining to the kingdom of God. things they were ordained to preach and teach, and after Jesus had ascended back to heaven, some of them wrote the beautiful New Testament Scriptures that are still being preached around the world, still revealing to souls the way of salvation. On one occasion Jesus said to his disciples, "My meat is to do the will of him that sent me, and to finish his work." And again he saith, "But I have greater witness than that of John, for the works which the father hath given me to finish, the same works that I do." John 4:34; also 5:36. We see Jesus desired always to please his Father. He was aware of the task he was sent to accomplish, and he was willing to make the plan of salvation because of his great love he had for us.

When Jesus had been betrayed and the soldiers came to take him, in an effort to defend his Master,

Peter drew his sword and cut off the servant of the high priest's ear; but Jesus said unto him, "Put up thy sword into the sheath, the cup which my Father hath given me, shall I not drink it?" A cup, as we know, is a container. It holds something. So the cup which Jesus mentioned held something for him. Yea, it held suffering, torture, ridicule, mockery, and crucifixion. Yet Jesus was willing to suffer all this for you and me, bearing our sins, and the sins of the whole world that he might order and establish God's kingdom in the earthen vessels of poor lost mankind. Praise the Lord for such great redeeming LOVE!

In Luke 22:17-20 we find Jesus saying to his disciples, "This cup is the new testament in my blood, which is shed for you." Paul tells us in the 9th chap. of Hebrews that without the shedding of blood there is no remission of sin. Jesus freely shed his precious blood in dedication of the entire New Testament scriptures which teach us the way of salvation, and the discipline of God's church in the earth. When the apostle Paul was taking leave of the brethren for the last time on one occasion, he said to them, "Take heed therefore unto yourselves, and to all the flock, over the which the Holy Ghost hath made you overseers, to feed the CHURCH OF GOD which he hath purchased with his own blood."

Man has formulated many so-called churches, but none of them have been dedicated with blood, and none of them take sin out of the heart of man, but each and every one teach in their book of discipline or in their category of rules something added to the Word of God or something taken away (or left out). This in itself makes them man-made churches; for the church of God which Jesus built has no other discipline or creed than the teaching of the New Testament scriptures. We are forbidden by God's Word to ADD anything or take anything from the scriptures. Rev. 22:18, 19. We are satisfied therewith. When Peter preached to the multitude at Pentecost, they were pricked in their hearts and inquired of the brethren what to do. Peter said unto them, "Repent and be baptized every one of you in the name of Jesus Christ, for the remission of sins," etc. Peter had no church for them to join. But when they repented of their sins they were born into God's church, and three thousand souls were added unto the disciples. And the last verse of the second chapter of Acts says, "The Lord added to the CHURCH daily such as should be saved. When God adds a soul to his church, he also writes its name in the book of life. How sad it will be when souls stand before God in judgment and learn that their names are not recorded in that book; for we read in Rev. 20:15, "Whosoever was not found written in the Book of life, was cast into the lake of fire."

Dear reader, are you only a church member with a sinful heart, thinking and hoping you may make it through to heaven? If this be your case, I beg you now, confess your sins, forsake them, repent of them, and ask God for Jesus sake to forgive you, and if you are in earnest with God and want salvation, God will blot out every sin and transgression you ever commit-

ted, and make you a new creature in Christ Jesus, and write your name in the Book of Life, and you will be happy, as I am happy, in God's church, the "CHURCH OF MY CHOICE."

Gathered Unto Him

Away back in the book of Genesis, over 3500 years ago, in the 49th chapter and 10th verse we read a prophecy of Christ who was to appear in this world 1600 years later to gather believers together unto him. It reads thus: "The sceptre shall not depart from Judah, nor a law giver from between his feet, until Shiloh [Christ] come; AND UNTO HIM SHALL THE GATHERING OF THE PEOPLE BE."

