The Book of Life

On the Isle of Patmos, John wrote the things that God revealed to him in visions. He said he was "in the Spirit on the Lord's day." God let him see the end of time, and he said, "I saw a great white throne, and him that sat on it, from whose face the earth and the heaven fled away; and there was found

no place for them. And I saw the dead, small and great, stand before God; and the books were opened: and another book was opened, which is the BOOK OF LIFE: and the dead were judged out of those things which were written in the books, according to their works. And the sea gave up the dead which were in it; and death and hell delivered up the dead which were in them: and they were judged every man according to their works. And death and hell were cast into the lake of fire. This is the second death. And whosoever was not found written in the BOOK OF LIFE was cast into the lake of fire." Rev. 20:11-15.

What a solemn scene to behold, yet a terrible reality for those whose names are not written in the BOOK OF LIFE! Surely, it behooves each one of us to be sure that our names are in the book of life. FULL REDEMPTION

The authors of the dictionaries define the word "redemption" as "the act of deliverance, release, repurchase," etc. The redemption through Christ is the deliverance or repurchase of man. Man in his original, primeval state enjoyed unity and an affinity with God. Because of transgression on the part of man this natural agreement between God and man was destroyed. All creation—herb and tree, beast and fowl, and man—was pronounced very good by the Creator as he beheld it in review after creation. Gen. 1:29-31.

But because of Eden's sin the very nature of all things became changed. The ground became cursed, and thorns and thistles sprang up. Gen. 3:17, 18. The nature of the beast creation, no doubt, became affected by man's transgression. Gen. 6:7, 11-13. The transgression in Eden was the entrance of sin into this world. Rom. 5:12. Previous to this, all in the world was sinless and harmony, and the earth itself uncursed by thorns and thistles. By the entrance of sin man's nature became changed, and since the nature of man became depraved there has not been a single individual born of the flesh but has possessed a depraved nature, except the child conceived by the Holy Spirit. The Psalmist says: "Behold, I was shapen in iniquity, and in sin did my mother conceive me." Psa. 51:5.

This same condition is true of every child. The nature of the child in its formation in the womb is

depraved. The moral condition of the parents may modify to an extent, but never wholly change that nature. The child does not inherit a depraved nature from its parents. It is not because the parents are deprayed that the child is conceived in sin, but because nature is deprayed. It required a supernatural conception to beget a pure child, everything in nature being depraved. The child does not inherit either physical or moral image directly from its parents. It is true the child generally bears a marked resemblance to the parent, both physically and morally, but on the whole it is born in the image of Adam, morally and physically. It is generally the case that if a parent have three arms, or possess but one, his offspring will have two, receiving its physical image from the first created man. Should the parents be holy, the child will possess a carnal nature, because it is the nature of all the race.

How holy parents beget children depraved in nature is a puzzling problem to some minds, especially to those who are busying themselves about the intricate matters of God. This need be no more puzzling than a deformed parent begetting perfectly formed children. Nature, in embryo, begins its work of forming both the physical and moral image of the child, which is after the similitude of the original parents and not the immediate ones. While justification, which is the forgiveness of actual transgression, the inevitable result of a depraved nature, is a wonderful and glorious achievement of grace, it is but a very small part of the redemption of Christ. The supernatural overthrow of the depraved nature by the power of the Holy Spirit is the principal and real redemptive work. The pardon of committed sins is the clearing away of the rubbish, or preparation work, for the Third Person in the Holy Trinity to effect a revolution in the nature of man. Hallelujah to God! This change in nature is more wonderful than the revolting of nature at the command of Joshua. Man now, instead of being depraved in nature, is restored to his original holy nature.

