Without Faith It Is Impossible To Please God

Faith is a vital necessity for all Christian success. Without faith we cannot become a Christian, for we "must believe that He is and that He is a rewarder of them that diligently seek Him." Oh, let us earnestly contend for the faith once delivered to the saints! We need more faith today. How I would love to impress our people that we need to exercise more faith all of us. We need to cry out to God to help our unbelief if we are in doubt in any way. God is able, willing, and ready to help in every time of need, if we only believe. Listen how Paul had complete confidence in God: he said, "I can do all things through Christ which strengtheneth me." Oh, may we expect God to do something for his people, even expect to see miracles performed! The day of miracles is not passed except to those who do not believe. His Word declares that He is the same yesterday and today and forever. Can we not believe that? take Him at His Word? The Scriptures need more believing today than explaining. We must believe that He is a rewarder of them that diligently seek Him. Are we diligently seeking Him? Do we believe God's promises are to us?

In Luke it says, "Shall not God avenge his own elect which cry day and night unto him though he bear long with them? I tell you that he will avenge them speedily. Nevertheless when the Son of man cometh shall he find faith on the earth?" To me that is proof that the writer was afraid people would faint and not have faith. The Scriptures tell us to contend for the faith which was once delivered to the saints. Do we contend, urge, show folks that it is the only way? The reason some folks do not have more faith than they do is because of lack of obedience. Folks do not obey the Lord. Oh, they obey when it suits them and is easy, but when hard things come and it does not suit them, I am afraid they are like Saul when Samuel told him to utterly destroy the city. He partly obeyed, and told Samuel that he had performed the commandments of the Lord. But Samuel asked him the meaning of the bleating of the sheep and the lowing of the oxen in his ears. Saul said the people desired them for a sacrifice unto the Lord. He was trying to place the blame on someone else, but he was the guilty one and Samuel knew it. He told Saul that God had turned from him and that it was better to obey than to sacrifice. It seems that Saul was sorry in a measure when he saw the penalty he would have to pay, but he was not willing to admit that he had sinned by his own choice. He wanted Samuel to forgive him, but Samuel turned away to leave him. Samuel was very sorry that Saul had turned away from God and refused to obey the Lord. He knew that God could not bless Israel as long as Saul ruled over them. Be sure your sin will find you out. One cannot hide from God. He that covereth his sins shall not prosper. We must deal honestly with God. Of course one cannot exercise faith if his life is crooked. We cannot serve God and mammon. We must serve Him with all our hearts. Then and then only can one have faith in God. It is through constant obedience that faith is built up in God and we can expect God to answer our prayers and expect miracles to be performed. With God nothing is impossible, but all things are possible to him that believeth.

Prayer and faith are so closely connected that I do not see how we can separate them. Prayer builds up our faith and when we have faith we want to pray. We have confidence in our prayers, though He may not answer as we expected.

Let us not just pray once, but continue in prayer. Think of the great prophet Elijah praying for rain. He did not stop the first time, nor the second nor third, but prayed on and on till the answer came. Sometimes when we pray we feel defeated, feel our prayers have gone no higher than our heads. It is good to tarry in prayer until the enemy is defeated. What a wonderful thing prayer is.

Another thing that hinders faith is a lack of secret prayer. He that prayeth in secret shall be rewarded openly. It is not the long prayer, and the beautifully worded prayer; but it is the heart felt prayer and our faith and submission to God that brings results.

We cannot grow without faith. The Bible tells us to add to our faith-virtue, knowledge, etc. Faith is not feelings. Sometimes when things look darkest one can stand by faith. "Having done all to stand."

The Bible tells us of those who had no faith; those who had little faith; and those who were full of faith. We are saved by faith; we are sanctified by faith; kept by faith; healed by faith. James tells us that faith if it hath not works is dead. I will shew my faith by my works, said James-faith in action. If someone comes to us needing help that we can give and we just say, "God bless you," yet do not give them the things needed, How dwelleth the love of God in us? "Inasmuch as ye did it not unto the least of these, my brethren, ye did it not unto me." May God help us all to exercise more faith in God. May the time soon come when we shall see more of the early church miracles. Let us work harder to accomplish it. Obey God in all things. He will increase our faith. Earnestly contend for the faith once delivered unto -Mrs. Henry Grauke. the saints.

Are You Dead or Just Playing Opossum?

"We then, as workers together with him, beseech you also that ye receive not the grace of God in vain" 2 Cor. 6:1. "If we suffer, we shall also reign with him." 2 Tim. 2:12. God needs workers today in the time of the end as he never did before; because the time is very short. Workers are needed who are filled with power and faith—faith that worketh by love. God wants to love the souls of lost men through us; be burdened for souls through us; suffer through us for the afflicted ones.

