Redemption

"For the redemption of their soul is precious" Psa. 49:8a. "Thou wast slain, and hast redeemed us to God by thy blood out of every kindred, and tongue, and people, and nation;" Rev. 5:9b. Redeem: to buy back, to recover as property, etc. Every soul that is not redeemed is lost. Every soul in sin is lost. Every soul that will not be redeemed, will be eternally lost. The nature of the redemption plan is such that

no man can redeem himself, nor can any man or number of men redeem another man's soul; "for the redemption of their soul is precious." Being of an eternal and spiritual substance, it can not be redeemed with corruptible things, such as silver and gold, nor any earthly treasure or thing can purchase the redemption of one soul—it is more precious than the enumeration of the wealth of this world. The blood of bulls and goats, and the sprinkling of the ashes of heifers, and such sacrifices can never take away sins. They cannot remove the guilt of a defiled and

polluted conscience. The Jews had toiled for years to eradicate themselves from the entanglements and bondage of sin, by making sacrifice after sacrifice, but could not thereby reach their goal, neither was the mind of God satisfied. The scripture says, "Sacrifice and offering thou wouldst not, but a body hast thou prepared me . . . Then said I, Lo, I come (in the volume of the book it is written of me) to do thy will, O God." Isaiah breaks forth in prophetic language, saying, "Say to them that are of a fearful heart, Be strong, fear not: behold, your God will come with vengeance, even God with a recompence; he will come and save you." Isa. 35:4. Zacharias, being filled with the Holy Ghost prophesied, saying, "Blessed be the Lord God of Israel; for he hath visited and redeemed his people." Luke 1:68. Again we read, "Surely, he hath borne our griefs, and carried our sorrows: yet we did esteem him stricken, smitten of God, and afflicted. But he was wounded for our transgressions, he was bruised for our iniquities: the chastisement of our peace was upon him; and with his stripes we are healed." Isa. 53: 4-5. When Jesus had accomplished all things according to the scripture for the perfection of the salvation of the souls of men, while yet on the cross, he cried, "It is finished," and he bowed his head and gave up the ghost." Later, "they pierced his side, and forthwith came there out blood and water." That cleansing fountain was opened; the price of man's salvation was paid. We are not our own, for we are bought with a price; not with corruptible things, "But with the precious blood of Christ as of a lamb without blemish and without spot." 1 Pet. 1:19. And "there is no other name given under heaven among men" through which we may be saved, or redeemed, only through the mighty name of Jesus. Wherefore, John says, "Thou art worthy. . . for thou wast slain, and has redeemed us to God by thy blood out of every kindred, and tongue, and people, and nation." Rev. 5:9 Amen.

Jesus has finished his part, but there remains a responsibility upon each individual. Jesus said, "Except ye repent, ye shall all likewise perish"; "As ye go, preach, saying, Repent, for the kingdom of heaven is at hand." It is the goodness of God that leadeth to repentance. Godly sorrow worketh repentance not to be repented of." "Let the wicked forsake his way and the unrighteous man his thoughts, and let him return unto the Lord, and he will have mercy upon him and to our God for he will abundantly pardon" Isa. 55:7. If the wicked "turn from his sins and do that which is lawful and right; If the wicked restore the pledge, give again that which he hath robbed, walk in the statutes of life without committing iniquity; he shall surely live, he shall not die." Ezek. 33:15. When an individual hears the word of God, and realizes that his life is out of order with the same, if he will repent, make his wrongs right, call upon God for mercy, in faith believing, God will

