The Bible Way of Salvation

I wish to call your attention to the Bible way of salvation. Some seem to see it one way, and others seem to see it another way. I see no place for controversy, for the way is so plainly outlined in the Word of God.

In Luke 13:3 we read, "I tell you, Nay; but except ye repent, ye shall all likewise perish." So we see that we are first called unto repentance. It is "repent, or perish."

In II Cor. 7:10 we read, "For godly sorrow worketh repentance to salvation not to be repented of." When we are convicted of our sins, there comes a

godly sorrow for sins committed, which calls us to repent, to come to God, and ask His forgiveness. Upon our truly repenting and asking, God forgives us of our sins, and gives us the witness of His Spirit that He has forgiven us. This places us among those who are justified freely. Rom. 8:16 says, "The Spirit itself beareth witness with our spirit, that we are the children of God." What a wonderful experience it is to know that our sins are all gone—all blotted out by the precious blood of Jesus!

In Rom. 5:1, 2, we read, "Therefore being justified by faith, we have peace with God through our Lord Jesus Christ: by whom also we have access by faith into this grace wherein we stand, and rejoice in hope of the glory of God." When we are justified and have peace with God, we are saved, or born again—born of the Spirit. We are then called unto holiness, or sanctification (I Thess. 4). One is not merely called unto sanctification, but he is commanded to go on unto it: "For ye know what commandment we gave you by the Lord Jesus; for this is the will of God, even your sanctification, that ye should abstain from fornication: that every one of you should know how to possess his vessel in sanctification and honor."

St. Paul tells us that every one of God's children should have the experience of sanctification. It is not only a blessing, but it is a heart experience—a second definite work of divine grace wrought in the heart by the Holy Ghost, after one has been converted or born again. A sinner cannot get sanctified, for he must first repent, be delivered from sin, be made alive unto God, or born again. When Jesus prayed for His disciples (St. John 17), He prayed the Father, "They are not of the world, even as I am not of the world." We know that they were converted, and Jesus asked His Father, to "sanctify them." He also prayed, "Neither pray I for these alone, but for them also which shall believe on me through their word." which brings it down to all of us today. How wonderful, and how easy to be understood!

In Heb. 6:1 we read, "Let us go on unto perfection"; and in Heb. 10:14, "For by one offering he hath perfected forever them that are sanctified."

Heb. 12:14 reads thus, "Follow peace with all men, and holiness, without which no man shall see

the Lord." What could be more plain or understandable to anyone who loves God and means to make heaven his eternal home?

In II Cor. 4:3, 4, Paul gives us a solemn warning: "But if our gospel be hid, it is hid to them that are lost: in whom the god of this world hath blinded the minds of them which believe not, lest the light of the glorious gospel of Christ, who is the image of God, should shine unto them."

Now, dearly beloved reader, consider the truth of this, and also consider how good God is to give us this wonderful experience of full salvation "through sanctification of the spirit and belief of the truth." Jesus died that we might be sanctified.

Heb. 13:12 says, "Wherefore Jesus also, that he might sanctify the people with his own blood, suffered without the gate." Jesus could, and did forgive sins before He was crucified.

I am so glad God ever sent the holy people my way and helped me to see and accept this wonderful truth. After I was saved for some time, I felt my need of a closer walk with God. I surely leaned on Matt. 5:6, "Blessed are they which do hunger and thirst after righteousness: for they shall be filled." When I heard sanctification preached, I said, "That is just what I need," and I gladly went down on my knees in my own home and was sanctified wholly. I can sing with the poet,

"Oh, I never shall forget how the fire fell,

When the Lord sanctified me."

It holds good today! Glory! May the Lord help precious, Judgment-bound souls to see, before it is too late, is my prayer.

These are just suggestions and kind reminders. We appreciate the Spirit-filled testimonies and articles, and pray the Lord to keep them coming to His glory and the good of souls.

The condition existing in Christendom today is appalling and heart sickening to those who see the light of His Word and are walking in it. Christendom today is overcome with wor'dliness, self-right-eousness, riches, and pleasure, and a great host of people are traveling the broad way to destruction with a profession of religion. In this condition they are blinded to the fact that the old Dragon power under the cloak of Communism is gradually undermining our government and in time will take over and many of the saints will be persecuted and professors of

religion will find themselves helpless and will be forced to yield to this octopus power which is now strongly gripping this country.

