

"What if they don't have a place to get dry from the rain? Maybe the rain doesn't make them as happy. Can we think of ideas so we can help them?"


"I think that's a wonderful idea, Violet. Let's brainstorm."




He runs back with \$8. "Here. Now you have \$11.50. Those blankets at Mrs. Knelson's store are \$6 so you almost have enough for two now!"


Violet's eyes shine. She can't wait to help some people stay warm this winter.

Violet stares at the money. She realizes four people will now have blankets to keep them warm through the winter.


"Thank you, Jesus," she says simply and quietly.



The two children help each other get the cookies on cookie sheets and into the oven. They make several batches until 72 cookies fill the kitchen with the smell of cinnamon and sugar.





Suddenly, she realizes there are only three cookies left!





"What?" she says out loud. "I've never been to the principal's office before!"


Inside the office, she shifts nervously on her feet. The principal smiles and says, "Violet, you aren't in trouble."


Violet sighs in relief and sadness. "I am missing the money box from the bake sale. I went to get it and it was gone!"

Emma watches Violet. "Bless her," she whispers.



She thinks about obedience. "God must want us to obey our parents so we can obey Him when He asks us something," she says out loud.




Violet slowly shakes her head. "So you still have to obey?" she says. Her mom laughs and squeezes her shoulder.

The singing is about to start.


The Mackeys take their place beside their friends, the Aldana's. Someone calls out, "Let's start with 'The First Noel."
