Do You Have to Sin?

Since sin is a wilful transgression of the divine law, do you have to sin more or less every day-and knowingly do it—then at night ask God to forgive the many sins you did during the day that you did not know about? It seems very inconsistent to hear such pleas in order to go ahead and commit sin. Since God has made provision to take away ALL sin (1 John 1:7), why need we sin? The word Christian means to be like Christ. The Christian to be like Christ is "Dead to sin" (1 Peter 2:24) and "should live unto righteousness." "Dead indeed unto sin" (Rom. 6:11). "Being then made free from sin, ye became the servants of righteousness" (Rom. 6:18). You cannot go ahead and sin and then call yourself a Christian, which means to be like Christ; for even the world on the outside who make no claim or profession can see whether you live like Christ or not; and it is certain that you cannot fool God. Of course, you cannot go ahead as a Christian and live a pure life (1 John 3:3) without Christ in you (Col. 1:27); for it takes HIS power to keep you from sin (1 Pet. 1:5; Matt. 1:21).

Those of you that take the seventh chapter of Romans as a crutch to uphold your doctrine of sin-you-must religion, should also look at the sixth and eighth chapters. Paul did not teach that you must sin when you are a Christian; but if you will look at Rom. 7:1, you will find that he was talking to those that were under the law and not to the Christian. "But thanks be to God, which giveth us the victory through our Lord Jesus Christ" (1 Cor. 15:57). That does not sound as if Paul was defeated more or less every day and could not help it.

Another thing that many of our nation overlook is that God expects his people to live holy lives "before him all the days of our life" (Luke 1:75), and right here "In this present world" (Titus 2:12). Now do you think God unreasonable to tell man, "Be ye holy in all manner of conversation" (1 Pet. 1:15), and not make it possible to live a consistent Christian life before him and before all the world? If you are a Christian (truly) and having a hard time of it, get down in earnest prayer before God and ask him to give you something to do for him and ask him to help

you do it, and as he gives the inspiration you will have something to do instead of sinning (1 Cor. 15: 58).

To be a Christian is to be like Christ, "Who did no sin, neither was guile found in his mouth" (1 Pet. 2:22). And you will want to do righteousness instead of sin (Rom. 6:18). Therefore it is impossible to be a saint and a sinner at the same time. —A Saint

In The Kingdom of God, The Church

When Jesus began to preach, he said, "The time is fulfilled [not future, but now] and the kingdom of God is at hand, repent ye and believe the gospel." Mark 1:15. He was teaching the doctrines of the new covenant, and souls began to get saved (born again); for he had power to give eternal life to as many as received him. In Luke 16:16 we read, "The law and the prophets were until John; since that time the kingdom of God is preached, and every man presseth into it." The Kingdom of God is the same as the church. When souls believed the teaching of the new covenant, they would be convicted and repent and be saved, would be born into the Kingdom or church. Jesus told Nicodemus, "Except a man be born again, he cannot see the kingdom of God." The disciples were born again, for we read in the thirteenth chapter of Matthew where Jesus was teaching them of the kingdom. He told them (11th verse), "It is given unto you to know the mysteries of the kingdom of heaven." In the 16th verse he said, "Blessed are your eyes, for ye see: and your ears for they hear." In the next verse he said, "That many prophets and righteous men have desired to see those things which ye see, and have not seen them, and to hear the things which ye hear and have not heard them." The disciples were learning the doctrines of the new covenant from Jesus and were living under his teaching and were seeing and hearing the mysteries of the kingdom or church of God. Jesus said that one could not see the Kingdom of God except he be born again.

After the Lord got through teaching the disciples concerning the Kingdom of God, he asked the question: "...have ye understood all these things?" They say unto him, "Yea, Lord," or yes, Lord. (Matt. 13:51. How could the English language make it any plainer to us that the "born-again" disciples were seeing the Kingdom of God? There is no doubt but what they had a deeper and better understanding of the Kingdom after Pentecost when the cleansing and infilling of the Holy Spirit took place; but to deny that they were seeing and understanding about the Kingdom of God when Jesus was instructing them, would be to ignore the holy Word of God.

When Jesus began to preach the gospel of the Kingdom, he cleverly taught the new covenant doctrines, which were far superior to the old covenant, the law, and he had power to forgive sins.

We have a splendid example in the seventh chapter of Luke of a sinner woman who believed his new covenant teaching and got saved, born again. This sinner woman fell at Jesus' feet weeping. She had

a broken heart and a contrite spirit. Her tears fell on his feet and she wiped them with the hairs of her head and kissed them. Certainly she was humbled down in godly sorrow and repentance because of her sins. Listen to what Jesus said to her: "Thy sins are forgiven." In the 50th verse he said unto the woman, "Thy faith has saved thee; go in peace." She got saved and was justified just like we do today, for she showed faith in Jesus in her weeping and repenting, and she had peace. She was saved just like Paul tells us in the first verse of the fifth chapter of Romans. If she had no more than a law experience, he would have told her to go to the priest and offer up a blood sacrifice; but no, she had an experience under His new covenant teaching, and He said, "Thy faith has saved thee; go in peace." She was there born into the Kingdom, had become a stone in the temple of God, was justified before God. She repented, had faith, and she went in peace, just like we get saved or are born again today.

