Behind Closed Doors?

"Then the same day at evening, being the first day of the week, when the doors were shut where the disciples were assembled for fear of the Jews, came Jesus and stood in the midst. and saith unto them. Peace be unto you." John 20:19. Here we find the disciples, followers of Christ, assembled on the first day of the week (Sunday) behind closed doors for fear of the Jews. Our burden is that Christ not find us behind closed doors or lacking in our experience and shut off from the lost world in which we live. True, we come together to worship God, but that is not only to strengthen ourselves, but also to gain knowledge and wisdom to take us out in the midst of a wicked and perverse nation to be witnesses for God.

The Greek word for witness is "martus" (Strong's), meaning martyr, record, witness. We are to be martyrs for God. What does a martyr do? He or she gives their lives for the gospel. Not necessarily death, which we often associate with the word martyr, but giving our lives in the service of God. How? By being His witness in this world in which we live; taking what we have learned and becoming fishers of men.

"Glorify thy Son, that thy Son also may glorify Thee"

"These words spake Jesus, and lifted up his eyes to heaven, and said, Father, the hour is come; glorify thy Son, that thy Son also may glorify thee: I have glorified thee on the earth: I have finished the work which thou gavest me to do." John 17:1, 4.

Jesus realized that the time had come for Him to be betrayed into the hands of sinners and suffer many things and be crucified. He had glorified God in doing the will of His Father up to that time, preaching the gospel of the kingdom, healing sickness and disease among the people and doing many other mighty works. He had told the disciples of John, "Go and shew John again those things which ye do hear and see: The blind receive their sight, and the lame walk, the lepers are cleansed, and the deaf hear, the dead are raised up and the poor have the gospel preached to them." Matt. 11:4, 5. He had glorified His Father in many ways, showing His mighty power. He had finished the work that had been given Him to do up to that hour. Now He is desiring His Father to "Glorify thy Son, that thy Son also may glorify thee." The need is different now, but the Father was just as faithful to answer this earnest petition.

We see Him going to Gethsemane and telling His disciples, "My soul is exceeding sorrowful, even unto death: tarry ye here and watch with me." Then He went a little farther and prayed, saying, "O my Father, if it be possible, let this cup pass from me: nevertheless not as I

will, but as thou wilt." Going again to His disciples He found them sleeping and said to Peter, "What, could ye not watch with me one hour? Watch and pray that ye enter not into temptation." Oh, how hard it must have been to be left entirely alone to bear the heavy burden upon his heart, as well as realizing that their failure to watch and pray would result in them failing in the crisis just ahead of them. The Father was enabling Him to be faithful to Himself, even if His disciples were failing. He prayed more earnestly, until His sweat was as it were, great drops of blood falling down to the ground and He received the full strength needed. Here He was glorifying God.

Then came Judas, one of the twelve, and drew near to Jesus to kiss him, saying, "Hail, master." Matthew records that Jesus replied, "Friend, wherefore art thou come?" God was truly glorifying His Son in giving Him the needed strength to bear all this.

They led Him away to Caiaphas the high priest where the scribes and elders were assembled. Two false witnesses came and said, this fellow said, I am able to destroy the temple of God, and to build it in three days. "The high priest arose and said to him, Answerest thou nothing? what is it which these witness against thee? But Jesus held his peace. And the high priest . . . said unto him, I adjure thee by the living God, that thou tell us whether thou be the Christ, the Son of God. Jesus saith unto him, Thou hast said:" Matt. 26:61-64. Truly the Father was giving His Son an abundance of grace that He was able to hold His peace when falsely accused, then He so boldly acknowledged that He was the Son of God, when it looked as though He was forsaken of God, having to submit to them in all they chose to do to Him.

Then He didn't stop there, but went on to tell them boldly and truly, "Nevertheless I say unto you, Hereafter shall ye see the Son of man sitting on the right hand of power, and coming in the clouds of heaven"—knowing that they would condemn Him to death. Surely God was answering Jesus' prayer, "Father, glorify thy Son, that thy Son also may glorify thee:"

They took Him to Pilate, the governor, bringing accusations against Him, but Jesus answered nothing. "Then said Pilate unto him, Hearest thou not how many things they witness against thee? And he answered him to never a word: insomuch that the governor marveled greatly." Truly God was glorifying His Son and enabling His Son to glorify Himself in that hour of trial.

Though Pilate found Him innocent, yet he scourged Him and delivered Him to be crucified.

Then the soldiers took Him and stripped Him, putting a scarlet robe on Him, also a crown of thorns and a reed in his hand. Mocking Him they bowed the knee before Him saying, "Hail, King of the Jews!" They spit on Him and took the reed and smote Him on the head. Then they led Him away to crucify Him.

