Christians Are Saved From Sin

"And ye know that he was manifested to take away our sins; and in him is no sin. Whosoever abideth in him sinneth not: whosoever sinneth hath not seen him, neither known him" (I John 3:5, 6). This is the uniform gospel standard, as we shall see.

1. Christ taught it. Verily, verily I say unto you, Whosoever committeth sin is the servant of sin. . . . If the Son therefore shall make you free, ye shall be free indeed" (John 8:34-36). Here is promised a perfect freedom from the bondage of sin.

In the fifth chapter of John we read of a certain impotent man lying at the pool of Bethesda, whose infirmity was of thirty-eight years' duration. Jesus came along and healed him. "Afterward Jesus findeth him in the temple, and said unto him, Behold, thou art made whole: SIN NO MORE, lest a worse thing come unto thee" (verse 14). Now, it is preposterous to suppose that Christ was unjust, giving a commandment that could not be obeyed—a commandment whose violation was to bring upon the poor man a sorer punishment than he had endured during those thirty-eight long years. It could be obeyed. This man received power from the Lord to go and live without sin.

Again, in John 8:3-11 we read of a certain woman who was brought to Christ accused of great sin. After a short conversation, during which time the scribes and Pharisees, becoming condemned by their consciences because of their own sins, went away, Jesus turned to the woman and said, "Where are those thine accusers? hath no man condemned thee [legally]? She said, No man, Lord. And Jesus said unto her, Neither do I condemn thee: GO AND SIN NO MORE."

2. Peter taught it. "Repent ye therefore, and be converted, that your sins may be blotted out; when the times of refreshing shall come from the presence of the Lord" (Acts 3:19). "Christ also suffered for us, leaving us an example, that ye should follow his steps: who did no sin, neither was guile found in his mouth" (I Pet. 2:21, 22).

3. Paul taught it. "Awake to righteousness, and sin not; for some have not the knowledge of God: I speak this to your shame" (I Cor. 15:34, 35). Almost the whole of the sixth chapter of Romans is devoted to the subject of the Christians' deliverance from sin. I will notice just a few verses wherein it is stated.

"What shall we say then? shall we continue in sin, that grace may abound? God forbid. How shall we that are dead to sin, live any longer therein?" (verses 1, 2). "Likewise reckon ye also yourselves to be dead indeed unto sin, but alive unto God through Jesus Christ our Lord. Let not sin therefore reign in your mortal bodies, that ye should obey it in the lusts thereof" (verses 11, 12). "Sin shall not have dominion over you: for ye are not under the law, but under grace" (verse 14). "Ye were the servants of sin, but ye have obeyed from the heart that form of doctrine which was delivered you. Being then made free from sin, ye became the servants of righteousness" (verses 17, 18). "But now being made free from sin, and become servants to God, ye have your fruit unto holiness, and the end everlasting life" (verse 22).

Some people attempt to prove that Paul himself was a sinner and a defender of sin; but this chapter alone is sufficient to forever settle his attitude as a Christian toward the subject of sin. This point we will refer to again in the present chapter.

4. John taught it. "If we walk in the light as he is in the light we have fellowship one with another, and the blood of Jesus Christ his Son cleanseth us from all sin. If we say that we have no sin [to be cleansed from], we deceive ourselves, and the truth is not in us. If we confess our sins, he is faithful and just to forgive us our sins, and to cleanse us from all unrighteousness" (I John 1:7-9). Here a perfect cleansing from sin is taught, upon condition that we do not cover our sins up and deny them, but "walk in the light" and "confess our sins." And the same writer also shows that we must live before Christ in this sinless state, for he says, "He that sayeth he abideth in him ought himself also so to walk, even as he walked" (I John 2:6). How did Christ walk? Peter affirms that he "did no sin, neither was guile found in his mouth" (I Pet. 2:22). Hence we must do no sin. This is the Christian standard.

So John writes again, "My little children, these things I write unto you, THAT YE SIN NOT" (I John 2:1). In the same verse he goes on to show that "if any man sin, we have an advocate with the Father, Jesus Christ the righteous." This shows that, even if men should by some means depart from the Christian standard by falling into sin, it is possible for them to be recovered, because Christ would be willing to forgive again. This, however, does not in the least weaken the standard here set forth that "he that sayeth he abideth in him ought himself also so to walk, even as he walked" (verse 6). But the apostle goes a step further; he shows not only that Christians "ought" to walk this way, but that they really do. "Whosoever abideth in him sinneth not: whosoever sinneth hath not seen him, neither known him" (I John 3:6. "We know that whosoever is born of God sinneth not; but he that is begotten of God keepeth himself, and that wicked one toucheth him not" (I John 5:18).

