"Son, Give Me Thine Heart"

"My son, give me thine heart, and let thine eyes observe my ways" Prov. 23:26. The heart is defined as the seat of affections, passions, conscience, innermost soul, the vital or chief part. The heart of man, without being wholly given to God's control, is deceitfully wicked, and in opposition to God and His Word. But if God can obtain complete control of our heart, He will lead us in paths of righteousness for His name's sake.

Yours, for a clean Christian life, Blood as an Old Testament Type

When man fell into sin and spiritual death and thus became estranged from his God, a plan for his return to spiritual life and divine fellowship through atonement (which literally means at-one-ment) had been preordained by Jehovah (1 Pet. 1:18-20). This atonement as the basis for reconciliation was to be the sacrifice of his own Son Jesus Christ, a vicarious suffering of death for man's salvation. By miraculous conception He would be introduced into the stream of humanity through natural birth, and thus as the sinless God-man would take upon himself the sin of the human race, suffer its penalty and thereby provide the great reconciliation, effective, of course, only on condition of acceptance; for man, being a free moral agent and having transgressed of his own free will, was not to be saved independent of or against his will.

All this, of course, would not be accomplished in a day, for the dispensations of God cover magnificent distances of time. Estrangement from him meant the most withering blight upon the human soul. The world soon filled with idolatry and the grossest ignorance respecting any proper conception of purity and righteousness. For such an august event as world atonement there would have to be a long series of affairs leading up to it. Since it would be an event profoundly affecting man's spiritual nature it would be foreshadowed by a meaningful series of blood sacrifices and other offerings fittingly designed for preparatory education in the spiritual things of God and made a very part of the religious worship of the people. A code of ten commandments would make sin a statutory offence and make man more acutely sensible of it. A covenant relation would not be established with the whole world but with a particular people whom God would call out from the mass of humanity and win to himself by miraculous deeds of deliverance from oppression as well as by repeated acts of blessing and protection. A prescribed form of worship would make them a people separate and distinct from idolatrous nations surrounding them. A separate and distinct people whom individuals from other nations could join on certain conditions would foreshadow the divine ecclesia which should constitute Jehovah's people in the new and final dispensation which should follow. The divine hand would be manifest also in the destinies of the other nations, so that "in the fulness of time" God could send his Son manifest in the flesh as the promised Savior of the world. Deut. 7:6-8; Gal. 4:4, 5; Eph. 1:10, 11.

The sacred rituals featuring the worship of the covenant people, as just stated, were chiefly a system of animal sacrifices which by the divine prescription were made to point forward as an impressive type to the atoning death of Christ. The blood was chosen as the atoning element for it represented the life of the creature being sacrificed. Lev. 17:11. Its value lay in its symbolism representing the Savior's blood. The blood of animals, however, could never of itself "take away sins." While the individual reverently offering such sacrifice could be "forgiven" of sin, that is, have its condemnation lifted from him, it yet had to be remembered in God's sight as accruing against the atonement of Christ, the actual Sin-Bearer, to which the blood only pointed as a type. Heb. 9:15; 10:3-6, 12. In beautiful contrast to this old system of types and shadows stands the antitype, the promised provision under the new covenant whereby sin, being fully atoned for, would be REMEMBERED —A. L. Byers NO MORE. Jer. 31:33, 34.

Divine Physical Healing

There are many different kinds of healings of the body in the world today. But there is only one divine healing. Divine means "given or inspired of God." (Web. Dic.) "Oh," someone says, "I thought that everyone who got well, received it because God had healed him." But that is not true. Let us turn to God's Word to prove that there is only one divine healing of the body. Divine healing is healing that God performs upon the body of those who look directly to Him for healing, or are prayed for by those who are God's children through obedience to God's Word.

