A Brief History of Christmas



December 25 has not always, since the time of Christ, been celebrated as the birthday of our Savior. According to history, there was in earlier times, no strict uniformity in the day for celebrating the Nativity, the different churches disagreeing as to the exact date. Some favored January 2, some January 6, some celebrated May 20, while others fixed the date on April 18 or 19, and still others on March 28. The uncertainty existing in the minds of the historians at the beginning of the third century proves that there was no formal observance before the middle of the century. We have no historical record that our Lord's birthday was celebrated during apostolic times.

The first man to fix December 25 as the correct date, seems to have been Hippolytus of the second century. He believed that Jesus' life from conception to crucifixion was exactly thirty-three years. Since the crucifixion occurred on March 25, Hippolytus calculated that the Annunciation to Mary, or the Conception, took place in the same month, thirtythree years earlier. He decided therefore, that Jesus must have been born in the month of December, on the twenty-fifth day. But the uncertainty of all dates discredits every attempt at fixing the correct date. Indeed, some think it is almost certain that December 25 was not the date of Jesus' birth; for it is then the height of the rainy season in Judea, and shepherds would not likely have been watching their flocks by night on the plains.

The earliest record of the recognition of December 25 as Christ's birthday is in the Philocalian Calendar, which shows that the celebration of that date was a Roman practice as early as 336. An Armenian writer of the eleventh century states that the celebration of Christmas was invented in Rome by a heretic and first observed in Constantinople in 373. The present date has never been adopted by the Armenians; they still celebrate January 6. The church at Jerusalem also celebrated January 6, about the middle of the fourth century. At about this time, the Jerusalem bishop asked the bishop at Rome to ascertain, if possible, the exact date, in order to over-

come the difficulties of nonconformity between the Eastern and Western churches. It is represented that a calculation based on the supposition that Zacharias' vision took place during the Feast of Tabernacles, thus favoring December 25 as the date for Christmas, was submitted to the church at Jerusalem, who, nevertheless, persisted in celebrating January 6, until the year 549 or later. In Egypt, the Western birthday was opposed during the early part of the fifth century, but was observed in Alexandria as early as 432.

Owing to the widespread belief in the earlier centuries of Christianity, that Jesus was born spiritually. that is, adopted as the Son of God and exalted to divine rank and power at the time He was baptized by John, the date of His baptism was considered much more important than the date of His physical birth. During these centuries, little attention was given to the date of His birth in the flesh. But by the middle of the fourth century, the former prevalent belief had given place to the doctrine based upon the first chapter of John's gospel and the Epistles of Paul, maintaining that Jesus existed with the Father from eternity, and that He was absolutely divine from the time of His conception. With the spread of the latter belief, the date of the physical birth of Christ became of greater importance to Christianity.

The date we now celebrate was not fixed by mere accident. The discussions and conclusions of the church fathers doubtless had a great deal to do with fixing December 25; but it is believed that the ancient heathen festivals which were held at the same time of the year, also had a powerful influence over Christianity in deciding the date. Almost all the heathen nations of the early centuries A. D., regarded the winter solstice—the time when the sun reaches its most southern point—as a very important event of the year. It was the beginning of the renewed life of nature and of the gods, and the beginning of the lengthening of days. Especially the more northern countries hailed this point of the winter with great delight; and from the oldest times they celebrated this season with sumptuous festivities. At the winter solstice, the Germans held their great Yule feast in commemoration of the return of the fiery sun-wheel. It is stated that many of the beliefs and usages of the old Germans and also of the Romans were carried over from heathenism into Christianity, some of which survive at the present day. Christianity itself added dramatic representations of the birth of Christ and of the first events of His life. This occasioned the composition of the manger songs and numerous Christmas carols. The Christmas trees adorned with lights and gifts were also introduced with the custom of exchanging presents and preparing special Christmas dishes. Thus Christmas has become a universal social feast day.

December 25 is observed religiously by Roman Catholics and by almost all Protestant bodies. However, the Scotch Presbyterians and the English Nonconformists generally reject religious Christmas observances, holding that such celebration savors too much of Catholicism. It is said that the Puritan founders of New England established Thanksgiving Day as a substitute, in some degree, for Christmas.

