Divine Healing

This morning while we were busy husking corn and thinking of the old time saints we met at New Castle last summer, we felt led to write some, including some testimonies on the subject of divine healing.

First, that divine healing is a Bible doctrine, there can be no doubt in the mind of an honest person who has examined the scriptures on this subject. Healing was done by the Lord all along in the Old Testament dispensation. In Exodus 15:26 we read: "And said, If thou wilt diligently harken to the voice of the Lord thy God, and wilt do that which is right in His sight, and wilt give ear to His commandments and keeps all his statutes, I will put none of these diseases upon thee, which I have brought upon the Egyptians: for I am the Lord that healeth thee." And in chapter 23:25 it also says: "And ye shall serve the Lord your God, and he shall bless thy bread, and thy water; and I will take sickness away from thee." Also in Psalms 103:3 we read: "Who forgiveth all thine iniquities; who healeth all thy diseases." If we could not find plenty more, we have adduced sufficient witnesses to prove the point under consideration since the scriptures tell us that in the "mouth of two or three witnesses every word shall be established." We have only to turn to the Old Testament to see for ourselves how the Lord healed His people, or to the New Testament to see the abundance of it in the ministry of Jesus during His nativity and in the ministry of the apostles of the early church after the ascension of Jesus. This can There can be no question, according not be denied. to the abundant testimony of the scriptures, that Jesus came to heal His people, soul and body. prophet Isaiah told us before Jesus came what He was coming for. He said, "He was wounded for our transgressions, he was bruised for our iniquities: the chastisement of our peace was upon him; and with his stripes we are healed." (Isaiah 53:5). abundantly proved this when He came. commissioned His apostles and disciples to heal. Bible readers know Jesus sent His apostles and disciples forth and told them to "Heal the sick, cleanse the lepers. raise the dead." And shortly before His ascension He said to them; "Go ye into all the world, and preach the gospel to every creature. He that believeth and is baptized shall be saved; but he that believeth not shall be damned. And these signs shall follow them that believe; in my name shall they cast out devils; they shall speak with new tongues; They shall take up serpents; and if they

drink any deadly thing, it shall not hurt them; they shall lay hands on the sick and they shall recover." (Mark 16:15 to 18).

Here it tells them to lay hands on the sick and they shall recover (to heal the sick) and that these signs shall follow them that believe. So it didn't stop with the apostles and early disciples but it comes on down to them that believe. It was to follow them. There was no time set for it to be taken out of the Church, or even hinted at. Every thing pointed to its permanency. I defy any one to try to show me by the scriptures where it has been withdrawn from the Church only through apostasy and unbelief. As long as God has a people in the earth and they exercise faith in Him for physical healing He will heal

It is not only in His plan, but it is a part of His compassionate nature. For we read in His Word: It is of the Lord's mercies that we are not consumed, because His compassions fail not. (Lam. 3: 22). And, "For I am the Lord, I change not." (Mal. 3:6).

Many are the cases of Divine healing recorded in the New Testament. And since we read in the Word, "Jesus Christ the same yesterday, today and forever," it must follow, therefore that His divine qualities or attributes that He ever possessed, He possesses now and forever. Therefore He is His people's healer today. Having established, by the Word, the fact that the Lord meant to be the healer of His people from the time He has had a people on the earth till the end, we proceed to give, briefly, an account of a few cases of healing among the many He has done in our family of 12, to add to the many remarkable healings He has done for His believing children in this our day.

I used to be subject to a shifting, knocking headache, of superficial pains. One day while helping build some flues for our old meeting house it was hitting me hard. At noon I went out in the woods to a beautiful little secluded spot, a sacred little dell, to pray. Time and space will hardly permit me to tell of the sweet spirit of humility that seemed to hover over me as I submitted myself there to God. Livingstone who died on his knees for the Lord in the deep, lonely jungles of Africa, came into my mind and like a flash there seemed such a contrast between my suffering and sacrifice and that of Livingstone's that I substantially said, Lord I have done nothing, or suffered nothing in comparison to him so if you want to take this headache away from me all right; if not, I'll suffer it for your sake. I went on to my work with my head still aching

Perhaps it was the middle of the evening when a voice seemed to say, where is your headache? Strange as it may seem to some, the Lord, in His wonderful way, had actually made me oblivious of the fact, but it was truly gone. And the Lord has kept it away and that has been, perhaps 15 years. He did a complete work. Praise His name! I do not say the Lord did not permit my faith to be tested a little. Two or three times, perhaps, I had a little threat, but I resisted it in the name of the Lord and it vanished. "Resist the devil and he will flee from you."