You will notice they were to be gathered unto Him and not unto man-made organizations, humanly arranged and organized into human creeds. The following verse reads, "Binding his foal unto the vine, and his asses colt unto the choice vine." Jesus says in John 15:1, "I am the true vine." And in the 5th verse, "I am the vine, ye [his believers] are the branches." When we are born again, born from above, we are attached to Christ, the true Vine, for we are then his foal, and we should remain in the place drawing strength and grace from him day by day as we pray unto him and keep yielded into his hands. Every soul that will separate himself from the world and its organized religions as Christ did, and abide in Him, will be a member in the church of God, which is the pillar and ground of the truth. Jesus told his disciples that believed on him, "Ye are not of the world even as I am not of the world." And to the religious Jews he said, "Ye are from beneath; I am from above: ye are of this world; I am not of this world." John 8:23.

People who join lodges, unions, and worldly organized religions are making themselves a part of the world and thereby they grieve the Spirit of God, if indeed he lives in their hearts.

Anyone who is truly sanctified wholly has given up all into the hands of God, and he dare not say in his heart (or otherwise) that what he possesses is his own; for in order to remain in a sanctified state, all must be kept in the hands of God for Him to call for and use as he pleases. In giving of the substance which he places in our hands, we only give back to Him that which is already His and we have no right to receive any honor for anything that is done only as God may bestow it upon us. In the early church when the need of the poor was great, they sold their possessions and laid the money down at the apostles' feet so distribution could be made to the needy ones, and God blessed them and great grace was upon them. Folks who retain the sanctifying grace of God in the soul will be just as willing to give of their substance to their neighbor or others in need as they would to use it for their own need. To withhold from the needy when God has made you able to give would be hardening your heart against God and his Spirit working, and would bring disaster to your soul. We have a lesson given in the first few verses of the 5th chapter of Acts where one man and his wife who claimed they had given all, held back part of the price. Peter said that Satan had filled their hearts and that they lied to the Holy Ghost. They pretended to be doing a thing that they were not doing, and they both fell dead, literally and physically.

I have been thinking of the many that are lying to God today when they say they are sanctified vet hold on to the substance that God allows them to have and pile up more rather than to keep it in God's hands with an open heart before Him, asking Him daily, What shall I give and where and how much? even to the last penny, that God may be glorified through their giving. If you are withholding from God, you place your soul in the same state that Ananias and Sapphira were in. It is impossible for you to keep an experience of sanctification and withhold from God the things you claim by being sanctified are in God's hands. Many will not earnestly seek God in prayer as to where to give and what to do with what He puts in their hands for fear they will hear from heaven and will have to give up that which they covet. Such actions prove that they are not sanctified, and if they do not repent of such actions and begin to do otherwise, their souls will be wrecked and ruined, even though they do profess. The gospel by evangelists would be carried farther and more abundantly, also the gospel by the printed page would double and tripple and reach many precious souls that otherwise are denied the light and knowledge of full and free salvation if this consecration were holding good in the many who claim to be sanctified. Let us make our calling and election sure by obedience to his Word and Spirit. To do otherwise would be denying God the right to handle your affairs in this life and would be proving that you are of the world and not like Christ and the disciples were. Paul says, in Gal. 6:6, "Let him that is taught in the word communicate [or give] unto him that teacheth in all good things. Be not deceived; God is not mocked [or fooled, as He knows your heart]; for whatsoever a man soweth, that shall he also reap. For he that soweth to his flesh, shall of the flesh reap corruption for damnation]: but he that soweth to the Spirit shall of the Spirit reap life everlasting." And then he exhorts us not to be weary in well doing, for in due season we shall reap if we faint not (or quit doing and giving). -Fred Pruitt



The above diagram illustrates what constitutes the religious world in its Babel confusion and the True Vine (Christ), which is in the world but not of the world, which the Scriptures call, "The Church of God," the "Family of God,' and the

The True Vine and The False Vine

In the first verse of the fifteenth chapter of John's gospel, Jesus says, "I am the true vine, and my Father is the husbandman." Jesus would have been guilty of using idle words if there had been no false vines; so we know if he is the true vine, there are false vines. In the gospels, Jesus quite often spoke of false prophets and false teachers, men coming in sheep's clothing, and some saying, "Here is Christ," and "Lo, there is Christ;" but he warns us to be not deceived.

