### Believing and Behaving

"What's good tonight?" I addressed the question to a busy waitress as she prepared to take my order.

Without the slightest embarrassment she answered, "How should I know? I eat at home!"

Later, thinking over the vagaries of human behavior, I strolled down the street to be accosted by a newsboy: "Paper, Mister?"

"Well, maybe," I rejoined. "What's the news?" "I dunno, Mister—I never read the paper!"

Still later, while an energetic young colored boy wearing dirty saddle shoes beat out a rapid tattoo upon my dusty footwear, I listened with great interest while a bald-headed barber described a tonic guaranteed to raise hair.

Inconsistency? Yes, but no more so than the sad spectacle of professing Christians who give little evidence of being possessing Christians. As a wise old preacher once remarked: "There are two things we must do: believe the Gospel, and behave the Gospel."

Nothing could be more explicit than the Scriptural admonition for the children of God to "be doers of the Word, and not hearers only." A Bible teacher once reminded us, "We've had a feast of Bible interpretation, and a famine of Bible application!"

The United Press some time ago reported how maintenance men at the University of California discovered that termites had eaten through a large stack of pamphlets in the mailing room. The title of the pamphlets: "Control of Termites." It was one thing to explain the theory of termite control in a pamphlet—and quite another to put the theory into practice!

The thinking Christian is not only aware of the truths contained in God's Word, but is faithful in applying them in his own experience. His entire personality is permeated by his conception of God. He is careful to heed the instruction of God's Word to be the "servant of Christ, doing the will of God from the heart," and to be "blameless and harmless, the sons of God...holding forth the Word of Life."

Too many are like the lad who knelt beside his bed one night and prayed: "Lord, make me a good boy. Not real good, but good enough to keep from getting spanked!" We need the reminder of Horace Mann, who is reported to have said: "I have never heard anything about the resolutions of the apostles, but a good deal about the acts of the apostles!"

God wonderfully designed the blueprint for Christian living. He has promised to make His will clear to the earnest seeker, and places at our disposal all that we need to execute His purpose in our lives. In the words of Jesus, "If any man will do His will, he shall know of the doctrine" (John 7:17). Again, "We have not an high priest which cannot be touched with the feeling of our infirmities . . . Let us therefore come boldly unto the throne of grace, that we may obtain mercy, and find grace to help in time of need" (Heb. 4:15, 16).

Missionaries, entering a district where they believed the Gospel had never gone, sought to impress the natives with the infinite holiness of Christ. To their amazement, the natives cried: "We know Him! We know Him! He used to live here!"

Patiently the missionaries explained that the One of whom they spoke had lived centuries before, in a different part of the world. Still the villagers insisted that they knew Him because He used to live there.

It was learned that years before a single soldier of the Cross had entered the village. His ministry seemed to bear little fruit, but the ineffable sweetness of his personality had been so Christ-like that it had made an indelible impression upon the minds of his hearers.

Could that be said of you? Would that be the testimony of your friends—of the members of your family? "The fragrance of Christ is the perfume of His people." Is your life sweetened by His indwelling presence so that others really see Him in you?

May God give us the burning urgency in our hearts to love Christ and to live Christ. May we remember that when we are saved by grace we cannot disgrace. May we praise Him with our lives as well as with our lips as we believe the Gospel and behave the Gospel.

# Redemption

The authors of the dictionaries define the word redemption as "the act of deliverance, release, repurchase," etc. The redemption through Christ is the deliverance or repurchase of man. Man in his original primeval state enjoyed unity and an affinity with God. Because of transgression on the part of man this natural agreement between God and man was destroyed. All creation—herb, and tree, beast and fowl, and man—was pronounced very good by the Creator as he beheld it in review after creation. Gen. 1:29-31.

But because of Eden's sin the very nature of all things became changed. The ground became cursed, and thorns and thistles sprang up. Gen. 3:17, 18. The nature of the beast creation no doubt became affected by man's transgression. Gen. 6:7, 11-13. The transgression in Eden was the entrance of sin into this world. Rom. 5:12. Previous to this all in the world was sinless harmony, and the earth itself uncursed by thorns and thistles. By the entrance of sin man's nature became changed, and since the nature of man became depraved there has not been a single individual born of the flesh but has possessed a depraved nature, except the child conceived by the Holy Spirit. The Psalmist says: "Behold, I was shapen in iniquity, and in sin did my mother conceive me." Ps. 51:5.