Another time rheumatism was trying to locate in my arms. I was determined to lay it upon the Lord. I committed it to Him, trusted in Him and He drove every vestage of it away. Another case. A few years back our youngest child contracted blood poison from scratching itching sores on a lower limb. It soon became serious. Her limb became red as blood from toes to the top of her hip. alternately chilly and hot. She was in great pain. She couldn't rest if she was still. If she was moved she screamed with pain. Oh how my heart was breaking, as I cried to God for help. It was truly a time of need in which our precious Lord proved a friend indeed. It appeared that the Lord, to strengthen my faith and encourage me to "come boldly" to the throne of grace, was repeating the most encouraging part of the promise in Matthew: "Ask and ye shall receive . . . for every one that asketh receiveth." and falling again on my face in the bean patch I cried mightily to the Lord. While there prostrated before the Lord He showed me a vision of how the sore on her limb looked and a voice informed me it was getting pale around the sore. I went to the house in about an hour and there was the pale spot around the sore, the size of a silver dollar or longer. And thanks to our precious Redeemer, she was "well from that hour." Pain left. Redness left in a little while, only a little spot near the top of her hip. And while I was exulting in the victory by praising our God, a voice said, "you better hold on, there's a red spot that's not gone yet, you might get too fast. This was the voice of the devil to discourage. I let him know the Lord had done the work; this stopped his diabolical mouth and Jesus gave a wonderful victory.

This is just a little of the good things the Lord has done for us. Will briefly mention just one case out of our family. A sister's child couldn't eat anything scarcely. He was going down, and they were alarmed about him. They first sent word and asked me to pray for him. He seemed no better. Then they sent for me to come and anoint him. He laid down and went to sleep before I got to anoint him so I anointed and prayed for him while he was asleep. His grandmother told me he jumped out of bed the next morning, ran in to the cupboard full of life, and calling for something to eat, ate heartily from that time on, that being the end of his stomach trouble. She told me no one could deny that the Lord healed him. He had been afflicted for a good while.

Matt. 15:21-28; Acts 12:1-17), and it will take the same for us now. We must be in earnest agreement with each other and with what the Bible says. (Matt. 18:19, 20; Heb. 11:6.) We must reach the place where other people's unbelief will not affect our faith in Him. (Rom. 3:3, 4.) All men did not believe God's word in the apostle's days. (2 Thess. 3:1-3.)

Titus 2:11-

You may say the cost is too great. I cannot pay it. But listen, just a moment friend, Did you ever stop to think what the cost will be if you do not repent and serve God in this short time world. It will cost you the eternal bliss of heaven, and it will mean severe punishment and torment throughout eternity in a devils' hell. We read of a man in the 16th chapter of Luke who would not pay the price while in his short life, and in hell, he lifted up his eyes, being in torment. He prayed for a drop of water to cool his tongue for he said, "I am tormented in this flame," (It was real to him). He was even denied a drop of water. Then he prayed for one to be sent from the dead to tell his brothers, so they would pay the price and not come to this awful place of torture, but he was denied that for they had Moses and the prophets. Stewardship

In this day and age of rapid money making, we frequently hear of fortunes being made in a very short time, but how few, even Christians realize, the fact that they are only stewards of the wealth that they hold, and in reality are accountable to God for the way that they handle their money.

When one considers the shortness and uncertainties of life and the interminable length of eternity, does it not seem like falacy in the extreme to not make ample provision for the future, especially in the face of the fact that, "all you can ever really keep, is what you give away." Here, is a seemingly absurd and contradictory statement, but let me qualify it by saying, "that all we can ever really keep is that which we give away," but, of course, in the channel of God's choice. To use the colored man's philosophy, "Do yur givin' while yur livin', then you'll be knowin' where its goin,", is sane advice today.

We feel today that there are many "Ananias and Sapphira" consecrations, who in reality are keeping back "a part of the price" of their property and means which they claim to have put on the altar, yet, in reality held for the good of the family and friends of these unfaithful servants of God. The writer just now has in mind one instance which he was requested to pray for the disposition of a certain piece of property with the promise that they would remember the Lord's cause if the deal could be made. In due time the property was disposed of, but so far as the writer knows the Lord's cause was not remembered, and this deal was consummated many years ago.

