Convincing Bible Truths

Misled minds contend that we sin in thought and deed all the time. We see the results of wrong doings all about us; we read of criminal deeds and the bitter fruits of the abominable cursed intoxicating drinking habit everywhere. It is but natural that we think of these evils, but without any desire or will to partake of such. We can think of temptation to sin in many ways, but being saved people we just abhor all such tendencies to do evil, or to yield to sinful powers. The conscience of man becomes guilty when he considers or entertains a desire or thought to do a wrong deed in advance of actually doing it. Matt. 5:28; Ezek. 38:10.

In the 16th century a noted Spanish explorer, Ponce De Leon, landed on the shores of what is now Florida, in search of the fountain of youth, that he might drink therefrom and forever remain young. I am unable to say just how he got his knowledge or tradition of such, but I do have in mind that the Word of God informs us that if anyone will come and drink of the water of life, they will never thirst. Jesus Christ is the source of this never failing substance of spiritual life to all whosoever will come and drink.

He meant to convey to all that it would give strength, power and will to overcome evil and to sustain spiritual life without thirsting again.

He (Jesus) is the fountain of life declared the Psalmist, for we draw water out of the wells of salvation, so declares Isaiah the Prophet, and Jeremiah the Prophet says my people have forsaken the fountain of living waters. Are you sincere when you sing that lovely gospel hymn, "My Saviour First of All?" Do you look forward to when life's work is ended at meeting some loved one dear to you first over there? Or is it Jesus who has done so much towards your eternal happiness or welfare more than any of your loved ones could ever hope to be able to do? Our Saviour declared that if anyone love father or mother, son or daughter more than Him, they would be unworthy servants. He was critized, insulted and shamefully treated and crucified for you and I, suffering untold physical pain and agony, shedding His precious blood to complete the final act of the redemption of our souls.

Greater love hath no man than this that one should suffer and willing to die that others might live and find peace with God. It must be a voluntary or willing sacrifice to give up or forsake all earthly ties and all earthly possessions for the Kingdom of God's sake to place Jesus above everything. Luke 14:26; Matt. 10:37.

It is alarming at the many cases of suicides on account of financial losses, reverses in business, ill health and domestic troubles, and various other causes. Apparently they think it is the end of all their worries and troubles. Not having the peace of God and the hope of Glory in their souls they become miserable creatures and can't face the problems and difficulties incident to mortal life. If they

only could see a picture illustrating a scene of the state and condition of the lost, in the regions of despair, they would be so horrified they would cry out for mercy and help, and desire God to prolong their life rather than resort to self-destruction.

I am quoting two passages found in the inspired Word of God than conveys to us that the state and condition of the lost is so unspeakably awful that they will desire to die or hide from the presence of God, but death will flee from them. There will be no opportunity for suicides in the regions of the lost, to those who reject God. Luke 23:30; Rev. 9:6.

Living and yet dead; dead and yet living are strange and foolish phrases to the unregenerated, yet it is logical gospel truth. Godly sorrow for sin and repentance bringeth forth death to sin ushering in eternal life, a state of unending peace and joy. The unsaved are dead in sin prefering what they blindly think is a good time in corruptible worldly things. Natural death comes far too suddenly to vast multitudes to get ready to live, so they wake up in grief and disapointment among the doomed. Of such the Lord Jesus declared would weep where their worm (accusing conscience) dieth not; where hope fleeth away.

How glorious and far better it is to first weep for your sins and wake up in the glory world among the people of God than to wait too late to repent, for we have no message or assurance from God's Word that sorrow or weeping will avail anything after it is too late. Luke 13:28; 1 Tim. 5:6; 22 Cor. 6:9.

Evil designs, purposes and desires to gratify the lusts of the flesh, to covet or unlawfully take that which belongs to others, is a sense of gratification under disguise of false and foolish judgment. Such is compared to what the angel said to John about eating the book which would be sweet in his mouth, but bitterness in his belly or stomach; so likewise, all forms of wickedness results in bitterness, anguish and tormenting remorse if not repented of in due time. Sinful lusts is nothing more than sweet and pleasant things, apparently, but likened to a deadly poison smeared over with honey to deceive and lead astray.

The torment of an accusing conscience is indeed a most fearful and bitter reality of the retribution and judgement of God meted out to those who perfer the pleasures of sin to that of righteousness; Rev. 10:9; Heb. 10:27.

Popularity with mortal being at the frightful expense of the fate of the soul, is downright human corruption and common cheapness of profession; which is a grevious abomination to God and a curse of the devil to mankind.

