The Church Of God Its Organism

"But now hath God set the members everyone of them in the body as it pleased him." 1 Cor. 12:18.

God never makes mistakes. When He places one in His body. He places it where it can best work for Him. Since He is doing the placing, there can not be friction because each member is tempered together. One may be a preacher, another a teacher, and another a deacon or what ever God calls him to do. God places him in that position with grace to conduct

himself for God's glory. Oh, the beauty of this peaceful harmony-each member working under divine guidance without any friction. "In whom ye also are builded together for an habitation of God through the Spirit." Eph. 2:22.

This text clearly proves that the body of Christ is composed of those in whom the God of heaven dwells through His Spirit. Can this be said of the man made churches? -surely not. The Church of God is different in all respects. First, the members of Christ's body all have the same care for each other so that when one member suffers, all the members suffer with it. Can you say the different denominations have the same care for each other?—surely not! The different officers placed by Jesus himself in His body function under the leadership of the Spirit of God: hence, pastors, evangelists, prophets, teachers, etc. all work as the Spirit leads, and each one being led by the Spirit of God never clash or get out of order so long as they obey the Spirit's demands; but each is held responsible for the duties of his place or calling. Jesus, being the head (Col. 1:18), issues orders through His Holy Spirit to each officer in His body; and each obeying, working in the position in which he is placed, represents the handiwork of God-His Church.

Its Class Book

Every church has a class book in which its members' names are enrolled. The Church of God also has a class book in which its members' names are enrolled, but it is different from the man made church class book. As soon as a child is born(saved) its name is recorded on the family register-"And the Lord shall count when he writeth up the people, that this man was born there." Psa. 87:5-6.

"Notwithstanding in this rejoice not that the spirits are subject unto you; but rather rejoice because your names are written in heaven." Luke 10:20. How wonderful, to have our names recorded in heaven's Book, and to know it is written there! Many have their names written on earthly class books without any knowledge of salvation; but no name is written in God's class book, and no member is added to the Church of God without a spiritual birth. Sin removes our names from heaven's book. for the same Bookkeeper who records our names at birth, erases them when we sin. We are kept in His name (St. Jno. 17:11-12). Just one family, one name, all names are kept on the same class book. This cannot be said of Babylon (confusion) with its multiplicity of churches, class books kept by carnal man here on the earth as recorded by Jer. 17:13.

There will be some books opened at the great Judgment Bar of God, and each one there will be judged according to the Books. And another Book will be opened (the Class Book) which is called the Book of Life where all the saved have their names enrolled and will receive their reward accordingly. Rev. 20:12-13.

Let us compare the Church that Jesus built with any other, then we can readily see the difference. The church that Jesus built contains all who are saved, all who have entered at the door, all the Holy Spirit filled, all who are going together in perfect harmony, all who ,by the grace of God, are living free from sin. Jesus' blood cleanses from sin when we enter through Him (the door); but when men take members into their churches, many sinners are admitted. All agree that there are good and bad in all churches. I will admit God has a few in the different churches that are really saved, but God is calling His people out of those cages. (Rev. 18:1-4. 2 Cor. 6:17). Every really saved soul will gladly flee as soon as he hears the call: "Come out of her." If he keeps a clear vision of the beautiful Church that Jesus built, he will never go back into bondage again. It is the privilege of each member in the body of Christ, or His Church to see eye to eye and be perfectly joined together in the same mind and in the same judgment, all speaking the same thing; according to Paul's advice to the Corinthian Brethren. (1 Cor. 1:10.)

The wise man said, "Who is she that looketh forth as the morning, fair as the moon, clear as the sun, and terrible as an army with banners" Song of Sol. 6:10. Solomon saw the vision of the pure church in its pristine glory— "My dove, my undefiled is but one. She is the only one of her mother." When you look at a company of Spirit filled saints, you see the visible Church here on earth, part of the family having crossed over, and part here on earth waiting for the coming of Jesus to take the remaining part of the family home to their mansions in glory. (St. Jno. 14:3.)