We wonder if this is not the cause of many Christians, who at one time had a bright experience,—but now have lost their unction—having become dwarfed in their souls, simply because they have failed God at this very point. God's Word plainly says, "It is better not to pledge than to pledge and not to pay." How many instances there are today where good people are leaving practically all their wealth for their children to squander in riotous living, and in many cases it hastens them on to destruction. What a great blessing it would be not only to these children, but to the parents as well, if a reasonable amount of this money could be spent as God directs, which might be the means of bringing many, many souls into the kingdom, and a matter of great rejoicing to the donors throughout eternity.

To stand firm and true in this materialistic age means more than childs play. It takes courage, decision, firmness, and determination, as well as faith and grace to enable us to go through on the Bible line. We see men and women on every hand who profess to be Christains, but the Bible test will prove that they are spurious. "Winning Souls"

"He that winneth souls is wise." Young Christians can and should be soul winners. All the work of winning souls cannot be left to the preacher. Some people cannot be won by sermons from the pulpit. They need a personal touch. The preacher cannot possibly supply this personal touch to everyone in the community. Besides, you may be the one upon whom God has laid the burden for a particular person. Your personal interest may be just the thing that will cause him to make a decision.

Everybody needs Christ. Suppose every person in the world were a real Christian. What would happen to the great war evil? the crime evil? the liquor problem? the industrial upheaval? corrupt politics? all the sin in this world? Sin causes all the misery in the world, and if everybody had Christ in his heart, sin would be eradicated.

People are not satisfied without Christ. A Christian, on his way to prayer meeting, saw a stranger looking wistfully into the open window of the church, and moved by a strong impulse, he invited him to go in with him. The stranger consented, and it was the beginning of a Christian life for him and his family, "Do you know," he said to the one who invited him to the prayer meeting, "that I have lived in this city seven

years before I met you, and no one had ever before asked me to go to church? I had not been here three days when the groceryman, and the dairyman, and the politician had hunted me up, yet in all the seven years, you were the first man that ever expressed an interest in my soul." Some people long for Christ, but hesitate, waiting for an invitation.

Christianity is like the widow's cruse of oil—the more we pour out the more we have. Christian experience grows by exercise. Tell it and you will have some new and fresh growth every day. Keep it and you will have nothing worth telling.

The most effective means of winning souls to Christ is by a godly example. Paul teaches that we are living epistles, "known and read of all men." If this be true, then we are all preachers, and we ought to consider seriously whether we are actually preaching the gospel in our lives or something else. Some one has said, "I'd rather SEE a Christian than HEAR one." A Christian life is always more convincing than talk about it.

We are also to be witnesses for Christ by telling what Christ has done for us. If our example backs up our words, we can have a great influence. The gospel spread in the early church because every Christian took it upon himself to be a personal witness to his friend about Jesus.

"All Ye Are Brethren"

The Lord very clearly condemns the honorary titles, such as Rabbi, Father, Reverend, D. D., etc. which are affixed to the names of preachers and churchmen. This tends to exalt man above his brothers. In Matt. 23:8-12, Jesus plainly said to the apostles: "But be not ye called Rabbi; for one is your Master even Christ: and all ye are brethren. And call no man your father upon the earth; for one is your father, which is in heaven. Neither be ye called Masters, for one is your Master, even Christ. And whosoever shall exalt himself shall be abased; and he that humbleth himself shall be exalted." Jesus here taught equality—"all ye are brethren." A humble man of God will not accept these titles.

The word, "Reverend," which is so commonly used, is found just one time in the Bible. In Psalms 111:9 we read: "He (God) sent redemption unto his people: for he hath commanded his covenant forever: holy and RE-VEREND is HIS name." This title applies to God only. Yet men, in order to exalt themselves to superiority, have taken His name and subscribed it to their own. Is it true that such are taking that which does not belong to them?

Mark 6:1. And he went out from thence, and came into his own country; and his disciples followed him.

