Restoration of Truth

There are several things that are essential in order to restore and make more visible the TRUE CHURCH ON EARTH. First, the full gospel must be preached as it was in the morning time of this dispensation by an uncompromising ministry.

Restoration of truth has always been brought about by true leaders—those who are not greedy of filthy lucre. Reasoning powers are demoralized by falsity, and developed by Truth. It was when the children of Israel listened to false prophets that they drifted into heathenism and idolatry, prophets who preached visions out of their own heart and not out of the Word of God. They ran, but God had not sent them. Read Jer. 23: 16-20-21-22.

The full gospel must not only be preached, but practiced. "Not every one that saith Lord, Lord, shall enter the Kingdom of heaven, but he that doeth the will of my Father which is in heaven." Matt. 7: 21. "He that rejecteth Me, and receiveth not my words, hath One that judgeth him; the word that I have spoken, the same shall judge him in the last day." John 12: 48. For a body of people to obey the Word of God has always made them a peculiar people in the eyes of the world and worldly professors.

God's ministers preach and stand for the One True Church of God, the only church that Christ purchased with His own blood. Acts 20: 28. They preach and practice the three ordinances of the church-baptism, feet-washing (John 13) and the Lord's supper. 1 Cor. 11: 23. God's ministers preach unity of all Christians and cry out against every so-called religious institution that make divisional pens which divide the children of God. They recognize no other creed but the New Testament creed, for they know that they need no other. "And that from a child thou hast known the holy scriptures, which are able to make thee wise unto salvation through faith which is in Christ Jesus." "All scripture is given by inspiration of God, and is profitable for doctrine, for reproof, for correction, for instruction in righteousness: that the man of God may be perfect, throughly furnished unto all good works." 2 Tim. 3: 15-17.

God's ministers preach and practice the laws of

true church government. Read Paul's instructions to the church in 1 Cor. 5: 4-6. They preach that all Christians have the love of God in their hearts and do manifest it when opportunity presents itself. "By this shall all men know that ye are my disciples if ye have love one to another." Read the book of 1st John. 3rd chapter.

God's ministers preach against the wearing of immodest apparel, costly array, pearls, gold for adornment, bobbed hair, lip sticks, painted faces and every mark of the world that doesn't become women and men professing Godliness. Read 1 Tim. 9: 10; 1 Pet. 3: 3-4.

God's ministers preach restitution, honesty, both to God and to our fellow man. We should always have a conscience void of offense toward God and toward man. Acts 24: 16. If we are to live and shine for God we must be able to meet our creditors with an honest face and testify to them as well as others that we have the salvation of Christ which makes us honest and peculiar people.

God's ministers teach gospel giving, not as under the Jewish law putting a yoke upon the people, but under the law of LOVE, which all Christians find it a pleasure to obey, a law of liberty, that enables them all to give cheerfully. There is a certain class of religionist who give to what they think is gospel work grudgingly, another class who give because they think it necessary, but this spirit of giving is not commended of the Lord, for He only loves a "Every man according as he purcheerful giver. poseth in his heart, let him give, not grudgingly, or of necessity: for God loveth a cheerful giver." 2 Cor. 9: 7. The law of tithing, which a great many try to bind on their followers, has no foundation in the New Testament scriptures, and is insignificant with gospel giving under the law of love. The only reason the writer can give for such ministers preaching tithing is this: They seem to know that the most of their followers do not have the love of God and if they can get them to believe that they are still under the law, that they can scare them into giving at least as much as the tenth, and of course if just the really saved ones give, there would not be sufficient means to support them in their divisional work. I shall not doubt when the love of God has been shed abroad in the heart that folks will give to the extent of their means, and do it cheerfully. It is true they will not and can not give cheerfully to a corrupted institution that is only a church in name, but when they find God's people representing the true church they will give freely.

Another sense that doesn't appear in the congregations of the True Church: individuals who look and act like the world during the week, then come to meetings on Sunday and are seen on the platform singing songs or teaching Sunday-school classes as other sinners set back and say their looks and man-

ner of dress speak so loud that I do not understand what they say.