"Little children, let no man deceive you: he that doeth righteousness is righteous, even as he is righteous. Whosoever is born of God doth not commit sin; for his seed remaineth in him: and he cannot sin, because he is born of God" (I John 3:7, 9). Reader, mark this fact: John does not say that God's people confess their sins every day or repent of them frequently, but says that they "DO NOT COMMIT SIN." Thousands of professed Christians have asked the question, "Who are those just persons

which need no repentance,' of which Christ speaks" (Luke 15:7)? The answer is very clear: They are the Christians, those who have been born of God; for "Whosoever is born of God doth not commit sin." They need not, and hence could not, repent.

Binding and Loosing of the Dragon

"And the great dragon was cast out, that old serpent, called the Devil, and Satan, which deceiveth the whole world: he was cast out into the earth, and his angels were cast out with him. . . . And they [saints] overcame him [dragon, devil, anti-God spirit] by the blood of the Lamb, and by the word of their testimony; and they loved not their lives unto the death." Rev. 12:9, 11.

It is important to note in this verse that the dragon was "called the Devil, and Satan." We know that the devil, the chief of evil spirits, has worked through many agencies to deceive people in this world right from the beginning of time. We note that this dragon that was cast out is not the devil that deceived Eve in the garden of Eden, but is the idol worship, or paganism, symbolized as the dragon, "called the Devil and Satan." Many are confused on this verse, interpreting it to say that the devil was cast out of God's heaven. But the dragon, or paganism, "called the Devil and Satan," was "cast out" of the ecclesiastical, or church heavens, and this took place on earth.

Let us note that idol worship, paganism or the anti-God spirit symbolized as the great red dragon, "called the Devil, and Satan," ruled most of the world for thousands of years and is portrayed in the Old Testament. The history of the Israelites is filled with their being led away from the true God and into worshipping idols like the rest of the then known world, and being punished by God. When Jesus came, the then known world still worshipped idols, but just the few Israelites who stood true to God did not. After Jesus' ascension, the disciples obeyed His commands to "Go ye into all the world, and preach the gospel." Mark 16:15. Paul was especially sent to the Gentiles who were idol worshippers, and he, and others, faced this huge system of idol worship symbolized as the dragon "called the Devil, and Satan." A spiritual warfare was waged between Christ's followers and this dragon power. Paul and others boldly preached Christ, but they were severely persecuted. When Paul preached at Ephesus, many believed on Jesus and they burned their books of "curious arts," which were priced at 50,000 pieces of silver. The workmen in Ephesus called a trade meeting, saying that something had to be done, or their trade of making silver shrines for the goddess Diana would be destroyed by Paul's preaching of Christ. Demetrius told his fellow workers, "Moreover ye see and hear, that not alone at Ephesus, but almost throughout all Asia, this Paul hath persuaded and turned away much people, saying that they be no gods, which are made with hands: . . . our craft is in danger to be set at nought; but also that the temple of the great goddess Diana should be despised, and her magnificence should be destroyed, whom all Asia and the world worshippeth." Acts 19:17-19, 24-27.

On through the Book of Acts we read about this spiritual warfare going on. Paul and many others gave their lives for the sake of Christ and for preaching the gospel. It is said that they turned the "world upside down" with their teachings of Christ, and the people left idol worship and began worshipping the true God. Acts 17:6. This warfare is symbolized in Rev. 12:7-8 as "Michael and his angels [Christ's followers] fought against the dragon [anti-God spirit]; and the dragon fought and his angels, and prevailed not; neither was their place found any more in heaven [ecclesiastical or church heaven]." God's followers did prevail and the "dragon, called the Devil and Satan," was "cast out" or "bound" as people turned away from idol worship and worshipped the true God. The preaching of the gospel by the early church "bound" the dragon for a long period of time. In Rev. 20:1, 2 the power and Word of God preached is symbolized by the "key" and "chain."

