The Fruit of the Generations

Then comes death. We weep over death because life is valuable. Sometimes we don't realize how valuable until death separates the soul from the body. Though a person's life time be as the flower of the grass that soon fades away, we are never expecting death so soon when it comes our way. Loved ones treasure memories of the departed but with the turning of time, they also pass away.

Inhabiting the earth is a new generation. They inherit the pre-planned blessings or the unsolved problems that the old generation left behind. Indeed, there are many ancient prob-

lems still existing today. The nation of Israel continues their war with the Philistines and Canaanites. Their children have never received the blessing of their promised Messiah because they have been told lies about Him. The old cycle of hatred and war will

Recently, the fall programs have been announced and it is terrifying just to learn what 99 percent of America's society will be watching.

CBS has a new sitcom entitled: "Love and War." It is mixed with all varieties of adultery, fornication, and lasciviousness. Fox has a new series called: "The Heights" which is about a rock band in search of interesting women. Need we mention any more?

This type of programing hardens the hearts of men, women, boys and girls. Television has two basic messages: there is no absolute right or wrong and killing is okay if "my hero" does the killing. How contrary this is to the Word of God!

The average television viewer can listen to suggestive language peppered with blasphemy and never feel a bit of guilt. They witness an average of 24 murders in one evening and become excited when the "bad guys" are caught and executed. Are the younger generations learning that human life is yet valuable? Will they become so hardened that there won't even be sorrow when a loved one dies? Already our country is suffering from the low esteem of life. With over five hundred serial killers loose in America today, it seems our government would see that evil corruption threatens public security.

In nature, autumn is a beautiful season when apples turn red and peaches are sweet, that is, if bugs, worms, and flies do not live among them. If the fruit trees are treated with insecticide when the fruit is young, there is less chance of insects destroying the crop. No one likes to bite into an apple and find a half of a worm.

So in our world today, good seeds need to be planted and nurtured in the younger generation. We are already harvesting sin and immorality sown in the past. When red lights on a school bus flash, the average person knows to stop or pay the consequences. Our nation highly esteems this law to protect the youth, but the worst crime is what our society is feeding the minds of our young people. We had said our good-byes to our family in Tulsa, OK, on June 14, and we planned a 26 day trip to different parts of Russia. It was very difficult to leave them this time, especially my wife who had been a real blessing to us and the people last year when we visited Moscow. Bro Bill Lassache was to meet me in Moscow one week later as I first wanted to meet with some of the people I had previously contacted and spend time with them.

I would encourage all young people who desire to work for the Lord, to start now and pray that God will direct you, and should you be directed to Russia, you need to learn the Russian language. It will be a great blessing to those people if you could converse with them in their native tongue the "good news."

My heart goes out to them when I see their plight. The wages hardly make ends meet, and the effect of alcohol is very evident on men and women alike. Their expressionless faces show their dissapointment and struggle for just mere existence. The influx of Western Culture is around everywhere, and sad to say, it is not for the best in every circumstance. Religious confusion is everywhere. Every church seems to want to be first to get their foot in the door. Inflation has climbed to 1000%, and higher on some food and transportation costs.

They need God so much in their country. To send food and money is not the answer. It must come through a relationship with their Maker, not from the government to the people.

We had several experiences in Moscow. Once we got lost in the bus and didn't know where we were. The Lord helped us stay calm and we stayed on the bus till it went around its route and came back to the place I started from. The Lord helped us to not be afraid and we are thankful for His blessings.

Another time when we were walking down a sidewalk near a construction site, eight or ten dirty Gypsies, with little babies on their backs, saw me and cried out, "American, American," They came running after me, grabbing my shirt, pulling my arm and reaching into my pocket trying to rob me. I knew God had to help me. I kept walking faster but they wouldn't give up. I kept one of my hands on my billfold, and I had a belt purse on which I kept my other hand on. They stuck their hands into my pocket and tried to pull my billfold out, but I grabbed their hands, and all at once they took off and ran. It just seemed that God drove them off of me. I learned later there was a Russian man in back of us who started yelling and pushing them away from us. When it was all over I was comforted by the thought again, "I will guide thee with mine eye."

I must praise the Lord at this point and say how grateful we were for God's protection over us. We traveled hundreds of miles by bus, train, subway or car and walked over many dangerous

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EDITORIALS

Time progresses on, and the autumn of the year is upon us. This year is winding to a close to make way for another. It is always challenging to think that just as years have cycles, so do our lives. We don't know how close the end for each of us may be, but as we see wickedness flourishing in the world, we can't help but feel time may be drawing near its close. However, when temporal things seem to be going in a downhill direction, the spiritual part of each individual, and the church as a whole, can be flourishing, growing and expanding. "For which cause we faint not; but though our outward man perish, yet the inward man is renewed day by day." II Corinthians 4:16.