Isaiah was a true prophet and God told him to prepare the way for the people, gather out the stones; and to lift up a standard for the people. Isa. 62: 10. Thank God He has a few ministers today who are using His word and lifting it up as a standard for the people and will not rest until God establishes His truth out clear from dark and cloudy sectarianism which will cause His true Church again to be a praise in the earth. Isa. 62:7.

Divorce and Remarriage A Personal Testimony

From a child I was taught that it was a gross sin to separate from one's companion and remarry. I remember while quite young I told myself sternly that I would never do such a thing. .As I grew older I felt a deep pity for any one that made such a bungle of his or her life.

In the year 1902 a young man sought my hand in marriage and we became engaged. Then the rumor reached me that he was a married man with wife and child. I asked him to tell me the truth about it. Knowing full well that he would lose me if he confessed it, he said it was a lie. I had no way of investigating, or at least I did not know how to go about it, and since we lived in a small mining town, I set it down as small-town gossip, and married the man.

I had one of the dearest fathers in this world, but no mother to counsel me, and no one else to go to. My father approved of it, as every one thought it was a good match. I lost my mother at the pitiful age of two months and ten days. I was the only child, and can remember when my father was introduced to me at the tender age of six years. Being so alone in the world, and being an affectionate young girl, I naturally looked forward to marriage and children of my own.

At this time I was unsaved, but had a deep reverence for God. I really feared to do anything so wrong as this terrible sin of marrying a divorced person. The word of God is so plain to those who fear to do evil. Mark 10:11, 12; Rom. 7: 2, 3; 1 Cor. 7:11.

Within four years after my marriage I had two lovely children, for which I thanked the dear Lord. I thought the coming of my children was most blessed but when I had been married four years another and more wonderful thing happened to me. The Holy Spirit convicted my heart of sin. I knew it was God talking to my heart, and I began to listen. Then He led me on to true repentance. O, what a joy really to know Christ! I studied God's Word and walked in all the light He gave me according to my

understanding, and went on to entire sanctification. Nine years after I was married, we moved to Fort Worth, Texas, just across the street from a man

who knew my husband, and knew all the facts concerning his former marriage. He, thinking I knew all about it (for my husband had told his folks that he had told me all) talked freely to me about it. As I listened my face became white as death. He exclaimed, "Didn't you know it?" I said, "No!" The poor man was so frightened at what he had done that I felt sorry for him, but in my own soul I said, "Well, what are you going to do now, since you yourself are in this boat?" I saw no other way but to take it to the Lord in earnest prayer. I had a talk with my husband about it when he came home from work. He was furiously and unreasonably angry. I wrote to the Gospel Trumpet Company (editors of a religious paper) for advice, but all they gave me was a tract to read called, "Must They Separate?" written by Bro. D. S. Warner. Of course, the Bible does not say to separate after such marriages are made, but it plainly shows how God holds us as adulterers and adulteresses. (Heb. 13:4). If the heart is honest and God-fearing, God can through His word and by the help of the Holy Spirit show us these truths. Before I knew my own predicament, I had warned and advised all I could not to commit this sin, but when I warned others after that, it would come back to me like a boomerang to bring great sadness to my heart.

Finally, I left my husband when my children were six and eight years old. He tried to put them in a Catholic convent so that I could never see them again. My father tried to influence me to return, but I could not conscientiously do so. I was living and working close to the home, and when the children became ill my husband sent my father to tell me that he would leave if I would return to the children. He left, but refused to contribute to the children's support, and there I was with two little children and my invalid father. Work was scarce and wages small, so I sold our cow and household goods and came to California, where work for women was plentiful and wages good. I stayed away for one year. Then I met a kindly well-meaning old minister who advised that God's Word was silent as to separating, and for the children's sake, may be I should go back. All my relatives were against me and for my husband, so with sad heart I went back, right over my own heart's convictions, not in wilful transgression, but thinking I had been mistaken. I felt so sorry for the children, who wanted to be with their father, but wouldn't leave their mother. This is a heartbreaking position for the children of parents to be in, who want to get a divorce and remarry. What a pity; yea, what a burning shame!