for Christ's sake save him or grant him pardon or forgiveness of sins; "For whosoever shall cal upon the name of the Lord shall be saved." "For by grace are ye saved, through faith; and that not of yourselves: it is the gift of God" Eph. 2:8. "Saved from sin today, every band is riven, I am a child of God." It is a wonderful experience, a glorious realization when the Spirit of God witnesses to ou spirit that we are a child of God. Condemnation has passed, no more guilt remains, a new song is ours to sing, we are happy and free. Yet there remains another step to be taken, a deeper grace to be sought and obtained—the experience of entire sanctification, which experience we do not receive at the time our sins are forgiven. Sanctification is a second definite experience, wrought in the heart by the Holy Ghost. Its purpose is to remove, or eradicate the Adamic nature, depraved nature, the carnal man, the tree that the heavenly Father hath not planted, the prone to wander, the bent to evil, from the heart or soul of the believer; and to purify the heart and fill it with the presence and power of the Holy Spirit, which Jesus tells us the heavenly Father is more willing to give to them that ask him than parents are to give good gifts unto their children. This is part of the redemption plan. Jesus prayed that all believers be sanctified. We read in St. John 17th chapter and 17th through the 21st verse: "Sanctify them through thy truth, thy word is truth, as thou has sent me into the world, even so have I also sent them into the world, and for their sakes I sanctify myself, that they also might be sanctified through the truth. Neither pray I for these alone, but for them also which shall believe on me through their word: that they all may be one; as thou Father, art in me, and I in thee, that they also may be one in us: that the world may believe that thou has sent me." "Wherefore, Jesus also, that he might sanctify the people with his own blood, suffered without the gate" Heb. 13:12. Jesus said, "If ye love me, keep my commandments, and I will pray the Father, and he shall give you another Comforter that he may abide with you forever, even the Spirit of truth whom the world can not receive." But when the Comforter is come, whom I shall send unto you from the Father, even the Spirit of truth, which proceedeth from the the Father, he shall testify of me; and ye also shall bear witness." Then can we sing: "We have a hope within our soul, brighter than the perfect day: God has given us his Spirit and we want the world to hear it, all the doubts have passed away." Thank God for that blessed hope. "If we hope for that we see not, then do we with patience wait for it." Sometimes we groan as we linger and wait for the adoption, to wit the redemption fo our bodies, being compassed about with afflictions and infirmities under the bondage of corruption, subject to death and decay. Sometimes with aching heart and tear dimmed eyes; but we know we have another building, a house not made with hands, eternal in the heavens. It will be joy unspeakable when we shall be enraptured by the great mysterical change when this corruptible shall have put on incorruption, and this mortal shall have put on immortality, and death shall have been swallowed up in victory. Paul says, "We shall not all sleep, but we shall all be changed," and be "caught up together with them in the clouds to meet the Lord in the air, and so shall we ever be with the Lord," and redeemed by his side we shall stand. Have you ever been redeemed?

Webster's definition of **pride** is: "feeling of inordinate self-esteem; haughtiness; generous elevation of heart; self-esteem springing from consciousness of worth; etc. Prideful, full of pride, scornful." The Bible concordance definition of **pride** is: "unreasonable conceit."

Now if you are one that believes there is no wrong or sin in being proud (having pride) and that pride is really necessary in your social life, and gives you recognition among the better class of society; just run all the references on the word pride in the dictionary and Bible. If you are really interested in your soul, and have any desire to be saved, I am most sure that you will change your mind and pray God to take the sin of pride out of your heart; for there is where it is located. Read St. Mark 7:21, 22. "For from within, out of the heart of men, proceed evil thoughts, adulteries, fornication, murders, thefts, covetousness, wickedness, deceit, lasciviousness, an evil eye, blasphemy, PRIDE, foolishness." 23 concludes by saying: "All these evil things come from within and defile the man." You can see by the foregoing scripture that pride is classed with some very bad companions. "Every one who is proud in heart is an abomination to the Lord; though hand join in hand, he shall not be unpunished." Prov 16:5.

I seem to hear some of you say, "I am not proud. I have no pride like the worldly people have. I dress, powder, and primp so that I will look clean and decent and be recognized by good society." Being clean and decent in dress is proper, but following after the worldly fashions and customs is not proper nor right for a Christian to do; and if you are really a child of God, and the "Holy Spirit" is leading you, you will not have any desire to dress, bob your hair, pluck eye brows, paint lips, fingernails, etc. like the worldly women do. I want to add that men who like to gaze at half-nude women and feel no shame, but think it smart and cute to look like a half-picked peacock are just as guilty as the women.

