#### THE GATEWAY OF THE CROSS

There is a beautiful, wonderful land called heaven. It is a place where people never sin and never sorrow. There are no tears there, no heartaches, no pain, no death. There is no night there, no sickness, no misunderstandings or disappointments. It is the land of Live-forever. We are intensely interested in this land of unending day. We have some loved ones over there and most likely you have. O man, think of it! It should concern you a thousand times more than any thing in this world where people sin and sorrow, where there is sickness and trouble, pain and death. This article has been written for the purpose of helping you find the way to this land of eternal light and love.

#### The Open Gate

The gate is strait, but it is open. (See Matt. 7: 14). The term "strait" means a small, narrow pass. It is taken from the figure of a narrow pass in a mountain gorge hemned in by walls of rocks on either side. Jesus tells us that but few will find this strait gate. This should put a great fear upon us. Oh, what if we failed to find it! If we failed to find this gate there is nothing left for us but the wide gate that leads to destruction. There is another very serious thing to think about. Multitudes think they have found this strait gate and they have not. Many people are blind and deceived. They are on the broad way and think they are on the narrow way.

We do not have to open the gate. It is already open; all we have to do is to find it. Remember, O soul, that there is no other gate that opens on to the way that leads to eternal life. We will never reach that glorious land if we fail to find this gate before we die. We tell you this with a serious, solemn feeling in our heart. We feel the awfulness of the fate of those who miss it. Lost in the blackness of darkness

forever. We beg of thee to be concerned and make doubly certain that you have found the way to heaven. Why concern yourself so much about the things of time and neglect the eternal welfare of the soul?

We need not be deceived or uncertain. The directions to this "strait gate" are very plain and clear. If we will but take time to study them we can find the way. Jesus says, "I am the door," and "I am the way." He is the door and the way and the gate into that wonderful country where people live forever and are always happy. He says, "Behold, I set before thee an open door." Rev. 3:8. Through this open door is the way to heaven, and there is no other. To find this door and enter in is the all important thing in life. A man's life does not consist in the abundance of the things of this world that he might gain, but in finding this open door which leads into everlasting life.

#### The Humanity of Christ

We are told by Christ that many shall seek to enter in and shall not be able, and that many will profess to have entered in and yet have not done so. He says, "Not every one that sayeth Lord, Lord, shall enter the kingdom of heaven, but he that doeth the will of my Father which is in heaven." (Read Matt. 7:21, 23). For this reason we have asked God to help us make this subject plain and simple as we possibly can. We want you to understand it. It is needful that we think for a moment about the humanity of Jesus. When God made Adam He gave him a human nature. This human nature is what is called humanity. Humanity is not the body of flesh, but a nature that belongs to it. God also gave a divine life or nature to Adam. He had a spiritual or divine life. He was not God, but he did possess the life of God. Now divine life is divinity, and human life is humanity. In Adam there was a union or oneness of humanity and divinity. These were one in the other. When Adam sinned he lost the divinity or the divine life out of his humanity. Instead of the divine nature being in his humanity he now had carnal or fleshly nature. Whatever was the act Adam performed it was something that caused him to lose the divine nature and become fleshly. Now when we speak about the flesh, do not think of the flesh of the body, but of a fleshly nature. This helps us to understand the words of Paul when he says, "So then they that are in the flesh can not please God." Rom. 8:8. He does not mean those who are living in the body or have humanity, but those who have the fleshly nature in their humanity. Remember this fleshly nature does not really belong to humanity, but came there by sin; in fact it is sin. Now when Jesus was born of the virgin Mary, (see Matt. 1: 18-23) He taken humanity upon Him. He, like Adam before he sinned, was both human and divine. He possessed humanity and divinity. He was God in humanity. To take on man's humanity He must take man's fleshly body. "The Word (Christ) was made flesh, and dwelt among us." John 1: 14. Just how humanity and divinity unite and become two natures in one we do not know. When man and woman unite in marriage they two become one flesh. (See Matt. 19: 5). In Christ there is a marriage of divinity and humanity and they become one. We will say at this time, and may repeat it later, that a Christian is one who is married to Christ, therefore has divinity dwelling in his humanity.