There are some who teach that a justified soul is not in the kingdom or church because they are not cleansed from the defiled nature brought upon man by the fall of Adam. This may be because they do not understand the condition of a justified soul. The justified soul, if in a normal condition, is living free from any known sin, and is accepted of God as being holy. The presence and power of God that is with a justified soul causes that defilement to be subdued and kept down, so it would not be counted that the defilement is in the Kingdom or church. A soul who claims to be justified is not ready nor fit to present himself to God to be sanctified and have the defilement cleansed away and be filled with the Holy Spirit unless he is living holy before God. We read in John 14:17 that the world cannot receive the Spirit of truth. Those who are not holy in a justified state are still of the world; for when you present your body to God as a living sacrifice to be cleansed and infilled by the Spirit of truth, it must be a holy sacrifice. You will read that in Romans 12:1. God will accept nothing but a holy sacrifice.

In the seventh chapter of Romans Paul was telling us about his sinful condition while under the law in sin. In that state he could not have presented himself to God to be sanctified. But in Acts we read that he got saved or justified when Jesus spoke to him and the light of heaven shined around about him while on the way to Damascus. He was justified from the moment he heard the voice of God (John 5:15) and said, "Yes, Lord, what wilt thou have me to do?" And he was living holy before God the three days he was in a justified state. When Ananias laid his hands upon him, calling him Brother Saul, and prayed, he received the Holy Ghost. The blood cleansed and the Holy Spirit came in, and immediately he preached in their synagogues that Jesus Christ was the Son of God. When one walks after the Spirit, he is not walking after the fleshly carnal mind. The law of the Spirit of life in Christ makes one free from the law of sin and death. Read the first few verses of the eighth chapter of Romans.

The disciples had received Christ, left all and followed him and were learning of him as he taught them the doctrine of the new covenant. They were born again, were justified by believing Christ and his new covenant teachings. Jesus testified of them in the 17th chapter of John that they were not of the world, even as he was not of the world. They had followed him in the regeneration (Matt. 19:28). Jesus told the seventy that their names were written in heaven. In the 15th chapter of John we read that Jesus said to the disciples: "Now ye are clean through the word which I have spoken unto you." As far as he had taught them, they had received it and lived up to all the knowledge they had, and God or Jesus looked upon them as being clean. He said, "I am the vine, ye are the branches." They were already branches. In the second verse he says, "Every branch that beareth fruit he purgeth [cleanseth] that it may bring forth more fruit." In a justified state the disciples were bearing fruit; but in sanctification they were purged or cleansed and brought forth more fruit.

To teach that a soul is not in the Kingdom of God or the church in a justified state, is out of harmony with the plain word of the Lord, for the normal state of a justified man is to be holy before the Lord.

Hear the conclusion of the whole matter. After all the reasonings of men and their hair splitting opinions on this subject, the fact still remains that the life of Christ with you or in you is the cause of you being in the Kingdom of God or the Church of God, and without that Spirit of Christ being with you or in you, you would not be saved at all. In Romans 8:9 we read, "Now if any man have not the Spirit of Christ, he is none of his." In other words: If any man has the spirit of Christ, he is the Lord's and is in the Kingdom of God, the church. The life of Christ with you or in you makes you in the Kingdom, and you have peace with God.

Paul teaches us in Romans 5:1 that a justified man has peace with God through the Lord Jesus Christ. In Romans 14:17 we read, "For the Kingdom of God is not meat and drink [not a literal thing or element] but righteousness and peace and joy in the Holy Ghost."

The life of Christ with us or in us is the Kingdom, and therefore makes us a member of the Kingdom of God or the Church of God which is the pillar and ground of the truth. In the fourteenth chapter of John the Lord teaches us that in a justified state the Spirit of truth is with us; but in speaking of our future state in sanctification, he says, "And shall be in you." So whether in a justified state or in a sanctified state, we are in the Kingdom of God or the Church of God.

Editorials

Campmeeting season will soon be here. All the saints everywhere ought to be praying that God will make these meetings rich with heaven's blessings and that every meeting will be a soul saving meeting. Each one should look to God to show him (or her) what he can do that would help along the cause of God. You will find the dates of the campmeetings in the "Faith and Victory" paper. Every reader ought to attend one or more of these meetings for his own soul's benefit.

The Hennessey, Okla. campmeeting will come first, starting May 27th, and the others will follow. Sometimes it is necessary for more than one campmeeting to be on the same date because of the many campmeetings to be held. The Hammond, Louisiana campmeeting will begin on June 24th. We have attended this meeting for many years. It was in the year of 1927 when we first began to go there. Brother C. E. Orr was pastor at Hammond then. He was an old established Church of God minister even before Bro. D. S. Warner passed to his reward. We found him teaching the same doctrines that dear old Bro. George Harmon had taught us years before this. He, too, had been a settled minister and a pillar in the Church of God.

In the earlier years when we would go to the Hammond Campmeeting, we often would stay in that country for weeks or months and have meeting out near Loranger and at Kentwood and sometimes near by in Mississippi. A number of precious souls got saved in those meetings and others were reclaimed. Some of them are pillars in the Church of God today in their respective places. We have much friendship and heavenly fellowship with the saints at Hammond and the localities surrounding that place, as they are very dear to us. When the Hammond campmeeting draws near, there is a stir in our hearts to be there and meet the dear saints again. We are looking to the Lord to preserve us and keep us in health and allow us to be in the Hammond campmeeting this summer. We also expect to attend the National campmeeting at Monark Springs, Mo. and other places as the Lord may lead.

We have been quite active and busy in the service of the Lord since the last campmeetings, for the Spirit within quickens us and we have an urge in our soul to do all we possibly can while he keeps life in this body.

