"When I was a child, I spake as a child, I understood as a child, I thought as a child: but when I became a man, I put away childish things." I Corinthians 13:11.

Recently, the Lord sent us a message on spiritual maturity. As it was going forth, the Lord brought to my mind several childlike ways. Let us examine them and see if we have put away "childish things."

Children speak their mind. They will boldly tell you that you are ugly, or that they don't like the gift you have given them, etc. Spiritually, are we still speaking our mind, no matter who we hurt or what damage we are doing?

Many times, if things don't go their way, they will pout. Their bottom lip comes out and they will not so much as give you the time of day. What about spiritually? If church services don't go exactly like we think they should, or the pastor doesn't handle a situation like we think he should, do we clam up, or maybe even quit going to church? Remember, this is the way children handle life. "...When I became a man, I put away childish things."

Maybe you are not one to pout, but one that throws a tantrum when things don't go as planned. Instead of clamming up, you make sure everyone knows that the situation should have been handled better, or services should be run more smoothly, etc. It is still a child's way of handling life.

Children have great exuberance over worthless items. Some of them can become so excited over a cheap, plastic toy which tears up before the day is over. They aren't willing to save their money until they can buy something which will last. They want it now. Are we letting our joy and happiness come from the worthless things of life? We should be taking the time to dig a deep well in the things of God and let peace and joy be springing up within.

Many times children are picky eaters. As long as they can have candy, cookies and ice cream, everything is fine, but give them green beans and broccoli, and they immediately say "Yuck!" Are we picky eaters with God's Word? Do we just want to measure to certain things?





God has a well-balanced meal to set before us and to be healthy we must eat it all.

Children's attention span is about two inches long. Try sending a three-year-old to his room to pick up toys. Invariably he will look at a book or play with the toys. How are we? When God gives us a job to do, are we willing and able to complete it? When we are prompted to read and pray, or send a card to someone; do we get sidetracked? What about that area God has dealt with us about? Do we complete the task or fail to completely conquer?

If you are calling, "Ice cream, everyone," children hear very well, but if they think you are calling them to do work they suddenly become deaf. Do we have selective hearing when God is talking to us?

Little children need to hang on to their mother, or their security blanket. Are we afraid to step out into a new field for the Lord, or would we rather keep quiet than to testify or pray like the Lord is asking us to?

Many times children become discouraged very easily and are ready to give up. I heard of one child who, because he couldn't ride a bike with the first try, wasn't going to try again. When we try and fail, are we ready to throw in the towel? That is being childish. If at first we don't succeed, try, try again. A sign of maturity is to get up and try all over again.

Often I find my children taking things into their own hands and correcting each other without giving me a chance to handle the situation. We need to learn to back off and let God do the correcting. God is well able to correct without our being in control and bossing.

It is real easy for children to say, "I can't." If we are not careful, we will tell the Lord, "I can't forgive." "I can't be kind." "I can't measure up on that line." That is being like a child.

Children are ready to lie, if need be, to cover up their faults. If they don't lie, they will make an excuse. God sees right through all our lies and excuses.

No doubt you can think of other childish behaviors. Let God challenge you to become a MAN and put away childish things.

The Responsibility Of Knowledge

It is written, "That upon you may come all the righteous blood shed upon the earth, from the blood of righteous Abel unto the blood of Zacharias son of Barachias, whom ye slew between the temple and the altar." 

I would like to relate some of the wonderful healings the Lord has performed for me in the last two and a half years.

In July of 1995, I was carrying out the trash when I stepped on the edge of the walk and my right foot buckled. It was either broken or badly sprained, as it was about six months before I could wear a shoe and walk on it normally. But I do praise God for healing it and helping me through the pain and discomfort.

Then, last February, I was eating in town when a piece of food became lodged in my throat, completely sealing off my windpipe. God was so good to have someone there to help get it dislodged, and again, I praise Him for it.