If those that profess Christ were really saved and in touch with God they could unite in prayers that would cause God to look in mercy and he would stay this red dragon power and preserve our country from its coming ruin. Many worship today, they know not what, as their god seems to be dead and does nothing for them. Oh, that such people would awake to the fact that they are duped or deceived by satanic angels-oflight preachers and spirits. Jesus says, "If the blind lead the blind, both shall fall into the ditch." And He also said, "If therefore the light that is in thee be darkness, how great is that darkness!" Many people are walking near the light but are not in the light. In Psa. 36:9 we read, "For with thee is the fountain of life: in thy light shall we see light." We must possess Him in order to have the fountain of life and walk in His light to be able to see true light. When people resort to the arm of flesh and cater to the world and its folly, they cannot expect to see true light, although through their own self-righteousness they are near the light of God. Being blind they do not see the true light for the way they take and justify themselves brings blindness to their spiritual vision.

The statistics show that every day the American people swollow 45 million aspirin tablets, 20 million sleeping tablets, and 20 million wake-up tablets. Oh, that men would have faith in God to give them sleep at the proper time and to keep them awake when needful and best! Oh, the misery that people undergo because they do not know the true God. Just think of the liquor that is consumed, the taking of God's name in vain, the pride that causes men and women to dress in the worldly fashions and put on jewelry, gold adornments, beads, and other adornments which the scriptures plainly teach against. People need salvation, but they love sin and the world; they need

God but choose the world; they need heaven but are choosing hell. How sad the picture! They go to church on Sunday but live to please the devil through the week. I trust that none of our readers are in this class. I exhort you not to lean toward nor console yourself with any of this worldly way.

Jesus rebuked the sect people in His day and said, "Woe unto you, scribes and Pharisees, hypocrites! for ye compass sea and land to make one proselyte, and when he is made, ye make him two-fold more the child of hell than yourselves" Matt. 23:15. OUR PRECIOUS CHILDREN (Continued)

The family council can not be overstressed, as it is so much needed in this day of hurry. When there is an important matter to decide, call all the family together. Let the children make suggestions and consider them. If they feel that they have an important place to fill in the family, they will try to fill that place well. Be honest with yourself and your child; never tell him an untruth. If you are called to dress a wound, do not say, "This will not hurt;" let him know that it might hurt a little, but that the wound must be dressed.

If the child has bad habits, correct one at a time. Be patient; do not nag. Correct the bad habit by helping him to form a good one in its place. Make the good habit attractive to the child so he will want to master it. The child's desire or will is your greatest asset in working with him. If you can guide until he wants to accomplish the desired end, he will co-operate with you because he will know that he is doing the task because he wants to, and not because he is forced to do it. Do not be always saying, "Don't do that," "Get out of that," or, "You can't do that," but give the child something to do to keep him busy.

It is true that sometimes our children must be punished, to teach obedience. The Lord punishes us to teach us to obey Him, "For whom the Lord loveth he chasteneth, and scourgeth every son whom he receiveth" Heb. 12:6. Before you punish, talk and pray with your child. Do not jump on him in the heat of your passion, for if you do, you may punish beyond reason. As you pray with him, cause him to see that you are punishing him for his good, not to satisfy your anger. If you get this to him it will cause him to become hunble and then he will not build up a resentment against you.

Never scold. We can talk in a firm quiet way, letting them know that we mean just what we say. Never tell the child one day that he can not do a certain thing and the next let him do it. Do not let your children beg you to let them do things. Be firm. Be sure that you mean what you say. When you say "yes" be sure that you mean it and stick to it, and likewise for "no." Never let your child throw itself into a tantrum to get its way. If they start this bring them out of it with a good switch, and be sure the switch is large enough to sting plenty. Little tender switches only make matters worse by stirring up more anger.

Now concerning family prayer and the child: the world today is losing respect for authority because that respect has been lost in the home. Family worship should be made interesting for the children. Read a short interesting chapter of a few verses and let the children comment on them. The prayers should not be long and drawn out, but short and to the point. Talk to God as if you saw him in the room—He is there. Try to see Him with your spiritual eyes. Parents should pray for the needs of their friends and be burdened for all gospel workers, but they should do their long praying in secret, for long prayers tire

children. Let the children pray too, and do not let them run over the house during the worship: they must be taught to reverence God. As soon as the child is old enough to read let him read and take part in all phases of the worship.

