Caiaphas' Report to the Sanhedrin

(The following is a letter that the high priest Caiaphas wrote to the Sanhedrin concerning the resurrection of Jesus Christ. The letter was found at Constantinople in the Mosque of St. Sophia translated by Drs. McIntosh and Twyman and recorded in *The Archko Volume*.

"To You, Masters of Israel: As I have made a former defence to you, and you have approved the same, I feel in duty bound to communicate to you some facts that have come to my knowledge since that communication. A few days after the execution of Jesus of Nazareth the report of his resurrection from the dead became so common that I found it necessary to investigate it, because the excitement was more intense than before, and my own life as well as that of Pilate was in danger. I sent for Malkus, the captain of the royal city guard, who informed me he knew nothing personally, as he had placed Isham in command of the guard; but from what he could learn from the soldiers the scene was awe-inspiring, and the report was so generally believed that it was useless to deny it. He thought my only chance was to suppress it among the soldiers, and have John and Peter banished to Crete, or arrested and imprisoned, and if they would not be quiet, to treat them as I had treated Jesus. He said that all the soldiers he had conversed with were convinced that Jesus was resurrected by supernatural power and was still living, and that he was no human being, for the light and the angels and the dead that came out of their graves all went to prove that something had happened that never occurred on earth before. He said that John and Peter were spreading it all over the country, and that if Jesus would appear at the head of a host, and declare

for the king of the Jews, he believed all the Jews would fight for him. I sent for the lieutenant, who gave a lengthy account of the occurrence that morning, all of which I suppose you have learned, and will investigate. From this I am convinced that something transcending the laws of nature took place that morning, that cannot be accounted for upon natural laws, and I find it is useless to try to get any of the soldiers to deny it, for they are so excited that they

"I asked John and Peter if they could give me any further evidence in regard to this man; that I wished to be informed of his private history. Peter said that Jesus passed by where he was, and bade him follow him, and he felt attracted to him, but at first it was more through curiosity than anything in the man; that he soon became acquainted with Mary, who told

"After questioning the soldiers and officers to my satisfaction, my mind being so disturbed that I could neither eat nor sleep, I sent for John and Peter. They came and brought Mary and Joanna, who are the women that went to embalm Jesus' body the morning of the resurrection, as it is called. They were very interesting as they related the circumstances. Mary says that when they went day was just breaking. They met the soldiers returning from the sepulchre, and saw nothing strange until they came to the tomb, and found that it was empty. The stone that covered the sepulchre was rolled to one side, and two men dressed in flowing white were sitting, one at each end of the sepulchre. Mary asked them where was her Lord; they said, 'He is risen from the dead; did he not tell you he would rise the third day and show himself to the people, to prove that he was the Lord of life?' Go tell his disciples, said they. Joanna said she saw but one man; but this discrepancy must have been due to their excitement, because they say they were much alarmed. They both say that as they returned they met the Master, who told them that he was the resurrection and the life; all that will accept shall be resurrected from the second death. 'We fell at his feet, all bathed in tears, and when we rose up he was gone.' Both these women wept for joy while relating these circumstances, and John shouted aloud, which made me tremble in every limb, for I could not help thinking that something that was the exclusive work of God had occurred, but what it all meant was a great mystery to me. It might be, I said, that God had sent this message by the mouth of this stranger: him that he was her son, and related to him the strange circumstances of his birth, and that she was convinced that he was to be the king of the Jews. She spoke of many strange things concerning his life, which made Peter feel more interested in him than he would have been otherwise. He said that Jesus was a man so pleasant in his character, and so like a child in innocence, that no one could help liking him after he got acquainted with him; that though he seemed to be stern and cold, he was not so in reality; that he was exceedingly kind, especially to the poor; that he would make any sacrifice for the sick and needy, and would spare no effort to impart knowledge to anyone that would call on him, and that his knowledge was so profound that he had seen him interrogated by the most learned doctors of the law, and he always gave the most perfect satisfaction, and that the sopher or scribes, and the Hillelites, and Shammaites were afraid to open their mouths in his presence. They had attacked him so often and been repelled that they shunned him as they would a wolf; but when he had repelled them he did not enjoy the triumph as they did over others of whom they had gotten the ascendency. As to his private life, he seemed not to be a man of pleasure, nor of sorrow. He mingled with society to benefit it, and yet took no part at all in what was going on. I had heard many tell of what occurred when he was baptized, and from what his mother told me I was watching for a display of his divine power, if he had any, for I knew he could never be king of the Jews unless he did have help from on high. Once when we were attending a marriage-feast the wine gave out, and his mother told him of it, and he said to the men to fill up some waterpots that were sitting near, and they put in nothing but water, for I watched them, but

