The Two Works Of Grace

In Gen. 1:27, we read: "So God created man in his own image, in the image of God created he him; male and female created he them."

The first pair of mankind had the image of God in them, and God gave them one commandment with the penalty attached, that if they broke it, it would mean death. They were tempted by Satan. When they yielded, Satan had succeeded in poluting and defiling the image of God, and planted his seed of evil in their hearts. Thus they became possessors of a sinful nature. They died a spiritual death—according to God's word, that they would surely die. When Adam begot sons and daughters, they received a polluted and sinful nature; the seed of Satan was in their hearts, and they were in darkness. We read in Romans 5:12: "Wherefore as by one man sin entered into the world, and death by sin; and so death passed upon all men, for that all have sinned."

When God was driving them out of the garden for this sin, he gave them a promise that the seed of the woman would bruise the serpent's (Satan's) head. The seed referred to was Christ, as Christ was born of a woman and begotten by the Holy Ghost. Man had nothing to do with his birth; therefore he was "Sanctified and sent into the world." John 10:36. He possessed the image of God as Adam did in the beginning. The Holy Ghost was dwelling in Him. He had a fisehly body, but it was only a tabernacle for the God-life in the soul, hence we have the scripture declaring that the "Word was made flesh and dwelt among us." St. John 1:14.

When John saw Jesus coming, he exclaimed, "Behold the Lamb of God that taketh away the sin of the world." The sin of the world was none other than that sin nature that passed upon all of us because of Adam's transgression. John tells us in 1 John 3:8: "He that committeth sin is of the devil; for the devil sinneth from the beginning. For this

He goes on to make it plain to us the difference between the children of God and he children of the devil. God's children do not sin and the children of the devil do sin. It is not what you profess to be, it is what you are in the sight of God that makes you His child, or the child of the devil.

Some ministers teach one work of grace, others teach two works of grace, others three works of grace, and some no work, and others all works. It is not possible for all to be right; there is only one true way, and the Bible makes that way plain.

People could get justified, or have their sins forgiven, while under the law by offering blood sacrifices, and having faith in the coming Messiah; but being possessors of that sin nature, or seed of Satan, in the heart, they would sin again and would have to go back from time to time and offer as a sacrifice, a lamb, dove, or a bullock, with faith in the coming Christ, which would take away sin. God would forgive them of their actual transgressions, and they would go on their way with peace from God in their souls.

The mission of Christ in the world, was to destroy that sin, or seed of Satan, out of the heart, that man might again possess the image of God as Adam did in the beginning, and not have to sin again.

When Christ came and was crucified, he fulfilled the law and the prophets, and has become our law, for it is written: "For this is the covenant that I will make with the house of Israel (Sanctified people are the spiritual house of Israel today) after those days, sayeth the Lord; I will put my laws into their minds, and write them in their hearts: and I will be to them a God, and they shall be to me a people." Hebrews 8:10.

When Jesus came and was crucified, God had concluded all men under sin that he might have mercy upon all (Gal. 3:22), for it was said, all had sinned and come short of the glory of God.

Since Christ came and shed his precious blood as a sacrifice for sin, man cannot get justified or forgiven by the works of the law, because Jesus is a better sacrifice. Now, when we have godly sorrow because we have transgressed God's law, we humble our hearts and plead guilty before God, confessing our sins repenting, asking God for mercy, and forsaking all sin; and he says he is faithful and just to forgive us as we believe on the Son of God. Because of this faith in the Lamb of God, we have peace with God through our Lord and Saviour Jesus Christ. In other words, our actual transgressions are all blotted out by the blood and we are innocent before God of any wrong. Jesus is with us to comfort and help us to overcome the enemy and live free from any more transgressions. Justification means that we have been forgiven of all of our transgressions, and by faith in Christ, we have peace with God. (Rom. 5:1).

In Rom. 15:16, Paul, in writing to the Gentiles, says, "Ye are sanctified by the Holy Ghost." The second definite work of grace is spoken of in the Bible in different ways, manners, and phases. Sometimes it is spoken of as a pure heart (Matt. 5:8). When the Holy Ghost comes in, He destroys that sin nature and purifies the heart. He takes up His abode in this cleansed heart, then we really begin to see God. In another place, Jesus speaks of it as, "Another Comforter," or "The Spirit of Truth," as in John 14:16, 17. When Jesus was with the disciples, he was their comforter. They believed on him and were in a justified state. Jesus tells them plainly that the world (unsaved, or unjustified people) cannot receive the Spirit of truth. But he told them that they knew Him, "for he dwelleth with you and shall be in you." The Comforter could not come into them until Jesus was crucified, resurrected, and ascended. Jesus plainly told the disciples this in St. John 7:37, 38, and 39; also in St. John 16:7. In the 26th verse of the 14th chapter, we read: "But the comforter, which is the Holy Ghost, whom the Father will send in my name, he shall teach you all things, and bring all things to your remembrance."

