We read in the precious Word of God: "For where two or three are gathered together in my name, there am I in the midst of them." (Matt. 18: 20.) And in the 19th verse of the same chapter we read: "Again I say unto you, That if two of you shall agree on earth as touching anything that they shall ask, it shall be done for them of my Father which is in heaven."

Friends, saints, Christians, men and brethren, members of the one body, and church of the living God let me tell you: when and where God himself is present in a meeting, there is something worth while going on. And too, when the Master is not present in your meeting, there is little, if anything, worth while going on. For he himself has plainly said, "Without me ye can do nothing." (John 15:5.)

The Word of God tells us that the Saviour prayed thus: "Holy Father, keep through thine own name those whom thou hast given me, that they may be one as we are." (John 17:11). He furthermore prayed in the same chapter: "For their sakes, I sanctify myself, that they also might be sanctified through the truth. Neither pray I for these alone, but for them also, which shall believe on me through their word; that they all may be one; as thou, Father art in me, and I in thee, that they also may be one in us." (John 17:19, 20, 21).

Thank God, the Saviour did not only pray for the unity and sanctification of His body, but died for the same. As it is written: "Christ also loved the church, and gave himself for it; that he might sanctify and cleanse it with the washing of water by the word." (Eph. 5:25, 26.) Truly, the good Lord has done, and is yet doing much to emphasize the oneness of His people.

The Holy Spirit of God himself is the organizer of this great institution, and He (the Spirit) carefully sets it up in the one name. Well has one said: "There is somebody wrong about this Bible, as sure as God is on His throne. All church organizations claim to be reliable, and every one a name of his own." Yea! each chartered, incorporated or authorized to do business of his own; each having a constitution, ritual, guide, and head of its own. Too many heads for the one body, too many incorporated names for the one organization pretending love and unity, when in reality a Babel-Tower of modern evil and confusion.

Those earthly names serve only to divide us, while the name of God unites us as one. "United we stand, but divided we fall." Well has the blessed Saviour taught us: "If a kingdom be divided against itself, that kingdom cannot stand. And if a house be divided against itself, that house cannot stand. And if Satan rise up against himself, and be divided, he cannot stand, but hath an end." (Mark 3:24, 25, 26.) As for our modern Babel, watch her go down! Truly, Christ is head of His sanctified body (Col.1:18) and has only one body (Rom. 12:4) on earth and in Heaven; (Eph. 3:15) and has only one name, thank the Lord. "Precious name! O, how sweet! Hope of earth and joy of Heaven."

Listen friends, it is as true in this evening time as it was in the morning time (as I have said), whenever white, colored, Indian, and all meet together in the name of God, in Spirit and in truth, there is something worth while going on, for God himself is present.

JESUS CHRIST IS THE SAME

A few of the many instances of Divine healing witnessed by the undersigned for the good of suffering Humanity

For the lack of time and space I will only mention some of the instantanious healing of a few: Sister Owens of Tyrone, Mo., given up to die by the Dr., with Typhoid and Pneumonia, was so near gone that she knew no one when we got there, was healed instantly in answer to prayer. Charley Lay of the same place, burned and crooked arm, healed and straightened. Brother Steve Rutledge of the same town, bad cancer on his face, healed completely so that in a very short time there was no visible trace or scar to show where it had been. Eugene Harmon, when three years old had membraneous croup, choked until he could hardly breathe, but said, "Mama, pray." She did pray, I came in just at that time, agreed in the prayer and God instantly healed him. The writer was twice healed of Typhoid Pneumonia; the first time in Okla. Wife was worn out caring for me and went sound asleep (this was in Bro. Hewitt's home). Every body in the house was asleep, I tried to call wife but was too weak to make her hear. Here the devil tried to make me believe he had me, by lowering a black casket by my bed. I was alone with God. I rebuked the devil, and stood on the promise: "If ye abide in me and my words abide in you, ye shall ask what ye will and it shall be done unto you." I called on God for strength, I could hear the old wind mill, and wanted water, my lips were parched and my tongue swolen. I got out of bed and staggered to the wind mill on the "promise," drank all I wanted and went back to bed. The next morning, I got up and dressed myself-I was healed. The next spell of sickness of the same kind was at Clovis, New Mex. Wife called in three ministers. They had no faith for my healing and thought I had to die. Wife called Sister Grider of Portalis, New Mex. She got to my house at midnight, and she and dear wife prayed the prayer of faith and God healed me. Sister W. I. Miles of Clovis was near unto death. Wife and myself were called. The prayer of faith was prayed and she got up and dressed for God had healed her. Sister Miller of Mo. was healed of erysiplas; also Sister Lay of a severe sickness; some cases of the itch have been healed; one double cure- a sinner at Tyrone, Mo. was healed and saved at the same time; some have been raised from the dead. The writer gone about an hour, cause unknown, was brought back by the prayer of his faithful companion. Again,

