Also in the 18th verse of this chapter we read, "Yea, a man may say, Thou hast faith, and I have works: shew me thy faith without thy works, and I will show thee my faith by my works."

Jesus said in John 14:23, "If a man love me, he will keep my words." Much is said about having "the victory." No one has "the victory" who does not love Jesus well enough to keep his commandments as far as he knows.

Did you know that when you seem to feel and act pious now and perhaps in an hour or two you have flown "off the handle," and are ready to grit your teeth at some one—maybe your nearest friend—for some unthoughted or trivial matter or scold and pout around awhile instead of approaching them in a spirit of meekness, that to claim "the victory" is to deceive yourself? The Smoking Girl

The great tobacco concerns of the U. S. are putting forth a powerful effort to put a cigarette in the mouth of every girl possible. It is one of the most serious evils that confronts us today. It is tremendously injurious to the health, well-being, morality and spirituality of the girl. No cigarette-smoking girl can be at her best. It is impossible. The cigarette habit is demoralizing to both men and women, but more especially to women. Nicotine is one of the most deadly poisons known to man, therefore the girl who smokes cigarettes continually fills her system with a poison that undermines her health, her morals, her virtue, and her womanhood.

It is hard for us to believe that a real lady will smoke cigarettes. The girl who becomes addicted to cigarettes is usually morally loose, or will become so. Cigarette smoking is one of the most undermining. moral-wrecking habits possible for a girl to form. It weakens her physically, mentally, morally, and spiritually; therefore it opens up and paves the way to other immoral habits. The cigarette smoker has no great will power. This is true of boys and men, much more of girls and women. This evil habit dulls the mind, saps the vitality, destroys the health, wrecks the morals, eventually shortens life and sends the soul into eternity unprepared to meet God. It is said that every cigarette anyone smokes shortens his life forty seconds! We do not doubt but that it will exceed this, and more especially with the girl, as she is not so strong to throw off the deadly poison as the boy or man.

What a pity that the great tobacco concerns are cursing the girlhood of America with cigarettes as they have cursed the boyhood for many years past! All they care for is the money they get out of it. They do not care a straw for the health and happiness of our girls, for the morality, virtue and spirituality of our girls, how they go to destruction thru the use of cigarettes, and the filthy, hateful, godless use of tobacco, just so they fill their coffers with filthy lucre; just so they make big money, have fine homes to live in, fine cars to ride in, fine clothes to wear, plenty to eat, and have a big time. It is absolutely wrong. They can not curse the girlhood, womanhood, boyhood, and manhood of the world and get by. They may be sure their sin will find them out. No one can do wrong and get by.

The girl who smokes cigarettes will use dope and liquor oftentimes. One bad, destructive habit calls for another. When one is weakened at one point in life it is an evident fact that it weakens at other points. Cigarette smoking is very weakening—physically, mentally, morally, and spiritually. It is very, very destructive to girlhood. Just as the tobacco concerns are determined to put a cigarette in the mouth

of every girl, if they possibly can, so the cursed liquor interests are determined to put a bottle to the lips of every girl if they can. The evils of various kinds go together; one calls for another.

You will notice that the great tobacco advertisements today picture the girl very prominent and outstanding as smoking and endorsing the cigarette. This is to popularize one of the greatest evils and curses that ever struck the land. A popular evil is always a very cursed evil. It is so very hard to outlaw and put down. The girl advertized as smoking cigarettes and endorsing them is pictured as healthy, rosy, beautiful, and noble, which is an absolute falsehood. She should be pictured as pale, swarthy, sickly, weakly, immoral, and wretched. That would come far nearer the truth of the whole matter. But such would defeat the sale and use of tobacco. The cigarette-smoking girl will never be a good wife and mother; never make a home happy; never lift a country to greater heights; never bless the churches and schools of our land; never leave her mark in the world to bless mankind; never live nobly and sublimely and die victoriously. Risen With Christ

In Col. 3:1, we read: "If ye then be risen with Christ, seek those things which are above, where Christ sitteth on the right hand of God. It is essential for a devoted Christian to be hid away from the temporal things of this life, in a secret dwelling place with Christ that the world knows not of, where our souls are continually reaching out for and feasting on heavenly soul food, where we are continually dwelling and conversing in sweet communion with the Almighty.