The loving Heavenly Father has a special process through which all must go before they can be meet for the Master's use. Very few have gone through this severe test.

Oh! if everyone were really dead that thinks they are, we would see great things accomplished for God. Dear ones, if God ever uses us in the great work of salvation, we must first be crucified with Christ. Suffering always accompanies crucifixion, therefore if we have not suffered we have not been crucified; and if not crucified, Christ cannot use us. Some may say: I have suffered. I suffered the loss of my dear wife and children. Another may say, I suffered in body many years and bore it patiently. But to suffer with Him means more than all this. Sinners are subject to this kind of suffering.

Jesus' body suffered untold agony on the cross. The thieves also suffered in their bodies. This is not the suffering that it takes for you to be able to say, "I am crucified with Christ."

The greatest suffering of our Saviour was the inmost soul suffering that he suffered when his soul was sorely afflicted. What caused this affliction? Was it not because he cared? He suffered for all. If he had not been burdened for the lost world, he would have escaped this soul suffering, the greatest suffering of all. His great love for the lost world brought on this suffering: and we are commanded to follow in His steps and to love one another as he loved us.

Jesus suffered for all of our afflictions, both of body and soul. And if we (His body the Church) are in good health spiritually, when one member suffers we all suffer with it. But to suffer for others we first must have suffered as He suffered. The flesh does not want to die. The flesh of Jesus did not want to go to the cross. But hear Him when the decision is made, the victory won, the price is paid; when he comes to the place where he can say, "Not my will, si but thine be done."

Dear ones, are you suffering in your inmost souls for the lost and afflicted ones? If so, then you can say, "I am crucified with him." If not, you are not dead-just playing dead. Many, I fear, are like the opossum, they are playing dead. From all appearance they seem to be dead, and no doubt they think that they are dead. When the opossum is caught, he will play dead and go stiff all over and never bat an. eye. You can pick it up, toss it around, bump it against a tree and it will never move a muscle. You will think that it is surely dead. But when left alone and when no one is looking, it will be up and about

its own business, following its own desires. So many are just like that, going about their own business, following their own desires, living their own lives, living for the flesh, have no burden for the lost world, cannot suffer when other members are suffering, all because they are playing dead.

Pick up that opossum and break his neck, then watch him. What has happened? He is not playing dead any longer; he is going through the death struggle. Brother, have you gone through the death struggle? If you have, it will cure you of playing opossum.

The flesh does not want to die. We all die hard. Jesus suffered the death struggle in the garden: the flesh did not want to go to the cross. It is not easy to die to all but Jesus and his will, not easy to say—and really mean it—"Not my will be done, but thine."

It seems to be easy for some to say, "I'll suffer for Him, I'll bear the cross." These are easy sayings from the lips out; and many have gone no further. Ask them if they are suffering with Him and they do not know what you mean. Suffering cannot be taken away from the cross. Beware! today many are teaching a streamlined cross. Do not be deceived! If you have not suffered and can not suffer for others, you are not dead, just playing dead.

My beloved, search your hearts. Have you suffered crucifixion? If so, He can use you; if not, you are not dead. And what is worse, you are a hinderance to the great cause, a weight that is hindering the progress of his people. If we are really dead, then we are channels of blessing through which God is working: "Workers together with Him" because it is not us, but God working through us. —H. P. Huskey

Biblical Truth On Adultery

Away back in ages past before the "Sun of Righteousness began to shine, God winked at many things which the people did (Acts 17:30). The reason for God's winking at some of their deeds and passing over them was that the people were in ignorance, in moon-light darkness. They were living in the "shadow of good things to come" (Heb. 10:1). They were not able and had no way to free themselves nor to be cleansed from the polution of sin and death that passed upon all men through the fall of the first Adam (Rom. 5:12). Hence they could not be responsible as we are today who live in the new covenant and have the light and truth shining in the world by the gospel of the Lord Jesus Christ. The apostle Paul, in speaking of Jesus in Titus 2:11, says, "For the grace of God that bringeth salvation hath appeared to all men, Teaching us that, denying ungodliness and worldly lusts, we should live soberly, righteously, and godly in this present world." Light and knowledge rates

our responsibility before God. We know sin is a transgression of the law, whether it be the Mosaic law or the law of Christ under grace. If people do know and really keep the law of Christ under grace, they will also be keeping all the law of Moses in a spiritual sense before God. For Jesus came not to destroy the law but to fulfill it; and his laws, which are put into our minds and written on the fleshly tables of our hearts (Heb. 8:10) when we are sanctified and cleansed by His blood, will make us absolutely free from the law of sin and death which reigned over and in men through the fall of our foreparents.

