Remove Not the Ancient Landmarks

(Part IV)

Let us notice the different conditions of conscience spoken of in the scriptures. Imperfect (Heb. 9:9). Purged (Heb. 9:14). Good (1 Tim. 1:5). Pure (1 Tim. 3:9). Defiled (Titus 1:15). Weak (1 Cor. 8:7), etc. Now let us realize that whatever state and condition an individual's conscience is in it will

pretty well set his course for life. A corrupt conscience would allow corrupt things in the life of the individual without remonstrating against them, while one whose conscience was pure would require strict purity in every phase of life and so on with all the different phases and conditions of the conscience. An imperfect conscience will allow an imperfect life while a perfect conscience would demand a perfect life in order to keep clear. Paul persecuted the Church of God in a good conscience. He said in Acts 26:9 that he verily thought within himself that he ought to do many things contrary to the name of Jesus. We can see then that our conscience can be affected by the way we have been conditioned. Conscience is pretty much governed and regulated by what one believes to be right or wrong. It may be wrong, but if one believes it to be right, his conscience will allow him to do it. On the other hand, it may be right, but if one believes it to be wrong, his conscience would condemn him in doing it. And let us realize that there is such a thing as a "seared" conscience (1 Tim. 4:2) and when that happens the conscience becomes entirely insensitive to anything. This condition is not arrived at immediately but comes gradually through one trifling with his conscience and failing to keep it clear and tender.

I am told that there is in some heathen lands a belief that one can only appease the wrath of his god by sacrificing his firstborn child to the crocodiles in the river. These people take their children to the river and throw them in because their conscience requires that of them and would smite them severely if they withheld. But in more enlightened America our conscience would smite us to death almost if we were to do such a thing. Thus we see that one person's conscience would smite him severely for doing the same thing that another person's conscience would smite him severely for not doing. Thus we see that conscience does not set any kind of a general standard at all and if it did, what kind would it be?

Now let us realize that the teaching of conscience in the New Testament covers only things which are entirely neutral in principle and involve no moral principle of right or wrong at all. Paul brought it in under the heading of eating meat which was sacrificed to idols and said in his discussion of it in 1 Cor. 8:8 that if we eat we are no better and if we eat not we are no worse. This covers a principle that should be applied and carried through all consideration of conscience matters. It applies only to things of an entirely neutral nature which would neither make one better or worse either way. If it goes beyond this into something which involves moral principles of right and wrong, then we are to be governed by God's Word and not by our conscience or what we think about it.

There has been a great cry in recent years for liberty of conscience. But let us realize that this tendency generally runs into a liberal conscience and there is a vast difference between a liberal conscience and liberty of conscience. But God has talked to me some in times past on the text in Gal. 5:1, "Stand fast in the liberty wherewith Christ has made you free, and be not entangled again with the yoke of bondage." People today are contending for a great many liberties which Christ did not give them. He has never at any time liberated you and me from the obligations of His Word and the standard it sets forth. All He has done in that respect at the best is to just be patient and merciful and long-suffering with us and allow us time to get to the standard and get straightened out in our conscience and light, etc. But if we would not try to get to it but just contended for our own "think-so" in it, His patience, long-suffering and forbearance would run out on us and we would be cut off. The liberty Christ gave us was never liberty to follow our own conscience alone as a standard of holiness and spiritual life. Many other liberties which people contend for and do not want to be interfered with in are liberties Christ did not make them free in, also.

God has never given to you and me free license to follow any questionable thing even a little bit but has instructed us to abstain from all appearance of evil. (1 Thess. 5:22.) The more we do this the fuller and richer and more complete our spiritual lives will be and the more God's blessings will abound in our souls. Bro. Fred Pruitt and I were together in a meeting in Minnesota some years ago and were staying in the home of a man who was pastor of the congregation where the meeting was being held. This man was accused to us by some of the members of his congregation that he drank beer. Bro. Pruitt talked to him about it and he never said if he did or did not but his answer was that the Bible said to be temperate in all things and that would include drinking beer the same as anything else and one could not be condemned for drinking beer if he were temperate in it. But the liberties Christ gave never extended to such things as this and He does not grant us license to indulge in any evil thing even temperately.

