Are you Born Again?

In a village church in England one Sunday the the kingdom of His dear Son' (Col. 1: 12, 13). 'pastor spoke on the text, "Except a man be born appositive theology can give you no other answer."

gain he cannot see the kingdom of God." (John 3:3)

Among the audience were some noblemen, to whom the village partly belonged. One of these—Sir Vivyan—was so deeply impressed by the force of the text that he became very restless and troubled, not knowing how this change to a new being was to be made. He was a young man, morally good, and had known this Scripture from his childhood; but not until now did he realize that he would be eternally lost if he died as he lived, and that he must be born again in order to be saved for eternity.

In his anxiety to get clear about this vital truth, Sir Vivyan a few days later invited the pastor—Mr. Longdald—for dinner to his castle, stating that he wanted to get definite information on a point that had troubled him since Sunday.

After dinner the pastor asked Sir Vivyan what it was that he wanted information about. "I have been deeply concerned about the subject of your last Sunday's sermon," he answered.

"What is it then that you didn't get quite clear on?" inquired the pastor.

"Well, to be born again, which is necessary for salvation, is it a mere theory or a real and actual change?"

"Of course," said the pastor, "the Holy Scriptures leave no doubt about that. The word 'born again' in the original means 'born anew,' or 'born from above,' which says that the soul enters an entirely new life. The Scriptures speak of this birth in other ways elsewhere, but in every case it means a real change from one life into another. A mere religious reforming of ways and manners wouldn't bring that about. For instance, it is called 'passing from death unto life' (John 5: 24); 'a turning from darkness to light' (Acts 26: 18), 'making us meet to be partakers of the inheritance of the saints in light,' 'deliverance from the power of darkness,' and a 'translating into the kingdom of His dear Son' (Col. 1: 12, 13). The positive theology can give you no other answer."

"Then," asked the anxious young nobleman, "the new birth is really a renewing and a change that the soul must practically experience in this world, is it not?"

"Yes, without a doubt," replied the pastor, getting uneasy about the seriousness of the conversation.

"And how can I be born again?" was the next question.

Now the pastor was evidently confused. He saw that here was a case where his orthodox knowledge and his theological intelligence was insufficient; here was a really awakened man craving for the truth about salvation which he could not supply. Here could only experienced reality give light. "Yes," he said, almost dreaming, "there are differences of opinion on that part among the theological schools."

"Oh, please let us leave out the theological schools. Books and theories cannot help me here," replied the nobleman, almost angry; and then, looking at the pale face of his guest, he said: "Excuse me, dear pastor, my soul is in distress; I seek light and peace. It is a question of eternity and I grope in darkness and see no light. Tell me, I pray, how can I be born again, and who has experienced this change on himself? In short, are you—."

The heavy table shook as the strong man began this personal question. He trembled and was unable to finish the question. But the pastor understood. He dropped his head and covered his pale face with both hands.

Now there was a deadly silence for some time. Then the pastor arose and with tears in his eyes said: "My dear friend, let us pray." Sir Vivyan understood; they were both not yet born again; neither had yet come to the Lord Jesus Christ as lost sinners to receive from Him forgiveness and eternal life; tears filled his eyes, too.

And there and then they bent their knees together and cried to God for mercy, for salvation and eternal life, and received the answer from Him who said, "him that cometh to Me I will in no wise cast out" (John 6: 37). They received peace with God and eternal life (Rom. 5: 1; 1 John 5: 13).

For several weeks Mr. Longdale was not seen in the pulpit, but when he took his old place again, oh, how different was his preaching! He could speak now in the power of the Holy Spirit of the Savior and of the gift of eternal life, now really his own. At the end of the sermon he told his astonished people what the Lord had done to his soul. Many were moved to tears, and when he then knelt down, praising and wor-

shipping and praying his Lord and Savior for blessing, many turned to the Lord Jesus Christ for their own salvation and happiness for time and eternity. It was a day of blessing, never to be forgotten.

Implicit Trust

"Except ye become as a little child, ye cannot enter the kingdom of heaven" (Mark 9: 15).

The trust of a little child is wholly centered in its father, providing he is a good father. Be not deceived; the God-given instinct of a child is so keen that they scent any wrong-doings without actually having any visible signs.