Of late the Lord has been giving us some precious light and truth on the difference between the doctrines of the law and the new covenant teachings and doctrines. We find that in nearly all the parables, illustrations, and teachings of Christ that He was trying to get the Jews to see the new covenant truth and get them loose from the law doctrines that brought hardness of heart and self righteousness. He wanted them to see their condition and repent and be saved under the new covenant teachings. Read the tenth chapter of Luke, beginning at the 25th verse,

and see what the lawyer said, who represented the old covenant and law doctrines. Read it through and see how cleverly the Lord taught him the new covenant doctrine and showed the contrast and results of both and brought it home to him with a "sledge-hammer" lick.

He told him about the man who went down from Jerusalem to Jericho and how he fell among thieves. They stripped him of his raiment, wounded him, and left him lying beside the road half dead. A priest, who represented the law and old covenant, came along. He looked at the man and passed by on the other side. A Levite came along, and he, too, passed him by and left him there in this pitiful condition. The Levite also represented the law and the old covenant. But then came a Samaritan, who is a representative of the new covenant doctrines. He is a man at whom the Jews had scorned, they despised him and would have no dealings with him. But he looked at the poor man lying in his blood, and he had compassion on him. He went to him, bound up his wounds, put him on his beast and carried him to an inn and took care of him. When he left, he told the Inn keeper, after paying for the man's keep, to care for him and if he spent more on him he would pay him when he returned that way. Then the Lord put the question point-blank to the lawyer, "Which now of these three thinkest thou, was neighbor to him that fell among thieves?" The lawyer saw the truth and said, "He that showed mercy on him." Jesus answered him, "Go, and do thou likewise."

The Priest and the Levite who had been keeping the old covenant doctrines and the law had become hard in heart and self righteous and they had shut up their bowels of mercy and compassion from this man and went on in their selfish pursuits.

Brethren and sisters, let us be careful that we do not try to make law doctrines out of the teachings of the new covenant which Christ and the New Testament writers have given us, but always give room for God's mercy and compassion to exist lest we, too, bring bondage on others or become hard of heart and self righteous and thereby be tempted to stone some poor soul to death whom God would forgive and have mercy upon.

In the 119th Psalm, verse 165, we find these words written, "Great peace have they that love thy law, and nothing shall offend them." To really love the law of God would mean that when a soul received light and knowledge of God's will and law for them they would gladly begin to do just what they knew was the will of God no matter if it was greatly contrary to their natural desires or other people's wishes. Abraham set us a good example of this truth when God informed him that it was his will for him to offer his only son Isaac as a sacrifice upon the altar. Even though such a command would naturally be offensive to a human, yet we have no record of Abraham manifesting an offensive attitude toward God in the matter, but he immediately went to work preparing for the trip to the mountain where the sacrifice was to be

made. Had God not interfered, his son would have been killed and sacrificed as a burnt offering by his own hand.

When the Lord first saved us, we immediately gave up all and began to obey Him in all things that he directed us in. Many of our words and deeds were offensive to our friends and neighbors, but we looked to God for grace, and what he wanted us to do or speak was not offensive to us, for we loved His law.

Bro. Geo. Harmon (who has passed on to his reward) was the minister who baptized my wife and me after we were saved. We understood by his teaching what water baptism represented to a saved soul and to the world. Bro. Harmon had been a pillar in the church of God for many years before we met him, and he was qualified to give us good advice and instruction.

We were under his instruction for several years after we were saved and he taught us the truth from the Bible on the two works of grace, on adulterous marriage and adultery which kindled the wrath of God on the guilty one, on the Kingdom and the Church of God, the folly of the Millennial Reign doctrine, together with many other wholesome truths.

In the twenty-five years that God burdened us as an overseer of the congregation at Guthrie, Okla., the two works of grace (justification and sanctification) was taught and held up before the congregation, and when this late anti-cleansing doctrine was disturbing and leading souls into false teaching, not one in this congregation became tainted with it nor would receive their teaching. Adulterous marriage and adultery was held against by the preaching of the Word so clearly that in the twenty-five years not a single case developed in the congregation. The doctrines of the Kingdom of God and the Church of God as being the same and separate from sectism have been faithfully taught until the congregation has made a steady increase, and they know the sound of His voice from the false shepherds that make up sectism in the world.

God will honor as his children those who are not offended at his word and that seek first the Kingdom of God and his righteousness, and he will add to them all that they need in life to carry on for Him. I have found by experience that if a soul will be faithful in using the talent that God gives them that he will add more talents and give one a clearer understanding of the Scriptures for the work he calls them to do.

The church today is in great need of pastors and pillars who will hold the truth in righteousness and not become offended because of more light and knowledge on subjects, which, if they would practice, might be offensive to some with less light and to those who are drifting some toward the world and sectism. It seems that there are so many who fail to show the "ox strength" when it comes to holding the load and waiting on God, and then move up in light and knowledge that brings more crucifixion for self and persecution from professors.

We have many examples of men who once had light and knowledge and were walking in the crucified way, but when the Lord would lead into deeper selfdenial or make them know to hold the load and wait on him, they would become oftended, let up, and drift into a worldly religion, ceasing to love the self-denial crucified way. Such have received a delusion according to the Word recorded in 2 Thess. 2:10, 11, 12.

Oh, brethren and sisters, let us be steadfast, unmoveable and always willing to walk in the true light and keep loving the truth, being not offended at His Work and His meek and humble ways, which will be offensive to those who will not walk in the true light. These will persecute, slander, and speak evil of God's true ones. Did you not know that the Word says? "Woe unto you, when all men speak well of you! for so did their fathers to the false prophets." Luke 6:26. "If we suffer we shall also reign with him: if we deny him, he also will deny us." 2 Tim. 2:12. Therefore we should give the more earnest heed to the things which we have heard, lest at any time we let them slip. (Heb. 2:1).

The Treatment of Children

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This is not an article on correcting children; but I feel God would have me to speak about how the parents should or should not treat children.