Physical and spiritual adultery is a cursed thing in Christendom today through fleshly lusts upheld by deceitful teachers. The complete teachings of the New Testament are fully against physical and spiritual adultery; and we can also include the whole Bible, for God only created one woman for the man whom he had created; and he said of them; "Therefore shall a man leave his father and mother, and shall cleave unto his wife: and they shall be one flesh." Gen. 2:24. Anyone having more than one living companion would be living in fornication and whoredom whether they had any ceremony performed or not. A man living with what is called a "Common law wife" would be in sin, fornication and whoredom in the sight of God just as much as one who had a ceremony performed. One in that state is in sin because he has not complied with the laws of the land which demand couples to be married by a credible offical. They would also be in fornication and whoredom because we cannot associate Him with those who are breaking the laws of the land, which He teaches us to obey. God does not look upon sin or transgression of his law with any favor, no matter what state or condition it is found; therefore we can see that biblically speaking, it is not the marriage ceremony or vows they make, but the deeds they commit which make them adulterous persons in His sight. God does not hold us to former vows when light and knowledge comes to us. We must walk in truth and righteousness regardless of former vows or decisions.

Saul made vows before going to Damascus, but broke them suddenly when the light shown on him (Acts 9:5, 6). We know that all over the land today preachers and judges are joining men and women together in marriage ceremonies, which the laws of the land uphold, and at the same time many of them are in adultery, having several living companions. Is God a party in joining them together? I say no, and you say no. I believe that it would be blasphemy for any one to accuse the Lord of being a party in joining one up in an adulterous state. I believe that every enlightened child of God will say amen to that statement. It is quite in harmony with the Word of God to say that the man who has been living with a "common-law wife" for years and had never at any time had a ceremony performed would have no divine right to marry another woman. If they both got under conviction and cleaned up for God, they would be led of Him to clean up in every needed way and have a ceremony performed in harmony with the laws of the land, and they could live with God's approval upon them. I believe

that Bro. Warner and the early reformers in this evening light reformation in general terms received the right doctrines of the Bible and God did mightily bless their labors. We need those wholesome truths embedded in our hearts today with knowledge and understanding on the same subjects to overcome the greatly increased wickedness and evil and false religious teachings which have multiplied and are multiplying in the world, thereby keep shining as lights in this dark world.

Our early reformers taught us that if two parties were legally married and were living together as man and wife and perhaps had a family of children and then the enemy would work evil in their hearts and cause them to divorce and be separated one from the other, living apart; that they would be in adultery if they married any one else while both were living. But if and when they got saved, washed in the blood of the Lamb and made clean, they were instructed to remarry and live together as God ordained they should. For proof of this statement I refer you to Bro. C. E. Orr's book entitled, "A Religious Controversy." Bro. Orr wrote this book many years ago and he used to be closely associated with Bro. Warner. At the time this book was written the Trumpet leaders had not backslidden in heart and gone to worldly religion, but it was the Church of God. They had not lost their identity at that time. Bro. Orr told me with his own mouth that when the first issue of this book was printed that the whole Trumpet family stayed up late at night, working, writing addresses, wrapping, and getting this book ready to mail out to friends and others when the first issue was printed. The whole company at that time approved its teachings. You will find his writings on this subject on Page Eleven of this book, "Religious Controversy," which we now print and keep in stock. To make it plain to our readers we shall quote two paragraphs from Page 11: Quote. "Mr. W.- Well, I don't know whether to believe such a story or not. I've never yet seen a preacher that wouldn't marry anyone for twenty-five dollars.

"Mrs. W.—Go to the meeting with me tonight, and you'll see one, for this is the same man. But I didn't tell all the story. This preacher began to talk to the man about his soul and how wrong it would be to remarry and disobey God. 'Go back' he said, 'to your divorced wife and live with her. Both of you get saved, and you can live happily together.' The man said he wanted to do what was right. The preacher asked him to come out to meeting and hear the Word of God. The man did go to the meeting, got saved, and then he and the preacher went to see his divorced wife and talked to her. She, too, got saved and they married again and have been living happily together ever since. That does not look like separating husband and wife."