a two-year-old daughter of Arthur Hammond and wife of Melrose. New Mex. lay dying with erysipelas or shingles. The father phoned to the writer at Clovis to come. He prayed that God would spare little Bertha's life until we could get there, which He did, but as we stepped into the door she breathed her last. We prayed anyway, but there were no signs of life. Five or six professors in the house all said the child was dead as there was no heart beat and no pulse. We went into another room to be alone with God, and prayed God for the sake of those in the house to manifest His power. I believe this was repeated the third time before the assurance came, then we went back to the little one, (This must have been 45 minutes from the time it drew its last breath) and asked the parents if they could believe that God would yet raise little Bertha. The father answered, yes, so we anointed and prayed for her, and as we opened our eyes she was looking into my eyes and Another case was Brother Maxwell of Clovis, New Mex. who died with T. B. He had been gone about 45 minutes when Brother Erle Forbes, wife, and myself anointed him, prayed, and rebuked death, and God brought him back. I will mention one more case: an infant of Sister May Kiger of Mo. was very sick. Wife and myself prayed for it and it seemed to be all right. We were called to dinner in another room and while there we heard the mother scream, "The babe is gone," and from all appearance, it was gone. There were no signs of life until we rebuked death as we did in all other cases, and God heard prayer, brought it back and healed it.

All saints should trust God for healing. I have not taken a dose of medicine for about 40 years. Read James 5:11-15. —G. E. Harmon.

And immediately Jesus stretched forth his hand, and caught him, and said unto him, O thou of little faith, wherefore didst thou doubt?" 1 John 4:18—"There is no fear in love; but perfect love casteth out fear; because fear hath torment. 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

Christ is our perfect passover Lamb. The shadow or figure of the true sacrifice is recorded in Exodus 12:3-11. God's chosen people were in bondage and slavery in Egypt, but He had promised to deliver them. After sending many plagues upon the Egyptians, He finally commanded each family of the Israelites to select a lamb without blemish. This lamb was to be slain and the blood sprinkled upon the door posts of their houses, and the flesh to be roasted and eaten. God said He was going to pass through the land that night and smite the firstborn; "and against all the princes of Egypt I will execute judgment." He says further: "And the blood shall be to you for a token upon the houses where ye are; and when I see the blood I will pass over you, and the plague shall not be upon you to destroy you, when I smite the land of Egypt." This came to pass as the Lord had said, but those who had the blood on the door posts were saved from the plague.

The Apostle Paul, in 1 Cor. 5:7, says: "For even Christ our passover is sacrificed for us." And Peter says, "Forasmuch as ye know that ye were not redeemed with corruptible things, . . . but with the precious blood of Christ, as of a lamb without blemish and without spot." 1 Pet. 1:18, 19. The Revelator says, "And all that dwell upon the earth shall worship him, whose names are not written in the book of life of the Lamb slain from the foundation of the

world." Rev. 13:8.

Since Christ the true passover Lamb has been slain, we are entreated to apply the blood to our hearts. It is the only way that we might be exempt from the plague of death. God has appointed a day in which He will execute judgment upon the world. No one will escape who is not covered under the blood of Christ. HARD NUTS FOR SEVENTH DAY ADVENTISTS.