My heart goes out to many children who are not treated right by their own parents or foster parents or those who may have the care of children. Dear ones, God's Word tells us to be kind and it tells us to be merciful. We must be kind and merciful to the children, too. Do you speak kindly to them? are you merciful? or do you become angry or impatient, slap them in the face, hit them over the head, or kick them, grab them by the hair and pull it? Some will shake them hard. I have heard of some being grabbed by the neck and choked, some pushed up against the wall and hit over the head. Some tie their children up in an unmerciful way and some shut them up in dark closets. I read of one little girl who had lost her voice because of being shut up in this way. The shock was too much for her. Some whip unmercifully with large straps or big sticks. Such unmerciful treatment is certainly not right, and often children treated in such a manner will grow up with hatred to their parents or the ones who have so treated them, and no one but the Lord can remove it from their hearts. If you are claiming to be a Christian and use any of these methods of punishment, you need to seek the Lord for wisdom and better methods lest your children lose confidence in you--also others. Many unsaved people would not treat their children in this manner. If in times past you have been guilty, ask your children's forgiveness, also God's forgiveness that you may be in favor with Him. May God help you.

Ephesians 6:4 tells the fathers not to provoke their children to wrath; also Col. 3:21, adds, "lest they be discouraged." Many have become discouraged and have left their homes early in life and are out in the cold world of sin all because of not receiving the love and care they should have received at home, or because of receiving unjust punishment. Be careful, dear ones. One man would tease his small boy until the child would become angry, then he would pull off his belt and whip the child. He was an unsaved man, but we are speaking of the wrong treatment of children. And if you are an unsaved parent or anyone who has the care of children, first of all you need to repent and be saved so you can be a real example and teach the children right.

Sometimes when children have trouble among themselves, the one who has charge of them will whip them all, not knowing just which one is in fault; thus little Joe or Mary may get punished for what Willie or Betty did. Some bad feelings will creep into the heart of Mary or Joe toward Willie or Betty, and you are to blame. Teach your children to ask each other's forgiveness. If you make a mistake in dealing with your child, be humble enough to ask its forgiveness.

When your children are old enough to help you, do not discourage them by being unmerciful when they break a dish. They may need correction if it has been done through carelessness, but remember little hands cannot hold a dish as firmly as larger ones. Be careful lest you punish them for something they could not help. The next time they may try to hide the broken dish. And the father should not be unreasonable when son begins to help and uses his tools.

As ye would that others do to you, do even so to them. Try to put yourself in the place of the child. Do you think you could do better? If so, then teach it the better way in kindness. Talk to them, pray for them and with them. Show them by your deeds and actions that you love them. There is sin and temptations all around. The enemy of souls is after all, young and old. When your children do get saved, be all the encouragement to them that you can. Do not discourage them and cause them to give up trying if they make mistakes and blunders for which they need to be corrected. Do not keep them so busy at work that they have no time to play. Children need some innocent recreation and if you will help them in this it will mean much in keeping them from the enticements and sinful pleasures that the world has. Teach them to be trust-worthy at all times and that they are responsible to God for their actions whether in your presence or out. Love, patience, and kindness will do much toward helping your child to do right.

May God bless each reader and help them. He who promised to help in every time of need will help you in rearing, teaching, and correcting your children

just like He will help in any other need if you will live for Him and seek His help. The reform schools and penitentiaries would not be so full if all parents and those who care for children would seek God in their problems. May the children get the love, care, kindness, and patience shown to them at home that they need, is my prayer.

Righteousness, Free From Sin

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We are commanded to live a righteous life if we ever enter into His eternal kingdom. Let us see in Rom. 5:19, "For as by one man's disobedience, many were made sinners, so by the obedience of one shall many be made righteous."

Verse 21: "That as sin hath reigned unto death, even so might grace reign through righteousness unto eternal life by Jesus Christ our Lord."

Rom. 6:1-5, "What shall we say then? Shall we continue in sin, that grace may abound? God forbid. How shall we, that are dead to sin, live any longer therein? Know ye not, that so many of us as were baptized into Jesus Christ were baptized into his death? Therefore we are buried with him by baptism into death: that like as Christ was raised up from the dead by the glory of the Father, even so we also should walk in newness of life. For if we have been planted together in the likeness of his death, we shall be also in the likeness of his resurrection. Knowing this that our old man is crucified with him, that the body of sin might be destroyed, that henceforth we should not serve sin."

Now let us take more proof of righteousness:

Rom. 6:12-16, 20, 23, "Let not sin therefore reign in your mortal body, that ye should obey it in the lusts thereof. Neither yield ye your members as instruments of unrighteousness unto sin: but yield yourselves unto God, as those that are alive from the dead, and your members as instruments of righteousness unto God. For sin shall not have dominion over you: for ye are not under the law, but under grace. What then? shall we sin, because we are not under the law, but under grace? God forbid. Know ye not, that to whom ye yield yourselves servants to obey, his servants ye are to whom ye obey; whether of sin unto death, or of obedience unto righteousness?

"For when ye were the servants of sin, ye were free from righteousness.

"For the wages of sin is death; but the gift of God is eternal life through Jesus Christ our Lord."

Rom. 8:6, "For to be carnally minded is death; but to be spiritually minded is life and peace. Because the carnal mind is enmity against God: for it is not subject to the law of God, neither indeed can be."

Why could we ask for plainer proof as to what God requires of everyone in order to enter into his Kingdom? God does not have any sinning Christians. All of His children live a righteous life, free from sin. If you sin you belong to the devil.

