A Brief History of Christmas

December 25 has not always, since the time of Christ, been celebrated as the birthday of our Savior. According to history, there was in earlier times, no strict uniformity in the day for celebrating the Nativity, the different churches disagreeing as to the exact date. Some favored January 2, some January 6, some celebrated May 20, while others fixed the date on April 18, or 19, and still others on March 28. The uncertainty existing in the minds of the historians at the beginning of the third century proves that there was no formal observance before the middle of the century. We have no historical record that our Lord's birthday was celebrated during apostolic times.

The first man to fix December 25 as the correct date, seems to have been Hippolytus of the second century. He believed that Jesus' life from conception to crucifixion was exactly thirty-three years. Since the crucifixion occurred on March 25, Hippolytus calculated that the Annunciation to Mary, or the Conception, took place in the same month, thirty-three years earlier. He decided therefore, that Jesus must have been born in the month of December, on the twenty-fifth day. But the uncertainty of all dates discredits every attempt at fixing the correct date. Indeed, some think it is almost certain that December 25 was not the date of Jesus' birth; for it is then the height of the rainy season in Judea, and shepherds would not likely have been watching their flocks by night on the plains.

The earliest record of the recognition of December 25 as Christ's birthday is in the Philocalian Calendar, which shows that the celebration of that date was a Roman practice as early as 336. An Armenian writer of the eleventh century states that the celebration of Christmas was invented in Rome by a heretic and first observed in Constantinople in 373. The present date has never been adopted by the Armenians; they still celebrate January 6. The church at Jerusalem also celebrated January 6, about the middle of the fourth century. At about this time, the Jerusalem bishop asked the bishop at Rome to ascertain, if possible, the exact date, in order to over-

come the difficulties of nonconformity between the Eastern and Western Churches. It is represented that a calculation based on the supposition that Zacharias' vision took place during the Feast of Tabernacles, thus favoring December 25 as the date for Christmas, was submitted to the church at Jerusalem, who, nevertheless, persisted in celebrating January 6, until the year 549 or later. In Egypt, the Western birthday was opposed during the early part of the fifth century, but was observed in Alexandria as early as 432.

Owing to the wide-spread belief in the earlier centuries of Christianity, that Jesus was born spiritually, that is, adopted as the Son of God and exalted to divine rank and power at the time he was baptized by John, the date of his baptism was considered much more important than the date of his physical birth. During these centuries little attention was given to the date of his birth in the flesh. But by the middle of the fourth century the former prevalent belief had given place to the doctrine based upon the first chapter of John's gospel and the Epistles of Paul, maintaining that Jesus existed with the Father from eternity, and that he was absolutely divine from the time of his conception. With the spread of the latter belief, the date of the physical birth of Christ became of greater importance to Christianity.

The date we now celebrate was not fixed by mere accident. The discussions and conclusions of the church fathers doubtless had a great deal to do with fixing December 25; but it is believed that the ancient heathen festivals which were held at the same time of the year, also had a powerful influence over Christianity in deciding the date. Almost all the heathen nations of the early centuries A. D., regarded the winter solstice—the time when the sun reaches its most southern point—as a very important event of the year. It was the beginning of the renewed life of nature and of the gods, and the beginning of the lengthening of days. Especially the more northern countries hailed this point of the winter with great delight; and from the oldest times they celebrated this season with sumptuous festivities. At the winter solstice, the Germans held their great Yule feast in commemoration of the return of the fiery sun-wheel. It is stated that many of the beliefs and usages of the old Germans and also of the Romans were carried over from heathenism into Christianity, some of which survive at the present day. Christianity itself added dramatic representations of the birth of Christ and of the first events of his life. This occasioned the composition of the manger songs and numerous Christmas carols. The Christmas trees adorned with lights and gifts were also introduced with the custom of exchanging presents and preparing special Christmas dishes. Thus Christmas has become a universal social feast day.

December 25 is observed religiously by Roman Catholics and by almost all Protestant bodies. However, the Scotch Presbyterians and the English Nonconformists generally reject religious Christmas observances, holding that such celebration savors too

much of Catholicism. It is said that the Puritan founders of New England established Thanksgiving Day as a substitute, in some degree, for Christmas.