This same is true of every child. The nature of the child in its formation in the womb is deprayed. The moral condition of the parents may modify to an extent, but never wholly change that nature. The child does not inherit a depraved nature from its parents; it is not because the parents are depraved that the child is conceived in sin, but because nature is depraved. It required a supernatural conception to beget a pure child, everything in nature being depraved. The child does not inherit either physical or moral image directly from its parents. It is true the child generally bears a marked resemblance to the parent both physically and morally, but on the whole it is born in the image of Adam, morally and physically. It is generally the case that if a parent have three arms or possess but one, his offspring will have two, receiving its physical image from the first created man. Should the parents be holy, the child will possess a carnal nature, because it is the nature of all the race.

How holy parents beget children depraved in nature is a puzzling problem to some minds, especially to those who are busying themselves about the intricate matters of God. This need be no more puzzling

than a deformed parent begetting perfectly formed children. Nature, in embryo, begins its work of forming both the physical and moral image of the child, which is after the similitude of the original parents and not the immediate ones. While justification, which is the forgiveness of actual transgression, the inevitable result of a depraved nature, is a wonderful and glorious achievement of grace, it is but a very small part of the redemption of Christ. The supernatural overthrow of the depraved nature by the power of the Holy Spirit is the principal and real redemptive work. The pardon of committed sins is the clearing away of the rubbish or preparation work, for the Third Person in the Holy Trinity to effect a revolution in the nature of man. Hallelujah to God! This change in nature is more wonderful than the revolting of nature at the command of Joshua. Man now, instead of being depraved in nature, is restored to his original holy nature.

This destruction of the carnal nature and the restoration of the original nature is accomplished by the Holy Spirit at the moment of his reception as an indwelling comforter. Peter teaches this truth when he says: "God, which knoweth the hearts [or nature], bare them witness, giving them the Holy Ghost, even as he did unto us | at Pentecost |; and put no difference between us and them [Gentiles], purifying their hearts by faith."—Acts 15:8, 9. Purifying the heart is the purification of man's affections, or nature. This is accomplished at the time of the giving of the Holy Ghost as declared in the last text; and this purifying of the hearts of the Gentiles at the giving of the Holy Ghost, is just what was done for the apostles at Pentecost. This is a plain undeniable fact taught in the text. To turn to philosophizing upon how we can be conceived with a carnal nature, or how we can be converted and yet be depraved in nature is to soon become spoiled through vain deceit after the rudiments of the world and not after Christ, Col. 2:8. In the very nature of things and according to the word of God, pardon of sins necessarily precedes the destruction of the carnal depraved nature by the Holy Spirit. In the fall of man there was the act of transgression and also a change in man's moral image. In his restoration there must be a pardon of transgression and subsequently a change in nature.

It is a law of God that the redemption of man be accomplished through faith, by his grace. Our faith can not reach beyond our knowledge. By knowledge we mean a real soul-consciousness or conviction and not an intellectual knowledge. At this point many a dear soul has erred from the truth. They have endeavored to bring their faith up to their intellectual knowledge, which ends in presumption. True Bible faith is grounded in the soul. It results from a soulknowledge, or conviction. To accept pardon of sins or healing of body with only an intellectual knowledge of these blessings and not a real heart-conviction is mere presumption, and ends in failure and disgrace. To follow the comprehensions of the intellect, and not the enlightenment of the Holy Spirit upon the soul, concerning the mysteries of God's salvation is to be led into error, because the intellect can not fathom

the things of God. We do now emphatically say, according to God's established law, that no unregenerated heart can have a comprehension or conviction of a corrupt moral nature and its purification. Why? Because transgression stands between it and purity. The awakened guilty soul knows nothing but its guilt, and for forgiveness only does it plead. After being pardoned the soul gains a knowledge of carnality, and it is then convicted for the second cleansing.

Those who believe that purity of heart is attained in pardon take as a basis of such belief the language of Paul in 2 Cor. 5:17; Rom. 8:1-7; and similar texts. Now the apostle often speaks of full salvation, or complete redemption of the soul, in a general way. He says that "salvation is by the grace of God through faith." By this he does not mean justification only, but sanctification as well. He has not specified the two works, but has spoken of full salvation in a general way of being by grace through faith. Thus Eph. 2:8-10 includes full salvation. In 2 Cor. 5:17 he again speaks of full salvation in a general way. It is true we are in Christ when converted, but we are none the less in him when sanctified. To say that Paul is referring to the justified only in this text is an error. By the two preceding verses we have reason to believe he is referring to those who are wholly sanctified. This then is no proof text that carnality is destroyed in justification, because you can not prove that he is referring to those who are only justified. In conclusion we would say that Christ came to redeem man only. Beast and bird have no part in the redemption. They shall perish. The earth is not redeemable, but being under the curse-spotted by sin-it shall be destroyed. By C. E. Orr printed in the Gospel Trumpet June 8, 1899.