In the fifth verse he says, "I am the vine, ye are the branches: he that abideth in me, and I in him, the same bringeth forth much fruit." From this statement it is plain to see that every saved person who retains the Spirit of Christ in the soul is a branch in the vine (Christ) or a member in his body, the church. "If a man abide not in me, he is cast forth as a branch, and is withered; and men gather them, and cast them into the fire, and they are burned." (verse 6).

As there are many false prophets and false teachers in the world who have false vines (churches) that will be burned and destroyed, it is easy to see how a branch (a saved soul) that ceases to abide in the true vine (Christ) will become withered and men will gather them into their false vines and they will in time be burned or destroyed with the other false vines (religions). In the chart or diagram, you will notice that the true vine is rooted in God and in heaven, but the false vines are rooted in Satan and in the earth, yet both are flourishing in the world and have their life here. In John 17:14, 15 Jesus prayed for his disciples who were branches in the true vine, "I have given them thy word; and the world hath hated them, because they are not of the world, even as I am not of the world. I pray not that thou shouldest take them out of the world, but that thou shouldest keep them from the evil."

In the third chapter of John's gospel, Jesus says, "Ye must be born again." In the margin it says, "From above." A soul that is truly born again is born from above, and has a life coming down into it from above, from God and from heaven, and it is not of this world any more than Jesus and his disciples were of this world. He did not pray for the Father to take His people out of the world, but to keep them from the evil. We who are truly born again are in the world where all these false religions are, but we do not partake of them, and the Spirit of God keeps us from all these evils; therefore we are not of the world, but of heaven.

Jesus met with the false religions of his day, and they hated him because he told them the truth. False religions and false teachers and prophets will not receive all the truth, and they will array themselves against the true ministers of God, who are not of this world but are from above. Jesus told the false teachers in his day, "Ye are from beneath: I am from above: Ye are of this world; I am not of this world." John 8:23.

The present-day religions are nearly all of this world and are drawing their substance from the earth, are from beneath, are of this world, and will not receive all the truth, but just that which suits them to hold up their false religions. They can mix with and draw support from the world, and at the same time claim to be following Christ and leading souls to heaven.

It is remarkable to note the comparison of Jesus and the false religions of his day, and the branches in the true Vine today and the false vines. In Jesus' time the false teachers and prophets claimed Abraham as their father and owned and worshiped God, but at the same time they reviled and hated Jesus who was the true God manifested in the flesh. Presentday false teachers and prophets claim God as their Father and Jesus Christ as their Saviour, but at the same time they hate and resist the true Vine in the world today that comes down from God out of heaven and brings all of the real truth to men. Often they will brand the branches of the true vine as fanatical and legalistic people, narrow minded, and such like, in order to justify themselves before men in their attachments to the world. James says that the world is the enemy of God. "Whosoever will be a friend to the world is the enemy of God." We love the souls of men, but not the spirit of the world in which they move. Those who are Christ's, or pretend to be, and conform to the world in different ways, are showing themselves to be friends of the world, which is the enemy of God. Read James 4:4, and also 1 John 2:15, 16.

Some one may ask, "How is it that these ministers in the different man-made religions have so much light, and preach so many right things, and many of them seem so nice and pious?" Jesus witnessed that they were such in his day, and said that they were like "whited sepulchres, which indeed appear beautiful outward, but are within full of dead men's bones, and of all uncleanness." Matt. 23:27. False teachers have the appearance of the true, but they have poison doctrines back of it that will defile the soul if believed and practiced, and will cause folks to be of the world and not from above. In Luke 11:44 Jesus said to them, "Ye are as graves that appear not." In other words, he was telling them that they appeared to be much alive in the things of God, but at the same time their end was death, as their beliefs and practices showed them to be dead in their souls as far as real truth was concerned.

