They sold their business, gave up their jobs, and left their clothes and belongings. They said "Goodbye" to fathers, mothers, brothers, sisters, wives, children, sweethearts, and friends. They had joined the army.

A good soldier obeys every command, regardless of how foolish the order seems to be. Their clothes, beds, and everything is kept clean and in order. They have good food three times a day, must go to bed at a certain time and get up at the call whether they want to or not. They must obey every command because they are not their own. They belong to the U. S. Army and Navy.

This is a very good comparison of a good soldier of the cross of Christ. According to the Word of God,

no man can come to Christ "except the Father which hath sent me, draw him," John 6:44a. Then he must make the necessary preparations. Jesus said, "Repent ye and believe the gospel." Mark 1:15b. When he has accepted Christ or has been born again, he must also keep God's commandments. Jesus said, "Thou shalt love the Lord thy God with all thy heart, with all thy soul and with all thy mind, and with all thy strength: this is the first commandment. And the second is like, namely this, Thou shalt love thy neighbor as thyself. There is none other commandment greater than these." Mark 12:30, 31. These two are the greatest commandments. There are many more. No matter how foolish they seem to be or how hard the saying, His commandments are not grievous (John 5:3b). If man obeys the voice of the inspired Word of God, he will be a vessel unto honor, sanctified and meet for the Master's use and prepared unto every good work. Christians should be rich in good works, ready to distribute, willing to communicate (1 Tim. 6:18).

Saints should be fruitful in good works. "That ye might walk worthy of the Lord unto all pleasing, being fruitful in every good work, and increasing in the knowledge of God." Saved people in some texts of Scripture, are likened unto good trees. They are a tree that is abounding with the fruit of every good Christians are admonished to be ready unto every good work. "Put them in mind to be subject to principalities and powers, to obey magistrates, to be ready to every good work." Titus 3:1. They should be established in them. "Now the God of peace that brought again from the dead our Lord Jesus, that great Shepherd of the sheep, through the blood of the everlasting covenant, make you perfect in every good work to do his will, working in you that which is well pleasing in his sight through Jesus Christ: to whom be glory forever and ever, Amen." Heb. 13:20, 21. This is a most precious text. "Working in you" in the margin is rendered "doing." All the good things a Christian does is not him doing it, but it is God doing it in him. So he is not found going about telling what he has done.

Saints should provoke each other to good works: "And let us consider one another to provoke unto love and to good works." Heb. 10:24. We know of no better way to provoke others to good works than by setting a good example before them. All their good works should be done in wisdom and meekness, or humility. "Who is a wise man and endued with knowledge among you? let him show out of a good conversation [or conduct] his works with meekness of wisdom." James 3:13.

The people of God do not adorn themselves with gold and pearls and costly array to appear beautiful, but with good works. (1 Timothy 2:9,10).

What can be more lovely than a character beautified by the ornaments of every good work in the meekness of wisdom? Glory to the name of Jesus! My soul feels like crying, "Lord, work more of thy good works in the hearts of thy people!"

Man's works shall be brought into judgment: "For we must all appear before the judgment seat of Christ, that every one may receive the things done in his body, according to that he hath done, whether it be good or bad" 2 Cor. 5:10. "For God shall bring every work into judgment with every secret thing, whether it be good or whether it be evil." Eccl. 12:14.

That will be an awful hour when we are called before the tribunal of God and there have to unfold to the incomprehensible One our true character. The Second Coming of Christ

Acts 1:9-11 says, "And when he had spoken these things, while they beheld, he was taken up; and a cloud received him out of their sight. And while they looked stedfastly toward heaven as he went up, behold, two men stood by them in white apparel; which also said, Ye men of Galilee, why stand ye gazing up into heaven? this same Jesus, which is taken up from you into heaven, shall so come in like manner as ye have seen him go into heaven."

This took place after His resurrection from the dead. Christ remained with his disciples many days, speaking of the things pertaining to the kingdom of God; then he led them out to Mount Olivet, near Bethany, and here gave them the final commission to

preach in his name among all the nations.

In the New Testament much importance is attached to the second coming of Christ. The Scriptures uniformly point forward to that event as the time when the dead will be raised, when the general judgment will take place, and when final rewards will be meted out to the righteous and to the wicked. "The Son of man shall come in the glory of his Father with his angels; and then he shall reward every man according to his works" (Matt. 16:27).