When Jesus comes in the clouds, it will be to catch up his pure church; and not to set up some kind of a Millennial reign. (1 Thess. 4:15-18). In Eph. 5:27 Paul tells the kind of a church which he is going to take back. "That he might present it to himself a glorious church (the only kind he purchased) not having spot or wrinkle, or any such thing; but that it should be holy and without blemish." Reader, can you not see by looking over the organism

of the Churcn- tne purity, oneness, the same care, tenderness, and trueness to each other-characteristics which truly make it without spot and blameless? John, on the Isle of Patmos, caught a glimpse of the pure Church and compared it to the Bride, the Lamb's Wife. (Rev. 21:9-10) and in verse 10 it is shown as a great city "The holy Jerusalem descending out of heaven from God." Notice John was carried away in the spirit to a great high mountain before he could see it in all its transparent glory and beauty-out of every quagmire, no miasmatic air on the mountain. "In the last days it shall come to pass, that the mountain of the house of the Lord shall be established in the top of the mountains, and it shall be exalted above the hills; and people shall flow into it." Micah 4:1. -E. M. Zinn.

Eternal Security

There is a teaching in the world today that if a soul is once saved or "born again" it can never be lost. It is hard for me to understand how intelligent people can believe such a theory, much less to believe that the Bible teaches such a thing.

Consider the Hebrews whom God had called as a chosen people, and read the commandments and instructions which God gave them, and you will find that they were to have life and be in favor with God on the condition that they continue to obey Him and do His commandments. Otherwise, they would be cut off. We read in Joshua 24:20, "If ye forsake the Lord, and serve strange Gods, then He will turn and do you hurt, and consume you, after that He hath done you good." In 2 Chronicles 15:2, the Prophet said, "If ye seek him, he will be found of you: but if you forsake him, he will forsake you." God never forsakes man first; but when man forsakes God, He will forsake him.

I have heard well-meaning preachers say, "The Lord is married to the backslider." This is a sad mistake as a backslider is one who is in sin and dead in trespasses and sin. The Lord's wife is not a dead wife; but every member in His body has life from heaven in his soul. Peter calls us "lively stones." They use the scripture in Jeremiah 3:14 where the Prophet says, "Turn, backsliding children, saith the Lord, for I am married unto you." Notice, he says, "Backsliding." One can be backsliding and not be backslidden. There is a going back before the death takes place in the soul and the Lord is married to us until the death takes place and we are backslidden. Paul tells us plainly in Romans seventh chapter that a woman is free from a dead husband. Even so, God is free and not married to one in trespasses and sins, for they are dead; therefore, you can get no "Eternal security" out of this scripture. There is no place in the scriptures where God says that He is married to one that is backslidden.

Jesus says, "For many are called, but few chosen." Matt. 22:14. To be saved or have salvation means that one is forgiven of all transgressions and his heart cleansed from all the polution of Satan. Then he is in favor with God and is called to follow Jesus. He must bear his cross or he cannot be His disciple. (Luke 14:27). He is saved and knows it. He will continue to be saved just as long as he is faithful and obeys God. In this saved state he is on probation and will only get into heaven as he continues faithful to the end. This is according to scripture: "But Christ as a son over his own house; whose house we are, if we hold fast the confidence and the rejoicing of the hope firm unto the end." Heb. 3:6. "For we are partakers with Christ if we hold the beginning of our confidence steadfast unto the end." Heb. 3:14. "And ye shall be hated of all men for my name's sake: but he that endureth to the end shall be saved." Matthew 10:22. "And if children, then heirs; heirs of God and joint heirs with Christ; if so be that we suffer with him, that we may be also glorified together." Romans 8:17. "And to him that overcometh, and keepeth my works unto the end, to him will I give power over the nations." Rev. 2:26. "To him that overcometh will I grant to sit with me in my throne." Rev. 3: 21. "Blessed are they that do his commandments, that they may have right to the tree of life, and may enter in through the gates into the city." Rev. 22:14.