There are many going forth who are "false apostles, deceitful workers, transforming themselves into the apostles of Christ. And no marvel; for Satan himself is transformed into an angel of light. Therefore it is no great thing if his [Satan's] ministers also are transformed as the ministers of righteousness; whose end shall be according to their works." 2 Cor. 11:13-15. The Bible also tells us that "many false prophets are gone out into the world." 1 John 4:1. Now, what can these false prophets do? Can they work miracles or heal people? Let us again turn to the Word of God to answer this question. We read in the words of Jesus concerning this question, "Many will say to me in that day. Lord, Lord, have we not prophesied in thy name? and in thy name have cast out devils? and in thy name done many wonderful works? And then will I profess unto them, I never knew you: depart from me, ye that work iniquity" Matt. 7:21, 22. So we see and know that all healings and wonderful works are not done by God. The devil has power, too. God lets people go on in their own ways, and if they desire to be a tool for the devil to work through, they can be that. I say that many today are healed by the devil. False prophets go under the cloak of being God's ministers. They are deceived and are deceiving people through healings and other works.

There are three great powers through which the devil works to heal people. "And I saw three unclean spirits like frogs come out of the mouth of the dragon [the pagan, idolatrous, anti-Christ and anti-God spirit], and out of the mouth of the beast [Roman Catholicism], and out of the mouth of the false prophet [Protestantism or sectism which are void of the spirit of God]. For they are the spirits of devils, [pagan, Catholic, Protestant] WORKING MIRACLES, which go forth unto the kings of the earth and of the whole world, to gather them to the battle of that great day of God Almighty" Rev. 16:13, 14.

I am sure that we need not tell you that these three spirits of devils are working miracles today. A missionary from Africa has said that the witch doctors there among the tribes have performed some great miracles of healing. The dragon, anti-God spirit today is working miracles of healing. The Roman Catholics boast of great healings, and also the Protestant movements are full of miracles. But in the fear of God I declare unto you that these miracles of healings are not divine healing. It is not done by God. It is the working power of the devil. Beware, dear ones, that the devil does not deceive you. If God does not heal me, I do not want to be healed. There is a spirit of deception that goes along with these healings.

We read the record of how Jesus healed when He walked the shores of Galilee and among the people. "Jesus Christ the same yesterday, and today, and for ever" Heb. 13:8. He healed then and He is heal-

ing today. Many times Jesus commended the faith of those who came to Him for healing. "If thou canst believe, all things are possible to him that believeth. And straightway the father of the child cried out, and said with tears, Lord, I believe; help thou mine unbelief" Mark 9:23, 24. Jesus helped his unbelief and healed his child. Another time Jesus said, "Have faith in God." He said to the blind man, "Go thy way; thy faith hath made thee whole. And immediately he received his sight, and followed Jesus in the way" Mark 10:52.

"Is any sick among you? let him call for the elders of the church; and let them pray over him, anointing him with oil in the name of the Lord: And the prayer of faith shall save the sick, and the Lord shall raise him up" James 5:14, 15. We hear from many today who tell us that there are not in their town any ministers who believe in praying for the healing of the sick. Of course, these ministers are not God's ministers, but are false prophets. God's true ministers do pray for the sick and God heals. That is divine healing. Sometimes God heals instantly, and then at other times God has a purpose in waiting. God does all things right. But those who are God's children are healed by the divine power of God.

I have seen different ones healed through the divine power of God of many afflictions in my lifetime. I have seen God heal blind eyes, typhoid fever, kidney stones, diptheria, chicken pox, measles, smallpox, T. B., the lame made to walk, broken bones, appendicitis, earache, boils, risings in the head, fevers, goiter, cancer, pneumonia, black widow spider bites, poison oak and ivy, high blood pressure, sugar diabetes, polio, female troubles, weak backs, and many other kinds of diseases. All of these that I have mentioned were healed by the divine power of God without the aid of doctors or medicines. God has received all the glory and honor for His matchless love and care that He shows to those who truly are born again and are trusting Him for both soul and body. God doesn't need the aid of man to heal. God made these bodies and it is certain He can heal them. I count it a privilege to trust God for both soul and body. He has healed me and my family of so many things.