As the Apostle Paul established churches in Asia, he warned them to be careful as there would be those who would rise up among them and draw disciples away with them into a nominal Christianity. (II Thess. 2:3-12: I Tim. 4:1-3). The completion of this deception did take place about 270 A.D. Some political rulers even accepted the Christian religion in name only. They recognized the true God and not idols. This nominal acceptance of the Christian religion gave rise to Catholicism which is symbolized by the "beast" in Rev. 13:2. As the years rolled by, millions were killed when they would not bow down to the Catholic system, as history informs us. "During the long reign of Popery, when the doctrine was be-a-Catholic-or-die, infidelity could not publicly lift its head in which it was cast down by the early Christians." (Smith, Revelation Explained).

We must remember that through these Dark Ages, God had a church consisting of those who would not bow down to the "beast." They had to hide in caves or go underground to worship God. They were not in the general public view. The church "fled into the wilderness." Rev. 12:6.

According to the prophecy in Rev. 20:7, the dragon, called the Devil, and Satan, was to "be loosed out of his prison." The anti-God spirit would again come into view and people would turn against God. The renewal of paganism, atheism, and infidelity began when the infidel Voltaire and his followers worked to turn the people away from the true God. This dragon spirit, "called the Devil and Satan" was loosed and will continue to work until the end of the world.

About 1880, Bro. D. S. Warner and other ministers restored the Bible truths in this "evening time" on the unity of God's people, Holy Spirit leadership, separation from sectism and this sinful world, divine healing and all the teachings of the Bible. God's true people, which is the Church of God, are teaching and practicing these same truths today.

Satan is turned loose against these Bible truths. He works in many forms and manners. He even imitates the truth, but denies the power of God to enable a person to live free from sin. The so-called churches of God today are filled with many skeptics and infidels. Satan is working through Communism and atheism against God's true followers. Forces are combining in the form of the World Council of Churches which the saints of God will not join.

Recently, the archbishop of Canterbury, Dr. Donald Coggan, and Pope 6th had a meeting at the Vatican. The Roman Catholic and Anglican churches have 660 million followers. They have been separated since the fifteenth century. The archbishop said, "What a marvelous thing to meet and speak together for more than an hour in love, frankness, and ease." The Pope said, "It is particular joy for us to gather in this spirit with Your Grace. . . . We must not see such a celebration as a mere nostalgia for the past, but rather as a spiritual reality." We see there is a great move of combining forces for the purpose to "encompass the camp of the saints." (Rev. 20:9). Prophecy is being fulfilled in this end of time. We need to be established in the Lord or the forces of infidelity. Communism, and combined sectism will overcome us. God will take care of His own and will always have a church. The gates of hell cannot prevail against the church. Rev. 20:9 says that God will send fire down from God out of heaven and devour those who oppose God's church. The final judgment will come to pass, and the righteous will be taken to be with the Lord forever.

Subsequently, through the weary centuries the human race was in bondage to sin and Satan until the light of the gospel shone forth with the coming of Christ, the long-promised Messiah, and His redemptive atonement for sin. Jesus Christ, the Lion of the tribe of Judah, came to break the sinful bonds of Satan and

set the captive souls at liberty so they again might serve their Creator in the beauty of holiness.

May God especially comfort the bereaved mother and other relatives.

Bro. George Hammond of Kenosha, Wisconsin, who made a mission trip to the Philippine Islands last summer, still has a burden for those people and for the spread of the pure gospel in those faraway Islands. Again financing his trip as before, Brother Hammond will leave, Lord willing, from Oklahoma City on Sunday, May 29th, by plane for the Philippines where he expects to be in the campmeeting that will be held at Cauayan during the second week of June. Bros. Florencio and Ben Granil, native missionaries in that area, are anxiously anticipating his arrival to aid them in preaching the Word on all lines to establish the believers in the Bible truths. Let us pray the Lord to give Bro. Hammond holy anointing to preach His Word and divine wisdom in dealing with precious souls, and for a safe and profitable round trip to advance the kingdom of God in that needy mission field. It is hoped that a sufficient fund will be provided in time for Bro. Hammond to take with him to purchase a suitable vehicle for the Philippine missionaries to use to carry the gospel more quickly to other villages in the Islands.

Jesus' commission to His Church still reads, "Go ye into all the world, and preach the gospel to every creature." Mark 16:15. What are we doing to meet the challenge? If we cannot go, we can help others to go whom the Lord has called.