We as the saints of God observe the day in memory of the birth of our Savior into this world for the salvation of souls, without any regard to the exactness of the date. One thing we do know, that he was born "to save his people from their sins," and that we have by his mercy obtained this salvation. For this greatest of blessings and many kindred benefits, we offer to him heartfelt devotions on the day generally commemorated as his birthday.

The Reign of God's Saints on the Earth

Much has been written relative to a supposed reign of God's people here on the earth, but the majority of the writers on this subject place this reign in a future age. If it can be shown that the reign of God's saints on earth is a present experience during this dispensation of divine grace, then the contention of a future reign on earth is false. It may surprise some of our readers when I state positively that the notion of resurrected saints reigning on earth a thousand years with Christ is positively without scriptural support. A careful study of the texts used to support any such theory will show that they teach absolutely nothing of the kind.

That the Bible teaches a reign of God's people on earth, we do not deny; but instead of its being in a future age, thank God, it is the present experience of all those who are fully saved. We have proved that in this dispensation God's people are "in the kingdom of his dear Son" and possess its elements in their hearts—"righteousness, joy, and peace in the Holy Ghost." Jesus plainly taught that "the kingdom of God is within you," or, as some translators render it, "the reign of God is within you." Therefore it is evident that identical with our induction into the kingdom and possessing the kingdom in us, the reign of God's saints takes place. In fact, it cannot be otherwise. Possessing the kingdom and reigning through the grace of God is the same experience.

Paul says, "That as sin hath reigned unto death, even so might grace reign through righteousness unto eternal life by Jesus Christ our Lord" (Rom. 5:21).

Adam Clarke says on this text: "As extensively, as deeply, as universally, as 'sin'—whether implying the act of transgression, or the impure principle from which the act proceeds, or both—'hath reigned,' subjected the whole soul and all its powers and faculties, 'unto death' temporal, spiritual, and eternal; even so, as extensively, deeply, and universally, might grace reign, filling the whole earth, and pervading, purifying, and refining the whole soul, through righteousness, through this free salvation by the blood of the Lamb, and by the principle of holiness, inwrought in the soul by the Holy Ghost, unto eternal life—the proper object of an immortal spirit's hope. Where God is, where he is seen as he is, by Jesus Christ our

Lord, as the cause of our salvation, the means by which it is communicated, and the source whence it springs. Thus we find that the salvation from sin here is as extensive and complete as the guilt and contamination of sin. Here is glorying: 'Unto him that loved us, and washed us from our sins in his own blood, and hath made us kings and priests to God and his Father; to him be glory and dominion forever and ever. Amen.' "

This exegesis beautifully presents the truth concerning the reign of God's grace in the human soul, the result of which enables us, through God's abundant favor and the possession of his own holiness, to reign triumphant in this life. "For if by one man's offense death reigned by one; much more they which receive abundance of grace and of the gift of right-eousness shall reign in life by one, Jesus Christ" (Rom. 5:17). Death is here represented as reigning over mankind; but, thank God, salvation places us in kingly triumph over all the elements of the world. "Whatsoever is born of God overcometh the world." (1 John 5:4). And not only this, but we reign over Satan himself, who claims to be ruler of the earth: "Behold, I give unto you power . . . over all the power of the enemy" (Luke 10:19).

Peter thus describes the church in this dispensation: "Ye are a chosen generation, a royal priesthood [kingly priesthood; that is, a priesthood of kings], an holy nation, a peculiar people; that ye should show forth the praises of him who hath called you out of darkness into his marvelous light" (1 Pet. 2:9). The very things that many people are looking for and expecting to enjoy in some fancied age yet to come, are being enjoyed by God's people at this present time. Writing to the churches of Asia in the first century of Christian grace, John declared that Jesus Christ "hath made us kings and priests unto God and his Father" (Rev. 1:6). Right in harmony with this, John testifies of himself, that he was "in the kingdom and patience of Jesus Christ" (vs. 9). God's church in this dispensation is a priesthood of kings who, through the grace and righteousness of God in Christ Jesus, "reign in life." Hallelujah! All who live in sin are slaves to their own lusts, are not able to govern themselves; but salvation makes us "kings," because through Christ we can rule our own selves, our own passions, appetites, and desires. Paul says, "I keep under my body" (1 Cor. 9:27). And a wise man of ancient times said, "He that ruleth his spirit [is better] than he that taketh a city" (Prov. 16:32).