So in 1913 we reassembled in the home, but always there was that uncertainty and pain in my

heart. I sought the council of different ministers, and they would only tell me to earnestly seek God, and He would reveal His will to me. I can see now that God wanted to help me many times, but it was hard for me to re-open the wound, and break up the home again. Truly, it isn't an easy thing to do. but Matt. 5:29, 30 is in the Bible to be obeyed. I sought as earnestly as anyone could, but there I hung, like many others, thinking God was surely too merciful to let me be lost, since I did not get the divorce and marry another. Yes, but I married one who had been divorced. Luke 16:18. God has to be strict with us, or what would we not do? Surely, we would dishonor Him just like a disobedient child dishonors his parents. Twenty-five years went by. Oh, will I ever be able to understand God's mercy and patience and longsuffering toward me? Several times during those years I was very ill and thought my time surely had come. I would take inventory and submit my will to the Lord and say, "Lord, as far as I know I am ready to go." For in truth, I was His child, and He plainly manifested Himself to me. But always a faint shadow hung over my soul concerning my marriage, and I would say, "Yes, Lord, I know of this marriage of mine, I would give anything in my power if it were not this way." The Lord would heal me and raise me up, praise His dear name, for He is goodness personified.

Preachers, teachers and editors who are in sects often speak of the Church as a "mystical body" and in this way keep their followers in darkness, making them believe that it is some mysterious something that can never be seen or clearly discerned. Others, who have lost the vision of the Church or have never been able to clearly discern the Body, teach folks and act as though the church was scattered amongst all the different divisions of Christendom and they have a tendency in all their teaching to comfort them in such weeping and sickness, when the scriptures are plainly calling his sheep (not goats) out of such places to abide in the one fold with one Shepherd, stating clearly that, "Babylon the great is fallen, and is become the habitation of devils, and the hold of every foul spirit, and a cage of every unclean, hateful bird." Rev. 18:2. What does God think of a minister, editor or teacher that will try to console his sheep and lambs to stay in such cages, caged up with foul spirits and unclean and

hateful birds. Surely, any one that would do such a thing must be blinded with filthy lucre, making merchandise of precious souls, 1 Tim.3:3. There is no sect but what teaches some unsound doctrines, even if it is nothing more than binding a tithing system on their members. Those who lose faith in God resort to many ways to raise money to keep their system up, continually keeping their wants before the people and making them believe that they are doing a great work for God, making debts and working on the sympathy of their hearers or members to pay it off, stirring them continually to sacrifice and give, give, making one think of the horseleach or the daughter. Pr. 30:15.

Jesus says, "Therefore if the Son make you free, ye shall be free indeed," John 8:16. The real true and visible Church of God is from heaven, Rev. 21:2. They are in the world but not of the world, John 17:14. Jesus prayed that they would not be taken out of the world but that they be kept from the evil, John 17:15. They are not entangled with and darkened in soul by earthly things, but are free from all man-made religions, serving God day and night in the beauty of holiness. They are loose and ready for his coming when they will arise with the resurrected ones and meet the Lord in the air and so shall they ever be with the Lord, 1 Thess, 4:17.

Questions Answered By The Ministry

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To the dear Saints scattered abroad, greetings:
Because of some erroneous teachings among us, which is not conducive to unity, but rather tends to strife and division; we, the ministers of the Church of God assembled at the National Camp Meeting at Monark Springs, Mo., and after prayerful consideration, feel it pleasing to the Lord to write a letter of encouragement to those who may have been discouraged by said erroneous teaching, and at the same time correct by the Word of God any mistakes or teaching which is not compatible with the word of God.

First of all, we believe in one God, the Father of our Lord Jesus Christ who was born of the Virgin Mary, died for our transgressions, was buried and rose again for our justification, "By whose stripes we are healed," and saved through the all-atoning blood of Jesus. We believe in the leadings of the Holy Ghost, who will guide us into all truth, convince the world of sin, of righteousness and of a judgment to come, and cause men and women to repent and believe in the Lord Jesus Christ and be saved (or born again). We believe in sanctification as a second definite work of grace wrought in the heart by the Holy Ghost. We believe in all the fundamental principles of the apostolic church as recorded