Now, this summer, on August 30th, I was standing on a chair trying to hang a picture, when I lost my balance and the chair tipped. I fell over the back of the chair and landed on my back, on a concrete floor that had only a thin layer of carpeting on it. Thank God, my daughter, Janell, was at home and was able to come immediately and help me get up and into the living room to a recliner. I very possibly broke some bones, including a toe, and was very sore for several days. About three days after my fall, I was sitting in the recliner and I turned my back wrong and it started having muscle spasms just below my left rib cage. I had four of them within about three hours of time, and they were very painful. I could hardly stand to move. The ministers came and prayed for me and God healed me and I haven't had them since. Thank the Lord!

She was the youngest of eight children. They were raised on a farm in Ft. Gaines, GA, by two Christian parents who were firm believers in prayer. She was a brilliant student in school. She attended Paine College in GA. She was also a teacher in the public school system for eight years.

QUESTION AND ANSWER

(Continued from last month.)

QUESTION: Please give us a lesson on how to raise our children and teach and train them.

If you teach your children to love God above all else and put Him first in their life, then let them see you putting Him first in your life and loving Him supremely. If you teach your children to be unselfish and to share, then let them see no selfishness in you and see you sharing with one another and with them. If you teach your children that they must not strive, nor quarrel among themselves, then let them never, never hear you, their parents, striving, quarreling, speaking harsh, sharp, cutting words one to another nor arguing between yourselves. If

you teach them to be humble and submissive one to another and to you, their parents, then let them see you manifesting a lot of humility and submission one to another in the fear of God. Especially let them see their mother humbly and graciously submitting herself to their father as the Word of God instructs her to do. If you teach them to live in peace among themselves, make sure that they see you living in peace between yourselves. If you teach your children to deny themselves and never contend for their own way, then let them never hear either of their parents contending for their own way, but let them see them both denying themselves and submitting one to another.

I here insert another quote from Adam Clarke's commentary. "He who understands the way of God should carefully instruct his household in that way: and he who is the father of a family should pray to God to teach him, that he may teach his household. His ignorance of God and salvation can be no excuse for his neglecting his family: it is his indispensable duty to teach them; and God will teach him, if he earnestly seeks it, that he may be able to discharge this duty to his family. Reader, if thy children or servants perish through thy neglect, God will judge thee for it in the great day."

Abraham faithfully taught his household, which included Lot, the principles of upright living and righteousness; also the entertaining of strangers and hospitality to travelers. This paid off good dividends in later years with Lot and his family. When the angels came to Sodom at evening, Lot, looking for opportunities to show hospitality to strangers and travelers, and help to the needy as he had been taught by precept and the example of his Uncle Abraham, went right out and urged the men to come under his roof for the night. This proved to be the saving of his life as well as his two daughters' lives. Way over in the New Testament, reference is made to this in Hebrews 13:2, "Be not forgetful to entertain strangers: for thereby some have entertained angels unawares." The principles of righteousness and upright living continued to direct Lot's life so that he was not drawn into the evil, corrupt way of life which was prevalent all around him, but it was obnoxious and vexatious to him. He had been taught better than that. Peter referred to him in II Peter 2:7-8, "And delivered just Lot, vexed with the filthy conversation of the wicked: (For that righteous man dwelling among them, in seeing and hearing,

vexed his righteous soul from day to day with their unlawful deeds.)"

I insert here a quote from Adam Clarke in regard to Lot. "He and his family...alone were free from the pollution of this accursed people. How powerful are the effects of a religious education, enforced by pious example! It is one of God's special means of grace. Let a man only do justice to his family by bringing them up in the fear of God, and He will crown it with His blessing.... This is your work that is the Lord's. If through your neglect of precept and example, they perish, what an awful account must you give to the Judge of the quick and the dead. It was the sentiment of a great man, that should the worst of times arrive, and ministry fail, yet, if parents would just be faithful to their trust, pure religion would be handed down to posterity, both in its form and in its power."

