The Kingdom of God is Mutual Aid

The kingdom of God is within you! The kingdom of God is among you! It is stamped into our relationships with one another—it is the way we are made to live corporately. A college professor tells of how as a boy he and another boy were on a seesaw and were playing nicely until the idea struck him of jumping off when his end was down, letting the other boy down with a crash. The other boy then refused to play with him. Finally he persuaded him to play again, and then the other boy let him down in the same way, with the same crash. Then neither one would trust the other; so the play ended permanently. The one boy broke the law of friendship, and in the end lost the friendship of the other boy-and the game.

You cannot violate the law of love any more than you can violate the law of gravity and not get hurt. Suppose the law of mutual aid, which is the law of life among the organs and members of our bodies, should be violated by the members—the stomach falling out with the heart and refusing to give it nourishment; the heart retaliating and refusing to give the stomach any blood; the feet refusing to cooperate with each other, one going in one direction and the other in the other: the arteries and the veins refusing to cooperate, the arteries withholding pure blood and the veins holding up the elimination of impurities—in short, if the organs of the body became selfish and competitive instead of unselfish and cooperative, the whole system would collapse, and with it the parts. If the parts would save their life in selfcenteredness, they would lose it. Only as they lose themselves in the interest of the whole, do they find themselves again.

This law of mutual aid is not something imposed on the body from without as a decree.

It is written into the very constitution of its being. As no one has imposed the law, so no one imposes the penalties. They are inherent and self-acting. Break the law of mutual aid, and the results come automatically.

Filling The Vacuum

Continued from last month.

I have thought different times about just one degree. You might think, "What is one degree?" To a lot of people one degree means nothing. You can change the temperature in here one degree and most of us won't notice it. But if you want to make steam, you will never make it at two hundred and eleven degrees. Water will set all day long and never make steam at two hundred and eleven degrees. It just won't happen.

One degree means the difference in a locomotive taking off, building up steam and starting to pull a quarter of a mile long load of cars behind it. One degree is important, and little things are important, too. It is the little projects, like throwing your socks in the corner when you should have picked them up. It is not taking care of the small things and continually pulling and drawing out of the home instead of putting in. One degree means the difference, and one little thing, many times, is the difference in us making it and not making it in relationships.

May the Lord help you and me tonight to be able to recognize our needs. Maybe I have been taking my children for granted. Maybe you wives haven't been doing what you could for your husband. Maybe there are some areas that you need to improve on.

To keep a balanced relationship, we must keep the pressure at a minimum. Don't let things pile up and accumulate and get higher and higher until it suffocates all the love and the compassion, and the home becomes just an empty shell.

My heart is burdened tonight that we see some areas in our lives, and not just see them, and say, "Oh, that was really a good message. I'll fix all the doorknobs." May we go home and be a changed people. I like the song that says, "Lord, I'm so tired of being stirred and not being changed." Get a glass of water and stir it up, then set it down, and all the dregs will fall to the bottom when it settles down.

We are wanting the blessings of the Lord in our married life, aren't we? I tell you, these things bring the blessings of the Lord. It will be in the small things that you gain ground with God. Don't be out looking for great big things. You take care of the little things, and the big things will happen in their own time. I know they will, and I know these things work.

If there is a vacuum in the home, the husband and wife become a little bit estranged from each other. When they're not warm anymore, what do you think happens? There will be somebody else that comes along and gives the attention they crave. The vacuum will be filled someway, somehow. This is going on all the time, and marriages fail.

Christ said, "Because iniquity shall abound, the love of many shall wax cold." Have you ever seen how wise the world is? Just take a look. How many fast food restaurants were there twenty years ago? Just look at how many there are now. We can see something happening right here. Why did they all of a sudden spring up? Where did they come from? Did somebody just start learning how to cook chicken and hamburgers? I still like my mom's hamburgers and I would rather have her fried chicken than anybody else's.

You might say, "Well, we're just so fast paced." Yes, both parties are working, and they don't have time. The fast food business says, "We will fill the vacuum. You don't have to cook anymore. We will do all the cooking for you." They're smart, aren't they? They reached right in there and filled that void and vacuum that was left in the home.

The Bible said in the book of Timothy, "Men in the last days shall be...lovers of pleasures more than lovers of God." All I have to do to make big money is to find out what pleases the flesh. A lot of the false religions in the world have hatched out because of a vacuum created by

religious professors. The Bible said they would heap to themselves teachers having itching ears. The itching ear was because they didn't have a love for the truth.

