A Letter To Young Converts

Beloved, we have undertaken to put together this letter that you may be reliably admonished about those things which are to help you along the pathway of life. This is the way of HOLINESS:—Enter not into houses of unholy repute where the weak congregate daily; neither drink of their bitter dregs. Remember, that dancing in any form, as a sister to drink, can lead you astray, and so does not change essentials any.

Extravagancy is a sign of loose morals, and little will power. Those who make it a habit to spend their money for banquetings shall have no part in God's kingdom. Be not of ill appetite, yet do not over-eat. Satan has found this to be a good seat of affection, where men's appetites are so perverted, no room is left to taste the goodness of the Lord.

Be observative—especially watch "self." Self is a dangerous character that needs to be controlled and put under guard day by day. Many have been robbed and cheated of a "more abundant life" because self-praise and ego tried to enter in. God, our God, has a way out of all this if we earnestly seek for the sanctifying Spirit. Sanctification not only gives power for self-destruction, but also edifies the spirit body of Christ.

Again: be observative. Do not act upon your own accord, but only do what the Holy Spirit tells you. Let not jealousy, nor pride, nor complacency ruin your beautiful character. Lead a clean, holy life, void of all foolish chatter, and passing remarks. Love soberly and spiritually. Let your love be pure and separate from all base passions. Watch your natural emotions, and let your kindly affections be motivated by godliness in the soul. Then adding to your comfort, be very careful that you do not become filled with an exalted spirit through the idle praises of men.

Refer to the Holy Word and learn that Satan tries every possible way and means by which to trip you and divert your mind from God. With the aid of the Holy Spirit, you can resist Satan, and he will take flight from you. This will be a constant warfare which you will have to contend with, so be wide awake and do not slumber as do the unawares.

Seek not after earthly amusements such as you notice people of no faith indulging their lives in—

where the eye of lust must greet the flesh. Neither crave for popularity in the high places for the sake of being noticed. These yearnings are deceiving, and can shake even the foundation of a Spirit-filled life, and cause one to go into perdition.

Seeing so much evil loose in this world, be aware round-about, the displays of the frivolous pleasures of youth. To God, this lusting after worldly allurements is unspeakably ugly. It is as an immediate step toward detention from spiritual progress. Avoid familiarity. Keep both hands clean. Be meek and gentle, and always remember humility, one of the sweetest graces of God in the soul.

Give no place for world knowledge, but live a humble life before God, saints, and men. Those who' will not humble themselves can have no part in this heavenly marriage. Do not allow money nor materiality to rule or occupy your God-given time. Life is too short to build on mammon. Yet be honest in your business deals as unto the Lord. Remember that God never sent us into the world just to make money.

Cherish the truth and respect light. Do not live under your privileges, but enjoy every word that proceeds from God. It might be suggested that some people have an aptitude of twisting the truth to suit themselves. They are usually the quick to offend, and slow to pardon type. Such, you must treat cautiously according to the instructions as given by Jesus: "Behold, I send you forth as sheep in the midst of wolves. Be ye therefore wise as serpents and HARMLESS as DOVES."

May something be said this time regarding our vision? We discern through the natural eye the things of the flesh; but we must needs judge only through spiritual insight. God looks at the inward part, while man is carelessly apt to judge by outward show. Learn to define character by the fruitful works of the Spirit; the natural from the spiritual, and the spiritual from the artificial.

Finally, know your opponent, the foul spirit. He is your deadliest enemy. So be vigilant to keep a sweet, calm spirit when difficulties come in opposition to the instructions which you have received. If in these things you prove faithful, God can be called upon, who will not try you beyond your strength; but when strong temptations come, he will provide an escape so that you will be able to bear all things. On Giving

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God gave his Son; Jesus gave his life, and by giving his life, brought redemption to man, the greatest and the most important gift that man could receive. It is said of Jesus that "he went about doing good and healing all that were oppressed of the devil." Acts 10:38. The Lord teaches us to give, hoping for nothing in return.

In Luke 6:38, we read, "Give and it shall be given unto you: good measure, pressed down, shaken together, and running over, shall men give unto your bosom: For with the same measure that ye mete withal it shall be measured to you again." God loves a cheerful giver, and not one that gives grudgingly or of necessity, which would be giving because some one required it of you or urged you to give; but Paul

says, "Let every one give according as he purposeth in his heart." 2 Cor. 9:7. The whole tenor of the scriptures is against God receiving any gift unless it is given freely as unto the Lord. The tithing system is a law system and should never be taught to the saints as a New Testament doctrine; for along with the other law doctrines, it was fulfilled in Christ; and as he gave all to purchase salvation for us, so we follow him and give up all unto him and let him lead us in our giving. Jesus said, "If the Son shall make you free, ye shall be free indeed." The saints of God are free in Christ, and they give freely of their substance to whom he directs, and in the manner as he directs. It would be binding law on the free saints to make a rule for them to give in a certain manner, to whom to give, and how much to give.