Dear brothers and sisters, do not receive anyone's new light on this subject, for we are now living under the new covenant. When the blood is applied it cleanses from all sin and uncleanness (Zech. 13:1), makes us new creatures and old things pass away. Clean folks would naturally want to go back together

and live as God ordained they should, rearing their children in the nurture and admonition of the Lord.

We find in the Word of God recorded in Matt. 5: 28, this truth spoken by the Lord himself, "But I say unto you, that whosoever looketh on a woman to lust after her, hath committed adultery with her already in his heart." I dare say that there are many in sin today, including professors of religion who sin more or less every day, that are guilty of this ungodly and sinful deed. For this reason and many others, adultery should be taught against truly and strongly by all of God's enlightened ministers, for in this enlightened age since Christ has fulfilled the law and the prophets, one is in adultery if he retains lustful desires in his heart for the opposite sex. We that are ministers in this evening light truth should live clean and hold up boldly the true holiness doctrines of the Bible, and teach against sin and adultery in every form regardless of what state or condition it may be found.

In the 19th chapter of Matt. Jesus makes it very plain that no one is to have more than one living companion. He referred them to God's created pair in the beginning. He said, "They twain shall be one flesh." He also said positively, "What therefore God hath joined together, let not man put asunder." I believe that it is biblical to say that all marriage ceremonies and vows in accordance with the laws and regulations of the land are binding and approved of God with the exception of those ceremonies which bind parties together in an adulterous state. Far be it from us who love the Lord and souls to accuse the Lord of being a party to such a state when his whole teachings and life are against it.

Several years ago a couple came into my office and wanted me to perform a marriage ceremony for them. On inquiry I found out that the man had a living wife. I told him that I could not perform the ceremony for them as it would be contrary to the teachings of the Bible. I was persuaded that God would not unite him up with this woman when he had a living wife and I would not be a party to any thing that God would not do. I believe that the first marriage ceremony has God's approval and binds men and women together until death does them part.

Jesus told the Pharisees that Moses because of the hardness of their hearts suffered them to put away their wife, but from the beginning it was not so. We who are saved are circumcised in heart, living under the new covenant and are cleansed from the hardness of the heart. We are put back as God created man in the beginning and should live all the time with a tender heart toward God and all mankind or else forfeit our right to the tree of life, be weighed in the balance and found wanting in that awful day that is coming.

The 9th verse reads thus, "And I say unto you, whosoever shall put away his wife, except it be for fornication, and shall marry another, committeth adultery: and whosoever marrieth her which is put away doth commit adultery." There are many today who use this word "except" as an excuse for being free to marry again. It does give them a right to separate from the one who is a fornicator, but I am

persuaded that the voice of Scripture is against their being free to marry anyone else. Matthew and Paul both say that in the mouth of two or three witnesses shall every word be established (2 Cor. 13:1). We read in Mark 10:11 what Mark as a witness says, "Whosoever shall put away his wife, and marrieth another, committeth adultery against her. And if a woman shall put away her husband, and be married to another, she committeth adultery." Bro. Luke says, "Whosoever putteth away his wife, and marrieth another, committeth adultery: and whosoever marrieth her that is put away from her husband committeth adultery" Luke 16:18. The apostle Paul says in Romans 7:3, "So then if, while her husband liveth, she be married to another man, she shall be called an adulteress."

Now we have three inspired of God witnessing without giving any exceptions, if's and and's about the matter, declaring one would be in adultery were he to marry another.

Young brothers and sisters and older ones as well, I want to warn you by the sacred and holy Scriptures to never consider uniting in marriage with anyone who has been mixed up in questionable marriage relationships. If you want to keep out of trouble and clear before God, do not consider such a person as a life companion, or with anyone who has a divorce and a living husband or wife.

God forbid that any minister among us should ever so lower the standard of truth on this subject insomuch that any adulterous person would have any liberty to make a profession among any of the congregations of the saints and go along as though he or she were a member in the body of Christ, the Church of the living God. Hear the Word of God, "Be ye clean, that bear the vessels of the Lord." And again in Isaiah 35:8 we read, "And an highway shall be there, and a way, and it shall be called the way of holiness; the unclean shall not pass over it." In Luke 1:75 we read that we are to serve the Lord "in holiness and righteousness before Him all the days of our life."