To get up in the pulpit and for fear of hurting people's feelings, or to risk ones position as a pastor by failing to preach a full gospel; to warn people against the wrath of God and to confess and repent of their sins lest they perish or awake up in the regions of the lost is a most deplorable thing, too awful to describe.

On her death bed a young woman cries out she is lost as a result of placing confidence in her pastor whose duty was to warn her of the wrath to come by tell or instructing her how to find peace with God. Read the sentence of God in Ezekiel 33:6, to those that cater to popularity of men and fail to give full proof of their ministry. 1 Tim. 4:5; Ezek. 33:6.

Salvation comes to us as the result of our meeting certain conditions, required and expected of us by getting busy or active ourselves. It is stupid to think some one can pray God to forgive us of our sins without us confessing our sins or praying for a changed heart and life, which makes us a new creature. Remember it is you and your life that must answer to the call of the great Judge. Though Jesus died for your sins that don't mean that you are exempt from any responsibility concerning certain fundamental thing you must do. Luke 3:8; Heb. 4:16.

It has long been a joy of our heart to visit jails, alms houses and Penitentiaries and preach the gospel of salvation to them and give them good sound gospel tracts and booklets to read. Experience along this line of work has taught us that these unfortunate are greatly neglected and misunderstood, are in great need of gospel light and truth: being bound, bruised and crushed by the enemy of all righteousness and in a large measure denied the hearing of the pure gospel. Jesus came, was persecuted and slain, giving his life's blood to save just such people, and the Lord has given us the joy of seeing quite a number soundly converted and begin to rejoice in a Savior's love.

The thing that brings us joy and comfort at present is the satisfaction of sending the gospel by the printed page into so many of these State and National institutions where a great army, or rather great armies of men are in gross darkness and steeped in sin and oftimes in the deepest dye. Yet they have souls that will live on somewhere.

Since sending out the last issue of Faith and Victory paper with the testimonies of the need of these dear souls: Also making mention of the lack of funds to do that which was upon our heart, God has stirred a few of our readers who have responded with offerings amounting to nineteen dollars and we have been sending out to different Prisons in several different shipments, until now we have been able to reach more than a hundred of these institutions with tracts and booklets carrying the glad tidings of salvation, the gospel which Paul says, "is the power of God unto salvation to every one that believes."

God will certainly reward and bless those who have given of their substance to this fund for the extension of the gospel into these dark places. While there are many reached already, yet we shall continue to send the tracts into these places as God continues to supply funds for this purpose. This is a great work for God.

While there are many foreigners across the waters in need of the gospel, yet the Lord has impressed us strongly that there is an abundance of work for us to do right at home. There is danger of us getting our minds focused away off and around to do some great work when the really great work in God's sight is near around in very humble places which have been greatly neglected.

The Lord gave me a very impressive vision one night about two months ago. (In the vision I had a pole, line

and hook fishing, as it seemed in the ocean. I threw the hook away out in the ocean, thinking that there were plenty of fish out there. Something got hold of the hook and began to pull it-back near the shore and as I pulled it to the top of the water it was near the shore and a voice said very clearly and firm, "there is work to do at home." This was repeated three times and every time the hook would be drawn back near the shore and the voice would sound out again, "there is work to do at home."

Since that time I have been seeking God earnestly to show me plainly the work at home as I was very anxious to go about to do all that He would show me to do and so God has certainly led me right into this Prison work, and He has showed me other things which are also opening up and I stand ready to be a "Minute man for Him," cooperating in every possible way to get the pure gospel of Christ to these poor unfortunate men, boys and girls who have their birth in this great United States of America, and being of our native country they ought to be first upon our hearts and reached with the gospel.

Who of you will co-operate with us in making up a good fund to keep the tracts and booklets going into these institutions to reach bruised and crushed souls?

I believe if the dear saints could really see and know the awful need in these dark places, they would be absolutely willing to do his will in these things and would be able to hear the Macedonian cry from these men behind the bars saying, "Come along with your means and help us receive the gospel." Some have already heard and responded and I am persuaded that many more will hear and the gospel by the printed page will be flooding into every penal institution in this fair land of ours and the Spirit of God will have an opportunity to flash light upon many darkened souls while Jesus whispers to them, "Come unto me and I will give you rest, I will heal your broken heart and pour the "Balm of Gilead" into your diseased soul and you shall live."

When sending offerings for the Prison work just say, "For the Prison Fund" and it will be used in that way.

Willie Murphey who has been operating the Linotype and doing press work here in the shop for the last six months has been working as extra man at the Co-operative Publishing Co. of this city and cannot longer give all of his time to the work here and we are in need of a consecrated young man to learn to operate the Linotype and also run the Job and Cylinder Presses; doing general work in the shop.