Dear suffering one, look unto God. Read God's Word and believe His promises. Read how Jesus healed when He was here and know in your heart that truly He is the "same yesterday, and today and forever." Praise the dear Lord! Have faith in God and trust Him completely for both soul and body. That is what God wants. The Bible says. "Thus saith the Lord, thy redeemer, and he that formed thee from the womb, I am the Lord that maketh all things" Isa. 44:23. He has formed us and can heal us. Again we read in Jer. 17:5, 7, "Thus saith the Lord; Cursed be the man that trusteth in man, and maketh flesh his arm, and whose heart departeth from the Lord. Many letters are coming to our desk expressing sincere appreciation for the spiritual blessings derived from reading the contents of the paper. We are pleased to report that the Lord has answered prayer in regard to the payment of the 2¾ ton order of paper which was received in January. Just off the press is the second edition of the small heavy paper-bound song book for children or juniors, entitled "Beautiful Way Songs." It contains 32 songs in words only—no music, but it is very suitable to use in Sunday schools and children's meetings. The price is 10c per copy, or one dozen for \$1.00, postpaid.

The January and February issues of the new four-page Spanish paper, entitled, "La Luz de Esperanza" (The Light of Hope), have been printed and mailed to the mission workers for use in Mexico. Our Bro. Clifford Smith has faithfully translated, written the copy and set the Spanish type for these issues, and we will continue to publish this Spanish paper free of charge as long as the Lord permits. The mission workers heartily appreciate the assistance of this Spanish paper in presenting the gospel message to

the Spanish-speaking people. Let us pray that the Holy Spirit will water the gospel seed that is sown by those faithful workers on the mission field.

The response to the proposal to publish a new 2-page leaflet for primary pupils in Sunday schools has been overwhelmingly in favor of it, and many orders have already been received. Pictures and drawings are especially needed in teaching children and young people. Therefore, we are praying that the Lord will provide His printshop with an offset press and equipment in order to produce pictures at a more reasonable cost. We already have floor space in our shop building for this type of equipment, just waiting to be occupied. We are trusting Him who "works all things after the counsel of his own will."

A very striking parallel exists in regard to the history of the church of the morning era and that of the evening time. History indicates that within thirty years after the day of Pentecost in A. D. 33, problems of serious departure from the original standards of truth such as factions, heresy, legalism and world-liness began to infect the church. Losing its pristine power and glory, the so-called church went from bad to worse.

In a like period of time, about thirty years from 1880 A. D. to 1910 A. D., the Church of God reformation movement of the "evening light" shone forth in divine power and glory, until at the latter date it began its infamous spiritual decline and apostasy. Though the compromise and "landslide" of 1910-17 carried the great majority of the movement with it, yet God in His infinite wisdom and power has preserved from those early days a continuous "remnant"—a true church of the "evening light"— which is today maintaining, teaching and practicing those same precious truths which brought forth this glorious reformation. (For a further record on this subject, write to this office for the tract, "Eighty Years in the Evening Light.")

The tragic fact is that many of the people who are affiliated with the several so-called Church of God groups do not know the truth as it was taught and practiced fifty years ago, prior to 1910. What was truth then is still truth today, and will be the truth when the Judgment Day comes. In fact, the light is shining brighter, according to the Scripture,

but it will not obscure or hide the truth that has already been revealed to the Church.

The trouble is that in the attempt of the various groups to restore the obvious lost power and glory, they have not gone back far enough. Some have gone back part of the way, but why not go back all the way to the point where the pure river of life will again flow directly from under the throne of God, imparting all its life-giving freshness to the soul? Let each one seek God for that spiritual vision, holy boldness and courage to go all the way back to the original pattern of the church as laid down in the New Testament.

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Word has been received that Bro. Clyde Stroud of Missouri passed from this life on Feb. 10, 1964, after having suffered intensely for several weeks. He had testified to this writer on Jan. 18 that all was clear between him and his Creator. May the "God of all comfort" be very near the bereaved relatives. He was a former worker here at the Lord's Printshop in the years of 1946 and 1947. The obituary will appear in a later issue.