Millennialists are expecting to reign over Satan when he will be cast into a great pit and bound with a mighty chain, so that he cannot harm anyone: that certainly would be such a very easy thing that no one would boast of it. Thank God, we have something better than that; right now, while Satan is loose, going about as a roaring lion "seeking whom he may devour," we have power over him. In the name of Jesus Christ every demon in hell is subject to the saints of God. We reign over sin. Sin held the whole human family under its dominion for thousands of years, but now, in the Christian Era, "sin shall not

have dominion over you: for ye are not under the law, but under grace" (Rom. 6:14). Yes, we reign over sin. The truly saved now possess the very things that formalists are looking for in the future. "Now being made free from sin, and become servants to God, ye have your fruit unto holiness" (vs. 22). A master of the situation of life, with a peace that nothing disturbs—this is now realized in the kingdom of God. Well hath the poet, D. S. Warner, said:

"One we hail as King immortal He did earth and hell subdue; And bequeathing us his glory, We are kings anointed, too.

"Shall we, then, by sin be humbled?

Must we yield to any foe?

No, by heaven's gift, we're reigning

Over all this world below.

"Oh, what grace and high promotion, That in Jesus I should be Raised from sin to royal honor, Even reigning, Lord, with thee!

"All this life is blissful sunshine, Earth is subject at our feet; Heaven pours its richest blessings Round our throne of love complete.

"I am reigning, sweetly reigning, Far above this world of strife; In my blessed, loving Saviour, I am reigning in this life."

NIGERIAN MISSIONARY REPORT

Under date of October 29 Bro. Etuk, mission superintendent, signed this letter thanking the church in the States for their prayers for his recovery from the stroke he suffered in September. In answer to prayer he is improving, but is not completely back to normal, and is requesting your continued prayers in his behalf. With this same letter was the report of the Nigerian mission activities consisting of eight typewritten pages, produced by Bro. Nse Umanah, the mission secretary. Too long to reprint here, these reports cover in detail the mission activities during the time Bro. and Sister C. C. Carver were there—Sept. 20 to Oct. 16. A summary follows:

Arrangements were made, and the Carvers met with the various congregations in that area during their stay, receiving warm welcomes everywhere. Bro. Carver preached or spoke to each congregation through an interpreter. Texts and sketches of the sermons were recorded. Out of their poverty the people gave offerings to them of what they had—oranges, bananas, onions, potatoes, paw-paw, yams and chickens.

Bros. Carver, Etuk, and Umanah drove to a large city over 200 miles from the mission headquarters and met with a large religious group. Bro. Carver preached and many seemed to accept the truth. He baptized 19, including the pastor, and they felt that their effort there was very successful. Now a quantity of literature has been mailed to that group.

On Oct. 16 the Carvers were escorted to their plane for the return trip home. Farewells were said, with the hope that they would meet again if the Lord willed.

The next day, Sunday, Oct. 17, the members from all stations met for a baptismal and communion service. It was hoped that Bro. and Sister Carver could have been there for that service. 117 believers were baptized by Pastor B. E. Udoka, 669 took part in the Lord's Supper, and a total of 761 were in attendance.

When the Carvers arrived in Amsterdam from Nigeria, he phoned me that a leader and a large number of congregations in Nigeria, W. Africa, had taken their stand for the truth of the Church of God. He was very optimistic about the advancement of the gospel work in Nigeria, so let us give thanks unto the Lord, continue to pray and labor on faithfully to reach the millions in that country who have not yet heard the pure gospel.

The mission work in Nigeria requires financial support every month from the Church in this country. We are endeavoring to meet this need through the special Missionary Fund at this office. Will you continue to help?