Rom. 8:7-14, "Because the carnal mind is enmity against God: for it is not subject to the law of God, neither indeed can be. So then they that are in the

flesh cannot please God. But ye are not in the flesh, but in the Spirit, if so be that the Spirit of God dwell in you. Now if any man have not the Spirit of Christ, he is none of his. And if Christ be in you, the body is dead because of sin; but the Spirit is life because of righteousness. But if the Spirit of him that raised up Jesus from the dead dwell in you, he that raised up Christ from the dead shall also quicken your mortal bodies by his Spirit that dwelleth in you. Therefore, brethren, we are debtors, not to the flesh, to live after the flesh. For if ye live after the flesh, ye shall die; but if ye through the Spirit do mortify the deeds of the body, ye shall live. For as many as are led by the Spirit of God, they are the sons of God."

Some will say that everyone sins and that they just cannot live and not sin. Then some will say that if we were living without sin, we would be as good as Jesus and would be taken away to heaven.

Rom. 8:16, "The Spirit itself beareth witness with our spirit that we are the children of God." So if we have been regenerated and born again, born of the Spirit, then we know that we are God's children because the Spirit beareth witness with our spirit, and we can surely know. I hear some say, "Oh, I only have a hope, I don't know if I am saved or not." If you do not know, you had better be on your knees and find out for sure. God is merciful, and if you humble yourself in His sight with an honest heart, he will lift you up and bless your soul, praise His holy name. If you are poor, he can make you rich. What he will give you is worth more than ten worlds, and he will do it if you will obey his voice. "Come unto me all ye that labor and are heavy laden, and I will give you rest. Take my yoke upon you and learn of me, . . . for my yoke is easy and my burden is light, and ye shall find rest to your souls." What a wonderful promise! And we can trust Him to do it. I speak that I know. He did it for me, and he will for you if you will seek. God's Word says, "Seek and ye shall find; knock and it shall be opened unto you. Now let us see just what Webster's dictionary says concerning the meaning or definition of the word "Righteous." It says one that is just, blameless, godly, pious, guiltless, pure, free from sin. It seems to me the folks of today that claim to be Christians have forgotten the meaning of the word "righteous" if they ever knew. The trend of the people generally speaking, seems to be the idea that the church is an organized society where they can have their circles and clubs, and some of them have their Bingo games. Some even dance, go to ball games, card parties, picture shows, cut their hair (that is the women folk) powder and paint their faces, wear ear bobs or rings and high heel shoes. In warm weather they wear as few clothes as they can to get by the police and not be arrested. The laws of our land seem to uphold them, or the officers do. I am of the belief that these fashionable modernistic churches are leading more people on that broad road than any other thing now in existence, because a lot of folks think that is the way. That is what they have been taught from childlood up. "But there is a way that seemeth right unto man, but the end thereof are the ways of death."

So the saints of God that know the truth must keep themselves clear of the unfruitful works of darkness and stay clear of all the isms and schisms that are leading men and women on that broad road. There is only one way and it is the holy way. I am glad that I am in that way and where we fellowship righteous folks. There is not a sinner in that way.

I heard a preacher say this morning that the goal set by the Missionary Baptist for last year was to baptize one person for every eight church members. Then he said in his church he had beat that. He had baptized one person for every six church members they had. I was just thinking about him telling them that they could not live without sin, that everyone sins more or less all the time. I know that God is not pleased with such, and will bring everything into judgment whether it be good or whether it be evil.

Have Faith in God

Here are a few thoughts of encouragement to those of you who are trusting the Lord for healing.

I am sure we all have heard of Paul's thorn in the flesh, and some say it is the affliction that Paul had to suffer in preaching the gospel, or God laid it upon him and he had to suffer because Christ suffered on the cross. But I want to exhort from a different angle, and hope this will help you to see the truth. In 2 Cor. 12:7 we find, "And lest I should be exalted above measure through the abundance of the revelations, there was given to me a thorn in the flesh, the messenger of Satan to buffet me." But this does not say anything about Paul having to suffer for Christ's sake. Paul's thorn in the flesh was not affliction; it was as the passage says: ". . .the messenger of Satan to buffet me." This buffeting was the persecutions that Paul had to face in preaching the gospel. And Paul had plenty of persecutions to face because " . . . whatsoever ye sow, that shall ye also reap." Paul was reaping because he had "persecuted the Christians even unto death."

But Paul continues in the 9th and 10th verses of this chapter by saying that the Lord (through the Holy Spirit) spoke to him and said, ". . . My grace is sufficient for thee; for my strength is made perfect in weakness. Most gladly therefore will I rather glory in my infirmities, that the power of Christ may rest upon me. Therefore I take pleasure in infirmities, in reproaches, in necessities, in persecutions, in distress for Christ's sake: for when I am weak, then am I strong." But this still doesn't say that we have to suffer afflictions for Christ's sake.

It was even prophesied in Isaiah that He would take away our sins and heal all our diseases. Isaiah 53:5-8, "But he was wounded for our transgressions, he was bruised for our iniquities: the chastisement of our peace was upon him; and with his stripes we are healed. All we like sheep have gone astray; we have turned every one to his own way; and the Lord

hath laid on him the iniquity of us all. He was oppressed, and he was afflicted, yet he opened not his mouth; he is brought as a lamb to the slaughter, and as a sheep before her shearers is dumb, so he openeth not his mouth. He was taken from prison and from judgment: and who shall declare his generation? for he was cut off from the land of the living: for the transgression of my people was he stricken." Now notice in the 5th verse, ". . . and with his stripes we are healed." Now you say that was in the Old Testament and that doesn't apply to the New Testament. How about the many times Christ healed on the shores of Galilee? Matt. 4:23, "And Jesus went about all Galilee, teaching in their synagogues, and preaching the gospel of the kingdom, and healing all manner of sickness and all manner of disease among the people." Read Matt. 8:1-3 where Jesus healed the leper, vs. 3, "And Jesus put forth his hand, and touched him, saying, I will, be thou clean. And immediately his leprosy was cleansed." This chapter tells of many more healings. The Centurion's servant was healed (vs. 5-9); then Peter's wife's mother was healed (vss. 14, 15). In verse 16 it is written: "When the even was come, they brought unto him many that were possessed with devils: and he cast out the spirits with his word, and healed all that were sick:" He healed how many? "ALL that were sick."