JANUARY MISSIONARY REPORT FROM NIGERIA, WEST AFRICA

Bro. B. U. Etuk, native minister in Nigeria, has sent in his report of their mission activities for the month of January. It being too long to print in detail, we will give only a short summary at this time.

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Bro. Etuk writes that the Lord is blessing all of them and His work throughout the whole field of labor. At the moment they are having no difficulty in expanding the work except for lack of accommodations in nearly all of their present chapels in the outlying stations. He writes that the enlarging of the headquarters' chapel is most essential in order to accommodate the large general meetings, and they have decided to start the building of this chapel forthwith.

They are also appealing to the Church here in the States to share with them the financial responsibility in enlarging the headquarters' chapel and the building of new chapels at the stations where they do not have the necessary buildings. He states that "no offering will be too small nor too big that we would not receive with all pleasure, and none will be used for any other purpose."

He also mentions the need of a tape recorder to use

in extending the gospel of Christ.

From all the detailed reports and personal experiences related, it is evident that this is a very needy field for the gospel.

Just today we received a letter from a native evangelist who stated that he had a small holiness church in Port Harcourt, Nigeria and was urgently appealing for a supply of Bibles, books, papers and tracts to use in his evangelistic work there. We will be mailing him a box of literature promptly. A few months ago this native evangelist was highly recommended to us by letter from an American missionary stationed in that area.

Surely the time is overdue when missionaries from the Church here should answer this "Macedonian" call. The door to this needy field is open now, but for one reason or another it may close if a definite move is not made in that direction very soon.

"I guess the case goes back many, many years to the time I was a young boy. At that time I was given an insight into God's truths and in a way shown a sanctified life. I took it as being my own conviction of God's Word, but still I never lived up to it. I sinned all the more. But tucked away in me was the conviction of a sanctified life in Christ, although I didn't know the first thing about it—not, that is, until I met the saints and was led into the fullness of people living not only with Christ but also living in Christ—the sanctified life. Upon meeting all of you and seeing your lives, I came in touch for the first time with a sanctified life in Christ and slowly I started to see more and more this purity that God wants in us all. "The Battle of That Great Day"

(Rev. 16:14)

Since the dawn of creation a warfare has been in progress between good and evil, God and the devil. Each is in conquest of the affections of the human heart or soul.

In the beginning God created man holy in nature like Himself. The devil appeared on the scene, tempted and persuaded mankind to turn his love and loyalty away from God. Man transgressed God's law, and his posterity followed the road of sin and spiritual death as the servants of Satan. The Apostle Paul clearly states that "death reigned from Adam to Moses" Rom. 5:14. This death was a spiritual separation from God as a result of sin. Moses' law was given "that sin by the commandment might become exceeding sinful" Rom. 7:13. Through all the weary centuries the devil held sway over the lives of most all the human family.

In due time Jesus Christ, the Son of God, appeared on the world scene and began preaching a way of deliverance from sin and Satan. Jesus sent His disciples out to preach the way of salvation, and the devil was dethroned in the hearts of all who believed the gospel. Jesus, Himself, testified: "Now is the judgment of this world: now shall the prince of this world be cast out" John 12:31. Jesus came to destroy the works of the devil in the human heart. Through Christ's atoning death and triumphant resurrection, he was victorious over death, hell, and the grave. The binding chains of sin were broken, and the universal invitation had gone out that every guilty soul could, if he willed to do so, be saved from sin and be brought back in favor and fellowship with His Creator. Jesus set up His kingdom, built His

church, and placed it in full operation by the agency of the Holy Spirit on the day of Pentecost in opposition to the devil's kingdom.

The devil's first agent against the infant church was pagan Rome which instituted a reign of physical persecution. Thousands of Christians were martyred, but Jesus and his army increased and prevailed. Eventually Pagan Rome crumbled and fell before the power of Christianity. Yet the devil was not through. His next agent took the cloak or false form of Christianity under the name of Papal Rome which was also a persecuting power, and millions of saints sealed their testimony with their blood. Though God still had a church which preserved the gospel, yet for a long period its visibility on the earth was largely obscured. Catholicism and Protestantism have been and are continuing to wage unrelenting opposition to true Christianity. The lines of demarcation between the true and the false are being drawn more distinctly as time moves closer to the end.