when they poured it out it was wine, for it was tasted by all at the feast, and when the master found it out he called for Jesus to honor him, but he had disappeared. It seemed that he did not want to be popular, and this spirit displeased us, for we knew if he was to be king of the Jews he must become popular with the Jews. His behavior angered his mother, for she was doing all she could to bring him into notice, and to make him popular among the people, and the people could not help liking him when they saw him. Another peculiarity was that in his presence everyone felt safe. There seemed to be an almighty power pervading the air wherever he went so that everyone felt secure, and believed that no harm could befall them if Jesus were present. As we were in our fishing-boat I saw Jesus coming out toward us, walking on the water. I knew that if he could make the waves support him, he could me also. I asked him if I might come to him; he said to me to come, but when I saw the waves gathering around me I began to sink, and asked him to help me. He lifted me up, and told me to have faith in God. On another occasion we were sailing on the sea, and there was a great storm. It blew at a fearful rate, and all on board thought they would be lost; we awakened the master, and when he saw the raging of the storm he stretched out his hand and said, "Peace, be still!" and the wind ceased to blow, the thunder stopped, the lightnings withdrew, and the billowing sea seemed as quiet as a babe in its mother's arms-all done in one moment of time. This I saw with my own eyes, and from that time I was convinced that he was not a common man. Neither did he work by enchantment like the Egyptian thaumaturgists, for in all their tricks they never attack the laws of nature. In vain might they order the thunder to hush, or the winds to abate,

as the Egyptian necromancers. They use vessels. such as cups, bags, and jugs, and many other things to deceive. Jesus used nothing but his simple speech in such a way that all could understand him, and it seemed as if the laws of nature were his main instruments of action, and that nature was as obedient to him as a slave is to his master. I recall another occasion when a young man was dead, and Jesus loved his sisters. One of them went with Jesus to the tomb. He commanded it to be uncovered. The sister said. "Master, by this time he is offensive; he has been dead four days." Jesus said, "Only have faith," and he called the young man by name, and he came forth out of the tomb, and is living to-day,' and Peter proposed that I should see him for myself.

"Thus argue Peter and John. If Jesus had such power over nature and nature's laws, and power over death in others, he would have such power over death that he could lay down his life and take it up again, as he said he would do. As he proposes to bring hundreds of witnesses to prove all he says, and much more-witnesses whose veracity cannot be doubted—and as I had heard many of these things before from different men, both friends and foes (and although these things are related by his friends—that is, the friends of Jesus-yet these men talk like men of truth, and their testimony corroborates other evidence that I have from other sources, that convinces me that this is something that should not be rashly dealt with), and seeing the humble trust and confidence of these men and women. besides, as John says, thousands of others equally strong in their belief, it throws me into great agitation. I feel some dreadful foreboding-a weight upon my heart. I cannot feel as a criminal from the fact that I was acting according to my best judgment with the evidence before me. I

or the lightnings to cease their flashing. Again, I saw this man while we were passing from Jericho. There was a blind man, who cried out to him for mercy, and Jesus said to me, "Go, bring him near," and when I brought him near Jesus asked him what he wanted. He said he wanted to see him. Jesus said, "Receive thy sight," when he was not near enough for Jesus to lay his hands upon him or use any art. Thus were all his miracles performed. He did not act

feel that I was acting in defence of God and my country, which I love better than my life, and if I was mistaken, I was honest in my mistake. And as we teach that honesty of purpose gives character to the action, on this basis I shall try to clear myself of any charge, yet there is a conscious fear about my heart, so that I have no rest day or night. I feel sure that if I should meet Jesus I would fall dead at his feet; and it (Continued on page 14)

"He that hath ears to hear, let him hear." Matt. 11:15. On several occasions Jesus spoke these words to the people. Such instruction is applicable today. It is important that our perception of spiritual things be keen. Being alert and listening enables us to escape many pitfalls, and also to help others around us.

In order to have ears to hear, we must have a desire to hear. This includes all that God has to say and not just a favorite set of doctrines. A spoiled child will hear only those things which he wants to hear. It is possible for grown people to be the same way when God speaks. The Psalmist David said, "Therefore I esteem all thy

precepts concerning all things to be right." Psalm 119:128.

