### Christian Living

In order to live a Christian life one must first become a Christian. "Wherewith shall I come before the Lord, and bow myself before the high God?"

The prophet asks a question, which should come first in the mind and heart of every one who wants to live right. In the 8th verse he says, "He hath shewed thee, O man, what is good." And, how has he showed us? We read in Heb. 1:1, 2, "God who at sundry times and in divers manners spake in time past unto the fathers by the prophets, hath in these last days spoken unto us by his Son." Therefore, what Jesus says about it is the way you and I will have to come before God in order to be accepted of Him. "Repent ye and believe the gospel" (Mark 1:

15). This is the way Jesus tells us to come, and the Word of God explains what is meant by repenting.

First of all one must realize they are sinners and are lost forever without forgiveness. (Rom. 3: 23; 6:23.) Then we must be really sorry that we have sinned against the God who has created us for His pleasure (Rev. 4:11), and loved us so much that he gave His only begotten Son for our redemption. (John 3:16.) Also, we read in Prov. 28:13, "He that covereth his sins shall not prosper, but whose confesseth and forsaketh them shall have mercy." Again, we read. "If we confess our sins He is faithful and just to forgive us our sins and to cleanse us from all unrighteousness' (1 John 1:9). When we do this and believe in the forgiveness and atonement of Jesus, we are converted or changed, or born again of the Spirit of God. There is something from above that comes into our lives; it is the Spirit of love, which makes us love everybody. (John 3:1-8.) This is the Spirit of Christ which all must have or we are none of his. (Rom. 8:9.) We are then Christians and ready to begin living a Christian life. Let us now consider some more thoughts found in Mican 6:8: "He hath shewed thee, O man, what is good, and what doth the Lord require of thee, but to do justly, and to love mercy and to walk humbly with thy God?"

Here we see the first principle of the Christian life is honesty. You must be honest with God and your own soul to become a Christian, and you must continue to be honest with God and your own soul, also your fellow man, if you continue to be one, for we have renounced the hidden things of dishonesty and put away lying, to speak every one the truth with his neighbor. (2 Cor. 4:2; Eph. 4:25.) We see by these scriptures, also Matt. 7:1-12, that the Christian will be honest in business, in conversation, and in all things he will do to others as he would have them do to him.

The second principal of the Christian life is to love mercy, because it is the wonderful mercy of the heavenly Father that brought the Saviour into this world to deliver us from the bondage of sin. And if God was merciful enough to forgive us all the wickedness and disobedience of our past lives, we surely will be willing also to forgive our fellow men. The Spirit of Christ in us will cause us to follow Him in judgment. What was the judgment of Christ? And how did it work? The Word teaches us that He judged that the world was lost in sin and had great need of a Saviour. He was willing to leave His home in glory and come here and live a selfsacrificing life, and finally die the cruel death on the cross to save them. And He did not condemn the people, even those who rejected Him, but left the Word of God as a witness against them, which shall judge them at the last day. John (3:16; 12: 47-50.) The hypocrites are the only class of people against whom Jesus hurled judgment without mercy. See Matt. 23:13-33. We will love righteousness and hate iniquity, as He did, (Heb. 1:8, 9; 1 Pet. 2:21. 22.), thus following in His steps.

The third principal of the Christian life is to "walk humbly with thy God," which is a most important part of the Christian life, "For God resisteth the proud but giveth grace to the humble" (1 Pet. 5:5.) "And whosoever shall exalt himself shall be abased and he that shall humble himself shal be exalted." (Matt. 23:12.) God dwells with the humble, (Isa. 57:15,) and He dwells only with His servants. "No man can serve two masters" (Matt. 6:24.) So, if we are humble we can walk with God and be safe, but if we be lifted up with pride we are in danger, for pride goeth before destruction and a haughty spirit before a fall" (Prov. 16:18.) Pride is a terrible thing. It had its beginning at the first, when our mother Eve listened to the serpent in the garden of Eden. While she and her husband were humble, God talked with them and told them the one thing they should not do, even as she told the serpent, but when she listened to the serpent's temptation, she gave place in her heart to this evil principal, which lifted her up in her own estimation so much that she was willing to believe the serpent rather than God who had created her. This evil things has been in the hearts of mankind ever since, defiling and corrupting them, making them unfit for God's service and pleasure. 7:21-23.) But Jesus came to deliver us from all of these evils and to give us a new heart. (Ezek. 11: 19.) So, if these things are in our lives we need