in the New Testament, to wit: the unity of God's people of all races, the praying and laying on hands for the healing of the sick, casting out devils, and ordaining ministers, elders and pastors; not to rule over God's heritage, but to be examples to the flock not for filthy lucres' sake, but of a ready (or willing) mind. The pastor should have full control and confidence in his (or her) congregation, and they in him. So that the congregation having a voice in and working in perfect unison with their pastor, so that difficult problems that may arise can be Bibically adjusted, all should be subject one to another (elders and all) (1 Pet. 5:5). Should a pastor walk disorderly, the congregation should have a voice in the matter. "Ye which are spiritual restore such an one" (if possible) Gal. 6:1. If it is not possible, take Bible steps. Should a congregation feel that a certain minister was not qualified to pastor them, he, or she, should submit to them; especially, if making Any pastor who may trouble by not submitting. feel the Lord wants him to resign as pastor at that place, or for the time being, may do so; but said resignation does not disqualify him from being reinstated as pastor if the Lord so leads; but we believe the congregation will see and feel his or her qualifications. Young Spirit-filled ministers should be encouraged to exercise their God-given talents and ability without restraint, but should take advice as Paul to Timothy, who said, "Let no man despise thy youth." And after giving instructions how saints ought to behave themselves, he commits the whole thing to Timothy (1 Tim. 1:18), then commanded him to teach these things (1 Tim. 4:11).

Young people should have their liberty in the Lord to have their young people's meeting carried on in the light of the gospel. Young people should teach in their meetings that which is taught in the general meetings— justification by repentence and faith, sanctification by consecration and faith (and this last work just as soon after justification as the person sees the need and understands the prerequisites, as in Rom 12:1)..

We recognize no ministerial supremacy, no head but Christ, no bosses, no year book (our names in eternity's book in heaven), the Holy Ghost as our leader, the one church on one foundation, the Bride of Christ. They are now married, hence the children are all legitimate. He has but one bride or wife. Saints have but one companion. Light on the Word of God rates our responsibility on this and all other questions.

We abide in the church, the only church (1 Tim. 3:5). There is no such thing in the New Testament as "First Church of God." The church on earth is visible. We do not know of an invisible church on earth because the church is composed of live men and women. "Whosoever would be chief among you, let him be your servant." (Matt. 20:27)

Among other deceptions is the "Eternal Security" after one is sanctified—a very dangerous doctrine, which means one can not fall after receiving this experience.

There are no sinners in the church because Christ is the door (John 10:9) There are no Christians outside of the church (Eph. 3:14, 15).

All Spirit-filled ministers should feel free and have the cooperation of all saints to go wherever led to talk or have meetings, and put forth every effort to get souls saved out of sin, sectism, compromise, or fanaticism. "God is love," and everyone called to preach is called to preach Christ (God), and thus get as many as possible to love God instead of the world. All God-called and qualified ministers have the right (whether ordained or not) to officiate in all the ordinances of the Church, to wit: washing of the saints' feet, the Lord's Supper, Baptism, conducting funeral services, except, however, the solemnizing of matrimony, which act is regulated by the laws of the land.

The above is also a summary of the preaching and teaching in this meeting, which answers some of the many questions being asked.

(Ed.) I had the privilege of attending only three days of the National Campmeeting at Monark Springs, Mo. and the ministers had gotten together and written answers to the above questions before I got to the meeting. This will no doubt be a help and encouragment to all the saints every where and will clear away any wrong impressions that may be lingering in the minds of some.

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The National camp meeting at Monark Springs, Mo. closed with victory on July 28th, and those who were privileged to attend the entire meeting reported it was the best ever held on the grounds. The love, unity and fellow-ship for which Jesus prayed was truly demonstrated in every department, from the kitchen to the pulpit. The Holy Ghost was the only member of the pulpit committee, and as a result the clear, definite messages harmonized into a complete well-balanced volume of Bible truth.

The expenses of the meeting were met by freewill offerings, but after the meeting closed and the outstanding bills were submitted, we find that we are indebted to the amount of \$25.00. If any of our readers feel led to help pay this expense, the Lord will bless you and it will be thankfully received. Please send your offering direct to the National Secretary, and if more than enough is received to pay the present debt, the balance will be held in a fund for the camp meeting next year.

In the business meeting of the National Camp Meeting this year at Monark Springs, Missouri it was strongly recommended that each saint and each congregation send a liberal offering to the National Secretary thirty days before the meeting starts next year in order to pay the expenses as they arise without over working the offering box during the meeting. 

COMMENTS AND APPLICATIONS

Praise and thanks are due to God, and when practiced continually, discouragement will find no dwelling place in the hearts of God's people.