The humanity of Christ was humanity in its original purity. It did not have the fleshly nature in it, but had divinity in it. The fleshly nature and the divine nature can not dwell together in humanity, no more than light and darkness can dwell together. The thought to get impressed upon our minds here is that the humanity of Chirst was as humanity was designed in the mind of God to be and as man had before he sinned.



#### "Walk While Ye Have The Light"

"Yet a little while is the light with you. Walk while ye have the light, lest darkness come upon you, for he that walketh in darkness knoweth not whither he goeth. While ye have light, believe in the light, that ye may be the children of light." John 12: 35-36,

Light always represents righteousness. Jesus said, "I am the light of the world," and He also said to His disciples, "Ye are the light of the world." Danseness always represents sin and confusion, and every evil work.

Jesus had just told them that He must be lifted up from the earth and by this they know that he was to die on the cross, and He, the light of the workt was soon to be taken from them, so He science warms them to walk in His light. "While ye have light, believe in the light," or believe in Mc "that ye may be the children of light" or of righteousness. If we call light darkness and darkness light, how dark is our understanding of the word of truth. If we believe that we can disobey God's word and it will be alright with us, how dark we have become. David says "Thy word is a lamp unto my feet, and a light unto my path." Psa. 119: 105. "For thou art my lamp, Q Lord; and the Lord will lighten my darkness." 2 Sant. 22: 29.

Here is a scripture about putting light for darkness and darkness for light. "Woe unto them that call evil good, and good evil; that put darkness for light and light for darkness; that put bitter for sweet, and sweet for bitter. Woe unto them that are wise in their own eyes and prudent in their own sight. Woe unto them that are mighty to drink wine, and men of strength to mingle strong drink; which justify the wicked for reward, and take away the righteousness of the righteous from him. Therefore as the fire devoureth the stubble, and the flame consumeth the chaff, so their rust shall be as rottenness and their blossom shall go up as dust; because they have cast away the law of the Lord of hosts, and despised the word of the Holy One of Israel. Therefore is the anger of the Lord kindled against His people and He hath stretched forth his hand against them, and hath smitten them; and the hills did tremble, and their carcasses were torn in the midst of the streets." Isa, 5: 20 -25. This shows God's anger upon Judah because they refused to walk in the light in their day. They were carried away captive into Babylon, and only one out of ten were ever allowed to return to the land of Palestine.

We can imagine some one carrying a lantern by his side as he climbs a steep mountain side in darkness. He has to see every step of the way lest he make a mis-step which would dash him down many feet below. How necessary that he keep his lamp burning by his side. This is what David meant when he said, "Thy word is a lamp unto my feet and a light unto my path." Psa. 119: 105. And again when he says, "For thou art my lamp, O Lord; and the Lord will lighten my darkness." 2 Sam. 22: 29. We also read, "The entrance of thy words giveth light; it giveth understanding unto the simple." Psa. 119: 130. Should another be carrying the lantern, how necessary that we should keep up in the light. Don't stay with the crowd unless the crowd stavs with Jesus and He the center of attraction. You had better be alone in the world with Jesus than in a crowd without Him. The crowd in sin will be no blessing to you. The Word still says, "Be ye not unequally yoked together with unbelievers: for what fellowship hath righteousness; with unrighteousness, and what communion hath light with darkness? And what concord hath Christ with Belial, or what part hath he that believeth with an infidel? And what agreement hath the temple of God with idols, for ye are the temple of the living God; as God hath said, I will dwell in them and walk in them; and I will be their God, and they shall be my people. Wherefore come out from among them, and be ye separate, saith the Lord, and touch not the unclean; and I will receive you, and will be a Father unto you and ye shall be my sons and daughters, saith the Lord Almighty." 2 Cor. 6: 14-18.

This means for us to leave sinners and be joined to Christ and God will receive us, then when we have Christ He will walk and live in our soul. We will have the light abiding in our very being, teaching us the way of life, but without Him we can do nothing. We neither have the grace to live right nor the ability to please Him. To walk in the light is simply to obey God and be filled with His Holy Spirit.

Two angels who stood by assured the lonely watchers that this same Jesus which is taken up from you into heaven shall so come in like manner as ye have seen Him go into heaven. Acts 1: 11.

Will He appear in Jerusalem or in a desert or

in some secret place? "Behold, He cometh with clouds and every eye shall see Him." Rev. 1:7. "As the lightning cometh out of the east and shineth even unto the west, so shall also the coming of the Son of man be." Matt. 24: 27.