There is another aspect to hearing. It is possible to fail in being a help to others because we do not hear and recognize their needs. The world is sending out a clear signal of the times that we are living in, yet there are Christians who are not recognizing it. One little boy was telling his father a story. The father said, "Slow down, you are talking too fast." "No," the son replied, "I'm not talking too fast, you are listening too slow." It is possible for us to listen too slow to the changes that are taking place in the world. We cannot afford, for our sake and others, to look at the world in the context of 40 years ago. Let me give an example. In 1940, school teachers were asked to describe the top seven disciplinary problems they faced in the schoolroom. The problems given were: talking, chewing gum, making noise, running in the halls, wearing improper clothing, and not putting waste paper in the waste paper basket. In the 1980's, educators were asked the same question by college researchers. Their answers were: rape, robbery, assault, burglary, arson, bombing and murder. There is a great difference in these answers. These problems may not have reached where you are living, but to be cognizant of the fact that they exist will perhaps in the near future be of great benefit.

Today's society offers not only the portrayal of nudity, but perverted exploits of every type imaginable by corrupt minds. Today's problems do not end with divorce and remarriage, but include the co-habitation of the same sex. The penalty of illicit affairs is not just a shame and reproach, which has to a great extent been removed, but the very real possibility of contracting a deadly disease. The neglect of children pales in the light of the abortions that are taking place. The mention of evolution is not the worst thing that parents should fear in sending their children to a public school, but rather finding that they are being taught "sexual responsibility" by being given free birth control devices by the school health clinics.

We need to have our ears open, an awareness of these things, which are taking place around us. If we have no knowledge of them, we will be helpless in protecting ourselves, our children and others against them.

In one place, Jesus said, "Let these sayings sink down into your ears." This means to give great consideration. I pray that God will give wisdom to know how to incorporate these facts into our everyday lives. —Wayne Murphey

A recent ice and snow storm we had in the Shawnee area is recorded as one of the worst in many years. My wife, Ruth, and I live on an acreage northeast of Shawnee about twelve miles. Question and Answer Column

Question: Will you please discuss and explain the doctrine of Justification?

Answer: Justification is defined in the dictionary as (1) the act of justifying; and (2) The condition or fact of being justified. Justifier is defined as "One who justifies." Justify is theologically defined in the dictionary as "To free man of the guilt and penalty attached to grievous sin."

Justification is the legal aspect of our salvation; the absolving from guilt by the forgiveness of all of our sins. Psalms 103:3 says of the Lord God "Who forgiveth all thine iniquities." As the dictionary defines "Justifier" as "One who justifies" so the Scripture says in Romans 8:33, that it is God that justifieth. Hence; God is the justifier Who justifies sinful men on certain grounds and conditions and for specific reasons. Psalms 103:10-12 says, "He hath not dealt with us after our sins; nor rewarded us according to our iniquities. For as the heaven is high above the earth, so great is his mercy toward them that fear him. As far as the east is from the west, so far hath he removed our transgressions from us." The reason and grounds for God not dealing with us after our sins nor rewarding us according to our iniquities will be seen as we proceed. Another Scripture confirming God as the justifier is Isa. 43:25. "I, even I, am he that blotteth out thy transgressions for mine own sake, and will not remember thy sins." Again in Heb. 8:12, speaking of His new covenant, He would make with the people, God said, "For I will be merciful to their unrighteousness, and

their sins and their iniquities will I remember no more." In the mouth of two or three witnesses shall every word be established (Matt. 18:16; John 8:17) so these texts are sufficient to establish God as the Justifier and He is the only Justifier. If we obtain justification for our sins at all, we must receive it directly from Him. So now we will move on to discuss the grounds on which He can righteously justify us; blot out all our transgressions and remember our sins no more.

Since all human kind was blighted by sin as a result of the disobedience of our foreparents (Adam and Eve) in the Garden of Eden and their sinful state separated all of them from God (Isa. 59:1-2) there existed no point of contact between God and man and no means of approach to Him; consequently no remedy for the doleful condition. But God was not satisfied with that condition because He loved mankind and wanted fellowship with him so He set about to devise a means of reconciliation. In Isaiah 59:16, we read this, "And he saw that there was no man, and wondered that there was no intercessor: therefore his arm brought salvation unto him; and his righteousness, it sustained him." God must bring this about in a way to protect His own character and sustain His own righteousness, holiness and justice. God Himself had decreed a penalty of death for sin (Gen. 2:17; Ezek. 18:4; Rom. 5:12 and 6:23). Therefore the acceptable sacrifice for sin must be one subject to death and the shedding of blood-"Without shedding of blood there is no remission" Heb. 9:22. But man could not accomplish this for himself because the sin sacrifice must be perfect without spot or blemish (Lev. 22:19-20) and no man could qualify here because "All have sinned and come short of the glory of God" Rom. 3:23 and 5:12.