2 Cor. 5:1, "For we know that if our earthly house of this tabernacle were dissolved, we have a building of God, an house not made with hands, eternal in the Heavens." We have an assurance in our souls that if all temporal things of this life, even houses and lands and even our own bodies were to pass away, we still have a Blessed Home not made by man, a home where Jesus and all the righteous dwell all through Eternity in the heavens. To be sen with him is to dwell with him, and when we swell with Him our souls are continually communing and feasting with him on Heavenly manna.

Eph. 3:14,15. "For this cause I bow my knees unto the Father of our Lord, Jesus Christ, of whom the whole family in heaven and earth is named."

God's church is one. Eph. 4:4; Rom. 12:4,5. Man's churches are many. God's church is named after God, John 17:11,12; 1Cor. 10:32; 1 Tim. 3:5; and Acts 20:28. Man's churches are often named after some man.

In God's church every member is saved, as Christ is the door and no sinner can get in until he repents and forsakes all his sins. Christ opens and shuts the door Himself. Rev. 3:7,8. The door of salvation is always open. The door into man's church is opened by man, therefore many sinners get into his church. In God's church there are no sinners but all are righteous. Isa. 60:21.

In man's church, a committee gives the preacher a subject to preach on, also the length of time to preach on the subject given him—at least it is this way many times on special occasions. In God's church the Holy Spirit gives the message and the length of time in which to deliver it. In man's church, one learns to preach by going to school. In God's church the Lord calls and qualifies and sends forth His ministers to preach His word. Eph. 4:11-13 God's church is the body of Christ of which He is the head. He has only one body which is the church of God. Eph. 4:4 and 5:23; Col. 1:18; 1 Cor. 12:27; Rom. 12:4, 5.

Guthrie Assembly Meeting

The State Assembly Meeting of the Church of God, held at Guthrie, Okla, during the holidays, was much better attended than the saints expected. REFUGE

A refuge is a place of safety, and protection and shelter from danger and distress. God is a refuge. He is a place of safety, and to abide in this refuge is to be safe from all harm. Nothing can molest one who abides in this refuge.

The Bible tells about cities of refuge in Numbers chapter 35. They were cities into which people could flee and be safe. Psalm 46:1 says God is our refuge and strength. The evil one cannot molest those who are hiding in God. Praise his name forever! "The eternal God is thy refuge, and underneath are the everlasting arms: and he shall thrust out the enemy from before thee; and shall say, Destroy them." Deut. 33:27. "And there shall be a tabernacle for a shadow in the day time from the heat, and for a place of refuge, and for a covert from storm and from rain." Isaiah 4:6. It is very comforting to the natural man to know that he has protection from heat and from storms; but the Lord in this passage of scripture is using literal examples of protection to portray to our hearts the protection which the soul will have when hid away in Him. It brings great peace and comfort to the spiritual man to have the assurance of such soul protection.

This refuge is available to all who will flee into it, but a very deplorable fact is that many will not flee to it, choosing rather some false protection for their souls. In Isa. 28:15 we read of some people who made a covenant with death and with hell and had made lies their refuge, and hid themselves under falsehood; but in verse 17 God warned them that hail would sweep away the refuge of lies, and the waters would overflow the hiding place.

God is not mocked, for whatsoever a man soweth, that shall he also reap. God knows just where each human being is hiding. In John 5:40 Jesus said, "Ye will not come to me that ye might have life." This place of refuge is a place of life. Jesus gave his life as a sacrifice that he might be our protection from death. We get into this refuge by a spiritual birth. He has given us instructions so that we need not be in doubt as to whether we are hiding in him or hiding in the refuge of lies.