As He hung on the cross He suffered many things besides the awful physical suffering. They that passed by reviled Him, wagging their heads, saying, "Thou that destroyest the temple, and buildest it in three days, save thyself. If thou be the Son of God, come down from the cross." Likewise also the chief priests mocking Him with the scribes and elders said, "He saved others; himself he cannot save. If he be the King of Israel let him now come down from the cross, and we will believe him." He meekly bore all of this and more. At one time as He hung there He said, "Father, forgive them, for they know not what they do." Truly God was glorifying His Son in giving Him such divine grace to endure to the end.

One of the thieves dying by His side somehow was convinced that He was the Son of God. He said, "Lord, remember me when thou comest into thy kingdom." Jesus answered him, "Today shalt thou be with me in paradise."

God's ways are so different and higher than man's ways. While the world was looking down on Him, deriding, reviling and ridiculing Him, all unknown to them. God was glorifying Him. Now we can read the Scripture in Heb. 12:2, 3, "Looking unto Jesus the author and finisher of our faith; who for the joy that was set before him endured the cross, despising the shame, and is set down at the right hand of the throne of God. For consider him that endured such contradiction of sinners against himself, lest ye be wearied and faint in your minds." Also in Heb. 2:18, "For in that he himself hath suffered being tempted, he is able to succour them that are tempted." We read of how He endured and it encourages us to know that through God's grace we, too, can endure.

Jesus could have prayed to the Father and received more than twelve legions of angels to deliver Him. That would have been easier to the flesh, but if He had done that and saved Himself He could not have saved us, too. The plan of God would not have been fulfilled. Sometimes in our lives God is glorified in us suffering some things rather than being delivered. May we be enabled to know when those times come and be fully faithful to our God and His Son, Jesus Christ who have been so faithful to us.

Editorials

We send this paper forth with the joy of salvation flowing in our souls. We can truly say that God has been gracious to us and we are grateful for the good that we have received at His hand. God is good to all in that He "maketh his sun to rise on the evil and on the good, and sendeth rain on the just and on the unjust." Matthew 5:45.

The world in general is not satisfied with their lot in life. People are continually striving to better their finances and prestige and yet they often are not satisfied. This unrest turns into bitterness toward God for the difficulties in life and is manifested in murmuring and complaining.

We should be careful that the discontent of the world does not take the joy from our lives. There is a murmuring spirit that people acquire. It is contagious. We find that complaining was a common malady of the Israelites and that it brought the wrath of God upon them. The trouble seemed to stem from the outskirts of the camp and those of the mixed multitude. It would then work its way into the midst of them.

To murmur is to spiritually self-destruct. Once Caesar planned a great banquet. The rain poured down and ruined the regal affair. Caesar was so upset that he commanded all of his men to shoot arrows into the air in defiance of Jupiter, their god. The result of the rash anger was that the arrows returned and wounded many of his men. How foolish, we say. However, if we could see the resultant wounds caused to the souls that murmur, we would say that it is even more foolish. Dissatisfaction caused the Israelites to call angel food, "this light bread". Num. 21:5. What did this do to their spiritual life?. Psalm 106:15 says, "And he [God] gave them their request but sent leanness into their soul."

How does God really view murmuring? In Numbers 11:34, it is equated with lusting. This sounds a little strong to us, but God has an intense dislike for complaining. Perhaps the reason is because complaining leads into a broad spectrum of sins. Read I Cor. 10:5-12 and note all the sin that was connected with murmuring in the wilderness.

We need to realize that it is childish and pettish to complain about what we don't have. We must not think that the leeks and garlics of the world will satisfy. It is foolish to allow what we don't have to make us dissatisfied with what we do have. There is something that we can thirst for, and it's commendable to do so; that is more of God. "As the hart panteth after the water brooks, so panteth my soul after thee, O

God. My soul thirsteth for God, for the living God: when shall I come and appear before God?" Psalm 42:1, 2.

We have recently finished printing 2,000 books of "What the Bible Teaches", and have also been busy with other reprinting. This has drained our paper supply. Consequently, we placed an order on Feb. 17th for 6,000 pounds of paper. This expense, as well as that of having "What the Bible Teaches" bound, has placed us in a position of dependence upon the Lord to supply.

Saints who write often mention that they are praying for the work here. We greatly appreciate this. Also appreciated are those who have supported us with offerings and sent testimonies, articles and other literature for print. This is your paper and your interest in it makes its continuance possible.

Recently the President of the United States delivered the State of the Union address. In this speech he expressed his opinion of how our country has progressed in the last few years. where we are now and what our aim for the future is. I have wondered, "What kind of a State of the Church address could be given?"

I believe that it is good to study the era of the early-morning Church and the issues with which it had to contend. It is also well to read the personal experiences of the pioneer ministers. It will give us courage and hope as we relate to what they faced in their day. As we encounter the attacks of the enemy against the Church today, and consider the unknown aspects of the future, we are able to optimistically say, the government is still upon His shoulder. (Isaiah 9:6).