We as the saints of God observe the day in memory of the birth of our Savior into this world for the salvation of souls, without any regard to the exactness of date. One thing we do know, that He was born "to save his people from their sins," and that we have by His mercy obtained this salvation. For this greatest of blessings and many kindred benefits, we offer to Him heartfelt devotions on the day generally commemorated as His birthday.

The next spring (1978), the Lord provided me with a trailer to call "my home," yet this didn't solve all my problems, even though it was a blessing to me. I had no personal desire to come, as I had wanted to relax and enjoy the summer, yet my heart was fully yielded to His will.

One day, while talking by phone with my brother Paul, he asked me if I was going to answer the Lord's call. I asked him what that was, as I didn't know at first what he was referring to. He told me there was a need for a worker at the Print Shop. The thought came to me, "What is keeping me from going? All I have to keep me are my two part-time jobs. Although they may be depending upon me for these jobs, I can be replaced. The jobs were here before I was and will be after I leave. I don't feel the responsibility to them that I had to my family. I can no longer use my family as an excuse. They are no longer in business; they no longer need my services. So, I have nothing to keep me." I fell upon my knees and offered myself in all earnestness with no reserves. I made it a matter of serious prayer. I soon felt that God wanted to accept my offer.

I began making preparations to quit my jobs and to move. As I made plans to come to the Print Shop, I found myself yielding to Him more and more. The way was made clear, and I arrived here in Guthrie on June 19 to give my services unto the Lord. The Lord has blessed me since coming.

On either the second or third day after arriving, I felt a feeling of despair. I thought, "What am I doing here? I don't fit. I don't even belong here." I felt like such a stranger. I wished I could just run away. (I have never been very good at facing things.) I just stopped mentally and told myself that I had consecrated to come; I felt God put me here, so I was going to stay here. Then after submitting to that thought, the thought came to me that when God leads us somewhere or to do something, He doesn't want us to just "endure" the thing, but to be happy. After that, my soul and heart just overflowed with joy. Praise be unto God! I think I began singing. Such happiness and contentment I've enjoyed since being here! I can't say that I've not had any adjustment to leaving my former jobs and moving here, because there definitely have been. There have been times of a deep ache and longing to be back home with the dear people I worked with for so long, the work that I was familiar with, but the assurance of God's leadings in these transactions have brought peace to my mind, and there have been no regrets or desires to go back in reality. It's amazing to me. How I praise God for victory in both mind and soul! I know that it isn't the "living here" that has brought it, but it has been the complete yielding of my will to His and resting in the leadings of God.

I appreciate and thank God for all His blessings upon me this year. There have been other special blessings that I do not have the space to tell of. One morning the Lord brought the song to my mind, "Oh, Golden Hours." The chorus goes, "Oh, golden hours will never wait; we must seize them while they come, or forever be too late. Oh, do not wait for something great; do whatever you find to do and do it right." Then all the verses begin with "Up and be doing." It is my fervent desire to remain true to God and always be yielded to His will and to be "up and doing" for the Lord, as we have no time to seek repose in our living for God. I desire your prayers that I might draw yet closer to God.

Question and Answer Column

Question: Please explain Rev. 11:15.

Answer: I will explain this text to the best of my understanding, but I promise you that it will not be according to the general interpretation of this text in most religious circles. I do not understand this text to refer to a future time when Jesus Christ will come back to this earth and establish a universal kingdom which shall reign over all the kings and kingdoms of this world.

Before going further, I will insert the text which is to be the center of this discussion. "And the seventh angel sounded; and there were great voices in heaven, saying, The kingdoms of this world are become the kingdoms of our Lord, and of his Christ; and he shall reign for ever and ever." Please note that this was a permanent, eternal, unending reign (for ever and ever) referred to here; not just a thousand years nor any other measured duration.