THE END

"And as he sat upon the mount of Olives, the disciples came unto him privately, saying, "Tell us, when shall these things be? and what shall be the sign of thy coming, and the end of the world?" (Matt. 24:3).

In 1 Cor. 15, where Christ's coming and the resurrection are described, we read in this connection, "Then cometh the end" (vs. 24). This great event marks the end of time, the end of man's probation, the end of Christ's special redemptive reign—yea, as Peter says, "The end of all things is at hand" (1 Peter 4:7).

THE RESURRECTION

"There shall be a resurrection of the dead, both of the just and the unjust" (Acts 24:15). How many resurrections? One—"a resurrection." And this one resurrection of the dead is to include both the just and the unjust.

This text does not state when it will take place, but in Revelation 1:7 we have the time stated: "Behold, he cometh with clouds; and every eye shall see him, and they also which pierced him: and all kindreds of the earth shall wail because of him." This proves the fact of a general resurrection; and that this resurrection includes the wicked also is shown by the statement that even those who "pierced him" will see him when he comes. The idea of two literal resurrections—one of the righteous and the other of the wicked—is utterly impossible according to this text. That the resurrection is one, but includes both classes, the just and the unjust, this text makes clear.

"Marvel not at this: for the hour is coming, in the which all that are in the graves shall hear his voice, and shall come forth; they that have done good, unto the resurrection of life; and they that have done

evil, unto the resurrection of damnation" (John 5: 28-29.) Both classes—good and bad—come forth from their graves in the same "hour."

Some think that 1 Thess. 4:16—"the dead in Christ shall rise first"—teaches two resurrections, but even a hasty examination should show that it teaches no such thing. The word "first" does not refer to other dead people at all. The text with the context, simply show that those who are living on the earth in Christ, but that the dead in Christ will rise "first," and then they will both ascend together.

Also Philippians 3:11—"If by any means I might attain unto the resurrection of the dead"-is sometimes perverted in order to sustain the false doctrine of two future literal resurrections of the dead; for, it is argued, if there were only one unconditional resurrection, Paul would not have sought to attain it. But the Bible represents the single resurrection of the dead as composed of two classes, the one receiving the resurrection unto eternal life, and the other a resurrection unto eternal damnation. The object and effort of Paul was to attain to this resurrection of life, which can be obtained only by proper effort, for it applies only to those who are saved. The context shows this application. In verse 19 he mentions one class "whose end is destruction"; in the following verses he speaks of other classes, to which he belonged, and says, "We look for the Savior, the Lord Jesus Christ: who shall change our vile body, that it may be fashioned like unto his glorious body.'

There will be but one literal resurrection of the dead, and it will include "all that are in their graves" "both of the just and the unjust"— and together they will come forth in the same "hour," when Christ comes; for then "every eye shall see him, and they also that pierced him and all kindreds of the earth shall wail because of him" (Rev. 1:7).

This does away with the idea of there being two resurrections, for the Bible says "every eye shall see him" and it is plain to see that if there were to be two resurrections the Bible would not have said "every eye shall see him."

THE GENERAL JUDGMENT

To the Athenians Paul declared that God "hath appointed a day, in the which he will judge the world in righteousness by that man whom he hath ordained" (Acts 17:31). This judgment day is "the last day," the day of resurrection; for Paul says that "the Lord Jesus Christ . . . shall judge the quick and the dead at his appearing" (2 Tim. 4:1). The revelator connects the general judgment with the resurrection at the second coming: "And I saw a great white throne. and him that sat on it, from whose face the earth and the heaven fled away; and there was found no place for them. And I saw the dead, small and great, stand before God; and the books were opened; and another book was opened, which is the book of life: and the dead were judged out of those things which were written in the books, according to their works; And the sea gave up the dead which were in it; and death and hell delivered up the dead which were inthem: and they were judged every man according to their works" (Rev. 20:11-13).