In first Thessalonians 5:23 we read, "And the very God of peace sanctify you wholly; and I pray God your whole spirit and soul and body be preserved blameless unto the coming of the Lord Jesus Christ. Faithful is he that calleth you, who also will do it.' If you are saved, sanctified, and walking in the truth, do not in any case consider uniting in marriage to anyone who is unsaved, for it is plainly stated in the Word of God in 2 Cor. 6:14, "Be ye not unequally yoked together with unbelievers: for what fellowship hath righteousness with unrighteousness? and what communion hath light with darkness?" I do not know how one could be yoked up with an unbeliever more closely than in marriage. Precious souls, keep yourselves clean and pure before God, and His favors and blessings will rest upon you. ---Fred Pruitt

I have been burdened for some time about isolated saints and congregations. I believe the Lord has suggested a means to help. We offered the following suggestion at the Guthrie Assembly meeting and it met with approval. This is the plan:

Make tape recordings at camp meetings, assembly meetings, or even local congregational meetings. Record singing, preaching, or teaching. Let each congregation or individual that will do so, send into a central pool, such material as will be suitable for distribution to all who will supply themselves with a tape recorder-reproducer. From this pool those having reproducers may order recorded tapes by paying the postage. A (7 in.) 1200 ft. tape will play for two hours. Wouldn't two hours of saints' meetings be good to listen to? These tapes can be erased and used over and over. For those who would not be interested in recording, only listening, a very good RE-PRODUCER may be purchased for about \$90.00. If you might want to record as well as reproduce, a very good one, simple in operation, may be supplied for \$110.00 plus express. A real good one with three speakers for extra quality reproduction will cost about \$175.00. Then there are prices in between. For those who will record at services, I believe the \$175.00 would be best, but the cheaper is real good. For shutins the \$90 or \$110 will be fine. I suggest each give about two blank tapes into the pool, for initial distribution.

For those who have machines already, I can furnish 7 in. tapes containing 1200 ft. for about \$2.00; in lots of 12 for \$1.75. This is the two-hour tape.

If interested, please write me what you desire. I have several messages already, and want those who record something that they think the Holy Spirit dictated, send it in to me, stating if you want it returned.

Careful? or Prayerful?

Have you thought very much about the importance of each word that you speak? Many people say they try to be very careful in their conversations; but believe me, dear ones, that is not enough. We must be prayerful. In Matt. 12:34 Jesus says, "For out of the abundance of the heart the mouth speaketh." Verse 35 reads, "A good man out of the good treasure of the heart bringeth forth good things and an evil man out of the evil treasure bringeth forth evil things." So you see we must have pure hearts, filled with the Spirit of Christ, if we are to please God. Until He Find It

There is a religious class of people who do not deny that the Scripture is the Word of God, and must therefore of necessity admit that there is divine authority behind it. But knowing, by long experience, the result of its truths being received into the heart by simple faith in a divine communication, they find it convenient to maintain, that ordinary people cannot understand it, that only the clergy can properly interpret it to the laity! Like the "lawyers" when the Lord was upon earth, these men use all the influence they possess to "take away the Key of Knowledge." And not only would they keep this key in their own hands, but men's consciences also, if they could only induce their hearers to trust them.

But, thank God, in spite of every attack, the Holy Scriptures are still here, and He who makes the truth effectual in men's souls—the Holy Spirit of God—is here also. Men can get rid of neither. Infidelity

may do its best to tear the book to pieces, and Romanism and Anglican Ritualism may do their utmost to snatch it out of your hand, or bury it out of your sight; but these two witnesses of Christ are in the world still, and God's work goes on (see John 5:39 and ch. 15:26).

Page Thirteen

Let the writer relate to you an instance of how, notwithstanding all the opposition of man, God can and does bring about His own gracious ends and bless precious souls. Like the good shepherd of whom Jesus spoke, He will "go after that which was lost, until he find it," Luke 15:4.

A young lady of our acquaintance was leaving home in Germany to fill the post of French governess in a school in England. She was at this time a devout Roman Catholic. Before her departure the priest, her "father confessor" expressed grave fears as to the influence of certain things upon her when she landed in Protestant England (so-called). Two things he tried to make her solemnly promise him. First, that she would never read a Bible; second, that as it was a common custom in England for persons to put little religious leaflets into your hands, she would absolutely refuse them. While declining to bind herself by any definite promise, she assured him she would certainly do her utmost to follow his advice. We shall see, presently, that the fears of this German priest as to the effect of tract and Bible were not altogether without foundation. Man proposes, and God disposes, no matter how much Satan opposes.

When the young governess reached her destination, one of her first duties was to take a junior reading-class in French. In this school, it appears, they made use of the French Bible as their ordinary reading-book for those studying that language. This religious governess had never handled a Bible before, and when they told her that the portion for that day's reading was the fourteenth chapter of John's Gospel, she did not even know in which part of the book to look for it; a girl in the class had to find the place for her!