The only qualifications that are necessary is to love God and be consecrated to deny self and spend and be spent for Jesus and the sake of needy souls. To have a good knowledge of Grammar or English would be very essential in Linotype work Some young man that has finished High School would be in a good condition to begin this work for the Lord.

We cannot promise wages as commercial companies do as most of the work is free-will, or near cost and funds are generally very scarce. But if you have faith in God you will know that He will care for you as your needs may be. Anyone thinking of coming should write us first about the matter, telling us of your qualifications in Him.

"Looking for that blessed hope and the glorious appearing of the great God and our Saviour Jesus Christ." Titus 2:13.

"Both the elements of the generic idea of hope--

Further, the term some times designates the expectation itself, and some times the thing expected. (Col. 1:5.) is an instance of the latter usage."

Hope and faith are closely related, but whereas faith seizes upon the invisible in general, whether past, present or future, hope is limited to the realization of future good. Faith is a living principle, however, includes true hope.

The hope of the wicked shall come to naught: Prov. 11:23; 24:20; but the hope of the righteous is not vain, Psa. 37:4; 9:18; 24:20. Hence the definition of faith in Heb. 11:1, as the assurance of things looked for. The close association of the three basal elements of Christian experience: faith, hope and love, is significantly indicated in such passages as I Thess. 1:3; Col. 1:4; 1 Cor. 13:13; Rom. 5:1-11.

Reformation

My dear brethren, the apostle Paul in speaking of the first covenant and its ordinance and worldly sanctuary in the ninth chapter of Hebrews, tells us that these, "Stood only in meats and drinks, and divers washings, imposed on them until the time of reformation."

By "time of reformation," we know that he meant, the reformation that Jesus was to set in motion. A reformation that reforms every one that accepts Jesus as their Savior.

The word reform, means to amend or improve by change of form, by removal of faults or abuses, or rectaim. Our blessed Savior gave his all that we might be reclaimed from the powers of Satan, where we had fallen into when our fore parents sinned and brought sin upon the human race.

If the great apostasy had not hit the Church, there would have been no need of other reformations, but God has brought about several reformations since the apostasy. Why, several? Because these reformations ceased to reform the people, ceased to transform them, and therefore ceased to be reformations. Their leaders failed to walk in the light, therefore God could not use them. Reformation after reformation rose up and failed until the last reformation.

It is this last reformation that we wish to discuss as we believe God is using us to warn the people that claim to be reformed in this reformation.

Reformation denotes the act or state: reform, the St. Paul explains what is meant by fact or result. reformation in Romans 12:2. "And be not formed to this world: but be ye transformed," formation means the state of being transformed. "And hath translated us into the Kingdom of his dear Son," Col. 1:13. The word conformed, means to be in agreement with, or in harmony with, Paul is telling us not to be in agreement with or in harmony with the world; but to be transformed or translated, to be just the opposite to the worldly minded crowd. "Abstain from all appearance of evil." 1 Thess. 5:22. We are to abstain from everything that would appear like the evil minded world. "If any man love the world, the love of the Father is not in him," 1 John 2:15. John tells us in the next verse what is meant "The lust of the flesh, the lust of the by the world. eye, and the pride of life." We are not to talk, dress or walk like the worldly minded, but to walk as he walked, who did no sin.

Peter says, "Whose adorning let it not be that outward adorning,"

Some say, "Where shall we draw the line?" "Not outward adornment." There is where to stop dear saints, do not put on any thing to adorn the body as the world does; they put on earrings, fingerrings, necklaces, feathers, artificial flowers, large buckles, large buttons, trimmings on their hats and dress, and adorn and set the hair to catch the eye, because they are not of the Father but of the world. But we are to glorify God in our bodies and in our spirits, which are God's, 1 Cor. 6:20.

Fellow Saints and ministers of God, God wants to use us to redeem unto himself a peculiar people, zealous of good works. We cannot do this if we do not teach all the truth and cry out against everything that is unlike God. Many that once were reformed in this reformation have gone back on the truth, and now say that we cannot teach people against worldly styles, because they say, 'different people have different customs of dress." They also have different habits of sinning, but we must teach all people to forsake all sin; also outward adornment, and to dress as a people "professing godliness." "And to walk in the light as he is in the light." People anywhere under the sun can do this.

Just teaching the doctrines of the movement does not make us the people of God, but we must practice what we preach.