This refuge is a place of love, for "God is love." It is a heavenly place or heaven-like, for He has raised us up together and made us to sit together in heavenly places in Christ Jesus. It is a place where the soul has great joy, but the flesh has no fun; for "to be carnally minded is death; but to be spiritually minded is life and peace." It is a place where fellowship with the world cannot enter. If any man love the world the love of the Father is not in him. It is a place of peace: "Great peace have they that love thy law and nothing shall offend them." It is a place of freedom from all sin, a place of holiness "The blood of Jesus Christ his son cleanseth us from all sin." "Follow peace with all men and holiness without which no man shall see the Lord." No pride can enter this refuge for the Lord hates a proud look. Facial makeup must be left on the outside, for the Lord beautifies the meek with salvation. Tobacco will not be found there, for He commands us to cleanse ourselves from all filthiness of the flesh, and we cannot enter unless we obey If anyone says he abides in his commandments. Christ and does not keep his commandments, he is a liar—hiding in the refuge of lies. (See 1 John 2:4). It is a place of light. "He that followeth me shall not walk in darkness, but shall have the light of life." Light represents salvation; and darkness, sin.

"I will say of the Lord, He is my refuge and my fortress, my God: in him will I trust." Psa. 91:2.



COMMENTS AND APPLICATIONS

Jesus, the light of the world—Jesus is to the human soul what the sun is to physical life. How much life could exist on the earth without the sun? Bro. C. E. Orr writes: "Men have tried to manufacture artificial sunlight, but they have not yet succeeded in inventing something that will melt the snows of winter, paint the flowers with beautiful colors, mantle the fields with covering of green, and shoot life through all nature. It is only God that can bring light, peace, and health to the soul." Men have made religions (artificial light), trying to satisfy the soul. They have succeeded in deceiving many, but they cannot melt the heart of stone, nor wash away the scarlet stains from the guilty, nor give new life to the soul. Jesus is the "Sun of righteousness." He has given us a view of the nature of God that satisfies our hearts; He has made known the way by which we can approach Him acceptably (repent of sin and accept the pardon and peace offered in Christ); He has given his people assurance of a life beyond the grave; He has revealed the evil in men's hearts, and shown them the way to be cleansed from that evil; and He points out the only way of safety for the soul. Wonderful light!

Jesus was conscious of His origin, so he could boldly witness for himself. Verse 24 is left out of our printed portion, but should be read, for it plainly states the consequences of turning from "the Light of the world" darkness and death.

The mark of a true disciple is that he continues in the words of Christ. To continue IN his word, would mean to be a continual doer of his word. Many of these Jews to whom He spoke in this lesson soon turned back to follow Him no more. Today, many start out on the way of the cross, but faint by the way or deliberately turn back. "He that shall endure unto the END, the same shall be saved." Let us ask the Lord for grace to endure. Many have fainted, many are fainting, and very likely others will faint, but it need not be you or I.

At the fall, man's soul was led captive by Satan. He was no longer free to do as he wanted to, for what his master told him to do, that he did. As Paul said, "What I would, that do I not; but what I hate, that I do." Culture, training, age or earthly wisdom could not deliver him from this tyrant. But Jesus came to redeem them from their task master and set them free from the bondage of sin. He makes them "free indeed."

The human minds of the Jews just could not understand how Jesus could be what he professed to be, especially that he existed before Abraham; so they attempted to put out "the Light of the World" with stones. That did not hinder the divine Sun from shining any more than a little dust thrown into the air hinders the sun from shining. The one who throws the dust may get it in his own eyes until he cannot see the sun, but it is shining as brightly as ever.

COMMENTS AND APPLICATIONS

The "Light of the world" continued to shine and give light to men in spite of the clouds and storms of hatred and opposition.

It is comforting to note that it was a busy Sabbath afternoon in a public place that Jesus "saw a man." He was a blind beggar, and doubtless the crowds had passed him by unheeding and little touched by his sad plight. The disciples saw him too, but their words do not give any evidence that they were moved with compassion. But Jesus saw him as one in need, and one who could be helped to the glory of God. The miracle was performed, the blind eyes were opened, and it caused no small stir among the Jew. They realized it was a miracle, so they took him to the Pharisees.

Their mistake was similar to the mistake which people make today. When they see a thing which testifies to the greatness of God, they take the matter to religious leaders (the majority of whom have unbelieving hearts), who endeavor to explain away the miracle. If people would go straight to Jesus instead of to their blind religious leaders, how many blind eyes would be

Many allowed the Pharisees to keep their minds prejudiced against Jesus, but this man's spiritual eyes were opened to truth as well as his natural eyes being opened.