So when God looked over the entire human race and saw no man who was eligible to make an atonement for the sins of the race and qualified to stand in the breach between God and man and act as a mediator, go-between, intercessor between them, He never abandoned the project and gave it up as a bad job. He made Him a man (Jesus) Who accomplished the redemption of the human race (Isa. 59:16 and Rev. 5:1-10). "For God so loved the world, that he gave his only begotten Son, that whosoever believeth in him should not perish, but have everlasting life. For God sent not his Son into the world to condemn the world; but that the world through him might be saved." Ah! folks, here is our redemption and salvation and our ONLY redemption and salvation because Jesus, the Son of God, offered Himself to God a sacrifice for our sins "as of a lamb without blemish and without spot" I Peter 1:19 and Heb. 9:14.

Romans 3:24-26 says "Being JUSTIFIED freely by his grace through the redemption that is in Christ Jesus: Whom God hath set forth to be a propitiation through faith in his blood, to declare his righteousness for the remission of sins that are past, through the forbearance of God; To declare, I say, at this time his righteousness, that he might be just, and the justifier of him which believeth in Jesus." There could be no compromise here if God were to maintain his own character of holiness, righteousness and justice. The full penalty for sin (death) must be paid and it must be paid by one Who was eligible and qualified to pay it; having no stain of sin upon him and no spot of his character if God could be justified in forgiving sin and justifying sinful men. This was the great problem of redemption but Jesus solved it and bridged the gap by offering a total and acceptable sacrifice for sin and dying in our stead and His shed blood was a sufficient redemption for sin. Now, under this arrangement, God can still be God as holy, righteous, and just as He was before and still justify sinful men who will humble their hearts, confess, forsake and repent of their sins, believe in Jesus Christ as God's Son and their Saviour and put their faith in the merits of the all-atoning blood of Jesus Christ and that ONLY for the forgiveness of their sins. Jesus bore our sins in His own body on the tree (I Peter 2:24), He tasted death for every man (Heb. 2:9), and God placed on Him the iniquity of us all (Isa. 53:6). Therefore God can have mercy on them who are out of the way and freely forgive their sins and blot out all their transgressions and remember them no more when they come unto Him by Jesus Christ. This is total and complete justification by God for Jesus' sake.

Romans 5:1 says, "Therefore being justified by faith, we have peace with God through our Lord Jesus Christ." Peace with God is the result of justification. It is sin that breeds the quarrel between man and God and separates us from Him (Isa. 59:1-2). When sins are forgiven and blotted out, the cause of the enmity is removed and peace is restored. This peace is through Jesus, the mediator of the new covenant. Jesus has qualified as the one and only mediator between God and man and to be our intercessor at the throne of grace. We can come unto God through Him in His name and in no other way. Read the following Scriptures: John 14:6; Rom. 8:34; I Tim. 2:5; Heb. 9:15; Heb. 8:6; Heb. 12:24; and Heb. 7:25. Jesus is right now appearing in the presence of God for us mediating and making intercession for all who will come unto God by Him.

But there is one more thing I must add before I close this little article. Let us not settle too cheap on this matter of New Testament justification. We have dealt much on the thought of God forgiving all of our sins, blotting out all our transgressions, cancelling out all of our past life and justifying us and declaring us righteous on the basis of Christ's righteousness and our faith in Him. Wonderful!! But this is only one part of God's process of justification. When He has done this. He then imparts to the justified person a power and grace to have victory over sin and to live a life free from sin. In Acts 13:39, we read, "And by him all that believe are justified FROM all things, FROM which ye could not be justified by the law of Moses." The key word in this text is the word "FROM". God forgave sins under the law of Moses when the required sacrifice was offered. Man was forgiven but that was all. He received no power to enable him to live without sinning so he had to bring his sacrifice again and again. But in justification under grace he is justified FROM those sins when they are forgiven and receives power and grace to live victoriously over sin.

