The Second Coming of Christ

"And when he had spoken these things, while they beheld, he was taken up; and a cloud received him out of their sight. And while they looked sted-fastly toward heaven as he went up, behold, two men stood by them in white apparel; [now notice what these men said] which also said, Ye men of Galilee, why stand ye gazing up into heaven? this same Jesus, which is taken up from you into heaven, shall so come in like manner, as ye have seen him go into heaven." Acts 1:9-11. Notice it says, he will come in like manner. He was caught up in a cloud, and that is the way he is coming back.

Notice John 14:1-3, "Let not your heart be troubled: ye believe in God, believe also in me. In my Father's house are many mansions. If it were not so, I would have told you. I go to prepare a place for you. And if I go and prepare a place for you, I will come again, and receive you unto myself; that where I am, there ye may be also." He said he would go and prepare a place for us. That doesn't sound like he was going to set up a literal kingdom here on this earth, does it? No, dear reader, Jesus will never set his foot on this earth again, but we do know he is coming again.

Let us read Matt. 16:27 and notice the purpose of his coming. "For the Son of man shall come in the glory of his Father with his angels; and then he shall reward every man according to his works."

"Then shall the king say unto them on his right hand, Come, ye blessed of my Father, inherit the kingdom prepared for you from the foundation of the world." Notice, we inherit this kingdom he is speaking of. "Then shall he say also unto them on the left hand, Depart from me, ye cursed, into everlasting fire, prepared for the devil and his angels."

"And these shall go away into everlasting punishment: but the righteous into life eternal." Dear reader, you can see plainly that both classes are to receive their reward at the same time.

Notice, it will be the separation day, to separate the good from the bad, and everybody will be there, both young and old, small and great. Rev. 20:11-15, "And I saw a great white throne, and him that sat on it, from whose face the earth and heaven fled away; and there was found no place for them." John 18:36, "Jesus answered: If my kingdom were of this world, then would my servants fight, that I should not be delivered to the Jews; but now is my kingdom not from hence.

ALL the dead will be raised at the same time, at his coming. Rev. 20:12-15. "And I saw the dead small and great stand before God: and the books were opened; and another book was opened, which is the book of life; and the dead [all the dead] were judged out of those things which were written in the books, according to their works." ALL stood before him; not just the righteous, but both righteous and sinners.

The coming of Christ will be the last day. John 11:23-24, "Martha saith unto him, I know that he shall rise again in the resurrection at the last day" So Martha understood that the resurrection day would be the last day. Now if it is the last day; there will be no other day. Notice John 6:39, 40, "This is the Father's will which hath sent me, that of all which he hath given me that I should lose nothing, but should raise it up again at the last day. And this is the will of him that sent me, that every one which seeth the Son, and believeth on him, may have everlasting life: and I will raise him up at the last day Now the 44th verse: "No man can come to me, except the Father which hath sent me draw him: and

I would claim one and brother the other. Mother's ears caught what we were saying, so she called us into the house to talk to us. She told us that God Almighty could strike us dead. This put the fear of God in my heart to stay. When seventeen years of age, I attended a meeting. It seemed that the preacher was aiming right at me. He told me all the mean things that I ever did. When altar call was given, I sat seemingly frozen to my seat, thinking I would die if I did go and would die if I did not go, so I decided to die going. My burden was taken away and love filled my heart, but I didn't get what I wanted. I did not shout. So I went back to worldly pleasure for ten years. I became tired of that drinking, dancing, swearing, and fighting; so I said, "Old booze, if this is what you are bringing me to, I have quit you, and besides, I will seek the Lord." That is what I did.

A meeting was in progress. I was the first to answer the altar call for about ten nights. I was so miserable I did not care for company, so I got out ahead of the congregation and went on down the road alone. I stopped to consider my case when I was near my home, and said, "I guess I am too hard for the Lord doesn't want me, and there is no use

Then I heard a voice which said, "You will have to love God with all your heart."