This destruction of the carnal nature and the restoration of the original nature is accomplished by the Holy Spirit at the moment of His reception as an indwelling Comforter. Peter teaches this truth when he says: "God, which knoweth the hearts [or nature], bare them witness, giving them the Holy Ghost, even as he did unto us [at Pentecost]; and put no difference between us and them [Gentiles], purifying their hearts by faith." Acts 15:8, 9. Purifying the heart is the purification of man's affections, or nature. This is accomplished at the time of the giving of the Holy Ghost as declared in the last text: and this purifying of the hearts of the Gentiles at the giving of the Holy Ghost, is just what was done for the apostles at Pentecost. This is a plain, undeniable fact taught in this text. To turn to philosophizing upon how we can be conceived with a carnal nature, or how we can be converted and yet be depraved in nature, is to soon become spoiled through vain deceit after the rudiments of the world and not after Christ. Col. 2:8. In the very nature of things, and according to the Word of God, pardon of sins necessarily precedes the destruction of the carnal, depraved nature by the Holy Spirit. In the fall of man there was the act of transgression and also a change in man's moral image. In his restoration there must be a pardon of transgression and subsequently a change in nature.

It is a law of God that the redemption of man be accomplished through faith by His grace. Our faith can not reach beyond our knowledge. By knowledge we mean a real soul-consciousness or conviction, and not an intellectual knowledge. At this point many a dear soul has erred from the truth. They have endeavored to bring their faith up to their intellectual knowledge, which ends in presumption. True Bible faith is grounded in the soul. It results from a soul-knowledge, or conviction. To accept pardon of sins or healing of the body with only an intellectual knowledge of these blessings and not a real heartconviction is mere presumption, and ends in failure and disgrace. To follow the comprehensions of the intellect, and not the enlightenment of the Holy Spirit upon the soul concerning the mysteries of God's salvation, is to be led into error, because the intellect can not fathom the things of God. We do now emphatically say, according to God's established law, that no unregenerated heart can have a comprehension or conviction of a corrupt moral nature and its purification. Why? Because transgression stands between it and purity. The awakened guilty soul knows nothing but its guilt, and for forgiveness only does it plead. After being pardoned, the soul gains knowledge of carnality, and it is then convicted for the second cleansing.

Those who believe that purity of heart is attained in pardon take as a basis of such belief the language of Paul in 2 Cor. 5:17; Rom. 8:1-7 and similar texts. Now the apostle often speaks of full salvation, or complete redemption of the soul, in a general way. He says that "salvation is by the grace of God through faith." By this he does not mean justification only, but sanctification as well. He has not specified the two works, but has spoken of full salvation in a general way of being by grace through faith. Thus Eph. 2:8-10 includes full salvation. In 2 Cor. 5:17 he again speaks of full salvation in a general way. It is true we are in Christ when converted, but we are none the less in Him when sanctified. To say that Paul is referring to the justified only in this text is an error. By the two preceding verses we have reason to believe he is referring to those who are wholly sanctified. This then is no proof text that carnality is destroyed in justification, because you can not prove that he is referring to those who are only justified.

In conclusion we would say that Christ came to redeem man only. Beast and bird have no part in the redemption. They shall perish. The earth is not redeemable, but being under curse—spotted by sin—it shall be destroyed. —From "The Gospel Day," 1904

Editorials

In the 1961 March issue of the Faith and Victory paper appeared an article written by Lawrence D. Pruitt entitled, "Eighty Years in the Evening Light." This article, a brief history of the Reformation work, was appreciated and some have written us asking for it to be put in tract form. That the spiritual Body of Christ, the Church of God, which is now functioning in this world, is a Christ-filled, spiritual institution, separate and distinct from all humanly-organized institutions called churches, is clearly taught in the Scriptures. There are many scriptures which testify to this fact. Let us here at the beginning of this writing insert one scripture which makes this truth an established fact. Let us read 1 Peter 2:2-4, "As newborn babes, desire the sincere milk of the word, that ye may grow thereby: If so be that ye have tasted that the Lord is gracious. To whom coming, as unto a living stone, disallowed indeed of men, but chosen of God and precious. Ye also as lively stones [born from above] are built up [by the Lord Himself] a spiritual house, an holy priesthood, to offer up spiritual sacrifices, acceptable to God by Jesus Christ."

That this heavenly-born people composing His Body, the Church, has an enemy to fight against while in this world is also taught in Ephesians 6:10-12, "Finally, my brethren, be strong in the Lord and in the power of his might. Put on the whole armour of God, that ye may be able to stand against the

wiles of the devil. For we wrestle not against flesh and blood [our warfare is spiritual in the ecclesi-astical heavens here in this world], but against principalities, against powers, against the rulers of the darkness of this world, against spiritual wickedness in high places." Our warfare is not carnal, for our sword is the Word of God and our shield is faith in God.