Paul, in 2 Cor. 11:13-15, tells us very plainly what false teachers are and why they become such: "For such are false apostles, deceitful workers, transforming themselves into the apostles of Christ. And no marvel; for Satan himself is transformed into an angel of light [knows the truth about a lot of spiritual things]. Therefore it is no great thing if his ministers also be transformed as the ministers of righteousness; whose end shall be according to their works."

Some one may ask, "Why is it that many who once had the truth are now in this class, and are partakers of the world with other false religions?" For

an answer to this question, read 2 Thess. 2:10, 11, "Because they received not the love of the truth, that they might be saved, and for this cause God shall send them strong delusion, that they should believe a lie: that they all might be damned who believe not the truth, but had pleasure in unrighteousness." These people did not continue to love the truth, but began to love the world and conform to it, and became withered branches. God sent them strong delusion, so that they went right on preaching and claimed to follow Christ, becoming more and more like other false religions, and partaking of nearly all manner of worldliness. Thus they became the enemies of the cross of Christ.

In the chart you will notice Catholicism and her harlot daughters (Rev. 17:5) pictured as false vines coming out of the earth, and they are very prominent in the world. You will also notice on the other side of the "true Vine" more false vines coming out of the earth and of Satan, and in the world. These represent the three unclean spirits like frogs which have come out of the mouth of the dragon, and out of the mouth of the beast, and out of the mouth of the false prophet. "For they are the spirits of devils, working miracles, which go forth unto the kings of the earth [Kings here means ministers that have wide influence, swaying the multitudes into false doctrines and ruling over them, spiritually speaking. They are kings of the earth and not from above. They draw their substance from the earth and Satan, and are, spiritually speaking, as angels of light, transformed into preachers of righteousness—as they preach many right things.] and of the whole world, to gather them to the battle of that great day of God Almighty." Read Revelation 16:14, 15.

The true Vine in the picture represents the family of God that is in the world but not of the world. It is not of the multitude of false religions, but is separated unto God and set apart from all the religious rabble. It does not love the world nor the things in the world, but it has its affections on things above where Christ sitteth at the right hand of the Father. In the Scriptures it is symbolized as Jerusalem which is above and free from the world, which is the mother of us all (Gal. 4:26); and also symbolized as, "New Jerusalem" (Read Rev. 3:12; also Rev. 21:2). It is also termed "the bride, the Lamb's wife," for when one is saved he is symbolized as being married to the Lord (Read Rom. 7:4). You will notice that John saw the holy city (which symbolizes the holy children of God) the new Jerusalem, coming down from God out of heaven prepared as a bride adorned for her husband (Rev. 21:2). Also, notice that the true Vine is come down from God out of heaven and this is symbolized as the new Jerusalem, the people of God that are born from above. They are in the world but not of the world. They draw their power, strength, wisdom, and righteousness from above and bear the fruits of the Spirit in the world, to the glory of God. Souls that are born from above are all made new in Christ Jesus, old things have passed away and all things have become new. They do not walk according to the course of this world any more, do not fellowship the multitude

of false religions in and of the world.

Rev. 21:10 is a description of what John saw when he was shown the bride, the Lamb's wife, "And he carried me away in the spirit to a great and high mountain and shewed me that great city, the holy Jerusalem, descending out of heaven from God." The children of God are often termed as on a mountain, and a mountain. Read Isaiah 2:22, 23; also, read in Ezekiel 43:12, "Upon the top of the mountain the whole limit thereof around about shall be most holy."

We shall now show you that John also saw the fallen church, the multitude of earthly religions that surround us in the world today which he called "Mystery Babylon the Great, the mother of harlots and abomination of the earth." Notice, these things are of the earth and not from above. Read Rev. 17:5.