I responded, "Yes, Lord, I love you."

He said, "You will have to love everybody else."
"Yes, Lord, I love everybody but one man. I can't love him."

He said, "You will have to love him, too."

I stopped to consider that. I knew He did not want me to love his evil ways or his body, but his soul. I said, "Yes, Lord, I love him, too." Then my burden rolled away and I was filled with joy unspeakable and full of glory. Oh, heaven filled my soul. The next morning I saw out of spiritual eyes. All things had become new. Then as I was driving along the road the Lord asked me what I would rather do, preach the gospel, be a missionary, or do Sunday School work. Then He showed me I was sitting on a nice grassy beach overlooking the ocean. He showed me His servants out on the rough waves, laboring and patiently toiling on. He said, "It is about time you are taking some of that."

I was attending a mission. One night I went home, took a chair in my bedroom. I was not asleep. Jesus came in on my left side and brought Satan in on my right side. Jesus asked me, "Will you serve me?" I said, "Lord, I can't preach, I can't pray, I can't sing, I can't testify even; I do not know what I can do for you." The blessed one ignored all those excuses and asked the same question again, "Will you serve me?"

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All Saints Ought To Be Seriously Interested Now or Never

Do you want to preserve the songs in the "Select Hymns" song book?

The Gospel Trumpet Company has offered to sell us the plates to all the songs in the "Select Hymns" song book, with the exception of six which they do not have the right to give us permission to print, for the sum of \$500.00. Unless we buy these plates now, the chances are we shall never have another opportunity.

In the campmeetings this summer, when the subject was brought up, the brethren and sisters were unanimous in declaring that we should purchase these plates, and do it now. In order to pay for these plates, we need the money in less than forty days. All who are interested in getting these plates so we can print the songs, should send in their offering as soon as possible.

We are expecting to select about 400 of the songs and make a book of them, which would make the new book about one third smaller than the original book. This will be more convenient with less cost. If the saints will send in offerings to pay for the plates, we will furnish the material and do the work in the printing them and fixing the book. We expect to put extra good quality of paper in the book, which would cost us several hundred dollars. The price for the book when finished would be fifty cents each, and less in dozens and hundreds.

Every one who will send in a dollar now will be entitled to a song book when they are finished.—fifty cents would be a donation on the plates and the other fifty cents to pay for the book. If a congregation wants twenty-four books, they can send in twenty-four dollars—twelve dollars for the plates and twelve dollars for the twenty-four books. Let each saint act at once so we can get the plates and preserve these songs which are so dear to all of us.

Auto Tires Wanted

To all the dear saints scattered abroad: We send greetings in the name of Jesus Christ, our Savior.

In as much as we are living and working under very abnormal conditions it may be necessery to resort to some abnormal steps to prevent unnecessary curtailment of the gospel work in these times when it should be going forward at top speed. Knowing the general policy of cooperation of all true saints in the matters of the gospel, we feel good in bringing this matter before you as a means in which some of you may be able to help in the cause. The matter to which we refer is regarding tires for the ministers' cars.

No doubt all can see how vitally important it is to work to keep the ministers cars running as long as possible. Ministers are eligible to buy tires through the rationing boards but the latest regulations governing the use of ration tires are such as to so curtail the work of our ministers that they want to stay free from those restrictions just as long as possible. When ration tires are installed on a minister's car they can then only use that car to call on members of their congregation only in cases of serious sickness or death--not for ordinary and regular visiting which ministers usually do. They cannot run errands for the aged and infirm and take them to meeting which is a part of the regular work of almost every minister. They cannot fill appointments unless more than three miles distant and then only when no other means of transportation is available. You can see that their work is curtailed more than half and in order to keep free from these restrictions and be able to be the greatest help and blessing to every soul possible some are running on tires that are not at all dependable as regulars and taking chances on being stranded every time they go on the road Ere long these cars will either be parked or on the "restricted use" list unless some other means of putting tires on them is worked out.