Following is a brief historical sketch of the Lord's publishing work:

In the year of 1918, this editor's parents, who then lived in Clovis, N. Mexico, received a definite leading of the Lord to move to Guthrie, Okla. Therefore, in June, 1918, Fred and Mary Pruitt with their four children moved to Guthrie, Okla., driving through in a 1916 Model T Ford car, requiring three days over rough unpaved roads.

In New Mexico, my parents had previously heard and embraced the truth of this Reformation, and were baptized by Brother George E. Harmon, the pastor at Clovis. My father answered the Lord's call to the ministry about the year 1915. At Guthrie he continued in evangelistic and mission work, as well as working with another family in the printing and circulation of gospel literature. In the year 1923, he launched out by faith, and with the aid of a few close associates, he began (free of charge for seven years) the publication of this paper which, by the unfailing blessings of the Lord, has continued and expanded in circulation and effectiveness through the years.

Feeling a definite call of God and seeing the urgent need for world-wide gospel literature evangelism, my father placed all of his earthly possessions, which included several thousand dollars from the sale of his homestead and property in New Mexico, into buildings and printing machinery for the production of Christian literature.

In 1926, the masonry shop building attached to the rear of the frame residence at 611 W. Mansur was torn down and salvaged, and a new masonry building erected at 920 W. Mansur on lots adjacent to the residence on the corner at 924 W. Mansur where the Pruitt family had lived since 1920. Additions have been made to this new shop building. It now covers about 4,000 square feet.

Faith Publishing House is incorporated under the statutes of Oklahoma as a non-profit religious institution, and no one connected with the work receives any personal profit from the operation. All the board members and co-workers have volunteered their services as unto the Lord, and He supplies their needs as He promised.

My beloved parents, Fred and Mary Pruitt, finished their course of many years in the triumphs of a living faith and their works do follow them. Mother went to be with the Lord in October, 1954, at the age of 64 years. My father, who was the co-founder and editor of this publication, departed this life for the Glory World on June 6, 1963, in his 82nd year, concluding 47 years of a very active ministry of the Word by the pulpit and press.

As at the beginning, this paper is still published in the interest of God's people who compose the one and only true Church of God in this "evening light." It stands committed to the teachings and practices of the thirty years of the Reformation prior to 1910-1912, and open for more or additional light, but not "new light" which eclipses or hides the truth which brought forth this precious restoration movement.

Through the hand of God this publishing work has played a major role in continuing the truth of the original movement since the compromise "landslide" of 1910-1912. However, this publication is not officially recognized as the church paper, neither do its publishers aspire for it any such recognition, nor is the Church's headquarters here at Guthrie or any other earthly location. Yet in spirit and in truth, the paper is the servant of the Church as the sub-title and use of its columns indicate.

The publishing work is supported mainly through free-will offerings, as the present small subscription price on the paper (35¢ per year) does not pay the cost of producing it. Then through the Free Literature Fund thousands of papers, tracts, and books are printed and mailed out free of charge. With the postage rates soaring, this is a very large expense item. Where prices on literature are quoted, they do not cover all the costs, so this is primarily and essentially a faith work with the aim to carry the gospel to "every creature" in obedience to the Great Commission which Jesus gave to His Church. A Missionary Fund is also maintained to aid the saints in relaying missionary offerings to home and foreign missionary work.

The Reformation in this "evening time" is really a restoration movement, bringing back to the people the truths and practices which prevailed in the morning Church of the first century. Over the years God has given more light and understanding on His Word.

The National Campmeeting, held annually at Neosho (Monark Springs), Mo., was started in 1938, and the attendance and interest have been increasing ever since. The 40th annual National campmeeting will be held there, Lord willing, this summer on July 22 to 31. You are cordially invited to attend.

Question and Answer Column

Question: Are there "methods" of working for or earning our salvation and healing? I know a preacher who preaches this way strongly.

Answer: No, there are no "methods" of working for or earning salvation or healing. Eph. 2:8-9 says, "For by grace are ye saved through faith; and that not of yourselves: it is the gift of God: Not of works, lest any man should boast." Again, Titus 3:4-7 says, "But after that the kindness and love of God our Saviour toward man appeared, not by works of righteousness which we have done but according to his mercy he saved us by the washing of regeneration, and renewing of the Holy Ghost; which he shed on us abundantly through Jesus Christ, our Saviour; that being justified by his grace we should be made heirs according to the hope of eternal life."