Let us begin reading at the first verse of the 17th chapter of Revelation, "And there came one of the seven angels which had the seven vials, and talked with me, saying unto me, Come hither; I will shew unto thee the judgment of the great whore [Mystery Babylon the great and her harlot daughters] that sitteth upon many waters." Waters here symbolize people. You will get the definition out of the 15th verse of this chapter. This great mystery of the false religion is resting on the people and they are supporting her, are in bondage to her and become idol worshipers. In the 2nd verse it says, "With whom the kings of the earth have committed fornication." The kings of the earth are these great preachers that sway the people, such as popular radio preachers, pulpit preachers, and editors. You notice it says. "Kings of the earth." They are not of heaven although they claim to be of God and to worship him and claim Jesus as their Savior. They are of earth and rule over men, spiritually speaking, and commit fornication with the harlot daughters of Babylon. They acknowledge them, conform to the world as they do, and get their converts into the family of some harlot daughter, and in that way commit fornication with the whore that sitteth upon many waters. All ministers, radio preachers, and editors that call themselves interdenominational are committing fornication with the harlot daughters of Babylon whether they realize it or not. This verse reads on, "And the inhabitants of the earth [You notice it says "earth," which would leave the true children of God out, as they are from above] have been made drunk with the wine of her fornication." In other words, they drink of her doctrines, imbibe them and are spiritually intoxicated, being partakers with her in her fornication and are conformed more or less to the world, as all the false, "Mystery-Babylon-the-great" religions are.

The third verse reads thus, "So he carried me away in the spirit into the wilderness." You will notice the contrast between the scene of the bride, the Lamb's wife, and the scene of Mystery Babylon the great and her harlot daughters. In the one he was carried to a great and high mountain to see the bride, the Lamb's wife; but here he is carried into the wilderness, which symbolizes a wild, unattended place where many evil things grow and some good things which have no husbandman to dress them, to purge

them and cause them to bear acceptable fruit unto God or to keep them from the world and the intoxicating wine of Mystery Babylon and her harlot daughters. In order to see this Mystery Babylon the great. the mother of harlots and abominations of the earth, it was needful to go into a wilderness place not inhabited, not cultivated, or tended by the true God.

When I mentioned wilderness where John was carried to see the "MYSTERY BABYLON THE GREAT AND HER HARLOT DAUGHTERS" and said that some good things grew there, I meant by that that there are some of God's people in these places who are sincere and living up to all the light they have, but God in these last days is calling them out of those places to separate them from the world and its religions and abide in the true Vine alone to fully glorify God. -Fred Pruitt. --:::--

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JESUS CONDEMNS FALSE LEADERSHIP

March 1, 1953

Matt. 23:1. Then spake Jesus to the multitude, and to his disciples,

- 2. Saying, The scribes and the Pharisees sit in Moses' seat:
- 3. All therefore whatsoever they bid you observe, that observe and do; but do not ye after their works: for they say, and do not.
- 4. For they bind heavy burdens and grievous to be borne, and lay them on men's shoulders; but they them-

selves will not move them with one of their fingers.

- 5. But all their works they do for to be seen of men: they make broad their phylacteries, and enlarge the borders of their garments.
- 6. And love the uppermost rooms at feasts, and the chief seats in the synagogues,
- 7. And greetings in the markets, and to be called of men, Rabbi, Rabbi.
- 8. But be not ye called Rabbi: for one is your Master, even Christ; and all ye are brethren.
- 9. And call no man your father upon the earth: for one is your Father, which is in heaven.
- 10. Neither be ye called masters: for one is your Master, even Christ.
- 11. But he that is greatest among you shall be your
- 12. And whosoever shall exalt himself shall be abased; and he that shall humble himself shall be exalted.
- 37. O Jerusalem, Jerusalem, thou that killest the prophets, and stonest them which are sent unto thee, how often would I have gathered thy children together, even as a hen gathereth her chickens under her wings, and ye would not!
 - 38. Behold, your house is left unto you desolate.
- 39. For I say unto you, Ye shall not see me henceforth, till ye shall say, Blessed is he that cometh in the name of the Lord.

Memory Verse: Whosoever shall exalt himself shall be abased; and he that shall humble himself shall be exalted. Matt. 23:12.

Practical Truth: Religious leaders should be careful to teach the truth and to exemplify the spirit of Christ.