We get into heaven on conditions of being faithful to observe and do, and have no hope held out to us otherwise. According to the above scriptures, all saved people are on probation now. They are being tested and proven here in this world where the devil is loose and are amid a multitude of temptations. Therefore, saved people are exhorted to "Put on the whole armour of God that ye may be able to stand against the wiles of the devil. Eph. 6:11. people get saved, they are then called to follow the Lord in the self-denying, crucified route; and if they prove faithful unto the end, then God will choose them to dwell with Him in eternity; hence Jesus says, "Many are called but few are chosen." Many run well for a season but when temptation comes and they are being led on in the crucified way they turn back and walk no more with Him. Many begin to love the world and the praise of men and just drift on with a profession and will never be chosen to dwell with Him. They love to have men speak well of them; but Jesus says, "Woe unto you when all men shall speak well of you: for so did their fathers to the false prophets." Luke 6:26.

We have often said it from the pulpit, and now write it unto you that a profession of religion will avail nothing for you at the judgment. You will have to have the real life of Christ dwelling in your soul. The question should always be with you; not what did you have, but what do you have now? You might profess to belong to the "Church of God" which is the correct name, and yet be void of the Spirit of Christ, or lose out through neglect and never be chosen to dwell with Him.

"Let us hear the conclusion of the whole matter: Fear God and keep his commandments: for this is the whole duty of man. For God will bring every work into judgment, with every secret thing, whether it be good or whether it be evil." Eccl. 12: 13, 14.

The great apostle Paul said, "But I keep under my body, and bring it into subjection; lest that by any means, when I have preached to others, I myself should be a castaway." 1 Cor. 9:27.

Webster says a castaway is one who is cast away or off or rejected; a reprobate, which is a sinner; a lost man.

Brothers and sisters, the only safe place for any saint is to be wholly separated from this old world and to have supreme faith in God—continually choosing the Lord; continually saying yes to God; continually giving up to Him and having in our hearts: "Thy will be done." —Fred Pruitt.





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The threats of another world war are by no means past. It is merely postponed a few days, or perhaps years, as world armaments are rapidly increasing, and then, if the Lord prolongs time, it will strike with much greater destruction and dreadfulness than we can imagine. Centers of population everywhere will no doubt witness the scenes of war. The problem of war not only faces civilization as a whole, but it comes before God's people. The facts cannot be ignored. It will affect us if God permits time to go on. The saints will be persecuted. Their devotion to God will be tested, and no telling how far the persecutions will go.

War means all that Jesus did not stand for. He is the author of peace, and of course, God's people will follow the teaching of Jesus of non-resistance. Young saints especially will need Divine guidance and crace to endure that which will be ultimately thrust upon them.

Some preachers and editors of today believe one should not teach doctrines of the Bible about which so-called Christians differ, but deal only with those subjects on which they agree. Is this belief and practice correct? What is the greatest need when God's people are confused on any doctrine? The answer is clear that there should be a distinct, clear-cut exposition of the subject by the Word of God, regardless of conflicting opinions of men. The thing worth while is to discern the truth on all lines and not to withhold it from the people because it has been a subject of controversy. The real truth is needed all the more where there is a difference, and

he who blows the trumpet of warning should not give an "uncertain sound."

Jesus, in His commission to his disciples, told them to "Go ye therefore and teach all nations, . . . teaching them to observe all things whatsoever I have commanded you," but inserted no clause forbidding them to teach the truth on any subject where there was a difference of opinion. Then there was the promise: "And, lo, I am with you always, even unto the end of the world." Matt. 28:19, 20. Workers of God, when you go forth "teaching them to observe all things," then you can claim this promise.

The Apostle Paul declares that "All scripture is given by inspiration of God, and is profitable for doctrine, . . . that the man of God may be perfect, thoroughly furnished unto all good works." So we see that all of God's Word is necessary that "the man of God may be perfect."

Very often the truth concerning the unity of God's people separate from human denominations, and the present call of God for His people to declare their freedom from every sectarian wall which prevents full fellowship with other children of God is withheld from those who need it most. This truth is so greatly opposed by the denominational world and sometimes not clearly discerned by God's people, that preachers fail to be definite; and as a result, they gain support and influence from the denominations. Yet the souls who may have gotten saved are left to starve to death among the hills of Babylon.