John the Revelator writes of the war which the saints in the early morning Church waged against paganism. In Rev. 12:11 he says, "And they overcame him by the blood of the Lamb and by the word of their testimony; and they loved not their lives unto the death." In that war the saints won the victory over paganism which had exalted itself to a supreme position over the souls of men. In their fighting the pagans used carnal weapons along with their Satanic spiritual power, but the saints, like Christ, did not use carnal weapons. They held up the shield of faith and wielded the Sword of the Spirit which is the Word of God. These spiritual weapons proved to be mighty in the pulling down of strongholds and uncovering their sandy foundations.

This spiritual battle of Armageddon, the conflict between good and evil, God and Satan, is raging in this "evening time" when we are living in the last of the last days. The battle will become more fierce as time moves on to the end and to Christ's coming. Let us notice what Isaiah the prophet says about this conflict. In Isaiah 9:5 we read, "For every battle of the warrior is with confused noise, and garments rolled in blood: But this [not literal war] shall be with burning and fuel of fire." This war in which we are engaged is not with literal weapons, but with the Holy Spirit fire and burning which just quietly burns the truth upon souls, causing them to lay down their carnal weapons and surrender to God.

In Malachi 4:1 we read what the prophet says of this day of the Lord, "For, behold, the day cometh that shall burn as an oven; and all the proud, yea, and all that do wickedly, shall be stubble: and the day that cometh shall burn them up, saith the Lord of hosts, that it shall leave them neither root nor branch." Read the next two verses. The third verse reads, "And ye shall tread down the wicked; for they shall be ashes under the soles of your feet in the day that I shall do this, saith the Lord of hosts."

The saints of God are fighting in a war today whose Captain is the Lord Jesus Christ—the King of kings and Lord of lords—and He will be the one who will conquer all His foes in the end. Although at times it seems that we suffer defeat because we are so few compared to the hosts of the enemy, yet He gives us the victory again and again, and will finally destroy our enemies with fire from heaven. In Rev. 20:9 we read, "And they went up on the breadth of the earth, and compassed the camp of the saints about, and the beloved city [the Church of God]: and fire came down from God out of heaven, and devoured them."

Let us take a look with John the Revelator and see what is going on at this present time in the ecclesiastical heavens. Rev. 19:11-15 reads, "And I saw heaven opened, and behold a white horse; and he that sat upon him was called Faithful and True [the Lord Jesus Christ], and in righteousness he doth judge and make war. His eyes were as a flame of fire, and on his head were many crowns; and he had a name written, that no man knew, but he himself. And he was clothed with a vesture dipped in blood: and his name is called The Word of God. And the armies which were in heaven followed him upon white horses [the sign of a conqueror], clothed in fine linen, white and clean [denoting the purity and cleanness of the saints]. And out of his mouth goeth a sharp sword [the Word of God], that with it he should smite the nations; and he shall rule them with a rod of iron: and he treadeth the winepress of the fierceness and wrath of Almighty God. And he hath on his vesture and on his thigh a name written, KING OF KINGS AND LORD OF LORDS."

Again the Church is portrayed in symbolic language in Rev. 12:1, "And there appeared a great wonder in heaven; a woman [the Church] clothed with the sun [Christ], and the moon [the Law age] under her feet, and upon her head a crown of twelve stars [the 12 apostles]."