The Prophet Zechariah foretold: "... that at evening time it shall be light," with reference to the Church of God in the evening time of the gospel day. In fulfillment of this prophecy the "evening light" began to shine forth about 1880 A. D. on Bible holiness and the one true Church free from the creeds of men. The three-fold message of this reformation is that of the first three angels of Rev. 14:6-13. Read them. The second angel declared that "Babylon is fallen, is fallen, that great city." Read also Rev. 18:2. Then in Rev. 18:4 we read, "And I heard another voice from heaven, saying, Come out of her [Babylon], my people, that ye be not partakers of her sins, and that ye receive not of her plagues." Just as God's people, the Jews, were taken captive into ancient Babylon, even so God's people during "the cloudy and dark day" were scattered in spiritual Babylon which is Protestant confusion. Even as ancient literal Israel returned to Jerusalem, the city of God, so in this evening time God is calling and leading His people out of spiritual Babylon to "their own land" on the heights of Mount Zion. The gathering of God's people (a small remnant in comparison to the multitude of opposing forces) is in preparation for that great and final battle of Armageddon -a conflict between good and evil, right and wrong.

The New Testament Church, the saints of God, do not fight with carnal weapons. The Apostle Paul says, "For the weapons of our warfare are not carnal, but mighty through God to the pulling down of strong holds" 2 Cor. 10:4. "For we wrestle not against flesh and blood, but against principalities, against powers, against rulers of the darkness of this world, against spiritual wickedness in high places" Eph. 6:12. Read of the Christian's armor in Eph. 6:13-18. The armor is spiritual, so the battle is spiritual.

Solomon, with prophetic vision, saw God's glorious Church and exclaimed, "Who is she that looketh forth as the morning, fair as the moon, clear as the sun, and terrible as an army with banners" Song of Sol. 6:10.

Not only is God gathering His people into one true fold, but also the devil is gathering and marshaling his forces of false religions in opposition to the true. Perhaps more steps have been made in that direction in the past two or three years than ever before... Nominal Christianity is hailing the mergers of the various denominations as fulfilling Christian unity, looking toward that golden day of one world church. In reality, this is not the nature of the unity for which Jesus prayed. The union or an amalgamation of all religions is not Christian unity in any sense of its meaning. The move is merely increasing the size of the false systems-a movement which is spearheaded by the World Council of Churches. Even Pope Paul has aided the ecumenical union movement last year by continuing the work of the Second Vatican Council of the Catholic Church to promote Christian unity, so-called. In its closing session, he spoke of its efforts of "finding ways and expressions capable of closing the gap between our separated brethren and ourselves." A meeting of the World Council of Churches last July adopted a message affirming that the ecumenical movement is advancing "faster than we can understand or express it." It was announced in December that a Roman Catholic edition of the Protestant Revised Standard Version of the Bible would be published in England in 1964. This was a major step in the movement for a common Catholic-Protestant Bible as a spur to Christian unity, so-called. During last year many ecumenical contacts at the grassroots level were reported in the United States, as Catholic theologians spoke at Protestant gatherings, and vice versa. Leaders of both faiths appeared together on radio and television programs, and even exchanged pulpits to expound and support the cause of unity (?).

The recent meeting between the two leaders of Catholicism and Greek Orthodoxy on the Mount of Olives in the Holy Land was the first in 500 years. They have been in schism for about 1000 years. In a climactic speech from Bethlehem, where Christ was born, Pope Paul called on Christians to unite. Is this union effort for good or for ill?