FINAL REWARDS

"Behold, I come quickly; and my reward is with me, to give to every man according as his work shall be" (Rev. 22:12). "For the Son of man shall come in the glory of his Father with his angels; and then shall he reward every man according to his works" (Matt. 16:27). God has reserved the "Unjust unto the day of judgment to be punished" (2 Peter 2:9). This will be an awful day, and one that we cannot escape. "Every eye shall see him" when he comes: for "the Lord Jesus shall be revealed from heaven with his mighty angels, in flaming fire, taking vengeance on them that know not God, and that obey not the gospel of our Lord Jesus Christ: who shall be punished with everlasting destruction from the presence of the Lord, and from the glory of his power; when he shall come to be glorified in his saints" (2 Thess. 1:7-10).

The same great truth is also taught in Matthew 25 and centers in the second coming. "When the Son of man shall come in his glory, and all the holy angels with him, then shall he sit upon the throne of his glory: and before him shall be gathered all nations: and he shall separate them one from another, as a shepherd divideth his sheep from the goats: and he shall set the sheep on his right hand, but the goats on the left" (vss. 31-33). Here we have all men before the judgment throne at the same time; they are divided into two classes, represented by sheep and goats.

This division is made for the purpose of setting their final destiny: "Then shall the King say unto them on his right hand, Come, ye blessed of my Father, inherit the kingdom prepared for you from the foundation of the world" (vs. 34). "Then shall he say unto them on the left hand, Depart from me, ye cursed, into everlasting fire, prepared for the devil and his angels" (vs. 41). "And these shall go into everlasting punishment: but the righteous into life eternal" (vs. 46).

THE DESTRUCTION OF THE EARTH

"Heaven and earth shall pass away," says Jesus (Matt. 24:35). Peter describes the manner in which the heavens and earth shall pass away. "The heavens" doubtless refers to the aerial heavens surrounding the earth. "But the heavens and the earth, which are now, by the same word are kept in store, reserved unto fire against the day of judgment and perdition of ungodly men" (2 Pet. 3:7).

Notice that this destruction of the earth by fire is reserved till "the day of judgment and perdition of ungodly men." Millennialists have argued that the fire would come first and simply purify the earth, after which the righteous would reign here a thousand years before the resurrection of the wicked. But according to Peter, the fire will not come until the time when the ungodly men shall receive their doom. Peter did not believe the Millennial theory. He knew that when Christ came the end of all things pertaining to earth would take place and that the righteous and the wicked would be rewarded at the same time,

Therefore he goes on to say: "But the day of the Lord will come as a thief in the night; in the which the heavens shall pass away with a great noise, and the elements shall melt with fervent heat, the earth also and the works that are therein shall be burned up. Seeing then that all these things shall be dissolved, what manner of persons ought ye to be in all holy conversation and godliness, looking for and hasting unto the coming of the day of God, wherein the heavens being on fire shall be dissolved, and the elements shall melt with fervent heat?" (vss. 10-12).

Peter does not say that the earth shall be burned over, but that it shall be "burned up"; that "all these things "shall melt," be "dissolved," and "pass away." And in direct contrast he mentions a "new heavens and a new earth" (vs. 13), brought to view after the first one has gone. The Revelator also describes the passing of this old earth: "And I saw a great white throne, and him that sat on it, from whose face the earth and the heaven fled away; and there was found no place for them" (Rev. 20:11).

THE PREMILLENNIAL THEORY

With these clear and plain scriptural statements before us, we can readily see that there is no possibility of a millennium, or earthly reign of the righteous after Christ comes.

- 1. There will be no time for a Millennium.—The second coming of Christ, when he raises the dead and rewards the righteous, is "the last day." At that time "the mystery of God" will be finished, and there will be "time no longer" (Rev. 10:6-7). There is not a thousand years after the last day.
- 2. There will be no place for a Millennium.—As we have just seen, the destruction of the earth is to take place at the same time that the wicked are to be punished; and this destruction will be complete, the earth being "dissolved," "burned up," and passing away. Hence, there will be no earthly place for a Millennium after Christ comes.
- 3. There will be no need of an earthly Millennium.—The offers of perfect salvation are all extended in the gospel dispensation. "Behold, now is the accepted time, behold, now is the day of salvation" (2 Cor. 6:2). Every means consistent with moral government and the moral freedom of the individual are now being employed to effect the salvation of men. Furthermore, since at the coming of Christ the wicked are judged and sent to their everlasting doom, there is positively no need of an earthly Millennium.

So we need to watch and give no place for the devil to work.