Pride is one of the fruits of the carnal nature,

or fleshly lusts, and will defile and damn your soul •just the same as all the other sins spoken of in the 21st and 22nd verses of Mark 7. You may try to excuse yourself by saying: "I don't feel condemned for the way I dress." There is where Satan has you deceived-you are following after feelings instead of God's word and the Holy Spirit; and in most cases your preacher has his lips (and heart too, I fear) sealed with Satan's sealing wax: viz., keep mum on non-essentials; such as, dress, attending shows, ball games, etc. False teachers will hear the awful denunciation: "Depart from me, ye workers of iniquity, I never knew you." God says, "Come out from among them, and be ye separate, saith the Lord, and touch not the unclean thing; and I will receive you, and will be a father unto you, and ye shall be my sons and daughters, saith the Lord Almighty." Notice this: We are made children of God on the condition that we are separated from the world. Read 1 John 1:15, Some people say that it doesn't matter how much we primp and attire these bodies so long as our hearts are right. Do not let Satan deceive you with such ideas; for in the first place, if your heart is right (no pride in it) you would not have any desire to conform to the world in dress or any other thing of a worldly nature. The only cure for pride and all sin is a heart full of pure religion (Jas. 1:27) taken by faith, believing that the blood of Jesus cleanseth from all sin, and by obeying His word and letting the Holy Spirit lead, we can live soberly, righteously, and godly in this present world, Amen.

Editorials

•If Christendom was ever in "Babel confusion," it must be now, for numerous doctrines and winds of doctrines are everywhere in evidence. "Schisms" and "isms" are multiplying all the time. This condition is sickening and disgusting to the child of God who is clearly enlightened by the Holy Spirit dwelling in the heart. It is not only grievous to the child of God, but is wholly contrary to the Word of God. If you will turn and read the tenth verse of the first chapter of 1 Corinthians, you will see how strongly the Apostle Paul condemned it in its infancy. He says, "I beseech you, brethren, by the name of our Lord Jesus Christ, that ye all speak the same thing, and that there be no divisions among you; but that ye be perfectly joined together in the same mind and in the same judgment." He reproved them for making division, and asked, "Is Christ divided?" The answer implied is, NO.

Those who have darkness enough in their souls to think that the body of Christ is divided and scattered into all different sects are only aiding the devil in hindering the answering of Jesus' prayer in St. John, 17th chapter, 21st verse, which reads: "That they all may be one; as thou, Father, art in me, and I in thee, that they also may be one in us; that the world may believe that thou hast sent me."

Christendom, being in this confused and divided state, makes many infidels, for the world can see no Christ in such actions, and the lives of most professors are no better than the ordinary sinner who makes no profession of religion.

Some one said that we preach the Church more than Christ. Such talk only betrays the darkness in the soul of the speaker, because preaching and teaching the oneness of believers and the divine organization and government of the church, is lifting up and exalting Christ in the highest sense, for the Church is the spiritual body of the Lord Jesus Christ, which is functioning in the world today. (Eph. 1:22, 23.) The inspired Word of God is full of references to the church from cover to cover. In fact, Christ is the beginning of the Church in this grace dispensation. He is the chief Corner Stone (Eph. 1:10), and Paul speaks of Him as being the "first born." Peter says, in speaking to the brethren, "Ye also, as lively stones are built up a spiritual house." 1 Peter 2:5. A house is not something that is divided. says that Christ sets the members in the body as it pleases Him. (1 Cor. 12:18). So the house or Church is built by Jesus himself. Man has nothing to do with it. In Ephesians, the last part of the second chapter, we find that Jesus is the chief corner stone, and that all the building (not part of it) is fitly framed together and groweth into an holy temple. He says, "In whom ye (saved men and women), are builded together (not apart), for an habitation of

God through the Spirit."

If you were going to build a house, and part of your lumber or material was entangled and tied up to strong literal objects in various parts of the country, you could never build the structure until you first got your material loose from those objects. So, also, it is with Christ building His spiritual house. He can only fit and frame material into His building as they loosen from all man-made churches and other worldly objects. Then He can fit them in, and they can begin to function freely in the one true body, the house of God, which is the Church of God, the pillar and ground of the truth. (1 Tim. 3:15).