In Rev. 19:17 we read, "And I saw an angel standing in the sun; and he [minister of God] cried with a loud voice, saying to all the fowls [evil spirits] that fly in the midst of heaven, Come and gather yourselves together unto the supper of the great God." The angel standing in the sun would no doubt symbolize a messenger in the Church, a minister of God who was girded about with the truth. When souls die spiritually they become food or supper for fowl or evil spirits to possess and use to fight against the real saints. Satan is inventing ways and means in these days by which he is slaving thousands and thousands of souls who once had heavenly life. The latest and most efficient tool he is using in these days is the television. Since he has succeeded in getting it into nearly all the so-called Christian homes in America and the world, he has slain millions of souls and, symbolically speaking, the blood is running to the "horses' bridles." Rev. 19:18 continues: "That ye may eat the flesh of kings, and the flesh of captains, and the flesh of mighty men, and the flesh of horses, and of them that sit on them, and the flesh of all men, both free and bond, both small and great. And I saw the beast [Catholicism] and the kings of the earth [not of heaven], and their armies [all evil powers], gathered together to make war against him that sat upon the horse, and against his army." Read to the end of the chapter and you will see that the beast and the false prophet that worked miracles to deceive the people were taken and cast alive into the lake of fire burning with brimstone. In Rev. 20:10 you can read of the similar fate of the devil, the old dragon which is paganism now exhibiting itself in the form of Communism.

Let us turn to Rev. 14:14 and see what is taking place now in the spiritual realm in this world: "And I looked, and behold a white cloud [purity, cleanness],

and upon the cloud one sat like unto the Son of man, having on his head a golden crown, and in his hand a sharp sickle." A sharp sickle will cut tough grass and weeds. The sharp sickle would represent the Word of God used with sharpness to slay Satan's tough characters and tear down his strongholds. The 15th verse continues: "And another angel came out of the temple, crying with a loud voice to him that sat on the cloud, Thrust in thy sickle and reap: for the time is come for thee to reap; for the harvest of the earth is ripe." Nearly all the world of people are turned against God and His holy flock, and they are ready to be destroyed. 16th verse: "And he that sat on the cloud thrust in his sickle on the earth, and the earth was reaped." Verses 17 to 20: "And another angel came out of the temple which is in heaven [ecclesiastical heaven], he also having a sharp sickle. And another angel came out from the altar, which had power over fire; and cried with a loud cry to him that had the sharp sickle, saying, Thrust in thy sickle, and gather the clusters of the vine [the false vines — humanly-organized churches] of the earth [not of heaven]; for her grapes are fully ripe. And the angel thrust in his sickle into the earth, and gathered the vine of the earth [false vines], and cast it into the great winepress of the wrath of God. And the winepress was trodden without the city [outside of the true Church of God], and the blood came out of the winepress, even unto the horse bridles, by the space of a thousand and six hundred furlongs."

Some religious people claim that there will be a literal battle of Armageddon where the slaughter will be so great that human blood will run to the horse bridles for miles around the fighting. Such a theory is preposterous and unbelievable. This is definitely symbolic language, and has reference to the great slaughter of souls which is taking place in the ecclesiastical heavens where the battle is raging—righteousness against wickedness. Souls who once had light and truth are being slain by the Word of God, and the slaughter is so great in these last days that it is symbolized as blood running to the horse bridles.

The true ministers of God are doing a great work in the earth today, although it is not discerned by many it seems. But the work of God is going on just the same. They are not only gathering His people together unto the Lord for His coming, but also they are, at the same time, "gathering" many, yes, thousands upon thousands, into sectarian pens to be burned in the end. In our ministry we have seen people come to our meetings and hear the Word of God preached in its fullness and, instead of measuring up to the truth and taking the crucified way with the saints in light, they would go off and join some false, man-made sect. The false preachers would preach smooth things to them, wrest the scriptures and make them feel good in their sins-thereby easing their consciences. These humanly-organized institutions called churches are the gates of hell. When people with light and knowledge join up with them, they are bound there to be burned in the end.

The light and truth which is set forth and taught

in this paper is causing many, because they do not love the truth, to join up with sects in order to ease their conscience. The false preachers make them feel secure, but the end will be disappointment and misery in eternity.

Yes, my dear readers, the ministers in the evening light are doing a great work for God in the preparation of His coming, and no one can stay the Lord's hand of gathering the clusters of grapes for the wine-press of His wrath in these closing days.

Is Murmuring Sin?

Phil. 2:14 says, "Do all things without murmurings and disputings, that ye may be blameless and harmless the sons of God. . . . " Then to be the sons of God we must be blameless—without murmuring. So murmuring must be sin, for it is sin only that keeps us from being the sons of God.