A mother, because the father was so stingy, was forced at times to buy things secretly, having to use underhanded business transactions; (not really wrong on her part, as she should have had as much right as he, as she worked really harder than he did and was a much better manager). Seemingly, the young children naturally understood conditions, but every one of them proved to be sneaky and unreliable. Were not both of the parents to blame? The father first, and also the mother, because she did not face the issue openly; possibly on account of persecution, or thinking perhaps a family row had been avoided, which in this case (if her heart was right with God) would have been preferable, as He, who promises wisdom for every problem, would have managed for her.

A little girl was frequently taken to town by her father who would give her some small change to buy candy, while he went elsewhere, cautioning her not to tell mother that he had left her. That child certainly felt in her little heart that something was seriously wrong between her parents, although she could not explain it. There will be children in hell (not little children, but offspring of parents) who have not been true to their marriage vow, thus being responsible for their lost condition. Nothing short of a pure heart and life will stand the judgment test.

Jesus says, "It were better that a millstone were hanged about your neck, than that you should offend one of these little ones."

How confidently a little child will place its hand in the parent's, fearing neither darkness, wild beasts, or dangers of any description; neither does it worry about its food or other necessities—just happy to know that all is well as long as confidence reigns, asking questions and favors. How happy they are in each other's love. God is a jealous God, visiting the iniquity of the fathers (and mothers) unto the third and fourth generations (Ex. 22).

Why should we place our trust in insurance companies and lodges, thus telling by our actions that our faith is in man more than God? Many so-called holiness people take the Lord for their healer so long as they have no aches, but where is their faith when some one of the family feels out of order, and fear of death causes them to rush for a doctor who must be (and rightly should be) paid for his unnecessary service? Not a missionary would be wanting for necessities if the money thus spent was placed in the mission fund. It is nothing to spend hundreds, yes, thousands of dollars for operations, which, if the law of God was obeyed by proper dieting and care of the body, (which is supposed to be the temple of the holy Spirit) would be avoided.

While at Santa Cruz, Calif. along the beach, I noticed a young man with a small boy at his side. I think the mother was there, too. The little fellow enjoyed wading in the water, fearing no danger. Every time just before a breaker would reach him, he was safely in the arms of his father who could ride the billows.

As a father pities his children, so does He pity those that fear to displease Him. He is more willing to provide for us than we are to please our children. Should we ask for bread, would He give us a serpent? "Have faith in God" who is able and willing to carry us over every tide, providing our will is wholly centered in Him.

EDITORIALS

It is with much pleasure and deep joy that we send forth this February issue of Faith and Victory paper. We have well begun on the New Year now, and with joy we take up the work that is before us, having confidence in our Leader who has won the battles for us during the past year. Christ, our Captain, is going on before; we follow Him and Satan is behind—he is a conquered foe to every trusting, faithful child of God.

We have much pity for those who are crushed, bruised and bound by Satan. If they only knew how much stronger God is than Satan, if they could only see what a mean whelp is holding and ruling over them, they would yield to and seek the Lord until He rained righteousness down upon them (Hosea 10: 12). Jesus said, "He was a murderer from the beginning and abode not in the truth, because there is no truth in him * * * for he is a liar and the father of it" (John 8: 44). So, it is right for us not to believe the devil if he does tell the truth, for his motive in telling the truth is for the purpose of leading you to believe a lie.

There are many preachers in the world today preaching right things. Satan's preachers are preachers of righteuosness in many instances (2 Cor. 11:15). By righteous preaching they lead souls into believing lies. There are more souls blinded, led astray and destroyed by this dope of truth and lie than any other drug handled by salesmen of the lower regions in angel's garb. Many today are crying, 'liberty of conscience' while they sear their own consciences by "building again the thing which they once destroyed" (Gal. 2: 18). Brethren, let us consider well the pit from whence we were dug, and the rock from whence we were hewn. (Isa. 51: 1). The Psalmist David, in speaking of God's children, says "They shall not be ashamed in the evil time; and in the days of famine they shall be satisfied" (Psa. 37: 19). Lord has kept us not ashamed in this evil world, and has satisfied us in the 'hard oppressing times' which the world in general is groaning under.

