It is a biblical fact that God often punishes men for their sins and wrong-doings while they live upon the earth with the hope that they will receive correction and let their hearts be tendered toward God, to love Him more, or better. This truth spoken here is certainly true with every individual today, regardless of what false prophets teach. Every saved soul will do well to hearken unto this teaching.

God does not agree with sin in your life in any form. He does not look upon sin with any degree of favor. He hated sin so much that he gave his only begotten Son to the smiters and they heaped reproach upon him and so abused him that it seemed he was a man accursed and smitten of God. But the Scripture says that, "He was wounded for our transgressions, he was bruised for our iniquities: the chastisement of our peace was upon him; and with his stripes we are healed." Isaiah 53:5. God allowed His Son to suffer all this abuse for others, even for us that we might have peace and favor with God our Father.

Before the flood God's anger was kindled against the people for we read in Genesis the 6th chapter and the 5th verse, "And God saw that the wickedness of man was great in the earth, and that every imagination of the thoughts of his heart was only evil continually." God was sorry that he had created man and it grieved him at heart. Because of their sins and iniquities he sent a flood upon the earth and destroyed all but eight souls.

Sodom and Gomorrah were wicked cities and were filled with violence, evil, pride, and fleshly lusts until God sent fire down from heaven and destroyed them. When a nation was arrayed against Israel with a large army, God fought for His people by causing large hailstones to fall upon them, killing many, and drove them out of the country. Thus God proves that He is an avenger of His people. In Amos the 3rd chapter we read in the 6th verse where God asks a question in this way, "Shall there be evil in a city, and the Lord hath not done it?"

King Herod had James killed with the sword, and had caught Peter planning to kill him, but God worked a miracle and delivered Peter out of his hand. Herod went down to another part of his country and made an oration to the people taking glory to himself, and God sent His angel and smote him. He was eaten of worms and died. In Eccl. the 8th chapter and the 11th verse we read, "Because sentence against an evil work is not executed speedily, therefore the heart of the sons of men is fully set in them to do evil." While God is merciful and longsuffering with man, yet there is an end and He will often use drastic measures to come upon some which will either cause them to soften their heart and quit wrong doing or will harden them and bring death.

Lately Oklahoma has been visited with tornadoes in different places and much property has been destroyed, houses demolished, and some persons killed and many others wounded or maimed for life. No doubt many of those who were in those tornadoes or close by would have a question in their minds which would be, "WHY, why, has such things taken place?" God no doubt allowed these things for different and varied reasons. They may have become careless and indifferent about attending meeting and prayer services or they may not have gone to meeting at all. Maybe they are not loving or serving the Lord. They may have had the devil's worldly television in their homes with all of its soul poison and dope, and by having the tail sticking up from their home they gave reason to be classed as one of the world, and in that way ever associated with the enemies' crowd. The world is the enemy of God.

Luke 13:2, 3 reads,"And Jesus answering said unto them. Suppose ve that these Galilaeans were sinners above all the Galilaeans, because they suffered such things? I tell you, Nay: but, except ye repent, ye shall all likewise perish." Here we can see plainly that God did not allow these men to be treated with evil because they were greater sinners than others around them, but as an example of his anger against sin so that others would take warning and repent of their wrong doings. It is just and upright with God to deal with His created beings as He pleases. He has a right to make alive and He has a right to kill. All of His dealings with mankind are justly, honestly, and uprightly done. Not one of His created beings has a right to complain or murmur against God. As poor earthly creatures, we should beg and entreat Him to have mercy and pity on us and to keep us from all the sins in the world that we might be a pleasure in His hand. He has created us for His pleasure and for His glory. He will cause us to be just and upright if we will continually yield ourselves into His hands without grudge or murmur.

Because of Israel's sins God ceased to let the rain fall upon the earth in answer to Elijah's prayer. Then He sent rain after three years and six months when Elijah prayed for the rain to fall. In Isaiah 30:30 we read, "And the Lord shall cause his glorious voice to be heard, and shall shew the lighting down of his arm, with the indignation of his anger, and with

the flame of a devouring fire, with scattering, and tempest, and hailstones." When the disciples were on the sea and the wind arose in a violent manner. the ship was in danger of being sunk, but the Lord spoke to the wind and the waves, and there was a great calm. The Lord has power to send disastrous storms and He can also still the storm until there is a great calm. In Amos 4:13 we read, "For, lo, he that formeth the mountains, and createth the wind, and declareth unto man what is his thought, that maketh the morning darkness, and treadeth upon the high places of the earth, The Lord, The God of hosts, is his name." Read all of the 4th chapter of Amos and see what God is like and the power He has to do good, or cause destruction. Oh, that men would fear God and thereby begin to have real wisdom from above! In Isaiah 29:6 we read again. "Thou shalt be visited of the Lord of hosts with thunder, and with earthquakes, and great noise, with storm and tempest, and the flame of devouring fire."