These texts and many more make it clear that salvation is by grace through faith and not of works. I remember a day when God told me straight out that I would be worthy of His blessings only as long as I put my faith in the merits of the shed blood of His Son, and that only, for every favor I ever got from Him. And that as soon as I began to think that He was obligated to me or owed me anything or that I had earned or merited any blessing from Him because of any good thing I had done or any sacrifice I had made or any service I had rendered, that very moment I became unworthy of the least of His favors.

However, we must recognize that the promises of God for salvation or healing or any other favors are conditional promises and the fulfillment of them is contingent upon our doing certain things and meeting certain conditions set forth in connection with the promises. To the sinner seeking salvation the requirements are: Confess and forsake his sins (I John 1:9, Psa. 32:5 and Prov. 28:13), Repent (Acts 17:30, Luke 24:47, II Cor. 7:10-11. Mark 1:14-15 and Acts 3:19), Forgiveness of those who have wronged him (Matt. 6:12, 14, 15, Mark 11:25-26 and more), Restitution-making his wrongs right (Ezek. 33:15 and Luke 19:8) and believe in the Lord Jesus Christ as God's Son and his Saviour (John 3:16, John 5:24, John 8:24, John 20:31 and Mark 16:16). If a sinner does not do all of these things and meet Bible conditions, he can never be saved. It is the same with promises for healing or

any other favor from God. Possibly the minister you refer to in the question may have been dealing with this angle. To teach a doctrine of salvation by works constitutes a corruption of the pure gospel of Christ and is contrary to the doctrine which we have learned and those who teach such things are in error and should not be accepted. (Rom. 16:17).

Question: What part, if any, does God have in psychological healing or modern "Prayer Therapy"? I know this may help some people—neurotics, psycosematics, etc., but it is hard for me to believe God works this way. Am I wrong?

Answer: No, you are not wrong. You are exactly right. God established His own method of working in the early church and has outlined it in the Bible for humble saints and humble ministers to go by. It has never changed. It was not and is not today through the human sciences of psychology, Transcendental Meditation, Mesmerism, Hypnotism, modern "Prayer Therapy" and such like, but is through obeying the plain, simple instructions of God's Word. Some of the afore said things are purely of human origin and some of just plain Satanic origin and relate to witchcraft and should be religiously avoided by Christian people.

In Mark 16:17-18 Jesus said, "And these signs shall follow them that believe; . . . they shall lay hands on the sick and they shall recover." We see this is something that accompanies the preaching of the pure gospel of Christ and is accomplished by the laying on of hands of holy, humble people of God who believe in Christ. Again, in James 5:14-16 we read, "Is any sick among you? let him call for the elders of the church; and let them pray over him, anointing him with oil in the name of the Lord: and the prayer of faith shall save the sick, and the Lord shall raise him up; and if he have committed sins, they shall be forgiven him. Confess your faults one to another, and pray one for another, that ye may be healed. The effectual fervent prayer of a righteous man availeth much." Here again we see that God's method of healing is through the operation of His church by holy men of God under the anointing of His Spirit and acting according to His Word and living holy, righteous lives.

God's Word and God's Spirit are the two agents through which all the work of God is being carried on in the world today, and God's people receive their healing, salvation and all other benefits for both soul and body through faith in Christ, obedience to His Word and the power of His Spirit.

Question: Please explain Matt. 19:9, "And I say unto you, whosoever shall put away his wife, except it be for fornication, and shall marry another, committeth adultery: and whoso marrieth her which is put away doth commit adultery."

Answer: The basic law for interpreting Scriptures—any Scripture and all Scriptures—is known as "Unanimity of Faith." This means there must be a complete accord and agreement of all Scriptures on any particular subject. To isolate one Scripture on any subject and put a private interpretation on it which is contradictory to the general plain teaching of the Scriptures on that subject is to do violence to the Scripture which will destroy the validity of that doctrine or teaching. Charles E. Brown said, "Now we ought not to found a doctrine upon a text

of Scripture of doubtful meaning. We ought to found all doctrine upon Scriptural texts of plain meaning and then interpret the difficult texts by the plain texts." I certainly agree with this statement, and failure to follow this rule in interpreting the above text has led to a general breakdown of standard on this very important doctrine.