But some will ask, will He not come by His Spirit and enter gradually into the hearts of men? "The Lord himself shall descend from heaven with a shout." 1 Thess. 4: 16. "Behold I come quickly." Rev. 22: 12. "When the Son of man shall come in His glory." Matt. 25: 31.

We cannot know the exact time of Christ's coming. "Of that day and hour knoweth no man, no not the angels of heaven, but my Father only." Matt. 24: 36. But because men have taken this to mean that it makes no difference when He comes, there is all the more reason why we should find out the time as nearly as possible, and this God expects us to do. We may know by the signs when it is spring, even at the doors. Matt. 24: 32, 33. For the reason that we do not know the exact time, it is especially necessary to watch all the time. "Watch therefore, for ye know not what hour your Lord doth come." Matt. 24: 42. When the flood was to come and when Sodom was to be destroyed, the people were warned but they did not know destruction would come, because they refused to heed the warning. Matt. 24: 37-39. So will it be when Jesus appears, but we are responsible for what we may know. If the coming of our Lord seems to be delayed, it is because God waits a little longer that more may be saved, for He is not willing that any should perish. 2 Peter 3: 9-15.

Dear readers, let's study God's Word. One of the purposes God had in making the sun, moon and stars was for signs. Gen. 1: 14. He carried out that purpose by making the sun and moon stand still as a sign at the time of Joshua, (Josh. 10: 12, 13 and Isaiah 38: 7) signs continue, (2 Kings 20: 8-11) and by darkening it at the crucifixion scene. Luke 23:44. Christ said that as a sign of His second coming shall the sun be darkened and the moon shall not give her light. Matt: 24: 29. Some of these signs have been seen. The sun and moon was darkened May 19, 1780. Jesus said the stars shall fall from heaven, and on the night of Nov. 13, 1833 a remarkable shower of stars, such as man has never seen, fell toward the earth. Jesus said there shall be signs upon the earth; distress of nations, the sea and waves roaring, men's hearts failing them for fear and for looking after those things which are coming on the earth. Luke 21: 25, 26. Read the newspapers and see the fulfillment of this sign.

Dear readers, we have many other signs that we may be sure about this being the last days. 2 Peter 3: 3, 4. "Knowing this first, that there shall come in the last days, scoffers walking after their own lusts and saying where is the promise of His coming." Here is another sign; believers in the evolution theory are in themselves signs of Christ's coming. "Now the Spirit speaketh expressly that in the latter times some shall depart from the faith, giving heed to seducing spirits and doctrines of devils." 1 Tim. 4:1. While many are denying Christ's return, yet millions still believe in it. But this is not enough; let us watch the signs of the time here, "for there shall arise false Christs and false prophets, and shall show great signs and wonders insomuch that if it were possible they shall deceive the very elect." Matt. 24: 24. The devil will personate Christ; Satan himself is transformed into an angel of light. 2 Cor. 11: 14, 15. Therefore, it is no great thing if his ministers also be transformed as the ministers of righteousness whose end shall be according to their works. -T. J. Davis.

### Making Preparations, Yet Unprepared

"And as it is appointed unto men once to die, but after this the Judgment." Heb. 9:27. As we behold the lives of men and the universal preparations which they are making for dying and being buried, it causes us to realize that most men believe the truth contained in the fore part of this text that "it is appoined unto men once to die." As we note the many cemeteries and memorial parks which are being laid out and prepared as a place for men to be buried, it makes us know that men have a deep inner consciousness that sooner or later they will die and be buried.

A proprietor of a concrete works in our town was showing me the vaults which different citizens of our city had ordered him to make for them. They were still alive but had their vaults already made and waiting for them to die and be placed in for burial. All seem to know that they are going to die and are preparing for it, but how few really believe the latter part of this text, "but after this the judgment." By their actions, their deeds, their words and general conduct they prove to the spiritually minded that they do not in heart believe the latter part of this text, as very few are really making the necessary preparations to meet the Judgment. Most all die in their natural, carnal, unregenerated state; die in their sins unprepared to meet God.

