Whereas the Word declares it is, "the gift of God and not of works." Yes, it is a Bible fact that even after one is born again he must live a certain way to keep saved. And that way is Jesus with all his teachings and His blessed holy life as our example to live by. It is true that a sinner can not work himself into Christ but after he forsakes his way, (Isa. 55:7) repents of his sins, brings forth fruits meet for repentance, (Matt. 3:8) then he may believe into Him (John 1:12). Question: When a child is born in his father's family, is he not always his child? Yes, until death takes Him out of the family. Likewise, he who has been born of God into his spiritual family may die a spiritual death by committing sin and thus separate himself from the family. "The soul that sinneth it shall die" (Ezek. 18:4). Question: Is it not His business who hath begotton us to keep us? Yes, by His power thru faith. (1 Pet. 1:3-5)., But notice, it is through faith in Him and His Word. Without faith it is impossible to please Him (Heb. 11:6). If we have faith in Him, we will observe all things He has commanded us (Matt. 28:20). Question: May I not be a disobedient child and yet be his child? No, disobedience makes men sinners (Rom. 5:19). When Jesus comes

He will punish those who do not obey the Gospel, (2 Thess. 1:8-9). Regardless of what they profess. Question: When my child sins, I can not take his life, then give it back to him when he repents, can I? No, you must chasten him, then receive him back in your confidence when he repents. But if he does not repent, your confidence in him is gone. Just so, if a child of God goes into sin, he separates himself from the fellowship of God. When he repents, God. receives him back again. If he does not repent, and goes right on professing, he is like the one in Rev. 3: 15-16, become lukewarm and perhaps been spued out a long time ago and don't know it. Deceived themselves by their profession, or "like the sow that was washed, to her wallowing in the mire again and the dog to his own vomit again." (2 Pet. 2:21-22). Question: But am not I a sinner saved by grace? If you are a sinner, if saved at all, it will be by grace, then you will be no longer a sinner. "He that committeth sin is of the devil." (1 John 3:8). Question: Ts there not a difference between my state and my standing? If I have been born again, am I not safe forever because of my standing in Him? Whereas, my state here on earth in the flesh may fluctuate up and down and must confess because of the carnality in me that I am far from being perfect but does that affect my standing with God? Yes, you can not serve God and mammon at the same time; cannot be a sinner and a Christian at the same time or an honest man and a thief at the same time. Question: If I have been born again, is it not my body that sins instead of my soul? No, "every sin that a man doeth is without the body." (1 Cor. 6:18). The Emphatic has it. "exterior to outside or independent of the body." It is true the head and heart acts and reacts to each other. Therefore, Paul says, "I keep mv body under, or bring it into subjection, lest when I have preached to others I myself should be a castaway." (1 Cor. 9:27). To you who have so much trouble with the flesh, crucify it. (Gal. 6:24, 2:20). Then sin will not reign in your mortal body. (Rom. 6:12). "The wages of sin is death." Paul says to them who are trying to keep the old law along with the law of grace, "Ye are fallen from grace." Gal. 5:4). Some are dead while they live (1 Tim. 5:6). People who sin more or less every day have nothing to fall from because they are already down.

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"Redemption Of The Body"

In Rom. 8: 18-23 the Apostle Paul writes: "1 reckon that the sufferings of this present time are not worthy to be compared with the *glory that shall* be revealed in us. For the earnest expectation of the creature waiteth for the manifestation of the sons of God. For we know that the whole creation groaneth and travaileth in pain together until now. And not only they, but ourselves also, which have the firstfruits of the Spirit, even we ourselves groan within our selves, waiting for the adoption, to wit, the redemption of the body."

This text speaks specifically of the "redemption of the body" as an event which was to take place at a future time. Let us here particularly notice this phase or benefit of the great redemption plan. Much is spoken about the blessed realities of how the soul of man is redeemed back to God through the atoning blood of Jesus, but now we want to call your attention to another benefit of this complete salvation, how that it not only redeems the soul but also the *body*.