Here is a verse which shows the progression of a Christian. "And beside this, giving all diligence, add to your faith virtue; and to virtue knowledge; And to knowledge temperance; and to temperance patience; and to patience godliness; And to godliness brotherly kindness; and to brotherly kindness charity." II Peter 1:5-7.

Faith is the foundation of the Christian life. "But without faith it is impossible to please him: for he that cometh to God must believe that he is, and that he is a rewarder of them that diligently seek him." Hebrews 11:6. There is a seed of faith planted in the heart of every believer, and it is upon this, that the whole Christian experience is built. One writer said, "Man must be arched and buttressed from within, else the temple wavers to the dust." Another has written, "Unless there is within us that which is above us, we shall soon yield to that which is about us."

The newly-saved person should be concerned about virtue. The Greek Diaglott renders "virtue" as fortitude, which is inner courage. Soon after a person leaves an altar of repentance, he will have plenty of opportunity to exhibit courage in the way of former companions and new temptations. This needed courage is no small thing, but God has the grace, a measure of which is given at the time of forgiveness, that every temptation can be met, dealt with and conquered. When great courage is shown in the flesh, then that person is made a hero; a status only a few attain. In the Christian life, heroism is the norm.

The next need the Christian will feel is for knowledge; knowledge of the Bible and knowledge of God's will. God never places credence in ignorance, unless it concerns sin, but has invited us, saying, "Come now, and let us reason together..." Isa. 1:18. This is an opportunity we should not pass up. Think of the wealth of knowledge contained by God, and to reason with Him will certainly raise our level of comprehension.

The knowledge of God will soon enlighten us that we must have temperance in our lives; a quality the world greatly lacks, and one that even Christians can fall short of. Temperance means control of temper, tongue, thought, will and emotions. This will make for happiness of others as well as ourselves, and is a great testimony to the world of what God can do. A man who was once addicted to alcohol and had lived in poverty because of it, but gave his life to God, was asked sneeringly by a friend, "You don't really believe that yarn about Jesus turning the water into wine?" "I don't know about water and wine," replied the convert, "but I know this, that in my house Jesus Christ has turned beer into furniture! And that is a good enough miracle for me."

Patience is another slant to this Christian life we must all work on. With this virtue, we are discussing something that is getting deep into the experience of the Christian life. If you possess patience, you can possess just about anything. The much reverenced Carthaginian church father, Tertullian, once said, in speaking of the Pharisees and Christ, "They should have known that He was God; His patience proved it."

This thought flows into the next quality the apostle Paul mentioned - godliness. Godliness is nothing more or less than being god-like, and attaining to the admonition which Christ gave, "Be ye therefore perfect, even as your Father which is in heaven is perfect." Matt. 5:48. This is really the goal for man and should be the aim of us all.

Paul went on to include brotherly kindness. This is next to godliness and puts godliness into practical use. Perhaps the Priest and the Levite passing by the man who had been robbed and wounded were godly, but it was the good Samaritan who showed brotherly kindness. Brotherly kindness will be without partiality and hypocrisy, and will do unto all men as we would want them to do to us.

Love is the topping on the Christian life and should flow down and intermingle with all the other qualities. It is love for God that will cause us to have faith in God. Without love for God we will not have the grace to be courageous. Knowledge without love will puff us up. Love will enthrone God as supreme in our lives, causing all temporal things to be secondary and us to be temperate in them. Patience without love is not patience, just a forced self-control. Godliness without love is nothing but a form. Brotherly kindness without love is superficial etiquette.

As our days of life shorten, let us renew our push to possess and gain more spiritually. This is the way we can end this race with triumph.

Their purpose is to help in the rebuilding of the homes of the saints which were damaged by hurricane Andrew. 

About the second or third day I was home from the hospital, I was able to sit up in the hospital bed for the first time since I have been sick. I sit up most of the day and can write and read. I have very little pain now, most of the time, none! That is such a blessing. God is so good. I can sit on the edge of the bed with both feet on the floor for a short time. I hope to be able to stand and get in a wheel chair soon, then maybe walk again. When I think of the way I felt and the way I feel now, I am made to praise God. He has done so much for me. I have trusted God for my healing for many years and I still do. If I am left here for a short period or a longer time, I am happy and satisfied with Jesus Christ my Savior.