Jesus said, "And behold, I send the promise of my Father upon you: but tarry ye in the city of Jerusalem until ye be endued with power from on high." This instruction Jesus gave to the disciples just before he ascended to heaven. Again, in Acts 1:4, we read: "And being assembled together with them, commanded them that they should not depart from Jerusalem, but wait for the promise of the Father, which saith he, ye have heard of me."

You can read in Acts 2:1-8 how the disciples received the promise of the Father, the Comforter, which is the Holy Ghost and God was so great in them that He spoke through them in many different languages and the Gospel was heard and carried to different nations. On that day the Kingdom of God came in power and the Church was set in order. It began to function, for the Spirit of truth had come into the hearts of men, making up a spiritual body that Christ dwelt in.

The question may be asked, is this experience for us today? Let us see what the scripture says about it, then the question will be forever settled, for God has said, "Let God be true, but every man a liar."

Turn with me to the 17th chapter of St. John and see what Jesus asked the Father to do: "And for their sakes I sanctify myself, (set himself apart to be crucified) that they also might be sanctified through the truth." Then he continued with: "Neither pray I for these alone, but for them also which shall believe on me through their word." Thank God, that includes you and me, if we will believe.

Let us read Acts 2:39 and see what Peter said about it after he was filled with the Holy Spirit: "For the promise is unto you and to your children, and to all that are afar off, even as many as the Lord our God shall call." Dear reader, to doubt this experience is for you, would be to disbelieve His word.

Some one may ask, do we have any examples in God's word to show that there are two works of grace? Truly, there are many instances of this second work recorded in the Bible.

This sin, or seed of Satan, that is in your heart cannot be repented of, for you did not commit it. It must be cleansed away by faith in Christ. Sanctification has two meanings: one, is to "set apart"which we must do; the other is to cleanse, or make pure or holy. Paul says, "Ye are sanctified by the Holy Ghost." When the Holy Ghost comes in, he cleanses or destroys that seed of Satan and takes up his abode in one's heart. This is the part that God does. We first sanctify ourselves, or set ourselves apart for God's sacred use now, and just as long as God keeps life in the body. When God knows that we mean it with our whole heart, He them sends the Holy Ghost and cleanses us and takes charge of this earthen vessel, setting us apart for God's sacred use. Then we are no longer our own, but become God's property, and are now led by His Spirit that dwelleth within. It is a glorious experience.

Read Ephesians first chapter beginning with the thirteenth verse. "After that ye believed, ye were sealed with that Holy Spirit of promise." Notice, we are sealed with the Holy Spirit of promise after we believe. The Spirit of promise is given to those who are saved, justified, have peace with God, or have been forgiven of all actual transgressions. He says that this Holy Spirit is an earnest of our inheritance-just a small portion of what it will be when we are glorified with him at his coming. This Holy Spirit of promise is for us in this life. When he comes in, he is the seal from God, showing that we are God's and have become his purchased possession. He purchased us with his own blood, and now he possesses us. Glory to God.

"And the very God of peace sanctify you wholly; and I pray God your whole Spirit, soul, and body be preserved blameless unto the coming of the Lord Jesus Christ." That same God who forgave vou of your sins and gave you peace "sanctify you wholly." "Faithful is he that calleth you, who also will do it." Praise the Lord, God, who has called you to follow him will also perform the perserving by coming in and dweeling in your heart. Read 1 Thes 5:23,24.

"I beseech you therefore, brethren. (notice, he is talking to brethren—justified men who have peace with God) by the mercies of God (the same God that has had mercy on you and forgiven you of your sins), that ye present your bodies a living sacrifice (sacrifice your life, your friends, your relation and all that is dear to your heart of this world) holy, acceptable unto God, which is your reasonable service." It is

the most reasonable thing in the world to give your-self and all to God who has been so good as to blot out all of your transgressions and give your soul peace. Read Rom. 12:1 and 2.