Those who have been co-operating with us in sending forth this gospel literature will have treasures laid up in heaven; their giving has not been in vain, as the means sent has been judiciously used in the work, and every precaution has been used to do the most good possible with the least expense. There were nearly twenty ministers present. We had ministers' meeting every morning during the last

few days of the meeting. Among other things brought up and considered was the question of life insurance. Considerable time was taken up on this subject, as it seems that some of our good brethren are needing reproof on this line. All the ministers present, as far as could be learned, were against life insurance or anything else that showed a lack of faith in God, and there seems to be no danger of them taking up with those who are leaning that way, but they rather have a reproof for them for their lack of faith and confidence in God to supply all our needs. Saints, who are living with faith in God, will not be permitted to suffer more than they are able to bear, without escape. Anyone is certainly taking plenty of authority to legislate contrary to generally accepted truth. Jesus reproved the disciples for their little faith. He says, "Oh! ye of little faith." Luke 12:28.

It has been universally taught and practised among us that saints should not send for a doctor or take medicine when sick, but trust God through prayer to heal them, and God has been verifying His promises and healing those that trusted alone in Him. Yet there is no scripture that says, "Thou shalt not call a doctor or take medicine"; however, the very tenor of Scriptures teaches us against those things, and the Spirit of Christ within us knows that God does not need man's drugs to heal us, so also with many other things (2 Cor. 7:1). Tobacco is not named, but the scriptures teaches against filthiness of the flesh, and against defiling and injuring your body, and we know that tobacco is both injurious and filthy, so we resist it as an evil thing. Life insurance likewise is not named in the Bible, but it does teach us to lay up our treasures in heaven (Luke 12:34) and to put our trust in God and not in the arm of flesh, to take no thought for the morrow, (Matt. 6: 34) to pray for our daily bread and not 'old age bread', and teaches us to leave our "fatherless children and widows to Him" (Jer. 49: 11). Knowing this truth and many others, we readily see that God would be displeased for us to distrust God and try to secure our future care by faith in earthly companies which is the arm of flesh.

We have a tract entitled, "Life Insurance" which gives some truth on this subject, and shall be glad to send it to any one desiring it. There are many ways by which men can become conformed to this world. We keep a tender conscience toward God by careful obedience to His word. The "liberty of conscience" doctrine will cause one to ride over the finer teachings of His word, and their conscience will soon become so seared and not troubled that it will be easy for them to "build again the things they once destroy-

ed" (Gal. 2: 18). Brethren, let us deny ourselves, and suffer with Jesus the scoff and scorn of the proud professors. If we suffer with Him, we shall also reign with Him. Keep dead and your life hid with Christ in God and none of these things will move you.

It is needless for any one to think that the "Church" is going down, for "the gates of hell shall not prevail against her". Satan has always tried to keep her hid from men, piling up much rubbish in trying to hide the City from view. He has always got a few to apostatize and lead disciples off with them, and we need not be surprized about his stirrings. The Church of God or the family of God is marching right on in the lowly humble ways of God, and there will be a remnant here when Jesus comes. Do not be troubled about seemingly important ones letting down and drifting; many are loving this present world. Iniquity is abounding and the love of many is waxing cold. Fear

"But unto you that fear my name shall the Sun of righteousness arise with healing in his wings; and ye shall go forth, and grow up as calves of the stall." Mal. 4:2.

Feeling the burden upon my heart, I believe God would have me write some on this very important subject. Now, listen to what the prophet said, "But unto YOU that fear my name." Thank God, I am glad it takes in all that do this, and to what are they like? Calves of the stall which are lively, full of life. Yes, some one may say, I knew God's people should be a lively people. Very well, but not the levity or foolishness of this world, but lively stones built up a spiritual house, an holy priesthood, to offer up spiritual sacrifices acceptable to God by Jesus Christ (1 Pet. 2:5). We don't rejoice in iniquity, but in the truth. (1 Cor. 13:6). For the fear of the Lord is the beginning of wisdom (Psa. 111:10), and by it men depart from evil (Prov. 16:6).

Also fear not him that can only destroy this body and hath no more that he can do, but rather fear Him that can destroy both soul and body in hell (Matt. 10:28, also Luke 12:4).