Question and Answer by Ostis B. Wilson

This is article number twelve in this ongoing series of articles on full salvation; justification and sanctification.

My purpose in this article is to bring a scriptural distinction and comparison of Old Testament and New Testament justification, and possibly clear up some questions in some people's minds which have been asked at different times.

The justification obtainable under the New Testament economy is far superior to the justification obtainable under the law in the Old Testament economy. In Acts 13:38-39 we read, "Be it known unto you therefore, men and brethren, that through this man is preached

unto you the forgiveness of sins: And by him all that believe are justified FROM all things, FROM which ye could not be justified by the law of Moses." Note, it is stated here that we who believe can be justified FROM all things FROM which they could not be justified under the law.

Justification under the law was obtained by the shedding of blood. Hebrews 9:22 says, "And almost all things are by the law purged with blood; and without shedding of blood is no remission." But in that case it was the blood of animals. Leviticus 6:6-7 says, "And he shall bring his trespass offering unto the Lord, a ram without blemish out of the flock, with thy estimation, for a trespass offering, unto the priest: And the priest shall make an atonement for him before the Lord and it shall be forgiven him for any thing of all that he hath done in trespassing therein." In Leviticus 4:20, 26, 31 and 36 where the sin offering is under consideration, it gives instructions on how to proceed with the sin offering and it says in these verses that "the priest shall make an atonement for him as concerning his sin, and it shall be forgiven him." Also Leviticus 5:10, 13, 16 and 18 which only states the same thing over. The same thing is stated in Numbers 25:25-28.

In all these texts a promise is contained of the forgiveness of sins when the blood of animals is shed. The forgiveness of sins is all that is promised here and that is the only justification they received under the law. But they did obtain pardon and the pardon they received was as good as the pardon we receive through the blood of Christ. Now please do not misunderstand me to be saying that their salvation was as good as ours; far from it. But pardon is pardon no matter on what condition it is granted. But that was the full extent of justification obtainable under the law. Such sacrifices were not sufficient to take away sins. Hebrews 10:3-4 says, "But in those sacrifices there is a remembrance again made of sins every year. For it is not possible that the blood of bulls and of goats should take away sins." Verse eleven says, "And every priest standeth daily ministering and offering oftentimes the sacrifices, which can never take away sins." It is not said here that these sacrifices could not obtain forgiveness of sins, but that they could not take away sins. There is a difference between forgiving sins and taking away sins. For instance, if one who was a liar would receive law justification, he would be forgiven for all the lies he had told, but would

not receive power over the evil habit to refrain from lying thereafter. He had been a liar because he was inwardly disposed to lying and as the law of sacrifices could only provide forgiveness for sins, but could not take away sins, he would not be delivered from the inward disposition to falsify. He would soon be found indulging in the evil practice again and would stand in need of another repentance. Hence there was a remembrance of sins made every year and a big annual day of repentance and sacrifice for sins was observed. Read Leviticus 23:27-29.

In New Testament justification under grace, the individual is actually justified FROM THOSE THINGS from which he could not be justified under the law. In other words, he does not only receive forgiveness for sins committed but he also receives a cleansing of all sinful habits out of the heart, thus enabling him to live without committing sin. Under the law dispensation there was a remembrance made of sins every year, but in this dispensation God says that our sins and iniquities will be remembered no more. (Hebrews 10:16-17.) This is based on the fact that the blood of Christ not only provides forgiveness for our past sins but imparts at the same time grace to live without committing sin. Hence, no further remembrance of sins is necessary.

Justification is twofold. It has a positive and a negative side to it. This is what New Testament justification under grace does. It provides for the forgiveness of all past sins when properly confessed and forsaken, and also provides for a cleansing from the power of all sinful habits and practices, thus enabling one to refrain from committing sin. Old Testament justification did not provide this second ingredient, but only the first ingredient, (forgiveness) and the people were still under the power of sin and had to continue bringing sacrifices for sin over and over to keep up-to-date on their forgivenesses. Grace is a New Testament doctrine entirely. It was not Old Testament doctrine at all. The word "grace" occurs perhaps not over a dozen times in the entire Old Testament, and in most of those references it refers to special favors granted from one individual to another individual, and not of God's special favor to human kind. The grace of God that saves and keeps from sin issued forth from Calvary when Jesus, the Son of God, died to make an atonement for the sins of all mankind.