Paul had the two experiences (Acts 9): When he was on the road to Damascus, God visited him and he fell down to the ground. He heard a voice saying, Saul, Saul, why persecutest thou me? Paul answered, Who art thou Lord? The Lord said, "I am Jesus whom thou persecutest." Paul trembled and was astonished. He immediately believed on the Lord with a penitent heart and said, "Lord what wilt thou have me to do?" He became a willing subject, and obeyed His instructions to go to Damascus where it would be told him what to do. Paul prayed three days without eating or drinking. God sent Annias to lay hands on him and to pray for him. The first words that Annias spoke to him were, "Brother Saul." He acknowledged him as a brother-a saved man. He laid hands on him and prayed, "Receive thy sight and be filled with the Holy Ghost." Immediately he received his sight and he was baptized. After he had received meat, he straightway preached Christ in the synagogues, that He was the Son of God.

When the prodigal son came back to the Father, the Father met him far down the road. He threw his arms around him and placed a kiss upon his brow. That is typical of our justification. With the Father's arm around him and a kiss on his brow, he knew that the Father had forgiven him, and he was at peace with him. He certainly felt good, but the Father did not stop there. He took to the house, where he told the servants to bring forth the best robe and put on him. The best robe represents our sanctification or infilling of the Spirit. He told them to kill the fatted calf so they could eat and be merry, "For this my son was dead and is alive again, he was lost and is found."

The resurrection of Lazarus is typical of our salvation. Jesus went to the tomb weeping and groaning. He is weeping and groaning over sinners, today. He told them to roll away the stone. There may be some things in your life that you will have to fix up before Jesus will call you to life. They rolled away the stone and Jesus said with a loud voice, "Lazarus, come forth." Lazarus came forth bound hand and foot with grave clothes, and his face was bound about with a napkin. He had come forth and had life. This represents a justified state, but Jesus spoke the second time, saying, "Loose him and let him go." He was entirely free then. This represents the second definite work of grace, or the coming in of the Comforter, which is the Holy Ghost. Paul says, "Ye are sanctified by the Holy Ghost." Jesus says. "If the Son shall make you free, ye shall be free indeed."

The camp meetings are a source of much encouragement to the saints of God, for they can gather together and enjoy the heavenly fellowship and have opportunity to listen to the heavenly messages given to them through God's anointed ministry.

Many souls get saved in these camp meetings. Others are sanctified wholly by receiving the Comforter, which is the Holy Ghost (John 14:26); for believers are sanctified by the Holy Ghost (Rom. 15:16). Generally, God manifests his power in healing the sick and performing miracles, as all these signs follow them that believe on Him. (Mark 16:17).

Every saint who can should attend some good camp meeting this summer for the welfare of their soul and to aid in the furtherance of the cause of God among men.

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It has been our custom not to put out a Faith and Victory paper in August. For the third time the Lord has brought to my mind very forciabley that we should print and send out a paper in August this year. As we are his property and are fully willing to be led by his Spirit we shall proceed to fulfill his will and get a paper ready for August. It is going to make much extra work and expense as part of our help is away in meetings and we will have the State Camp meeting here at Guthrie and we also wanted time to attend part of the "National meeting" at Monark Springs, Mo. We shall look to the Lord to make it possible. He will surely have some truth in the August paper that will be important for people to read and receive.

Pray for us as we labor on for the Master.

We hear so much these days about tithing, which was a law doctrine, and can be so pressed as to undermine and take place of the "Grace" doctrine of "forsaking all" and giving all to God, giving His Spirit that is within us liberty to direct us in our giving of those things over which God has made us stewards.

We find no place in the New Testament where God demands a tenth of his followers, but we do find that "Free-will offerings" are encouraged and practiced

To be sanctified wholly means that we are God's sacred property and all we possess is His. His Spirit, living in us, moves us to give of what rightly belongs to God, for we are only stewards over all that He places in our hands. This is the reason a rich man cannot enter into the Kingdom of God any more than a camel can go through the eye of a needle. When he forsakes all, which is the only consecration that

will be acknowledged of God by sending the Comforter into his soul, he will not consider himself rich any more but it will be God who is rich, and he will only be God's steward.

