Fire On The Earth

In a positive declaration, Jesus says, "I am come to send fire on the earth; and what will I if it be already kindled? Suppose ye that I am come to give peace on earth? I tell you, Nay; but rather division. For from henceforth there shall be five in one house divided, three against two, and two against three." Luke 12:49, 51, 52.

Here is a text which might appear to contradict the doctrine of unity, but further consideration shows that it states another side to God's divine plan. In this passage the "fire" referred to is clearly understood not to be literal. Hence, it is a figure of speech, meaning a certain Divine element which has the characteristics of literal fire. Strange as it may seem, fire both separates and unifies. What happens when a flame of fire is placed under a pot of goldbearing dust or ore? It melts, and the dross or dirt separates from the gold. The dirt rises to the surface to be removed, while the pure gold remains. The fire did two things-one directly and one indirectly. Directly, it brought about a division or separation. Indirectly, the gold which remained was unified and compacted together as a result of the removal of the foreign substances which separated the grains of gold. Fire destroys and consumes. Therefore, Jesus said, "I am come to send fire on the earth," The fire of God's eternal Word will separate and consume every false way and foreign spirit. The fire will try every man's work. Fire is an emblem of God's Word. Jer. 23:29. In Hebrews 12:29 we read, "For our God is a consuming fire."

John the Baptist, while preaching to the multitudes about Jesus, said, "He shall baptize you with the Holy Ghost and with fire." This was fulfilled on the day of Pentecost when the cloven tongues as of fire sat upon each of the disciples and they were filled with the Holy Ghost. Thereafter the fire of God's Word went forth through the apostles and consumed pagan religions, conquering and to conquer. Truly, He "maketh his ministers a flame of fire." Heb. 1:7. A flame is that which carries the heat, so the ministers carry the Word to the people. When the gospel of Christ is believed to the saving of the soul, the holy fire begins to burn on the altar of the heart, and will continue to burn as long as we keep walking in the light. We are exhorted to be fervent in spirit, serving the Lord.

John the Baptist kindled the fire. Christ Himself is the Word which was made flesh and dwelt among us. The disciples were baptized with fire, and according to the commission, they spread the fire to all the then-known world. Nothing could stand before it. Notice how it affected the early Church, the one which Christ Himself established in wondrous perfection. The holy fire made a com-

plete division and separation between the church and the world. Sin and the works of the devil were eradicated from the hearts of His people. A clear line of distinction was drawn "between the righteous and wicked, between him that serveth God, and him that serveth him not." (Mal. 3:18). At the very time it made division, it also knit together the believers, insomuch that they were in one accord in one body, with one faith and one Lord. Hangers-on and cold professors was no problem in those days, because men were afraid to join themselves to them. The fire of the gospel under the anointing of the Holy Ghost has the same effect today. It will sweep away the refuge of lies to which people are clinging.

We are now living in an age when so-called Christians have decided that the line between the world and the church need not be so wide and distinct. The majority of the theatre-going crowd have their names on the sect church books. Nominal Christians and the worldlings go hand in hand. Untold numbers live in open violation to the Bible in regard to their conversation, dress, and manner of life on many points. Hear what God's unchanging Word says, "If any man love the world (worldly ways) the love of the Father is not in him." His Word cannot be side-stepped.

God's church is full of fire. He is displeased with anything less. The Church at Laodicea was not hot, but lukewarm; therefore, He said, "I will spue thee out of my mouth." (Rev. 3:16.)

The exclusiveness of God's people is becoming an unpopular doctrine with many who once took the narrow way. At one time they were careful to obey all of God's Word and rejoiced in it, but now they refer to certain practices as "trivial matters" and "no harm." "Whom the Son makes free is free indeed," and we are not in bondage to the world or man in any form. The Lord does not intend for His people to "pledge support" to any man-made program, even though it may be called Christian. To many, the "fundamental difference" has become very dim between the churches of the world and the church of God. It is sad to realize that those who lose their vision will eventually be given "a unanimous vote of confidence and recognition among" the worldly churches.

"But Rather Division"

What the people need today, is a radical division—from the world— the kind that Jesus taught and established.—L. D. Pruitt.