Then what is the plain teaching of the Scriptures on the subject of marriage and putting away and remarrying etc.? Without question, it is that marriage is for life and there is only one cause for "putting away" (unfaithfulness to the marriage vow), and that if one marries another while the former spouse is still living, he is guilty of the sin of adultery before God. This is the teaching of all the plain texts in the Bible on this subject, as follows: Matt. 5:32, Luke 16:18, Mark 10:11, 12, Romans 7:2, 3, I Cor. 7:10, 11, 39, Malachi 2:14-16. All of these texts are plain and unmistakeable in their teaching and definitely establish God's doctrine on this subject. Matt. 19:9 must be interpreted by them.

My understanding of this text is that it contains two parts. The Pharisees had asked Jesus if it were lawful for a man to put away his wife for every cause — verse 3. This was the full extent of their question. They never asked anything about marrying another spouse after this one was put away. That was no question with them since that was common practice among them and divorce and remarriage was allowable under the law. They even had more than one wife and lived with them at the same time (polygamy).

In the first part of this verse Jesus answered their question after discussing at some length God's original purpose and arrangement for marriage by saying that the only cause for which a man could put away his wife was for fornication. This relates to Matt. 5:32 where the same thing is stated and confirms the fact that a person has the right to put away a spouse for this cause because it is backed up by two witnesses and, according to God's Word, every word is established by two witnesses. Matt. 18:16 and John 8:17. "Putting away" is all that is under consideration up to this point. Then after He had answered their question He went ahead and introduced His own New Testament doctrine that if one marries another after that one is put away, he commits adultery. This, no doubt, shocked the Pharisees and it is certain it shocked Jesus' disciples by their response to that statement: "If the case of a man be so with his wife; it is not good to marry." Matt. 19:10. It is evident these chosen men understood from what He said that marriage was a binding thing, and if it were that binding and that difficult to get out of, it would just be better to not enter

Therefore, I conclude that according to Matt. 19:9, a man is permitted to put away his wife for the cause of fornication and for no other cause, and that to marry another while that woman is still living is forbidden and to do so is adultery. In Matt. 5:32 Jesus comes out very strong on this point and says if a man puts away his wife for any cause except fornication, he causes her to commit adultery. In other words, he is a contributor to her delinquency for putting her away from himself when she is a loyal and chaste wife. God would hold him responsible right along with her for having done this thing and exposed her to this condition.

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WORDS

"For by thy words thou shalt be justified, and by thy words thou shalt be condemned." Matt. 12:37. May God give the understanding.

In the above text, the words "thy" and "thou" are personal pronouns, and in the following Scripture they mean "your" and "you." "Let your speech be alway with grace, seasoned with salt, that ye may know how ye ought to answer every man." Col. 4:6. Here the apostle tells how our words should be spoken always with the grace of God, not only on Sunday or any special occasion, but every day. The grace of God in the heart will teach us how, what, and when to speak words that will glorify God and please our fellow man. Please read Titus 2:11, 12. "Be not rash with thy mouth, and let not thine heart be hasty to utter any thing before God: for God is in heaven, and thou upon earth: therefore let thy words be few." Eccl. 5:2. There may be times when one word may mean more than many words or a lengthy discourse, if seasoned with the grace and love of God. These and other texts teach us that we shall be judged by the words that we speak and not by the words of another.

Words, whether spoken or written, have a meaning. Some words express love, praise, and joy. Others denote anger, hate, or sorrow. These words and many more are in our vocabulary, and we are at liberty to use them at will. Our Bible is filled with words, as well as our school books, and histories. Of all the books that could be written about Jesus even the world itself, I suppose, could not contain them. John 21:25.

Some folks will try to justify themselves in things which God condemns by using many words. One of old has said, "If I justify myself, mine own mouth shall condemn me." The same also said, "My witness is in heaven, and my record is on high." Job 9:20 and Job 16:19. It is God that justifieth, and not we ourselves. He makes no mistakes. We wonder that if a tape could be made of every word we say from early morning until we close our eyes at night, then play it back to us the next day, what would our reaction be??? No doubt, we would hear words we never thought we said, but hearing our own voice we could not deny them.

One of old was mourning for three full weeks, praying under a heavy burden, when an angel said unto him, "Fear not, Daniel: for from the first day that thou didst set thine heart to understand, and to chasten thyself before thy God, thy words were heard, and I am come for thy words." Daniel 10:12.