To press the tithing system on any one is a sect spirit and only proves a lack of faith in God to supply their needs. Their eyes are on men and things of this world, rather than on God, who has promised to supply all our needs according to his riches in glory. You will notice that the tithing advocates want your tithe money either for themselves or for their idol, which they call a church. They are anxious to build up a show of religion. Human systems, boards, and committees take the place of God's Spirit working, and they keep up human machinery which God is not sanctioning.

Most of the advocates of the tithing system will use the 23rd verse of the 23rd chapter of Matt. to try to prove that tithing is a New Testament doctrine and that Christ taught it. The fact is, Christ is not teaching it to be a grace doctrine at all. These Scribes and Pharisees were under the law and should have given their tenth as the law demanded, but Jesus was trying to get them to see that they were leaving off the weightier matters—judgment, mercy, and faith. He was trying to get them to see that they were not keeping the law, and were in a condemned state before God. To get a tithe doctrine out of this scripture would be wresting the scriptures and causing them to mean that which Christ did not teach.

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I am not against the children of God giving to the cause of God, and that freely, liberally, and cheerfully, for they are certainly taught to do so all through the New Testament; but only in a way so the Spirit working in each member can have liberty to function through each member of his body as it pleases him. If a member feels free in his soul to give a tenth and let God move on them to give where he directs, then it is good and his soul will prosper in so doing. I am persuaded that he will not stop at a tenth, but will give freely even beyond that, for he knows all is the Lord's and he is God's sacred property to be used for his glory and not to keep up some man-made system. I believe that every saved soul should be sure that they are giving as much or more than a tenth; not because of law, but because they love God and his love in their heart will constrain them to give cheerfully as unto the Lord. Any soul that fails to give liberally and freely of the things that God is giving them will have a dwarfed soul, and many have dead souls and some become like Jesus said the Pharisees were—"graves that appear not." There are many weak and sickly souls because of their stingy giving. If those professing to belong to God would believe the scriptures and the words of Jesus, they would be great givers and yet have plenty.

Read what Jesus says about giving in Luke 6:38: "Give and it shall be given unto you: good measure, pressed down, and shaken together, and running over shall men give unto your bosom." Stingy givers do not believe Christ, and their covetous spirit will be the means of damning their souls. The scriptures exhort those who have this world's goods to be rich in good works (1 Tim. 6:17, 18, 19. The more God lets you have, the greater is your responsibility to give and use all to his glory.

The widow gave her two mites, all of her living, and Jesus commended her for it, and said that she had given more than all the rest who had given of their abundance (Luke 21:2). She gave with faith in God that he would return all her need. The other only gave of their abundance and were careful to have plenty left for themselves. Many people give that way today. To press a tenth doctrine on God's little ones is only aiding many to become formal and selfrighteous and sometimes boastful. healthy soul doctrine is: "Freely ye have received, freely give" (Matt: 8, 9). Give with faith in God and never through compulsory measures nor to those who are continually hinting and telling you their needs and working in various ways to get you to give to them or their system. Let God's spirit in you tell you where to give, when and how much to give, and if you are truly willing in heart to give as he directs, you will have no trouble in knowing where when, and how much to give. In this grace dispensation we are all to know Him, from the least to the greatest. Read Heb. 8:10. If you are not in this condition so God's Spirit can lead you, it is because you are lodged up in some man-made system or sect, and you are not free so he can lead and direct you in his ways. God says for us not to be unequally yoked up with unbelievers (2 Cor. 6:14). He also says in the 17th verse, "Wherefore, come out from among them, and be ye separate, saith the Lord, and touch not the unclean thing; and I will receive you." Read the next verse for your encouragement to do so. In Rev. 18:2, we read: "And he cried mightily with a loud voice, saying, Babylon the great (sect confusion and man-made systems) is fallen, is fallen, and IS become the habitation of devils, and a hold of every foul spirit, a cage of every unclean and hateful bird." This statement is true in a more or less degree with all the man-made sects and systems and selfish, dwarfed opinions of men that have influence over God's little children. In the 4th verse, John heard another voice from the angel from heaven saying, "Come out of her my people, that ye be not partakers of her sins, and that ye receive not of her plagues." If you are in one of these man-made systems and you are his child, this call is to you. you obey, the better it will be for you and all whom you may influence.