May the Lord bless those who are financing and sponsoring individual native ministers in Nigeria. Some of the native workers cannot read or write English, so be patient if you do not receive a prompt acknowledgement of your offering from them.

Christ's spirit is a missionary spirit. Do you still have that God-given soul burden for those in heathen darkness?

After part of this issue was on the press, I talked by phone on Nov. 19 with Bro. Carver who had just arrived the night before at the home of their son, Vernon, at Harper's Ferry, W. Va. Thank the Lord for answered prayer for his safe return home, and he is bringing to the Church a report of bright prospects of the ripe harvest field in India. Bro. and Sister Carver plan to be at the latter part of the Hammond, La. Assembly meeting where they will report on Nigeria and India. —L. D. Pruitt.

VAIN RELIGION

Exodus 20:7, "Thou shalt not take the name of the Lord thy God in vain; for the Lord will not hold him guiltless that taketh his name in vain."

One day as I sat meditating upon this verse of scripture, the thought came to me that it isn't necessary to curse and swear to take God's name in vain. Turning to Cruden's Concordance I found the following: "Vain and vanity are used in the Bible entirely with the idea of emptiness, fruitlessness, or worthlessness." Webster also gives the definition as "empty, worthless, of none effect."

Many people today desire to take God's name, that is, they want to be recognized as the Church of God, but are not willing to live the life that God demands or requires of them. I John 2:15-17, "Love not the world, neither the things that are in the world. If any man love the world, the love of the Father is not in him. For all that is in the world, the lust of the flesh, and the lust of the eyes, and the pride of life. is not of the Father, but is of the world. And the world passeth away, and the lust thereof; but he that doeth the will of God abideth for ever." In open rebellion against the Word of God, these people live like the world, dress like the world, (wear short dresses, short sleeves, tight skirts, short sleeved shirts. neckties), and go to worldly places of amusement such as ball-games, fairs, all kinds of plays and programs. and skating rinks. They have become lovers of their own selves, not greatly concerned about God's work, God's ministry, or their fellow man. All that seems to matter is that their own selfish desires be satisfied, and they still go on professing God's name. People of the world, and the different religious sects, knowing the standard we preach and hold, find it difficult to understand how people professing to be saints can drink coffee and tea, put on the tie and in general dress like the world. Just as the scribes and Pharisees Jesus spoke of in Matthew 23:3, "They say and do not."

Now I realize our salvation isn't based altogether on these things, but how can we hope to influence and win others to the truth if we fail to live by the recognized standard of the Bible and the church. According to the Bible and the dictionary, people of this kind are taking God's name in vain. It is of no effect in their lives, but empty, futile, and worthless. Their lives are void of the graces of God.

2 Timothy 3:1-5, "This know also that in the last days perilous times shall come. For men shall be lovers of their own selves, ... having a form of godliness, but denying the power thereof." They are taking God's name in vain.

Ephesians 3:14, 15, "For this cause I bow my knees unto the Father of our Lord Jesus Christ, of whom the whole family in heaven and earth is named." By virtue of the new birth we receive the name of our Father. The true saints, or children of God are given the name of their Father. We don't just decide to take His name irrespective of the way we live. Matthew 15:7-9, "Ye hypocrites, well did Esaias prophesy of you, saying, this people draweth nigh unto me with their mouth, and honoureth me with their lips: but their heart is far from me. But in vain they do worship me, teaching for doctrines the commandments of men." 2 Timothy 3:16, "All scripture is given by inspiration of God, and is profitable for doctrine, for reproof, for correction, for instruction in right-eousness..."

God has placed in our care the immortal souls of our children on which we are writing every day by our instruction and by our example—something which will be on display for or against us at the last great day.