A Forgotten Appointment

Just for records, I was born right into the heart of gangland, on Chicago's near West side. At 17, I got my nickname, Fargo Louie, because I drove a new horse-drawn Wess Fargo wagon.

After hours I drove another kind of wagon to back door in quiet alleys. As a result of this, \$200 was easy to make even for a young boy during prohibition days. So I felt pretty important—big stuff—I smoked and drank and gambled and talked out of the side of my mouth and swaggered and was happy, I thought. It was life—the only kind I knew.

Mom worried about me in a sort of far-off resigned way. She went to church by the clock and the calendar and belonged to every available lodge. Her church was a set of rules and she followed them religiously.

Dad left the worrying and church-going to Mom. He was a happy-go-lucky guy who had a good job as a receiving clerk in a warehouse, but dabbled in city politics and tended bar during off hours for political big shots.

So, since Dad liked this life for me, some of my happiest moments were spent in cheap Loop cabarets—with members of the famous Valley Gang that made the headlines in those days. I was one of their upcoming, bright boys.

One day in July, sporting a \$15 silk shirt, I started out to meet a couple of the fellows in a south State Street cabaret. I had about twenty minutes to make my date, and since I always preferred to arrive just on time—not early, not late—I slowed down at the corner of Van Buren and State to listen to a religious street meeting. I'd do a little high and

mighty sneering down my nose. A few people were singing a happy kind of song and I was soon rooted to the sidewalk. Later, even though I couldn't tell you a thing the gentleman said, I followed the speaker down the street, into a place called the Pacific Garden Mission!

Me in a mission? Yes, Fargo Louis, big shot—silk and all—in old Pacific Garden Mission! I listened for all I was worth to a young speaker who said something like this:

"You think you're having fun when you get dolled up in a silk shirt, a roll in your pocket and a flask on your hip...you may think it's big stuff to make a quick hundred delivering a few cases of bootleg liquor... I know I did. But that was before I knew there was another life I could have. Not only in some faraway hereafter—but right here and now—today in the city of Chicago.

Then he went on to tell how he had met the Lord Jesus Christ as his own personal Saviour and how the very life of God replaced the sin that had blinded him for so long.

Even while that fellow was talking, I made up my mind. Someone read and explained some verses from the Bible, and I repented of my sins before God and was born again. And this was happening while two pals of mine sat somewhere in a noisy smokefilled cabaret. I had forgotten my appointment!

That night I was so happy that I walked three miles home and Mom nearly fainted when she saw me home so early. I announced that Jesus had wiped away all my sins, that I was going straight. Mom didn't understand, but was happy that I was quitting the gang. Dad merely laughed hilariously! It was a big joke to him.

But Dad soon started to make life rough for me. Once he got my brother Charlie to kick me while I prayed. Six months later, Charlie stepped out for Christ.

But the Lord didn't stop with His miracle of redemption with Charlie and me. Brother George came to Christ, then my dear mother. I remember that Dad was a bit puzzled: "But, Anna," he asked, "how you gonna get along without your precious lodges?"

"Easy—I have my precious Jesus." Mom was extremely happy.

Charlie helped Dad to understand the miracle of salvation shortly before Dad met a very mysterious death.

The Lord doesn't keep us from trouble, but He does keep in the time of trouble. Take the time I was preaching in Bughouse square on Chicago's near North side. A tall, skinny, fanatical-looking old man challenged me when I told him that a Christian could sing in the face of even physical torture. Trying to prove my point from a Bible story, I myself had to prove it literally; for as I read, the old man, a professed Communist, held a lighted match in the end of his cane under my chin! Yet God gave me grace to sing. Today the same Lord who helped me to sing continues to strengthen me day by day. For nearly thirty years He has been the head of my home.

What Christ has done for me, He can do for you.

"Though your sins be as scarlet, they shall be as white as snow." "For God so loved the world, that he gave his only begotten Son, that whosoever believeth in him should not perish, but have everlasting life" John 3:16. "Neither is there salvation in any other: for there is none other name under heaven given among men, whereby we must be saved" Acts 4:12. "Then they that gladly received his word were baptized . . . And the Lord added to the church daily such as should be saved" Acts 2:41, 47. —Louis Skoda Selected from a tract.