Before passing on from the discussion of Abraham and Lot and his family and the relationship between them, let me point out and emphasize this point. Abraham was a man who lived very close to God, and God was well pleased with him, and his sacrifices were acceptable to God. Consequently, he stood in a place with God where God would and could accept his plea in behalf of his kinsmen (Lot and his family) as the hour of destruction approached for the city in which they dwelt.

It seems that in the narrative related in the 18th and 19th chapters of Genesis, that the Lord Himself and the two angels with Him appeared in the form of men to Abraham and he entertained them. After they had eaten the meal that was prepared hastily for them, the two angels went on their way, but the Lord tarried and made known unto him what He was going to do in the destruction of Sodom. He knew that Abraham had kinsmen down there and He would not carry out His purpose to destroy the city without letting him know about it. Then Abraham began to plead with the Lord to spare the city if 50 righteous people could be found in it. The Lord agreed to that. Then Abraham asked that if 50 couldn't be found, if He would spare it for 45; then 40, then 30, then 20 and finally 10 and the Lord accepted his petition all the way, step by step, and agreed to spare the city if 10 righteous people could be found there.

That would surely cover Lot and his family. Abraham was pleading for their lives and the Lord knew it, but the Lord was pleased with his life and faithfulness and his sacrifice was acceptable to God, so he was qualified to plead in their behalf. But, alas, all of them had not maintained righteousness, so there were not enough to save the city. But watch it now. The two angels spent the night in Lot's home and in the morning told him to go to his married children and tell them and their families to get out quickly because the destruction of the city was imminent. They would not go, so the angels took Lot and his wife and their two daughters and told them to hurry and get out of there because they could not do a thing until they had gone out of the city. (Genesis 19:22.) Abraham had made an acceptable plea for the lives of Lot and his family, and the angels made certain that Lot got the message and was gone from there before the destruction fell. This can all be traced to the acceptability of Abraham's life and his sacrifices before God.

Ah, parents, grasp the urgency and the importance of our own lives being well pleasing to God and our sacrifices acceptable to Him. It is very important that we have a good relationship with God and a life well pleasing to Him so that our sacrifices will be acceptable in defense of our children and in behalf of their salvation.


I am fully aware of the fact that we are somewhat at a disadvantage, even legally, in disciplining our children. The legislators have taken hold of the matter of "child abuse." and in some cases have enacted laws that prohibit parents from using a paddle or switch on their children. I have read where there have been attempts in our congress to enact laws to permit children to bring suit against their parents in court if they do not like the way they have been disciplined. I understand this has been hotly contested and debated on the floors, and in the chambers of Congress, but so far as I know has never gotten through, even in any modified form, and I hope it never will. Such would just open the door wide to outright rebellion and anarchy through our children and younger set, and the courts would be hopelessly flooded with such cases because "Foolishness is bound in the heart of a child:..." Prov. 22:15. Children don't like discipline of any kind at any time. None of them do. They want to be at liberty to go their own way and do not like restraint, especially if they are a strong-willed child. You will be at loggerheads with them anytime you try to restrain them in something they want to do.

Notwithstanding all this, saints have God's Word to go by in training their children, and we can count on God backing us up in it if we pray earnestly to Him, follow His instructions and employ His way in dealing with them. In Proverbs 19:18 we read, "Chasten thy son while there is hope, and let not thy soul spare for his crying." This verse seems to teach us that there is a time or period of their lives when our chastening will be to their profit, and we are admonished to not pass that time up, for when it is past there will be no more hope of helping them by that means. Again in Proverbs 13:24 it says, "He that spareth his rod hateth his son:

but he that loveth him chasteneth him betimes." It is a perverted sense of love we express when we are so sympathetic and "loving" toward our children that we cannot stand to hurt them and hear them cry over a chastisement we are administering to them. The word betimes seems in my mind to mean when it is necessary, administer the discipline and when it is not necessary, don't do it. Proverbs 22:15 says, "Foolishness is bound in the heart of a child; but the rod of correction shall drive it far from him." This verse makes it clear that it is common to all children to have foolishness bound up in their hearts, but God Himself has designed that the rod of correction, in the hand of a wise and good parent, shall be a means of helping to guide them out of their foolishness. In Proverbs 29:17 we read, "Correct thy son, and he shall give thee rest; yea, he shall give delight unto thy soul."