In Gen. 33:5, when Jacob was to meet Esau, Esau lifted his eyes upon the women and children, and wanted to know whose they were. Jacob said, "The children which God hath graciously given thy servant." Psa. 127:3, "Lo, children are an heritage of the Lord, and the fruit of the womb is His reward." Heritage is a birth-right or inheritance. Are we caring for the heritage (children) of the Lord so we can reap good things? In Heb. 2:13 we read, "Behold I and the children which God hath given me." In Mark 10:13, 14, when they were bringing the children to Jesus, the disciples rebuked those that brought them, "but when Jesus saw it, he was much displeased, and said unto them, suffer [allow, permit] the little children to come unto me, and forbid them not." When we do not take time with our children every day, we are like the disciples. Are we denying our children their rightful heritage-of parents who will teach, instruct, and take time every day to point them to God? That's why God placed us as shepherds over His lambs, His precious jewels, to keep them from the ways of the devil. One thing I have tried to do is to teach my children that I am Mother, and will be to the day I die, and I conduct myself in a way to have respect. I try to let my words be words of wisdom. I prove to the children that I am right, and when I am wrong, I will confess it also, and ask pardon. My children's ages are 10, 13, 15, and 18 years.

God can help us in every task that is too hard for us, but first we must desire for God to help us, and we must be determined that the devil will not get the best of us. Through Jesus we can do all things and defeat the devil.

"Chasten thy son while there is hope, and let not thy soul spare for his crying." Prov. 19:18.

"He that spareth his rod hateth his son: but he that loveth him chasteneth him betimes." Prov. 13:24. There is a difference in loving and correcting a child and domineering him. Love seeketh and findeth a way.

THE RAINBOW ANGEL

(Revelation, Chapter 10)

This is not one of the angels of destruction from the pit of the last vision, neither is he the sixth trumpet angel, but "another mighty angel... from heaven"—a messenger angel using his God-given power against the forces of darkness that had enveloped mankind during the dark and the cloudy day of Catholicism and Protestantism, and to reveal the full gospel message to men. The "little book"—the Bible was opened as never before since the days of the apostles. He also sounds the warning of the sooncoming of the end of all things.

Messenger angels from heaven are symbolic representations of God-sent ministers. This mighty angel represents the ministers of the "evening light" age, as does the angel of glory of the eighteenth chapter. But the rainbow angel reveals prophecy that carries us closer to the end.

The cloud sets forth the glory of God. Much truth had been lost during the dark days. Therefore, there was a need of a renewal of the covenant. The rainbow is a symbol of God's covenant to man. This angel's face beamed with the glory of God. The faces of the redeemed from sectarian bondage light up with the glory of God, as they enjoy their freedom in the courts of Zion.

The "evening light" ministry "cried mightily with a strong voice" (chap. 18:2). The rainbow angel "cried with a loud voice, as when a lion roareth." What did they cry? "Babylon the great is fallen, is fallen," etc. (Read chapter 18:2, 3.) The "evening light" ministry broke the power of deception which had long kept men under its spell. False doctrines were cast down, trampled under foot, as it were, by true ministers of God. This great victory is symbolized by the angel placing his "right foot upon the sea, and his left foot upon the earth." The evening light came to expose the darkness of Catholicism and Protestantism, and to call the redeemed home to Zion, thus crushing Babylon underfoot. The rainbow angel

places his right foot upon the sea, (Catholicism), and his left foot upon the earth (Protestantism) and remains so standing until the end of all things. John was told, "Go and take the little book which is open in the hand of the angel which standeth upon the sea and upon the earth."

The great body of people under the Roman Catholic Church is symbolized by waters (chapter 17:15). Consider the symbolic language of verse one of chapter thirteen, "... saw a beast rise up out of the sea." The objects, "beast" and "sea," are used as symbols, in the prophecy of the developing of the Roman Catholic Church. The beast power (man rule) in the ecclesiastical realm came into existence among the people of Rome symbolized by "sea" (the great body of Roman citizens). Therefore "sea" (many waters) becomes a fit symbol for the Roman Catholic Church.

Protestantism was said to have risen out of the "earth," verse 12. Notice what took place when the first vial angel poured out his vial of wrath "upon the earth." "There fell a noisome and grievous sore upon the men which had the mark of the beast, and upon them which worship his image" (Protestantism). In the description of the redemption from Babylon bondage of God's people (chap. 14:1-5), it is written, "which were redeemed from the earth" (Protestantism). Verse four reads, "These were redeemed from among men" (man-made traps of Babylon). In this case it was the section of Babylon called Protestantism for at the late date of the last reformation all were spiritually dead in Catholicism.

