That man or woman who willingly rejects Christ is a very wicked person in the sight of God. To spurn, reject and refuse the friend-ship of Jesus who gave His life's blood for you, makes you a very wicked man or woman in the sight of God for God cannot look upon sin with any degree of pleasure whatsoever.

When an unsaved person once realizes his awful sinfulness and the great unending punishment that awaits one in his state he should be stirred to look for a way of escape. Jesus says, "Repent ye and believe the Gospel." Godly sorrow worketh repentance to salvation. 2 Cor. 7:10. Since he has godly sorrow and really repents he should believe two essential truths to receive in fulness the salvation of God. First he must believe that Jesus Christ was God manifested in the flesh and gave his life on the cross, poured out his innocent, blameless and spotless blood by which he atones for all of your sins. Second he should believe that Christ was buried and on the third day was resurrected by the power of God, and believe from the heart that Jesus ascended up to heaven and is alive forever more and that he sheds forth the "Comforter" which is the Holy Ghost into the hearts of believers. In Acts 20:28 we learn that the whole family of God has been purchased with his own blood. In Rom. 10: 9 Paul says, "If thou shalt confess with thy mouth the Lord Jesus, and shalt believe in thine heart that God hath raised him from the dead, thou shalt be saved." The tracts, papers and booklets are reaching many souls and the Spirit of God is working on souls with telling effect. Praise God! Sweet Spirit of Christmas! What is Love, sacrificial Love! This is the Spirit that made the first Christmas. God so loved me that He gave His only begotten Son. The Son so loved to honor the Father that He came at His bidding to be born in a stable. The Son so loved me, that He grew to manhood and gave his life a ransom for mine on the cross. The Holy Ghost so loves to honor the Father and the Son, that He has come to live in this temple of clay and glorify the Son in me, so that the Christ may live every day in the year that sacrificial love life to such an extent that others may come to know the real meaning of Christmas also.

Would you care to know how that matchless name of Jesus is daily blasphemed in Colombia, during the week before Christmas? He makes no distinctions—idolaters are idolaters in his sight, but oh the hideousness of it all, and the blasphemy of it, in Roman lands! The insult of the veracity of God's Truth! Is there no one who will stir himself up for the glory of His Holy Name? Is there no one who loves His Glory more than they love life? His glory is at stake. His Honor is at Stake! His good name daily blasphemed! Colombia, in the 20th century, worshipping an idol of the baby Jeseus. Is it nothing to you? - 9 Nicodemus answered and said unto him, How can can these things be?
- 10 Jesus answered and said unto him, Art thou a master of Israel, and knowest not these things?
- 11 Verily, verily, I say unto thee, We speak that we do know, and testify that we have seen; and ye receive not our witness.
- 12 If I have told you earthly things, and ye believe not, how shall ye believe, if I tell you of heavenly things?
- 13 And no man hath ascended up to heaven, but he that came down from heaven, even the Son of man which is in heaven.
- 14 And as Moses lifted up the serpent in the wilderness, even so must the Son of man be lifted up:

COMMENTS AND APPLICATIONS

In today's lesson we have part of a conversation between Nicodemus and Jesus. We have no record of many words but those words that were spoken were vital, striking sin at the very root, a fulfillment of the scripture. "The axe is laid unto the root of the tree." Jesus did not tell him to turn over a new leaf and try to do better, nor to sign a card and shake hands with the preacher, but "ye must be born again."

It appears that in this age people try to do anything to try to appease the wrath of God except the one essential thing which is to experience a new birth. It is good for one to try to improve their conduct by education and refinement but let us remember that no amount of good works that we may do or any reformation that we can make can atone for one sin that we have committed. It is only as we cover under the all atoning blood of Jesus that condemnation vanishes and that peace and joy enters the soul.

How complicated and mysterious is seems to those who try to reason it out. It is so simple that even a little child by faith may enter right in and receive the heavenly benefits, receive complete forgiveness of sins and have a portion of heaven in their souls.