There are a lot of vacuums that are being filled tonight, and I hope that you and I are not responsible for creating them. I hope that you and I have a home life that is filling the needs of our children. Children can see if Mom and Dad have the love of God. If they love the Lord and there is warmth, the children feel at home. But I want to tell you, there are a lot of children who don't know the meaning of a functional home. They don't have any idea what it is like to have

Mom and Dad together. They live either with Mom, or they live with Dad, and that is a terrible vacuum. Children and young people are growing up and wanting to reach out and grab hold of something. They are hungry, and the thing that the devil presents to them many times is not what they really need.

You see, if we miss out on this important truth, it is not just Mom and Dad who lose; it is the children. If the children grow up not knowing the meaning of

an established home, they tend to have the same problems in their married life, because Mom and Dad never did get along together.

It is a dangerous thing for us to go on in a vacuum. It just doesn't work, and we will suffer the consequences if we don't realize and take advantage of the things that God has provided for us. In I Peter it says that God has given us all things that pertain to life and godliness. He will fill all the longings of the heart; all the longings of the home; whatever we need.

I took a young man and my boys out on a little canoe trip. We have a quiet little stream that we like to go to. We took an old tent, and spent the night out. That young man just came to life. He told me, "You know, my dad never did do things like this with me. He would always say, 'Here, take two hundred dollars and go have a good time.'" His dad was very wealthy, but he never did say, "Let's go do something together." He expected money to fill a vacuum. It doesn't work. You can't say, "Honey, I love

you. Here is some money. Go have a good time." She didn't marry you for money. She married you because she loved you and she wants you. If money is all you have between you, your marriage is in trouble.

What does the Bible say in Proverbs? Better it is to have a dry morsel where love is, than where there is a stalled ox and hatred therewith. The stalled ox, the material things alone, don't bring happiness.

In II Kings the 6th and 7th chapters we read, "And there was a great famine in Samaria: and, behold, they besieged it,..." Do you know what besieged means? People in war know that if they


can cut off everything coming in and going out, they will soon starve the people to death. Our government imposes embargoes and sanctions on other countries to pressure them to come under certain demands.

It said, "An ass's head was sold for fourscore pieces of silver, and the fourth part of a cab of dove's dung for five pieces of silver." Now I don't know how many of you have ever seen an old donkey's head on a plate. Imagine

sitting down to eat that. What kind of fight do you think there would be for part of that head? There is a grab for drumsticks or the breast, but what kind of run is there going to be on a donkey's head? These people were starving to death. Do you know that there are a lot of people in life who are just like this? The things of the world that fill their vacuum have kept them held up in places. They are in little dens starving to death. We can read on about how intense hunger was in these people.

It says in the 26th and 27th verses, "And as the king of Israel was passing by upon the wall, there cried a woman unto him, saying, Help, my lord, Oh king. And he said, If the Lord do not help thee, whence shall I help thee? out of the barnfloor, or out of the winepress?" They are pretty low down in the barrel, aren't they? "I can't help you, woman. If God doesn't help you, how can I help you? There is nothing around here to eat. Can't you see?"

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Editorials

We send greetings to all of our readers. We are thankful for everyone who has the interest and takes the time to read the *Faith and Victory* paper. It is certainly our endeavor, and our prayer, that it be the pure Word of God that is printed in this paper, so that you will be benefited from reading it.

Another year has passed. It has been a year full of activity, which makes time fly by quickly. A new year always turns our attention to time, its relevance to our lives, and on a broader scope, to where this world stands in the scheme of God's time. I would like to share a few thoughts with you.

Ever since the late 1800's, the Church's focus has been on the prophecy that at evening time it shall be light. (Zech. 14:7). This places a time period on the world as it relates to the return of God to call all things into judgment. It is possible to use this prophecy as the time of Christ's first coming and establishing a spiritual kingdom, and as to the events that His earthly dispensation ushered in, but in pondering what the reformation of the late 1800's ushered in, we see a parallel of the prophecy as the time from the early morning Church up until the end of time. However, we must realize time is not standing still. This frail shell of an earth has been continually hurtling towards the abyss of eternity. Those of us who are riding this sphere of destruction must keep our thinking relevant to the events that are happening on it. This is the only clue we have as to the schedule of time for our final destination.