COMMENTS AND APPLICATION

Ever since the devil told the first lie in the garden of Eden the history of the world has been one of much falseness, but when it is found in the leaders who are trusted by the common people, no wonder Jesus is so severe in his denunciation. We as representatives of the true Christianity need to be watchful that such does not creep in unawares. May God help us. Let us notice the solemn denunciation of Jesus as he related this list of sins; they shut up the windows of heaven, and devour widow's houses, verses 13 and 14. He plainly calls them hypocrites in verses 25 through 27. "Ye are the children of them that killed the prophets" verse 31. Many such things Jesus said they had done and were still doing and in verses 34-36 he tells what they will continue to do.

Throughout all the history of the Jewish nation God had shown a continual lament over the way Jerusalem had received his mercies and here we have the lament of Jesus as he weeps over this same Jerusalem and says, "How often would I have gathered thy children together." Jesus has that same message today for the world and says "Come unto me" Matt. 11:28-30. He still has mercy

and compassion for all of those who will come.

JESUS URGES ALERTNESS

March 8, 1953

Matt. 25:1. Then shall the kingdom of heaven be likened unto ten virgins, which took their lamps, and went forth to meet the bridegroom.

- 2. And five of them were wise, and five were foolish.
- They that were foolish took their lamps, and took no oil with them:

- 4. But the wise took oil in their vessels with their lamps.
- 5. While the bridegroom tarried, they all slumbered and slept.
- 6. And at midnight there was a cry made, Behold, the bridegroom cometh; go ye out to meet him.
- 7. Then all those virgins arose, and trimmed their lamps.
- 8. And the foolish said unto the wise, Give us of your oil; for our lamps are gone out.
- 9. But the wise answered, saying, Not so; lest there be not enough for us and you: but go ye rather to them that sell, and buy for yourselves.
- 10. And while they went to buy, the bridegroom came; and they that were ready went in with him to the marriage: and the door was shut.
- 11. Afterward came also the other virgins, saying, Lord, Lord, open to us.
- 12. But he answered and said, Verily I say unto you, I know you not.
- 13. Watch therefore, for ye know neither the day nor the hour wherein the Son of man cometh.

Memory Verse: Watch ye, stand fast in the faith, quit you like men, be strong. 1 Cor. 16:13.

Practical Truth: The Christian should be constantly prepared to meet his Lord.

COMMENTS AND APPLICATION

The key words here are to watch and be ready. There are a number of warnnings in the Bible which show that we need to be on our guard that we may not lose out by "Unbelief, in departing from the living God." Heb. 3:12. It must be possible to do this or surely God would not have had it recorded just as he has here to warn us. God is longsuffering and full of compassion for all that are ready to take his warning for he is "Not willing that any should perish, but that all should come to repentance."

In the case of the foolish virgins, it is quite evident that they had lost the Holy Spirit out of their lives and yet were going on with a profession just as if they were still the same. Rom. 8:9 plainly says, "Now if any man have not the Spirit of Christ, he is none of his." "Know ye not that ye are the temple of God, and that the Spirit of God dwelleth in you? If any man defile the temple of God, him shall God destroy." 1 Cor. 3:16-17. Therefore it is very plain that we need to heed the directions given in Heb. 12:15 "Looking diligently lest any man fail of the grace of God."

ACCOUNTABLE TO GOD

March 15, 1953

Printed Portion......Matthew 25:31-46.

Matt. 25:31. When the Son of man shall come in his glory, and all the holy angels with him, then shall he sit upon the throne of his glory:

- 32. And before him shall be gathered all nations; and he shall separate them one from another, as a shepherd divideth his sheep from the goats:
- 33. And he shall set the sheep on his right hand, but the goats on the left.
- 34. Then shall the King say unto them on his right hand, Come, ye blessed of my Father, inherit the kingdom prepared for you from the foundation of the world:
- 35. For I was an hungred, and ye gave me meat: I was thirsty, and ye gave me drink: I was a stranger, and ye took me in:

- 36. Naked, and ye clothed me: I was sick, and ye visited me: I was in prison, and ye came unto me.
- 37. Then shall the righteous answer him, saying, Lord, when saw we thee an hungred, and fed thee? or thirsty, and gave thee drink?
- 38. When saw we thee a stranger, and took thee in? or naked, and clothed thee?
- 39. Or when saw we thee sick, or in prison, and came unto thee?
- 40. And the King shall answer and say unto them, Verily I say unto you, Inasmuch as ye have done it unto one of the least of these my brethren, ye have done it unto me.
- 41. Then shall he say also unto them on the left hand, Depart from me, ye cursed, into everlasting fire, prepared for the devil and his angels:
- 42. For I was an hungred, and ye gave me no meat: I was thirsty, and ye gave me no drink:
- 43. I was a stranger, and ye took me not in: naked, and ye clothed me not: sick, and in prison, and ye visited me not.
- 44. Then shall they also answer him, saying, Lord, when saw we thee an hungred, or athirst, or a stranger, or naked, or sick, or in prison, and did not minister unto thee?
- 45. Then shall he answer them, saying, Verily I say unto you, Inasmuch as ye did it not to one of the least of these, ye did it not to me.
- 46. And these shall go away into everlasting punishment: but the righteous into life eternal.

Memory Verse: Verily I say unto you, Inasmuch as ye have done it unto one of the least of these my brethren, ye have done it unto me. Matt. 25:40.

Practical Truth: We all must render an account to God.

COMMENTS AND APPLICATION

Jesus gives us here the picture of the judgment scene so particularly described that no one can make mistake. The fact of the coming judgment is mentioned many, many times; here are three, Acts 17:31 "He hath appointed a day, in the which he will judge the world." Rom. 14: 12, "So then every one of us shall give account of himself to God." 2 Cor. 5:10, "For we must all appear before the judgment seat of Christ." So then the important fact is to learn that we are answerable to God. Since God has created all, he has a right to do with us as he will. Listen to Rev. 4:11, "Thou art worthy, O Lord to receive glory and honour and power: for thou hast created all things, and for thy pleasure they are and were created." No one is left out. God watches over every one with mercy.

There is a reward for the righteous right here in this life as well as in the world to come, for when he gets saved from sin he begins a happy life that will last throughout all eternity. Ponder Rom. 6:22, "But now being made free from sin, and become servants to God, ye have your fruit unto holiness, and the end everlasting life." Mal. 3:16-17, "And they shall be mine, saith the Lord of hosts, in that day when I make up my jewels."

IN THE SHADOW OF THE CROSS

March 22, 1953

Matt. 26:6. Now when Jesus was in Bethany, in the house of Simon the leper,

- 7. There came unto him a woman having an alabaster box of very precious ointment, and poured it on his head, as he sat at meat.
- 8. But when his disciples saw it, they had indignation, saying, To what purpose is this waste?
- 9. For this ointment might have been sold for much, and given to the poor.
- 10. When Jesus understood it, he said unto them, Why trouble ye the woman? for she hath wrought a good work upon me.
- 11. For ye have the poor always with you; but me ye have not always.
- 12. For in that she hath poured this ointment on my body, she did it for my burial.
- 13. Verily I say unto you, Wheresoever this gospel shall be preached in the whole world, there shall also this, that this woman hath done, be told for a memorial of her.
- 26. And as they were eating, Jesus took bread, and blessed it, and brake it, and gave it to the disciples, and said, Take, eat; this is my body.
- 27. And he took the cup, and gave thanks, and gave it to them, saying, Drink ye all of it;
- 28. For this is my blood of the new testament, which is shed for many for the remission of sins.
- 29. But I say unto you, I will not drink henceforth of this fruit of the vine, until that day when I drink it new with you in my Father's kingdom.
- 30. And when they had sung an hymn, they went out into the mount of Olives.

Memory Verse: I lay down my life, that I might take it again. No man taketh it from me, but I lay it down of myself. John 10:17-18.

Practical Truth: The outpoured love of Christ for us demands a responsive love on our part, suitably expressed.