By taking a realistic look at the religious world in the light of the Scriptures and a bit of spiritual discernment, one cannot fail to see the "signs of the times," and the "handwriting on the world's wall" that its days are numbered. Let John the Revelator describe in symbolic language the momentous events which are unfolding before our eyes, and those which are yet to come. "And I saw three unclean spirits like frogs come out of the mouth of the dragon, and out of the mouth of the beast, and out of the mouth of the false prophet. For they are the spirits of devils, working miracles, which go forth unto the kings of the earth and of the whole world, to gather them to the battle of that great day of God Almighty." Rev. 16:13, 14. "And when the thousand years are expired, Satan shall be loosed out of his prison, and shall go out to deceive the nations which are in the four quarters of the earth, Gog and Magog, to gather them together to battle: the number of whom is as

the sand of the sea. And they went up on the breadth of the earth, and compassed the camp of the saints about, and the beloved city: and fire came down from God out of heaven, and devoured them." Rev. 20:7, 8, 9.

In that final battle Christ and His army will be victorious. Are you in the camp of the saints, clothed in that white raiment which shall shine before God's throne? -Lawrence D. Pruitt

MARY, MARTHA, AND LAZARUS

Printed Portion Luke 10:38-42, John 11:20-27, 12:1-3

Luke 10:38 Now it came to pass, as they went, that he entered into a certain village; and a certain woman named Martha received him into her house.

- 39 And she had a sister called Mary, which also sat at Jesus' feet, and heard his word.
- 40 But Martha was cumbered about much serving, and came to him, and said, Lord, dost thou not care that my sister hath left me to serve alone? bid her therefore that she help me.

41 And Jesus answered and said unto her, Martha, Martha, thou art careful and troubled about many things:

- 42 But one thing is needful: and Mary hath chosen that good part, which shall not be taken away from her.
 John 11:20 Then Martha, as soon as she heard that Jesus was coming, went and met him: but Mary sat still in the house.

Memory Verse: She saith unto him. Yea. Lord: I believe that thou art the Christ, the Son of God, which should come into the world. John 11:27.

Practical Truth: We learn from Jesus that nothing is impossible for God to do.

COMMENTS AND APPLICATION

There is not a home as great as the home where Jesus is a constant guest. That home will be a shelter for the weary and a comfort for the broken hearted. The hungry will be fed and the lonely given courage. Jesus loved to go to the home of Lazarus, Martha and Mary. There was a close relationship between them. Our lesson brings out a scene in the home. Martha was interested in seeing that Jesus was fed but felt disturbed because she did not have the cooperation of her sister, Mary. She tried to get Jesus to help her to get Mary to see this. But Jesus rebuked Martha for being so interested in earthly things. She seemed to be more interested in serving her family and guest than serving the Lord. Jesus told her that "one thing is needful: and Mary hath chosen that good part." The cares of this life will crowd in and crowd Jesus out of the life if we let them. There truly is just "one needful thing."

Death struck this home but we find that Mary was more fortified to face it than Martha. She had been, sitting at Jesus' feet. Mary had faith while Martha battled doubts. Jesus encouraged Martha by telling her that He was the life and the resurrection. Lazarus being brought forth from the dead was one of Jesus' last deeds. Mary showed her great love by anointing Jesus' feet. She came to give and not to ask. Jesus wants us to give him our love.

March 8, 1964 THE MAN BORN BLIND

Printed Portion John 9:13-17, 24-25, 33-38

John 9:13 They brought to the Pharisees him that aforetime was blind.

- 14 And it was the sabbath day when Jesus made the
- clay, and opened his eyes.

 15 Then again the Pharisees also asked him how he had received his sight. He said unto them, He put clay upon mine eyes, and I washed, and do see.
- 16 Therefore said some of the Pharisees, This man is not of God, because he keepeth not the sabbath day. Others said, How can a man that is a sinner do such
- miracles? And there was a division among them.

 17 They say unto the blind man again, What sayest thou of him, that he hath opened thine eyes? He said, He is a prophet.

Practical Truth: Jesus loves those who are in trouble and desires to help them.