In the parable of the ten virgins, Christ referenced the return of the bridegroom as being at midnight. (Matt. 25:6). This is a time when sleep is the general norm, a time when people do not have their attentions turned to the coming of God. In observing the signs of our society, we must say that this condition seems to be upon us, and we must say that the evening time is far spent and the shades of night have set in. This is not to say that we no longer have the light of the evening time, for I believe we hold the truths within our hearts. What it does say is that we must be of the frame of mind that rather than to stagnate into a condition of being doctrinally ingrown, we must be a light ourselves by letting the truths of God's Word shine out through a holy conversation. (II Peter 3:11). As we do this, we will find God verifying His Word through our works. It is easy to sit still and be in a muddle as to whether the power of God is among His people. If a people have the power to live a holy life, there is enough power present to accomplish all other works. What is needed is the situation for the power to be applied to. Without a missionary-minded people, a people desirous of letting their light shine in a darkened world, the problem is simply that there isn't the opportunity for God's power to be manifested.

To know that time is winding down should not be a depressing thought to us. It should be a challenge. There are many things to be done. Satan knows this and he hasn't folded his hands. Notification must be given to the Church, and let it stand up and say, "...Here am I; send me." Isa. 6:8.

OK—Dear saints: This past Thanksgiving day we were shown most vividly that "God is our refuge and strength, a very present help in trouble." Psalms 46:1. What a privilege to personally know and serve such a God!

On that day we were returning from the assembly meeting in Loranger, LA driving a super-cab Ford Ranger pickup and pulling a small fifth-wheel travel trailer. We had come through Dallas quite early so traffic was light and the weather was dry, though very cold. As we neared the Oklahoma line there were brief sleet showers but the ice seemed to be melting on contact with the road.

About five miles into Oklahoma we saw a truck ahead driving very slowly with his emergency flashers on and then could see that traffic was backed up for a half mile or so ahead. When we came to two southbound cars that had spun out into the center divider, we thought that was the cause of the traffic tie-up and expected the traffic to resume normal speed. But just as we were approaching an overpass we passed a patrolman standing on the center line warning everyone to go very slowly. We soon found that the bridge was covered with ice. As we drove on, the roadway was dry so we resumed our speed,

remarking that we would have to watch for any bridges ahead.

We had gone only ten miles further when we felt the truck beginning to slide. Before we had realized it we were on an overpass. Because of a stiff head wind we were travelling no faster than 45 miles an hour, but we were suddenly out of control!

As we slid into the fast lane of traffic we both saw we were going to hit a red car that was being towed. There was a slight impact and immediately we were whipped back across both lanes heading directly into the heavy steel guard rail. As we crashed through the railing we were looking out over a very steep embankment and expected to next be rolling down it toward the road below.

Instead, we were jerked backwards (evidently by the whip of the trailer as it came around us and overturned). When we came to rest, we were about two car lengths beyond where we had crashed through the railing, parallel and very close to the guard rail. We were now heading the opposite direction we had been travelling. The trailer was just behind us at a right angle across the slow lane and bottom side up.

As we assessed our situation we saw the truck had sustained very heavy damage, front and back. The super cab was crushed in almost to the back of the passenger's seat and the passenger side door was jammed. All around us we saw broken glass and twisted metal. But just where we sat, everything was intact! When people came running to see how badly we were injured we were able to tell them we didn't have even a scratch. We had broken glass all in our hair and clothing but there was not one drop of blood.

We were taken to a nearby motel where we spent the rest of the day in true thanksgiving to the Lord for sparing both of us and not allowing anyone else to be involved even though we were in heavy traffic. We were both struck with the realization that there had not been time to pray; it had all happened so quickly.

Walking In The Spirit By The Word

This letter deals with being led by the Holy Spirit and walking in the light of the Word of God. As with all areas in the Christian life, there is a balance. So too, with walking by the Spirit. There are some in the body of Christ that allow very little, if any, leading of the Holy Spirit. Then there are others that believe they are only led of the Holy Spirit, discarding many areas of the Bible that disagree with their flesh.

When an individual repents of their sins and

receives Jesus into their heart, then the Lord Jesus Christ says He will send the Holy Spirit. We see this clearly in Acts 2:38, "Then Peter said unto them, Repent, and be baptized every one of you in the name of Jesus Christ for the remission of sins, and ye shall receive the gift of the Holy Ghost." Our Lord Jesus Christ says in John 16:7, "Nevertheless I tell you the truth; It is expedient for you that I go away: for if I go not away, the Comforter will not come unto you; but if I depart, I will send him unto you."