Worthy Of His Name

One of the ten commandments that God thundered to Israel on Mount Sinai was: "Thou shalt not take the name of the Lord thy God in vain; for the Lord will not hold him guiltless that taketh his name in vain." Exodus 20:7.

It is a serious and responsible matter to assume the name of the Almighty God upon us. To profess to be His children means that we are called by His name. But to do this without faithfully bearing the weighty responsibility that is therein involved can bring woeful judgments of His wrath upon us. Taking the name of the Lord in vain is not only using it as swear words and profanity like we usually think it is. We can more seriously take the name of the Lord in vain by not living up to the standard of purity and holiness that His name is worthy of.

I Peter 1:13-17 says, "Wherefore gird up the loins of your mind, be sober, and hope to the end for the grace that is to be brought unto you at the revelation of Jesus Christ; As obedient children, not fashioning yourselves according to the former lusts in your ignorance: But as he which hath called you is holy, so be ye holy in all manner of conversation; Because it is written, Be ye holy; for I am holy. And if ye call on the Father, who without respect of persons judgeth according to every man's work, pass the time of your sojourning here in fear." For us to be worthy of the name of our Heavenly Father we must strive and seek earnestly to live a holy and righteous life. We must give up the sins of the world that we were taken up with and follow holiness without which no man shall see the Lord. This means to be holy in all manner of conversation.

"...The grace of God that bringeth salvation hath appeared to all men, Teaching us that, denying ungodliness and worldly lusts, we should live soberly, righeously, and godly, in this present world." Titus 2:11-12. The word "sober" means to be sound in mind, self-controlled, and moderate as to opinion and passion. Why should we live thus? Because we are bearing the name of the One who purchased and redeemed us. We want to be worthy of that holy name. To be worthy means to be deserving

or fit. We cannot be worthy of the holy name of God Almighty or His Son, Jesus Christ, if we are still partaking of the sinful and fleshly lusts of this present evil world. The Spirit of God, that Christ accomplished for us to receive as the children of God, will dictate a holy, pure, clean, sober, conscientious and loving behaviour to conform to.

Bear in mind that, as Jesus said in Matthew 7:21, "Not every one that saith unto me, Lord, Lord, shall enter into the kingdom of heaven; but he that doeth the will of my Father which is in heaven." To profess His name and at the same time live contrary to His blessed will is to take His name in vain. This will bring serious consequences. He will not hold him guiltless who takes His name in vain. I John 2:15-17 warns us: "Love not the world, neither the things that are in the world. If any man love the world, the love of the Father is not in him. For all that is in the world, the lust of the flesh, and the lust of the eyes, and the pride of life, is not of the Father, but is of the world. And the world passeth away, and the lust thereof: but he that doeth the will of God abideth for ever." It is wise for us to be very diligent about how we live, where we go, how we spend our time, how we dress our bodies, how we speak, how we spend our money and how we treat our fellow man.

A person who allows sin or anything ungodly to have a part in his life, while professing the name of the Lord, is in grave danger. It is even as if one is saying, "It does not matter what I do. The Lord is not concerned with such things." People can be turned away from faith and obedience to God because of the unholy and unrighteous ways of those who profess to know Him. I heard of one young man who was so discouraged because a professed saint spoke such unkind and harsh words to him. He turned away from the truth and went out into open sin. Let us be careful and prayerful about this matter. Let us seek to live that righteous, godly, and holy life that is worthy of the name of the Lord God, our Father, and that of His holy Son, Jesus Christ.