Again, there is not only the matter of eligibility to purchase tires but there is the matter of the available supply. I was informed a few days ago in the town where I live that the local ration board had on file sufficient tire orders to absorb all their quota to December. That would mean that a car here on which the tires were unserviceable even though eligible to purchase tires would have to sit up at least until the first of the year before tires would be available.

All this is just by way of explanation of why we are bringing this matter before you saints. We feel that perhaps some of you may have extra tires in your possession that would give considerable service and maybe yield several souls if it were mounted on some minister's car and not inconvenience you either. Then perhaps others of you may have four good tires on your car and also a good spare. In such a case, you seeing and under-

standing the need, the Lord might help you to realize that you could get along alright with a spare not quite so good and that good spare of yours might be put on a minister's car and traded for his which was more worn but yet servicable enough for a spare. Then perhaps some of you may live in a territory where gas rationing is in effect and may be permitted only a very limited use of your car and yet it may have a good set of tires on it. In such a case the Lord might help you to realize that in order to help the cause of God along you could trade some of those good tires to a minister for his that were more worn and yet they would be quite satisfactory for the limited driving you do and not limit you any more than you already are.

By this method the ministers, cars might be supplied to keep going until the crisis is past or the Lord comes (whichever happens first) and in such a way that their work would not be so limited as to be largely ineffectual. I am sure the Lord will richly bless you who can and will cooperate in this matter.

Now we are not asking for a gift. We are wanting to buy tires and they are not available on the open market We are wanting to find out where we can buy them. Neither are we wanting you to suffer any undue inconvenience We are wanting to find those tires which can be sold or, in cases where the car is only moderately used, can be traded for more worn tires without inconveniencing the car owner unduly.

There is a present need with different ones of the ministers. If you have serviceable tires to dispose of they should not find their way into worldly channels but should be put to work for the Lord. If you feel like cooperating and can, write the Faith Publishing House immediately. State what size tire you have, what condition it is in, what service might be expected from it and what price you want for it. State whether you want to sell it outright or whether you want to trade for another tire. This information will be forwarded on to some minister needing tires to keep going. It will not be worthwhile to pay express charges, etc., on tires unless there is considerable service in them yet.

What Does The Cross Signify?

Just recently when passing a costly imposing church building with a beautiful cross on its spire, I noticed on the front lawn a bill board advertising a bingo card party and dance. My thoughts were: "Do those who come here to the services really sense the meaning or signification of the cross high up on the church spire?

If I should ask someone in authority there, they would most likely answer me that the cross was a symbol of their faith and hope in Christ.

Many other religious organizations perhaps would answer me the same. Apparently the cross just symbolizes their intellectual belief in Christ and his resurrection and life. If the Apostle Paul were here today as he once was, what a stern blistering rebuke would he hurl at those apostate church societies with their carnivals, oyster, turkey and chicken suppers, bingo card parties and dances and many other worldly entertainments to amuse their members. Multitudes of professed Christians, or those who go to religious services know but very little of what the cross of Christ represents as concerns righteous, holy living as required by God.

A sincere, heart-felt, fervent, craving desire to read and study the Word of God reveals that the cross symbolizes very much more than just head belief in Christ. The devoted Christian learns that the cross is a symbol of life and death as well. As you look upon it, does it not speak out to you silently what it represents to your very life, seemingly to ask if you have crucified self, houses, lands, friends,

and loved ones with all earthly ties and bonds, or everything that would deter you from following Jesus all the way? See Matt. 10:37, 38. In 1 Cor. 15:31, Paul meant that he died daily or crucified self or that nature opposing Christ.

In Gal. 6:14, Paul declares, "The world is crucified unto me, and I unto the world. To many, it is a great temptation and battle to constantly overcome and have perfect victory from sinful lusts of the flesh so common to mankind. Such lusts prevent many for setting their affections (love) on things of Christ.