salvation and can still obtain it, for it is to whosoever will. Pride has several different ways of showing itself. It is the seed. The fruits are the deeds which it causes. And if it is in the heart it will manifest itself in one way or another, for Jesus says, "There is nothing covered that shall not be revealed and hid that shall not be known" (Matt. 10:26.) With some, it is seen in a haughty air, others show it by their conversation, others in their dealings, and others in their self-adornment. Therefore, we as Christians, need to examine our motives very carefully to see that there is no pride behind anything we do. We have much for which to be thankful but nothing of which to be proud. Humble folks will be glad when others are honored, and will rejoice with them that do rejoice and weep with them that weep. (Rom. 12:15.)

### **EDITORIALS**

The great apostle Paul in the first chapter of second Timothy wrote some truth about Jesus that ought to be sufficient to cause every man and woman to seek after God until the same becomes a reality in their own soul. He said that, "Jesus Christ..ha" abolished death, and hath brought life and im tality to light through the Gospel."

Let us look at the word, "death" and the scriptures what he meant by death. He not have meant physical death for men are dying that kind of death even to this present day. Physical death is an appointment given of God, for He says in Hebrews 9:27, that it is, "Appointed unto men once to die, but after this the Judgment."

In Romans the 6th chapter and last verse we read these words, "For the wages of sin is death; (eternal death) but the gift of God is eternal life, through Jesus Christ our Lord." We see by this scripture that he is talking about the inner man and not about the physical or outter man. He has abolished spiritual death so definitely and completely that those who really believe in Him do know that they have eternal or everlasting life. Jesus knew this was so by the statement he made to Martha in the 11th chapter of St. John, "And whosoever liveth and believeth in me shall never die." So there are two things that Jesus through his death purchased for us, or rather did for us. First he abolished soul death by giving us spiritual life, and then an immortal body with eternal life. We are not able to fully comprehend the depth, length, height and breadth of His great love for us. Our short life of praise and service to Him cannot begin to express the honor due His name.

What is the difference between Satan and God?

We find in the word that God is a Spirit (John 4:24) and Satan also is a spirit, (John 13:27); they both have power, but God has by far the greater power. One has said that, "Satan is mighty, but God is almighty." Satan is subject to the power of God (Job 2:6; Luke 10:19) and can only live in and reign over men because they will it so. God is good and is seeking our eternal welfare. Satan is evil and is seeking our everlasting destruction. There are only two powers working in the world today, one is the power of Satan and the other is the power of God. Every man and woman is under the power or influence of one or the other of these two powers.

We read in Jeremiah the 17th chapter that the,

"Heart is deceitful above all things, and desperately wicked: who can know it?" This, indeed is a dark picture and has reference to an unregenerated heart, a heart that Satan has power over and influences to do his evil work.

In the third chapter of Romans we read, "As is written, there is none righteous, no not one". seems to be a hard saying and it comes from God 'tings of St. Paul. Let us turn and find out prar - the ris written and then we will know who he arming about. The references directs us to the 14th chapter of Psalms. In Psalms 14:1, it reads, "The fool has said in his heart, there is no God." In the third verse it says, "They are all gone aside, they are altogether become filthy; there is none that doeth good, no not one." He is talking about those fools.

You cannot see the evil spirit coming into man or living in man with the natural eye, neither can you see the Spirit of God any more than you can see the wind, but you can know what spirit is influencing them by their actions and deeds. When a man or woman says ugly words and gets mad you know that Satan has power over him. When you see him delighting himself in picture shows, in revelry, in joking and telling smutty yarns, in using tobacco or whiskey, you know that Satan has power over him. It is not what we profess, but it is what we are that counts before God.