Now in concluding let me earnestly exhort all brethren in Christ that we all stand fast in one mind striving together for the faith of the gospel and that we all present a solid front against the enemy and stand solidly together to defend the church and the succeeding generations against the innovations of worldly things which today are hammering at our gates trying to push in upon us. Let us see to it that no bounds are removed and no landmarks are destroyed and no corner stones of truth are moved out of their place and let us all earnestly contend together for the faith which was once delivered to the saints. Let us first of all contend for this faith within ourselves that we may possess within us the fullness of this faith with all its fruits, its personal regenerating power, its sanctifying power, its gifts of the Spirit, its unifying power and influence, its personal relationship with God, its miracle-working power and that we may all abound in the fulness of divine love and grace in our personal lives. Let us dig deep in the wells of our fathers and God will surely bless us to be able to meet the problems of our day and overcome them and move on for God. Amen.

Holy Living

"For the grace of God that bringeth salvation hath appeared unto all men, teaching us that, denying ungodliness and worldly lusts, we should live soberly, righteously and godly in this present world." (Titus 2:11, 12).

Not in the world to come only, but in this "present world," the world that now is, we are to live righteously and godly. There is both a negative and a positive side to holy living. Ungodliness and worldly lusts need to be carefully avoided. "Watch" is the command of Christ. "Abstain from all appearance of evil," is the exhortation of the apostle. "O man of God, flee these things," is the warning to Timothy. "Abstain from fleshly lusts which war against the soul," says Peter. There can be no positive holy living if the negative is not in active living force. The Christian life is destructive as well as constructive. Jesus came not only to set up the kingdom of heaven but He came also to "destroy the works of the devil." Life that does not destroy ungodliness, worldliness, and sin is not holy life.

Holy living is the need of the world today. Not just moral, cultured, refined lives, but lives in which there is God and holiness. Carry holy principles into the world if you want to bless mankind to the greatest possible extent.

The question was recently asked, "Is it possible to live holy in this exceedingly sinful world?" To this very hour the prayer of Jesus is heard in heaven, "I pray not that thou shouldest take them out of the world, but that thou shouldest keep them from the evil." A company of tourists were sight-seeing in a coal mine. Amid the black dust there grew a beautiful white flower. "How can a flower keep such pearly whiteness amid such black dust?" was asked by the party. The guide took a handful of dust and threw it on the flower, the dust rolled off, leaving the white-

ness unstained, then a tourist threw handfuls of dust but the little flower smiled in its snowy whiteness. It had a coating of white enamel to which the black dust would not adhere. God will clothe His people with a robe of such whiteness that the evil world cannot soil.

In some parts of our country is a curious spider known as the diving spider. It is capable of forming a bubble about itself in which, like a diving bell, it sinks to the bottom of the lake or stream. For hours it will live below, breathing the air of the world above. When it returns to the surface it is perfectly dry, not the slightest moisture having penetrated the atmosphere in which it lived. The child of God through prayer and holy thought, surrounds himself with a heavenly atmosphere, while he breathes the atmosphere of a world above.

There is power in the gospel of Christ to keep the soul in heavenly victory. "I am not ashamed of the gospel of Christ, for it is the power of God unto salvation" (Rom. 1:16). "Thy word have I hid in my heart that I might not sin against thee" (Psa. 119:11). A company of religious workers were discussing how to create among the people, a great interest in their movement. We have our artistic music, our programs, our picture slides, our pageants, our social gatherings but these all seem to fail to hold our young people, what shall we do next? An old brother present and one that had not yet forgotten the "old paths" answered, "Please allow me to suggest that you try preaching the gospel of Christ."

Holy living extends to all life's details, no acts so small but should bear the stamp of holiness. All our words and deeds should be Christianized. As he who hath called us is holy so we should be holy in all manner of life. (See 1 Peter 1:15). There should be no adulteration of the sugar, no placing the finest potatoes on top of the barrel, no material in the building but such as the contract calls for, no neglected work, the yard stick should be thirty-six inches, and the scales give sixteen ounces to each pound. There should be no exaggerations, no saying five or six when you know it is but four, no endeavoring to make things appear a little better or a little more than they are. Holy living extends to all our words. "Let no corrupt communication proceed out of your mouth, but that which is good to the use of edifying, that it may minister grace unto the hearers" (Eph. 4:29). Filthy, foolish talking and jesting are not consistent with holy living. (See Eph. 5:4). Such is wholly out of place among God's people. There is talk among professors of holiness that is lacking in seriousness and sobriety.