New wine dare not be risked in old wineskins neither can the poluted whited sepulchers contain the new life from above. The very nature of man, which is exceedingly sinful, cries out for a cleansing or transformation to be free from the binding forces of sinful habits.

How well we remember in our own experience how the forces of evil would come against us. Time after time we would enter into a covenant with ourselves that we would not yield to sin again. Before we could hardly realize it we had yielded again even though we would punish ourselves for breaking the contract. For lack of instruction we would continually be overcome and thus the binding forces of sin fastened upon us. continued to live in sin our conscience became hardened and the strivings of the Spirit became fainter and fainter until finally the greatest sin failed to affect us. How sad and how dangerous for one to allow themselves to get into this condition. A soul lost in sin and the spirit ceased striving. If these few words should reach any in this condition we say, "Be encouraged."

This morning we are made to weep for joy because we realize it was by the prayers of the saints and the mercies of God that we are enjoying the sweet communion of Jesus and fellowship with His people. The lion of the tribe of Judah has prevailed, and shackles of sin have been loosed, and we are saved by His blood.

In the beginning our heart was tender and a few words of instruction that Jesus was crucified for me, might have saved us much sorrow of heart, but now we are able to sympathize with, and be burdened for those that are not saved.

Mothers, pray right on, do not take "No" for an answer. Though that wayward boy or girl is deep in sin. prayer will change things. The blood of Jesus can make the vilest sinner clean.

- 9 Then saith the woman of Samaria unto him, How is it that thou, being a Jew, askest drink of me, which am a woman of Samaria? for the Jews have no dealings with the Samaritans.

COMMENTS AND APPLICATIONS

Isaiah prophesied that the day would come when we could with joy draw water out of the wells of salvation. Again we read in Psalms that, "All my springs are in thee." Zechariah said, "In that day there shall be a fountain opened." We thank the Lord for that fountain of living water that never runs dry. We have experienced how refreshing and satisfying good cool water is to one in the heat of the day and that no other drink can quench the thirst as water can. So it is with the nature of man, although man may revel and indulge in the wildest amusements of the world, yet God has placed something in the soul of man that can find that desired satisfaction only as they partake of the living water that proceeds from the throne of God.

Jesus told the woman at the well that if she drank of this living water she would never thirst, so it is as we continue to drink of this water we have no desire to look to the world for amusements and entertainments. We are willing to lay aside those unnecessary things. Fretting, murmuring and complaining are forsaken.

Jesus in His sermon on the mount said, "Blessed are they which do hunger and thirst after righteousness for they shall be filled." Not with the lustful things that man desires, but with righteousness. Would to God that men would have a greater desire for godliness, to understand God's will, concerning them more completely.

Jesus teaches us how he takes care of the birds and arrays the flowers and that we are of more value than many of them. yet men, and even some who profess to be saints, lean to the arm of flesh and cater to the world because they love the applause of man and have not faith to trust God.

Again we hear him say to seek first the kingdom of God and all these things (the temporal things) shall be added. The Lord truly verifies all of His promises to those who dare to trust Him.

- 10 And Jesus said, Make the men sit down. Now there was much grass in the place. So the men sat down, in number about five thousand.
- 11 And Jesus took the loaves; and when he had given thanks, he distributed to the disciples, and the disciples to them that were set down, and likewise of the fishes as much as they would.
- 12 When they were filled, he said unto his disciples, Gather up the fragments that remain, that nothing be lost
- 13 Therefore they gathered them together, and filled twelve baskets with the fragments of the five barley loaves, which remained over and above unto them that had eaten.
- 14 Then those men, when they had seen the miracle that Jesus did, said, This is of a truth that prophet that should come into the world.
- 15 When Jesus therefore perceived that they would come and take him by force, to make him a king, he departed again into a mountain himself alone.

COMMENTS AND APPLICATIONS