We believe and teach that all sects are unscriptural; and, being unscriptural and false, they are necessarily filled up with much false teaching which keeps the honest at heart separated from the true church, and aids Satan in hindering the prayer of Jesus that they all be one as He and the Father are one.

If honest souls would separate themselves from all sects and the opinions of men and just abide in Christ alone, it would be easy for Him to teach them the truth and to fit and frame them into the true Church or tabernacle which the Lord has pitched and not man. (Heb. 8:2).

"The House of God, which is the Church of the living God, the pillar and ground of the truth," is an exclusive divinely organized institution, separate from the world and all man-made organizations, has been purchased by His innocent blood (Acts 20:28), and she is without spot or wrinkle (Eph. 5:27), no sinner or unclean thing is in her. No one with a lion nature or a ravenous beast nature is there (Isa, Those with the lion-like natures, when in 35:9). their natural state, will be cleansed by the blood of the Lamb, and be made lamb-like to fit into the true Church. Thus the prophet has said, "The wolf also shall dwell with the lamb, and the leopard shall lie down with the kid; and the calf and the young lion and the fatling together; and a little child shall lead them" Isa. 11:6. Read the verses before this one in the chapter, and you shall see that the prophet has reference to the work of Christ when he appears in the flesh and begins to preach the gospel of the Kingdom. The man who is cleansed by the blood has lost that wolf nature and begins to rest in the Kingdom of God with His lambs. Likewise, the man with a leopard and lion nature lies down with the lambs.

In speaking of the disciples to the Father, Jesus said, "They are not of the world, even as I am not of the world" John 17:16. In the 20th verse, he says, "Neither pray I for these alone, but for them also which shall believe on me through their word." That includes all who are saved today. I am persuad-

ed that every saved soul who remains honest and retains the love of God in his soul, will do all in his power to answer Jesus' prayer. In the next verse, Jesus prayed: "That they all may be one in us: that the world may believe that thou hast sent me." Allowing objects or material things in this world to separate you from God's exclusive family, is a sin. Man-made organizations (called churches), lodges, worldly society, and following the fashions and fads of the world will separate you from God's family and damn your soul.

Paul sharply rebuked this divisional spirit in its infancy, and God's wrath is upon such today. Teachers, ministers, and writers who say that God's children are scattered in all these divisions, sects, or denominations; and in that state constitute the Church that Jesus built; and that there is no exclusive Church separate from all these divisions, are only aiding Satan in getting souls into sects which are the gates of hell. Ministers who preach Christ, the man, will succeed in getting many souls into sects, but ministers who are in full light and preach the Church which is the spiritual body of Christ in this world and show its oneness, its divine organization, and its divine government, will succeed in getting souls in the one fold which is Christ, and into the House of God, which is the Church of the Living God, the pillar and ground of the truth, and is the gate to heaven.

While here upon earth, Christ was in a fleshly body, and it is written: "And the word was made flesh and dwelt among us, (and we beheld his glory, the glory as of the only begotten of the Father) full of grace and truth." John 1:14. He also said that he was not of this world even though he was here in a Yet his life, strength, wisdom, and fleshly body. power came down from God, and Jesus, the man, was just merely a house of clay for the God-life from heaven. Just so, the true church is in fleshly bodies in this world and is a separate and visible body of people which are from heaven and are not of this world even as Christ and the disciples were not of the world. Their life, strength, wisdom, and power come from above. There is a wide breach between them and the world, for the life of the world is ruled and governed by Satar, and the life of God in his people are ruled and governed by God. Therefore, the "Battle of Armageddon" is raging today between Satan and his religious forces these two forces. will use carnal weapons, if need be, and all kinds of trickery-lying and different forms of spiritual deceptions: such as, making a show of being pious, and setting in motion great revivals, and assuming the name of the church, building great and expensive edifices to house its multitudes. On the other hand, God's subjects are innocent, harmless, and undefiled. Their weapons are not carnal, but mighty through God to the pulling down of strong holds, casting down