- 2. And when the sabbath day was come, he began to teach in the synagogue: and many hearing him were astonished, saying, From whence hath this man these things? and what wisdom is this which is given unto him, that even such mighty works are wrought by his hands?
- 3. Is not this the carpenter, the son of Mary, the brother of James, and Joses, and of Juda, and Simon? and are not his sisters here with us? And they were offended at him.
- 4. But Jesus said unto them, A prophet is not without honour, but in his own country, and among his own kin, and in his own house.
- 5. And he could there do no mighty work, save that he laid his hands upon a few sick folk, and healed them.
- 6. And he marvelled because of their unbelief. And he went round about the villages, teaching.
- 7. And he called unto him the twelve, and began to send them forth by two and two; and gave them power over unclean spirits;
- 8. And commanded them that they should take nothing for their journey, save a staff only; no scrip, no bread, no money in their purse:
- 9. But be shod with sandals; and not put on two coats.
- 10. And he said unto them, In what place so ever ye enter into an house, there abide till ye depart from that place.
- 11. And whosoever shall not receive you, nor hear you, when ye depart thence, shake off the dust under

your feet for a testimony against them. Verily I say unto you, It shall be more tolerable for Sodom and Gomorrha in the day of judgment, than for that city.

- 13. And they cast out many devils, and anointed with oil many that were sick, and healed them.

COMMENTS AND APPLICATIONS

We have another practical lesson for today. The title, "Serving with what we have" is a privilege that none of us may excuse ourselves from. Because many do not have an abundance, or are not gifted with many talents, they think it not worth while to try and they do nothing. The man that had only one talent was held as responsible for that one talent as was the servant that had ten talents.

The Master Rejected

Jesus, returning to His home community, as before, is not welcomed and received with faith. While they admit to God's wisdom and power manifested through Christ, yet, because He was one of themselves made them angry that He should have such gifts.

Did Jesus weaken when thus wounded in the house of His friends? "Is not this the carpenter?" "Though he was rich yet he became poor." The great price that was paid by Jesus was in vain for so many, because they would not pay the price.

"How oft' would he have gathered—but ye would not." Today He is still extending the invitation, "Come unto me," but many say, "we will not have this man to rule over us. Unbelief was then, and still is blinding the hearts of many, many people.

"And he could do no mighty work." Not that he hadn't the power, but the plan of salvation benefits those who embrace and receive it. Some of them believed, yet He did no mighty work. There is no wonder that only a few mighty works are done in our day of unbelief. "And he marveled because of their unbelief."

The ambition of the devil throughout the ages, is to get man to doubt, so that he will be helpless. Unbelief always paralizes man and limits accomplishments.

- 32. And they departed into a desert place by ship privately.

COMMENTS AND APPLICATIONS

In our lesson today, we find the apostles returning from their missionary tour through Galilee. No doubt their successful ministry had stirred the people, and also John the Eaptist had just been beheaded by Herod and his followers were coming to Jesus in their trouble, and disappointments.

All of these emotions caused the crowds to gather so dense around Jesus, and the apostles that they found it necessary to withdraw to a private place for rest. The death of John surely must have lifted, over the pathway of Jesus, the shadow of His own cross. Not only the pressure of the needs of the multitudes, but this burden of His own death for the sins of the people, was swiftly closing in.

We like to think of Jesus as a God, but He was also a human, and found it necessary to be alone with God to receive strength and guidance. Note the words, "Come ye apart." Would to God that our spiritual ears were so inclined and sensitive toward God that we could hear many times more than we do, those precious words, "Come ye apart." It is then and only then, as we separate ourselves from worldly things, close our hearts' door to everything, except God, that we are ready to receive those good things that cometh down from above. When Mary sat at the feet of Jesus He commented that she had chosen the better part. As we choose the better part, making ourselves to become silent before Him, He can bless that little that we have. Our temporal supplies will be sufficient for us, and we will have some to divide with those that are less fortunate than ourselves. It is while we are in secret communion with God, that the grace of God is so increased in our hearts. We are ready and able to tell others about the things of God. He that caused the loaves and fishes to increase is able to make all grace abound to His word.

COMMENTS AND APPLICATIONS

Again in our lesson for today we find Jesus coming to the rescue of those in need. Those bodies that had become the victim of disease and decay were immediately made whole by the great physician. The title of our lesson today is, "Keeping the Body Strong."

We cannot even imagine the number of bodies that have been wasted away by the effects of sin and luxury. While a strong, healthy body is a blessing from God, yet of what avail is a strong body if it houses a soul that is filled with corruption and vileness? The body cannot remain sound long in such circumstances, for the body is but a servant of the soul. "As a man thinketh in his heart so is he." And sooner or later his words and deeds will follow in the same ruts which the thoughts have made.