All true Christians spiritually have the same experience as this blind man—groping in sin, they are poor, wretched, and blind. When they come into contact with Jesus he bids them to anoint their spiritual eyes with His Word of truth, and wash in His blood. All who obey in faith will "come seeing," and will be able to testify as this man did, "One thing I know, that whereas I was blind, now I see." This testimony has caused countless numbers to be cast out of the synagogues of men, but little matter, for Jesus receives them into "everlasting habitations," and they worship Him.

COMMENTS AND APPLICATIONS

In previous lessons we have read titles of various natures which were ascribed to Jesus; such as, Light, Life, Truth, Bread of Life, etc. In today's lesson, including verses 6-10 which are not printed, are two more: "I am the door," and "I am the good shepherd." There are many other titles given to Jesus in the Bible. It would be interesting to make a list of them and notice how they vary in nature. Do you wonder how he could be so many things? We must keep in mind that it would be impossible to express in one title, all Jesus is to His

He is the door, or the one through whom all must go, in order to be in the fold of God. Those who try to be Christians by doing good works and being moral and joining an earthly church are thieves and robbers. They wrest God's word and rob it of its true meaning, thus steal eternal life from many. Jesus said, "The thief cometh not but for to steal, and to kill, and to destroy." Many deceived souls who profess to be Christians without being born of Christ, do not realize that their master, Satan, has appointed them the job of stealing, killing, and destroying.

Jesus is the "Chief Shepherd," and his true ministers (those who entered the fold through Jesus and received their appointment from him) are shepherds under him. The chief shepherd speaks through them to his sheep as well as speaking directly to the sheep.

Beginning with verse eleven, Christ contrasts his care for the sheep with men who had been hired to care for them. He knew what the thieves and robbers (false teachers) would do to him for protecting his sheep (teaching them the truth), but he willingly laid down his life in order that the sheep might be saved. Not only for the Jc. vish sheep fold did he make this sacrifice, but the "other sheep", Gentiles, were included. Many of them heard His voice and followed Him.

In the last part of our lesson are some precious promises. He is able to protect us from all enemies as long as we obey his voice and follow him. No man can pluck us out of His hands, but we need to be careful that we do not wander away ourselves. There is danger of being devoured by wolves when we get so far away that we can no longer hear His voice.

COMMENTS AND APPLICATIONS

In the home of Lazarus, Mary, and Martha, Jesus had often been lovingly received and sheltered. It seemed that He enjoyed being there. But sickness had visited the home when Jesus was away, and laid hold on a loved brother. Their trust was in Jesus, hence they sent the message, "Lord, behold, he whom Thou lovest is sick." They did not tell him what to do, but the message bore a note of intreaty. Jesus received the message, but continued the Father's work in the country where he was, as if he did not intend to help them in their distress.

The brother died and was buried, and the sisters were heart-broken. News came that Jesus was near, but it seemed he had come too late. But he never comes too late to help those who fully put their trust in Him. The purpose for his delay was to bring greater glory to God.

When we need help from the Lord and implore Him to come to our rescue, it is not lack of love for us that causes IIim to sometimes delay in giving us what we need. Even when He waits until all hope seems gone, "If thou wouldest believe, thou shouldest see the glory of God."

Three times while on earth, Jesus raised the deada child, a young man, and Lazarus. Thus He proved his testimony in a measure, "I am the resurrection and the life," but the full proof came when he arose from the dead himself. His rising is the sure foundation upon which our hopes for rising rests. "If the Spirit of Him that raised up Jesus from the dead" dwell in us, we can say with Paul, "O death, where is thy sting? O grave, where is thy victory?" Notice what Jesus said, "He that believeth in me, though he were dead, yet shall he live." Those words were not spoken concerning Lazarus, but to ALL who believe in Him, who is the resurrection and the Life. Jesus arose with the "keys of hell and death.' If you have heeded his voice when He called to your soul, which was dead in trespasses and sins, "Arise," you may die and be buried, but the time will come when you'll hear that voice call, "Come forth," and your body sown in corruption will be raised in in-corruption. When? "In a moment in the twinkling of an eye, at the last trump." Lazarus died again, but at the last trump, "Death is swallowed up in victory," and there will be no more death. Are you ready for tl last trump to sound?