Be Wise

Jesus said, "Be ye therefore wise as serpents and harmless as doves." Matthew 10:16. Being wise as a serpent is being aware of the surrounding dangers. True, there are many physical dangers on every side of which each must protect himself and his family, but the most serious dangers are elements that threaten the decay of

immortal souls. Satan is shooting evil darts at every Christian, aiming to fatally damage the soul.

One agent the devil is using very effectively to damage souls is the broadcasting media. By the newspapers, magazines, radio, and TV reporting a constant stream of crime of all sorts; pornography, rapes, drugs, alcoholism and uncontrolled passions of all kinds, one could believe there are no common, hard-working, good moral people left in America. A special target is the break-down of Christian morals and the family unit.

We often hear or read, "according to a survey," or "results from this investigation." or "statistics show." Writers and speakers are using results from all sorts of investigations to communicate certain desired thoughts. One good example of this is a recent headline which read, "Kids of Working Mothers Do Better in School." This headline and the related article. could make a depressed, a financially stressed, or a tired-of-staving-at-home mother, feel that staying at home just isn't worth the sacrifice she has been making to obey what she believes to be God's plan for her. Especially could this happen when the report comes from a team of psychologists representing two major universities and five years of inquiry. Each of us must be "wise as serpents" and understand that many such reports are seriously flawed. This one was based on an investigation of 573 children from 38 states in the first, third and fifth grades. The children were divided into two categories; those whose mothers stayed at home and those whose mothers were employed. The children of the working mothers seemed to cope better than their peers and showed higher scores. It was not very surprising though, when the non-working mother category consisted of mothers who did not speak English which would make it almost impossible to help their children with school homework. This category also included mothers who were emotionally unstable, alcoholics, drug abusers, those with low intelligence, those who were too ill to work, ones who had no employable skills, some who had children out of wedlock and mothers who were raising several children supported by welfare. The non-working category did not consist only of mothers who chose to stay at home with their children for spiritual and personal reasons.

Reports from such slanted investigations are distrusted in academic circles. Information from such investigations can be used to prove an untruth. For example, did you know that children of larger stature also score higher on standardized tests than those with smaller stat-

ures? You ask, could this really be true? Yes, it is true! Obviously, sixth graders score higher on academic tests than third graders and they are larger in stature. In this instance and in countless others, the investigation tells us nothing about cause and effect. The results from the investigation done on children from working and non-working mothers does not prove the element that the working mother will benefit her child. There were many other influences that were also present to effect the academic scores of the children investigated.

The devil would like for every homemaker to believe that her job is unimportant, and that she is wasting her time. There could never be a bigger lie. The future of every small child is affected greatly by whoever controls his or her early environment. There is simply no substitute of a Christian mother's time and involvement when her children are small. Pre-school, nursery school, nor the best experienced baby sitter can compete with the benefits of a full-time sincere mother. Dr. Burton White, director of a 10-year Harvard University Pre-school Project, says, "Young children of mothers working full time are at a significant disadvantage emotionally and intellectually when compared to those whose mothers remain at home to care for their children. This is not said to place guilt on mothers who have to work. It is only a statement of pure truth."

Every mother must decide from which her child will benefit most; supplying a higher living standard, better clothing, etc., or training in proper values, decision making and coping abilities. Common sense will tell us that children cannot be properly trained when a mother works 40-50 hours a week outside the home, then comes home tired and has to cook, launder clothing, bathe small children, help with school homework and fill the emotional and spiritual needs of her family.

Parents, be "wise as serpents" and do not let headlines such as the following affect your values: "Working Moms' Kids are Healthy, New Study Says," "Kid's Reading Scores High If Mom Works," "Kids Approve of Dual-Career Householder," and "Career Moms Don't Hurt Kid's Chances."

Through many such articles and the news media, the devil is trying to discourage women who are obeying God's commandments to be "keepers at home." He would like to convince us that every mother ought to leave her duties at home and be employed for financial gain. The teenage alcoholism, drug abuse, abortions and unwed teenage mothers and fathers, should prove to any intelligent mother that the best

thing she could be doing is instilling values in her children through her daily care for them until they have made their choice of companions and married, or for some other reason have chosen to leave the home.

seemed to me if I went out I should be sure to meet him.