# The Door

is closed, it will be too late. Oh, please open your heart's door today and let Jesus come into your heart. Just now, while he is knocking and while you are in your right mind and all is well, let Him in. He will bless you and forgive your sins and roll the burden away and put a new song in your heart and mouth.

The door of heaven was shut against the proud Pharisee's heart and was opened to hear the prayer of the humble penitent sinner.

As I was meditating on the subject of God shutting the door to Noah's ark, the thought came to me why God shut the door instead of Noah. ### **Editorials**

This is the second issue of the paper in the new year of 1954, and our hearts are rejoicing in Him to know that he makes it possible for us to send forth this little messenger of truth and righteousness again to our many readers. We want our readers to rejoice in spirit with us in God because of the good that is being done by sending forth the Gospel of Christ by the printed page. The little paper with its load of heavenly bread reaches many souls in the hedges and byways, jails and penal institutions that evangelists never come in contact with. Many become happy in Christ and ready for heaven that otherwise would grope on in darkness, sorrow, and grief, and have a disappointed ending. The little gospel tracts, the silent preachers, are going out continually and reaching into the nooks and corners of the earth; and they tell their truthful story over and over again and again. as one will receive them and pass them on to others who in turn get blessed and burdened for their loved ones or friends to read them, too. Thus the work of God moves on by the generally unseen hand of God, gathering souls unto Christ, who in time to come will present them to the Father as His spiritual bride or wife. They have suffered for Him in this sinful world, having washed their robes in the blood of the Lamb and overcome evil by their faith in God and their testimony of his saving and keeping grace. Bless the Lord, O my soul, and forget not all of His benefits.

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Quite often folks ask us to tell them how this work at Faith Publishing House is carried on or kept up. As the name implies, it is purely a faith work, and is not kept up and going by commercial profits; but is a servant of the church of God, which is the pillar and ground of the truth. The mail and principal supplies come from the members of His body, which is the church or family of God functioning in the world but are not of the world. They are kept from the evils of this world by the power of God living and working in their souls. These supplies are given freely as a gift to the work as God moves on his children by His Spirit.

Those who help do the work in the print shop and office are directed by the Lord to come and help get the gospel out to men by the printed page. We make them no promise of any stipulated salary or wages; but they, being consecrated to the service of God, come of their own free-will, looking to God by faith to supply their temporal needs. We live as one family here, making God first in everything. When there is a need, we tell the Lord about it and ask Him to have mercy on us and to supply and He does that for His children. We generally have from two to four workers in the office. We meet in the front room of the dwelling house every morning at seven o'clock for worship. We do not have any cut and dried rule in worship; but generally we have two songs and then one in turn reads some out of the word of God and we all kneel and pray unto God, thanking Him for His many blessings and asking Him for grace and strength for the day and the supplying of all needs. Many times prayer requests come in which we remember in prayer before the throne of grace, besides telling God about them in our private prayers and devotion through the day. No one is retained in the work unless we are convinced that they are saved and consecrated unto God, and in this way it is like heaven in the home and heaven in the print shop. Truly the saints of God have a heaven to go to heaven in. Every evening after supper we gather in the front room and have our family devotions and pray for one another.

Just yesterday morning one of the workers was sick and unable to work. She called for prayer and was anointed according to the word, and prayed for. She went on to her work, and she testified when eating her noon day meal that if the Lord had not touched her she would have been unable to work. It is precious to keep our faith fully in God. The Lord loves his faithful and obedient children and will help them just as he has promised in his word. James 5:13, 14, and 15. I like the chorus of the song which is as follows: "Stand by the cross, soldier, stand;

Victory will come by and by; Stand by the cross, soldier, stand; And we'll conquer though we die."