There are other things which are in the same class as murmuring, such as complaining, grumbling, criticizing, fault-finding and no doubt many more. We need to guard against these things lest we be overtaken and fall into condemnation.

I wonder if those who murmur against and criticize the pastors, evangelists and ministers realize how serious their actions are? The Word of God says in Psa. 105:15, "Touch not mine anointed and do my prophets no harm." How can we destructively criticize the ministers and others, and still keep clear before God? We are again instructed in Hebrews 13: 17, "Obey them that have the rule [margin—guide the rule] over you and submit yourselves, for they watch for your souls. . . ." How can we respect God's anointed and at the same time hinder them by malicious criticism? It cannot be so. God help us. When we think they are not doing just right, let us start praying for them. I believe that would solve many problems.

Moses prayed for God to forgive the children of Israel for this sin of murmuring. The Apostle Paul warns us against murmuring in 1 Cor. 10:10, 11 in these words: "Neither murmur ye as some of them also murmured, and were destroyed of the destroyer. Now all these things happened unto them for ensamples: and they are written for our admonition. . ." Let us take warning from the sad experiences of the Israelites who murmured against Moses, whom God had chosen to be the leader of His people. Many were swallowed up in an earthquake and fire came from the temple and burned others, showing that the wrath of God was kindled against those who criticized and opposed their God-given leader. Neither will He tolerate the same sin today.

But thanks be unto God for His mercy and love to forgive us of these sins and to cleanse from all unrighteousness IF WE REPENT OF THEM. But sin, unrepented of, will keep us out of heaven.

The Better Financial System

Those who believe in paying tithes are ready to cry that if the tithing system be abolished there remains no scriptural financial system. But in this they mistake, like law-teachers generally concerning most matters. The Savior has given us a financial system in the gospel that is better by far than the system set forth in Moses' law.

Jesus' system is far superior to the Mosaic system as regards these matters; for He positively forbids the laying up of treasures on earth. "Lay not up for yourselves treasures upon earth, where moth and rust doth corrupt, and where thieves break through and steal." Matt. 6:19. "But God said unto him, Thou fool, this night thy soul shall be required of thee: then whose shall those things be which thou hast provided? So is he that layeth up treasure for himself, and is not rich toward God." Luke 12: 16-21. These texts set forth the sentiment of the entire New Testament. No jubilee is taught, nor any year of release; because none is needed. Jesus cuts off the necessity for either by striking at the very head of the evil, and forbidding the laying up of treasures on earth. In Luke 12:33, 34 He commanded, "Sell that ye have, and give alms; provide yourselves bags which wax not old, a treasure in the heavens that faileth not, where no thief approacheth, neither moth corrupteth. For where your treasure is, there will your heart be also." These teachings of Christ are very easily comprehended; for the command is to sell our superabundance of treasures and lay them up in heaven.

But some would ask, May we not lay up a great fortune for our children when we are gone? I answer, No: his teaching nowhere allows it. When he commanded us not to lay up treasures on earth he inserted no exceptional clause; so we are to understand it in its absolute sense. It is all right to do business and make money under the gospel; in fact, it is wrong not to exercise ourselves in that direction; for we are commanded to be "not slothful in business." Rom. 12:11. The apostle Paul sums up the legitimate objects of making money under the gospel under two heads, as follows:

First, to provide for our families. "But if any provide not for his own, and especially for those of his own house, he hath denied the faith, and is worse than an infidel." 1 Tim. 5:8. "For the children ought not to lay up for the parents, but the parents for the children." 2 Cor. 12:14. The latter text some hold to teach the hoarding up of wealth for our children after we are dead, but this is refuted by the context. Paul makes use of these words when speaking of his refusal of means from the hands of the Corinthians. This shows that the language refers only to the providing of necessary food and raiment for the children. If he had intended to teach the duty of laying up treasures for our descendants after our death, he would have enjoined a duty that many Christians could not perform.

Second, to have something to give to the needy. "Let him that stole steal no more: but rather let him labor, working with his hands the thing which is good, that he may have to give to him that needeth." Eph. 4:28. This would include the challenging needs of the gospel work at home and abroad.