Holy living includes our dress. Women are exhorted to dress in a way that becomes those professing holiness (See 1 Tim. 2:10). It is possible to dress in a way that is unbecoming women who profess to be godly. To know that this is being done is only to go into the many congregations of professed holiness people. You take young people from some of their holiness gatherings and place them beside a company gathered from the theater and there is but

little distinguishable difference in their general appearance—shame!

Holy living includes consideration of others. Holy people do not do all they may feel free to do lest it may be a cause of stumbling to some weak brother. Professor Dager would often take a long walk through the country, his large dog accompanying him. They had a very deep and wide ditch to cross. One day a small dog joined the company. On coming to the ditch the professor leaped across but the big dog would not jump. Instead, he ran up the ditch a quarter of a mile to where he could go down a path and then up on the other side. His instinct seemed to teach him that if he would jump the ditch the little dog would also try it, but fail. For this little dog's sake he would not leap. We should carefully avoid causing any of God's little ones to stumble.

To live holy we must be holy. Holiness of heart insures holiness in life. What is in the heart will break out in the life. A mother lost her only child, a little girl. She had but one photograph of the precious one, and this was somewhat faded and bleached. The mother was quite proficient in painting. Under her brush the features of the sweet coy child-life came out in the picture. The photograph was laid carefully away for a few days. When taken out the eyes were dim and the face marred with the same ugly blotches. The devoted mother wrought over it the second time until the beauty was restored. Again it was laid away only for the same marring stains to appear again. There were some chemicals lurking in the paper on which the photograph was taken that were doing the mischief. The analogy holds in human life. By no act of skill or care can the exterior life be kept beautiful if there is pride. worldliness and selfishness in the heart.

In our talking, dressing, desires, pleasures, occupations, let there be sobriety, righteousness, and godliness. These three things are absolutely necessary to holy living.

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Through the weary centuries God's prophets had foretold of the advent of the Messiah, the world's promised Redeemer. Perhaps the first prophesy is recorded in Gen. 3:15 after Adam and Eve had transgressed God's command. The Lord God said to the serpent that the seed of the woman "shall bruise thy head." Many years passed. The people became so wicked that God destroyed them all by a flood of water except eight souls-Noah and his family. Later God made a covenant with Abraham. After many years the law was given to Israel through Moses. The judges and kings ruled rebellious Israel, and the prophets brought God's words of warning to the people. After the last prophet, Malachi, there followed about 400 years of gross spiritual darkness, a period in which no word was sent from God to the people. Even in this era solitary souls were looking for the promised Messiah. The Hebrew writer speaks of those of "whom the world was not worthy," and further says (Heb. 11:38), "And these all, having obtained a good report through faith, received not the promise."

"But when the fulness of the time was come, God sent forth his Son, made of a woman, made under the law, to redeem them that were under the law, that we might receive the adoption of sons." Gal. 4:4, 5. "God, who at sundry times and in divers manners spake in time past unto the fathers by the prophets, hath in these last days spoken unto us by His Son, whom he hath appointed heir of all things, by whom also he made the worlds." Heb. 1:1, 2. Zacharias, the father of John the Baptist, was filled with the Holy Ghost, and prophesied, saying, "Blessed be the Lord God of Israel; for he hath visited and redeemed his people, and hath raised up an horn of salvation for us in the house of his servant David." As this issue goes to press, the report of the mission activities in Nigeria, W. Africa for the month of October has not been received from Bro. B. U. Etuk and the secretary, Bro. Nse Umanah. Bless His dear Name! "I trust in God, I know He cares for me, on mountain high or on the rolling sea. The valley steep is dark and deep, but O, the Father guards His lonely sheep. The billows roll, He keeps my soul. My heavenly Father watches over me!"

It would take too much space to tell of the Lord's manifold blessings to this unworthy child, but these two following outstanding instances of the great mercy, goodness and mindfulness of the Lord to His unworthy children might prove a blessing to others.