We read in 2 Chron. 7:14, thus: "If my people, which are called by my name, shall humble themselves, and pray, and seek my face, and turn from their wicked ways; then will I hear from heaven, and will forgive their sin, and will heal their land." Repentance does not only include confessing your sins, but it also means a turning away from them forever. In Micah 6:8 we read, "He hath shewed thee, O man, what is good; and what doth the Lord require of thee, but to do justly, and to love mercy, and to walk humbly with thy God?" Men should search their hearts in the light of God's Word and become obedient in word and deed. Flee from the high and lofty, the proud, haughty, vulgarly dressed or undressed worldly-minded, and Christ-rejecting people, and measure your life, ways, and deeds to harmonize with the teachings of God's Word, bear the reproach of the cross in this world, and wear a crown in the world to come which Peter says will never fade away. God resists the proud but giveth grace to the humble. Humble yourself down to walk with God in this world of sinners and He will receive you in that great Judgment Day. The Apostle John says, "And we know that we are of God, and the whole world lieth in wickedness." We know that the world is in a pitiful state at this present time. It looks upon the saints of God as a very peculiar people, and ofttimes refers to them as ignorant fanatics to justify itself in its worldly, unrighteous ways. In 1 Peter 2:9 we read, "But ye are a chosen generation, a royal priesthood, a holy nation, a peculiar people; that ye should shew forth the praises of him who hath called you out of darkness into HIS MARVELOUS LIGHT." Let each one of us see that we walk in His light and obey His Word -Fred Pruitt. that it may be well with us.

Editorials

There are many that run well for a season, but when the thorns of life come their way they begin to faint and lose their zeal for God and His cause. Many Christian experiences start out good. o-o-o-o-o TESTIMONY OF A PRISONER

When I found myself behind bars one thought overpowered me, and that was to take my own life by the most effectual means that could be found in the penal institution. I ground up glass and beat it up in water and took it. I felt some glass stay between my teeth and I pushed them in with my finger and took more water. I wouldn't eat now, thinking that one who is going to die doesn't need to eat. I settled now to wait for death, when my intestines would rupture. After three or four days I realized that it hadn't taken effect. Then I took a solution that they used as disinfectant in the penal institution, but it didn't do anything to me.

A certain day when I was brought out to make a legal deposition I saw a new opportunity. Cautiously I approached the sergeant with the purpose of taking away his pistol and killing myself with it, but the sergeant noticed it, put his hand on the catch of the pistol, and

made me keep my distance. Then I realized indeed that I had failed, and that if I insisted, I would only succeed in getting a beating from them.

In these conditions I was found when an evangelist came, Bro. Federico Gonzalez, and I heard him preach the Word of God. I felt that a rush of light entered into my heart, and new thoughts came. I didn't know how to read or write, so that I only heard the preacher, but the preachings took place weekly and new purposes were found within me. I decided to deliver myself to the Judge of the universe, as King. I asked Him for pardon, and Christ pardoned me, for His sacrifice was for me, and for you, if thus, reader, you will do it.

Christ says: "Him that cometh unto me I will in no wise cast out." So then today I feel myself strengthened with the life of His Word. He says: "My word is life." Thus then I live in this new life with a great interest to console others with the comfort with which I have been comforted. Today, reader, my greatest desire is that you may accept Christ as your Saviour and your Healer. He says in Psalms 103:3: "Who forgiveth all thine iniquities: who healeth all thy diseases." What a heavy burden sin is, but the Lord has said to "cast upon me your burdens." If your sins are red like scarlet, they shall be white as snow. Thanks to God that I feel myself free from the burden which my weak body could no longer bear. Thus in His time my help came with great power.