Some advocate putting a box up beside the door where the people come in and go out. They have a perfect right to do so, as there is no New Testament teachings against their using this method for freewill offerings. Some say they get this from the temple giving under the law, but I do not find where they had any box in the temple up beside the door. In 2 Kings 12:9, it says that the chest where the money was placed was set beside the altar. This altar where the sacrifices were offered was some little distance from the door of the temple. In Mark 12:41, it is said that Jesus sat over against the treasury and beheld how the people cast money into the treasury. To sit over against would mean to be facing the treasury. The seats of the temple would not likely be facing the door. The scripture also said they were casting their money in, and it states that the widow threw her two mites in, so the treasury no doubt consisted of an open box.

We do not find any stedfast rule laid down in the New Testament for the giving of free-will offerings; however, we do find it recorded in the first of the 16th chapter of 1 Corinthians where Paul was asking for a collection to be made for the poor saints at Jerusalem, and he had given the same order to the churches in Galatia. He said for every one to lay by in store the first day of the week as God had prospered him that there be no gatherings when he came. Likely he did not want them running around to gather up money after he was there. He wanted to give them the messages which were upon his heart. Paul used this method on this special occasion, but he did not bind it on the saints as a law. In many of the sect meetings they pass a collection plate around to collect from the people; but I do not know of any true holiness people doing that as it seems to embarrass some to have a plate shoved under their nose, yet it may not be any worse than to hear the preacher call out, "Don't forget the box at the door."

One way of giving offerings which has been practiced by some of the true holiness people for many years is to place a box on the altar bench or some convenient place in the meeting house and let the saints put their free-will offerings in it. In this manner of giving, one could cast in a dollar bill and another could cast in a twenty dollar bill according as God has or is prospering them, and no one would know who gave the twenty dollar bill. It would be out of the Spirit of Christ to urge folks to give or to insist upon it. Let every one give freely. When it falls my lot in the larger camp meetings to mention a free-will offering, I often tell them that it is a free-will offering and if they cannot give freely as unto the Lord we would rather that they would not give, for I am persuaded that God does not accept anything but an offering given freely as unto the Lord. This method of giving has been practiced from the beginning at some of the oldest camp meetings in the south, and has been taught and practiced in the reformation from a very early date. I have before me a book entitled, "The Sabbath and the Lord's Day" written by H. M. Riggle, dated 1904, which teaches this and shows a picture of a box on a bench close to the pulpit and the saints passing by and casting their free-will offerings into the box. I do not look upon this as a fixed way for the saints to give their free-will offerings; but do find that it is a very convenient way for the saints to practice, but not as a compulsory rule; for the Spirit of Christ may move individuals differently under different and varied circumstances; and to have any certain rule would hinder the Spirit from having freedom to work in and through individuals as he pleases, and would bring bondage where freedom should exist.

Dear old brother Winn, known as father Winn, told me that they have used this method of giving here at Guthrie ever since the meeting house was built, which was forty-six years ago. Yet this is not a law of giving, as we sometimes tell the saints to just hand their offerings to the ministers among us as the Lord directs.

Some of the saints take up no offerings in their meetings, but expect the saints to give to the ministers and in other ways bear the expense of the meeting as the Lord may direct; and that seems to work quite well, especially in the smaller meetings; but it does not give visitors, who do not understand, much of a chance to contribute as they would like and it is sometimes embarrassing to those with meagre means to give their little amount in this manner to those receiving it. I do not suppose that it is possible to eliminate every difficulty in any one method of giving; and as I look at it, I feel that the saints should have their freedom in Christ to give their free-will offerings in any of the following ways: making up the offering before hand; a box at the side of the door; a box on the altar bench; or give to the ministers for expense of a meeting privately just as the Lord may direct them by his Spirit. Begging for means in any of these ways would not be Christ-like, neither would it be faith in God. I have traveled in evangelistic work for years and held meetings in almost all the states, and I have never taken up an offering for our meetings nor for myself, nor even hinted for any support, and God has always provided so we got along and did all he led us to do. You will notice that there is no begging done through the "Faith and Victory" paper, nor continued write-ups trying to work money out of our readers. The 25-cent subscription price on the paper is only about one-fouth

what a commercial price would be. The larger part of our tracts are sent out free. The price on our books are less than half of commercial prices. This is the Faith Publishing House or the "Lord's Print Shop," and we practice what the name implies. If God did not supply us with means, we would have to close up shop in a short time.