Reformation

John 17:3, "And this is life eternal, that they might know thee, the only true God, and Jesus Christ, whom thou hast sent." Very few know God as He would have us to know him. It is possible to know God even as Jesus knew him. When one does not know God, and yet has a zeal to work for him, he will find that often he gets in God's way and hinders God from working as he would like to. Men who know God are very much needed today—men of faith that do not depend on the arm of flesh for anything.

God's great truths are still being unfolded to those whose minds and hearts are open to receive them. But someone will say, "I thought we had all the truth. Isn't this the last reformation?" Yes, it it true, this is the last reformation; but what is meant by a reformation? Reformation is to restore something that once was enjoyed by God's people but has been lost. And the work of bringing the light again upon this hidden truth and revealing it to the people is known as a reformation work. God's great plan of redemption, to redeem and bring man back to that high place of holiness and purity that Adam and Eve enjoyed before the fall, is the plan of salvation that has been unfolding through the ages. He has brought many out of their sins by redeeming them and bringing them back to God. This plan of salvation consists of three great phases of work; namely, justification, sanctification, and the unity of all God's people into the one true body, the church.

These great truths were lost in the dark day of Roman rule; but, praise our God! He has restored them again unto us, his people. God's work of restoring these truths again is called a work of reformation. Thus we had the first reformation (of these last days) led by Martin Luther. God through Luther, restored the truth of justification. This was Luther's main theme to preach to the people—that they could find God and get their sins forgiven by seeking Him themselves without seeking Him through the priest. This was glad news to many lost souls, and thousands found Christ through this teaching. While all the truth on justification was revealed to Martin Luther, there were other truths to follow, but the time was not yet. And while Luther taught the truth of justification in all its fulness, his teachings on many other lines were cloudy because of his former. teaching. He was not able to clear himself of all the false doctrines that had been taught for ages.

Later we hear of John Wesley, who taught justification, and also brought in the second reformation of the last days, the sanctification of God's people. We find him straight on the doctrines of justification and sanctification and teaching it in all its fulness because he was a chosen vessel in God's hands to bring the clear light out on this subject. When God does anything, he always does it right; and it was His time to reveal the truth on sanctification; so He revealed it to Wesley and others in all its fulness. So they went forth placing much stress on the doctrine of sanctification. But on many other lines of truth they were still in the darkness; and through lack of knowledge or light on other truths, they taught many things that were not scripturally sound.

Time rolled on to when it was God's time to bring in the last reformation; but because it is the last truth to be brought in that is necessary to restore God's people to full salvation and bring them to the unity of the faith into the one body, His church, so God's plan again was to use a man of God. He chose Bro. D. S. Warner as the leader and used others also to bring in the light on the oneness of His people. So we see them stressing this glorious truth above all others, teaching it and calling God's little ones out of Babylon. They carried on the former truths as taught by Wesley and Luther, recognizing that they were God's eternal truths revealed by God himself and that they needed no changing, as on each step of the way God had revealed each truth in all its fulness.

While God used a reformation in each phase of His great plan, if man had stayed pliable, he could have brought out the three phases all in one movement. But the followers of Luther, also of Wesley, formed a creed and said by their actions: "This far and no farther." So we see God using others that would follow Him.

But God will go on to the end teaching us deeper things and revealing things to his saints that must come to pass on the earth. Yes, there is no end to God's knowledge, and he will still be teaching obedient hearts when the end comes. We are in danger when we say as others have said, "We know it all. There is no more to be revealed." God can not use such ones. They will stand still while others of us will go on unto a closer walk with God until the end comes.

I for one am seeking God daily for deeper things in Him.

COMMENTS AND APPLICATION

The revelation given to Peter's soul by the Father that Christ was the Son of the living God, has come down to us as a reality and as we meditate over these words, we are convinced of the statement of truth. We have unanswerable arguments in the word of God of the deity of Jesus Christ.

The statement has been made that 300 different names can be found in the Bible of our Lord and each has a different phase of meaning to apply to the needs of the souls of men.

It is necessary that Jesus become our Savior to be our king and our Lord and Master. When we are saved from sin then all of the different names become our heritage as we get salvation. In Isa. 9:6 he is called Wonderful, Counselor, the mighty God, the everlasting Father, the Prince of Peace. This one verse alone is worthy of much meditation.