"Keep thy eye turned inwardly upon thyself, and beware of judging the actions of others. In judging others, a man labors to no purpose, commonly errs, and easily sins: but in examining and judging himself, he is always wisely and usefully employed."

"We generally judge of persons and things as they either oppose or gratify our private views and inclinations; and, blinded by self-love, are easily led from the judgment of truth. If God alone was the pure object of all our intentions and desires, we should not be troubled when the truth of things happens to be repugnant to our own sentiments: but now, we are continually drawn aside from truth and peace by some partial inclination lurking within, or some apparent good or evil rising without."

"He is truly good, who hath great charity; he is truly great, who is little in his own estimation, and rates at nothing the summit of worldly honor: he is truly wise, who 'counts all earthly things but as dross, that he may win Christ:' and he is truly learned, who hath learned to abandon his own will, and do the will of God."

"'He that followeth me shall not walk in darkness, but shall have the light of life.' These are the words of Christ; by which we are taught, that it is only by a conformity to His life and spirit that we can be truly enlightened, and delivered from all blindness

of heart: let it, therefore, be the principal employment of our minds to meditate on the life of Christ."

Frequently call to mind the observation of Solomon, that 'the eye is not satisfied with seeing, nor the ear filled with hearing;' and let it be thy continual endeavor to withdraw thy heart from the love of 'the things that are seen,' and to turn it wholly to 'the things that are not seen:' for he who lives in subjection to the sensual desires of animal nature defiles his spirit, and loses the grace of God.'' — L. ANTITHESIS OF CHURCH OF GOD AND SECTS

(G. E. Harmon, Part Two)

What is a sect? Any institution that does not include all the saints of heaven and earth in its membership. For example, does the Methodist denomination, to which I used to belong, include all the family of God? If so, then there are no Christians outside of that particular sect. To admit that there are saved people outside of it, is to admit that that denomination is a sect. In talking with one of our circuit riders years ago, he said he thanked God for all the denominations of earth, for it took them all to complete the gospel Church. If so, then the sects taken together include all the saved in heaven and earth; but they do not, and they know better. There are thousands in paradise that never belonged to a sect, and thousands on earth who do not hold membership in any sect, and yet they are saints of the Most High God, and their names are in heaven. Luke 10: 20 says, rejoice not that spirits are subject unto you, but rather rejoice because your names are written in heaven. The names of all who hold membership in the Church of God are written in heaven in the Book of Life (Phil. 4:3). The Lord shall count when He writeth up the people, that this man was born there (Psa. 87:6), but on the other hand, all sects write their members' names in a book "in the earth". "All they that depart from me shall be written in the earth, because they have forsaken the fountain of living waters" (Jer. 17: 13).

Again, if it takes all the sects to compose the Church of God, where was His Church before they arose? But thank God, His Church was in existence 1500 years before the first Protestant sect was organized. To teach a relationship between the sects and Church of God is to make the Word of God a lie, and become guilty of heresy. God help all honest souls to hear the voice of God, "Come out of her, my people,

that ye be not partakers of her sins, and that ye receive not of her plagues" (Rev. 18:4). All the saved belong to one body (Col. 1:18); "we being many are one body in Christ" (Rom. 12:5). There is one body and one spirit (Eph. 4:4) or one body (1 Cor. 12:12), baptized into one body (verse 13), reconciled in one body (Eph. 2:16), called in one body (Col. 3:15). One body proved only one church, one in Christ, then all other bodies are out of Christ. We abide only in the one body (the Church of God) and reject all others as antichrist. Christ is the head of but one body; no sect has Christ for its head. They all have human heads. Salvation makes us members of the Church of God, but not of any sect, and the Lord added to the Church daily such as should be saved (Acts 2:47).

Jesus said, "I am the door; by me, if any man enter in, he shall be saved" (Jno: 10:9). Church and kingdom are practically the same. Conversion puts us into the kingdom (Matt. 18:3); by the new birth we enter the kingdom (Jno. 3:3-5). The moment a person is saved, he is a member of the Church of God. Docs that make him a member of the Baptist, Dunkard, Methodist, or any other sect? No, never; for one must join to become a member of any sect institution: hence, they are not orthodox, as some sects claim to be. The only way to become a member of the Church of God is to get salvation, but that does not make him a member of any sect.