imaginations, and everything that exalts itself against God (2 Cor. 10:4, 5). Their sword is the word of God (Eph. 6:17), and they strike the souls of men with burning and fuel of fire (Isa. 9:5), destroying the selfish, carnal, fleshly life of the world, laying bare their hearts before the all-piercing eye of God, helping them to see that, even though they think themselves to be something, they are nothing and are only deceiving themselves. In this way the battle of Armageddon will rage and become more fierce, close, and hot as the few remaining years come and go. Satan is now deceiving the nations and his hosts are becoming more numerous all the time, and the saints are getting less in number; but more and more together. Soon the Church will be shining more, and with greater power, and persecution will be more severe from his religious hosts. When they get so numerous on the breadth of the earth and compass the camp of the saints about—the BELOVED CITY (Rev. 20:9), the church which is New Jerusalem which came down from God out of heaven-then God will send fire down from heaven and devour them. his wife, and others that loved the Lord. They arranged for a meeting that night, and twenty-five or thirty of us were together in service. God was very precious to all of us that night. Consecration

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One of the principal things that leads to success in the Christian life, lies embedded in this one wordconsecration. To be consecrated, means more than just saying that we are. Jesus left us an example while praying in the garden of Gethsemane. He saw the suffering and agony of the crucifixion, and although he knew that for this cause he was born to shed his blood for the sins of the world, he prayed: "If it be possible, let this cup pass from me." It was all right to pray this way, for no doubt God would have answered this prayer if there had been any other way to reconcile the people to Himself. However, I am glad He did not stop praying then, but finished with these words: "Nevertheless, not my will, but Thine be done." He was resigned to his Father's will. That is a perfect pattern of consecration.

How often we pray for something and think that the Lord surely ought to give it to us even in the way we ask Him. Perhaps He is not ready to give it to us yet, because He sees our hearts and knows that we have not reached the place where we can say, "Not my will, but Thine be done." Before we can pray through to definite victory, this must be the supreme desire and purpose of our prayer. We must be willing to let the Lord answer in His own way, whether it be according to our desire or otherwise.

We sing a song which expresses this thought so well:

"You have longed for sweet peace, And for faith to increase; You have earnestly, fervently prayed; But you cannot have rest, And be perfectly blest Until all on the altar is laid."

James 4:3 says that ye ask and receive not because ye ask amiss that ye may consume it upon your lusts. And yet the prayer is closed with these words: "In Jesus' name we ask it." How can it be for Jesus' sake when it is something that would not even glorify Him? We are told that whether we eat or drink, or whatever we do, do ALL to the glory of God. Merely saying words and being entirely consecrated to God are two different things. 

- 19. Every tree that bringeth not forth good fruit hewn down, and cast into the fire.
- 20. Wherefore by their fruits ye shall know them.
- 1 Cor. 10:6. Now these things were our examples, the intent we should not lust after evil things, they also lusted.
- 7. Neither be ye idolaters, as were some of them; is it is written, The people sat down to eat and drink, and rose up to play.

Folden Text: "Ye shall know them by their fruits." Matt. 7:16.

COMMENTS AND APPLICATION

When a vine quits bearing fruit, it is useless; for the wood in it is of no value. Even so, man is useless except when he stays in touch with God that he may bring forth fruit to His glory. Consider the

words: "Behold, when it was whole, it was meet for no work: how much less shall it be meet yet for any work, when the fire hath devoured it." Man in himself is of no value. When he has polluted "burned" his body with intexicants and other things which defile the flesh, he is less than of no value, for he injures others too. It is certain that in that condition he could not bear fruit for God. Jesus said of the unfruitful tree, "Why cumbereth it the ground?" and of the unfruitful branch of the vine that it would be cast forth and be burned.

God only preserves the world in answer to the prayers of His true children, and to give those who have been influenced by their teachings a chance to be saved. Thus the Christian, like salt, has a preserving quality. The world would be putrified in sin and God would destroy it if it were not for the few righteous people in it. If one loses contact with God, he loses that Spirit or "savour," and is thenceforth good for nothing.