Jesus said, "Suppose ye that I am come to give peace on earth? I tell you, Nay; but rather division." He meant just what He said. He who is the author of peace and unity came to make division. have heard much about the unity which Jesus prayed and died for, all of which is true and proper, but in this text is brought to view the fact that He came to bring division. Do His teachings conflict? No! There is a division which God favors, and on the authority of God's Word we can say further that there is a division which God demands of His people. The extent of this division is expressed in the words of Jesus, "They (His people) are not of the world, even as I am not of the world." John 17: 14. In the text Jesus said, "For from henceforth there shall be five in one house divided, three against two and two against three." In the New Testament we have three records where there were divisions among the people because of Jesus and His teachings.

THE GREAT NEED OF THE MINISTERS "More Humility and Prayer"

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For a long period before Christ's first advent, there was no direct spiritual division. In other words, practically all people were given to heathen worship and enslaved to the power of sin. In that sense, the devil had unity in his kingdom. Yet in due time there appeared on earth a direct opposing force in the person of Jesus Christ who was given all power both in heaven and in earth. The devil's kingdom was disrupted and divided. A people was called out to compose Christ's kingdom. Down through the years since that time, Christ has been making division. People have been and are being separated from the spirit and love of the world.

I notice in the Word of God that Jesus prayed after some of the greatest things He did while in His ministry, and when people had the most to say about Him or praised Him most.

This division which Christ brought also unifies His people. When one is separated from the devil's kingdom and made a new creature in Christ Jesus, he automatically becomes associated in spirit and experience with all others who likewise have been Matt. 14:14: "And Jesus went forth and saw a great multitude and was moved with compassion toward them, and healed their sick." Here we see Jesus, our example, having sorrow for the suffering people, and He healed them. Following this was one of the great miracles of His ministry—feeding five thousand men, besides the women and children, with five barley loaves and two small fishes. (verses 15-20). When the people witnessed this miracle, they were filled with excitement. Insomuch John tells us: "When Jesus therefore, perceived that they would come and take him by force, to make him a king, he departed again into a mountain himself alone." John 6:14. (Read also, 5-14 verses). You may ask why He went into the mountain alone. The

word says "He went there to pray." Mark 6:46. My dear brethren, here would have been a good place for our Master to have stayed around the crowd to have received some praise from man, and thus exalted Himself, because it was said of Him: "But was, in all points, tempted as we are, yet without Heb. 4:15. Oh, praise His name for the perfect example! After His great success, He wanted to be alone in secret prayer. When prayer was over, we see Him coming, with great victory again, walking on the sea. (John 6:19). Dear ones, as I search into the life of our Master and see the character and manner of His life, truly, my soul cries out: "Oh, Lord, help me to keep hid away with Christ in God." Dear ones, holiness means freedom from sin. It brings heart purity, complete deliverance from all the elements of sin. It is the destruction of "the old man" and body of sin, being brought back to the image of Him who created us. As Paul says, "And have put on the new man, which is renewed in knowledge after the image of him that created him." Colossians 3:10. But perfect holiness in entire Sanctification does not destroy our humanity. We still have our likes and dislikes, our natural dispositions; and too, we are subject to temptations, trials, discouragements, and, if not on our guard, may fall. Here is where the prayer life comes in. Every day, every hour, yes, all of the time we need to come to the throne of grace, that we may find grace to help in time of trouble. Here is where we receive protection, guidance with the Spirit warning, when danger is near-have triumphant victory over all the foe. At no time do we need protection and a fresh supply of humility and grace, as when we have visible victory and when God's power has been manifested in a special way. There are times when we have good success, (and, brethren, we are conscious of the fact) God has helped us in a wonderful way to preach the Word, and, as a result, the altars are filled with seekers. At the close of the service, people come to us saying, "My, that was a wonderful sermon, my brother (or sister), how the Lord is using you! You surely gave out the truth tonight. I never heard a better sermon, etc." How easy it is to swell up and get exalted. This is the time, when we need to take ourselves away to the secret place of prayer. Then we should take the attitude of Joseph, when he said, "It is not in me: God shall give Pharaoh an answer of peace." Gen. 41:16. (Also, read Dan. 2:28.) Paul says: "I am not worthy to be called an apostle and am less than the least of all saints." Dear ones, it takes prayer, much humble prayer, to stay in the back ground. I have, and no doubt you have, heard preachers tell how, when they preached, this or that was done, or when so and so was healed. May the God of all love help us to keep hid away. Some will boast of their humility,

but you can find them out real soon, when differences arise. Under no condition can you get them to obey Matt. 5:23; 18:15, and yet, they will tell you, in the face of all facts, that they are doing all they can for God. I pray the Lord to help us to be a ministry of love and really possessing Bible humility.