John Wesley has beautifully set forth the financial system of the New Testament in his sermon on money, in which he maintained that we are required, first, to make all the money we can; second, to save all the money we can; third, to give all the money we can.

The New Testament financial system so far as pertains to the maintenance of ministers of the gospel is as follows: "The Lord hath ordained that they which preach the gospel shall live of the gospel." 1 Cor. 9:14. But they are not allowed to make any charges for their preaching. They are commanded inasmuch as they have freely received the gospel, to give it freely. Matt. 10:8. It must be delivered without charge. 1 Cor. 9:18. According to this, stipulated salaries are unscriptural. God's ministers are to trust the Lord fully for their living, and the Lord in answer to their prayers will move the people to bestow upon them free-will offerings sufficient for their support. God commands the laity to communicate (give) to the ministry of all good things for their support. Gal. 6:6. But they are not to be driven to this giving by taxation, but should be taught by the ministers to give cheerfully and from the good purpose of their hearts. 2 Cor. 9:7.

This is in truth a better financial system than that of the Old Testament. The Levitical priesthood under their system obtained their living by taxation; hence needed not to trust the Lord for it. Under the New Testament system God's ministers do not receive their living by taxation, but by faith in God. This gives them a chance to develop their faith, and thus make themselves more efficient as ministers of the gospel. The New Testament system also tends to keep the ministry pure; for except men are clear before God, they can not trust Him for their living.

The proper way to gather money in the church under the New Testament system is set forth in 1 Cor. 16:1, 2—"Now concerning the collection for the saints, as I have given order to the churches of Galatia, even so do ye. Upon the first day of the week let every one of you lay by him in store, as God hath prospered him, that there be no gatherings when I come." According to this text each local assembly should have a treasury established. A box or something of the kind should be provided, into which each Christian could place his liberalities every Lord's day. This may be stationed at the door or in any convenient place, and thus avoid the passing of baskets, etc., to the disgust of unbelievers.

COMMENTS AND APPLICATION

Our lessons for this quarter will be biographical studies. They will be about personalities of the New Testament. The quarter will begin with the study of Mary, the mother of our Lord. It was a wonderful thing for Mary to be chosen from all the virgins in that day to become the mother of Jesus, yet we do not believe as the Roman Catholics. They pray to her as though she were a substitute for Christ. They attempt to teach that there was no taint of sin about her. We do not believe this theory. She was one of the 120 on the day of Pentecost who received the cleansing and infilling of the Holy Spirit.

Teachings today try to do away with the virginity of Mary and her conception by the Holy Ghost, but our lesson gives ample proof that those teachings are false. The event of "espoused" or the betrothal usually preceded the marriage by a year. The engagement ceremony was the beginning of the marriage ceremony. A woman could not be put away during that period without a divorce. Mary had a legal husband when the announcement was made by Gabriel. It was hard for Mary to take it all in, but verse 37 says, "For with God nothing shall be impossible." To strengthen her faith, Gabriel gives her

the news that her cousin Elizabeth in her old age was to have a son who would be six months older than Jesus.

July 9, 1961

ANDREW, A FISHER OF MEN

Printed Portion....John 1:35-42; Matt. 4:18-20; John 6:8-9

John 1:35. Again the next day after John stood, and two of his disciples;

36. And looking upon Jesus as he walked, he saith, Behold the Lamb of God!

37. And the two disciples heard him speak, and they followed Jesus.

38. Then Jesus turned, and saw them following, and saith unto them, What seek ye? They said unto him, Rabbi, (which is to say, being interpreted, Master,) where dwellest thou?

39. He saith unto them, Come and see. They came and saw where he dwelt, and abode with him that day: for it was about the tenth hour.

40 One of the two which heard John speak, and followed him, was Andrew, Simon Peter's brother.

41. He first findeth his own brother Simon, and saith unto him, We have found the Messias, which is, being interpreted, the Christ.

42. And he brought him to Jesus. And when Jesus beheld him, he said, Thou art Simon the son of Jona: thou shalt be called Cephas, which is by interpretation, A stone.

Practical Truth: To bring others to Jesus is one of the most blessed attainments that man can achieve.