Christ is the true light, but Christians are lights, for they reflect the light of Christ, and he shines through them. Others see that it is divine power that causes them to live righteous lives—not their own goodness—and God is glorified.

Read what the "lusts of the flesh" and the "fruits of the Spirit" are in Gal. 5:19-23. Are you bearing the fruits of the Spirit? If so, you are a useful vine to God. Are you fulfilling any of the lusts of the flesh? If so, you are fit for nothing, and will be burned. "He that soweth to the flesh, shall of the flesh reap corruption, but he that soweth to the Spirit, shall of the Spirit reap life everlasting."

Ezek. 33:7. So thou, O son of man, I have set thee a watchmen unto the house of Israel; therefore thou shalt hear the word at my mouth, and warn them from me.

- 8. When I say unto the wicked, O wicked man, thou shalt surely die; if thou dost not speak to warn the wicked from his way, that wicked man shall die in his iniquity; but his blood will I require at thine hand
- 9. Nevertheless, if thou warn the wicked of his way to turn from it; if he do not turn from his way,

he shall die in his iniquity; but thou hast delivered thy soul.

- 10. Therefore, O thou son of man, speak unto the house of Israel; Thus ye speak, saying, If our transgressions and our sins be upon us, and we pine away in them, how should we then live?
- 11. Say unto them, As I live, saith the Lord God, I have no pleasure in the death of the wicked; but that the wicked turn from his way and live; turn ye, turn ye from your evil ways; for why will ye die, O house of Israel?
- 12. Therefore, thou son of man, say unto the children of thy people, The righteousness of the righteous shall not deliver him in the day of his transgression: as for the wickedness of the wicked, he shall not fall thereby in the day that he turneth from his wickedness; neither shall the righteous be able to live for his righteousness in the day that he sinneth.
- 13. When I shall say to the righteous, that he shall surely live; if he trust to his own righteousness and commit iniquity, all his righteousness shall not be remembered; but for his iniquity that he hath committed, he shall die for it.
- 14. Again, when I say unto the wicked, Thou shalt surely die; if he turn from his sin, and do that which is lawful and right;
- 15. If the wicked restore the pledge, give again that he had robbed, walk in the statutes of life, without committing iniquity; he shall surely live, he shall not die.
- 16. None of his sins that he hath committed shall be mentioned unto him: he hath done that which is lawful and right; he shall surely live.

Golden Text: "So then every one of us shall give account of himself to God." Rom. 14:12.

COMMENTS AND APPLICATION

A preacher, or watchman, whom God has placed in charge of a congregation is responsible to God for their welfare to a certain extent. In many places, souls die unconverted because they have not been warned of their sins nor shown the way of salvation by those whom God had appointed to do it. Ministers who are guilty of such neglect will be responsible for every soul that has perished. It is as much the duty of a minister to warn the righteous that he sin not, as it is his duty to warn the sinner to repent of his sins. How can the minister who teaches that one can not fall from grace and perish after he has once been saved, escape the wrath of God on the day of judgment?

People do not always repent when they are warned by faithful ministers, but God will hold nothing against the ministers..

Individuals should not leave the welfare of their souls in the hands of a preacher, for even if God punishes the preacher for leading them astray, each one is personally responsible for his own sins and

will perish, if not saved by the blood of Jesus.

Godly people often share in the calamities set upon nations and innocent children suffer because a sins which the parents have committed, but none and deprived of the favor of God because of the iniquities of others; neither is one granted the favor of God because of the righteousness of others. We are all personally responsible for our own sins. "The sout that sinneth, it shall die."

Notice carefully what God tells a sinner to debefore he can have favor in God's sight. This is a unpopular way with most people of today, but it is God's way. One cannot obtain the eternal life which God alone can give, and go to God's heaven unless he goes God's way.