God desires, as taught by the Apostle Paul, (Eph. 4:13, 14) that His people should "all come into the unity of the faith, and of the knowledge of the Son of God, into a perfect man, into the measure of the stature of the fulness of Christ: that we henceforth be no more children, tossed to and fro, and carried about with every wind of doctrine, by the cleicht of men, and cunning craftiness, whereby they lie in wait to deceive." People will surely never come to the unity of the faith when left a prey to all false doctrines that are abroad in the land. The editors of Faith and Victory stand committed to the publication of the whole truth as revealed by the Holy Spirit through the Word of God. —L. D. P.

Take Heed Unto Thyself

The Apostle Paul, in refering to the different congregations where he had been preaching the Kingdom of God, said: "I have not shunned to declare unto you all the counsel of God." Acts 20:27. He also said for the ministers first to take heed unto themselves, and then to all the flock over which the Holy Ghost had made them overseers, and exhorted them to feed the Church of God which He had purchased with His own blood.

Those days seem to have been days of drifting and taking up with wrong things and ministers speaking perverse things to draw disciples away after them. Paul warned them and said that after his departure, grevious wolves would enter in among them, not sparing the flock.

It seems to me if there ever was a time in the history of the Church when ministers needed to take heed unto themselves and not be decoyed away after wolves in sheep clothing and following after perverse teachings, it is now. The wolves and perverse teachers certainly have gotten into the flocks and played havoc on all sides, for we see cliques, clans, companies, and bunches separated by clever, crafty designers and deceived souls which in turn deceive others. We see so much of this being done and yet there is more of it being done and more trying to be done.

As a minister of God and one who has been called to preach the "Kingdom of God" and to declare the truth that makes men free, we are burdened of the Lord to sound a warning to the saints every where to keep your eyes on the Lord and follow Him, not any man or company of men, no matter how clever he or they seem to be. There is only one safe place for a saint, and that is entire separation from this old world and its lovers, even though at one time they were true preachers; for many of them begin to love the world and the praise of men and bring in perverse teachings to have a following and to decoy sheep away from the true fold of God.

Satan has many ways of working to divide, separate, and scatter the flock; but he has two ways by which he seems to have the most success. One, is to get an influential minister puffed a little until he loves the world and its praise. He becomes backslidden in heart but makes a very strong profession, and makes it a point to let folks know that God is very close to him and is using him in a very special way. Thus, he slyly and cunningly weaves his influence over the meek and humble, honest and sincere

sheep of the flock. If possible, he will get them to look to him as their special guardian and sole spiritual advisor.

We hear quite a lot these days about being "broad minded." There is a broad mindedness in Christ, but it is far from the broad mindedness which is meant by those who use the word so much. This word is very common among the slimy, compromising people, and it is uttered from the heart which is filled with a "Love the world" spirit. It means for you to be liberal and with enough worldly broad mindedness to allow this or that thing which the carnal, lustful professor of religion delights in.

If you will not compromise and go after the world, Satan will try to get you to become fanatic and extreme, and with illness in your heart, begin to take delight in using the Word to club, frighten, and crush precious souls. By having unrighteousness in your heart and knowing the truth, you will hold the truth in unrighteousness and continually cause trouble in congregations-going around more like a roaring lion than a meek and humble minister of God. Such a minister will, through fright, get some sheep under their awful influence, and looking through their glasses will be unable to discern and see the true humble children of God. They keep their "bell" of false teaching ringing in their ears so loudly that they cannot hear the voice of the true Shepherd. Thus, the slaughter of souls goes on and many are defiled, crushed, and lost because of Satanic influences.

Some years ago when some ministers were rising up and leading individuals and congregations into compromise by putting on worldly adornments, sanctioning and having programs and systems in congregations, and separating themselves from colored saints; God sent His voice from heaven through one of His humble ministers and said, "It is a down right compromise of the devil."