In our travels over the country and by correspondence, we know that there is a mighty stir going on in Christendom. God is shifting and sifting and is gathering his people into one (all who will be gathered) delivering them from false doctrines and bringing them out into the one fold, separating them from all the world, and they are not of the world any more than Christ and his disciples were not of the world. Some are getting out and others seem to be just slowing down a little. They make me think of the time I drove past a stop sign. The police halted me and asked me if I saw that stop sign. I told him that I slowed down. He said, "That sign does not say, 'slow down,' it says, 'STOP!'" God's word does not tell you to slow down and not to go with the world so far or fast; but it says, STOP! God's word does not say for you to come out of one sect into another, neither does it tell you to lodge up in a man-made system or come under bondage to some man's clever opinions with spreading wings to smother and blind you. The word says, "Come out of her, she is fallen." Come completely out and just abide in Him, and be God's free man or woman, for as many as are led by the Spirit, they are the sons of God. (Rom. 8:14.)

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THE "FAITH AND VICTORY" PAPER

On page four, in first column, you will find printed regularly in each issue a brief statement of Bible truths for which this paper stands. In this writing we desire, by the Lord's help, to call your attention to and discuss more fully these truths from a scriptural standpoint.

Its Motto

Have faith in God. Faith is the link that connects God and man together. "But without faith it is impossible to please him: for he that cometh .o God must believe that he is, and that he is a rewarder of them that diligently seek Him." Heb. 11:6. "This is the victory that overcometh the world, even our faith." 1 John 5:4. Faith is the shield of the Christian (Eph. 6:16). "The just shall live by faith." Through faith we become the children of Abraham—justified by faith (Rom. 3:28); sanctified by faith

(Acts 26:18). Miracles are performed through faith. Physical healing is wrought by faith. "The prayer of faith shall save the sick and the Lord will raise him up." Jas. 5:15. The temporal needs of God's people are supplied by faith. "Faith cometh by hearing." (or reading).

Perfect obedience to God's will is the basis for active faith. "If our hearts condemn us not, then have we confidence toward God." Where there is a lack of faith and trust, many evils creep in. Murmuring and complaining is heard. People turn to the arm of flesh for healing, become covetous and lay up their treasures on earth. Others, through a lack of trust in God, bring reproach upon the cause of Christ by borrowing money which they are not certain they can repay. Ministers and congregations will resort to human systems of taxation and questionable methods of raising funds for their support. "Have faith in God." Mark 11:22.

Its Object

The glory of God and the salvation of men. "And I, if I be lifted up, will draw all men unto me." This paper endeavors to help fulfill the world-wide commission to carry the gospel to "all nations" and "every creature." Christ is held up as the only name through which man can be saved from the bondage of sin and made ready for heaven.

The promulgation and restoration of the whole truth to the people in this "evening time" as it was in the morning church of the first century. The truths of the apostolic church had been hidden and obscured from the people during the ages of the "dark and cloudy day," but "it shall come to pass, that at evening it shall be light." Zech. 14:7. Even as the truths were gradually obscured by the clouds of human rubbish, even so, these same truths are now being gradually restored to the Church and to the people with the coming of each spiritual reformer. The old paths are new to the people today. paper stands as an exponent of all these Bible truths which are bringing the church to its primitive glory and power. If we walk in the light that we now have, more will be revealed.

The unification of all true believers in one body by the love of God. Jesus prayed for and suffered death on the cross that his people might be one body, knit together by love. Jesus came to destroy carnality—the cause of the multiplicity of sects and divisions which we witness today. "There shall be one fold and one shepherd."

Its Standard

Separation from the world and entire devotion

to the service and will of God. Saints are called to be separate and distinct from the world. There is no fellowship between them and the worldly crowd. "Whosoever therefore will be a friend of the world is the enemy of God." Jas. 4:4. Jesus said of his disciples that they were not of the world even as He was not of the world. That is a wide separation. "Love not the world, neither the things that are in the world." 1 John 2:15. Saints are separate from the world in thought, actions, ambitions, desires, worldly pleasures, and adornments. "Whether therefore ye eat or drink, or whatsoever ye do, do all to the glory of God." 1 Cor. 10:31.

Its Characteristics

No discipline but the Bible. All of God's word is essential to our life. "Man shall not live by bread alone, but by every word that proceedeth out of the mouth of God." The Bible is its own best interpreter, and needs no condensing or enlarging.

No bond of union but the love of God. In God's people there is a unity of the spirit and heart, because they are all born into one family by one spiritual birth. Divine love is the tie that binds. A union through human organization does not produce heart unity.