We could go on and on in the recordings of Jesus' healings, but you take your Bible now, and run all the references on healing and pray that God will help you to get the light and the faith on healing.

We do have plenty of proof that God does heal.

When you have faith for physical healing and want to trust God for it, you trust upon God's promises and know that God does not go back on His promises. When He promises, He will fulfill that promise. You can stand on God's promises and all of heaven's force will be back of you. Furthermore, we know that Jesus spilled His blood for our sins and our healing, "and with his stripes we are healed." You must put the blood of Jesus between your healing and the enemy, Satan. And I'll go a little farther and say when we do that, Satan cannot touch our healing. If we should have tests, do not become discouraged, because that is just the trying of your faith. Keep it committed to God and the blood of Christ is upon it. For another expression, when we commit anything to God through faith, we have to bind it to the altar. Abraham had to "guard his sacrifice lest the birds come and pick it off." So we have to leave it with the Lord and in His hands lest Satan come and take it off the altar through causing us to doubt.

I do hope and pray that this will be of help to you. Do not doubt if you want complete healing. James 1:6, "But let him ask in faith nothing wavering. For he that wavereth is like a wave of the sea driven with the wind and tossed." This passage tells us that we can not doubt or let our faith waver or we have asked in vain. It takes that steadfast faith firm upon the promises of God.

Now for those of you that desire to see unsaved ones brought into the kingdom of God, this same faith is required. Many souls have been won to the Lord through endless and ceaseless praying and also fasting.

I desire every Christian in the world who really knows God to pray for our world and the crisis that faces us. If we were praying like we should with weeping and agony, we could move mountains for the Lord in this world. God is not pleased with this sin and fightings, and unless America gets on her knees and starts praying more than she ever has, God will no longer shield us from these disastrous things that will come. I urge every one of you to take this upon your hearts and pray with faith. Ask God to move upon this world, especially our rulers and all that are in authority. SOLUTION IN THE HOME

Juvenile crime is shockingly on the rise. Mrs. Oveta Culp Hobby, secretary of health, education, and welfare, revealed recently that there has been a 17 per cent increase in teen-age offenses in the last three years. From the FBI comes the stern warning that if juvenile crime rate continues to increase, the greatest crime wave in history will engulf America in the next generation.

Many influences will be cited for this ominous trend. Yet the primary responsibility goes back to one place—the home.

A famous sociologist, once observed: "There are no delinquent children, only delinquent parents." And the hard fact must be faced that parental neglect is at the bottom of juvenile delinquency.

Home life has altered greatly over the years. To-

day's way of living furnishes the time and opportunity for diversions outside the home. Parents spend fewer hours at home than ever before. Children too much of the time are left to drift for themselves.

Neither do we today have the firm adherence to moral principles that governed us in the past. Thus the laxity of parents is transmitted to children.

Every approach to this problem must therefore begin by holding parents accountable for the behavior of their children. And corrective measures must also begin in the home. The responsibility of parenthood cannot be delegated to the church, school, or social agency. Good children are the product of proper home environment—of love, care, and discipline. To the extent that parents face these facts will the problem of juvenile delinquency be curbed. —Sel.

First Campmeeting in Oklahoma

It will be sixty-two years ago this August since the first campmeeting of the Church of God was held in Oklahoma. Recollections of this first campmeeting and pioneer gospel work in the state are told by Bro. and Sister Simon Post of the Guthrie congregation. They celebrated their 69th wedding aniversary on April 25th. Bro. Post was 94 years of age on May 1st and she is past 87. Considering their age, they are quite active and are up and around the house most of the time. He attends the Sunday morning services quite often, and rejoices to hear the old songs of Zion, some times raising both hands in praise to the Lord.

They were married April 25, 1886 near Arkansas City, Kansas, and came to Oklahoma territory in July, 1889, and homesteaded on a claim nine miles north of the town of Crescent in Logan County, of which Guthrie is the county seat.

In April, 1892, George and Mary Cole, Lodema Kaser, and Sterling Price McCully held a meeting at a school house near their homestead. Bro. and Sister Post attended this meeting, got saved and accepted the truth. In August of the next year, 1873, a campmeeting was held a half mile south of their farm on the banks of Skeleton Creek. (The notice of this campmeeting, signed by Simon Post, appeared in the "Trumpet" in 1893 while Bro. Warner was the editor.) Among the ministers present at this first campmeeting in Oklahoma were Jeremiah, George and Mary Cole, Lodema Kaser, and Sterling P. McCully.

In October, 1904, Bro. Post and Bro. and Sister Robert Glasgow went to Blackwell, Okla., and through many hardships held the first meeting of the Church of God in that city.

Some of the early-day ministers who held or attended meetings in the Post community are as follows: W. J. Henry, George and Emma Dansberger, William Wilson, Ostis B. and Mattie Wilson, S. G. Bryant, G. P. Keeling, Samuel Helms, Charles Forbes, W. N. and Jennie Smith, Robert and James Glasgow, Edward and Lena Mattheson, Mable Hale, W. H. Shoot, Charles Bright, Cornelia A. Sunderland, Ellen Trent (Porter), and Moses H. Williams.—L. D. Pruitt.