Man is a compound being, composed of soul and body, the inner man and outer man. "Though our outward man perish, yet the inward man is renewed day by day." 2 Cor. 4:16. Man is then a combination of an immortal soul and a mortal body. "And the Lord God formed man of the dust of the ground, and breathed into his nostrils the breath of life; and man became a living soul." Gen. 2: 7. The inner man, or soul, is immortal (undying, deathless), and salvation from sin does not make the soul of man immortal as some believe. The soul, however, is the responsible part of man, for it was made in God's image, created pure and holy and has a conscience of right Sin originates from the soul or inner and wrong. man. "For from within, out of the heart of men, proceed evil thoughts, adulteries, fornications, murders, thefts, covetousness, . . . all these evil things come from within, and defile the man." Mark 7:21-23 Hence, the soul of man must be redeemed from sin.

When man was in the Garden of Eden he had the privilege to eat of the 'tree of life' and thereby possess bodily immortality. Yet when man sinned, a curse of physical death was placed on the body of man as one of the penalties. Now through the atonement of Christ the soul of man can be redeemed from sin and re-united with its Creator as it was in Eden. Consequently, with the present experience of salvation, there is given a promise and hope of a future salvation or redemption of the outer man—bodily immortality, a benefit which we do not now possess. "For our conversation is in heaven; from whence also we look for the Sawiour, the Lord Jesus Christ, who shall change our vile (mortal) body, that it may be fashioned like unto his glorious body." Phil. 3:20,21. Therefore, the whole man, both body and soul, is included in the plan of redemption. However, the redemption of the body is not a redemption from sin, for it is not responsible for sin (1 Cor. 6:18), but it is a redemption from the power of physical death, γ resurrection of the mortal body to glorified immortality.

The apostle Paul here again pictures our present condition and the future resurrection to bodily immortality. "For we know that if our earthly house of this tabernacle were dissolved, we have a building of God, an house not made with hands, eternal in the heavens." 2 Cor. 5: 1.

Of the time of this change of the body from mortality to immortality, we read: "For since by man came death, by man came also the resurrection of the dead. For as in Adam all die, even so in Christ shail all be made alive. But every man in his own order: Christ the first-fruits; afterward they that are Christ's at his coming." "For the trumpet shall sound and the dead shall be raised incorruptible, and we shall be changed. For this corruptible must put on incorruption and this mortal must put on immortality. So when this corruptible shall have put on incorruption, and this mortal shall have put on immortality, then shall be brought to pass the saying that is written, Death is swallowed up in victory." 1 Cor. 15: 21-23, 52-54. This glorious resurrection is the "redemption of the body," and we might call it the second greatest benefit of salvation, for then only does man, soul and body, stand fully redeemed (in point of fulfillment) from the curse of sin. In Genesis 3: 22, 23 we read that man lost his right to the "tree of life" (immortality), and now in Rev. 22: 14 the way is again opened to the tree of life. "Blessed are they that do his commandments, that they may have right to the tree of life, and may enter in through the gates into the city."

The price of complete salvation for soul and body was fully paid on the cross when Christ said, "It is finished," but in actual fulfillment it is drawn out over a long period. May the Lord help every saint and sinner to see the marvelous benefits in the system of redemption. —L. D. Pruitt.

Quite a number of the young saints who were attending the meeting came in and helped us, some nights after service they would come and we would all work until twelve o'clock or later, the paste and papers certainly did fly, they were a happy bunch of young saints rejoicing in the Lord, while they folded and wrapped papers. Since the January paper was put in the mail we have been busy printing tracts and doing other necessary work connected with printing. We rejoice to be busy for the Lord. We have been in receipt of a number of very encouraging letters of late from parties who have been reading the tracts and papers, God has made the contents such a wonderful blessing to their souls. When others are encouraged it encourages us and we have the assurance that our long hours of labor are not in vain. The Lord so definitely led us into the printing of the gospel that the devil has never been able to make us doubt the calling and we expect to move on in the will of God regardless of what others do, say or think. We solicit your earnest prayers.