"They that are Christ's have crucified the flesh with the affections [love] and lusts" Galatians 5:24. "Mortify [as though non-existant or destroyed by an iron-clad, God-given, controlled, masterly will-power over sinful passions or fleshly desires] therefore your members which are upon the earth; fornication, uncleanness, inordinate [wrong] affections, evil concupiscence, and covetousness, which is idolatry." Col. 3:5. They that follow Jesus must deny themselves and take up their cross daily, Matt. 19:29.

A full gospel Christian regards it a blessed opportunity, honor, and privilege to daily live a crucified life in Christ Jesus our Lord. A death to self and carnality can only be realized by a strictly spiritual contact with Christ resulting from a re-created (bornagain) life. That the body of sin be destroyed in everyone's daily life, the old man (sinful nature) must be crucified (destroyed. (Rom. 6:6.)

Romans 12:1 indicates a human sacrifice, a generating spiritual power constantly functioning and producing a perfect obedient will and mind to measure up to all the fundamentals of a full gospel doctrine. This is nothing short of a crucified life with Christ living in you. It may be a hard thing to do, and it calls for a real sacrifice to take up your cross with a willingness to give up your loved ones and friends for Christ's sake. It was such to the rich young man who asked Jesus what he should do to inherit eternal life, Mark 10:21.

It calls for a crucifixion and sacrifice before the pure, clear light of the gospel can shine into your changed heart and life, revealing the many detriments of Christian progress; such as, wearing jewelry, costly, superfluous array or worldly, fashionable dressing that lowers the honor, dignity, and respect of girl and womanhood. All other vanities; such as, cigarette smoking, booze, and night parties must be crucified; for bear in mind all worldly pleasures and popularity tends to sign your death warrant to the glories and riches of eternal life and peace to your soul.

To the wife or husband: have you crucified yourselves to all others by honoring and esteeming one another far above any other one, no matter how attractive and appealing they may appear to you? If you have, then you are co-operating with Christ to throttle, stop and defeat that satanic monster of evil—DIVORCE. To those who have put their hands to the plow to press and labor on to more fertile ground, how shameful, contemptible, and low to even think of stopping and looking back to consider the beggarly elements of this hostile, evil world, and thus crucify to themselves the Son of God afresh! (Heb. 6:6) and put him to an open shame!

GOD'S MINISTERS

The impression has been very strong for some time to write an article on this subject. I realize my weakness to cope with the subject as it should be, however, in the name of Jesus, I will do my duty in His divine fear.

The foundation of the Christian religion has been brought about and through God's ministry. When our Lord called the first ministers in the early morning of the apostolic age, He chose them from among the fishermen and shepherds-a lowly class of people (Matt. 10:1-6) and they were sent by our Lord into all the world with divine power and authority over all devils and diseases with the promise that he would supply all their need. These were t. evangelize the world in his stead; for he (Jesus, was to soon be crucified. But He was to leave them the precious Holy Spirit to guide them into all the truth. The seventy He also called with similiar qualifications and power. These were to teach men to observe (or do) all the Word of God (Matt. 28:18).

In Ephesians 4:11, 12, "He gave some apostles [or planters]; and some prophets; and some evangelists; and some, pastors, and teachers; for the perfecting of the saints, for the work of the ministry, for the edifying of the body of Christ: Till we all come in the unity of the faith, and of the knowledge of the Son of God, unto a perfect man, unto the measure of the stature of the fulness of Christ."

Notice God's wisdom in the selecting of the different officers to carry on His work in the body of Christ, which is his church. Each one was to labor under the Lord's divine guidance and man had nothing to do in calling and qualifying these different ministers. They were to go as the Spirit of God led them and to work in the capacity in which each was qualified. We shall take them in God's order and study each one briefly and trust that we may all see our place in the body of Christ and work there, well pleasing unto Him that calleth us.