There is of course, much sadness for those in the body of Christ who do not acknowledge and follow the Holy Spirit. Many of us have knowledge of churches that have become steeped in the traditions of men, forsaking the leading of the Holy Spirit. Instead of continuing with their shoulder to the plow, they have stopped to look back, finding contentment in a traditional and comfortable, but dead church. No longer do they pray in the Spirit. No longer do they allow the Holy Spirit to lead them in the truth of God's Word, guiding them to a more mature walk with Christ. We must always be on guard not to become complacent, falling into the traditions of men, turning away from the leading of the Holy Spirit.

Unfortunately, there are many in the body of Christ who claim to be led by the Holy Spirit and yet rebel against much of the Word of God. Our Lord Jesus Christ says clearly in John 16:13, "Howbeit when he, the Spirit of truth, is come, he will guide you into all truth: for he shall not speak of himself; but whatsoever he shall hear, that shall he speak: and he will shew you things to come." This is a powerful statement our Lord makes. We can see clearly in this scripture that the Holy Spirit will lead us in all truth. Someone might ask, "what is truth?" as Pilate did in John 18:38. Jesus answered this question in John 14:6, "Jesus saith unto him, I am the way, the truth, and the life: no man cometh unto the Father, but by me." Jesus Christ is the <u>Truth</u>. Jesus Christ is the Word of God. "In the beginning was the Word, and the Word was with God, and the Word was God." John 1:1.

When people say the Holy Spirit is leading them, they can go to the Word of God to verify, that is, if it is the Holy Spirit. If the Word of God is in agreement with the leading, then it is the Holy Spirit. But if the Word of God does not agree with the leading, then it is not the Holy Spirit. The Word of God clearly says in John 16:13 that the Holy Spirit will not speak of

himself; but whatsoever he shall hear, that shall he speak. Again in I John 5:7 the Bible says, "For there are three that bear record in heaven, the Father, the Word, and the Holy Ghost: and these three are one." And in Amos 3:3, "Can two walk together, except they be agreed?" What these scriptures show us is that the Holy Spirit will not lead the children of God in a contrary direction from the Word of God. The Holy Spirit leads us in the truth of God's Word, that we may have an understanding of the scriptures, to faithfully follow our Lord and Saviour, Jesus Christ. The Lord clearly says in Psalms 138:2, "I will worship toward thy holy temple, and praise thy name for thy lovingkindness and for thy truth: for thou hast magnified thy word above all thy name." The Lord Jesus says again in Matthew 24:35, "Heaven and earth shall pass away, but my words shall not pass away."

My heart breaks for so many in the body of Christ that walk apart from the Word of God, believing that the Holy Spirit has showed them that it is all right to do so. There are of course, many reasons why believers disobey God, and one of those is to claim that the Holy Spirit spoke to their heart and said it was okay. But no matter what reason a person gives for disobeying God, it all boils down to self.

Let me give an example of this. I was talking with a person several years ago who told me she needed to be some place in a hurry. She went on to say that the Holy Spirit showed her where the State Troopers were on the highway. This she said allowed her to speed (break the law) until she came to where the State Troopers were, then she would slow down to the speed limit. This of course, was not the leading of the Holy Spirit.

There are of course, many areas where professing Christians say they are being led by the Spirit, when in truth they are in rebellion against the Holy Spirit. The Bible shows us clearly in I Samuel 15:23 what rebellion is, "For rebellion is as the sin of witchcraft, and stubbornness is as iniquity and idolatry. Because thou hast rejected the word of the Lord, he hath also rejected thee from being king." And it is so, too, with many professing Christians who reject the Word of God, claiming to be led by the Spirit of God. Galatians 6:7-8, "Be not deceived; God is not mocked: for whatsoever a man soweth, that shall he also reap. For he that soweth to his flesh shall of the flesh reap corruption; but he that soweth to the Spirit shall of the Spirit reap life everlasting." Sowing to the flesh is to be selfserving. Sowing to the Spirit is to walk in the Spirit according to the Word of God.