HAGGAI URGES THE BUILDING OF GOD'S HOUSE Sunday, June 16, 1940

- 4. Is it time for you, O ye, to dwell in your cieled houses, and this house lie waste?
- 5. Now therefore thus saith the Lord of hosts Consider your ways.
- 6. Ye have sown much, and bring in little; ye eat, but ye have not enough; ye drink, but ye are not filled with drink; ye clothe you, but there is none warm; and he that earneth wages earneth wages to put it into a bag with holes.
- 7. Thus saith the Lord of hosts; Consider your ways.
- 8. Go up to the mountain, and bring wood, and build the house; and I will take pleasure in it, and I will be glorified, saith the Lord.
- 9. Ye looked for much, and lo, it came to little, and when ye brought it home, I did blow upon it Why? saith the Lord of hosts. Because of mine house that is waste, and ye run every man unto his own house.
- 10. Therefore the heaven over you is stayed from dew, and the earth is stayed from her fruit.
- 11. And I called for a drought upon the land, and upon the mountains, and upon the corn, and upon the new wine, and upon the oil, and upon that which

the ground bringeth forth, and upon men, and upon cattle, and upon all the labour of the hands.

12. Then Zerubbabel the son of Shealtiel, and Joshua the son of Josedech, the high priest, with all the remnant of the people, obeyed the voice of the Lord their God, and the words of Haggai the prophet, as the Lord their God had sent him, and the people did fear before the Lord.

Golden Text: "And let us consider one another to provoke unto love and to good works: not forsaking the assemblying of ourselves together as the manner of some is." Heb. 10:24, 25.

COMMENTS AND APPLICATION

A number of Jews had returned from captivity in Babylon to Jerusalem. About fourteen years before today's lesson takes place they had rebuilt the foundation of the temple, but the work had been hindered. In the meantime the people had become indifferent about finishing the Lord's house, and had become engrossed in their own selfish pursuits; such as, building fine comfortable houses for themselves.

The Lord warned them through Haggai, that He would not bless the labor of their hands unless they would put Him and His work first.

There is an important lesson in this for all today. People have forgotten Christ in their greed for personal comforts, pleasures, and gain. God warns that "the wicked shall be turned into hell and all nations that forget God," but hell is not the only place where people will be punished for spiritual neglect. God's promise to the Hebrews was: "If ye hearken to these judgments, and keep, and do them, the Lord thy God will love thee, and bless thee, and multiply thee; he will also bless the fruit of thy womb, and the fruit of thy land, . . . Thou shalt be blessed above all people." This promise is also for us, and there is another like it: "Seek ye first the kingdom of God and his righteousness and all these things shall be added unto you" -meaning temporal needs. But notice the condition contained in each promise-put God and his work first. Is it any wonder that we have depressions, famines, and pestilences in our land today?

Meeting together and worshipping with other children of God brings renewed courage and inspiration, and helps us to grow in grace. Christians should not neglect public worship.

- Mal. 3:7. Even from the days of your fathers ye are gone away from mine ordinances, and have not kept them. Return unto me, and I will return unto you, saith the Lord of hosts. But ye said, Wherein shall we return?
- 8. Will a man rob God? Yet ye have robbed me. But ye say, Wherein have we robbed thee? In tithes and offerings.
- 9. Ye are cursed with a curse: for ye have robbed me, even this whole nation.
- 10. Bring ye all the tithes into the storehouse, that there may be meat in mine house, and prove me now herewith, saith the Lord of hosts, if I will not open you the windows of heaven, and pour you out a blessing, that there shall not be room enough to receive it.
- 11. And I will rebuke the devourer for your sakes, and he shall not destroy the fruits of your ground; neither shall your vine cast her fruit before the time in the field, saith the Lord of hosts.
- 12. And all nations shall call you blessed: for ye shall be a delightsome land, saith the Lord of hosts.
- 13. Your words have been stout against me, saith the Lord. Yet ye say, What have we spoken so much against thee?
- 14. Ye have said, It is vain to serve God: and what profit is it that we have kept his ordinance, and that we have walked mournfully before the Lord of hosts?