In this issue of the Faith and Victory paper we have two articles taken from the Gospel Trumpet paper which was printed in 1899. The year before this, an anti-cleansing doctrine had begun to work among the saints of God, and some of the ministers had been deceived into it. Their teaching was that all carnality, depravity, or impurity transmitted to the human race by the fall of Adam was cleansed out or destroyed when one was justified and that there was no cleansing in the second work, sanctification, the infilling of the Holy Spirit. Some of them even claimed that there was no evil principal or impurity transmitted to man by the fall. It is strange that men who once had light on the cleansing in the second work, which is sanctification, could become so blinded as to deny what God had done for them and take up with a false doctrine. In the Gospel Trumpet paper of June 22, 1899 is a full report of these ministers being renounced, giving their names and the reason for renouncing them.

I believe it would please the Lord for us to quote some of what was written in regard to this matter.

Quote: "For some time past our readers are aware of the element and false doctrines and false spirits opposing the teachings that have in the past been going forth on the subject of sanctification and other lines, and certain ones had been exposed some time ago. Nearly all of those parties, with others, were present at the meeting claiming their object was to investigate the matter concerning their teaching. They desired a chance to set forth their doctrines of heresy publicly, or before all the ministry—which meant a public discussion—but as their doctrines had been exposed publicly before some of them over one year ago and at different times since, and as they had been privately labored with and shown the error of their doctrine and warned against the false spirit that

caused them to propagate the same, and also some of the ministers had spent over two days with them recently, trying to show them their error, we considered it wisdom to give no place to a public discussion of a thing that was known to be a heresy. However, as they have also claimed that they have been misunderstood, they were asked to put their teachings in writing, which would then be considered before the ministry. This was done by those who were present who had taken up and taught that doctrine: Namely, W. A. Haynes, W. J. Henry, J. A. Smith, J. E. Chase, E. G. Masters, E. S. Soan, E. W. Durkee, S.C. Dickason, and Frank McCann. And after they having spent two days in arranging the same it was afterwards read publicly before the congregation and ministers and refuted by the word of God, showing not only the falsity of the doctrine but the spirit that propagated the same. It was so full of error and false teaching, misapplication and perverting of the word of God, that almost all present were made to realize the awful deceptions which the Devil is trying to impose upon the Church of God. The meetings had been very much hindered on account of permitting this element to have influence without a public exposure, but when it was given God witnessed the same at the close of the service by an outpouring of his Spirit and about forty persons flocking to the altar seeking salvation and deliverance through Jesus Christ. Most of those under that teaching soon left the ground, and the work of God went on with power, and those who remained and were affected by that doctrine began to feel the effects of the melting power of God and were constrained to acknowledge the same and yield to the wooings of the Holy Spirit.

"J. W. Henry, of whom mention has been made heretofore, desired to make a public statement, which he did, and after the doctrine was exposed by the word of God, and the spirit of the same rebuked, he arose and confessed that he saw the doctrine was false, and said, it truly is a slimy doctrine of the Devil, and underneath it all is a spirit of deception and that the whole foundation was based upon the idea that the soul was given directly from God at birth, without a scripture to prove the same, it being founded upon scientific and philosophical principals and reasoning, and not upon the word of God. In fact the whole thing is founded upon an "if" that "if" such and such a thing is true, something else is true. But we have no time to parley with such unsound doctrines and risk our souls upon a belief that is founded upon an "if." Jesus said to Nicodemus, 'We speak that we do know.' John 3:11"--End of quote.

This article goes on to say that there were others in the west who had taken up with this heresy and they were also renounced. Their names were: F. Husted, J. M. Harrington, A. A. Kinzie, Price McCully, W. Christ. Besides W. J. Henry who renounced the heresy and came back with the saints of God was E. G. Masters who had been carried away with the wind of doctrine. He renounced it and came back later.

The two articles spoken of heretofore, which we are inserting in this issue of the paper, will show the

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error of this heresy and also give some good Bible teaching that shows the truth on the subject. I deem these articles to be timely and of great help to the true saints everywhere. One of the articles is by the late C. E. Orr, and the other is written by George L. Cole.

Those ministers who were renounced have not been heard of very much, it seems, and we understand that some of them got off into some kind of tongues deception, and others no doubt died without being ready to meet God. After the space of fifty-five years, the Devil is trying to press this same false doctrine on the Remnant of God's people who have stood against the flood of worldliness that has swallowed up so many of the dear saints. It seems that the Devil failed in getting this anti-cleansing doctrine in the hearts of God's people, but he slyly worked in a compromising spirit upon them and strangled the most of them with worldliness and worldly wisdom together with copying after sectarianism, and in so doing lost real faith in God.