When she discovered what book it was, she determined not to pay any regard to what was in it. However, for the proper carrying out of this devout resolution it was unfortunate that the young ladies in her class stammered and blundered so considerably over their reading of the chapter in question, that they had to spell it out, over and over again. In spite of her fixed purpose, therefore, she could not help noticing what was in it.

Her next class was the elder scholars, and this time the chapter was the fifty-third of Isaiah. The girls of this class could, of course, read much better; but instead of being the better able to pay no attention to what was read, she became intensely interested; indeed, so much was she interested in the chapter that she found herself secretly determining to get a Bible, take it upstairs and read it for herself.

While reading Acts 1 one day, she found that at a prayer-meeting in that upper room at Jerusalem the mother of Jesus was included in the praying company, and that they were not praying to her! "These all continued in prayer and supplication, with the women, and Mary the mother of Jesus, and with his brethren," v. 14.

Then, for her, came a very serious question, but not less serious for the priest we have already spoken of, had he known it. It was this. If Mary herself needs to make supplication and prayer, in company with the other women and the rest of the disciples, why should she be prayed to? Again Mary, in speaking to Elizabeth, the mother of John the baptist, says, "my spirit has rejoiced in God my Saviour," Luke 1:47. So she knew that she had need of a Saviour herself.

These discoveries staggered her greatly, for she had often heard the very opposite from the priests. She was now forced to this conclusion, "They must have told me a lie about it! And if one lie, why not more?" Her confidence in them became more and more shaken, as the light of Scripture, with its divine authority, entered her mind. So much, then, for the priest's first warning.

When the holidays came a few of the pupils had to remain under the care of their teachers; and our young friend, unable to go home herself, was selected; with another, to take these girls to the Isle of Wight for a change. One day they all went together for a walk in the public park. Near the entrance they found a lady sitting on one of the seats, who gave them each a little book. The one given to the governess we have been speaking of was different from any of the others. Its title was "Almost a Christian."

On receiving it she made up her mind to read it when she got a good opportunity, though it was in English, and, as yet, she had but a very elementary knowledge of this language.

By the help of a dictionary and grammar she managed to get through it; but what it contained so touched her that, in a temper, she crumpled it up in her hands and angrily threw it into the corner of the room.

This, however, needless to say, neither removed nor lessened her soul exercises. Early next morning she was compelled to get out of bed, come downstairs, and search for that crumpled and once despised bit of paper. Carefully smoothing it out she read it once more, but this time in a very different state of mind. So much for the priest's second warning!

Thank God, she now began to read her Bible more diligently, and in reading one day the fifth chapter of Romans, she found what she longed for—PEACE WITH GOD.

Many years have rolled by since then, but the grace that once followed her for blessing still keeps her in the enjoyment of the love of the exalted Blesser, the Lord Jesus Christ.

May the light that shone from the face of a glorified Saviour into our young friend's heart shine into yours, my reader. Beware of men! God's written Word is your only safeguard amid the conflicting jargon of human opinions. "Jesus alone can save."

THE GRACE OF GOD

February 6, 1955

Printed Portion: I John 4:10; Eph. 2:4-9; Tit. 2:11-14.

I Jn. 4:10. Herein is love, not that we loved God, but that he loved us, and sent his Son to be the propitiation for our sins.

Eph. 2:4. But God, who is rich in mercy, for his great love wherewith he loved us,

- 5. Even when we were dead in sins, hath quickened us together with Christ, (by grace are ye saved;)
- 6. And hath raised us up together, and made us sit together in heavenly places in Christ Jesus:
- 7. That in the ages to come he might shew the exceeding riches of his grace in his kindness toward us through Christ Jesus.
- 8. For by grace are ye saved through faith, and that not of yourselves: it is the gift of God:
 - 9. Not of works, lest any man should boast.

Tit. 2:11. For the grace of God that bringeth salvation hath appeared to all men,

- 12. Teaching us that, denying ungodliness and worldly lusts, we should live soberly, righteously, and godly, in this present world:
- 13. Looking for that blessed hope, and the glorious appearing of the great God and our Saviour Jesus Christ;
- 14. Who gave himself for us, that he might redeem us from all iniquity, and purify unto himself a peculiar people, zealous of good works.

Memory Verse: Herein is love, not that we loved God, but that he loved us, and sent his Son to be the propitiation for our sins.

Practical Truth: Because God loved us he has made provision for all our spiritual needs.