In the prison I commenced to do the work. I distributed tracts, and I talked to others of the salvation which there is in Christ Jesus. On a certain day I felt in my heart that now they would give me my liberty, and it was so, for one day they called me to tell me that I was free. I was only to present myself to the judge in Obregon City. When I went to the judge he asked me to whom, and how much money I had given, to which I answered that I had delivered myself to Christ, and that He had done this. It is a difficult thing for a sentenced prisoner to be set free without completing his sentence or there being a bribe as a medium. So then I answered the judge that if they thought there was some mistake, to return me to the prison. The judge marvelled at how it was that I obtained my liberty without completing my sentence, nor paying a bribe. But I can answer like the blind man of the Bible, "I know not how it has been, but before I was blind, and now I see." So today, I only know that having been twice a captive, physically and spiritually, now I am free, free through the sacrifice of Christ, twice free. Christ says: "If the Son therefore shall make you free, ye shall be free indeed."

The power of God is so great for I, being a gambler and a drunkard with comparison, was transformed in heart by Christ so that now I only feel desires of doing His holy will. In that I used to run over the state looking for card playing, now I want to go over it speaking to souls of the marvel so great which the Lord has done for me. Glory to His name! Amen. —Ramon Valenzuela Maldonado.

Mich.—To all the saints and readers of this testimony, Greetings of love in Jesus' dear name. We feel it would be pleasing to our dear Lord to write our testimony of the gracious dealings of Him who died for us, and how He has worked in our behalf. Oh! what a wonderful Saviour! We have gone through some hard places, but the dear Lord came in time and delivered us out of the hands of man. Praise His blessed name forever!

Last summer sometime our daughter, Sister Aneita Corteway's children contacted a skin disease somewhere. We often wondered if it was an allergy or whether it was the Scabies. We have never known definitely of anyone contacting this disease from them, from the very beginning until now. My daughter and her husband finally took it also.

It was on the 2nd of Nov. when the children were sent home from school. Then on the 4th of Dec. our son-in-law received a letter from the Board of Education saying that Marvin, David, Sharon, and Jerry would have to be readmitted to school by the school nurse or doctor, as being free from any skin rash. If these conditions were not complied with by Dec. 14th, 1959, in regard to any or all of the children, they were notified that a petition would be filed in Juvinile Court alleging that the children were neglected children (as defined by the Juvenile code) because they were children "whose parents refused to provide medical care necessary for their health or well being." Of course they didn't know of the MIGHTY POWER OF GOD.

Soon after this they took the children to see a skin specialist. When this doctor first looked at it he called it an allergy then later said that he would swear in court that it was Scabies (a very contagious skin disease). Soon after this our son-in-law (Hubert Corteway) was examined by another skin doctor to see if he had Scabies also, and it was said that he did. Hubert reported to his place of work according to requirements and so lost his job for six weeks. All of us would like to say right now, how much we appreciated the earnest prayers of the saints and the letters of encouragement, and also the saints' help in a financial way. We surely thank God for His people. They are the best people on earth. Praise our God forever more!

Just before Hubert lost his job Bro. Gibson came to Kalamazoo to encourage and pray for them. We called Guthrie, Okla. for prayer at different times, and wrote out for prayer at different places. The condition began to get better. (David, who was in a terrible condition, made a great improvement.) Yet, they just didn't get complete victory. It was hard for us to understand for God had healed many, many times before of many things. God had performed some real outstanding miracles on our bodies in answer to prayer. But in all of this we believe the dear Lord had a purpose. We believe it was meant for our good and the good of others and that God wanted others to learn of this wonderful truth of the TRUE CHURCH OF GOD, who might never have heard of it otherwise.

Now a little later we went to the Court House and gave one of the court officers the paper which was the doctor's statement that they had Scabies. Our daughter told this fellow that they could take everything she had, her home, children, and ALL else she had in the world and she wouldn't fight back, but that she must OBEY GOD. She gave him scriptures to read showing him that we couldn't trust in physicians. While she was talking she began to cry and the Lord put a real message on her heart for that man's soul. He told her that even if she did convince him that she was right that he would have his job to do. Then 2 Chron. 16:12, and 13 were read to him.