No test of fellowship but the indwelling Spirit of Christ. "If any man have not the spirit of Christ, he is none of his." Whether or not one has the spirit of Christ—humility, gentleness, easily entreated, and full of good fruits—is the only test of fellowship. Two persons may have perfect fellowship or unity of the Spirit by each walking in the light that God gives him, even though one may have much more light than the other. "If we walk in the light as He is in the light, we have fellowship one with another." When one sets up his own opinions or greater light as a bar to fellowship, disregarding the Spirit of Christ the other may possess, then he becomes guilty of a sectish, divisional spirit, which is contrary to the Word of God.

Separation from all human organizations that are not authorized in the Word of God. All secret orders, lodges, and every system of a worldly nature should be forsaken by God's people. In those places and in man-made churches, they are necessarily yoked together with unbelievers, and Paul says, "Be ye not unequally yoked together with unbelievers." 2 Cor. 6:14. John the Revelator heard a voice from heaven saying, "Come out of her, my people, that ye be not partakers of her sins, and that ye receive not of her plagues." Rev. 18:4. This refers to the apostate churches-Babylon. They are commanded to come out because Babylon is fallen. Babylon may take the name, "Church of God," but that does not make it God's church. He looks at its true condition and names it accordingly. "Come out from among them, and be ye separate" 2 Cor. 6:17.

Job 2:1. Again there was a day when the sons of God came to present themselves before the Lord, and Satan came also among them to present himself before the Lord.

2. And the Lord said unto Satan, From whence

comest thou? And Satan answered the Lord, and said, From going to and fro in the earth, and from walking up and down in it.

- 3. And the Lord said unto Satan, Hast thou considered my servant Job, that there is none like him in the earth, a perfect and an upright man, one that feareth God, and escheweth evil? and still he holdeth fast his intregity, although thou movedst me against him, to destroy him without cause.
- 4. And Satan answered the Lord, and said, Skin for skin, yea, all that a man hath will he give for his life.
- 5. But put forth thine hand now, and touch his bone and his flesh, and he will curse thee to thy face.
- 6. And the Lord said unto Satan, Behold, he is in thine hand; but save his life.
- 7. So went Satan forth from the presence of the Lord, and smote Job with sore boils from the sole of his foot unto his crown.
- 8. And he took him a potsherd to scrape himself withal; and he sat down among the ashes.
- 9. Then said his wife unto him, Dost thou still retain thine integrity? curse God, and die.
- 10. But he said unto her, Thou speakest as one of the foolish women speaketh. What? shall we receive good at the hand of God, and shall we not receive evil? In all this did not Job sin with his lips.
- 11. Now when Job's three friends heard of all this evil that was come upon him, they came every one from his own place: Eliphaz the Temanite, and Bilad the Shuhite, and Zophar the Naamathite: for they had made an appointment together to come to mourn with him and to comfort him.
- 12. And when they lifted up their eyes afar off, and knew him not, they lifted up their voice, and wept; and they rent every one his mantle, and sprinkled dust upon their heads toward heaven.
- 13. So they sat down with him upon the ground seven days and seven nights, and none spake a word unto him: for they saw that his grief was very great.

Golden Text: "In all this Job sinned not, nor charged God foolishly." Job 1:22.

COMMENTS AND APPLICATION

In the first verse of the lesson it is said that Satan presented himself before the Lord with the sons of God. Satan is a Spirit even as God is a Spirit and Satan says that he went to and fro in the earth and walked up and down in it. In John 16:11 we find that Satan is referred to as being the "Prince of this world," and no doubt this is because he exercises so much influence and authority over men. In Eph. 2:2 he is called the "prince of the power of the air; the spirit that worketh in the children of disobedience." God calls his attention to his servant Job whom the Lord had permitted Satan to tempt in allowing him to destroy his children and all his

possessions and yet Job loved and honored God. Satan wanted another chance and this time to afflict his body and God allowed him to do it and he smote Job with sore boils all over his body but he could not take his life as God forbid him to do that. This is a good lesson for us when afflicted or reverse circumstances come—not to murmur or complain or fail God but to be true through it all, for Satan can go no farther with us today than God permits and when we are tried we will come forth as gold.

His wife's suggestion to turn from God was rejected, and he said, "Thou speakest as one of the foolish women" —as an infidel or one that did not believe in a future state. Job knew that he had been receiving good things from the Lord for many years and if God saw fit to let him have some evil things, he would accept that also.