The doctrine of justification and sanctification was not lost when the Wesleyan Reformation failed, but they failed because they ceased to teach so as to redeem a people from the world and the things of the world, and failed to walk in the light as He is in the light. The many who have failed that started to walk in the light as taught by the teachers of this reformation, did not fail because they would not preach what the world calls essential Bible truth. They failed because they ceased to preach a doctrine that separated their followers from the world. "Ye are not of the world as I am not of the world," said the greatest teacher of all time.

Has the last reformation failed? No, she shall not fail as long as God has some one to lift up a standard for the people. Many that were out clear in the present light, have failed. But as long as there is someone that stands and teaches all the truth, yes, and more, lives it, being not a partaker of Babylon, God's reformation will live on and increase.

- 2. And I will make of thee a great nation, and I will bless thee, and make thy name great; and thou shalt be a blessing:
- 3. And I will bless them that bless thee, and curse him that curseth thee: and in thee shall all families of the earth be blessed.
- 4. So Abram departed, as the LORD had spoken unto him: and Lot went with him: and Abram was seventy and five years old when he departed out of Haran.
- 5. And Abram took Sarai his wife, and Lot his brother's son, and all their substance that they had gathered, and the souls that they had gotten in Haran; and they went forth to go into the land of Canaan; and into the land of Canaan they came.
- 6. And Abram passed through the land unto the place of Sichem unto the plain of Moreh. And the Canaanite was then in the land.
- 7. And the Lord appeared unto Abram, and said, Unto thy seed will I give this land: and there builded he an altar unto the LORD, who appeared unto him.
- 8. And he removed from thence unto a mountain on the east of Bethel, and pitched his tent, having Bethel on the west, and Hai on the east: and there he builded an altar unto the LORD, and called upon the name of the LORD.
- 9. And Abram journeyed, going on still toward the south.

Genesis 13:14 And the LORD said unto Abram, after that Lot was seperated from him, Lift up now thine eyes, and look from the place where thou art northward, and southward, and eastward, and westward:

- 15 For all the land which thou seest, to the will I give it, and to thy seed for ever.
- 16. And I will make thy seed as the dust of the earth: so that if a man can number the dust of the earth, then shall thy seed also be numbered.

COMMENTS AND APPLICATION

In our lesson for today we find Abram as the central figure. The history of the Hebrews and God's redemptive work begins with Abram. He was a Babylonian and he was also called "the Hebrew" meaning, "the crosser."

Abram believed God, and by so doing he became the father of a great and interesting nation. The Jews of Christ's day prided themselves upon the fact that they were Abram's descendants. Paul tells us that the true children of Abraham are not those according to the flesh but those who belong to Christ.

When Abraham was seventy five years old God spoke to him and immediately he made a new start in life. "Without faith it is impossible to please God." Because Abram had faith God could fulfill his promise to him.

Would to God that more people would completely and fully trust themselves in God's hand that He might prompt and direct every action. Do we full realize that God is concerned in every detail of life? By faith we know that all things work together for our good. By faith we dare to step out on His promise—take Him at His Word and allow Him to have His way with us.

Abraham's reward for His faithfulness consisted largely in the fulfillment of promises both spiritually and temporally. How many of these blessings can you think of? Consider the fulfilment of them.

COMMENTS AND APPLICATION

We continue to study the life of Abraham. Let us not overlook the God given character traits Abraham manifested toward Lot. Not a weakling, to sacrifice right for peace. He would not quarrel but trusted the case in God's hands.

We also take note of Abrahams intercession for the wicked cities. Was it only for a few or was he asking for the entire city? How is it with us? Do not most of our prayers and attention end in our own concerns? We do not notice Christ continually importuning for his immediate benefit. There are many lame, sick and blind people around us. They may or may not be acquainted with God as a healer.

On every hand we find those that are perplexed and discouraged, those that are loaded down with sin and know not Jesus as their redeemer nor burden bearer. Can we as the children of God be at ease in Zion, or does a still small voice stir our hearts to duty. Our we our brothers keeper and do we fully realize that their blood will be required at our hand if we are not doing all in our power to warn lost men of their condition.

How terrible and how permanent is hell. A bottomless pit. Enlarged dimension. A closed door and a never ending eternity. Behold the goodness and severity of God.

COMMENTS AND APPLICATION

The history of the Jews come to us by studying the lives of leaders of those days, such as Moses, Abraham and Isaac. We learn how Isaac submitted himself to be bound and offered as a sacrifice when he was a young man. At the age of forty he was married to his second cousin, Rebecca. He lived to be about a hundred and eighty years old and was blind for about forty-six years.