Then a court summons was brought to the home, telling them to appear in Probate Court at a certain time. Jan. 15 was the day we went to court. They told us we could have a lawyer and a jury if we wanted to, but Aneita told them she had her case in God's hands. Then it was while we were in court that Aneita read some scriptures and made her stand for God known again. Dear ones, I want to tell you that our religious freedom is fast tighten-

ing up. Now when the Judge gave us the verdict that day in court he said he wouldn't expect Aneita to put medication on the children on account of her belief, so he said he would make the children temporary wards of the court. He said he felt it would be better to send them up to the contagious hospital ward until the doctor discharged them but that even then they wouldn't be allowed to go home to their parents until their parents got a written statement from a physician stating that they were also free from the Scabies. Oh! dear ones, this was a heart-rending scene.

When the doctor went to the hospital to examine the children he found David had improved a lot since he had last seen him. David told him that "we haven't done a thing; only trust the Lord." The dear Lord had performed miracles on their bodies before they ever got in that hospital. They were much better before they went there, praise our God! These children were not used to taking medicine and we believe this to be the cause of David's convulsion and both the other children were sick one night. The next night they told their mother they threw the pill away and that night they said they were not sick. One time the children were reading and praying before going to bed and the nurse came but let them finish with their worship before she put them to bed. It was encouraging to know those dear children were having their worship even if their mother wasn't there to tell them. Before these children were taken from their parents they were taught that some day the world might get so wicked that they might be even taken away from their parents, and that they needed to know how to find God and read and pray for themselves, because if this should happen, their Mama wouldn't be there to help them. So when this came to them, they knew what to do. It pays to teach the children how to pray, dear ones.

After the children were in the hospital around six or seven days the Judge sent for Aneita and Hubert to come to the court house for a preliminary hearing so they could also take Marvin (who had quit school) and the baby, Mark. After the first three children were in the hospital a little over a week they were released to us by the judge through answer to prayer. We did thank God for this.

Before the children left our home one night their mother and daddy came to see them and the mother took very sick and was in awful agony. We called the saints at Guthrie, Okla. and Seymour, Mo., for prayer and there were prayers here, too. God came to our rescue and wonderfully healed her. I believe it was almost instantly. What a mighty God we serve!

Now I think it was just before the last two children were released from the hospital that Hubert received word from his place of employment that if he didn't get back on his job at a certain date (within a few days), he would lose all of his priority that he had gained in 14 years. If they hired him again he would have to start right from the very beginning. But in order for him to get back on his job he had to have a written statement from a doctor proving that he didn't have Scabies. Both he and Aneita were examined but the doctor said that it was of her opinion that the dermatitis present was occupational and not due to Scabies. Yet Hubert's superintendent was not satisfied with this statement because the skin specialists had told him he had Scabies. More tests were taken. In five of these tests there was no evidence at all that he had had the Scabies, but in the sixth a burrow was found, but no Scabies. So, praise God, it looked like he had had it, but if he did the dear Lord had surely healed him in answer to prayer. Oh, dear ones, God is never too late and never too early. Hubert was permitted to go to work the next day and, praise God, he didn't lose any of his priority and even got his old job back. Oh, may we never forget what God has done for us in our time of need.

That evening we visited the judge at the court house and showed him the statement which had been approved by his superintendent at work. Amazed, the court officer said something like this: "Well, I believe you knew how it all was going to turn out any way, didn't you?" We felt that by that statement he knew that God had done all these wonderful things for us. The judge then turned over these precious children to their parents that evening without any strings attached. A letter from the judge that week released them completely. Oh, dear ones, we have such a compassionate Saviour. Don't be afraid to trust Him. JESUS NEVER FAILS.

We hope this testimony will help to encourage someone else to trust the dear Lord in time of need. One of my favorite scriptures is found in John 11:40. It says, "Jesus saith unto her, Said I not unto thee, that, if thou wouldest believe, thou shouldest see the glory of God?" This scripture has been an inspiration and encouragement to me many times. Neglected Children

The daily papers recently carried reports from the United Press revealing the improper conduct of young boys and girls whom their parents neglected in letting them go out at night without a chaperon. I quote from the Cleveland (Tenn.) Daily Banner, April 24, 1949:

"16 Boys and Girls Arrested in Raid."

This is the heading of one report. To shield all concerned all names are omitted. The report continues: "Sixteen boys and girls, picked up in a raid on a boisterous 'beer and bed' party, were charged with contributing to a disorderly house Saturday.

"The youngsters most of them teen-agers, spent Friday night in jail after a morals bureau raid" on a certain named apartment. "The raid ... was made after neighbors complained of a 'wild party.' Kids were all over the place, Sgt. Blank said. Some of them didn't stop drinking and necking while we were questioning them."