Children must also be taught to reverence the house of God. Do not let them run over the house during worship: take a little switch along and use it if needed to keep them quiet. (If you are firm, you won't have to use the switch much.) Your children, if taught Godly reverence, will soon accept Christ as their Saviour. Do not expect too much of your saved children; they need training. There is no doubt but what they will do things that will grieve not only you but the God of heaven also. Point out their mistakes and sins and tell them about God's mercy to forgive them. If you can show them how naughty they have been and the result of such a life, they will become sorry and truly repent. Little by little you can lead them until they will reach the place where their lives will please God. When we commit a trespass, Satan is there to tell us that God has left us and will not forgive us, but our Savior knows our weaknesses and is ready to forgive and restore when godly sorrow worketh repentance.

Our children should have an important part in our public worship: Sunday School, etc. Let the Junior boys and girls sing before the school. If they have a part they will be much more interested in all parts of the work of the Church.

Four out of five delinquent boys say their parents were indifferent to what they did and where they went. Three out of five juvenile delinquents are from homes where there is discord between parents.

May the Lord bless all and give wisdom in all things.

The Whole Armor of God

"Finally, my brethren, be strong in the Lord, and in the power of his might. Put on the whole armor of God, that ye may be able to stand against the wiles of the devil" Eph, 6:10, 11. We find in this scripture inspired of God the key secret to the success of a Christian life. The Christian life is illustrated in several different ways in the Bible but this is one of the most positive and impressive: the fact that the life of a Christian is likened unto a warfare. If you have been saved and sanctified very long, I believe that you have already found that so, because we have an unseen foe, the enemy of all righteousness as our adversary. He is out to drown our souls and to sap out the very life of Christ. But the Lord has not left us empty-handed to fight this foe. He has for each and every child of God an armor that will be your victory if you will use it. In our own strength we would be a sure victim of the enemy in all his deceivableness and craftiness. But by the means of these almighty spiritual weapons from God we can fight a good fight of faith and gain our eternal crown of glory just as the faithful ones before us did. Now

we would like to explain a little just what the armor is composed of.

But, first, if a hunter goes out on a hunting trip without his knife, trap, gun, and the other necessary equipment, he is very likely to come back empty-handed and may very well lose his life. A person who does not have his car fully equipped with every safety device and ready for the road, is not likely to get far and may well lose his life also. A football player who does not equip himself with every item of his uniform but carelessly goes out without it into the game is very likely to be a fatality or a member of the injured list. So it is with a Christian. If he is not equipped fully with the weapons of God, then surely he is likely to make a failure in the end.

Put on the armor that you may be able to stand. In verse 14, it says to stand, "having your loins girt about with truth." In Romans 13:14 it tells us to put on the Lord Jesus. In John 14:6 Jesus tells us that He is the truth. To be clothed with Jesus the truth means that we must take upon ourselves His nature. His ways, His mind, and His will. Just delight yourself in His work, His Word, and His precious standard. Though it may mean some suffering or some hard things, yet we must have His truth about us to be able to stand. Keep within your heart a burning love for the truth. The truth, we understand, is the Word of God in its right interpretation. No matter how much the enemy tries to turn you against the saints and the truth, stand your ground and look to Jesus to keep that love for God and His Truth in your heart. If you love the truth enough, you will measure to its standard and let it become a part of you. So the truth is to be our clothing in this life and this war.

"Stand . . . having on the breastplate of rightcousness." This breastplate of righteousness is the protection you have for your heart. Just as the ancient soldiers had a breastplate that covered the front of their bodies, so the Christian must have this spiritual protection. You might say that the breastplate of righteousness is a holy life before the Lord. Matt. 5:8 says, "Blessed are the pure in heart for they shall see God." In Heb. 12:14 it tells us to "Follow peace with all men and holiness, without which no man shall see the Lord." We must be holy and righteous as the Lord is. I Pet. 1:16. The best way to keep the heart with all diligence (Prov. 4:23) is to live holy before the Lord to the best of your knowledge and live righteous before Him to all you know and understand from His Bible standard. If you let down on any line and walk back of light that the Lord has given you then you are letting down the breastplate and are a sure victim of a dart from the enemy that will mean death to your soul. So walk holy before God and be careful lest your heart may become a target for the enemy.