The government shall be upon his shoulder. Could we as Christians ask for any better government than he doth give? Christ is magnified as the Creator of all things and by him all things consist. The peace that we have in our souls is made through the blood of his cross that in all things he might have the preeminence. Col. 1:15—20. In Heb. 1:3 we have him upholding all things by the word of his power. In him dwelleth all the fulness of the Godhead bodily. Col. 2:9.

COMMENTS AND APPLICATION

The Holy Spirit is the one who takes the things of Christ and shows them unto us. Jn. 16:14, 15. He is the permeating presence who keeps us broken and useful; by him also we have the purifying of our hearts by faith. Acts 15:9; I Cor. 6:11. Only those who are led of the Spirit of God are the sons of God. Rom. 8:14. The Spirit itself beareth witness with our spirit that we are the children of God. Rom. 8:16. When Jesus left, he was the only who sent the Holy Spirit (v. 7). Notice in verse 8 some of the work of the Holy Spirit; "Reprove the world of sin, and of righteousness, and of judgment so then according to that and Rom. 1:18—20 all men are left without excuse.

The Holy Spirit is the third person of the Trinity; and is referred to as God in Acts 5:3, 4: "Lie to the Holy Ghost"-"Hast not lied unto men but unto God." In Acts 16:6, 7 Paul was led of the Spirit not to go to work in Asia and Bithynia. Peter was sent there to that work. I Pet. 1:1. Peter was also led of the Spirit to go to Cornelius. Acts 10:19, 20. He helps us to pray as we should. Rom. 8:26, 27. The Holy Spirit reveals things to us. I Cor. 2:9—16 The natural man does not know the things of the Spirit (v 14). We can test how we stand before God as we listen to what he says in Gal. 5:22, 23.

- 29. And God said, behold, I have given you every herb bearing seed, which is upon the face of all the earth, and every tree, in the which is the fruit of a tree yielding seed; to you it shall be for meat.
- 30. And to every beast of the earth, and to every fowl of the air, and to every thing that creepeth upon the earth, wherein there is life, I have given every green herb for meat: and it was so.
- 31. And God saw everything that he had made, and, behold, it was very good. And the evening and the morning were the sixth day.

Rom. 3:23. For all have sinned, and come short of the glory of God.

- Heb. 2:6. But one in a certain place testified, saying, What is man, that thou art mindful of him? or the son of man, that thou visitest him?
- 7. Thou madest him a little lower than the angels; thou crownedst him with glory and honour, and didst set him over the works of thy hands:
- 8. Thou hast put all things in subjection under his feet. For in that he put all in subjection under him, he left nothing that is not put under him. But now we see not yet all things put under him.
- 9. But we see Jesus, who was made a little lower than the angels for the suffering of death, crowned with glory and honour; that he by the grace of God should taste death for every man.

Memory Verse: What is man, that thou art mindful of him? and the son of man, that thou visitest him? For thou hast made him a little lower than the angels, and hast crowned him with glory and honour. Ps. 8:4, 5.

Practical Truth: As a result of disobedience the nature of man became so tainted with evil that all have sinned and need salvation.

COMMENTS AND APPLICATION

It is a fact that some of the worst characters in the past have a decision for God and have been redeemed by the precious blood of Christ (I Pet. 1:19) and have been made a new creature. 2 Cor. 5:17. God allows temptations and trials in this life on purpose that they may be "purified, and made white, and tried." Dan. 12:10. Those who follow the narrow way "Which leadeth unto life" (Matt. 7:14) all the way will have "Great tribulation." Rev. 7:14. God knew before he made the world that man would sin and made provision (I Pet. 1:18—20) how to bring mankind back to a holy and righteous God. According to the first and second commandment in the N. T. God expects our first love. He made us and has a right to that first love.

According to the first part of our lesson man was given dominion here in the earth, but after his fall Satan took over with most of them (Gen. 6:5); therefore there was a great need that man be brought back to his rightful place. Only through Jesus, who was made man, has that place been given back to man; "Blessed are the meek: for they shall inherit the earth." Matt. 5:5; Rev. 5:10. So those who follow the Savior who is "Meek and lowly in heart" Matt. 11:29, can have "Victory through our Lord Jesus Christ" (Rom. 6:11—14; I Cor. 15:57) for he tasted "Death for every man." Heb. 2:9.