There is not a sinner in the Church of God. We stay in there as long as we stay saved, but the moment we commit sin, we are out. God holds the blotter; no man can put us in, and no man can put us out. "Whosoever hath sinned against me, him will I blot out of my book" (Ex. 32: 33). He that committeth sin is of the devil (1 Jno. 3:8). The soul that sinneth, it shall cie (Ezek. 18:4). Christ takes the members into His Church. The preacher takes the members into his sect. "But now hath God set the members every one of them in the body, as it hath pleased Him (1 Cor. 12:18). No sect preacher can put a member in the Church of God, or put one out. "Who (God) hath delivered us from the power of darkness and hath translated us into the kingdom of His dear Son'' (Col. 1: 13). Men can preach the Word, instruct souls in the way of righteousness, but inducting us into the Church is the work of the Almighty. Their excuse is, the Lord takes them into the invisible church, but the preacher takes them into the visible church. This is heresy, for the Church of God existed several hundreds of years before there was a professed Christian sect to join.

Is the Church of God an invisible body of believers? No, Jesus likened it to a city set on a hill that

cannot be hid. Has sectism made the church visible? No, they have covered it over with human rubbish and hid it for a time from the people, but God's true ministers are applying the torch of truth to their human rubbish. They say, we believe in the unity of the invisible church; well, we believe also in the unity of the visible church. For example, we hold a meeting in some locality and fifty souls are saved. They follow the Lord in baptism, assemble themselves together and partake of the ordinances of the house of God, worship Him in the spirit of holiness: is not this visible unity? Is it not Divinely organized?

But now suppose, some sectarian (wolf) got in among the flock and inculcate in their minds a schismatic spirit, and ten of them send for a Methodist preacher to organize a Methodist sect, ten send for a Baptist, ten for a Dunkard, ten for a Nazarene and ten for a Free Methodist. They come and set up their organizations; what have they done? Have they made the Chruch more visible? No, never, but they have disorgani ed it. Their names were all written in heaven in the Lamb's Book of Life (Rev. 21: 27), but now they are written in the earth. "Oh! Lord, the hope of Israel, all that forsake thee shall be ashamed, and they that depart from me shall be written in the earth, because they have forsaken the Lord, the fountain of living waters" (Jer. 17: 13). The general assembly and church of the firstborn are written in heaven. (Heb. 12:23). But in sect Babylon each denomination has a book of their own in which they write their members' names. The Church of God unites believers while sects divide and scatter.

The New Testament is our discipline; all have the same faith and doctrine. God set every one of the members in the body (His Church). 1 Cor. 12: 18, "Now ye are the body of Christ and members in particular, and God hath set some in the church, first apostles, secondarily prophets, thirdly teachers. After that miracles, then gifts of healing, helps, governments, diversities of tongues." All the above gifts are divinely ordered and placed in the body of Christ. The Emphatic Diaglott says, all are not prophets, all are not teachers, all do not speak with tongues, etc.

Will This Earth Pass Away, And Be No More?

Some Millennial teachers base their hopes on Eccl. 1:4.***" but the earth abideth forever." We will give another scripture which will make this plain as lasting for a time only. "While the earth remaineth, seedtime and harvest, and cold and heat, and summer and winter, and day and night shall not cease" (Gen. 8:22). This is to be while the earth remains. Both the Old and the New Testament teaches that this earth will pass away. "Of old hast thou laid the foundation of the earth: and the heavens are the work of thy hands they shall perish, but thou shalt endure: yea all of them shall wax old like a garment; as a vesture shalt thou change them and they shall be changed:" (Psa. 102: 25.26.) "For a fire is kindled in mine anger; and shall burn unto the lowest hell, and shall consume the earth with her increase, and set on fire the foundations of the mountains." (Duet. 32:22.) New Testament. "And Thou Lord, in the beginning hast laid the foundations of the earth; and the heavens are the works of thine hands: They shall perish; but thou remainest; and they all shall wax old as doth a garment; And as a vesture shalt thou fold them up, and they shall be changed: but thou art the same, and thy years shall not fail." (Heb. 1:10-12.) Jesus says it shall pass away (Mat. 24:35). Peter says it shall be burned up. "But the day of the Lord will come as a thief in the night; in the which the heavens shall pass away with a great noise, and the elements shall melt with fervent heat, the earth also and the works that are therein shall be burned up." (2 Pet. 3:10. V. 7) "And I saw a great white throne, and he that sat on it from whose face the earth and heavens fled away; and there was found no place for them." (Rev. 20:11.)