Jesus said unto the Pharisees (religious people), "For if ye believe not that I am He, ye shall die in your sins." John 8: 24. Nearly all people by their actions and manner of life, (even though they may profess) prove that they do not believe in Christ. The few that do really believe in Christ find that His Spirit comes in and makes them new creatures; old things pass away and a new life is springing up in their soul, a pure life, a clean life, a holy life and it causes them to walk in His statutes, to keep His judgments and do them (Ezekiel 36: 27). There is a conscious knowledge, a great and real hope in their soul of a life with God beyond the grave. This living knowledge in the soul of immortality after death causes rest, peace, consolation and a deep-seated joy to continue to abide in their soul, even though they may be persecuted, abused, defamed and dishonored by men. The joy and comfort in the Holy Ghost remains undisturbed and they pray for their persecutors, having pity and mercy upon them. They no longer take the "natural course of this world" but continually seek His thoughts and His ways. As they receive His thoughts and walk in His ways they become a peculiar people, not understood by the worldly minded professor. They rejoice not in this life but in the life to They are no longer under bondage to the elements of this world through the spirit and power of Satan working through the carnal nature, because they now have the divine nature which gives them power and authority over Satan and all fleshly lusts that war against the soul. They are now lifted up and raised up together and made to sit together in heavenly places in Christ Jesus. Through the mighty working power of God, a great change has been wrought in their soul and their affections have been changed from earthly things to heavenly things, even on Christ who has passed into the heavens and has become their great High Priest who succors them in time of need. Their soul is continually nourished by things from heaven

as they "Live by every word that proceedeth out of the mouth of God." They eat that meat that the world knows not of; they eat the flesh of the Son of God and drink His blood and eternal life grows and increases and flourishes in their souls, even as the lilies and rushes by the water brooks. Their spiritual eyes have been opened by the Spirit of God and their understanding has ceased to be dull; their taste for heavenly things is keen and the relish is supreme. therefore they delight themselves in the Lord and receive the desires of their heart. The redeemed of the Lord are like a watered garden. Every thing is flourishing and though they may possess nothing, yet they are possessors of all things; the hills, the trees and all created life is speaking to their soul of the great "I AM," the "Alpha and Omega." They rejoice greatly with the created beings of God for they realize keenly concerning the horrible pit from whence they came, concerning the miry clay which they were in and how He set their feet on a solid Rock and established their goings, how He put a new song in their mouth, even praise unto our God (Psa. 40: 2, 3).

The greatest calamity and misfortune that could befall any man is the neglecting of his soul's salvation. He ought to prepare for his future state more than any thing else; the judgment is coming to every man, every woman, every boy and every girl and woe be unto them if they die unprepared to meet God. "Some men's sins are open beforehand, going before to judgment; and some men they follow after." 1 Tim. 5: 24. The only way that men's sins can go on before to Judgment is by confessing Christ with faith in the blood as an atonement, then their sins go on to God and He judges them innocent and they go free being uncondemned in this world, and then only are they prepared to meet God in peace. If men neglect the cleansing stream in this life, they will die in their sins and their sins will follow up after them. They will meet them there in the Judgment day and God will judge them unworthy of eternal life. Their sins will bar them out of heaven forever; sad day that will be indeed.

If it were possible to convey to the heart of the sinner the goodness of God as He really is, it would not be hard for him to repent, but the enemy of all righteousness seems to succeed in keeping hid from his view and knowledge the great and real goodness of God. Thus he droops on in darkness, being miserable, wretched, and without hope and without God in this world. The Word of God says, "There is no peace to the wicked, they are like the troubled sea, continually casting up mire and dirt." This witness is true;

but it need not continue to be so with the sinner. If he will only obey the word and repent and turn to God with all of his heart, he can be changed by the power of God in a moment of time, receiving peace, joy and righteousness in this life and the assurance of a home with God in the future. The only thing that is separating any man or woman from God or this peaceful, restful, joyous state is their sins and iniquities, and God has supplied a Mediator to bear these sins and iniquities away. The Mediator is the Son of God and He has fully completed His work and now it is up to man to repent of his sins and to receive the free gift of God. He must do this of his own free-will choice. He has individually offended God by committing sin and rejecting Christ, (God's offered mercy to lost mankind) so it is absolutely necessary that he become sorry and repent of this crime against His Creator, coming to God individually, asking God to forgive him of this great wrong, promising God and decreeing in his heart that he will henceforth obey and serve Him.