Dear ones, have we really the humble heart that we want people to think we have? Do we, with all our heart, have the example to say to the people, or rather to the saints, "Follow me, as I follow Christ?" or is there a self-centered spirit about us that we fear lest some other brother be more in demand than we are. Truly, we trust all the dear ministers are free on these lines, and seeking for a closer walk with God, with a heart full of love for a clean work for God.

To the making of sects there seems to be no end, and one cause of this is that men's faith becomes weak and they think they have to have some kind of an organization of their own; not willing to trust all with the Lord and just let God add to or take from as He sees the condition of heart, not willing to trust the Holy Ghost with the organization part; and seeing the low congregational standard in comparison to the "Blood bought Church" which is without spot or wrinkle, they lose sight of the heavenly visible Church and begin to talk about the invisible church which they hope some day will be visible. We are aware of the fact that this is a time when God is shaking, shifting, and sifting, and many are being shaken out and their spiritual eyes are growing dim and will soon be put out as Samson's were, and they will be grinding for the Philistines. To many, this is a very cloudy day and they cannot see the visible Church of God which is the pillar and the ground of the truth shining in her glory. However, she is shining just the same and will shine more and more unto the perfect day. gather force and brightness as days go on, and many companies, cliques, and clans will drift into worldliness and formality, and in time become dark sects: but the humble and true saints that keep unspotted from the world will be His "Jewels" (Mal. 3:17), the true Church of God, and they will shine in His Kingdom and be caught up at His coming. (1 Thes. 4:17). We have received a Kingdom that cannot be moved (Heb 12:28), and the gates of hell cannot prevail against the Church that Jesus set up (Matt. 16:18). Lately, we have come into contact with some who have attended "Bible Schools" which have a high reputation among reputed holiness people, and from what they say and others have told us, the standard of spirituality weakens and becomes very low in those places. It becomes easy for the teachers, having not the Holy Ghost, to put their own private interpretation on the scriptures (2 Pet. 1:20) and deceive and lead innocent souls astray, causing them to lean to their own understanding in place of what God would give. I am fully persuaded that if God calls any one to preach His gospel, to teach His Word, or work in heathen lands, He will fit and qualify them for this place without special human aid from "would-be fathers." The Lord Himself will be our teacher and the Comforter whom he will send will lead and guide us into all truth, and in all work He would have us do. (John 16:8 and 16:13.) Many a poor soul had a good experience and could preach under the anointing of the Spirit before going to "Bible School," but after going to school and having his mental faculties crammed full of doctrines he became worthless, as far as preaching Holy Ghost conviction on souls is concerned. For a display of intellect and a show of numbers was uppermost in his heart and mind. No, dear readers, I am not in favor of "Bible Schools," not even "puppy" Bible Schools.

Many souls today who claim to be in the "Church of God" are lamenting their spiritual leanness and inactivity of the Spirit in them, and they seem to wonder why this is. The Bible will instruct and correct us if we will heed its teaching. In Gal. 6:7 we read, "Be not deceived, God is not mocked: for whatsoever a man soweth, that shall he also reap." If you sow to the flesh, you cannot expect the Spirit life of Jesus to increase in your soul. Those who are not careful to keep the teachings of God's word will be sowing to the flesh and that kind of sowing will grieve and kill out the tender loving Spirit of Christ, for they are contrary one to the other. Some get at ease in Zion and in this way sow to the flesh; for God says in His word, "Woe unto those that are at ease in Zion." Another will get so busy at secular work, laboring for perishable things, that they will neglect prayer, and reading of His word. Others will begin to put on adornments and dress in fashion to please the worldly minded and thereby disobey the teachings of His word. (Rom. 12:2 and 1 Tim. 2:9). Mothers will dress their little girls like the world with short skirts and bare legs, killing their modesty and starting them on the way to vulgar uncleanness. Many will not give of the means the Lord allows them to have and become selfish and covetous. All these things and many other wrongs which people do, weakens, wounds, and grieves the Spirit, for such works show no love to, and faith in God. Jesus says, "If ye love me, keep my command-Paul says, "Now the just shall live by faith: but if any man draw back, my soul shall have no pleasure in him." Heb. 10:38. We read in the second chapter of Hebrews, and third verse, "How shall we escape, if we neglect so great salvation." Brother, Sister, let the word of God correct you, sow unto the Spirit and put to death the clamorings of the flesh. "If we sow unto the Spirit we shall reap life everlasting."