About two months ago my husband was working late in a field some distance from home. Our son, Ted, and his family were staying with us until they could secure a home in the near-by town where he taught school. Upon his arrival home from school, Ted went to the field to finish the evening's work for his father. His two little sons, Jon, age 5, and Barry, 1½ years, went with him to the field and they were to return home with Grandpa. This was unusual as Jon was very timid, not yet being well acquainted with his Grandpa.

When Ted arrived at the field, Husband disengaged the tractor from the seeder and sent Ted to a distant part of the field to finish some discing, and as he was about to return home with the children, he thought he would fill the seeder with wheat in readiness for an early start the next morning. As he climbed upon the seeder, it became overbalanced and turned over on him, catching his foot so that he could not get out from under it. Day was growing dusk. Ted was too far away to hear him call and the frightened children were alone in the car. He called to Jon, but he was too small to help his grandpa. He told Jon to run to the near-by road and call for help if he saw a passing car. Just at that moment a truck came into view. Jon bravely waved and called for help. The trucker went by, but came back to investigate. He extricated Husband from the overturned machine and helped him to the car. His foot was hurt, but no bones were broken and he was able to drive home with the children. How great is Thy faithfulness, O Lord, to me! Let us magnify His great and Holy name!

Sister Eldeen has asked me to relate this experience for the glory of God, as she does not write English.

Sister Eldeen is very frail. She lives with her daughter, and is unable to go about the house freely without a walker. On this occasion, the daughter and family planned to drive to a distant town to spend the week-end with her husband's folks. Sister Eldeen wished to stay at home lest she be a burden. I have often stayed with Sister Eldeen at such times, but it was impossible to leave home at this time. Her daughter was very reluctant to leave her mother alone, and asked a relative to look in from time to time to see that all was well with her mother.

About six o'clock on the Saturday evening of the day the daughter had left, suddenly a great burden came upon me to go at once to see Sister Eldeen. I was very busy preparing supper. I told Husband I felt I must go to see Sister Eldeen as I feared she had fallen and asked if I should get his supper first. "No," he said, 'If you feel you must go, let us go at once," so we started for the city, twelve miles away. When we reached the house, all was dark. I went into the house and called, and I heard her feeble voice from the kitchen directing me to turn on the light. I found that she had fallen from a chair onto the kitchen floor as she was trying to reach to the cat's dish to fill it with water, after she had finished supper. She was lying in such a painful position in the water, and had been there for over an hour, praying fervently for the Lord to send help. She thought, "Who will come to help me? The house is dark and everyone will think I am in bed, and they cannot hear my feeble call." Earlier in the evening the lady had stopped by to see her, and Sister Eldeen told her she was getting along fine and she need not come again as she was going to bed as soon as she had finished supper. There was no human help available. Suddenly this Scripture came to her mind, "Not by might, nor by power, but by my spirit, saith the Lord of hosts." And she prayed, "Oh, dear Lord, send Thy Spirit to cause someone to come to help me." She said she was never so glad to see anyone in her life. And I never was so humbly thankful that I had obeyed the voice of the Holy Spirit. The Lord gave me strength to lift Sister Eldeen into the walker and then to the bedroom and into dry clothes. I haven't been able to write a letter in about 15 or 16 years and I had no idea of ever being able to unless the Lord healed me. After Sister Williams left for Oklahoma, I never wrote for years. After I found that some of the nurses did not mind writing for me, I began to send a letter every month. After a while it became too difficult as they were too busy. We have volunteers here, but I have a speech problem and it is hard to understand me unless one is around me for awhile. One day one of the patients was having someone write a letter for her, so I told the Lord how I wished I could write to Sister Williams for I had not written her that month. Don't let anything blight your sweet virtue and loveliness. When the time comes for you to take your place as a wife and mother and guide the household, you need to be prepared. - 6 The wolf also shall dwell with the lamb, and the leopard shall lie down with the kid; and the calf and the young lion and the fatling together; and a little child shall lead them.
- 7 And the cow and the bear shall feed; their young ones shall lie down together: and the lion shall eat straw like the ox.
- 8 And the sucking child shall play on the hole of the asp, and the weaned child shall put his hand on the cockatrice's den.
- 9 They shall not hurt nor destroy in all my holy mountain: for the earth shall be full of the knowledge of the Lord, as the waters cover the sea.