"Above all, taking the shield of faith, wherewith ye shall be able to quench all the fiery darts of the wicked." Here is a vital weapon we must have if we want to gain victories for the Lord. In your Chris-

tian life there will be times when the fiery darts of the wicked will fly fast toward you. Temptations, discouragement, jealousy, envy, hatred, selfishness, confusion, pride, foolishness, worldliness, riches, and neglect are just a few of the many darts the devil has to throw that would mean death to our souls. But just a lift of the shield of faith will ward off every one of them. Faith is to believe and to trust God. Sometimes the feelings may not be just right, but just lift the shield of faith in God by resisting the devil and determining in your heart that you will not give over to any evil thing but press on for the Lord. The temptations may be many but the shield of faith will enable us to go through with victory in our souls. No matter what the natural conditions may be, and no matter how hard the trial. just lift the shield, believe and trust in God and victory and grace will be yours. If we did not have faith, we would be depressed most of the time, but with faith we can soar above the clouds in the pure sunlight of God. So keep the shield of faith ready at all times.

"And your feet shod with the preparation of the gospel of peace." The thoughts that the Lord has given us reveals that we must be at all times ready to tell someone else about Jesus. Paul tells us to be instant in season and out of season. II Tim. 4:2. When the Lord wants us to, let us be willing to tell others about God. Be sure you can tell them what Jesus will do for them and how much He loves them. Be shod with the preparation. A thought from that tells us to live a holy life around people so that they will notice your life and be able to learn the gospel from you. Be kind to people in sin and always keep in mind that they are to be loved and pitied, for Christ died for them just as He has died to save you. It's a good idea to do good to all men. Give them a warm smile, be courteous, and always be ready to put in a word for the Lord. You will never know just how much these things will affect some people. In Isa. 52:7, it tells us "How beautiful upon the mountains are the feet of him that bringeth good tidings, that publisheth peace, that bringeth good tidings of good, that publisheth salvation; that saith unto Zion, Thy God reigneth!" It surely is a lovely thing to be able to spread the gospel wherever we go. But remember we are surrounded by men and women who are lost in sin and we must be at our post of duty to warn them to turn to God before it is too late. So let us be shod firmly (keep these shoes fastened firmly to your fect) with the gospel of peace.

"And take the helmet of salvation." The helmet is to protect your head. The head of the body controls the whole body. Even the heart beat is controlled by a certain part of your head. If your head is destroyed, so is your life. Spiritually, salvation covers and protects and saves every part of our life and soul. So let us be sure that we can testify of salvation at all times.

"And the sword of the Spirit which is the word of God." Here is our last part of the armor. The Word of God is very vital to the soul. It is the food on which the soul must feed. It is the strength of the soul. Your victory and strength depend largely upon the amount you feed upon the Word of God. A person who quits eating will soon die a natural death but a person who quits reading the Bible will die a spiritual. Young saints must read the Word of God. When you read the Bible, ask the Spirit of God to teach you precious truth and you will find the Lord making His truth and Word very dear to your heart. It is a necessity to read the Bible. When the enemy brings discouragement to you or tempts you to do something wrong, just pick out a good scripture from your heart and thrust it at him. Victory will be yours. When he tries to push you off into a false doctrine, just hurl some truth at him. Victory will be yours. At one time the enemy was trying to get me to doubt my salvation, but the Lord gave me some of the Word of God and I put that on the enemy and the victory was mine. In the Word of God we find many promises to supply every need. Remember that God's Word will stand forever. So let us keep the eternal Word as our sword and victory will be ours. Heb. 4:12 tells that the Word of God is quick, powerful, and sharper than any twoedged sword. It will cut both ways. It will hit the preacher just as it will any one else. So let us all keep the Word of God and measure to its standard,

A love for the truth, a holy life, the preparation of the gospel, faith in God, salvation, and the Word of God make up the armor of God. Without just one of these vital things we will not make a success of our experience with God.