Pray for us and pray for those left at the office while we are away. Ask God to supply them, that the tracts and papers may continue to go forth in a steady stream to all pars of the world. Remember, we are praying for you. Our burden is to see souls saved and that they grow in grace and knowledge of the Lord. A never fading crown is awaiting the faithful.

God's Ministry

The prophet Joel said, "And it shall come to pass afterward, that I will pour out my Spirit upon all flesh: and your sons and your daughters shall prophesy (preach or fortell future events), your old men shall dream dreams, your young men shall see visions." Joel 2:28. Because of this outpouring, men and women got under conviction and got saved, then the same Holy Spirit called men and women to the ministry and qualified them. The qualification of those ministers, according to Titus, was: "If any be blameless, the husband of one wife, having faithful children, not accused of riot or unruly," Titus 1:6, "For a bishop must be blameless." The commission given them, was to go into all the world, and they were to teach them to observe all things (all the teachings of the Bible); and if they did this, the promise "I am with you alway even unto the end of the world" was theirs. These ministers were to have power over all the enemy—they were to cast out devils, heal the sick and raise the dead (Matt. 10th chapter). They were to see eye to eye, all speak the same thing, and to be perfectly joined together in the same mind and the same judgment. Hence, the result was real Bible unity.

God's ministers have the burden of lost souls on their hearts—kind and tender hearted, yet firm; not double minded, but patient toward all men, striving together.

We are to know them that labor among us and are over us in the Lord. I am much convinced that this means to know their doctrinal teaching as well as their spiritual condition. If this were adhered to, there would be less disturbance among the saints of God. God's ministers love each other, and in much love and confidence stand together, in honor preferring the other ministers—none puffed up against each other. This grace carried out among the ministry will find its way among the lay members and they, too, will have the same feeling toward each other.

Judgment rendered in one state is always (or should be) recognized by the ministers in other

states. There has been a slackness on some of these lines, to the detriment of spirituality, and making division in different places. God's ministers are ambassadors of the Kingdom of peace, and represent the law of Heaven here on earth, and what they bind here will be bound in heaven. That is, the truth so preached here will bind souls out of Heaven, or land them in that Heavenly mansion prepared for those who love and obey God. Holy Ghost judgment will either draw or drive, kill or make alive.

God's ministry have the vision of His pure church, and can show the difference between the body of Christ and Babylon. I am sorry to have to say it, but some professed ministers have lost the vision (Prov. 29:18) of God's clean, pure church, and are holding up man-made creeds as being as good. That it, they are free to worship with the creedal systems of man, claiming they have fellowship with them, these sects. There has been a slackness among the ministry in showing up the evils of sectism. We can get so tender toward them that our preaching will shield them instead of helping them see the evils they are doing. God's judgments are both goodness and severity, and these two truths make a clean, pure work, free from all lopsidedness; and believers of this sort make up the pure church. "All love" will, if carried out to excess will allow crookedness to thrive under our labors. Real love will make a minister declare the whole counsel and even when he lays "judgment to the line" against crookedness, he does it in love with a pure heart fervently.

Ministers of God, let us stand together-we on the Pacific coast work with the ministers on the Atlantic or Midwest. What judgments are rendered on one coast, let us recognize them on the other. This will vitally affect unity and confidence among the ministry. I have written these things with a heart full of love for all, and not intending to hurt any, or thrust at any one, but to help us all to be more careful, and to make better co-laborers together for the work of the ministry. I plead with God's ministry, that each one of us endeavors to keep the unity of the Spirit in the bonds of peace. True, we will have to do some submitting (not compromise) and some self-denial among ourselves, or a modern term would be, "Give and take." can be done without any spiritual let-downs, or without sacrificing any principles of truth. Some times we may be fearful in submitting ourselves to each other, but there is no need for alarm, for God never said to submit truth, but "yourselves." This may mean one's orinions, but we can freely do this so long as a principle of truth is not involved. What is needed, is more real love of God in the heart, which will iron out many things. -E. M. Zinn.