The apostles were the first mentioned. An apostle is called a planter, one who goes into the harvest field and plants the truth. The apostolic ministry was primarily to take the place of Jesus, for he was soon to be crucified, and they were to carry on His great plan of evangelizing the world,

hence he gave them his Spirit so they could carry on his divine plan after his departure (John 14:16, 17; John 16:13). These had a very great responsibility, going as it were in the lead. The highest calling that could be, with power over all the enemy. God did the calling and no place did men set up a school or seminary.

Next we notice in the order were prophets. These had divine power to fortell events, and to expound the prophetic scriptures, and to show through the old scriptures the very Christ as a Saviour, a Mediator between men and God. These also had spiritual discernment and could read the signs according to the gift of prophecy. Jonah had a prophetical message, but God's anger was stopped because they believed his message.

Evangelists or itinerant preachers, or one passing from house to house or locality a local evangelist. These also had the same power and authority according to their divine order. They "could go into all wife world" but were more localized. They, too, had God's backing, power and authority. These also had to pass a very high standard according to Titus 1:6, and they were to be equipped with the Holy Spirit as a guide and to have the needed power to cope with the evil spirits in which they were to meet.

The next one is pastors, or those having the charge or oversight of a church or congregation. After the evangelist was through his mission and souls found the Savior, then the pastor's responsibility began. He must take the oversight willingly, not for gain, for Jesus is his paymaster, but with a feeling akin to a mother over her children—not a lord over God's heritage or slave driver, but he must be gentle, "apt to teach."

The pastor prays and studies each one of his flock with the thought in view of helping each one to grow thereby. Sometimes problems arise between his sheep. He must act as a mediator until at least he has sufficient evidence to act. The pastor feeds the flock (Acts 20:28). The Holy Spirit makes the overseer. Sometimes he may need to warn the unruly, but it is always in love. In extreme cases he might need to tell the congregation the spiritual status of the ones labored with. The pastor is the only one to see after the flock and to execute the judgments against offenders. The lay members, as we term them, sometimes must see after their pastor's needs and esteem them highly for their works sake. A true pastor will do his best to keep out division and defend his congregation against every evil whether it be false prophets, wolves in sheep's clothing, or any kind of a wrong spirit. Where there is no pastor, the most spiritual ones have these duties to perform, but in reality belong to the pastor or overseer.

All the ministry working in divine order can

keep out every scismatic spirit. The evangelist working for God and souls gets the truth planted in the hearts of men. They become converted, then the pastor begins his labors in caring for them. They need food, and get it from the pastor, hence they grow.. There are some that have almost all of these qualifications and can work as an evangelist or pastor either, but few have this calling.

The pastor must go when duty demands it, for his flock may be in danger. Some lamb may be languishing, almost dead. The congregation must listen to the teaching and advice given—must obey them that have the rule over them, and should never try to take the oversight in that which belongs to the pastor. The pastor feeds them spiritual food and they (congregation) feed the pastor temporal needs. What beautiful harmony! all working for God doing service heartily as unto God.

The pastors have the care of the congregation and the oversight, but not as a harsh ruler. And the pastor and congregation must keep in harmony. It is right and proper for a whole-hearted co-operation and consultation among the members for the success of God's work.

The last ones mentioned in this list are teachers. These all come under the same qualification. All the body of Christ have some duty to perform, and to be a teacher of God's truth means much to bring about the unity that Jesus prayed for. But as God leads each one in his office with the several different gifts of the Spirit and work of God, if each one will keep humble and stay in God's order, every scismatic spirit can be kept out from among God's children. All of God's ministry are subject to God and each other, and will work in full harmony. But should one of these ministers get to thinking more highly of himself than he ought to think, he disqualifies himself and can cause much trouble. Let us study to fulfil our calling satisfactorily with God and saints.

Practical Truth: Beverage alcohol has always been a problem and is becoming more so in this machine age.