COMMENTS AND APPLICATION

Andrew with others traveled 75 miles to Judea to see and hear the great preacher, John the Baptist, who was stirring the multitudes of that day. One day as Christ walked by, he said, "Behold the Lamb of God!" Andrew and another disciple heard him speak and they followed Jesus. How happy they were to find the Messiah. The news was too good to keep. "Whom shall I tell first," no doubt Andrew thought. He hurried to his brother Peter and said, "We have found the Messias." And our lesson said, "And he brought him to Jesus." Have you found the Saviour? Is that new-found joy bubbling up in your soul today? Are you still anxious to tell others about Jesus, your new-found Friend? If so, then I am sure you are a worker for Jesus, like Andrew. Those who bring others to Jesus have a profound concern for the welfare of souls. They genuinely desire to see sinners find a way out of their sins which have them bound in darkness and despair. I can't understand how anyone who has found Jesus as their Savior can be satisfied in doing nothing to help others find Him. Jesus wants us to be "fishers of men." It takes patience, wisdom from above and earnest prayer to lead others to Jesus. We need more Andrews today. Other glimpses of Andrew are found in Mark 3: 18 and John 12:23-36.

July 16, 1961

MATTHEW, THE CONVERTED PUBLICAN

Matt. 9:9. And as Jesus passed forth from thence, he saw a man, named Matthew, sitting at the receipt of custom: and he saith unto him, Follow me. And he arose, and followed him.

10. And it came to pass, as Jesus sat at meat in the house, behold, many publicans and sinners came and sat down with him and his disciples.

11. And when the Pharisees saw it, they said unto his disciples. Why eateth your Master with publicans and sinners?

12. But when Jesus heard that, he said unto them, They that be whole need not a physician, but they that are sick.

13. But go ye and learn what that meaneth, I will have mercy, and not sacrifice: for I am not come to call the righteous, but sinners to repentance.

Matt. 10:1. And when he had called unto him his twelve disciples, he gave them power against unclean spirits, to cast them out, and to heal all manner of sickness and all manner of disease.

2. Now the names of the twelve apostles are these; The first. Simon, who is called Peter, and Andrew his brother; James the son of Zebedee, and John his brother;

Memory Verse: He left all, rose up, and followed him. Luke 5:28.

Practical Truth: Salvation is provided for all classes of people.

COMMENTS AND APPLICATION

Jesus had a great work that needed to be done. His mission here in this world was an important one. He was to be in His ministry only three years. He needed men who would carry on after He was gone. His choice of those who would be close to Him and then be able to tell the world afterwards was important. We notice that He did not call the learned men of the day. Worldly wisdom did not enter into His choice of apostles. He needed humble, honest, and hard-working men. We do not find where he chose a lazy person, but they were all busy men.

Our lesson today is about Matthew, whom Jesus chose to be one of His disciples. Matthew wrote the book of Matthew in the New Testament. Matthew was a tax collector or a customs officer outside Capernaum. This was a caravan route between Damascus and the Mediterranean Sea. In those days some collectors were very dishonest and would collect more than they should and keep some for themselves, but we do not have any reason to think this of Matthew. We find that he was obedient to the call. He immediately left all and went with Jesus: Not only did he follow Him but wanted his friends to meet Him too. He had a feast and it seems that Jesus was the honored guest. In those days a feast was a public affair. Others could stand around and watch the invited guests eat. Jesus was criticized for eating with sinners. He made it clear that He came to save sinners. How could He have helped them if He had avoided them?

MARY AND MARTHA, FRIENDS OF JESUS

Printed PortionLuke 10:38-42; John 11:1-5; 12:1-3

Luke 10:38. Now it came to pass, as they went, that he entered into a certain village: and a certain woman named Martha received him into her house.

- 39. And she had a sister called Mary, which also sat at Jesus' feet, and heard his word.
- 40. But Martha was cumbered about much serving, and came to him, and said, Lord, dost thou not care that my sister hath left me to serve alone? bid her therefore that she help me.
- 41. And Jesus answered and said unto her, Martha, Martha, thou art careful and troubled about many things:
- 42. But one thing is needful: and Mary hath chosen that good part, which shall not be taken away from her.