God saw and heard Ananias and his wife when they were discussing the money for which they sold their property. They agreed to keep back part of the price and give a certain part, and so they did. Peter said, "Ananias, why hath Satan filled thine heart to lie to the Holy Ghost, and to keep back part of the price of the land? Whiles it remained, was it not thine own? and after it was sold, was it not in thine own power? why hast thou conceived this thing in thine heart? thou hast not lied unto men, but unto God. And Ananias hearing these words fell down, and gave up the ghost: and great fear came on all them that heard these things. And the young men arose, wound him up, and carried him out, and buried him. And it was about the space of three hours after, when his wife, not knowing what was done,

came in. And Peter answered unto her, Tell me whether ye sold the land for so much? And she said, Yea, for so much. Then Peter said unto her, How is it that ye have agreed together to tempt the Spirit of the Lord? behold, the feet of them which have buried thy husband are at the door, and shall carry thee out. Then fell she down straightway at his feet, and yielded up the ghost: and the young men came in, and found her dead, and carrying her forth, buried her by her husband." Acts 5:3-10. They were both condemned by their own words and died accordingly.

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Mixed Marriages

A wise man once said, and I quote: "If you, a child of God, marry an unsaved person, a child of Satan, you can be sure that you will have trouble with your father-in-law—the devil himself."

One of the greatest tragedies of today—one of the most critical problems we face is MIXED MARRIAGES—the union of believers and unbelievers. Every day, some Christian young lady or young man kicks over the traces, rejects the Bible teaching against the unequal yoke, and walks down the aisle with a person who has spurned the Son of God and refuses to live a Christian life.

"But I can't help it, I'm in love with him," Christian young ladies protest. "I don't want to lose him, so I'm going to marry him and try to win him over to Christ."

But is such reasoning sensible? Can you expect God to bless your disobedience? Can you expect your marriage to succeed when it already has two strikes against it? There are enough problems to solve in marriage without inviting trouble over religion.

I Corinthians 7:39 tells us to "marry in the Lord." That means to seek out a Christian companion, one with whom you can share your entire personality and life. As Nelson Veltman says, "It means to be one in the Lord. Your proposed mate may have 'all it takes' in personality, appearance, and like interests. Yet if he or she is not zealous for the faith, you will be separated 'in the spirit' although 'one in the flesh.' God's glory and your life are at stake! Obedience to the commands of the Lord brings Him great glory and endless happiness to your home. On the contrary, disrespect for your Father's Word dishonors God and mars your happiness. You have only one life to live on earth and normally one mate to choose. Marriage is a life-partnership. Your home will be shaped directly by your choice of a companion . . . You are not on this earth to seek selfish joy. God placed you here to glorify Him. When both husband and wife are one in faith and spirituality, there is a symphony of praise ascending to God. Such a home is a bulwark for the Church and the work of God."

Some of you are unmarried young people. May I have your closest attention for a few moments? Let me tell you, after years as a pastor and counselor, that no person is worth the price of a mixed marriage. If you could see the tears I have seen shed; if you could hear the regrets I have heard from the lips of people who have married unbelievers; if you could know their loneliness and emptiness, you would never think twice about even dating an unsaved person. The Bible says that "the way

of the transgressor is hard." You can't play with sin and expect to win. There is only one way to be happy in Jesus and that is "trust and obey."

Marriage is more than a handsome Romeo or delightful Juliet sweeping you off your feet. Looks fade, and personality can flicker and die. The lasting thing in marriage is mutual sharing of love and devotion.

I suppose all of you have heard of Mark Twain, that brilliant American humorist and author. Well, he fell in love with Olivia L. Langdon, a young lady who had been reared in a Christian home, and possessed definite religious convictions. Yet, in spite of her religious teachings, she married Mark Twain, who was far from being an ardent believer. In fact, he is generally considered an agnostic. Because of his love for her though, he did join in asking the blessing and took part in family devotions. But this did not last for long. One day Mark Twain burst out: "Honey... I don't believe in the Bible."

Little by little, his unbelief exerted a deadening influence on his wife's spiritual life. In a time of sorrow, he said, "Livy, if it comforts you to lean on the Christian faith, do so." She sadly replied, "I can't—I haven't any faith left."

This is not an isolated case. Mixed marriages take a regular toll. Marrying an unbeliever is asking for trouble. God help you, and your family, to obey God's Holy Word in II Cor 6:14, "Be ye not unequally yoked together with unbelievers." May you not learn the hard way the tragedy of MIXED MARRIAGES.

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Will All Israel Be Saved?