This verse of Scripture refers to the glorious triumphs of the gospel of Christ over the entire world and in all nations. Paul said in Romans 10:18, "But I say, Have they not heard? Yes, verily, their sound went into all the earth, and their words unto the ends of the world." Jesus gave the commission in Matt. 28:19, "Go ye therefore, and teach all nations, . . ." The commission of Jesus is recorded by Mark in Mark 16:15, "And he said unto them, Go ye into all the world, and preach the gospel to every creature." As this commission has been executed and the gospel has been proclaimed throughout the world and to all nations, it has had a profound effect and influence, and there have been converts to the Christian faith in all nations and among all people.

When John had a vision of the entire redeemed company in Rev. 7:9, he said: "After this I beheld, and, lo, a great multitude, which no man could number, of all nations, and kindreds, and people, and tongues, stood before the throne and before the Lamb, clothed with white robes, and palms in their hands." In 1 Pet. 2:9 Peter referred to the people of God as "an holy nation." The "Holy Nation" of God is composed of the saved people out of all of the nations. In Eph. 2:14 and 15, we read, "For he is our peace, who hath made both one, and hath broken down the middle wall of partition between us; . . . for to make in himself of the twain one new man, so making peace." The "both" and the "twain" here refer to the Jews and the Gentiles, and the converts from among both of them constituted "one body" (verse 16) and make up the "one new man"-or one holy nation, or one kingdom. In other words, the kingdom of God spread over the whole earth and to all nations and people through the effects of the gospel and there being converts to the Christian faith among all the nations.

The conversion of the Gentiles and their influx into the Church or kingdom of God was prophesied throughout the Old Testament. God told Abraham in Gen. 22:18, "And in thy seed shall all the nations of the earth be blessed." Paul refers to this covenant between God and Abraham in Gal. 3:16, "Now to Abraham and his seed were the promises made. He saith not, And to seeds, as of many; but as of one, And to thy seed, which is Christ." Therefore, it is evident that this covenant was confirmed in Christ, and He fulfilled it, and through Him the kingdom of God extended over all the world because He tasted death for every man.

Isa. 49:6 says, "And he said, It is a light thing that thou shouldest be my servant to raise up the tribes of Jacob, and to restore the preserved of Israel: I will also give thee for a light to the Gentiles, that thou mayest be my salvation unto the end of the earth." In Isa. 42:6 God was speaking to His Son, Jesus, and said, "I the Lord have called thee in righteousness, and will hold thine hand, and will keep thee, and give thee for a covenant of the people, for a light to the Gentiles." Isaiah 60 contains a prophecy of the glories of the Church of God in this gospel age of time, and in verses 3-5 we read, "And the Gentiles shall come to thy light, and kings to the brightness of thy rising. Lift up thine eyes round about, and see: all they gather themselves together, they come to thee: thy sons shall come from far, and thy daughters shall be nursed at thy side. Then thou shalt see, and flow together, and thine heart shall fear, and be enlarged; because the abundance of the sea shall be converted unto thee, the forces of the Gentiles shall come unto thee."

In the second Psalm, all of which is a prophecy of the coming of Jesus and the attitude of the people toward Him, and the effects of His work, etc., verse l says, "Why do the heathen rage?" It has been the general pattern of the heathen throughout their history to "rage" against the true and living God Who gave them their being, by living in open rebellion against Him and His holy will by not honoring Him as God but setting up their own idol gods and worshipping them instead of the true God. By this means, they fell into the deepest depravity and degradation possible. Paul describes the depths of their degradation and the cause of it in Rom. 1:21-32. Please read this entire passage. Psalms 2:8 says. "Ask of me, and I shall give thee the heathen for thine inheritance, and the uttermost parts of the earth for thy possession."

When the Jews at Antioch rejected the preaching of Paul and Barnabas concerning Christ, they turned to the Gentiles saying (Acts 13:47), "For so hath the Lord commanded us, saying, I have set thee to be a light of the Gentiles, that thou shouldest be for salvation unto the ends of the earth." In Dan. 7:14. when Daniel had a vision of the kingdom of God, he said concerning Christ, "And there was given him dominion, and glory, and a kingdom, that all people, nations, and languages, should serve him: his dominion is an everlasting dominion, which shall not pass away, and his kingdom that which shall not be destroyed." In a prophecy concerning Christ's kingdom in Psalms 72:8 it says, "He shall have dominion also from sea to sea, and from the river unto the ends of the earth." Paul declares these prophecies to be fulfilled in his ministry.