In Proverbs 28:13 we have a scripture that reads, "He that covereth his sins shall not prosper: but whoso confesseth and forsaketh them shall have mercy." First we must confess our sins and then forsake them, quit, cease to do them, then God will have mercy. In 1 John 1: 9 we read, "If we confess our sins, He is faithful and just to forgive us our sins, and to cleanse us from all unrighteousness." If man will be faithful to come back to God through repenting and confessing, God will be faithful and just with us, and will forgive and cleanse us from all unrighteousness. God will never fail any man that really believes for his salvation. The only hope that man has is given to us in Christ, and if in this life we neglect the cleansing stream, sad will be our end, for God has provided no other way for our escape. He is the "escape Goat." the "City of Refuge," the doorway to heaven; He declares Himself to be "The way, the truth and the life." He is the only hope for fallen man. # An Exclusive Christ

Jesus is the sovereign, universal King, and "only Potentate." He only is the Christ of God; He is the Savior of men, neither is there salvation in any other. "Ask of me," saith God in the covenant made with His Son in the untold ages of the past-"ask of me. and I shall give thee the heathen (Gentile nations) for thine inheritance, and the uttermost parts of the earth for thy possession." Psa. 2:8. Not only is He Lord over all the earth, but "when he bringeth in the first begotten into the world, he saith, And let all the angels of God worship him." Heb. 1:6. Jesus is King over heaven and earth, yea, throughout the vast universe. His kingdom, therefore, is an exclusive kingdom; it leaves no place for any other. It is the stone that breaks all other powers to pieces, and fills the whole earth.

His church is likewise exclusive. It is only to be expected that the Savior who gave his precious life to redeem us from sin, would jealously guard his redeemed church, and that any counterfeit would receive no recognition from Him. The Word of truth acknowledges no church besides the one founded by the Savior, and it is therefore our duty to recognize only this one. This church is the body of saved believers—"His body" (Eph. 1: 22, 23; Col. 1: 18, 24).

The Spirit of the God of the Bible is an exclusive Spirit. It repels and rejects every other spirit. God's children have all been "baptized by one Spirit into one body, and have been all made to drink into one Spirit" (1 Cor. 12:13). This all-searching and eternal Spirit in the hearts of the redeemed of the Lord takes cognizance of what kind of spirits dwell in the hearts and bodies of others who claim to be the worshippers of God. If of opposite character, there is no fellowship. If all are in possession of the pure and gentle Spirit and nature of God, the blessed elements of heaven, their hearts flow joyfully together; and this is fellowship, pure and heavenly, and the source of much happiness. Thus the Spirit of God endorses Himself and excludes all others.

The religion of Jesus Christ is exclusive in its nature. It compromises with no other. It justly assumes to be the only true religion and announces all others to be of the devil. This very characteristic has chiefly elicited the persecutions that have befallen Christ and His church in all ages. Had Christ been willing to fuse with Jewry and endorse along side of his own law the laws and the traditions of the Jews, they would not have crucified Him. Had the apostles grafted the new faith upon that Old Testament code that was ready to die and vanish away, then, says Paul, would the "offense of the cross have ceased."

At one time during the great persecution inflicted upon the saints of God by pagan Rome, the idolaters offered to spare the lives of the Christians and to give them religious liberty if they would but acknowledge the pagan gods and religion as also being genuine. But this the Christians could not do even to save their lives. Nay, only the system of divine worship that Christ founded is of God. It alone is the truth, and every other is false. As it was then, so it is now: to confess any religion but Christianity and any creed but the New Testament is to deny Christ. To confess that there is any true church besides the one Jesus built is to make God a liar. To be honest in the sight of God and to stand upon the offensive foundation of the exclusive Christ and His exclusive church, kingdom and religion, is what stirs the forces of opposition today and calls out what little persecution saints have to endure in these last days. This persecution, however, may yet assume degrees of severity. But, my soul says, let it come as the providence of God shall permit, and he will overrule it to His glory, to the more perfect purging of his sanctuary, and to the spiritual improvement of his remnant.

The sects would not mind our using the title given by the mouth of the Lord, namely, "the church of the living God," if we would only confess that all the sects are likewise churches of God—sister churches. But this would be confessing a falsehood. The Lord owns no sisterhood of sects, but ascribes "mystery Babylon" to Rome and her family of harlot daughters. This statement seems at first thought to be a hard saying. The Lord gave us eyes to see and ears to hear that we may receive the truth with unprejudiced hearts.