Seven days' mourning was a custom of ancient days for the dead and Job's friends saw him in such a plight and suffering so much that they mourned for him seven days. In all this suffering Job did not sin or charge God foolishly.

COMMENTS AND APPLICATION

The continuation of Job's sufferings is very great, and as dreadful as death is to others, Job would prefer it and esteem it a privilege to be covered in the grave rather than to continue in such afflictions and misery.

Job asks the question, "If a man die, shall he live again?" This is fully answered in John 5:28, 29 where it plainly tells us that they will be resurrected either to life or damnation according to our own doings while in this body.

In sealing up his transgressions and sewing up his iniquity Job has reference to God having record of all his deeds and he would be judged accordingly in that final Judgment day. All things are naked and open unto Him with whom we have to do and our deeds, good or bad, are on His book.

Job, in speaking of the grave as his house and his bed in darkness, had reference to his body being covered in the earth as he knew that he could not remain long in such affliction and weakness unless God helped him. He spoke of corruption being his father and the worm his sister or mother. He was so near to death that he considered himself ready to embrace them as his kin. He realized that his rest together with them was in the dust.

In the 25th verse Job breaks into a spirit of prophecy and says, "I know that my Redeemr liveth, and that he shall stand at the latter day upon the earth," referring no doubt to the redemption of his body by resurrection when Jesus comes to judge the quick and the dead. Though skin worms destroy the body he was expecting to see God. This was no doubt given to Job of God to encourage him in this dark hour. Though Satan through Job's friends had discouraged him and accused him of evil because of his awful afflictions, God was encouraging him so he would know his favor was on him and he had done no iniquity but had hope of a life with God in a future state.

- 3. Who is he that hideth counsel without know-ledge? therefore have I uttered that I understood not; things too wonderful for me, which I knew not.
- 4. Hear, I beseech thee, and I will speak: I will demand of thee, and declare thou unto me.
- 5. I have heard of thee by the hearing of the ear: but now mine eye seeth thee.
- 6. Wherefore I abhor myself, and repent in dust and ashes.
- 7. And it was so, that after the Lord had spoken these words unto Job, the Lord said to Eliphaz the Temanite, My wrath is kindled against thee, and against thy two friends: for ye have not spoken of me the thing that is right, as my servant Job hath.
- 8. Therefore take unto you now seven bullocks and seven rams, and go to my servant Job, and offer up for yourselves a burnt offering; and my servant Job shall pray for you: for him will I accept: lest I deal with you after your folly, in that ye have not spoken of me the thing which is right, like my servant Job.
- · 9. So Eliphaz the Temanite and Bildad the Shuhite and Zophar the Naamathite went, and did according as the Lord commanded them: the Lord also accepted Job.
- 10. And the Lord turned the captivity of Job, when he prayed for his friends; also the Lord gave Job twice as much as he had before.
- 11. Then came there unto him all his brethren, and all his sisters, and all they that had been of his acquaintance before, and did eat bread with him in his house: and they bemoaned him, and comforted him over all the evil that the Lord had brought upon him: every man also gave him a piece of money, and every one an earring of gold.
- 12. So the Lord blessed the latter end of Job more than his beginning: for he had fourteen thousand sheep, and six thousand camels, and a thousand yoke of oxen, and a thousand she asses.
- 13. He had also seven sons and three daughters. Golden Text: "And the Lord turned the Captivity of Job, when he prayed for his friends" Job 42:10.

COMMENTS AND APPLICATION

Experience. Many people have knowledge that they have received from others, but the true knowledge is received through personal experience with God. This is the kind of knowledge Job had. The Lord is faithful to fulfill every promise and deal individually with each one. Trust Him and give Him a chance to bless you.

Humility—a sure foundation. Verses 6 and 7. Humbleness of heart will remove every thing from between us and God. When our hearts condemn us not, then have we confidence in God.

Sin. If we regard iniquity in our heart, He will not hear us. Pride, unbelief, coveteousness separate souls from God. "Blessed are the pure in heart."

Intercessory prayer—serving others. He who was the greatest of all was the servant of all. Losing ourselves in service for others is the service fully acceptable unto him. The need today is more intercessors for souls that are not saved. Boys and girls, men and women are headed for destruction—eternal destruction "where the worm dieth not and the fire is not quenched."

The end of time is close at hand. Are we doing our best? Can we be satisfied to nestle down with the saints and enjoy God's blessings or may we not reach some little neglected corner somewhere near us and hold forth the words of life to lost men and women!
