was waiting to hear if it was Daddy.


"Yes that was daddy. He said that it was raining behind him and on the side of him but it never rained on his truck. He pulled up to the shop

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

Honk! Screech! A car barely missed hitting him! He hadn't stopped to look for cars.



They went outside and picked pink and yellow flowers. Kyle put the pretty flowers and the card he had made on the plate.


He took it upstairs to Mama's room. Mama was awake. She smiled real big. "Here," Kyle said, "I made you something."

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

"Could I tell you some Bible stories while you rest?" Gracie asked.


"Yes, I used to go to church but I didn't feel God at church."