The State Assembly meeting held at Guthrie, Okla. during the holidays was well attended and the interest was good throughout the meeting. A number of ministers were present from different states; namely from La., Mo., Kansas., and different parts of Okla. The Word went forth with power of the Spirit and unction from above. A few souls got saved along through the meeting, but on New Years Day in the afternoon service there was a real breaking up and breaking through and the altar filled up time and again with seekers. Many of them came weeping; some for salvation and others consecrating and receiving the second work of cleansing and infilling of the Holy Ghost. The altar service lasted until near dark. Then on the second day of the new year at the night service there was another breaking thru as the Spirit of God was poured out from above and many came sobbing and weeping and fell down before God with broken and contrite spirits, pouring out their souls in repentance toward God. The altar work went on until nearly one o'clock in the morning. It was truly a glorious time in Zion. A good unifying spirit prevailed all through the meeting. There were souls saved in this meeting who no doubt will be pillars in the Church of God in years to come. Let us all pray one for the other.

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A brother living in Anderson, Ind. supplied the two books for which I advertised in the January issue of this paper. It seems that the Lord just had them waiting there for us. These books contain the 1899 and 1900 issues of the Gospel Trumpet papers.

### The Bible Standard

People are not usually apt to exchange their religious views unless they fancy in some way that their present views are wrong, not giving satisfation; hence a craving for something they do not possess. All who have the true doctrine have met the conditions, and received grace from God to live accordingly, and the life proves the doctrine to be true. The doctrine teaches the life, but it would be dogmatic unless the life attested the same; but when it does, there is perfect satisfaction. If we cannot obtain grace to live

up to the doctrine we will very likely doubt the same and have reasons for it; but if we get the needed grace, a doubt would be impossible; therefore Jesus says, "If a man will do his will he shall know the doctrine." -John 7:17. Faith lands in knowledge when God's will is done. There may be doubts as to the genuineness of the will or doctrine before it is tested, but when tested by obedience revelation brings a knowledge that satisfies the heart which cannot be persuaded to relinquish its grasp upon the truth of the same, while eternal life reigns within and reason sits upon her throne. Persons that have never experienced the life contained in the doctrine of sanctification might change their views respecting the doctrine, over and over again being tossed to and fro like children, but when this life is revealed by the Spirit through obedience, "He shall know the doctrine," after which it is impossible to change views respecting the same until the grace of life is lost, and he becomes "blind and cannot see afar off and hath forgotten that he was purged from his old sins."

### A DECEPTION OF THE DEVIL

Is the doctrine that there is no cleansing in the work of sanctification, everything being cleansed in the work of justification; the work of sanctification only a positive work, and that is the baptism of the Holy Spirit. This doctrine has been refuted many times in The Gospel Trumpet, but those going into error still insist on teaching their false doctrine, even those who have professed sanctification in the light of the doctrine, that there is a cleansing as well as a baptism. As a basis for their new doctrine they claim that they are raising the standard of justification, but when the secret is known they simply deny the existence of the carnal nature, thus leaving the standard of justification identically as before and simply lower the standard of sanctification, denying the cleansing thereof, so if it is true that there is a sin principle in man, it is not cleansed out, and if not the Holy Spirit cannot possess the temple while this carnal element exists within, therefore all who seek sanctification as an infilling will receive nothing unless they receive a delusion from the Devil and believe a lie. No one can intelligently seek the experience of sanctification as a cleansing and infilling unless they consciously feel the need of a cleansing and infilling. If they deny the existence of carnality, they will not receive the Holy Spirit.

In speaking of this sin principle the Apostle John said, "If we say that we have no sin, we deceive ourselves and the truth is not in us." 1 John 1:8. Hence there is no satisfaction for such unless they repent and obtain deliverance from that error. The saints back in sectism have plead by the hour that God would baptize them with the Holy Ghost; they sought it as an infilling only and not as a cleansing, and not one of them obtained sanctification as we now enjoy it; but when they began to recognize that there was a cleansing needed, the real experience of sanctification, thus carnality was taken out of their hearts, the cause of division was taken out of them, and soon they received light on the one body—the church of God; hence the reformation that we now enjoy. We do not

hesitate to say that those who have sought, obtained, lived, and taught sanctification as a cleansing and infilling, a negative and positive work, and now teach that there is no cleansing in the work of sanctification, have lost their experience and now possess a delusion instead.