COMMENTS AND APPLICATION

Gen. 13:13. The problems confronting the ages of the past are in many respects like the present times, and the condition Sodom and Gomorrah had fallen to is truly facing us and our children in these last days. For their exceeding sinfulness had so increased and the people of these cities had forgotten God and given themselves over so completely that he purposed to destroy them and all their substance.

They were located along the banks of the fertile Jordan River, and the great increase of wealth and idleness had furnished occasion to cause them to so order their manner of shame and gross sinfulness that to this day they stand out as a land mark in the annals of time. For the heavenly messengers that appeared to Abraham said the cry of their sins had come up to heaven. And truly the cry of this wicked generation is reaching unto heaven, and we know not how soon God will punish this time world for the gross sins they are indulging in today. The awful effects of drinking and reveling which follow any sinful people was probably prevalent in Sodom and Gomorrah. No doubt, Lot made a sad mistake to take his family in such a place, and it was only his fear of God that saved him and his family.

Gen. 19:23-25. When the angels told Lot to flec to the mountains, he requested permission to stop short and locate in Loar, a small city. But as it is today, when we want our way instead of doing what God commands we fall in many sinful things.

The Lord rained fire and brimstone upon Sodom and Gomorrah and destroyed all the people with all that grew upon the ground. This shows us, today, the great wrath of God that will be poured out on all that forget God, and all gluttons and winebibbers will be cast into the lake of fire and brimstone.

Deut. 32:31-33. The scripture here gives us a picture of the wines of Sodom and Gomorrah. Their grapes are grapes of gall, the clusters are bitter. Their wine is the poison of dragons, and the cruel venom of asps, sig-

nigfying how awful the effects on all those that drink the deadly cup. First it is bitter as gall; and where is it more keenly felt than at this present day? Those who indulge in its sinful way know the bitter remorse and reproach that follows the users of all intoxicating liquors. What is more poison to the body and more able to destroy souls than this awful sin?

Amos 6:1-7. Here the prophet foretells the many things that accompany the drink habit. The people love idleness and ease and cause the seat of violence to come near. How truly do those who drink get enraged and many times kill even their loved ones! The houses of bright lights furnished with gay music to allure men and women steeped in awful sin accompany it; also drinking wine in bowls or something that holds more than a glass. And here God was warning them of the awful influence upon all who do these things then; and today, God still is warning all nations to turn away from their evil ways and he will receive us if we will repent.

24. And they took him, and cast him into a pit: and the pit was empty, there was no water in it.

25. And they sat down to eat bread: and they lifted up their eyes and looked, and, behold, a company of Ishmeelites came from Gilead with their camels bearing spicery and balm and myrrh, going to carry it down to Egypt.

26. And Judah said unto his brethren, What profit is it if we slay our brother, and conceal his blood?

COMMENTS AND APPLICATION

This is indeed a very dark picture, but sin is always dark. We see this lad very tired, no doubt, from his long journey, looking for his brothers that he might see if they were well so he could return and tell his anxious father.

When they saw Joseph waving the coat of many colors, it caused that jealousness and covetousness to arise in their wicked hearts, so they stripped him of his coat and cast him into a pit. But thank God, He knows how to deliver us out of a pit if we are pliable in his dear hands. He will send help, though like Joseph, we may not see it at the time, it will work for our good and carry out his blessed plan.

No doubt, Joseph wondered why he should be sold and carried away into a strange land. Many times when our hearts are made sad because we don't understand, our hearts would be made to rejoice if we could only know it was God using us to work out such wonderful

After they had cast Joseph into the pit, their hearts were so hard that they could sit down and eat bread even while their brother was suffering so near them. It seemed to ease their conscience some when they found a way of disposing of him without killing him, and they thought they were covering up their awful deeds. But the Word says, "Be sure your sins will find you out. They killed a kid and dipped the ccat in blood and returned it to his father, bringing much sorrow to his heart. Little did he know that it was the hand of the Lord using this dear young life to preserve life and care for his people.