"In this state of conscious dread I remained investigating the Scriptures to know more about the prophecies concerning this man, but found nothing to satisfy my mind. I locked my door and gave the guards orders to let no one in without first giving me notice. While thus engaged, with no one in the room but my wife and Annas, her father, when I lifted up my eyes, behold Jesus of Nazareth stood before me. My breath stopped, my blood ran cold, and I was in the act of falling, when he spoke and said, 'Be not afraid, it is I. You condemned me that you might go free. This is the work of my Father. Your only wrong is, you have a wicked heart; this you must repent of. This last lamb you have slain is the one that was appointed before the foundation; this sacrifice is made for all men. "Beloved, Let Us Love One Another"

There is much speculation among men as to the character and nature of God. Some look upon Him as a mighty overlord, sternly directing man. Others look upon Him as a loving Father who guides and helps. I would like to share some thoughts and Scriptures about God, His relationship with us and us with Him, and also our relationship one with another.

To begin to comprehend God and His dealings with man today, we must look back and consider His most prominent act towards us; the birth of Jesus. This event was heralded in by a great heavenly host praising God and saying, "peace on earth, good will towards men." This was a direct message from God. He reached out His hand across eternity, down to fallen, hopeless man, and said, good will and peace. God wanted to make peace with man. He in fact turned the other cheek. God's love was not dependent upon how good or holy man was. He loved the most wretched man, without any kind of holding back.

Can we get a clear vision of this love? Think of it as like the sun on a clear, warm day. Its rays fall upon the earth, warming it and causing things to grow. It has a constant output. It does not judge whether or not something is worthy of its life-giving rays. It falls upon all. So it is with God's love. There is no judgment in His love. It is for all men, whosoever will receive it.

Jesus was love personified. (Personify: to represent an abstract idea in the form of a person.) "For God so loved the world that He gave His only begotten son . . ." John 3:16. He gave His only Son to invite man to return to the initial fellowship and communion that God had desired when He created man. God wanted man to be His friend, to share with Him, to talk with Him. He gave all that he could in earnest appeal. Consecration is calling us to return the friendship offered by giving all in return. God consecrated, or dedicated Himself to us and we must return that commitment. It is only then that we are able to enter in to what is called the Land of Beulah and the Holy Spirit is able to enter into us, restoring us to our rightful place in the order of God's plan. God didn't have to do this. "Behold, what love, yes love divine the Father showed to thee, in that He gave His only son, thy soul from sin to free . . ."

At this point, I would like to define some words. In the King James Version, the words love (John 3:16) and charity (I Cor. 13:1) are directly translated from the Greek words agapo:

Salvation is greater riches than all the gold, silver and valuable treasures of this earth summed up together. A treasure that never faileth; a wealth so great that to the happy possessor everything of earth is, in comparison, reduced to dust and dirt.


to love in a social or moral sense; and agape: affection or benevolence, with both having the added inference, beyond measure. Charity means the performance of benevolent actions with no expectation of reward; a benevolent feeling towards those in need. Benevolence means a desire to do good unto others, an act of kindness, goodwill, kindhearted, generous.

This is the type of love God offered to man; a giving love, a sharing love. It is the kind of love that God wants us, in turn, to have toward not only the family of God, but toward all men; unselfishly, without partiality and without restraint. Jesus gave us two great commands. The essence of them are that we are to love God with this perfect love and that we are to love our brother likewise. Brother in this context means fellow man, having one common ancestor (Adam).

God desires that His children have this love, charity and benevolence working continually between ourselves and between us and Himself. The golden bars that held the children of Israel's tabernacle together were types or shadows of this love. It is the bond that holds the Church (meaning all saved people) together in unity, both with itself and with God. It is when this pure love breaks down and people regress into self-love that divisions appear and problems come up. Perfect love is necessary for the Church to continue as a body. Perfect love is not a worldly love, or a sensual love, but the pure love that radiates from God and is an expression of His own being. (I John 4:16).

My last thought is about losing our first love, which is what happened to the church in Ephesus (Rev. 2:4). I respect and appreciate what has been taught on this, but I would like to look at this verse in a little different perspective. When we are first saved we love everyone. We pray for people to experience the same thing that we have. We go to church meetings and we just love everybody. We are so filled with the love of God that we don't think evil of anyone. But so often it happens that Satan begins trying to work strife between brothers and sisters. Slowly the love of God is replaced by ideas, thoughts and things we have heard about each other. What happened to our first love? Where is it? Where did it go? Dear Ones, we need to make sure that we are continually filled with the love of God and not give place to any other spirit. For if our love for one another would fail, where would we stand before God? Therefore beloved, "be ye doers of the word and not hearers only." James 1:22.