COMMENTS AND APPLICATION

Jesus could have waited until another day besides the Sabbath, which the Pharisees strictly kept, to heal the blind man. It might have saved a big discussion but he wanted to help people see that they were only following traditions. Truth must triumph before souls could be saved from sin. In the discussion, the blind man and his parents got a chance to see the wrong in the Pharisees' lives. They cast the once-blind man out of the synagogue because he confessed Christ. After the word got around, Jesus sought him out. What a wonderful Saviour we have! When trouble arises, Jesus cares and is ready to help us. The man was cautious in saying whether he believed Jesus was the "Son of God." He wanted to be sure, but when he was assured, he worshipped his Lord and Saviour. What a joy filled his heart! His troubles were brushed aside by the joy in finding Jesus. I am sure this joy was greater than his physical eyes being opened. The soul receiving an insight into the deep spiritual things of God is greater than the eyes seeing the beauties of this life or having a physical touch. It is wonderful to be transformed from darkness into the kingdom of God where the light never grows dim to the child of God.

PILATE JUDGED BY JESUS

Printed Portion John 18:28-38

John 18:28 Then led they Jesus from Caiaphas unto the hall of judgment: and it was early; and they themselves went not into the judgment hall, lest they should be defiled; but that they might eat the passover.

- 29 Pilate then went out unto them, and said, What accusation bring ye against this man?
- 30 They answered and said unto him, If he were not a malefactor, we would not have delivered him up unto thee.
- 31 Then said Pilate unto them, Take ye him, and judge him according to your law. The Jews therefore said unto him, It is not lawful for us to put any man to death:
- 32 That the saying of Jesus might be fulfilled, which he spake, signifying what death he should die.

- 38 Pilate saith unto him, What is truth? And when he had said this, he went out again unto the Jews, and saith unto them, I find in him no fault at all.

Memory Verse: Pilate therefore said unto him, Art thou a king then? Jesus answered, Thou sayest that I am a king. To this end was I born, and for this cause came I into the world, that I should bear witness unto the truth. Every one that is of the truth heareth my voice. John 18:37.

Practical Truth: We will be falsely accused in this world, like Jesus.

COMMENTS AND APPLICATION

The Jews took Jesus from the garden of Gethsemane and passed judgment upon him. They brought him to Pilate. The Jews were keeping the passover and would not go into the hall because it would defile them according to their laws. The very passover they were keeping was a type of Jesus, the lamb that was to be slain for the sins of the world. All that believed on him would be saved from eternal death.

That night after Pilate left, his wife had a dream. She sent word for him not to have anything to do with Jesus. (Matt. 27:19) Pilate was forced to face Jesus alone. He would go out into the street and talk to the Jews and then come back and talk to Jesus. He knew there was no legal reason why Jesus should be put to death. He tried to get out of it. He was concerned about his position and his future in the Roman empire. Jesus forced Pilate to think of his future position before the judgment bar of God. Now Jesus was being judged by Pilate, but there was coming a day when Pilate would be judged by Jesus. "For the Father judgeth no man, but hath committed all judgment unto the Son." "And hath given him [Jesus] authority to execute judgment also, because he is the Son of man." John 5:22, 29. Jesus let him know he was dealing with a king of a kingdom that was not of this world. He washed his hands but that did not do away with his guilt.

COMMENTS AND APPLICATION

We have a real sad lesson today and it would be sad indeed if we thought our precious Lord had suffered in vain. As you study this lesson, be sure to think that Jesus went through all of this that you and I might be saved; that we might live in heaven in eternity. How we ought to love our precious Lord and Saviour. He proved his great love for us. We are the ones who had sinned but Jesus bore our sins for us; took our punishment that we might go free. They lifted the cross up and let it fall with a thud into the hole, tearing his precious hands and feet that were already bleeding. He was innocent and only came to do good in this world. He was in the fleshly body and had feelings as you and I. He willingly laid down his life for us. Out of his side gushed blood and water. Through that blood we are saved.

Two thieves who had lived wicked lives were put beside him. The devil gets people into lots of trouble but never helps them out. One of the thieves joined in with the sneering crowd who mocked and made fun of our precious Saviour. COMMENTS AND APPLICATION

Our lessons have been about people who have been with Jesus. Some were friends and others were his enemies. He was true to the soul of each one.