Verse 18 tells us to be "praying always with all prayer and supplication in the Spirit, and watching thereunto with all perseverance and supplication for all the saints." Dear Christian friend, let us pray for one another and keep in the center of God's will and victory is sure to be ours to the end.

Praise the name of our dear Saviour, He has done so much for me. I was reared in the Missionary Baptist denomination and my people were strong Baptists, teaching us that if we were once in grace it was impossible to be lost. I was converted when I was eleven years old (in 1895) and of course joined the Baptist sect. I thought it was right because they baptized by immersion. I was young and knew very little about the Bible.

When I was fourteen my father built on another place, which put us in another school district. Close to the new school house was a church house—Methodist. They taught we could be saved and backslide and be lost. My mother would make remarks about such a doctrine. Before this I had not given any doctrine serious thought, excepting I felt sure immersion was right. I began to

think seriously about the subject of whether or not one could be lost after being saved. One day I was ironing and studying deeply on that subject. Praise God, my Saviour knew I was honest, and used the little that I knew about the Bible to reveal light to me. The parable of the Ten Virgins came to my mind. They all had their light burning at once but five of them did not do their duty and did not get in. It appeared to me that they had all been saved, for their lamps were all burning, but five lamps went out and they were lost. From that day on that subject was settled with me. Many other Scriptures in the Bible plainly show that we have to live true to God after we are saved or we will be lost. "He that endureth to the end shall be saved." My mother was very much disturbed when she learned what the Lord had taught me on that. In a few years a minister came to the Methodist church and held a revival. He preached two works of grace, which the Baptists did not teach. They had a good revival and a number were saved and others sanctified, including my father and uncle, S. J. and J. T. Fortner (Some who read this know J. T. for he was a preacher for many years). After this, Father, Mother, and Uncle Tom Fortner and wife joined this Methodist denomination. In about a year I joined it.

In a few years we received light on the oneness of God's people and the true name of the church being "the Church of God." In 1909 I heard the first sermon on the Church of God. The dear Lord knew I wanted the truth, and He brought it to me. I got in touch with Bro. and Sis. D. A. Gibson through Bro. Pruitt, and we corresponded for awhile. THE CHURCH'S ONE FOUNDATION

January 5, 1958

Matt. 16:13. When Jesus came into the coasts of Caesarea Philippi, he asked his disciples, saying, Whom do men say that I the Son of man am?

- 14. And they said, Some say that thou art John the Baptist: some, Elias; and others, Jeremias, or one of the prophets.
- 15. He saith unto them, But whom say ye that I am?
- 16. And Simon Peter answered and said, Thou art the Christ, the Son of the living God.
- 17. And Jesus answered and said unto him, Blessed art thou, Simon Barjona: for flesh and blood hath not revealed it unto thee, but my Father which is in heaven.
- 18. And I say also unto thee, That thou art Peter, and upon this rock I will build my church; and the gates of hell shall not prevail against it.
- 19. And I will give unto thee the keys of the kingdom of heaven: and whatsoever thou shalt bind on earth shalt be bound in heaven; and whatsoever thou shalt loose on earth shalt be loosed in heaven.

Ephesians 2:19. Now therefore ye are no more strangers and foreigners, but fellow-citizens with the saints, and of the household of God;

- 20. And are built upon the foundation of the apostles, and prophets, Jesus Christ himself being the chief corner stone:

Memory Verse: He is the head of the body, the church: who is the beginning, the firstborn from the dead; that in all things he might have the preeminence. Colossians 1:18.

Practical Truth: The basis of the existence of Christians as a distinct group is their acceptance of Jesus of Nazareth as the Messiah and Son of God.

COMMENTS AND APPLICATION

Our lessons this quarter will be on the New Testament teachings about the church.

God, through the Spirit, revealed to Peter a precious truth that was contrary to the popular belief of that day. The church of God was built upon that truth which he uttered—and thank God, the gates of hell cannot prevail against God's church. It is founded upon a foundation, Jesus Christ. Paul teaches us, "other foundation can no man lay than that is laid, which is Jesus Christ" (1 Cor. 3:11).

It is sad to know that many in the world think the church is built on Peter. They do not understand that in the Aramic language, in which this was written, "Peter" and "rock" mean exactly the same. Jesus gave Peter this name (John 1:42) and he used an earthly thing to bring out a heavenly truth, which was his custom.