June 5, 1955

Printed Portion 2 Chronicles 33:9-20.

2 Chron. 33:9. So Manasseh made Judah and the inhabitants of Jerusalem to err and to do worse than the heathen, whom the Lord had destroyed before the children of Israel.

10. And the Lord spake to Manasseh, and to his people: but they would not hearken.

11. Wherefore the Lord brought upon them the captains of the host of the king of Assyria, which took Manasseh among the thorns, and bound him with fetters, and carried him to Babylon.

12. And when he was in affliction, he besought the Lord his God, and humbled himself greatly before the

God of his fathers,

13. And prayed unto him: and he was intreated of him, and heard his supplication, and brought him again to Jerusalem into his kingdom. Then Manasseh knew that the Lord he was God.

14. Now after this he built a wall without the city of David, on the west side of Gihon, in the valley, even to

the entering in at fish gate, and compassed about Ophel, and raised it up a very great height, and put captains of war in all the fenced cities of Judah.

- 15. And he took away the strange gods, and the idol out of the house of the Lord, and all the altars that he had built in the mount of the house of the Lord, and in Jerusalem, and cast them out of the city.
- 16. And he repaired the altar of the Lord, and sacrificed thereon peace offerings and thank offerings, and commanded Judah to serve the Lord God of Israel.

17. Nevertheless the people did sacrifice still in the high places, yet unto the Lord their God only.

18. Now the rest of the acts of Manasseh, and his prayer unto his God, and the words of the seers that spake to him in the name of the Lord God of Israel, behold, they are written in the book of the kings of Israel.

19. His prayer also, and how God was intreated of him, and all his sins, and his trespass, and the places wherein he built high places, and set up groves and graven images, before he was humbled: behold, they are written among the sayings of the seers.

20. So Manasseh slept with his fathers, and they burried him in his own house: and Amon his son reigned in

his stead.

Memory Selection: Teach me to do thy will; for thou art my God: thy spirit is good; lead me into the land of uprightness. Psalm 143:10.

Practical Truth: The mercy of God is so great that He will forgive a penitent soul, whatever the past has heen.

COMMENTS AND APPLICATION

There were kings of Judah that were good, others were not so good, but we find Manasseh to be the worst. His father was a good king and gave him an example of righteousness so there was no excuse for him to be the worst. Further, the Lord himself spoke to Manasseh and his people, "but they would not hearken" (v. 10).

Manasseh was greatly humbled down (2 Chron. 33: 10-13)

When God afflicted and gave him his frown; Then he knew that the Lord he was God, For God heard him and took away his rod.

Things are changed as to immediate action, for the thing that Manasseh had done he tried to undo, for he took away the strange gods, repaired the altar of the Lord. and restored the right form of worship. But in his life he had done so wickedly that God remembered later his awful deeds when he said, "Because of all the provocations that Manasseh had provoked him withall" (2 Kings 23:26, 27). As we take a view of the situation and ponder this lesson, we are made to realize what Jesus meant when he spoke of being beaten with few or many stripes (Luke 12:41-48). It pays for the Christian to pray, then do as God says.

YOUNG KING JOSIAH

June 12, 1955

Printed Portion 2 Chronicles 34:1-12a

2 Chron. 34:1. Josiah was eight years old when he began to reign, and he reigned in Jerusalem one and thirty years.

2. And he did that which was right in the sight of the Lord, and walked in the ways of David his father, and declined neither to the right hand, nor to the left.

3. For in the eighth year of his reign, while he was yet young, he began to seek after the God of David his father: and in the twelfth year he began to purge Judah and Jerusalem from the high places, and the groves, and the carved images, and the molten images.

- 4. And they brake down the altars of Baalim in his presence; and the images, that were on high above them, he cut down; and the groves, and the carved images, and the molten images, he brake in pieces, and made dust of them, and strowed it upon the graves of them that had sacrificed unto them.
- 5. And he burnt the bones of the priests upon their altars, and cleansed Judah and Jerusalem.
- 6. And so did he in the cities of Manasseh, and Epn raim, and Simeon, even unto Naphtali, with their mattocks round about.
- 7. And when he had broken down the altars and the groves, and had beaten the graven images into powder, and cut down all the idols throughout all the land of Israel, he returned to Jerusalem.

8. Now in the eighteenth year of his reign, when he had purged the land, and the house, he sent Shaphan the son of Azaliah, and Maaseiah the governor of the city, and Joah the son of Joahaz the recorder, to repair the house of the Lord his God.

9. And when they came to Hilkiah the high priest, they delivered the money that was brought into the house of God, which the Levites that kept the doors had gathered of the hand of Manasseh and Ephraim. and of all the remnant of Israel, and of all Judah and Benjamin; and they returned to Jerusalem.

10. And they put it in the hand of the workmen that had the oversight of the house of the Lord, and they gave it to the workmen that wrought in the house of the

Lord, to repair and amend the house:

11. Even to the artificers and builders gave they it, to buy hewn stone, and timber for couplings, and to floor the houses which the kings of Judah had destroyed.

12. And the men did the work faithfully. - - - - -

Memory Selection: Wherewithal shall a young man cleanse his way? by taking heed thereto according to thy word. Psalm 119:9.

Practical Truth: The influence of devoted young people is needed in every congregation, and they should exercise their God given gifts and grow in the things of

COMMENTS AND APPLICATION

We find here that Josiah began to walk in the ways of David his father (vs. 2, 3). David walked so close to God that he was called a man of God (Neh. 12:24). His life followed posterity down through the years of righteousness. Even where he went wrong, his repentance was to be imitated, (Psalm 51).