- 1. Where is the proof that any man ever kept the seventh day, except by special commandment prior to the proclamation of the ten commandments at Mount Sinai? (Gen. 2:2, 3; Ex. 16:1-30; 19:1-25; 20:1-17.)
- 2. If Christians are required to keep the seventh day, why do you depart from your dwelling on that day, seeing those to whom the law was given were plainly commanded not to do? (Ex. 16:29)
- 3. If you keep one Sabbath—the seventh day—why not keep them all, the seventh year and the year of jubilee? Who authorized you to make distinction in favor of the seventh day? (Lev. 25:1-22)
- 4. If Christians are required to keep the Sabbath, how are they to live in cold climates? (Ex. 35: 1-3.)
- 5. Is it the duty of Christians to put to death those who desecrate the seventh day? (Num. 15:32-36) If YES, who will be the public executioner? If NO, what will you do with the law? (Ex. 35:2). If you say the penalties are abolished, I answer that the same passages that you use to prove this established beyond the shadow of a doubt that the law, too, is abolished. If you admit that the penalties are still in force, and the proof that they are is unanswerable and invincible if the law is in force, there is not an Adventist on top of the green earth who can escape the vengeance of the broken law!
- 6. If Christians are under obligations to observe the seventh day, why did Jesus declare that all law and prophecy hang on LOVE instead of the Sabbath, seeing the command to keep it is the one on which you HANG your everlasting all! (Matt 22:34-40; Rom. 13:8-10).
- 7. Why did Jesus not require the young ruler to keep the Sabbath when enumerating the commandments? (Matt. 19:16-20; Mark 10: 17-22; Luke 18: 18-24).
 - 8. If Christians are to keep the law of Moses—the

- Sabbath—why did the apostles and elders who met at Jerusalem leave it out of their address to the churches? (Acts 15:1-29) This case finds, in some respects, a parallel in your theorizing. Judaizing teachers had gone forth declaring to the brethren that unless they would submit to circumcision and keep the law of Moses they could not be saved. The apostles said, "We have no such commandment."
- 9. If Christians are required to keep the Sabbath how are we to account for the open violation of the law by Jesus Christ, who is our example, unless by saying that the power that made the law can take it away, and that He did it? (Matt. 12:1-8; Jno. 7:22-23)
- 10. If you keep the Sabbath because, as you think, it was kept before the law of Moses, why do you not practice circumcision, seeing it is plainly commanded in these ages? (Gen. 1-7:1-14; Gal. 5:1-6).
- 11. When did patriarch, prophet, or apostle, or anybody else command any Gentile to keep the law of Moses? No dodging here. Proof! Proof! Proof!!!
- 12. Paul says the ministration of death written and engraven in stone (Ex. 20:1-17; 31:18; 32:15, 16; 34:1-28) was done away (2 Cor. 3:1-18). When, where, and by whom was it brought back into force? Name the day, the age, the authority, and give proof from the Book! If your doctrine is true the great apostle of the Gentiles stands convicted of a mistake.
- 13. If the early Christians kept the Sabbath day why did they break bread on the first day of the week? (Acts 20:7).
- 14. If Christians are to keep the Sabbath day how do you account for the fact that the apostles preached the gospel in Jerusalem, Samaria, to Cornelius the Gentile, and to many others, without commanding a single individual to keep it! Did they under the inspiration of the Holy Spirit, fail to properly instruct their converts? (Acts 2:1-47; 8:1-40; 10:1-48;16: 1-40).
- 15. Is it not a fact, according to the book of Acts, that the thing done was of more importance than the day? (Acts 20:7).
- 16. Can you demonstrate that the day you keep is really the seventh day or Sabbath coming down in regular succession from the day on which God rested? If not, your day is no better than any other day. Admitting for argument's sake, that the law of Moses is still in force, and that the fourth commandment is binding on the whole human race, you will affirm that it is possible for all men to keep the same day? If so, how do you explain the fact that the traveller who starts out to go around the earth gains, say, if going east, one hour for every thousand miles travelled! How far would he go before he lost the count? Do you not see how he would inevitably be behind or in advance? Further, how do you explain the fact that far away toward the extremes of the earth, travelling from the equator, there are periods of six

months night and six months day from age to age? Do you not see that it is a geographical impossibility for all men to keep the same day, and that the Law was only intended for one people, one country, and one age?