The keys of the kingdom of heaven are the authority God gave to the apostles to bind (forbid) or loose (allow) mankind on earth. Those keys are written in the Bible. Here Jesus gave that authority to Peter and to all the apostles in Matt. 18:18. We should obey God's Word given to us through His apostles or we will be bound on earth and in heaven.

The whole body of believers are fitly framed into the building of God which is the dwelling place of God through the Spirit.

THE SOURCE OF THE CHURCH'S POWER

January 12, 1958

Acts 1:4. And, being assembled together with them, commanded them that they should not depart from Jerusalem, but wait for the promise of the Father, which, saith he, ye have heard of me.

- 5. For John truly baptized with water; but ye shall be baptized with the Holy Ghost not many days hence.
- 6. When they therefore were come together, they asked of him, saying, Lord, wilt thou at this time restore again the kingdom to Israel?
- 7. And he said unto them, It is not for you to know the time or the seasons, which the Father hath put in his own power.
- 8. But ye shall receive power, after that the Holy Ghost is come upon you: and ye shall be witnesses unto me both in Jerusalem, and in all Judaea, and in Samaria, and unto the uttermost part of the earth.
- 2:1. And when the day of Pentecost was fully come, they were all with one accord in one place.
- 2. And suddenly there came a sound from heaven as of a rushing mighty wind, and it filled all the house where they were sitting.
- 3. And there appeared unto them cloven tongues like as of fire, and it sat upon each of them.
- 4. And they were all filled with the Holy Ghost, and began to speak with other tongues, as the Spirit gave them utterance.
- 5. And there were dwelling at Jerusalem Jews, devout men, out of every nation under heaven.
- 6. Now when this was noised abroad, the multitude came together, and were confounded, because that every man heard them speak in his own language.
- 7. And they were all amazed and marvelled, saying one to another, Behold, are not all these which speak Galileans?

- 8. And how hear we every man in our own tongue, wherein we were born?
- 9. Parthians, and Medes, and Elamites, and the dwellers in Mesopotamia, and in Judaea, and Capadocia, in Pontus. and Asia.
- 10. Phrygia, and Pamphylia, in Egypt, and in the parts of Libya about Cyrene, and strangers of Rome, Jews and proselytes,
- 11. Cretes and Arabians, we do hear them speak in our tongues the wonderful works of God.

Memory Verse: But ye shall receive power, after that the Holy Ghost is come upon you: and ye shall be witnesses unto me both in Jerusalem and in all Judaea, and Samaria, and unto the uttermost part of the earth. Acts 1:8.

Practical Truth: The source of the church's power always has been and still is the Spirit of God.

COMMENTS AND APPLICATION

The day of Pentecost was a feast that was kept in commemoration of the law that was given on Mt. Siani. Then the law was written on the tables of stone; but, praise the Lord, since the Holy Spirit came it is written on the fleshly tables of our hearts.

Acts 1:3 reads that Jesus was seen forty days of the disciples. He was in the tomb three days, therefore the disciples of Jesus waited in the upper room seven days, since there were fifty days between the Passover feast and Pentecost.

While Jesus was here on earth, he gathered together those who would constitute His church. He told them to tarry in Jerusalem until they were baptized with the Holy Ghost who would give them power to be witnesses for Him. This was prophesied by Malachi in the third chapter, first verse: "The Lord whom ye seek shall suddenly come to his temple."

On the day of Pentecost the Church of God was set in motion; and, thank God, it has been going since that time. The government is upon His shoulders and the Holy Spirit is placing each "lively stone" in the building as it pleases God. If we will work in our places and move as the Holy Spirit moves upon us, God's Word will reach many souls and be profitable to them.

We notice that there were seventeen nations represented. God wanted all the world to hear of the coming of the Holy Spirit. God, in a miraculous way, caused all to understand the message in their own language.

- 8. Now I say that Jesus Christ was a minister of the circumcision for the truth of God, to confirm the promises made unto the fathers:
- 9. And that the Gentiles might glorify God for his mercy.

Memory Verse: And be ye kind one to another, tenderhearted, forgiving one another, even as God for Christ's sake hath forgiven you. Eph. 4:32.