Jacob was so grieved and perhaps blamed himself very much for sending his dear Son away. He said he would go to his grave mourning the awful death of his son. These wicked sons rose up to comfort their father, thus trying to hide their guilt. Oh, how deceitful is sin and to what length it will go to keep from being detected, but this sin was at last found out as all sin will be. "You can't do wrong and get by." We are glad that by our trueness to God, he can use us to bring about good for ourselves and others, and teach us valuable lessons.

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JUDAH: AN EXAMPLE OF SELF-SACRIFICE

Gen. 44:18. Then Judah came near unto him, and said, Oh my lord, let thy servant, I pray thee, speak a word in my lord's ears, and let not thine anger burn against thy servant: for thou art even as Pharaoh.

- 19. My lord asked his servants, saying, Have ye a father, or a brother?
- 20. And we said unto my lord, We have a father, an old man, and a child of his old age, a little one; and his brother is dead, and he alone is left of his mother, and his father loveth him.
- 21. And thou saidst unto thy servants, Bring him down unto me, that I may set mine eyes upon him.

- 29. And if ye take this also from me, and mischief befall him, ye shall bring down my gray hairs with sorrow to the grave.
- 30. Now therefore when I come to thy servant my father, and the lad be not with us; seeing that his life is bound up in the lad's life;
- 31. It shall come to pass, when he seeth that the lad is not with rs, that he will die: and thy servants shall bring down the gray hairs of thy servant our father with sorrow to the grave.
- 32. For thy servant became surety for the lad unto my father, saying, If I bring him not unto thee, then! shall bear the blame to my father for ever.
- 33. Now therefore, I pray thee, let thy servant abida instead of the lad a bondman to my lord; and let the lad go up with his brethren.
- 34. For how shall I go up to my father, and the lad be not with me? lest peradventure I see the evil that shall come on my father.

Golden Text: "Hereby perceive we the love of God, because he laid down his life for us: and we ought to lay down our lives for the brethren.' 1 John 3:16.

Practical Truth: True love shows itself in sacrifices for others.

COMMENTS AND APPLICATION

Things that Lead up to the Subject of this Lesson

- 9. Here we come to the end of the cause of the sacrifice which Judah makes. It was a great sacrifice, and proves to Joseph that his brethren are not the heartless men they were more than twenty years ago when they

wanted to take his life because of their jealousy.

While in the presence of Joseph they chide themselves and say, or see, they are so treated by this great man in Egypt, and begin to believe God has a hand in it because of what they did to their brother so long ago.

While chiding themselves, Joseph is so moved with Judah's willingness to make this sacrifice. Read Gen. 44:18-34—especially verse 33: "Now therefore, I pray thee, let thy servant abide instead of the lad a bondman to my lord: and let the lad go up with his brethren"a great sacrifice. He makes the sacrifice so Benjamin can go home to spare the aged father the sorrow of another tragedy which would, no doubt, take his life.

Joseph could stand it no longer. It was such a sacrifice on the part of this brother to become a bondman for life. So far as he knew, such a sacrifice would mean that he would never see his wife and family again.

How pathetic, how wonderful! And how graciously God overruled it all for him as He does for all who sacrifice for Him. Read again the golden text.

"True love shows itself in sacrifice for others."

JOSEPH: AN EXAMPLE OF FORGIVENESS Sunday, September 27, 1942.

Gen. 45:1. Then Joseph could not refrain himself before all them that stood by him; and he cried, Cause every man to go out from me. And there stood no man with him, while Joseph made himself known unto his brethren.