COMMENTS AND APPLICATION

Jesus is drawing nearer and nearer to the cross and we notice some of his definite preparations for it. In our preparation for crucifixion of self there needs to be a definite preparation. The Bible gives definite instructions. Paul said, "I am crucified with Christ." Gal. 2:20. "The world is crucified unto me and I unto the world."

Mary of Bethany had her part in this preparation. Read John 11:1-2, 12:1-9. It must have cost Mary all that she had, for Jesus, who knows all things said, "She hath done what she could." She gave what was considered a year's earnings and Judas who criticized her, sold his Lord for thirty pieces of silver (\$5.10). Mary showed that she really believed Jesus when he told her of his coming death. Her love was poured out and her contrition was displayed by the tears that she shed. "Are we bringing the gift of true love to the Saviour? Are we honouring Jesus so gentle and good? Oh, how sweet it will be when our service is ended, If we hear his voice say, 'Ye have done what ye could'." (Song 254 in Evening Light Songs)

"This do in remembrance of me." In John 6:53-63, Jesus explains about eating his flesh and drinking his blood by saying, "The words that I speak unto you, they are spirit and they are life." Rev. 2:17, "To him that overcometh will I give to eat of the hidden manna."

JESUS IS CRUCIFIED

March 29, 1953

- Matt. 27:32. And as they came out, they found a man of Cyrene, Simon by name: him they compelled to bear his cross.
- 33. And when they were come unto a place called Golgotha, that is to say, a place of a skull,
- 34. They gave him vinegar to drink mingled with gall: and when he had tasted thereof, he would not drink.
- 35. And they crucified him, and parted his garments, casting lots: that it might be fulfilled which was spoken by the prophet, They parted my garments among them, and upon my vesture did they cast lots.
 - 36. And sitting down they watched him there;
- 37. And set up over his head his accusation written, THIS IS JESUS THE KING OF THE JEWS.
- 38. Then were there two thieves crucified with him, one on the right hand, and another on the left.
- 39. And they that passed by reviled him, wagging their heads,
- 40. And saying, Thou that destroyest the temple, and buildest it in three days, save thyself. If thou be the Son of God, come down from the cross.
- 41. Likewise also the chief priests mocking him, with the scribes and elders, said,
- 42. He saved others; himself he cannot save. If he be the King of Israel, let him now come down from the cross, and we will believe him.
- 43. He trusted in God; let him deliver him now, if he will have him; for he said, I am the Son of God.
- 44. The thieves, also which were crucified with him, cast the same in his teeth.
- 54. Now when the centurion, and they that were with him, watching Jesus, saw the earthquake, and those things that were done, they feared greatly, saying, Truly this was the Son of God.

Memory Verse: God commendeth his love toward us, in that, while we were yet sinners, Christ died for us. Romans 5:8.

Practical Truth: Through the greatest sacrifice ever made the greatest triumph was achieved—the redemption of a lost world.

COMMENTS AND APPLICATION

Brother C. E. Orr had a vision of the cross when he said, "I see thee on the reeking cross, I'm thinking, Lord, of thee." It makes the tears come when we get a vision of Christ on the cross for us. Rom. 5:8 plainly declares, "But God commendeth his love toward us, in that, while we were yet sinners, Christ died for us." The wonderful love of God. God gave his Son, (John 3:16) and the Son gave his life, (John 10:17-18). This is a great cost in the great plan of redemption for us who are "by nature the children of wrath." Eph. 2:3. We deserved wrath but God had mercy. "According to his mercy he saved us" Titus 3:4, 5. The reason for this is given in 2 Cor. 5:21, "For he hath made him to be sin for us, who knew no sin; that we might be made the righteousness of God in him."

What a contrast there is; when Jesus Christ was born, the glory of the Lord, shining forth upon the earth in radiant splendor, turned night into day. When he died, God veiled the sun, and turned midday into the blackness of night. During that time Jesus felt that God had left him for he said, "My God, My God, why hast thou forsaken me?" Matt. 27:46. But the triumphant cry of Jesus, "It is finished," gave to the world the finished plan of redemption. There is no other love like the love of Jesus that can satisfy the longing of the soul.

C. W.