COMMENTS AND APPLICATION

There are different ways by which one can be dishonest with God. If one is dishonest with Him in a financial way, he has allowed something, probably the leve of money, to hinder the simplicity of purpose

which God requires of his children:that is, to love the Lord with all the heart, soul, mind, and strength. He has lost some of the fear of God from his heart, hence, has forgotten His ways. We cannot find nor keep the favor of God by giving a tenth of our wealth and using the other nine-tenths to gratify selfish desires. The rich young ruler would, no doubt, have given one-tenth of all he had for eternal life (and he probably did, for he had kept the Law from his youth), but Christ asked Him to give all. Jesus said that one must forsake all that he has, or he cannot be His disciple. This includes talents, time, wealth and even one's self. Many claim to put "all" on the altar, yet hold back part of the price, as Ananias and Sapphira did, for selfish purposes. Failing God in this way has caused many to loose out with him.

One cannot be financially dishonest with God if his heart is right with God, because the Spirit of God dwells in him to direct him to do all that he does to the glory of God. Certainly the Spirit of God will not direct one to withhold means which could be used to support God's work.

One needs food, clothing, and shelter for himself and his family in order to live here and work for God. To buy these things, would not mean that he is withholding that much from God, for God has promised to supply these things, and expects his children to use them when he supplies them. It is all right to lay aside a tenth for a certain phase of God's work; but a Christian should feel with his heart that his ALL belongs to God. Sinners should not be asked to give a tenth to support God's work, for it either disgusts them and drives them farther from God, or it encourages their false hope of obtaining favor from God through works. God is no pauper that He needs people to beg for Him, but man robs himself of temporal and spiritual blessings by not giving.

Jonah 3:1. And the word of the Lord came unto Jonah the second time, saying,

- 2. Arise, go unto Nineveh, that great city, and preach unto it the preaching that I bid thee.
- 3. So Jonah arose, and went unto Nineveh, according to the word of the Lord. Now Nineveh was an exceeding great city of three days' journey.

- 4. And Jonah began to enter into the city a day's journey, and he cried, and said, Yet forty days, and Nineveh shall be overthrown.
- 5. So the people of Nineveh believed God, and proclaimed a fast, and put on sackcloth, from the greatest of them even to the least of them.
- 6. For word came unto the king of Nineveh, and he arose from his throne, and he laid his robe from him, and covered him with sackcloth, and sat in ashes.
- 7. And he caused it to be proclaimed and published through Nineveh by the decree of the king and his nobles, saying, Let neither man nor beast, herd nor flock, taste any thing: let them not feed, nor drink water:
- 8. But let man and beast be covered with sackcloth, and cry mightily unto God: yea, let them turn every one from his evil way, and from the violence that is in their hands.
- 9. Who can tell if God will turn and repent, and turn away from his fierce anger, that we perish not?
- 10. And God saw their works, that they turned from their evil way; and God repented of the evil, that he had said that he would do unto them; and he did it not.

Golden Text: "Salvation is of the Lord." Jonah 2:9.

COMMENTS AND APPLICATION

Although the people of Nineveh were not God's chosen people, yet He was interested in them and their wickedness grieved Him. Repentance is necessary because sin which is not repented of is not pardoned, and unpardoned sin cannot remain unpunished by a just God.

God gave Nineveh forty days in which to repent. The fulfillment of His threats, like His promises, depend upon how man reacts to them.

God is not willing that any should perish but that all should come to repentance. For this reason He often prolongs the lives of wicked people, and sends them many warnings. He sends his children to warn them and is faithful to convict them of their sins by his Spirit. Jesus said of the people when he was here on earth, "The men of Nineveh shall rise up in judgment with this generation, and shall condemn it: for they repented at the preaching of Jonas; and, behold, a greater than Jonas is here." He would declare the same to the people today, because we have even more opportunities to hear the word of God and repent, and measure to it than the people of his day.

True children of God have a concern for the lost even as their Heavenly Father, and keenly feel that they are their "brother's keeper." Hence they labor and pray, and do not become discouraged and quit because the multitudes prefer to be left alone in their sins. The few, like Nineveh, who believe God and repent, are worth all the efforts which are put forth to win them.