17. Do you keep the Sabbath day? No dodging, do you? Do you REST, or put in the day promulgating your doctrines? Do you not eat food on that day prepared by work on a fire kindled in violation of the Law? (Ex. 20:8-11; 35:1-3). Do you offer the burnt offering required by Law? (Num. 28:3-10). Do you remain in your house during the day? If you do not keep the day according to the Law you do not keep it at all. If you admit that any part of the Law concerning the Sabbath is done away, you are driven to the inevitable and irresistible conclusion that it is all done away. If you deny that any part of it is done away, you condemn yourself, for you do not keep it. Which way will you take?

In dealing with the subject at hand, may I draw your attention to a passage of scripture found in Romans 12:1, 2:

- 1. "I beseech you therefore, brethren, by the mercies of God, that ye present your bodies a living sacrifice, holy, acceptable unto God, which is your reasonable service.
- 2. "And be not conformed to this world: but be ye transformed by the renewing of your mind, that ye may prove what is that good, and acceptable and perfect, will of God."

To hold our young people we must pamper them and mix with them in the dance and other questionable amusements. Acts 18:1. After these things Paul departed from Athens, and came to Corinth;

- 4. And he reasoned in the synagogue every Sabbath, and persuaded the Jews and the Greeks.
- 5. And when Silas and Timotheus were come from Macedonia, Paul was pressed in the spirit, and testified to the Jews that Jesus was Christ.
- 6. And when they opposed themselves, and blasphemed, he shook his raiment, and said unto them, Your blood be upon your own heads; I am clean: from henceforth I will go unto the Gentiles.
- 7. And he departed thence, and entered into a certain man's house, named Justus, one that worshipped God, whose house joined hard to the synagogue.
- 8. And Crispus, the chief ruler of the synagogue, believed on the Lord with all his house; and many of the Corinthians hearing believed, and were baptized.
 - 9. Then spake the Lord to Paul in the night by

a vision, Be not afraid, but speak, and hold not thy peace:

- 10. For I am with thee, and no man shall set on thee to hurt thee: for I have much people in this city.
- 11. And he continued there a year and six months, teaching the word of God among them.
- 1 Cor. 2:1. And I, brethren, when I came to you, came not with excellency of speech or of wisdom, declaring unto you the testimony of God.
- 2. For I determined not to know anything among you, save Jesus Christ and him crucified.
- 3. And I was with you in weakness, and in fear, and in much trembling.
- 4. And my speech and my preaching was not with enticing words of man's wisdom, but in demonstration of the Spirit and of power:
- 5. That your faith should not stand in the wisdom of men, but in the power of God.

Golden Text: "I can do all things through Christ which strengtheneth me." Phil. 4:13.

COMMENTS AND APPLICATION

Today's lesson continues the study of Paul's missionary tour. At Thessalonica his party was accused of turning the world up side down. The brethren sent Paul away by night to Berea where the people were more noble, receiving the word and searching the scriptures to see if those things were so. When the persecutors from the other cities heard of Berea receiving the Word, they immediately came in pursuit of Paul, so again Paul departed unto Athens.

Paul at Athens-

Athens was a University center. Idolatry flourished there. The philosophers awaited to attack every strange doctrine. One of the most profound sermons that we have was given by him here.

The resurrection that Paul preached condemned the false teaching of the Epicureans and Stoics for neither school believed in the resurrection. Don't miss the blessing contained in this sermon by not taking time to study it thoroughly. Some were won to the truth.

Corinth— The Capital and metropolis of Greece. a city of 400,000 full of intellectual pride and idolatry and pagan doctrine.

Paul found bad material for church building. To the Jew first: "Ye judge yourselves unworthy of eternal life. Lo, we turn to the Gentiles."

Through much suffering and hardship the truth was planted with the result that "Many of the Corinthians, hearing, believed and were baptized.

Paul's Object—To preach "Jesus Christ and him crucified;" not philosophy that most people desired.

Paul's Method—Not in excellency of speech, but in demonstration of the Spirit and of power.