Many very nice, clever men are under the power and influence of Satan. Professing religion of some kind does not make a man right with God because Satan has more religious subjects than any other kind. He delights for men to take up or profess religion. God really delivers from all sin and Satau and his subjects hates true holiness. When God really saves a soul they begin to reign with Christ right here in this world. Some teachers tell their subjects that Satan is going to be bound after while and then we can reign and all will be righteous. God's true subjects are reigning over Satan now in this present world while Satan is loose. What honor or glory would God get out of your life if Satan was bound and couldn't tempt you. Thank God for the power of the Lamb that gives us power to reign over Satan in this life where he is loose all around about us doing evil and causing nearly all people to bow to his control, yet the child of God is sweetly regining with Christ. (Rom. 5:17). Satan is the prince of this world (John 16:11) and has hearly all men under his power and influence (2 Cor. 4:4) and has an abundance of religions, has

great revivals and great meetings all for the purpose of keeping his subjects deceived and away from the true Christ and His saving and keeping gospel. (1 John 5:19). Pauls says that Satan is transformed into an angel of light (2 Cor. 11:14) and his ministers are ministers of righteousness (2 Cor. 11:15.) His preachers preach many right things and with their fair words and clever wresting of the scriptures deceive their hearers. Dear fellow-man, if you are not saved from sin and have power from God in your soul to reign over all evil in this life, then you are on the broad way that leads to destruction. (2 Thes. 1:8-9). The soul that sinneth, it shall die (Ezekiel 18:20.) Awake to righteousness and sin not is the command of God. (1 Cor. 15:34). In the seventh chapter of Romans, Paul tells us of what a wretched man he was when in sin. After he thanked God for deliverance through the Lord Jesus Christ he said, "There is, therefore, now (present tense) no condemnation to them that are in Christ Jesus, who walk not after the flesh, but after the Spirit." "I pray God your whole Spirit and soul and body be perserved blameless." How much of you would there be left to committ sin if you would believe in God to the perserving of your soul, body and spirit?

My dear fellow-men, God has great and good things for you if you will only believe in Him for them. You furnish the willingness and God will furnish the grace and power.

It will only be a short time now until the ministers will be gathering here at Guthrie for the ministers' meeting which had its birth during the Assembly meeting here last holidays when God's Spirit was so wonderfully working, blessing and feeding us on the good things that heaven only can afford.

Every minister coming should come in the meekness and humility of Christ that God may be glorified in all their words and deeds. If all present will have heaven in their souls we will certainly have a heavenly meeting and all will go from the meeting refreshed and strengthened in the grace and power of God insomuch that God can do exploits in and through us for his own glory.

Five of the brethren are now working on the dining hall, repairing it and taking out partitions, making doors and fixing two good sized rooms for dining tables. They will also build 14 feet more on the chapel so there will be room to hold many more people than heretofore.

This ministers' meeting should be a good stimu-

lant for the many Camp meetings that will follow it this summer. We are expecting a harvest of souls during the summer Camp meetings. You will find them advertised in this issue of Faith and Victory paper. The outlook for a unifying, settling down in God and in the truth of His Word is good, and we are expecting the true Church of the Living God to shine more and more unto His coming. Those who cannot attend the ministers' meeting should be in earnest prayer that God will get glory to His name throughout the meeting. The ministers' meeting will begin the 18th of June, 1937. If Satan interferes in any way we believe that God will show him up with bruised head. God has said "It", the seed of the woman shall bruise thy head. Christ is the seed of the woman and we can depend on Him bruising Satan's head. We should have no fear of the devil, but if we fear God, He will take care of the devil. Gen. 3:15.