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Through the goodness of God and his consecrated children we have been able to get some of the Lord's machinery repaired so that it is giving much better service, several new parts have been put on the Linotype and other pieces have been fixed by a mechanic and we have also replaced three worn out belts. This repairing is a great *relief* to the operator as well as deep satisfaction to us. We humbly thank God for the same. The stitcher has been taken to a machinist and a much needed part which has been giving trouble for a long time has been fixed. This, also is a relief. We are soon going to have a machinist to work on the cylinder press. The job press has been run so long and has been repaired so much that it seems that the Lord would be willing to supply us with another in some way. Agree in prayer with us for this needed machine. We are asking God to give us a 14 by 22 New Series C. and P. Job press with a self feeder. A machine like this would enable us to double our present capacity in the printing of booklets and tracts and the printing would be far superior to the present work. I cannot believe that God wants his work to go crippling along, hindered and handicapped by worn out and inferior machinery. I can hardly see

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how saints who are 'sanctified wholly' can withhold means from God's needed work and at the same time have any burden for lost souls that are perishing. While we live here in these mortal bodies is the only opportunity that we will ever have to lay up treasures in heaven. Money put into a printing press will be printing and sending forth the gospel long after our bodies have gone back to dust and our spirits returned to our God, the Giver, and is living with Jesus. It would be hard to estimate the amount of the continual good that would be done by a printing press sending forth the Gospel by the printed page. Jesus said, that one soul was worth more than the whole world. The greatest and most honored buisness in the world today is activity in getting truth of salvation to souls on the broad way. We rejoiced the other night at praver meeting when a young married man arose and testified that he was saved and sanctified. Said the Lord had healed his body and delivered him from the tobacco habit. He was one that was seeking God in the late assembly meeting. The Lord is still on his throne and saves to the utter-most all that seek him with all their heart.

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We have recently been in correspondence with a man who has persuaded himself that there is no such thing as a lake of fire, torment or punishment for the wicked and Christ rejecters. It always makes me sad at heart when I come in contact with men who are trying to ease their consciences in this way. I once tho't that, too, when I was unsaved. Since God has raved my soul and took away the sting of death I can see the justice of God in all the Bible truths and I do not bother myself of trying to arrange and fix up the scriptures to do away with the penalty of death and punishment which is upon every unsaved soul. In the 18th chapter of Matt. and 8th verse Jesus says, "It is better for thee to enter into life halt or maimed, rather than having two hands or two feet, to be cast into everlasting fire." Everlasting means no ending and fire is something that will surely be burning the soul. Salvation through Christ is the only remedy for souls, there is no other escape.

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In the 25th chapter of Matt. Jesus says, "all nations will be gathered before him at his coming with holy angels, they will be divided, the righteous on the right hand and the Christ rejecters on the left, just like a shepherd divides sheep from the goats. He will say to them on the left hand, "Depart from me, ye cursed, into everlasting fire, prepared for the devil and his angels." In the last verse he says, "And these (the wicked) shall go away into everlasting punishment: but the righteous into life eternal."

Most all of this "no punishment" persuasion will say that God is to good to punish any person or send them to hell or torment. If you will notice the scripture you will find that God prepared hell fire for the devil and his angels and if men go there it is because they choose to go there. God does not send them. When they reject Christ there is no other place for them to go. God has made every provision possible for the salvation of man. A law without a penalty would be no law at all. God is dealing justly and altogether righteous with every soul.