Acts 19:1. And it came to pass, that, while Apollos was at Corinth, Paul having passed through the upper coasts came to Ephesus: and finding certain disciples.

- 8. And he went into the synagogue, and spake boldly for the space of three months, disputing and persuading the things concerning the kingdom of God.
- 9. But when divers were hardened, and believed not, but spake evil of that way before the multitude, he departed from them, and separated the disciples, disputing daily in the school of one Tyrannus.
- 10. And this continued by the space of two years; so that all they which dwelt in Asia heard the word of the Lord Jesus, both Jews and Greeks.
- 20:17. And from Miletus he sent to Ephesus, and called the elders of the church.
- 18. And when they were come to him, he said unto them, Ye know, from the first day that I came into Asia, after what manner I have been with you at all seasons.
- 19. Serving the Lord with all humility of mind, and with many tears, and temptations, which befell me by the lying in wait of the Jews:
- 20. And how I kept back nothing that was profitable unto you, but have shewed you, and have taught you publickly, and from house to house,
- 21. Testifying both to the Jews, and also to the Greeks, repentance toward God, and faith toward our Lord Jesus Christ.

Eph. 2:19. Now therefore ye are no more strangers and foreigners, but fellowcitizens with the saints, and of the household of God;

- 20. And are built upon the foundation of the apostles and prophets, Jesus Christ himself being the chief corner stone;
- 21. In whom all the building fitly framed together groweth unto an holy temple in the Lord:
- 22. In whom ye also are builded together for an habitation of God through the Spirit.

Golden Text: "But now in Christ Jesus ye who sometimes were afar off are made nigh by the blood of Christ." Eph. 2:13.

COMMENTS AND APPLICATION

Paul had a desire to evangelize Ephesus before this, but God didn't permit it then. Now the time has come and Paul begins as usual at the synagogue, only to be put out again in a few months.

Some of John the Baptist's disciples failed to give heed to his advice, that he must decrease and Jesus must increase, but continued separately to cling unto John. This error was soon corrected and they received the word, were baptized in Jesus' name, and also received the Holy Ghost. The temple of the Great Diana of the Ephesians was here; thus the truth preached by Paul wrought havoc unto the idols, and hindered the craft of the coppersmith, causing an uproar throughout the city.

Paul shrank not from declaring the whole truth unto them; but notice the humility of mind and the tears.

Some seem to draw back from study and knowledge; but study and knowledge are not the hindering factors among God's people today, but the lack of humility and the scarcety of tears. That burning love of Jesus in the hearts of men and women will send the gospel from the rivers unto the ends of the earth. As Jesus looked upon the multitudes, he had compassion. Brethren, thousands are paralized with indifference. May God stir our hearts, that the sleeper may be aroused and those who are spiritually dead may arise and come forth.

- 6. But they said, We will drink no wine: for Jonadab the son of Rechab our father commanded us, saying, Ye shall drink no wine, neither ye, nor your sons for ever:
- 7. Neither shall ye build house, nor sow seed, nor plant vineyard, nor have any: but all your days ye shall dwell in tents; that ye may live many days in the land where ye be strangers.
- 8. Thus have we obeyed the voice of Jonadab the son of Rechab our father in all that he hath charged

Eph. 5:15. See then that ye walk circumspectly, not as fools, but as wise,

- 16. Redeeming the time, because the days are evil.
- 17. Wherefore be ye not unwise, but understanding what the will of the Lord is.
- 18. And be not drunk with wine, wherein is excess: but be filled with the Spirit;
- 19. Speaking to yourselves in psalms and hymns and spiritual songs, singing and making melody in your heart to the Lord;
- 20. Giving thanks always for all things unto God and the Father in the name of our Lord Jesus Christ;
- 21. Submitting yourselves one to another in the fear of God.
- 6:1. Children, obey your parents in the Lord: for this is right.

COMMENTS AND APPLICATION

"Know ye not that to whom ye yield yourselves servants to obey, his servants ye are to whom ye obey; whether of sin unto death, or of obedience unto righteousness?"

That consistent, temperate life that a Christian lives is something to be coveted. This is an age of extremes—unbalanced minds and lop-sided souls are far too numerous.