My feelings concerning the work of the Lord are very aptly expressed in the following story. A ship at sea encountered a storm. The passengers were in great distress. After a time one of the men against orders, made his way to the deck and approached the pilot. The pilot saw that the man was greatly frightened and offered a reassuring smile. Then the passenger returned to the other travelers with such words of comfort as these: "I have seen the face of the pilot and he smiled. All is well."

OK—Dear Ones at the Print Shop: I trust all are encouraged in the things of God. Surely God is good to all of us.

I felt I should write my testimony and tell how the Lord miraculously spared my life and glorified His name on November 25, 1985.

It was a very foggy morning and the streets were very wet. I was going south on Highway 75 in Glenpool. There is a traffic light at the intersection of 141st and Highway 75. As I was approaching this intersection, but still a ways from it, an 18-wheeler going north apparently

didn't realize in time that the traffic in front of him was stopped, or maybe he didn't realize the lights were there. There was a pickup in the outside lane and a small car to his left. The truck driver swerved toward the left turn lane but couldn't miss the car. He knocked it into the pickup and then it spun around and hit the guardrail. The woman in the car was killed. Then the truck came across the center median and across all the southbound lanes. As it jack-knifed the back part of the trailer hit my car on the drivers side, rolled completely over my car, and then landed on its side on the north side of my car. The impact of rolling over my car caused my car to turn around and upside down.

Apparently I was knocked unconscious for a few seconds. When I came to I was laying in broken glass and no one was to my car yet.

I didn't know if I was badly injured or not, so I began to pray for the Lord to have mercy and help me. About this time a man reached my car. He was so scared looking that I guess he thought I would be dead. He said he was following right behind me and saw everything. He said, "No one goes through an accident like that and lives, but you did." I told him, "God was with me."

My legs were pinned and I could not get out. Finally they brought something called "Jaws" and pried the door loose on the driver's side so my legs were freed. Then they helped me out on the passenger side. This was about 30 minutes after the accident.

They unstrapped me and I got off the stretcher, walked down the highway to a friend's pickup and my husband brought me home.

The police asked me to come to the police station that night and make a statement. When I walked into the police chief's room, he smiled and asked, "Do you believe in miracles?" I said, "I believe in God." It was almost like they couldn't believe I was alive. One policeman said, "I want to see that woman." They told me that every time they told someone there was a fatality, they thought it was in my car.

My husband and I went to a meeting at City Hall. Just before they closed the woman said she was glad we came, then she told the others on the Board, "This is our miracle Lady." They all knew about the accident and felt it was a miracle that I lived.

Since I have been saved I have desired to see a real miracle performed and I have desired

to see an angel. I saw my miracle. I didn't see an angel, but there must have been one mighty close.

Question and Answer Column by Ostis B. Wilson

Question: Please discuss Isaiah 51:4 and Daniel 12:7.

Answer: This is part number two of this question. I discussed Isaiah 51:4 last month and the focus will be on Daniel 12:7 this time. This

text in its entirety reads thus: "And I heard the man clothed in linen, which was upon the waters of the river, when he held up his right hand and his left hand unto heaven, and sware by him that liveth for ever, that it shall be for a time, times, and a half, and when he shall have accomplished to scatter the power of the holy people, all these things shall be finished."


There are different texts both in Daniel and the Revelation which incorporate this same time period. In the seventh chapter of Daniel, Daniel had a vision of four beasts with the fourth beast being different from all the others and claiming Daniel's special interest. It was explained to him in verse 17 that these four beasts were four kings (kingdoms) which should arise out of the earth, but Daniel's attention was focused on that fourth beast and he made special inquiry concerning it. I refer the reader to Daniel 7:15-25 for a description and discussion of this beast. Please read.

Verse 23 describes his fierceness—treading down, breaking in pieces and devouring the whole earth. The ten horns out of this beast are declared in verse 24 to be ten kings which shall arise, but there was a little horn that came up among the ten horns and subdued three of them (verse 8). Verse 24 also describes another king arising up among these kings which shall be diverse from them. Verse 25 describes this king and his blasphemies against God and his boastfulness and exaltedness. The times were to be given into his hands for a time, times and the dividing of times. This is the same time period used in Daniel 12:7. Both of these powers are described as doing the same work and accomplishing the same thing. Daniel 7:25 says he shall wear out the saints of the most High; and Daniel 12:7 says he shall accomplish to scatter the power of the holy people. Inasmuch as the agents in these two passages of Scripture are allotted the same time period and do the same work and accomplish the same thing, we conclude they are the same. The seventh chapter gives us a better handle to work on, in that it gives a good description and identification of the power, so we will found our discussion from there.