God says in his word, "The just shall live by faith: but if any man draw back, my soul shall have no pleasure in him."

Pray for us, dear readers, that we will never draw back, but that our faith will grow and increase in the living God. Your servant, Fred Pruitt.

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When Adam and Eve transgressed against God in breaking the one and only commandment that God had given them, they fell from their Eden state of

love and purity. Satan had succeeded in planting sin in their hearts, and they became corrupted and defiled according to Paul in Romans 5:12, which reads, "Wherefore, as by one man sin entered into the world, and death by sin; and so death passed upon all men, for that all have sinned." 17th verse: "For if by one man's offense death reigned by one: much more they which receive abundance of grace and of the gift of righteousness [the Holy Spirit] shall reign in life by one Jesus Christ."

This sin nature is the very thing that. Christ came to destroy and cleanse from our souls, and then to enthrone the Spirit of God in our hearts, making us able to live free from sin. When John saw Jesus, he said, "Behold the Lamb of God that taketh away the sin of the world." In Romans 6:6, Paul calls it, "the body of sin." In Romans 7:24 he was wretched because of the sin nature that caused him to transgress God's laws, and he called it, "the body of this death."

That the disciples were only in a justified state before they were sanctified and filled with the Spirit and needed to be cleansed from that sin nature, is very evident, for they manifested carnality in different ways and on different occasions.

When Jesus, James, and John were refused shelter over night in a city, the two disciples became angry and wanted to call fire down from heaven and consume those people: but Jesus rebuked them, and said, "Ye know not what manner of spirit ye are of." The carnal nature, planting of Satan, was still there. At one time Peter withstood Jesus about going up to Jerusalem. Jesus rebuked him and said, "Get behind me, Satan." At the trial of Jesus, Peter denied the Lord and even cursed and swore that he did not know the man. When the two disciples asked the Lord to sit one on the right and the other on the left in his kingdom, the other ten heard it and were moved with indignation against the two (Matt. 20:24). In this they manifested a defiled nature. The Pharisees who opposed Jesus manifested the carnal nature when they were offended at the Lord's words and wanted to injure him; but Jesus said, "Every plant which my heavenly Father has not planted shall be rooted up." In this he referred to Satan's planting of sin in the soul, which he came to destroy and root out. 1 Jno. 3:8.

Man only took two steps down. First, he listened to Satan's lies and broke the commandment of God, receiving the carnal nature from Satan, or sin nature, and became corrupted and lost his Eden purity; and then he was so weakened that he began to commit many sins and transgressions. In order to get back to his Eden state of purity in heart he will have to take two steps up. First, repent and ask God to have mercy and forgive him of his actual transgressions. God says in his word that he is faithful to do this for souls, and when a soul is forgiven he will have peace with God through faith in the Lord's blood Then when he becomes aware that the sacrifice. carnal nature is still in the soul and learns that God has promised to cleanse and destroy that sin out of his soul, he looks to the Lord for this and it is done by power divine; he will be sanctified and infilled by the

Holy Spirit, which will give him power to live free from sin in this time world and to witness for the Lord by his daily conduct in words and deeds.

The Wesleys taught this second definite work of grace, the cleansing of the soul by sanctification and infilling of the Holy Spirit; and they were mightily used of God. Bro. D. S. Warner and his early associates taught this truth in an exceedingly strong manner, and they also were mightily used of God.

I have often thought of the exhortation which Paul gave the brethren in Ephesians 4:3, which reads: "Endeavoring to keep the unity of the Spirit in the bond of peace." Satan and his crowd are endeavoring to do anything else but this; and he has his agents whom he can use, who pass themselves off to be saint preachers, whether ignorantly or otherwise, who go about sowing discord, wresting the Scriptures from their proper setting and meaning, causing confusion and division. Dear saints, if anyone comes around teaching any other doctrine, trying to persuade you that there is no cleansing in the second work of grace and that the carnal nature is cleansed when you are first justified, believe it not, for such teaching is not sound doctrine, no matter how like an angel of light they may appear. Such folks as that are discord sowers and division makers; and if you listen to them and believe their false teaching, you will in time find yourself off with some little bunch of carnal professors who aid Satan in his endeavor to sow discord, causing confusion and division, bringing you into bondage to many of their pet ideas, which cannot be truly established by the sacred word of God; and thereby causing you to speak evil of the righteous ones who hold to the sound doctrines of the Bible.