The Holy Spirit dwells within every saved person, hence his body is the house of God, set apart for God's sacred use. We should therefore glorify God in our bodies. With this thought in mind, we should refrain from punishing the body by not wearing the proper clothing to protect it from the weather, nor is it saintly to wear tight clothing or high heeled shoes, which interfere with the proper functioning of the different organs of the body.

In regard to this, we also hear the inspired words, "Be not fashioned according to this world." Anything that we have to wear because it is a fashion is only a trick of Satan. Instead of asking one another so much in regard to the looks of a certain wearing apparel, let us humbly ask ourselves, "Can I afford to do those questionable things that only hinder some ones confidence in me? Can I wear this little hat on the side of my head to the glory of God?"

The word also instructs not to be conformed to the

world, but to be transformed by the renewing of our mind. The mind that was continually in search of self honor and praise is now desirous that all things be done to the glory of God. Every one of us should desire to find that, "Good and acceptable will of God," and abide therein.

Mark 7:1. Then came together unto him the Pharisees, and certain of the scribes, which came from Jemisalem.

- 2. And when they saw some of his disciples eat bread with defiled, that is to say, with unwashen, hands, they found fault.
- 3. For the Pharisees, and all the Jews, except they wash their hands oft, eat not, holding the tradition of the elders.
- 4. And when they come from the market, except they wash, they eat not. And many other things there be, which they have received to hold, as the washing of cups, and pots, brasen vessels, and of tables.
- 5. Then the Pharisees and scribes asked him, Why walk not thy disciples according to the tradition of the elders, but eat bread with unwashen hands
- 6. He answered and said unto them, Well hath Esaias prophesied of you hypocrites, as it is written, This peo ple honoureth me with their lips, but their heart is far from me.
- 7. Howbeit in vain do they worship me, teaching for doctrines the commandments of men.
- 8. For laying aside the commandment of God, ye hold the tradition of men, as the washing of pots and cups: and many other such like things ye do.
- 9. And he said unto them, Full well ye reject the commandment of God, that ye may keep your own tra-
- 10. For Moses said, Honour thy father and mother; and, Whoso curseth father or mother, let him die the death:
- 11. But ye say, If a man shall say to his father or mother, It is Corban, that is to say, a gift, by whatso ever thou mightest be profited by me; he shall be free.
- 12. And ye suffer him no more to do ought for his father or his mother;
- 13. Making the word of God of none effect through your tradition, which ye have delivered: and many such like things do ye.

COMMENTS AND APPLICATIONS

Our lesson today is another controversy between Jesus and the Pharisees. We notice that it wasn't the outright and vile sinners that caused Jesus so much trouble of that day. It is even so today. "We wrestle not against flesh and blood, but against spiritual wickedness in high places." Yes, the opposer of the truth is still in the world today. Just as sure as there is a God of compassion and mercy to extend His kingdom on the earth, so also there is the power of Satan to tear down, and confuse, and discourage. Satan is not working so much through sinners, as he is through church professors to hinder the spread and advance of God's cause.

The one that is not coming face to face with the opposing forces surely is not witnessing very much for the Lord. The very instant that a soul is redeemed, the battle is won, but we thank God for the victory we find in Him. The Pharisees boldly delivered their attack, not upon the disciples, but upon Jesus, on the ground that He was responsible for the acts of the disciples.

So it is today the reproach that comes on account of us falls indirectly upon our Saviour. Those things which we humbly bear for His cause is gladly lifted by Him for we hear Him say, "Cast all your cares upon me." and as much as you have done it unto one of these, my little ones, ye have done it unto me. Many people are glad to enjoy the blessing of the Lord, while everything is going nicely, but let obstacles and troubles arise and they are ready to be silent until he battle has been won. If the blood stains the cross for us, let us in turn stand by the cross when the Lord has need of us.

The tradition was that if a Jew by chance came near or touched a sinner, that he became unclean and only through much bathing and washing was he made clean How different was this from the attitude that Jesus had, for he came to seek and save that which was lost, also "he that cometh to me, I will in no wise cast out."

How does this declaration sound to us? Is it just one of the many scriptures or is it the inspired word of God thundering into our souls? Does all the ambitions and desires of our heart arise from a pure God Does the service rendered from our given motive? hearts reach the height of perfection as does those words that come from our lips? Our intentions may be good, but that will not suffice. The Spirit of God in the heart will bring forth fruit to the glory of God.