Old Satan is trying to work some of this false teaching off on the true saints again as there has been some whispering around of colored and white saints pulling apart. I am persuaded that such teaching has very little foundation and is no doubt hatched up by clever designers to frighten and create suspicion and to bring about the very thing that is grievous and repelling to every true saint of God. The Scriptures teach that God's people are all one, and God is no respecter of persons. One saint is just as dear to a true child of God as another, regardless of their race or color. Personally, I have great Godly love in my heart for the dear colored saints—just the same as for white saints.

We are going to have another assembly meeting here at Guthrie during the holidays, and the colored folks are all invited. They are just as welcome as the white. We shall be greatly disappointed if they

do not come and feel that it is God's meeting and their meeting and exercise the liberty that God gives them. We have been acquainted with a number of colored ministers for years, and we love them with the Love that God puts into our hearts for the redeemed. There is Bro. Ulysses Phillips of Dover, Okla., Bro. Manual Speers of Oklahoma City. Bro. Crawley, Bro. M. J. Phillips of Boley, Bro. G. W. McMillan, and the Okmulgee and Tulsa ministers and others which we could mention with whom we have sweet heavenly fellowship and would not for a moment separate from them as long as they stand true to God as in the past. We do not have fellowship with those spirits that work in men who want to manage everything and everybody and think what they say ought to be law for all, whether they be white, colored, brown or yellow.

It has been reported to me that some of the saint congregations in Oklahoma have, or want to have, programs or other entertainments to hold the young people and keep them coming to meeting. They want to be "broad minded." God says in His Word: "Strait is the gate and narrow is the way which leadeth unto life; and few there be that find it." Broad minded people of this type are on the broad way that Jesus says leads to destruction. Personally, I do not know of any congregation of true saints that has or endorses programs for the young people. If any are tempted in this way and would show the right kind of broad mindedness, they would know that young people of that sort do not need programs, but a continued red-hot, hell-fire revival to awake them and the preacher from their dead state. Get them alive in the Spirit and the good preaching of the Word, praying, singing spiritual songs, and spirit born testimonies would be an abundance of entertainment to keep them keen to come to meeting. Shame on any minister that would resort to any worldly method. I feel like saying as one said years ago: Programs and kindred methods are "A down right compromise of the devil."

Another thing I want to mention is concerning adultery. I verily believe that some are letting down and easing up on this ungodly thing. I have heard that it has been taught among us that a minister ought not to have but one wife, but that it might be different with others. They use the scripture in the third chapter of 1 Tim. to try to pull this thing over the saints. Paul said that a "Bishop must be blameless the husband of one wife." When there are so many scriptures in the Bible that teaches plainly that to have more than one wife is adultery, we should get the thought of the writer in this verse and not try to make it contradict the teaching of Jesus and Paul's former teaching in the seventh chapter of Romans, and then give license for a saint to have more than one living companion. This letter was directed to Timothy, a young minister, and Paul no doubt spoke it, or wrote it, to him in this way so he would be sure not to choose some "hanger-on" in the congregation who was in double marriage and was putting himself forward.

And, Brethren, that endorsing and giving way to "Life Insurance" is another slimy compromise move: and will, if endorsed or silence is held on the subject, weaken faith in God and open the door for many other compromising things. All Scriptures which teach you to have faith in God and to put your trust in Him is against it. To insure your life in earthly companies, shows no faith in God at all; but does show the contrary. It shows a full lack of confidence in God to care for you. It is depending on the arm of flesh. "Cursed be the man that trusteth in man, and maketh flesh his arm, and whose heart departeth from the Lord." Jer. 17:5. He goes on to say that a man of this kind "shall be like a heath in the desert, and shall not see when good cometh; but shall inhabit the parched places in the wilderness, in a salt land, and not inhabited." Read the sixth chapter of Matt. and see how clearly Jesus teaches us to "take no thought for the morrow." He tells us, when speaking of our needs, that our Father knoweth that we have need of these things. People who insure their lives fearing that God will not supply somewhere in the future are showing no confidence in God, but in man. A large portion of the teachings of Jesus will mean nothing to the man who insures his life and puts his trust in the "arm of flesh." Brethren, if we teach people to have faith in God, let us be an example of truth to them. A feigned faith is guile and hypocrisy.