The Bible says, "All Israel shall be saved" Rom. 11:26. Does God mean that all the Jews will be saved? First, let us notice the origin of the Jews, and the purpose for their existence. When God called Abraham, He told him He would make of him a great nation (the Jews), but His promise went further than that. God said through his seed all families of the earth would be blessed. That takes in us and all who accept Christ, as we shall show, by the oath which God swore to our father, Abraham, "that he would grant unto us, that we being delivered out of the hand of our enemies [inward foes] might serve him . . . in holiness . . ." Luke 1:74,75. Through Moses the literal Jews were delivered out of Egyptian bondage. Through Christ the spiritual Jews are delivered from sinful bondage, "For the promise that he should be the heir of the world, was not to Abraham, or to his seed through the law, but through the righteousness of faith." Romans 4:13.

"Now to Abraham and his seed were the promises made... and to thy seed, which is Christ." Gal. 3:16. "If ye be Christ's, then are ye Abraham's seed, and heirs according to the promise." Gal. 3:29. The Jews were to represent God to the world until Christ came. "For the law was given by Moses, but grace and truth came by Jesus Christ." John 1:17. "Wherefore the law was our schoolmaster to bring us unto Christ." Gal. 3:24. The law of circumcision (a fleshly rite) was given them as a token or a sign of the covenant God made with them and to remind them of the coming of their Messiah, who would cleanse their hearts from sin. Since Christ came "neither

circumcision availeth anything, nor uncircumcision, but a new creature." Gal. 6:15. "If any man be in Christ, he is a new creature." The new birth takes the place of that fleshly rite. (John 3:5). "For he is not a Jew, which is one outwardly, . . . but he is a Jew, which is one inwardly; and circumcision is that of the heart." Rom. 2:28,29. We see by the foregoing that the Christians are the spiritual Jews. Therefore, they are the true Israel of God.

Before anyone can be accepted as a Jew he must be obedient. "If ye continue in my word," said Christ, "then are ye my disciples indeed." John 8:31. Some of them disputed with Christ and contended that they were Abraham's seed, and were never in bondage. But they were in bondage to sin. They tried to kill Christ. So He told them that they were of the devil, though they were Jews after the flesh. He told them they were not of God because they would not obey His Word. (Jno. 8:31-47). They had the first chance to accept Christ, "He came unto his own [the Jews] and his own received him not. But as many as received him, to them gave he power to become the sons of God . . ." John 1:11,12. God didn't reject His people: they rejected Him. They were broken off because of unbelief. (Rom. 11:20). The Jews as a nation rejected Christ, Only a remnant accepted Him. The prophet Elijah felt one time, through discouragement, that all Israel had turned to idol worship and that his own life was in danger. But God told him that He had reserved 7,000 men who had not bowed the knee to Baal. "Even so at this present time also there is a remnant according to the election of grace. Rom. 11:5. "What then? Israel hath not obtained that which he seeketh for; but the election hath obtained it . . . Rom. 11:7. The rest were blinded though they were expecting Christ. He was their hope. All the prophets foretold of Him, but they failed to understand the true nature and purpose of His coming. Had they understood it, they would not have crucified the Son of God (Acts 3:17).

All Israel shall be saved, not all the Jews, but the ones that accept Christ. They are the only ones that God accepts as Israel. "What then? Israel [the Jews] hath not obtained that which he seeketh for; but the election hath obtained it, and the rest were blinded." Rom. 11:7. The election are those who accept Christ. That was God's plan from the beginning. Christ was a "Lamb slain from the foundation of the world." Rev. 13:8. God predestined us unto the adoption of sons. All who accept Christ will be saved and all who reject Him will be lost and that was God's plan from the beginning. "Elect according to the foreknowledge of God . . . unto obedience . . ." I Pet. 1:2. ". . . he hath chosen us in him before the foundation of the world, that we should be holy . . ." Eph. 1:4. "But ye are a chosen generation, a royal priesthood . . ." I Peter 2:9. God is not willing that any should perish but that all come to repentance. "Who are Israelites; to whom pertaineth the adoption, . . . For they are not all Israel, which are of Israel; Neither because they are the seed of Abraham, are they all children; but, in Isaac shall thy seed be called." Romans 9:4,6,7. Isaac was a child of faith. The Jews were Abraham's seed after the flesh by keeping the law. The Christians are Abraham's seed through the righteousness of faith. Abraham had faith before he had works. "For Christ is the end of the law for righteousness to every one that believeth." Rom. 10:4.