But let us more carefully examine into their true condition. Suppose their present doctrine is correct, the former one must be false. The question then arises, Could they have obtained a real experience of sanctification through a false doctrine? No; "we are sanctified through the truth."—John 17:17. They must admit one of two things, either they did not obtain sanctification under the former doctrine, or if they did the doctrine is correct, and if correct their present one is false and they are now false teachers. If they have not renounced their former profession nor sought an experience under present doctrines they have no experience nor internal evidence as to genuineness of the same. The change in doctrine, virtually, forfeits all claim to their former experience, so they are unsanctified now because they have not sought it according to what they hold as true; thus being unsanctified they have lost their commission to preach and teach because no unsanctified person is commissioned to preach; therefore, they are scripturally disarmed and unable to set forth their new doctrine. No wonder the apostle says an heretic is "subverted and sinneth, being condemned of himself." "The blood cleanseth from all sin."--1 John 1:7. "The blood . . . wherewith he was sanctified."-Heb. 10:29. To deny the cleansing in sanctification is to deny the blood. Punishment only awaits such. See Heb. 10:26-29.

### TO BE CLEANSED OUT

Sin as a principle, called "The sin that dwelleth in us," Rom. 7:17-20. This sin is said to revive when the commandment came, or at the age of accountability. See Rom. 7:9. It is called the "Body of this death," or margin, "This body of death." Rom. 7:24. "Sin in the flesh." Rom. 8:3. "Body of sin," Rom. 6:6; "Body of flesh," Col. 2:11. (See Emphatic Diaglott). The same is called "sin." 1 John 1:8. That this element is not our actual sins or transgressions, it is declared to be the cause of them. See Romans 6:6; 7:9, 17, 19, 20. And now in face of these scriptures we cannot deny the existence of carnality, which is sin that the blood cleanseth according to 1 John 1:7 and Heb. 10:29, in the work of sanctification.

### The Fear of Man Bringeth A Snare

"Nevertheless among the chief rulers also many believed on him; but because of the Pharisees they did not confess him, lest they should be put out of the synagogue, for they loved the praise of men more than the praise of God." John 12:42, 43. Jesus went about all Galilee preaching the gospel of the kingdom of God. He healed the sick, he cast out demons with the word of his mouth, and performed many miracles and wonders among the people. His words were with such power and authority that the people

were convinced that he was more than an ordinary man. His works were so different, and so much more outstanding than anything they had ever witnessed until they were made to realize within their very innermost being that he was a "man sent from God." Some confessed that he was the Christ, the Son of God. Others, yes many others, believed. The Word of God says they "believed on him [Jesus] but because of the Pharisees they did not confess him." And the reason they would not confess him was they were afraid they would be put out of the synagogue. And worse yet, their hearts were so blinded to the value of eternal wealth and heaven-born fellowship, that they loved the praise of men more than the praise of God.

And I am persuaded that many in this present time— in these last days when men are lovers of themselves, proud, highminded, worldly position lovers, loving a high place among their fellowmen—who have heard the Word of God preached in its purity, clearly explained, proved and backed up by the Bible, have believed that the message was true, and yet they would not confess and accept it because they feared public censure—afraid they would be put out of the synagogue so to speak, or excommunicated. They would rather cater to public opinion than to submit to the Word of God.

Jesus said, "Whosoever therefore shall be ashamed of me and of my words in this adulterous and sinful generation; of him also shall the Son of man be ashamed, when he cometh in the glory of his Father with the holy angels" Mark 8:38. He said also, "And I say unto you, Whosoever shall confess me before men, him shall the Son of man also confess before the angels of God: but he that denieth me before men shall be denied before the angels of God." Lk. 12:8, 9.

The fear of man and the love of popularity is dragging many precious souls down in darkness, down to the regions of eternal night. Many are saying, "Yes, that is the truth," "that's Bible, all right," "Yes, that's so," "You're right,"— BUT "my folks." My folks this and my folks that. Dear ones, who are your folks? and what help will your folks be to you when you stand at the great tribunal bar of God and Jesus refuses to confess you because you would not confess him in this world? when he shall deny you before the angels of God because you denied him before men in this life? You had better stop and think a little. Jesus gave his life's blood on Calvary's cross to redeem your poor soul from the wrath to come. It is by the Word of God that you shall be judged in the last day and not by popular opinion and the ideas and flattery of your folks, or your group, or your associates. "The fear of man bringeth a snare; but whose putteth his trust in the Lord shall be safe." Prov. 29:25.