Memory Verse: Yea, Lord: I believe that thou art the Christ, the Son of God which should come into the world. John 11:27.

Practical Truth: The thing most needful in life is fellowship with Christ.

COMMENTS AND APPLICATION

Our lesson covers three accounts about this wonderful family that Jesus especially loved. When we think of the sorrow of our Lord, it is a comfort to know He did have some true friends while here on earth. Their love for Him was overwhelming. The first part of our lesson tells about one of His visits to their home. Martha was genuinely interested in His physical welfare. She desired to show her love and concern, yet Jesus knew her soul needed food also. He gently told her that only "one thing is needful." I am sure this was an important message and is a sermon within itself. What could be more important than the soul? It will live on and on, but the body will go back to dust as well as every other earthly thing. We should put first things first. Truly only one thing is most important, and that is to be certain that the soul is ready to meet God before the hour of death.

It was a sorrowful day, yet a wonderful day when Jesus came and spoke to Lazarus in the tomb and he came forth. The glory of the Lord was shown forth that day and many believed. There is a purpose in every delay of a prayer being answered. Trust the Lord and rest in Him because He does all things well.

THOMAS: THROUGH DOUBT TO FAITH

Printed PortionJohn 11:7-8, 16; 14:3-6; 20:24-29

John 11:7. Then after that saith he to his disciples,
Let us go into Judea again.

- 8. His disciples say unto him, Master, the Jews of late sought to stone thee; and goest thou thither again?
- 16. Then said Thomas, which is called Didymus, unto his fellow-disciples, Let us also go, that we may die with him.

John 14:3. And if I go and prepare a place for you, I will come again, and receive you unto myself; that where I am, there ye may be also.

- 4. And whither I go ye know, and the way ye know.
- 5. Thomas saith unto him, Lord, we know not whither thou goest; and how can we know the way?
- 6. Jesus saith unto him, I am the way, the truth, and the life: no man cometh unto the Father, but by me.

John 20:24. But Thomas, one of the twelve, called Didymus, was not with them when Jesus came.

- 25. The other disciples therefore said unto him, We have seen the Lord, But he said unto them, Except I shall see in his hands the print of the nails, and thrust my hand into his side, I will not believe.
- 26. And after eight days, again his disciples were within, and Thomas with them: then came Jesus, the doors being shut, and stood in the midst and said, Peace be unto you.
- 27. Then saith he to Thomas, Reach hither thy finger, and behold my hands; and reach hither thy hand, and thrust it into my side: and be not faithless, but believing.
- 28. And Thomas answered and said unto him, My Lord and my God.
- 29. Jesus saith unto him, Thomas, because thou hast seen me, thou hast believed: Blessed are they that have not seen, and yet have believed.

Memory Verse: Blessed are they that have not seen, and yet have believed. John 20:29.

Practical Truth: There is evidence concerning Christ which should be sufficient to lead any honest doubter to faith in Him.

COMMENTS AND APPLICATION

We do not know very much about Thomas, but we do know he was one of Jesus' disciples. Our first part of the lesson overlaps last Sunday's lesson. Jesus had left Jerusalem because the Jews had sought to stone Him. But after Jesus heard about the sickness and death of Lazarus He decided to go back there. The disciples didn't feel that it was wisdom, but when He decided to go, Thomas spoke up and showed his great love for Jesus. He was willing to die with Him. He showed forth what was in him. After such a firm statement, if there was any draw back in the others they didn't show it. Sometimes our firmness will help those who are wavering to stand firm. Anyway their willingness to die with Jesus brought a great blessing to them. They witnessed the miracle of Lazarus being brought forth from the dead, and I am sure their faith was strengthened. If we are willing to face hard things, God will bless us the same way. Thomas wanted to see Jesus for himself after His resurrection. His doubts were all dispelled when Jesus appeared to him. A greater blessing is pronounced upon us today. We believe, though we have not seen Him with our natural eyes. There are doubters today, but if we will live the life and teach the Truth under the Holy Spirit's anointing it will dispel the doubts of some. Many times they become staunch disciples of Jesus. -Sister Marie Miles