Another report reveals the following (The Cleveland, Tenn., Daily Banner, April 25, 1949):

"Youth Stabbed While Defending Girl Gains."

This is the heading of this report, which continues: "Police said today that an 18-year-old high school youth who suffered a slashed throat while defending his girl friend from an attacking man appeared to be recovering."

This report further reveals that the trouble occured as the teen-agers "were sitting" in the boy's "car on a lonely road" "Saturday night" some miles out of town.

Had this neglected young couple been sitting in a well-lighted parlor at the girl's home instead of being out "on a lonely road" "in the black and dark night" (Prov. 7:9), they would not have been attacked. But this reminds us that the Bible says some "loved darkness rather than light, because their deeds were evil." John 3:19.

In these reports all the children involved had evidently been sadly neglected, for the Bible says, "The curse causeless shall not come." See Eph. 6:4; Prov. 26:2.

This truth is demonstrated in Joseph's life, for when he grew up to manhood and was tempted by a warm blooded woman, he did not depart from his early training and yield to his tempter. Read Gen. 39:7; Prov. 22:6; 1:10.

Dear young people who read this, though you may have been neglected in proper instruction and training, let me beg of you to give your heart and life to God "in the days of thy youth" (Eccl. 12:1), and confess and forsake all known sins. See Prov. 28:13. Live a clean life and determine that you will come to your marriage when matured as "pure" as a lily. See 2 Cor. 11:2. Shun bad company for "evil companionships corrupt good morals." 1 Cor. 15:33, Weymouth's trans.

A 17-year-old high school senior in Panama City, Florida. named C— W— was reported by newspapers that he was arrested on the night of Sept. 16, 1958, while prying a hub cap off a parked automobile. He boasted that he held the world's record for stealing automobiles hub caps, and said that "he collected some 3,000 last year (1957), and that his record for one night was 187." Where were his parents while this was going on? Would you call him a neglected child? Parents wake up! Children take heed!

Many parents would do well to see that their young boys and girls are in the right company and are protected from temptation needlessly. Just remember, darkness is a cover-up for the devil's work.

COMMENTS AND APPLICATION

Many heartaches, tears, and much sorrow in this world would be banished if everyone would observe the golden rule. When summing up any condition that arises and an opinion or an attitude is adopted, first ask yourself the question, "What attitude or opinion would I want a person to have if I were in the same condition?" Oh, I'm sure much mercy and love would enter into the conclusion. The judgment that Jesus is speaking of is not righteous judgment which is allowed in John 7:24. Even righteous judgment that is given must be in a spirit of forbearance and tenderness. The judgment that is refered to in our lesson is the tendency to condemn others before all facts are known. Some people are very strict on others on some lines, yet in their own lives there are things they do or say that is just as bad in comparison. This is unjust judgment. Some unjustly condemn others or criticise them to try to cover up something in their life or to try to elevate themselves. They are trying to pick out a mote or a speck or small splinter out of their brother's life when they have a beam (a log beam of a house) in their own life. How foolish that is. Jesus says "with what measure ye mete, it shall be measured to you again" in the last day. One told another, "Be hard on yourself and easy on others."

Verse six. We should not make known our most precious intimate spiritual experiences with those who would

scoff.

The promise to "ask, seek, and knock, and it shall be given you," is if you do not "ask amiss." James 4:3.

Practical Truth: Repentance and a disciplined life are necessary to win God's approval.

COMMENTS AND APPLICATION

There are only two ways in our life from which to choose. It is up to us if we choose the right way or the wrong way. Each of us must make a decision. No one can make it for us. This is a personal matter. If we choose the right way, which is the narrow way of holiness, humility, and love, it will lead us to heaven. But if we choose the broad way, which is easy, alluring, and many follow it, it will lead us to damnation. There are few finding the right way, the narrow way, because they do not want to take the way that means self-denial and cross-bearing.

The prodigal son began his step down by refusing to have parental restraint. The next mistake was leaving home. He fell into bad company and wasted his money. He sinned grievously. He was reduced to starvation. When a sinner realizes his true condition as a sinner, lost and doomed for damnation, then he can begin to search for a way out. The prodigal began to realize this and he said, "I will arise." He began to do something about it. He went home and humbly confessed his sins and his father joyously received him. In this story we see how the son went into deep sin. We note the mistake he made by choosing the broad way and the end of it. Bright lights, barmaids, dancing, and shallow friends did not satisfy his soul. He came to a decision to choose the narrow way, the humble way, and it brought him happiness. Have you made the right decision?