COMMENTS AND APPLICATION

Salvation is a free gift and faith is our means by which we can appropriate all that God has in store for the welfare of our souls. God sent his Son to be the propitiation (merciful favor) for our sins (v. 10). The world did not love God. He was despised and rejected, but regardless of their hate "God so loved the world that he gave his only begotten Son" (John 3:16), and the Son gave his life (John 10:17,18). Surely then we have much contained in our title THE GRACE OF GOD since it bringeth salvation to all men (Tit. 2:11) which is prompted by his great love for fallen humanity and is ready to show it by his pity. God's grace is so extended that he is "not willing that any should perish" (2 Pet. 3:9).

To gain eternal life we must repent. Repentance has two distinct factors that must come: sorrow for sin and turning away from sin; then Jesus is the Lamb of God that takes away sin (John 1:29). That is the first step in salvation but that is not all: Jesus said, "He that shall endure unto the end, the same shall be saved" (Matt. 24:13). To enter heaven we must first be purified, sober, righteous and godly in this present world. "Let us therefore come boldly unto the throne of grace, that we may obtain mercy, and find grace to help in time of need" (Heb.4:16).

THE NEW LIFE IN CHRIST

Printed Portion Jn. 3:5-7; Acts 16:25-34; 2 Cor. 5:17.

Jn. 3:5. Jesus answered, Verily, verily, I say unto thee, except a man be born of water and of the Spirit, he cannot enter into the kingdom of God.

- 6. That which is born of the flesh is flesh; and that which is born of the Spirit is spirit.
- 7. Marvel not that $\tilde{\mathbf{I}}$ said unto thee, Ye must be born again.

Acts 16:25. And at midnight Paul and Silas prayed, and sang praises unto God: and the prisoners heard them.

26. And suddenly there was a great earthquake, so that the foundations of the prison were shaken: and immediately

- all the doors were opened, and every one's bands were loosed.
- 27. And the keeper of the prison awaking out of his sleep, and seeing the doors open, he drew out his sword, and would have killed himself, supposing that the prisoners had been fled.
- 28. But Paul cried with a loud voice, saying, Do thyself no harm: for we are all here.
- 29. Then he called for a light, and sprang in, and came trembling and fell down before Paul and Silas.
- 30. And brought them out, and said, Sirs, what must I do to be saved?
- 31. And they said, Believe on the Lord Jesus Christ, and thou shalt be saved, and thy house.
- 32. And they spake unto him the word of the Lord, and to all that were in his house.
- 33. And he took them the same hour of the night, and washed their stripes; and was baptized, he and all his, straightway.
- 34. And when he had brought them into his house, he sat meat before them, and rejoiced, believing in God with all his house.
- 2 Cor. 5:17. Therefore if any man be in Christ, he is a new creature: old things are passed away; behold, all things are become new.

Memory Verse: The thief cometh not, but for to steal, and to kill, and to destroy: I am come that they might have life, and that they might have it more abundantly. (Jn. 10:10).

Practical Truth: New life in Christ is gradually made possible to all.

COMMENTS AND APPLICATION

There are many dead religions in the world, but there is only one that has life and that life (spiritual life) is found in Christ. To have Christ in the soul (Col. 1:27) is to have life, and according to our memory selection "and that they might have it more abundantly." Dead religion has no fire to burn out the dross. John, in speaking of Jesus said, "He shall baptize you with the Holy Ghost, and with fire" (Matt. 3:11). The fire is greatly needed today. Many souls are going along with a compromising attitude that really need the fire of God to burn out and to cleanse. The new life God gives us when we are regenerated is to be watered daily (daily Bible reading) and contact with God through prayer by "Praying in the Holy Ghost" (Jude 20,21). That is how we are to build up our most holy faith and keep ourselves in "the love of God."

Paul and Silas prayed and sang praises to God; they were alive, using their all even in the dark place where the keeper of the prison put them. They were not complaining nor wishing they had done differently, because they were faithful to God. God worked it all out that Paul had the opportunity to speak to him the word of the Lord and the keeper and all his house were saved.

THE CHURCH AND ITS ORDINANCES

Printed Portion Acts 2:38-41; Jn. 13:12-15; I Cor. 11:23-29.

Acts 2:38. Then Peter said unto them, Repent, and be baptized every one of you in the name of Jesus Christ for the remission of sins, and ye shall receive the gift of the Holy Ghost.

39. For the promise is unto you, and to your children,

and to all that are afar off, even as many as the Lord our God shall call.