EDITORIALS

The Apostle Paul wrote some admonitions to the church at Corinth, and in closing he said, "I write not these things to shame you, but as my beloved sons I warn you. For though ye have ten thousand instructors in Christ, yet have ye not many fathers: for in Christ Jesus I have begotten you through the gospel." In this we see the fatherly attitude in which he warned those who had been saved through his labors. There seemed to be a great number of instructors in Christ, but not many fathers in the gospel. With love and special care the father warns his sons. He pleads, persuades, and entreats, yet does not withhold any truth that they need.

Paul took special notice of the young workers in the early church. For instance, he wrote two letters to the young minister, Timothy. In one letter he addresses Timothy as "my own son in the faith," and we notice the many points of advice given in both letters. He encouragingly says, "Wherefore I put thee in remembrance that thou stir up the gift of God, which is in thee by the putting on of my hands:" and another time he says, "Neglect not the gift that is in thee, which was given thee by prophecy, with laying on of the hands of the

presbytery." This instruction should be obeyed by all who have received a gift from the Lord. It is for the profit and increase of God's cause among men.

Here is another injunction given to Timothy and to all preachers: "Preach the word; be instant in season, out of season; reprove, rebuke, exhort with all longsuffering and doctrine. For the time will come when they will not endure sound doctrine." After setting forth many truths, Paul says, "If thou put the brethren in remembrance of these things, thou shalt be a good minister of Jesus Christ." "And the things that thou hast heard of me among many witnesses, the same commit thou to faithful men who shall be able to teach others also." Here he expresses a desire to perpetuate God's Word and work in the earth by telling this young minister to commit these truths to faithful men who shall be able to teach others. Therefore, today it is very necessary that the young saints of the church be "nourished up in the words of faith and of good doctrine," so that in the future church there will be no place for compromise or fanaticism to take root. We are thankful for fathers in the gospel, but there is a wide field for many more. ---- oOo ---

- 1 Kings 12:1. And Rehoboam went to Shechem: for all Israel were come to Shechem to make him king.
- 2. And it came to pass, when Jereboam the son of Nebat, who was yet in Egypt, heard of it, (for he was fled from the presence of king Solomon, and Jeroboam dwelt in Egypt;)
- 3. That they sent and called him. And Jeroboam and all the congregation of Israel came, and spake unto Rehoboam, saying,
- 4. Thy father made our yoke grievous: now therefore make thou the grievous service of thy father, and his heavy yoke which he put upon us, lighter, and we will serve thee.
- 5. And he said unto them, Depart yet for three days, then come again to me. And the people departed.
- 12. So Jeroboam and all the people came to Rehoboam the third day, as the king had appointed, saying, Come to me again the third day.
- 13. And the king answered the people roughly, and forsook the old men's counsel that they gave him;
- 14. And spake to them after the counsel of the young men, saying, My father made your yoke heavy, and I will add to your yoke: my father also chastized you with whips, but I will chastize you with scorpions.
- 15. Wherefore the king hearkened not unto the people; for the cause was from the Lord, that he might perform his saying, which the Lord spake by Ahijah the Shilonite unto Jeroboam the son of Nebat.
- 16. So when all Israel saw that the king hearkened not unto them, the people answered the king, saying, What portion have we in David? neither have we inheritance in the son of Jesse: to your tents, O Israel: now see to thine own house David. So Israel departed unto their tents.
- 17. But as for the children of Israel which dwelt in the cities of Judah, Rehoboam reigned over them.
- 20. And it came to pass, when all Israel heard that Jeroboam was come again, that they sent and called him unto the congregation, and made him king over all Israel: there was none that followed the house of David, but the tribe of Judah only.

- 3. For he took away the altars of the strange gods, and the high places, and brake down the images, and cut down the groves:
- 4. And commanded Judah to seek the Lord God of their fathers, and to do the law and the commandment.
- 5. Also he took away out of all the cities of Judah the high places and the images: and the kingdom was quiet before him.
- 6. And he built fenced cities in Judah: for the land had rest, and he had no war in those years; because the Lord had given him rest.
- 7. Therefore he said unto Judah, Let us build these cities, and make about them walls, and towers, gates, and bars, while the land is yet before us; because we have sought the Lord our God, we have sought him, and he hath given us rest on every side. So they built and prospered.
- 8. And Asa had an army of men that bare targets and spears, out of Judah three hundred thousand; and out of Benjamin, that bare shields and drew bows, two hundred and fourscore thousand: all these were mighty men of valor.
- 9. And there came out against them Zerah the Ethiopian with an host of a thousand thousand, and three hundred chariots; and came unto Mareshah.
- 10. Then Asa went out against him, and they set the battle in array in the valley of Zephathah at Mareshah.
- 11. And Asa cried unto the Lord his God, and said, Lord, it is nothing with thee to help, whether with many, or with them that have no power: help us, O Lord our God; for we rest on thee, and in thy name we go against this multitude. O Lord, thou art our God; let not man prevail against thee.
- 12. So the Lord smote the Ethiopians before Asa, and before Judah; and the Ethiopians fled.