No doubt that Hilkiah the high priest or some of those older had a good influence on the young king to help him walk in the ways of the Lord, so that he began to "purge Judah and Jerusalem" (v. 3), and cleansed

them (v. 5). After he was through and "had purged the land" (v. 8), then be began to "repair the house of the Lord his God" (v. 8). And it says that the "men did the work faithfully" (v. 12).

The lesson today is used for the encouragement and upbuilding of the Christian. He began to seek after God while yet young. "Remember now thy Creator in the days of thy youth, while the evil days come not, nor the years draw nigh, when thou shalt say, I have no pleasure in them" (Eccl. 12:1). Then notice how he kept working at the job. The true Christian knows that he must keep working at it if he is going to remain a true Christian.

JOSIAH KEEPS THE PASSOVER

June 19, 1955

Printed Portion 2 Chronicles 35:1-6, 16-19.

- 2 Chron. 35:1. Moreover Josiah kept a passover unto the Lord in Jerusalem: and they killed the passover on the fourteenth day of the first month.
- 2. And he set the priests in their charges, and encouraged them to the service of the house of the Lord,
- 3. And said unto the Levites that taught all Israel, which were holy unto the Lord, Put the holy ark in the house which Solomon the son of David king of Israel did build; it shall not be a burden upon your shoulders: serve now the Lord your God, and his people Israel,
- 4. And prepare yourselves by the houses of your fathers, after your courses, according to the writing of David king of Israel, and according to the writing of Solomon his son.
- 5. And stand in the holy place according to the divisions of the families of the fathers of your brethren the people, and after the division of the families of the Levites.
- 6. So kill the passover, and sanctify yourselves, and prepare your brethren, that they may do according to the word of the Lord by the hand of Moses.
- 16. So all the service of the Lord was prepared the same day, to keep the passover, and to offer burnt offerings upon the altar of the Lord, according to the commandment of king Josiah.
- 17. And the children of Israel that were present kept the passover at that time, and the feast of unleavened bread seven days.
- 18. And there was no passover like to that kept in Israel from the days of Samuel the prophet; neither did all the kings of Israel keep such a passover as Josiah kept, and the priests, and the Levites, and all Judah and Israel that were present, and the inhabitants of Jerusalem.
- 19. In the eighteenth year of the reign of Josiah was the passover kept.

Memory Selection: I was glad when they said unto me, Let us go into the house of the Lord. Psalm 122:1.

Practical Truth: The public worship of God should be with reverence and an holy atmosphere before God.

COMMENTS AND APPLICATION

There is little use to read the Bible if it does not move to action those who read it. The test is to obey God's commandments, and show how much real sincerity there is in the study of God's word. When the will is to the purpose of God, that is an active response to divine law.

After Josiah had made repairs on the sanctuary and had completed his work of getting things ready to worship God in the right way, then he was ready to keep the passover "unto the Lord" (v. 1). And he says, "Prepare yourselves" (v. 4). "Stand in the holy place" (v. 5). "Sanctify yourselves" (v. 6). "So all the service of the Lord was prepared the same day, to keep the passover, and to offer burnt offerings upon the altar of the Lord" (v. 16). So Josiah observed the law of God according to all of God's commandments. When he heard the law read to him, he did something about it. That is the great need here in the U.S. today. There are many that read the Bible but do not let it move them to do right, just as God says for them to do. "Study to shew thyself approved unto God, a workman that needeth not to be ashamed, rightly dividing the word of truth" (2 Tim. 2:15). So that man lives "by every word of God" (Luke 4:4). Jesus himself said that.

- 2. She obeyed not the voice; she received not correction; she trusted not in the Lord; she drew not near to her God.
- 3. Her princes within her are roaring lions; her judges are evening wolves; they gnaw not the bones till the morrow.
- 4. Her prophets are light and treacherous persons: her priests have polluted the sanctuary, they have done violence to the law.
- 5. The just Lord is in the midst thereof; he will not do iniquity: every morning doth he bring his judgment to light, he falleth not; but the unjust knoweth no shame.
- 14. Sing, O daughter of Zion; shout, O Israel; be glad and rejoice with all the heart. O daughter of Jerusalem.

Memory Selection: O let the nations be glad and sing for joy: for thou shalt judge the people righteously, and govern the nations upon earth. Psalm 67:4.

Practical Truth: God rules and overrules in the affairs of nations, and will punish the guilty and forgive those that repent.

COMMENTS AND APPLICATION

The first five verses of our lesson give a picture of shame and degradation. "She obeyed not the voice; she received no correction; she trusted not in the Lord; she drew not near to God" (v. 2). "Her prophets are light and treacherous persons" (v. 4. What a sad picture of those who are without God and are filthy and are polluted (v. 1). The law of life is just that way. When men ignore God and choose other ways, there can be no other result. Without the life of God in the soul men are under the power of the devil, who will turn every thing into the worst condition possible for man.

What a happy contrast is the rest of the verses that are given for our study. The first part of the lesson was given under the figure of a filthy woman, but the last is given under the figure of a virtuous woman, "Sing, O daughter of Zion" (v. 14). "Speaking to yourselves in psalms and hymns and spiritual songs, singing and making melody in your heart to the Lord" (Eph. 5:19). What a wonderful heritage is for the Christian that he may be sure that he is a Christian. "The Spirit itself beareth witness with our spirit, that we are the children of God" (Rom. 8:16). That makes the heart rejoice and praise the Lord.