I realize there are many people who do not believe the Bible is of divine origin, do not believe in a coming judgment. There were many in Jesus' day who did not believe in a resurrection or a hereafter. Their hearts are so hardened by Satan and deceptive philosophy and so-called science until they never will

believe nor be persuaded until they come down to grapple arms with death (May God have mercy on this fast decaying world) and face the reality of a never ending eternity. This article is not addressed to such ones, but rather to those who believe, many of whom are making a profession of Christianity, and know that there is a better way of life according to the Word, and will not accept God's way but still hold on to man's way and their own will and way. "But I didn't mean it that way at all, I only used the term 'Reverend' as a title of respect, and not to

### COMMENTS AND APPLICATION

Jesus plainly says, "It is the spirit that quickeneth; the flesh profiteth nothing: the words that I speak unto you, they are spirit, and they are life." (John 6:63) So then we live "by every word of God." (Luke 4:4).

If some did not like the terms of the Master and "Walked no more with him," we who have found Him can say with Peter, "Lord, to whom shall we go? thou hast the words of eternal life. And we believe and are sure that thou art that Christ, the Son of the living God." (vs. 68, 69). Our faith takes hold. (Eph. 3:17-19). To do the words of Christ becomes spiritual life to the soul.

### "CAN THIS BE THE CHRIST?" February 14, 1954

Printed Portion: ...... John 7:37-44; 8:12-19.

John 7:37. In the last day, that great day of the feast, Jesus stood and cried, saying, If any man thirst, let him come unto me, and drink.

- 38. He that believeth on me, as the scripture hath said, out of his belly shall flow rivers of living water.
- 39. (But this spake he of the Spirit, which they that believe on him should receive: for the Holy Ghost was not yet given; because that Jesus was not yet glorified.)
- 40. Many of the people therefore, when they heard this saying, said, Of a truth this is the Prophet.
- 41. Others said, This is the Christ. But some said, Shall Christ come out of Galilee?
- 42.. Hath not the scripture said, That Christ cometh of the seed of David, and out of the town of Bethlehem, where David was?
- 43. So there was a division among the people because of him.
- 44. And some of them would have taken him; but no man laid hands on him.

John 8:12. Then spake Jesus again unto them, saving, I am the light of the world: he that followeth me shall not walk in darkness, but shall have the light of life,

- 13. The Pharisees therefore said unto him, Thou bearest record of thyself; thy record is not true.

### COMMENTS AND APPLICATION

In the previous lesson our Lord claimed to be the Bread of life; now He claims to be the Water of life and the Light of the world. In these eternal titles our Lord speaks with authority, and men marvel.

His claim was "If any man thirst, let him come unto me and drink--but this spake He of the Spirit, which they that believe on Him should receive," vs. 37, 39. "Behold God is my salvation--Therefore with joy shall ye draw water out of the wells of salvation" (Isa. 12:2, 2). So Christ reveals Himself as a fountain and river—knowing the need and He will supply that need when we come by faith. "There's a river of life with its pure crystal light, Flowing out from the great white throne; In that beautiful land where there is no night, And where sorrow never can be known. By the crystal waters flashing, I stand all redeemed by the blood; I'll forever praise my God and King, for my cleansing in the crimson flood." (Evening Light Songs, p. 205).

He claimed also to be "The Light of the world." God in Christ as light is always a conflict against the

darkness of this world. There have always been those who have argued against the claims of Christ, but since the Father has endorsed him, we too, can, and should honor Him.