These scriptures positively prove the utter destrution of the earth. We have been asked why we ignored Rev. 20:5 and 7. in the article, The Gentile Age. In reply, we positively have not ignored these scriptures. They are highly symbolized and have their place and meaning in the New Testament. The first verse reads, "And I saw an angel come down from heaven, having the key to the bottomless pit and a great chain in his hand (2) And he laid hold on the dragon, that old serpent, which is the Devil and Satan, and bound him a thousand years."

When Jesus Christ came to this world the heathen

religion was pagan; this was the power by which the whole world was deceived. Jesus Christ with His pure apostolic ministry made war against it, and with this chain of His eternal truth He bound it and cast it down and set up His Church or kingdom instead thereof. Then God's saints reigned upon earth. But this Dragon was to deceive the nations no more till the thousand years expired. Remember, there came an apostasy, but it was not old pagan Rome by which the world was then deceived. But during this period of darkness it was papal Rome which reigned about 1260 years. During this time the reign on earth ceased and the Church was in the wilderness, and the man child which caught up this reign of saints and martyrs was with Christ in Paradise. "And I saw thrones, and they sat upon them, and judgment was given unto them: and I saw the souls of them that were beheaded for the witness of Jesus, and for the word of God, and which had not worshipped the beast, neither his image. neither had received his mark upon their foreheads, or in their hands; and they lived and reigned with Christ a thousand years. (Not on earth, but with Christ). But the rest of the dead lived not again until the thousands years were finished. This is the first resurrection;" resurrected from spiritual death unto spiritual life in Christ. It makes men holy. "And you hath He quickened, who were dead in trespasses and sins" (made alive, Eph. 2:1). Jesus said, "Let the dead bury their dead: but go thou and preach the kingdom of God'' (Luke 9:60). Here is represented both literal and spiritual death, because a dead man could not bury a dead man. "Blessed and holy is he that hath part in the first resurrection: on such the second death hath no power, but they shall be priests of God and of Christ, and shall reign with Him a thousand years." During the reign of Catholicism the saints were martyred. In this time there was a great spiritual famine and the gospel was not allowed to be preached, which is the source of spiritual life. Therefore, the rest of the dead lived not again until the thousand years were finished. "And it was given unto him to make war with the saints, and to overcome them: and power was given him over all kindreds, and tongues, and nations, (Rev. 13: 7) and power was given unto him to continue forty and two months," reaching to about 1530 A. D. At this time he was to be loosed a little season and go out to deceive the nations. So you see that the binding of the dragon has already taken place, and he is now loosed. He has now established hundreds of divisions and calls them churches, and his agents say God's people must join some one of them in order to have a home, teaching for doctrines the commandments

of men.

There is but one Church, and it was built by Christ and He is the door. All the redeemed belong to it; all who are members of it are born into it. There is no other way of salvation. The New Testament is its discipline; in it we find its doctrine. "Thy righteousness is an everlasting righteousness and thy law is the truth." Psa. 119: 142. "All scripture is given by inspiration of God, and is profitable for doctrine, for reproof, for correction, for instruction in righteousness: that the man of God may be perfect, throughly furnished unto all good works." 2 Tim. 3:16, 17. All these human frauds are now uniting against the true Church of God. Read Rev. 20: 8-10, and you will see how this conflict will end, which shall soon take place. We are now living under the sixth seal, when the seventh trumpet sounds, then our world shall be no more.

" 'Maybe you did not see the bag of beans under my arm. I knew I would have a pretty morning's work taking them there if I didn't humor them a bit, so I got some beans, which they are particularly fond of, and dropped them along the road. And you saw how they scampered along picking up the beans, never thinking they were going to the slaughter.'