While the word temperate does refer to intoxicating drinks, the liquor with its many complicated problems; yet it does not stop there.

Seeking power and possessions more than is needed is intemperate. Recreation, pleasure, and comforts indulged in do not trend to spirituality. A pure heart produces a pure mind, and a pure mind in turn seeks to glorify God in all things.

Men may run to an excess of riot, indulge in evil, yield themselves unto sin; but happiness and satisfaction cannot be found in them.

The deep longings of man's soul can only be satisfied with that life that comes from God.

The wages of sin is death. An unrestrained life

in worldly pleasure cannot beat the law and penalty of sin. Surely we shall reap what we sow. Let us yield ourselves unreservedly unto God that we may fulfill the purpose wherein God has called us.

Rom. 1:1. Paul, a servant of Jesus Christ, called to be an apostle, separated unto the gospel of God,

- 2. (Which he had promised afore by his prophets in the holy scriptures,)
- 3. Concerning his Son Jesus Christ our Lord, which was made of the seed of David according to the flesh:
- 4. And declared to be the Son of God with power, according to the spirit of holiness, by the resurrection from the dead:
- 5. By whom we have received grace and apostleship, for obedience to the faith among all nations, for his name:
- 6. Among whom are ye also the called of Jesus Christ:
- 7. To all that be in Rome, beloved of God, called to be saints: Grace to you and peace from God our Father, and the Lord Jesus Christ.
- 8. First, I thank my God through Jesus Christ for you all, that your faith is spoken of throughout the whole world.
- 9. For God is my witness, whom I serve with my spirit in the gospel of his Son, that without ceasing I make mention of you always in my prayers;
- 10. Making request, if by any means now at length I might have a prosperous journey by the will of God to come unto you.
- 11. For I long to see you, that I may impart unto you some spiritual gift, to the end ye may be established;
- 12. That is, that I may be comforted together with you by the mutual faith both of you and me.
- 13. Now I would not have you ignorant, brethren, that oftentimes I purposed to come unto you, (but was let hitherto,) that I might have some fruit among you also, even as among other Gentiles.

- 14. I am debtor both to the Greeks, and to the Barbarians: both to the wise, and to the unwise.
- 15. So, as much as in me is, I am ready to preach the gospel to you that are at Rome also.
- 16. For I am not ashamed of the gospel of Christ: for it is the power of God unto salvation to every one that believeth: to the Jew first, and also to the Greek.
- 17. For therein is the rigteousness of God revealed from faith to faith: as it is written, The just shall live by faith.

Golden Text: "I am not ashamed of the gospel of Christ for it is the power of God unto Salvation to every one that believeth." Rom. 1:16.

COMMENTS AND APPLICATION

The three key-words in our lesson today, are: "I am a debtor," which represents the call to preach. "I am ready," is the preparation; "I am not ashamed," shows forth the glory of the ministry.

Many people realize their responsibility when they are first saved. They are aware that it is not by any merits of their own, but only through the mercies and favor of God that they receive forgiveness of sin. They are ready to do with all their being those things that come to them. They also are bold to witness for the Saviour; but as time goes on, they are affected by the cold formal atmosphere around them until the things of the world do not seem so bad. "Because iniquity doth abound, the love of many shall wax cold." The exhortation from the Word is, "as ye have received the Lord, so walk ye in Him."

Where is the consecration by which the saints were once known? The zeal and sacrifice that sent the gospel unto the remotest places is ebbing low. That love "one to another" that distinguished Christ's disciples from those of professors is not so plentiful.

Those gifts of the Spirit that are only found in the Church of God should be functioning with more power and authority.

May the Lord stir our hearts to get a firmer hold on God. When the Spirit of God brings a revival in our souls, eternal things will become more real.

The end of time is fast closing in upon us. Eternity will be so long. Both heaven and hell are real—Death is sure. Think of the loved ones, friends, and even millions that are on the downward road to eternal burnings, "where their worm dieth not and the fire is not quenched."

Our prayer is, "Lord help us to warn souls that they come to a halt and call upon God for mercy.