BEARING GOOD FRUITS

Printed Portion Matt. 7:15-23; Luke 13:6-9

Matt. 7:15. Beware of false prophets, which come to you in sheep's clothing, but inwardly they are ravening wolves.

16. Ye shall know them by their fruits. Do men gather grapes of thorns, or figs of thistles?

- 17. Even so every good tree bringeth forth good fruit; but a corrupt tree bringeth forth evil fruit.
- 18. A good tree cannot bring forth evil fruit, neither can a corrupt tree bring forth good fruit.
- 19. Every tree that bringeth not forth good fruit is hewn down, and cast into the fire.
 - 20. Wherefore by their fruits ye shall know them.

21. Not every one that saith unto me, Lord, Lord, shall enter into the kingdom of heaven; but he that doeth the will of my Father which is in heaven.

22. Many will say to me in that day, Lord, Lord, have we not prophesied in thy name? and in thy name have cast out devils? and in thy name done many wonderful works?

23. And then will I profess unto them, I never knew you: depart from me, ye that work iniquity.

Luke 13:6. He spake also this parable; A certain man had a fig tree planted in his vineyard; and he came and sought fruit thereon, and found none.

- 7. Then said he unto the dresser of his vineyard, Behold, these three years I come seeking fruit on this fig tree, and find none: cut it down; why cumbereth it the ground?
- 8. And he answering said unto him, Lord, let it alone this year also, till I shall dig about it, and dung it:
- 9. And if it bear fruit, well: and if not, then after that thou shalt cut it down.

Memory Verse: Abide in me, and I in you. As the branch cannot bear fruit of itself, except it abide in the vine; no more can ye, except ye abide in me. John 15:4.

Practical Truth: The kind of fruits which are produced by our lives show whether we are true followers of Christ or not.

COMMENTS AND APPLICATION

We are to "try the spirits, whether they are of God." There are many false prophets gone out into the world. They are claiming to bring messages from God and working under His power, "for they are the spirits of devils, working miracles, which go forth unto the kings of the earth." Rev. 16:14. We are to beware of them. They are corrupt and bring forth evil fruit. By their fruit you will know them. They are wicked at heart and are intent on injuring others to advance their own interests. At the last great day they and those who follow them will be cast into hell.

We are a planting of the Lord. He looks into our lives to see if we are bearing fruit for Him, and if the fruit of the Spirit is working in our lives to His profit. God is long-suffering and bears long. In the parable, He looked three years for fruit. When finding none he told the dresser (Jesus) to cut the tree (us) down, but Jesus begged for mercy. Using our own language we find him saying, "Let me send some hard things their way. Maybe they will pray more earnestly and when I help them they will then live a careful life and bring forth fruit." God gives permission for this to happen but yet he warns if we do not bear fruit after this we will be cut off. Are you in your third year? Are you fruitless? Maybe you are in your fourth year. Hard things have come. Let this be a warning to let it work for your spiritual good, or you will be cut off.

Practical Truth: It is of the highest importance that everyone who has the opportunity to know Christ's teachings should heed them and obey the commands which they contain.

COMMENTS AND APPLICATION

Our lesson is the closing instruction given in the sermon on the mount. Jesus warns all of us what will happen if we disregard the previous words. "Heaven and earth shall pass away, but my words shall not pass away." We will meet them when this old world is on fire. If we have obeyed them it will mean life eternal, but if we have rejected them it means hell fire.

He likens those who hear and obey to the man who builds on a strong foundation. We should have Jesus in our hearts and a love for His ways and His principles. This is the wise way of life. It has been said, "What no man would be fool enough to do with a house, many a man does in matters of true religion." Only those who do the will of God will abide eternally with God.

The rain, floods, and winds are the troubles, problems, and trials of life which are common to both saint and sinner. Those who build on God will stand; but those who build on the sandy, earthly foundations, will fail, and great will be that fall. It pays to be the Lord's child, and obey His words.

The last parable was written to the self-righteous Pharisees and Saducees who gave much lip service to God by saying, "Yes, yes," but did not do. They were like the second son. The first son was the publicans and harlots who repented of their refusals to accept Jesus. Jesus did not commend either class, yet those who repented were accepted.