The kingdom of God was set up, set in order, and established on the Day of Pentecost, and soon afterward the gospel was preached unto the Gentiles and there were very many converts among them, and the Gentiles were received into the Church of God. So, it is evident that this was all fulfilled in the atonement of Christ and the ministry of the early Church and the converts to the Church throughout the succeeding generations, and that the kingdoms of this world became the kingdom of our Lord and of His Christ through the effects and influence of the gospel.

Islam Religion of the Middle East

In the middle East and north Africa, the Moslem religion is an important part of the people. Except in Israel, Turkey, and Lebanon, most people in this region are Moslems—followers of Mohammed, and speak Arabic. (It is a mistake to believe that all Arabs are Moslems. Lebanon is an Arab-speaking country, but half its people are called Christians. In Turkey, the people do not speak Arabic, but most of them are Moslems).

Since the Moslem religion affects almost everything the people do, we should know something about it. The Moslem religion was founded by Mohammed early in the 7th century. Mohammed lived in Mecca, Arabia, a city that is Holy for Moslems all over the world. Mohammed called his religion Islam. Islam means "surrender to the will of God." Those who follow Mohammed's religion are called Moslems, or "surrendered ones." It is not correct to call them Mohammedans, for Mohammed did not put himself before his people as a god. He said that he was a prophet, or messenger from God.

Mohammed taught that there was only one God. He called that God Allah. There could be no images or idols of Allah. Mohammed set up some rules that all Moslems had to follow, and those they still follow today. First, all Moslems believe in one God, Allah. Second, each Moslem must pray five times a day. (When Moslems pray, they turn toward Mecca, the Holy City.) Third, Moslems are expected to fast (go without food) from sunrise to sunset during the holy month of Ramadan. Fourth, they are required to give help to the needy and poor of the community.

Finally, each member of the Moslem faith must make a trip to the sacred Mosque, or Temple of worship, at Mecca. This religious trip is called a pilgrimage. This pilgrimage should be made during the life of each Moslem. Every year, thousands of Moslems from different parts of the world travel to Mecca to fulfill this duty.

After his death, Mohammed's followers put his words in a book called the *Koran*. This *Holy Book* is considered by Moslems to be the word of God. It is the book used by most Moslem children in learning to read.

Moslems believe that theirs is the only true religion. Each Moslem city has a Mosque, or Temple, of worship. Every morning the Moslem is awakened by a call to prayer from the Mosque. Every Friday the faithful Moslem goes to the Mosque and listens to a reading from the Koran. There are no idols or images in the Mosque, and no one may enter who is not a Moslem. The religious beliefs that Moslems share have brought them close together. These beliefs have been carried over into their day-to-day living and into their forms of government. For example, shopkeepers must close down during prayer time.

These rules of religion may sound good to a lot of folks, and they may argue that these folks have a right to their own beliefs. But I disagree, on the grounds of what Jesus taught us. The Islam religion does not believe on Jesus Christ as the Savior of the world. In fact, Mohammed is their Prophet, but Mohammed died just like any other man, and is still in his grave. But Jesus, the Son of God, arose on the third day, and is alive and sitting at the right hand of God.

"He that believeth on him is not condemned: but he that believeth not is condemned already, because he hath not believed in the name of the only begotten Son of God. And this is the condemnation, that light is come into the world, and men loved darkness rather than light, because their deeds were evil." John 3:18,19.

"And he [Jesus] said unto them, Ye are from beneath; I am from above: ye are of this world; I am not of this world. I said therefore unto you, that ye shall die in your sins: for if ye believe not that I am he, ye shall die in your sins." John 8:23,24.

Those who are fighting in Afghanistan call their war "A Holy War." How could you call anything "holy," when they deny the existence of the Son of God?