Notice the price that Isaac paid, that peace might

continue. Lord impress these truths upon our minds. The power of gentleness and kindness can defeat many of our enemies and shield us from strife and contention.

According to authorative data the world war cost in money, four hundred billion dollars. Enough to furnish every one in the United States, Canada, Great Briton and Ireland, France, Germany, Belgum, Russia and Australia with a two thousand, five hundred dollar house on a 500 dollar lot, furnished each with one thousand dollars worth of furniture: also a five million dollar library for every community of twenty thousand or more in these countries: also a ten billion university for every such community. In addition to that it would provide a fund large enough to yield at five percent interest an amount sufficient to pay every year for all time, one thousand dollars each to an army of 125,000 teachers and 125,000 nurses: and still there would be enough left to buy every single bit of property and all the wealth in France, Belgium, including every cathedral and church, all public buildings, every factory, every rail road, every farm and every home. Can we imagine such an enormous amount and still nations are preparing more and more for war. When we consider the money cost of war together with 20,297,551 soldiers wounded and 9,998,271 killed: with the suffering and undescribable heart aches, it makes us shudder.

In our fair land today, each year there are 12000 murdered, 50,000 robbed and 3000 kidnapped. In the face of these astonishing facts, many dare to say that our Nation is getting better year by year.

- 27 And the boys grew: and Esau was a cunning hunter, a man of the field; and Jacob was a plain man, dwelling in tents.
- 28 And Isaac loved Esau, because he did eat of his venison: but Rebekah loved Jacob.
- 29 And Jacob sod pottage: and Esau came from the, field and he was faint.
- 30 And Esau said to Jacob, feed me, I pray thee, with that same red pottage; for I am faint: therefore was his name called Edom.
 - 31 And Jacob said, sell me this day thy birthright.
- 32 And Esau said, behold, I am at the point to die: and what profit shall this birthright do to me?
- 33 And Jacob said, swear to me this day; and he sware unto him: and he sold his birthright unto Jacob.

- 42 And these words of Esau her elder son were told to Rebekah: and she sent and called Jacob her younger son, and said unto him, behold, thy brother Esau, as touching thee, doth comfort himself, purposing to kill thee.
- 43 Now therefore, my son, obey my voice; and arise, flee thou to Laban my brother to Haran;
- 44 And tarry with him a few days, until thy brother's fury turn away;
- 45 Until thy brother's anger turn away from thee, and he forget that which thou hast done to him: then I will send, and fetch thee from thence: why should I be deprived also of you both in one day?

Memory verse. And every man that striveth for the mastery is temperate in all things. Now they do it to obtain a corruptable crown; but we an incorruptable. Practical Truth: To be controlled by appetite is a deplorable weakness in any one.

COMMENTS AND APPLICATION

Our lesson again to day is a study of biography. It not only concerns Esau as the title indicates but it also gives us information about Jacob.

A chain is no stronger than its weakest link. Neither is our spiritual life stronger than its weakest part.

If our weakness is carelessness or neglect we cannot hope to fulfill our place in the body. In lightness or lack of earnestness our time will quickly pass from our reach. We must be aware of the fact that the enemy knows our weak place as he did Esau's life and took advantage of his weakness, thus he lost his most valuable possession.

We notice that Isaac was partial to Esau. Why? Was this a very consistent reason? Rebekah was partial to Jacob. Showing partiality will often cause much trouble and sometimes it becomes a serious trouble.

We also notice that Rebeckah planned that Jacob should take advantage of Esau: so she reaped for the wrong, in that Jacob had to leave because of Esau's anger and I do not think there is any scripture that informs us that she ever saw her son again. Do we recall how Jacob in later years reaped from evil seed sown in his dealings with his brothers? How did his sons treat him in regard to this same weakness, (partiality). "Be not deceived God is not mocked for whatsoever a man soweth that shall he also reap."

May the Lord help us to realize that we should be stalwart Christians with well rounded up experiences; guarding against wrong on every hand.

COMMENTS AND APPLICATION

The study of the life of Jacob is continued today. The few days that Rebeckah advised her son to spend in another part of the country proved to be twenty years.

By being mindful of earthly possessions Jacob cheated his brother and did him a great wrong. Nevertheless when Jacob turned from his ways: God, who is rich in mercy was ready to abundantly pardon.

"The goodness of God turneth man to repentance." When man has concluded to pass a sentence of justice upon the condemned, then God still will have compassion and show mercy. The love of God toward Jacob was greatly manifested to him during his latter days.

How many sons did God bless Jacob with and which one of his sons was sold into Egypt?