COMMENTS AND APPLICATION

Lying is one of the devil's forces that is running at large today. If men will lie under oath with the penalties of the law facing them, how much more so, without constraint in both business and social life. Lying consists of more than merely uttering words for actions and deeds that deceive are also lies.

Out of the Heart- Jesus said, To eat with unwashen hands defileth not the man." As in the case of the other commandments, Jesus went back of the evil acts to the source from whence the evil came. How true are the words: "keep thy heart with all diligence for out of it are the issues of life." Truly. we must keep our hearts clean from every evil thought or desire. A thought to retaliate or misrepresent or even exaggerate is one of the little foxes that spoil the vines. How true is the scripture which says, "Out of the abundance of the heart the mouth speaketh!" The only way we can be fully cleansed from all evil is to have the blood of Jesus Christ applied to our hearts, and then it will be an easy matter for us to "speak the truth in Christ and lie not." "A good man out of the good treasure of the heart bringeth forth good things: and an evil man out of the evil treasure bringeth forth evil things."

A lie is "a falsehood uttered or acted for the purpose of deceiving." If a man utter an untruth which he himself believes, he makes a mistake; but does not tell a lie. On the other hand, an action which conveys a false impression is deceiving, and if we intend to deceive, it becomes a lie.

There are many ways in which we may lie. Abraham said, in regard to Sarah: "She is my sister." While this was a true statement, yet it was a lie because the impression he wished to make was that she wasn't his wife. She was his half-sister.

Discuss with your class, the particular problems that confront them in their every day life.

COMMENTS AND APPLICATION

To covet is to desire, but the sense in which the term is usually connected causes us to think of greed and worldly gain.

Our lesson today, the last of the Ten Commandments, is the highest of all for it pertains to the heart and forbids unlawful desires. A covetous spirit is the cause of many sins and crimes. The essence of the word in the commandment is not to desire our neighbour's possessions, but covetousness today shows itself in greedy desire for worldly possessions in general. Jesus said, "Take heed and beware of covetousness for a man's life consisteth not in the abundance of things he possesseth." In leaving the ideal pattern for our lives, Jesus did not surround himself with material things. The person possessing much of this world's goods makes a poor example for us to have our children pattern after. It is not an absolute proof, but is an evident fact that there is a weakness, or leanness which dulls the spiritual hearing to that still small voice which enables one to behold the sad condition of humanity today.

In contrast to covetousness is contentment. Choose God or mammon! How is covetousness like a mirage in the desert?

As the small particles of silt deposit at the mouth of a river clog the channel, endangering navigation and finally stopping it; so also, striving after and accumulating wealth gradually clog the soul until the spirit of God cannot have free course and spiritual life is endangered.

COMMENTS AND APPLICATION

Many of our lessons have been in regard to our duty and love to God; but this lesson teaches us our duty one to another. Notice the quotation: "Ye have heard that it has been said, love thy neighbour and hate thine enemy." It dosen't say that it is written; neither does this imply that it is a standard. Some Jewish tradition had taken it for granted that if you love your neighbour, you should hate your enemy.

Some are preplexed as to the meaning of love. When Jesus said, "Love one another," he also said, "As I have loved you." Jesus had a divine compassionate love for those who crucified him, but for those disciples who left all to follow him he had a tender affectionate love that can only be had by perfect fellowship.

How close is practical application of this lesson. Love your enemies. Be ready to do anything to get them saved. Have good will to all men. The New Testament law of love far exceeds the "Thou shalt not."

Think on the words: Love, Bless, Do good, and Pray. ..This is not tongue service alone, and can only be rendered from a heart that has been regenerated and saturated with the love of God. Jesus says that we are his friends, if we do whatsoever he commands us. That whatsoever, means that our lives must be completely yielded unto Him; that our will is absorbed in His will; and that we do all things to His glory.