The Bible gives no place for a plurality of brotherhoods in Christ. "But one is your Father, and all ye are brethren," one family in heaven and earth (Eph. 3: 15). "For as we have many members in one body, and all members have not the same office: so we, being many, are one body in Christ, and every

one members one of another." Rom. 12: 4, 5. Only "one body in Christ." As we discern that body and know that God has inducted us into the same, it would be dishonesty in the sight of God and a base, cowardly compromise to please men, to admit that several hundred other bodies are also in Christ. Yea, it would be making God a liar, since His Word says there is one body in Christ, only one.

John Winebrenner was too honest a man to sanction such a lie. Hence he taught an exclusive church of God, and as a result met with persecutions from the sects, who were unchurched by the Word of God. He and those with him, however, did not possess sufficient light to avoid forming another sect. This they did when they organized themselves together in general and annual eldership incorporations. they called themselves the church of God, they soon found themselves without that Bible holiness and that identity with the body of Christ which authorized an exclusive use of the sacred title, "The Church of God." And finding themselves no more that divine body than other bodies organized by men, and becoming more and more destitute of godliness, they felt the inconsistency in crying "sect" to their sister sects. they dropped all opposition, confessed in plain words in their organ, that all the other sects were churches of God also, and consequently they are now received in peace in the Babel sisterhood.

But in the last few years God has raised up a people who fully discern the body of Christ. They have taken their stand upon the platform of "all truth," as it is in Christ Jesus. By the process of salvation they have been taken into the one fold of Christ (John 10:9); the Lord himself added them to His own body, the church (Acts 2: 47). They teach and accept no condition of membership in the church other than those conditions found in the Word of God. And by a life of perfect obedience to the divine will and of faith toward God, they have this witness that they please God and are abiding in the one and only church of God, which is the body of Christ and which includes all the saved in heaven and earth. With perfect consistency and loyalty to God they resist every spirit but that which they have received of God; reject every other church (so-called) but that which Christ built upon the rock; and say to all honest disciples of Christ who have been falsely taught and taken by men into men's churches, "Come out of her. come out from among them." Though this is the point of offense and persecutions, yet by the grace of God we will not compromise the truth to save our lives.

All sects are associated on a plane of sisterly non-

exclusiveness. To teach one God, one Lord, one body, and then to continue in a divided condition is to be a subject for the scorn of unbelievers and to make it difficult to reach the lost. None of the sects holds a divine charter for its existence; hence none challenges the right and title of another. In other words, all are without foundation in the Word of God; therefore they agree not to question each other's foundation. All have glass houses, hence must not throw stones at one another. But we repeat that in these last days God has raised up a people who believe the Word of God and act accordingly. Christ has but "one fold," one church; and, knowing we are saved into this one fold, we must, in order to be consistent before God and to act out his Word, ignore every other (so-called) fold or church.

With a view of destroying the work of God, the enemies of Ezra and of Nehemiah proposed to join with them in building the temple and the wall. But they answered them, "The God of heaven, He will prosper us; therefore we His servants will arise and build: but ye have no portion, nor right, nor memorial, in Jerusalem." Neh. 2: 20.

They were then an exclusive people unto the Lord, and their reformation at Jerusalem was a grand type of the present reformation, in which God is restoring a pure Church, the bride, the Lamb's wife. "As the Lord liveth, what the Lord saith, that will I say." It would be bigotry for one sect to say, "We are the church, and all the rest are frauds." But for God's true saints, who "follow the Lamb whithersoever He goeth," and belong only to Him, and adhere only in "His body, which is the church," and which includes all saved men in heaven and earth, in or out of sect folds—for such to talk of other churches would be inconsistent and God-dishonoring, yea, confusion. Therefore be sure you are right, then go ahead in holiness of heart and life.

"Noah condemned the whole world." One man mounted on eternal truth can safely defy all the devotees of human creeds and systems on earth. There is "one God." Amen. Then all others are idols. "One body." Amen. Then all sect bodies are excluded. "One Spirit." Then all spirits not in fellowship with the pure in heart are not of God. "One Christ." Then all others are Anti-christ. — D. S. Warner.