- 3. And the Lord was with Jehoshaphat, because he walked in the first ways of his father David, and sought not unto Baalim;
- 4. But sought to the Lord God of his father, and walked in his commandments, and not after the doings of Israel.
- 5. Therefore the Lord stablished the kingdom in his hand; and all Judah brought to Jehoshaphat presents; and he had riches and honour in abundance.
- 6. And his heart was lifted up in the ways of the Lord: moreover he took away the high places and groves out of Judah.
- 9. And they taught in Judah, and had the book of the law of the Lord with them, and went about throughout all the cities of Judah, and taught the people.
- 10. And the fear of the Lord fell upon all the kingdoms of the lands that were round about Judah, so that they made no war against Jehoshaphat.
- 11. Also some of the Philistines brought Jehoshaphat presents, and tribute silver; and the Arabians brought him flocks, seven thousand and seven hundred rams, and seven thousand and seven hundred he goats.
- 12. And Jehoshaphat waxed great exceedingly; and he built in Judah castles, and cities of store.

- 31. And Elijah took twelve stones, according to the number of the tribes of the sons of Jacob, unto whom the word of the Lord came, saying, Israel shall be thy name:
- 32. And with the stones he built an altar in the name of the Lord: and he made a trench about the altar, as great as would contain two measures of seed.
- 33. And he put the wood in order, and cut the bullock in pieces, and laid him on the wood, and said, Fill four barrels with water, and pour it on the burnt sacrifice, and on the wood.

- 8. And it was so, when Elisha the man of God had heard that the king of Israel had rent his clothes, that he sent to the king, saying, Wherefore hast thou rent thy clothes? let him come now to me, and he shall know that there is a prophet in Israel.
- 9. So Naaman came with his horses and with his chariot, and stood at the door of the house of Elisha.
- 10. And Elisha sent a messenger unto him, saying, Go and wash in Jordon seven times, and thy flesh shall come again to thee, and thou shalt be clean.
- 14. Then went he down, and dipped himself seven times in Jordon, according to the saying of the man of God: and his flesh came again like unto the flesh of a little child, and he was clean.

- 2 Chron. 26:3. Sixteen years old was Uzziah when he began to reign, and he reigned fifty and two years in Jerusalem. His mother's name also was Jecoliah of Jerusalem.
- 4. And he did that which was right in the sight of the Lord, according to all that his father Amaziah did.
- 5. And he sought God in the days of Zechariah, who had understanding in the visions of God: and as long as he sought the Lord, God made him to prosper.
- 16. But when he was strong, his heart was lifted up to his destruction; for he transgressed against the Lord his God, and went into the temple of the Lord to burn incense upon the altar of incense.
- 17. And Azariah the priest went in after him, and with him fourscore priests of the Lord, that were valiant men:
- 18. And they withstood Uzziah the king, and said unto him, It appertaineth not unto thee, Uzziah, to burn incense unto the Lord, but to the priests the sons of Aaron, that are consecrated to burn incense; go out of the sanctuary; for thou hast trespassed; neither shall it be for thine honour from the Lord God.
- 19. Then Uzziah was wroth, and had a censer in his hand to burn incense: and while he was wroth with the priests, the leprosy even rose up in his forehead before the priests in the house of the Lord, from beside the incense altar.
- 20. And Azariah the chief priest, and all the priests looked upon him, and, behold, he was leprous in his forehead, and they thrust him out from thence; yea, himself hasted also to go out, because the Lord had smitten him.
- 21. And Uzziah the king was a leper unto the day of his death, and dwelt in a several house, being a leper; for he was cut off from the house of the Lord; and Jotham his son was over the king's house, judging the people of the land.