### THE MAN BORN BLIND

#### February 21, 1954

- 25. He answered and said, Whether he be a sinner or no, I know not: one thing I know, that, whereas I was blind, now I see.
- 26. Then said they to him again, What did he to thee? how opened he thine eyes?
- 27. He answerd them, I have told you already and ye did not hear: wherefore would ye hear it again? will ye also be his disciples?
- 28. Then they reviled him, and said, Thou art his disciple; but we are Moses' disciples.
- 29. We know that God spake unto Moses: as for this fellow, we know not from whence he is.
- 30. The man answered and said unto them, Why herein is a marvellous thing, that ye know not from whence he is, and yet he hath opened mine eyes.
- 31. Now we know that God heareth not sinners: but if any man be a worshipper of God, and doeth his will, him he heareth.
- \$2. Since the world began was it not heard that any man opened the eyes of one that was born blind.
  - 33. If this man were not of God, he could do nothing.
- 34. They answered and said unto him, Thou wast altogether born in sins, and dost thou teach us? And they cast him out.
- 35. Jesus heard that they had cast him out; and when he had found him, he said unto him, Dost thou believe on the Son of God?
- 36. He answered and said, Who is he, Lord, that I might believe on him?
- 37. And Jesus said unto him, Thou hast both seen him, and it is he that talketh with thee.
- 38. And he said, Lord, I believe. And he worshipped him.

Memory Verse: One thing I know, that whereas I was blind, now I see. John 9:25.

Practical Truth: There is no limit to the power of Christ to meet man's physical and spiritual needs.

#### COMMENTS AND APPLICATION

In the gathering tension between light and darkness as seen in this gospel, faith and unbelief are in conflict when our Lord acts to save men. They are skeptical about the miracle of the man receiving sight, But the man spoke of it as an experince and said "I know." Not only was his physical eyesight, but the eyes of his understanding was enlightened (Eph. 1:18) and he walked no more in the realm of darkness (Eph. 5:8). But walked as "Children of light."

Step by step this man was led into an open confession of faith in the Son of God. It is so with all of God's people for Christ is now reigning within and the Spirit of God changes the heart so that a drunkard becomes sober; the immoral become pure; the dishonest become honest; the so-called good man gets converted and all of them really become saints and give testimony to the miracle of God's grace in saving them from all sin.

Notice is taken of how this man that was born blind was excommunicated out of their company, but Jesus took care of him and he needed not the broken reed of the l'harisees any more—for Jesus said their house was left unto them "desolate" (Matt. 23:38).

### THE GOOD SHEPHERD

### February 28, 1954

Printed Portion: ......John 10:1-11.

- 1. Verily, verily I say unto you, He that entereth not by the door into the sheepfold, but climbeth up some other way, the same is a thief and a robber.
- 2. But he that entereth in by the door is the shepherd of the sheep.
- 3. To him the porter openeth; and the sheep hear his voice: and he calleth his own sheep by name, and leadeth them out.
- 4. And when he putteth forth his own sheep, he goeth before them, and the sheep follow him: for they know his voice.
- 5. And a stranger will they not follow, but will flee from him: for they know not the voice of strangers.
- 6. This parable spake Jesus unto them: but they understood not what things they were which he spake unto them.
- 7. Then said Jesus unto them again, Verily, Verily, I say unto you, I am the door of the sheep.
- 8. All that ever came before me are thieves and robbers: but the sheep did not hear them.
- 9. I am the door: by me if any man enter in, he shall be saved, and shall go in and out, and find pasture.
- 10. The thief cometh not, but for to steal, and to kill, and to destroy: I am come that they might have life, and that they might have it more abundantly.
- 11. I am the good shepherd: the good shepherd giveth his life for the sheep.

Memory Verse: And other sheep I have, which are not of this fold: them also I must bring, and they shall bear my voice; and there shall be one fold and one shepherd. John 10:16.

Practical Truth: Christ is a shepherd in whose care and leadership we may safely frust.

#### COMMENTS AND APPLICATION

Christ speaks of himself as the Door to the sheepfold. Many times in the Bible God's people are called sheep. In Ezekiel 34:31 we have "And ye my flock, the flock of my pasture, are men, and I am your God, saith the Lord God." Christ himself was called the "Lamb of God" (John 1:29). So then we are the sheep of His pasture and His pasture is full of good things, as found in Galatians 5:22, 23 and Colossians 3:12-17. The sheep have salvation (Acts 4:12), saved and delivered from sin's bondage, freed from it's guilt and have an assurance of the Spirit that we belong to him. The sheep have satisfaction, to go "in and out" is the freedom of one who has no fear. The old life has passed away, and in Christ are joy, peace, protection, and strength. So in Christ we have the more abundant

Christ received commandment from his Father to lay down his life (John 10:18; Ps. 71:3) and verses 11 and 15 says he does. He gives his life voluntarily. The sacrifice that He made on Calvary was no accident but it was purposed "Before the foundation of the world" I Peter 1:18-23. Another scripture is in Philippians 2:5-11, which gives a good comment on the work Christ did for us and how God highly exalted him.