Sinners have temporal blessings to be thankful for, and they should be thankful to God for His great mercy in sparing their lives while they grieve Him daily by serving the enemy of all righteousness; but they cannot truly praise and thank God from their

hearts until they have received the spirit of praise, which God places in the hearts of regenerated souls. Christians can truly praise God for both spiritual and temporal blessings.

Some of the blessings or benefits for which we should praise God are listed in our lesson today:

Forgiveness— Notice how complete is His forgiveness. He forgives all of our iniquities. "If we confess our sins, he is faithful and just to forgive us our sins, and to cleanse us from all unrighteousness."

Healing— Afflicted one, take courage and have faith in God, for "He healeth all thy diseases." "Himself took our infirmities and bare our sicknesses."

Protector—Not only does He protect us from countless dangers in this life; but He has redeemed us from eternal destruction.

Coronation— Crowns of this world are greatly coveted. How much more should we desire to be crowned by the Lord, with His lovingkindness and tender mercies.

Satisfaction— There is no real soul satisfaction outside of God. "He satisfieth the longing soul, and filleth the hungry soul with goodness."

If God had dealt with us according to our iniquities, there would be no hope for sinful man. Notice the extent of his mercy which is extended to them that fear Him. (The fear of the Lord is to depart from evil.) He removes our sins so far from them that they will never be remembered again.

The manifold expressions of God's mercy are to "such as keep His covenant." Those who break his covenant should accept His offer of pardoning mercy, turn from their evil ways and do right, that they might be partakers of all His benefits.

COMMENTS AND APPLICATIONS

David composed this song when the Ark was brought back to Jerusalem; but the Psalm is also a prophecy of Christ's coming to bring salvation to the people of the earth (whosoever will) then of his coming to judge the people in the end.

The return from literal captivity caused the Jews to rejoice and inspired them to sing "a new song." Today, when one is redeemed from captivity in sin by the blood of Jesus to walk in newness of life, the Lord puts a "new song in their mouth, even praises unto our God." The world is ever searching for something new. New songs are very much in demand. Many are being produced, only to be cast aside as old after they have been sung a few times. No song has ever been composed by man to equal the new song which God puts into the hearts of every born-again person. Thank God, He has taught us this new song and we are confident that it shall never grow old.

"And when in scenes of glory, I sing the new, new song, "Twill be the old, old story That I have loved so long."

Show forth his salvation—tell others about it in word and action that they may see and desire it. Salvation is a glorious work. Be not silent about its glories lest they grow dim in your own soul.

Heathen are those who are not acquainted with the true God. We find heathen even among professed Christians. "Even when the objects of the worship of the heathen have real existence, yet their existence does not render them worthy of homage." The Lord made everything and He alone should be worshiped. The time has come when they that worship the Lord must worship him in spirit and in truth—in the beauty of holiness.

COMMENTS AND APPLICATIONS

None but the Lord can search the heart. We do not need to testify to Him about the thoughts and intents of our hearts, because He knows all about them. He said about the people in Noah's time. "And God saw that the wickedness of man was great in the earth, and that every imagination of the thoughts of his heart was only evil continually."

Sinner, you will never know how contrary your thoughts are to the purity of God until you have asked Him to show your heart to you as He sees it.

He will uncover many things that you did not realize were there. God is man's maker and knows perfectly his every thought and action. The sooner one realizes this, the greater are his hopes for a happy eternity. "Men love darkness rather than light because their deeds are evil," hence they try to hide from God as Adam and Eve. and Cain did. The time is surely coming when God will call each one from his hiding place and require him to give an account of the deeds done in the body. We must even give an account for every idle word that we speak. Why try to hide from God in the day when His mercy is extended? The sinful account can be settled now with far less shame and embarrasment to the sinner than if he should try to cover up his sins in this life and be brought face to face with them after the day of God's mercy is past.

Selfishness has no part where the gift of giving is exercised.

The latter part of this lesson teaches faithfulness in the use of riches, and indeed we will be rewarded according to how we use what is intrusted to us. Very few rich saints, but all they have is consecrated to God. Every need in the world for God is met many times by great sacrifice on the part of God's little ones.

It is not safe to trust in riches for many times they take wings (as it were) and fly away.