In I John 1:9 we read, "If we confess our sins,

he is faithful and just to forgive us our sins, and to cleanse us from all unrighteousness." Righteousness in this text refers more to one's outward acts than to their inward condition of nature. Righteousness is a form of the word "right" and signifies a doing of those things which are right. Unrighteousness, then, would signify a doing of those things which are not right, or committing sin.

In New Testament justification, life is imparted unto the soul; the very Christ-life. This was not obtainable under the law dispensation. In Galatians 3:21 we read, "Is the law then against the promises of God? God forbid: for if there had been a law given which could have given life, verily righteousness should have been by the law.

New Testament justification brings peace with God. Romans 5:1 says, "Therefore being justified by faith, we have peace with God through our Lord Jesus Christ." Guilty sinners under condemnation could not have this. Isaiah 48:22 says, "There is no peace, saith the Lord, unto the wicked." Romans 8:1 says, "There is therefore now no condemnation to them which are in Christ Jesus, who walk not after the flesh, but after the Spirit."

New Testament justification produces a holy life. Those who are justified before God do not commit sin but live a holy life free from sin. I John 3:8-9 says, "He that committeth sin is of the devil; for the devil sinneth from the beginning. For this purpose the Son of God was manifested, that he might destroy the works of the devil. Whosoever is born of God doth not commit sin; for his seed remaineth in him: and he cannot sin, because he is born of God." And again in Hebrews 3:1 we read, "Wherefore, holy brethren, partakers of the heavenly calling, ..." In this text the brethren are called "holy brethren," but they were not perfected because the great burden of the entire epistle is to show an advanced degree of grace under the types of the Jewish sanctuary, and is an exhortation to go on to perfection. Hebrews 6:1 says, "Therefore leaving the principles of the doctrine of Christ, let us go on to perfection; ... It also contains an exhortation to enter into that which was not possible before the shedding of Christ's blood. Hebrews 9:8 says, "The Holy Ghost this signifying, that the way into the holiest of all was not yet made manifest, while as the first tabernacle was yet standing." Again Hebrews 10:19 says, "Having therefore, brethren, boldness to enter into the holiest by the blood of Jesus." We are told in II Corinthians 7:1 "Having therefore these promises, dearly beloved, let us cleanse ourselves from all filthiness of the flesh and spirit, perfecting holiness in the fear of God." This perfection is our sanctification. Hebrews 10:14 says, "For by one offering he hath perfected for ever them that are sanctified."

In Romans 12:1-2 we are instructed to present our bodies holy unto the Lord and this is so we can prove the perfect will of God. The will of God is declared to be our sanctification in I Thessalonians 4:3.

All of these texts sum up to the fact that one who is justified is living a holy life free from sin, but that there is another degree of holiness to be obtained which is declared to be "perfecting holiness."

Failure to understand, recognize and maintain a distinction between living a holy life free from sin in the justified experience of justification, and actually having the heart purified, cleansed from the native depravity, and the shedding abroad of the love of God in the heart, and being filled with the Holy Ghost (Read Romans 5:1-5.) by a second definite work of grace, has resulted in some not seeing the need of going on to perfection, or even concluding that there is no such experience for them. This is a very serious mistake and we exhort that no one make this mistake, but diligently pursue your course on into the completion of your salvation.

I write my testimony for the glory of our Heavenly Father, who has so richly blessed my life with salvation and sanctification. All praise and honor be to Jesus.

I was not reared in a Christian home, but was taught good moral values. I always had a fear of God and a respect for my Grandmother who was one of the saints. As a pre-teen I always told myself that I would never smoke, drink, etc. But without the power of Christ's blood in my life, it was impossible to resist the wiles of the

devil on my own strength. At fourteen I began to drink, smoke eigarettes occasionally, and date. However, I said that I would never smoke marijuana or do other drugs. Nevertheless, shortly I began getting high and doing speed. I became very into "me." I started wearing a little makeup at first, which then developed into a full face and I dressed in whatever the world was wearing, whether near nothing or not did not matter.

It was only God's mercy that I didn't sink into devil-worship. As a teenager, satan visited me often to the place where I feared to go to bed at night. I listened to heavy-rock music frequently. I am here to tell those who think that rock music is okay that it is a work of satan to destroy souls and pull them into his domain. I recall one night being pulled out of bed by the leg by satan. To my knowledge I wasn't dreaming but was wide-awake. I was so scared. I knew that I didn't want to go with him, but yet the life I was living indicated that I did. As I stated before, Bro Lassache was to meet me in Moscow one week after I arrived. Through miscommunication I was not sure of his flight schedule. I knew the date, but not the time. It was a blessing and answer to prayer when we arrived at the airport and met Bro. Bill sitting there waiting on us. He said, "How did you get here so fast? I just called ten minutes ago." At that time he didn't know that God had impressed on me to come and get him! We were thankful for the communication between God and us, even though we had miscommunication through people. We were going to a German speaking people in Russia and Bro Bill was a good German translator. We just simply couldn't have gone there without him, but there were different times when we needed to send telegrams or find directions in Russian and we marveled how God would send some English speaking person to help us out. Even when there was no one around that could speak our language, we managed to buy food with my very limited amount of Russian and Bro. Bill using hand signs.