Memory Verse: Of the increase of his government and peace there shall be no end, upon the throne of David, and upon his kingdom, to order it, and to establish it with judgment and with justice from henceforth even for ever.

Practical Truth: Those who growl like bears need to let the Prince of peace come into their hearts today.

COMMENTS AND APPLICATION

What a wonderful picture of peace is foretold in our lesson! The people were sitting in darkness and they needed Jesus to come as their light to lead them into the place of perfect peace in their souls. But sad to say, some teach that these Scriptures will be fulfilled in a future day, but thank God, we know that when Jesus came, He brought peace. Not many will accept this peace that He has brought. This peace comes into the heart of man. Only the humble and contrite in heart can have it today.

One time Jesus spoke of Herod as a fox (Luke 13:32), thereby signifying his craftiness. He had a fox-like nature. In our lesson it tells us that the wolf would dwell with the lamb. According to the nature of a wolf, it would kill a lamb, but when the Prince of peace came, He was to change those who had a wolf-like nature and they could get along with the lamb. - 6 All we like sheep have gone astray; we have turned every one to his own way; and the Lord hath laid on him the iniquity of us all.
- 7 He was oppressed, and he was afflicted, yet he opened not his mouth: he is brought as a lamb to the slaughter, and as a sheep before her shearers is dumb, so he openeth not his mouth.

- 9 And he made his grave with the wicked, and with the rich in his death; because he had done no violence, neither was any deceit in his mouth.
- 12 Therefore will I divide his portion with the great, and he shall divide the spoil with the strong; because he hath poured out his soul unto death: and he was numbered with the transgressors; and he bare the sin of many, and made intercession for the transgressors.

Memory Verse: But he was wounded for our transgressions, he was bruised for our iniquities; the chastisement of our peace was upon him; and with his stripes we are healed. Isaiah 53:5.

Practical Truth: We love Him because He first loved us and gave Himself for us.

COMMENTS AND APPLICATION

After reading our lesson for today, the words of Jesus came to me in John 10:17, 18, "Therefore doth my Father love me, because I lay down my life, that I might take it again. No man taketh it from me, but I lay it down of myself. I have power to lay it down, and I have power to take it again." How much we do love and adore our blessed Savior, Lord and Master, for His great love for us! He was innocent, but he took our punishment. He was "bruised for our iniquities." When God sees that we have accepted the death of Jesus on the cross for our sins and have confessed them, He looks upon us and sees the precious blood of Jesus covering them and then we can come into God's presence, or into His favor. We become His child.

Just think, He had the power to forego that horrible suffering. He could have called 12 legions of angels to deliver Him, but Jesus said, "How then shall the scriptures be fulfilled, that thus it must be." (Matt. 26:53, 54). These scriptures in Isaiah were written and Jesus came to bring them to pass. Just as all these scriptures were fulfilled concerning Jesus as written in our lesson, so all the promises that Jesus gave will be fulfilled, also. There is a heaven and a hell just as Jesus taught. Central Thought: The Lord wants us to prepare the way for others to come to Him.

COMMENTS AND APPLICATION

After John was born and God gave his father, Zacharias, his voice back, he was full of the Holy Spirit. God's Spirit spoke through him and he knew that God had visited His people to redeem them. He thanked God for the "horn of salvation," which was to come through the house of David, just as it had been prophesied by the prophets. He was to fulfill all the prophesies and even fulfill the oath that He had sworn to Abraham. Jesus did come and today we can rejoice because we have been delivered out of the hand of the devil. When we have salvation we can serve God in holiness and righteousness all the days of our life.

Then Zacharias looked at his baby son and said, "Thou shalt be called the prophet of the Highest: for thou shalt go before the face of the Lord to prepare his ways; to give knowledge of salvation [we can know we are saved] unto his people by the remission of their sins." We find that John was prophesied to be the forerunner of Jesus. (Mal. 4:5). He preached to the people, "Bring forth therefore fruits worthy of repentance."