"Out of the heart are the issues of life." Whatsoever a man lets down into his heart that is what will issue out. God is so great and mighty in wisdom and knowledge that he has so arranged the words in the Bible and the teachings that if a man will not get right in heart he will persuade himself to believe the Bible teaches this or that to try to justify himself or ease his conscience for the time being. Fleeing Youthful Lusts

Timothy was a young man. Paul knew the danger of young men being overcome by youthful lusts, therefore exhorts Timothy to "flee also youthful lusts" 2 Tim. 2:22. We, in much earnestness of heart, likewise exhort you, young reader, flee away from youthful lusts. Keep away from those things that have any power to allure away from God and spiritual excerise. We could tell you of scores of boys and girls that once were blessedly saved who have gone back into the ways of sin all because they did not keep aloof from those things that tempt to mind fleshly things. We will speak of a few of the many alluring things that are calculated to lead the feet of the young Christian away from the true path of life.

EVIL COMPANIONS. Many a young Christian has gone down to defeat because of too much association with sinful young people. This does not mean that we cannot go among them at all, but it does mean that we are to be guarded and never to come down out of our sacred spiritual realm and strike a line of fellowship or affiliation with them. You should go among them as God leads that you might win them to Christ, but you will need to keep yourself surrounded by an heavenly atmosphere that no spirit of worldliness can penetrate. You are to lift them up. Beware, lest they drag you down.

READING GOOD BOOKS. There is much soul-destroying literature in the world today. That is one reason why we need wholesome literature. Do not read fiction. The cheap, trashy novel is deadly posion to mind and to soul. Be sparing even of the reading of the every day newspaper. It is proper that we know something of what is transpiring in this world in which we live, but there is very much in the newspapers that you should not read. It dwarfs the mind and degenerates the soul. Be very sparing, therefore, of newspaper reading. Too much is a waste of time. Beyond that which is worthy and honorable, present-day history is profitless.

AMUSEMENTS. Perhaps more souls have been allured away from right paths by present-day amusements than in any other. There is such a thing, as getting such love for God, His Word, and communion with Him that we care but little for any other way in which to spend our time. We willingly admit that there are some recreations and amusements that are harmless and innocent in themselves, but we should have a care lest there be an over-indulgence in, and fondness for them. A young lady speaking of a certain amusement said, "I am passionately fond of it." Such is too great a fondness. We should be passionately fond of nothing but God and matters that pertain to His worship and service. No one can have a passionate fondness for any amusement and keep the passion of Christ in his soul. We cannot name to you just what amusements are innocent and what are not. Circumstances and conditions have much to do with it. I would advise, however, never to attend anything where the rabble of the world are gathered. You are to learn some things from God yourself. Live much in prayer, whenever you find that any amusement in which you may have some participation betimes is lessening your relish for secret prayer and reading of the Bible, then cease to have any part in such recreation.

THE ASSOCIATION OF CHRISTIANS. God has made us social creatures and we should associate together. Our constitution calls for it. But young and old should be careful of the spirit of your associations. Christians can associate together and lose spirituality. This is done by the manner or spirit in which they have associated. They can associate together in such a manner as to be greatly benefited in a spiritual way by the association. However, the religious meetings of young people can very easily become a mere social gathering rather than a religious spiritual service. If they are a little watchful they can determine which they enjoy the most, the chatting together after the religious service is dismissed or the service itself.

COVERED SINS. We are told in the Book, they that cover their sins shall not prosper. There are some sins of youth that are done in secret. These secret sins have great power over the youth of today. Flee, young man and woman, in horror, from the first suggestions of the tempter. Keep clean. The Psalm writer in old age prayed, "Lord remember not the sins of my youth." He referred to these secret sins of his life. He looked back, in his declining years, with regret upon those sins of his youth. Save yourselves, young people, of those regrets that will mar the peace of those days when your sun of life is sinking low. Keep your thoughts pure, your acts holy in the days of your youth. Follow after temperance, faith, meekness, purity, and righteousness. Walk close with God that you may have power over the flesh. We beseech you to heed this advice.