An object is used to symbolize, not itself, but something of like nature. In the vision John was standing upon the literal earth close by the literal sea when he saw the angel placing his feet upon the sea and earth, therefore "sea" and "earth" are used as symbols of objects in the ecclesiastical realm, and must not be understood to represent any part of the literal earth or sea.

Vs. 7. We are living very close to the time of the end. Therefore "the mystery of God" shall soon be finished. What is this mystery? The apostle Paul gives the answer. "Even the mystery which hath been hid from ages and from generations, but now is made manifest to his saints: . . . which is Christ in you the hope of glory." Col. 1:26, 27.

The greatest mystery of all time is Christ Jesus reigning in our hearts, coming into our mortal bodies, giving us victory over all sin and the devil. The working power of salvation will cease to affect the lives of men when they become so hardened that they will not listen to the gospel message. It shall soon be as it was in the days of Noah—all shall be rejecting God.

John, as a symbol of all believers, was told to eat the little book. Dear ones, let us eat the Word of God. It will bring on bitter persecutions, but we must be equipped to spread the gospel while it is still day before the night comes when no man can work.

COMMENTS AND APPLICATION

We need more Isaiahs today to cry out against the hypocrisy in the world. Our nation calls itself a Christian nation but it has forgotten what the word "Christian" even means. The people have a "form of godliness, yet denying the power thereof." (2 Tim. 3:5) Holy Spirit leadership is not recognized. A program of man's making is used in the so-called religious services on Sunday in the huge edifices. The preacher reads his sermon and his prayer to a group who has sinned during the week and comes to hear that everyone sins more or less every day. Many of them can hardly wait until the pipe organ finishes playing for the choir so they can get outside and light a cigarette. This nation needs to awaken to the fact that they have too long followed false prophets. They need some prophets like Isaiah who will tell them that God is tired of this and delights not in it. JOSIAH

Printed Portion 2 Kings 22:1, 2; 23:1-5, 25

- 2 Kings 22:1 Josiah was eight years old when he began to reign, and he reigned thirty and one years in Jerusalem. And his mother's name was Jedidah, the daughter of Adaiah of Boscath.
- 2 And he did that which was right in the sight of the Lord, and walked in all the way of David his father, and turned not aside to the right hand or to the left.
- 23:1 And the king sent, and they gathered unto him all the elders of Judah and of Jerusalem.
- 2 And the king went up into the house of the Lord, and all the men of Judah and all the inhabitants of Jerusalem with him, and the priests, and the prophets, and all the people, both small and great: and he read in their ears all the words of the book of the covenant which was found in the house of the Lord.

- 3 And the king stood by a pillar, and made a covenant before the Lord, to walk after the Lord, and to keep his commandments and his testimonies and his statutes with all their heart and all their soul, to perform the words of this covenant that were written in this book. And all the people stood to the covenant.
- 4 And the king commanded Hilkiah the high priest, and the priests of the second order, and the keepers of the door, to bring forth out of the temple of the Lord all the vessels that were made for Baal, and for the grove, and for all the host of heaven: and he burned them without Jerusalem in the fields of Kidron, and carried the ashes of them unto Bethel.
- 5 And he put down the idolatrous priests, whom the kings of Judah had ordained to burn incense in the high places in the cities of Judah, and in the places round about Jerusalem; them also that burned incense unto Baal, to the sun, and to the moon, and to the planets, and to all the host of heaven.
- 25 And like unto him was there no king before him, that turned to the Lord with all his heart, and with all his soul, and with all his might, according to all the law of Moses; neither after him arose there any like him.

Memory Verse: Wherewithal shall a young man cleanse his way? by taking heed thereto according to thy word. Psalm 119:9.

Practical Truth: God needs people who will not be afraid to stand for right.

COMMENTS AND APPLICATION

Josiah had a wicked grandfather and father. They forsook the Lord God of Israel. Manasseh one time offered his son on an altar to his god. But in spite of this Josiah feared the true God. No doubt he had a good mother. Her name means beloved. We must not follow in the footsteps of those whom we love if they do wrong. It takes courage to do right in the face of the wrong-doing of our loved ones.