- 2. And he wept aloud: and the Egyptians and the house of Pharaoh heard.
- 3. And Joseph said unto his brethren, I am Joseph; doth my father yet live? And his brethren could not answer him; for they were troubled at his presence.
- 4. And Joseph said unto his brethren, Come near to me, I pray you. And they came near. And he said, I am Joseph your brother, whom ye sold into Egypt.
- 5. Now therefore be not grieved, nor angry with yourselves, that ye sold me hither: for God did send me before you to preserve life.
- 6. For these two years hath the famine been in the land: and yet there are five years, in the which there shall neither be earing nor harvest.
- 7. And God sent me before you to preserve you a posterity in the earth, and to save your lives by a great deliverance.
- 8. So now it was not you that sent me hither, but God: and he hath made me a father to Pharaoh, and lord of all his house, and a ruler throughout all the land of Egypt.
- 9. Haste ye, and go up to my father, and say unto him, Thus saith thy scn Joseph, God hath made me lord of all Egypt: come down unto me, tarry not:
- 10. And thou shalt dwell in the land of Goshen, and thou shalt be near unto me, thou, and thy children, and thy children's children, and thy flocks, and thy herds, and all that thou hast:
- 11. And there will I nourish thee; for yet there are five years of famine; lest thou, and thy household, and all that thou hast, come to poverty.

- 12. And, behold, your eyes see, and the eyes of my brother Benjamin, that it is my mouth that speaketh unto vou.
- 13. And ye shall tell my father of all my glory in Egypt, and of all that ye have seen; and ye shall haste and bring down my father hither.

 14. And he fell upon his brother Benjamin's neck,
- and wept; and Benjamin wept upon his neck.
- 15. Moreover he kissed all his brethren, and wept upon them; and after that his brethren talked with him. Gen. 47:11. And Joseph placed his father and his
- brethren, and gave them a possession in the land of Egypt, in the best of the land, in the land of Rameses, as Pharaoh had commanded. 12. And Joseph nourished his father, and his brethren,

and all his father's household, with bread, according to their families. Golden Text: "Be ye kind one to another, tenderhearted, forgiving one another, even as God for Christ's

sake hath forgiven you." Eph. 4:32. Practical Truth: Christ's spirit is a forgiving spirit, and those who do not possess it are none of his.

COMMENTS AND APPLICATION

This is the third lesson taken from the life of Joseph. We hope you have read the full account in the Bible in order to fully understand the printed portion. In today's lesson, his life had reached the climax. His night of weeping was ended; now the morning of joy had dawned, when he should see his dreams come true and receive the reward for his long suffering in patience.

He had tested his brethren and found that they were truly sorry for their great sin against him. They were in a penitent state and ready for forgiveness, so he revealed himself to them. The words, "I am Joseph," could but bring to their hearts a sonse of fear because of their guilt, for his place and power afforded him a wonderful opportunity for revenge. But Joseph had a forgiving heart and yearned for their love. In spite of his great sufferings at their hands, he could look above them and see God in it all. God had made the wrath of man to praise him, and used them as instruments in his hands. Though they had no plans but to get rid of the one they hated, God used their actions to "preserve life."

Do you know of a time in your life when others meant to do you wrong, but God worked it out for good? Jesus' persecutors and murderers meant evil, but

God by their means wrought out salvation.

Joseph's forgiving spirit very closely resembles that of our Saviour. A sinner trespasses against the Lord in many ways, thinking he should do many things contrary to Jesus Christ of Nazareth. But in His mercy, He brings things to bear against him to get him to see his sin that he might repent and be forgiven. Should he get justice for his sins it would be death, for the wages of sin is death but the gift of God is eternal life through Jesus Christ our Lord. Should he trample His mercy under foot until he stands before Him in judgment, he can not be relieved of the feeling of guilt and fear such as Joseph's brothers had when they faced their judge; but if he confesses and forsakes sin and pleads for mercy here, he can hear what Joseph's brethren did: "Be not grieved," and "Go in peace, thy sins be forgiven thee."

It is good to know that the Lord so freely forgives; but don't forget that if you do not forgive men their trespasses, neither will your heavenly Father forgive your trespasses. Therefore, "Be ye kind, tender hearted, forgiving others even as God for Christ's sake hath for-

given you."