I pray that all of us in the body of Christ would continually examine ourselves; that we may be good and faithful servants, no matter what the cost, unto our Lord and Saviour Jesus Christ; that we may walk according to the Word of God, being led by the Holy Spirit. Psalm 119:9, "Wherewithal shall a young man cleanse his way? by taking heed thereto according to thy word."

Where is Your Faith?

"And they came to him, and awoke him, saying, Master, master, we perish. Then he arose, and rebuked the wind and the raging of the water: and they ceased, and there was a calm. And he said unto them, Where is your faith?..." Luke 8:24-25.

Jesus and His disciples had entered into a ship and Jesus, being weary, went to the hinder part of the ship and went to sleep. A storm came up and the disciples became afraid. Mark says they asked Jesus, "Carest thou not that we perish?"

Their faith was in having Him constantly in sight, and in hearing or feeling distance. Didn't they know that with the Son of God aboard that ship it could not sink, for God's eye was over His Son and He would preserve that ship for His Son's sake even though Jesus was sound asleep?

So with us-is our faith only in seeing, feeling and hearing God, or is it a calm assurance that I have the Son of God reigning in my heart and my ship can't go down as long as Christ is aboard? The storms of life may be raging, trouble on every hand and it may look as though all is in jeopardy. We may not be able to feel His presence or see His workings or hear His calming voice at the moment, yet let us rest assured that He lives in our hearts and with Him aboard, the storms of life cannot sink our ship. Not always will He see fit to still our storms but at times like that we need faith to just lie down on the pillow with Jesus in the hinder part of the ship, so to speak, and rest with Him even in the storm.

Paul said, "And to you who are troubled rest with us,..." (II Thes. 1:7.)

Let us draw a picture of an active Christian and one of a passive Christian and see which fits us and which we would rather be.

Our passive Christian remembers to hold his tongue that no irreverent or ungodly words pass his lips. This is good. Our active Christian remembers to speak with deliberate forethought and premeditation toward glorifying God. This is better. A passive Christian stands fast and resists evil. This is good. An active Christian allows the love of God to be a real and impelling force in his life toward good. This is better. The passive Christian's thoughts rise at random and his words are often without objective or inspiration. The active Christian's thoughts and words are motivated by his love for God, and inspired by God's love for him. The passive Christian says, "If the Lord ever shows me something to do, I'll do it." This is a good attitude, but the active Christian seeks to know the will of God and seeks to fill his place in the body. "Wherefore be ye not unwise, but understanding what the will of the Lord is."

Oftentimes the passive Christian spends much of his life laboring for that which satisfieth not. He may be resigned to his way of living and seek not to change it. Too often he has much time for leisure and repose. The genuinely active Christian is animated by an enthusiastic and aggressive ardor for the work of God. He bestirs himself zealously; is instant in season and out. There is no inertia here; no folding of the hands to sleep.

Can you vision the results if all passive, inactive Christians should suddenly become animated ones? "Enlarge the place of thy tent and let them stretch forth the curtains of thine habitations: spare not, lengthen thy cords, and strengthen thy stakes; For thou shalt break forth on the right hand and on the left;..." Isaiah 54:2-3.

One day at the California camp meeting a dear sister asked me if I had yet found my place in the body of Christ; if I knew what my duties were. I replied that I knew what I should like to do. She said, "Ah, but it isn't what we most like to do but the thing that God blesses us most in doing. That is the thing He wants us to do."

There is something for all of us to do, our specialty that God is wanting us to do; a little place to fill that only we can fill. Don't make the mistake of thinking it vain or conceited to say, "God has a work for me to do and I mean to do it by his help and grace." Rather would it show more conceit to consider that we are an exception and have no work to do while others must labor for the Lord. I hope and trust that when I see that sister again, I may be able to say, "Yes, God has shown me my place and I am happy in doing the things He would have me do." And by His grace I mean to find that place and that work. What a great day and what a looking up there will be when every little child of God finds his place and fills it. It is important too, to keep ourselves in a condition for that work of whatever nature it might be and in the place where we can perform it.

There is a story about a young Finnish girl who was coming to America to find work. A married couple, in seeking to employ her asked if she could cook. No, she couldn't cook. Could she sew? No, she replied that she had never tried to sew. Could she care for children? No, she had never learned to take care of children. "What **can** you do?" asked the couple in exasperation. "Why, I can milk reindeer," cheerfully responded the girl.

Let us not be like the Finnish girl. But rather let us be found in the place where our service can be used.