On the 16th of May the congregation of saints here at Guthrie held services all day at the chapel and the Lord blessed very much in the services. In the afternoon the ordinances of the Bible were observed and thirty-seven happy saints took part in the services. We also printed a special message to the officials of Prisons, telling them that the "Faith Publishing House" had a "donated fund" for the purpose of sending tracts to the inmates of the Prisons; and for them to mark the number of tracts they could use and send in to us and we would post the tracts to them free of charge.  $\Lambda$ ll we wanted to know was that they would use them for the inmates We are sending out a lot of these of the Prisons. folders and we expect to receive many calls for tracts from the various Prisons.

There has been some sending donations or freewill offerings for this purpose and we rejoice to know that so many have taken an interest in getting the gospel to these crushed and bruised souls. Satan has been lying to them and they need to hear of Jesus who heals the broken heart and sets captives free.

Owing to the expected large ordering of tracts there will be a need of an increase in the "Prison Fund." We are praying that God will touch hearts more and more for this Prison work. We shall continue to send gospel tracts and papers into the Prisons just as long as God supplies and makes us able. This workers are setting up and printing tracts now to restock with. As I write this editoral I can hear the sound of the 12 by 18, New Searies C. & P. Job Press clicking off tracts to be used in this Prison work.

I ask the prayers of all the saints every where to pray that God will help us to do all we possibly can for souls that are traveling to the judgement bar of God and that He will supply Prison funds enough to fill every call from that source and other sources.

with his brothers proved to him that they had changed since they had had dealings together. Joseph was glad to hear from his father and only full brother.

Note the place that the family has taken down through the ages in preserving Christian ideals. The family has been the channel through and by which God has poured His blessings from generation to generation. How beautiful to look upon a family in which Christ is the head where the spirit of love rules supreme. How fragrant the atmosphere that surrounds the family that ascends from the family altar around which each member bows in reverence to the most holy God. Note how contiguous and noticeable is the spirit that issues from the family gathering—whether it be good or bad. The marriage that God approves make the sacred tie.

If more attention were given to the home in instructing and raising the children, the church, the school, and the government would be in a much better condition. May the Lord help each of us to realize the responsibilities resting upon us. If we have neglected family worship let us begin at once. Those little ones will soon be out for themselves and then you will be sorry that you neglected your family duties.

- 5 By faith Enoch was translated that he should not see death; and was not found, because God had translated him: for before his translation he had this testimony, that he pleased God.
- 6 But without faith it is impossible to please him: for he that cometh to God must believe that he is, and that he is a rewarder of them that diligently seek him.
- 7 By faith Noah, being warned of God of things not seen as yet, moved with fear, prepared an ark to the saving of his house; by the which he condemned the world, and became heir of the righteousness which is by faith.
- 8 By faith Abraham, when he was called to go out into a place which he should after receive for an inheritance, obeyed; and he went out, not knowing whither he went.
- 9 By faith he sojourned in the land of promise, as in a strange country, dwelling in tabernacles with Isaac and Jacob, the heirs with him of the same promise:
- 10 For he looked for a city which hath foundations, whose builder and maker is God.
- 17 By faith Abraham, when he was tried, offered up Isaac: and he that had received the promises offered up his only begotten son,

By having faith it is easy to obey and also we are not afraid to trust Him for everything.

When men are in possession of currency they value it according to the faith they have in the government represented by the stamp. Should we not have more faith in God than in Uncle Sam? When we receive a gift regardless of its value we appreciate it because of the friend that gave it. I have a religious picture hanging in the room that I esteem very much, not because of its value, for it didn't cost as much as a dollar, but I esteem it because a school child made a sacrifice of self denial that she might give it to me. Good government, peace and safety and all other good things come not from Uncle Sam as many suppose, but from God. Should we not cease to honor the thing given and render unto God honor and praise from whom all blessings flow. While we enjoy and appreciate the blessings of the Lord, yet our hearts go out in love and service to the great God of heaven and earth for the gift of His Son to be a sacrifice, who was crucified on the cruel cross that we might be redeemed from sin.