- 40. And with many other words did he testify and exhort, saying, Save yourself from this untoward generation.
- 41. Then they that gladly received his word were baptized: and the same day there were added unto them about three thousand souls.
- Jn. 13:12. So after he had washed their feet, and had taken his garments, and was set down again, he said unto them, Know ye what I have done to you?

- 29. For he that eateth and drinketh unworthily, eateth and drinketh damnation to himself, not discerning the Lord's body.

Memory Verse: If ye know these things, happy are ye if ye do them. (John 13:17).

Practical Truth: In observing baptism, feet washing, and the Lord's Supper we are observing Christ's commands and are bearing witness to the Christian faith.

COMMENTS AND APPLICATION

The church and its ordinances are to be considered in today's lesson. There have been three given to us by the Lord: Baptism (Matt. 3:13-17); Feet-washing (John 13:1-17); and the Lord's Supper (Matt. 26:26-29; Mark 14:22-25; Lu. 22:14-18; I Cor. 11:23-29).

The best condensed definition of baptism is found in Col. 2:12, "Buried with him in baptism wherein also ye are risen with him through the faith of the operation of God, who hath raised him from the dead." The thought is given more fully in Rom. 6:3-11. It takes the blood of Jesus Christ to wash away sins (Rev. 1:5).

"Christ also suffered for us, leaving us an example, that we should follow his steps" (I Pet. 2:21). Jesus washed the disciples feet, and said, "Ye also ought to wash one another's feet" (Jn. 13:14), and "If ye know these things, happy are ye if ye do them" (Jn. 13:17). So we bear witness to our Christian faith to do just as Jesus said for those of us who are his disciples to do.

"As often as ye eat this bread, and drink this cup, ye do shew the Lord's death till he come" (I Cor. 11:26). "This is my body, which is broken for you" (v. 24). These are very plain scriptures as to why we partake of the Lord's Supper. We are to ponder the fact that Jesus died for our sins and rose again for us as we partake of it.

THE CHURCH PROCLAIMS THE GOSPEL

Printed Portion: Rom. 10:8-15; I Cor. 2:1-5.

Rom. 10:8. But what saith it? The word is night hee, even in thy mouth, and in thy heart; that is, the word of faith, which we preach;

9. That if thou shalt confess with the mouth the Lord Jesus, and shalt believe in thine heart that God hath raised him from the dead, thou shalt be saved.

- 10. For with the heart man believeth unto righteousness; and with the mouth confession is made unto salvation.
- 11. For the scripture saith, whosoever believeth on him shall not be ashamed.
- 12. For there is no difference between the Jew and the Greek: for the same Lord over all is rich unto all that call upon him.
- 13. For whosoever shall call upon the name of the Lord shall be saved.
- 14. How then shall they call on him in whom they have not believed? and how shall they believe in him of whom they have not heard? and how shall they hear without a preacher?
- 15. And how shall they preach, except they be sent? as it is written, How beautiful are the feet of them that preach the gospel of peace, and bring glad tidings of good things!
- I Cor. 2:1. And I, brethren, when I came to you, came not with excellency of speech or of wisdom, declaring unto you the testimony of God.
- 2. For I determine not to know anything among you, save Jesus Christ, and him crucified.
- 3. And I was with you in weakness, and in fear, and in much trembling.
- 4. And my speech and my preaching was not with enticing words of man's wisdom, but in the demonstration of the Spirit and of power:
- That your faith should not stand in the wisdom of men, but in the power of God.

Memory Verse: For I am not ashamed of the gospel of Christ: for it is the power of God unto salvation to every one that believeth; to the Jew first, and also to the Greek. (Rom. 1:16).

Practical Truth: We all should have some part in bringing the gospel to those who know it not.

COMMENTS AND APPLICATION

When God gives spiritual life to the soul, there is something to tell about. The desire to tell it becomes so real that somehow it works just that way no matter what difficulties are met with. One should have such an experience of salvation that the Spirit of God can have full control of the life. To not have such a desire would mean that that soul should dig deeper.

The dictionary definition of the word "Gospel" is the "announcement of the salvation of mankind by Jesus Christ." The world needs that announcement. God can use only the one who lives the life of a Christian in proclaiming the gospel.

"That if thou shalt confess with thy mouth the Lord Jesus" (v. 9) are pertinent words in our lesson today. "For with the heart man believeth unto righteousness and with the mouth confession is made unto salvation" (v. 10).

Paul said, "For I determine not to know anything among you, save Jesus Christ, and him crucified" (I Cor. 2:2), and he says, "I am set for the defence of the gospel" (Phil. 1:17). "That I may open my mouth boldly, to make known the mystery of the gospel." (Eph. 6:19).