God gave Josiah a vision of what needed to be done to bring a revival in his country. No doubt he had to fight all kinds of fears but he boldly declared the will of God. When the word of God was read in the hearing of all, both small and great, God worked with that word and the people promised to keep it. The king then went to work to get rid of that which caused the people to sin. The vessels that were used to serve Baal were burned. He put down the priests that burned incense to the "host of heaven." Real turning to God causes a change to take place. Those who turn to God with all their hearts will have to put on the "whole armour of God" to fight in the battle against sin and the devil. God's people should always take a decided stand against wickedness wherever they see it.

Printed Portion Jeremiah 31:15-17; 33:14-16; 31:31-34

Jer. 31:15 Thus saith the Lord; A voice was heard in Ramah, lamentation, and bitter weeping; Rahel weeping for her children refused to be comforted for her children, because they were not.

COMMENTS AND APPLICATION

The first verses of our lesson are referred to by Matthew as being fulfilled when Herod killed all the boy babies under the age of two years, after the birth of Jesus, thereby hoping to kill the Christ. (Matt. 2:17, 18).

The prophet got a vision of the coming of Christ whom he called a "Branch of righteousness." Through Christ, all who are saved are "Abraham's seed, and heirs according to the promise." (Gal. 3:29). Therefore we who are saved are spiritual Jews and live in the "New Jerusalem" which came down from God out of heaven. Rev. 21:2. 3.

Today we can rejoice because Jesus has come. He taught the way from earth to heaven, then died on the cross for our sins. Thank God he arose and ascended up into heaven. After he left he sent the Holy Spirit. The last part of our lesson tells us what God promised to do through the Holy Spirit. Through forgiveness and the infilling of the Holy Spirit, God writes His laws in our hearts. We can live without sin each day. He gives us power to live according to His commandments. We are "new creatures" through the spiritual birth and have spiritual natures. The old covenant was to be replaced by the new covenant of grace.

NEHEMIAH

Neh. 4:6 So built we the wall; and all the wall was joined together unto the half thereof: for the people had a mind to work.

7 But it came to pass, that when Sanballat, and Tobiah, and the Arabians, and the Ammonites, and the Ashdodites,

heard that the walls of Jerusalem were made up, and that the breaches began to be stopped, then they were very wroth,

- 8 And conspired all of them together to come and to fight against Jerusalem, and to hinder it.
- 9 Nevertheless we made our prayer unto our God, and set a watch against them day and night, because of them.

21 So we laboured in the work: and half of them held the spears from the rising of the morning till the stars appeared.

22 Likewise at the same time said I unto the people, Let every one with his servant lodge within Jerusalem, that in the night they may be a guard to us, and labour on the day.

23 So neither I, nor my brethren, nor my servants, nor the men of the guard which followed me, none of us put off our clothes, saving that every one put them off for washing.

Memory Verse: And let the beauty of the Lord our God be upon us: and establish thou the work of our hands upon us; yea, the work of our hands establish thou it. Psalm 90:17.

Practical Truth: We need to recognize our enemies and fight against them with the whole armour of God.

COMMENTS AND APPLICATION

Nehemiah was a cupbearer for the Persian king. He did not let his place of position and life keep him from having a burden for his people and Jerusalem from which they had been taken captive. The king noticed his concern and, after inquiry, authorized him to lead his people in rebuilding the walls of Jerusalem and bringing the people together.

First we notice there was a burden given Nehemiah from God, then a vision through faith, of what could be done. Next through prayer the answer came. Nehemiah was on his way. Others caught the vision and their faith was inspired and our lesson said "the people had a mind to work." Co-operation is a wonderful thing and is needed greatly in the work of God. We have a great example of what can be accomplished through all watching, fighting and working together. Everything you start to do the devil will contest it. Be assured of that. But we do not need to be dismayed. God will bring us through if we will be willing to fight on and not become discouraged. Oh, for a greater vision of greater things to be done for God! should be the cry of every heart which belongs to God. Let God use your talent in His service.