We were in Moscow for approximately two weeks. The next part of our trip was to visit some Saints in Alma Ata, which was a five hour trip from Moscow, and three times zones away. We had no telephone number, nor any real assurance that there would be anyone to meet us when we arrived. Bro Bill was impressed with the scripture that "...Satan hindered us." I Thes. 2:18. We had some hindrances in Moscow and felt there were going to be more in Alma Alta.

After the plane landed and we unloaded our luggage, we headed for the terminal where we walked right up to Bro. Reiberg and his son-in-law.

Our reception was not very warm and we didn't know what we were in for, but they kindly loaded our luggage on the car and we were off to Bro. Reiberg's home.

Bro Reiberg is 71 years old and lives by himself. His wife died 11 years ago. He had contacted the "Faith Publishing House" in 1989, wanting gospel tracts and information about some of C.C. Carver's works etc. We stayed up until 4:00 A.M. after our arrival visiting with him about many things. He thought we were from another group of people who he had no confidence in. Finally we said, "Bro. Reiberg, why don't you ask God who we are? He can reveal us to you by the Spirit of God." With that we went to bed and got a few hours rest.

The next morning Bro. Reiberg came into the bedroom where Bro. Bill and I were sleeping. He said that he was praying and asking God about us, and that God revealed to him that we were the children of God. It was such a blessing! Tears came into his eyes and he then greeted us like brethren.

We learned many things about how the saints have lived in times of persecution from without and within.

There were times when the congregation reached 300-400 people. Now it numbers scarcely a dozen. Many who once were close to God have either moved away in body or moved away in spirit.

We shared many things together. It seemed the eight days we were to stay there with him were gone before we knew it. On Wednesday they assembled for prayer meeting. As we were about to enter one of the sister's apartments, he asked us "Are you truly Abraham's seed?" We confirmed that we were indeed. He then smiled and we headed toward the apartment. It was a very exciting time to see them come one by one into the small living room. There were approximately 12 people. At 6:00 Bro Reiberg stood up and told the congregation all about us. Everyone started weeping and he walked over to us and greeted us like brethren. It was a special

time. They marveled at how we could find them, not speaking their language, traveling half way around the world, and they being so few. I told them the scripture the Lord had given me in Ps. 36:8 how he would guide us with His eye. We had a good worship service for 1 1/2 hours, then we ate supper. They really treated us well.

The eight days we spent there were full of travel visiting his little flock, and learning about many things the church has experienced in Russia since the early 1900's. The Bible was banned from reading in public or private by the authorities, so they hid the word of God in their hearts, and also hid their Bibles in the forest under trees and under the leaves.

They were called in question many times by government officials, but since they were never registered as a church with the government, the officials didn't feel a threat from them. Thus they had a minimum amount of persecution from them. Stalin closed all churches in 1932-1946. Bro. Reiberg says it was an act of God because of corruption that was in the churches.

There was little working for God at this time. It was a dark period. Bro. Reiberg was saved in 1946 and sanctified one year later. Because of the Reiberg's love for God they were persecuted and lost all their possessions.

They were in labor camps from 1935-1941, then they were moved farther north until 1959. There is much that happened to these poor people that we don't feel would be beneficial to talk about, but Bro Reiberg was blessed to be the only man in his camp of 15 who survived. All others died of hunger and cold.

They have two Church of God songbooks, one in German and one in Russian. Most of the time they use the German songs. They just don't have enough of the songbooks. We felt a burden to have more copies made of the Russian songbook, so they loaned us one of their's and we are in the process of having more made. It's so sweet to hear them sing the songs of Zion half way around the world. They seem to have plenty of Bibles there, and Bro Wayne gave us many tracts and books which they were very thankful for. We had many experiences there and can truly say God guided us with His eye.

There are many opportunities for a consecrated couple to go over there and work for God. Many people asked us if we could come or if we knew someone else who could come. May God stir our hearts to be up and doing our Father's business.