Practical Truth: Real fellowship should always characterize the children of God and be especially prominent in every local church.

COMMENTS AND APPLICATION

What a large happy family of believers that were meeting together glorifying God! The love of God that knit their hearts together, was flowing in fellowship from one to the other. What a concern was wrought in their hearts for each others' temporal necessities. Those who had plenty were anxious that their brother in need was supplied. They were fulfilling the Scripture which says, "Do good to all men, especially unto them who are of the household of faith." (Gal. 6:10.)

We see manifested here that "first love." How important it is that we keep that "first love" in our hearts and lives. This great congregation showed it in their deeds and lives. There is a contrast in another congregation mentioned in Rev. 2:1-7. God said of them: "I have somewhat against thee, because thou hast left thy first love."

The latter part of the lesson brings out the thought of working together harmoniously. We are to "bear the infirmities of the weak." We are to bear with their failings. We are to please cur neighbor only in those things that are good for his edification or to the upbuilding of the work of God in the world. We are not to be guilty of being "men pleasers" which Paul condemns in Gal. 1:10. We are to "with one mind and one mouth glorify God."

HOLY SPIRIT ORGANIZATION

January 26, 1958

Printed Portion:Romans 12:3-8; 1 Tim. 3:1-10.

Rom. 12:3. For 1 say, through the grace given unto me, to every man that is among you, not to think of himself more highly than he ought to think; but to think soberly, according as God hath dealt to every man the measure of faith.

4. For as we have many members in one body, and all members have not the same office:

- 5. So we, being many, are one body in Christ, and every one members one of another.
- 6. Having then gifts differing according to the grace that is given to us, whether prophecy, let us prophecy according to the proportion of faith;
- 7. Or ministry, let us wait on our ministering: or he that teacheth, on teaching;
- 8. Or he that exhorteth, on exhortation: he that giveth, let him do it with simplicity; he that ruleth, with diligence; he that sheweth mercy with cheerfulness.
- 1 Tim. 3:1. This is a true saying, If a man desire the office of a bishop, he desireth a good work.
- 2. A bishop then must be blameless, the husband of one wife, vigilant, sober, of good behaviour, given to hospitality, apt to teach;
- 3. Not given to wine, no striker, not greedy of filthy lucre; but patient, not a brawler, not covetous;
- 4. One that ruleth well his own house, having his children in subjection with all gravity;
- 5. (For if a man know not how to rule his own house, how shall he take care of the church of God?)
- 6. Not a novice, lest being lifted up with pride he fall into the condemnation of the devil.
- 7. Moreover he must have a good report of them which are without; lest he fall into reproach and the snare of the devil.
- 8. Likewise must the deacons be grave, not double-tongued, not given to much wine, not greedy of filthy lucre;
- 9. Holding the mystery of the faith in a pure conscience.
- 10. And let these also first be proved; then let them use the office of a deacen, being found blameless.

Memory Verse: Take heed therefore unto yourselves, and to all the flock over the which the Holy Ghost hath made you overseers, to feed the church of God, which he hath purchased with his own blood. Acts 20:28.

Practical Truth: Every congregation of the church should be Biblically organized by the Holy Spirit to meet its practical needs.

COMMENTS AND APPLICATION

We are glad that in the Church of God the Holy Spirit places each one in the body as it pleases Him. Our lesson compares the body of Christ to the human body, showing us that as each one works in the place God puts him, all will function properly. I am glad that the "government is on His shoulders." (Isa. 9:6). Man does not have any part in this. As we make room for the gifts of others, all will be well. In our lesson a number of the gifts are enumerated. It is precious to find our place in the body of Christ and work there. Great joy and peace will fill our souls as we stay in the center of God's will. Do not be troubled that others do not share your burden with you in the work God has called you to do. God has given them a burden for another phase of His work, and not yours; yet we must all encourage one another.

An elder, or leader, in a congregation has a big responsibility, and he (or she) should not take it lightly. It is a delicate work and he must know how to work with others. This requires much humility and being willing to be a servant of all. The elder must be an example, not violent nor contentious, managing his own household well with children under subjection. He must not be a new convert, but a tested person and established in doctrine. He must have a good report of outsiders, so they can be won for Christ.