Over and over, again and again we find the exhortation in the Bible to beware of false teachers; also, "Let no man deceive you." Paul says that Satan's preachers are preachers of righteousness. They preach many right things to deceive and alure souls into false ways. Read 2 Cor. 11:13, 14, 15, and be not deceived nor line up with discord sowers and thereby get into confusion and division, speaking evil of the humble saints of God who hold the truth in righteousness and true holiness.

One tactic these discord sowers use is to find fault with God's sanctified ministers, and thereby try to get you to lose confidence in them. When they have succeeded in doing this, then they can tell you or teach you almost any kind of false doctrine, and if you are not careful and prayerful, will get you to believe it. They will try to make out that if all would see it as they do, there would be more power and great miracles done. Satan has caused many a soul to be lost eternally by this art and clever juggling of the Scriptures. I feel like using the words that Jesus spoke when he was telling that many would arise, saying, here is Christ and, lo, there is Christ. His words were, "Believe it not." Matt. 24:23, 24.

Dear brethren, live humbly before God, keep in the true holiness way, be content with the effect of God's righteousness in your soul, which is "quietness and assurance forever." Isa. 32:17. Be not moved by loud talking or lying miracles, for these are the days when the three unclean spirits like frogs are loose. John the Revelator said, "For they are the spirits of devils, working miracles." Rev. 16:14. "Therefore, my beloved brethren, be ye stedfast, unmoveable, always abounding in the work of the Lord, forasmuch as ye know that your labor is not in vain in the Lord." 1 Cor. 15:58. Laboring in a false way is vain and will bring you no eternal profits.

o-o-o-o CAMP MEETING REPORT





"The GIFT of God is eternal life, through Jesus Christ our Lord" Rom. 6:23.

Suppose God charged a thousand dollars, or a hundred, or even one, for eternal life, would it be a GIFT? Nay, suppose He charged only one cent, would it be a GIFT?—No. Suppose He charged so many prayers, or so many good works, or so much love, to the man who needs eternal life, would it remain what He calls it—"the gift of God?"—No.

And is He not true to His Word? Will He deceive as men do? Will He, can He, mock man's need? Ah, not He! The One who loved man enough to give His only Son for us is not the One to mock man.

Whatever else man may have to work and pay for, there is no service and no price to bring to obtain eternal life. It is His prerogative to GIVE it, and He freely gives it to every man who comes to Him acknowledging his need. When one truly from the heart acknowledges his need, he humbles his heart to a state of true repentance toward God for sins he has committed, and a willingness to forsake them.

Do you know what eternal life is? It is the very life of God Himself. Are You With the Crowd that Crucified Jesus?

"Often times there are many who lead out in a reform movement and fail in that their message is not given heed to and this would-be reformer is gravely mistreated, many have been martyred, killed, put out of the way. Their message disturbed people, they did not like to hear it. Few people do like to hear their settled ways and customs attacked. Their anger is often aroused into a flame and there is no telling what they may do.

"Many a man from Jesus unto today, yea, even before his time, many were the really great men with heavenly wisdom; the prophets of the Lord and other who were compelled to travel their way alone. Jesus did this. Paul did the same and millions of others. It is yet as true today.

"He who would dare to reprove the people of God today and attempt to set before them a better way, a way more in keeping with the teachings of the Lord Christ Jesus will meet the same defaming treatment. He is looked upon as one who thinks he knows better than others, feels he is better, whereas his heart may be breaking, weeping inside because of the inroads Satan is making or has made into the people of the Lord. They are reproached, set aside, ignored, persecuted at times, looked down upon, tantalized, and almost anything done to hurt their efforts to help, not stopping at even the ruin of their reputation, thus killing their influence. It would be too belittling in the minds of some to acknowledge these as being reformers, prophets of God. To accept them would be belittling themselves too much, therefore they must be put into prison, or stopped some way or other."

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Called, Chosen, and Faithful

God's Word says that many are called. The sinner is called to repentance; the justified, to sanctification or holiness; and many are called to the gospel work. Oh, the sad thought, that many refuse to hear, or heed, their calls! Many refuse to hear (heed) the voice of God calling them to repent and turn away from sin. To such, He says He will laugh at their calamity, and mock when fear cometh. "When distresses and anguish cometh upon them, then shall

they call, but I will not answer: they shall seek me early, but shall not find me." See Prov. 1:24-30; Isa. 66:4; Matt. 22:3; Heb. 12:25.

The gospel call goes out to every one, and is a savor of life unto life, or of death unto death (2 Cor. 2:16; Mark 16:16; 1 Cor. 1:21).

The gospel includes all of God's Word, revealed to us through His Son. Heb. 1:1, 2: "God, who at sundry times and in divers manners spake in time past unto the fathers by the prophets, hath in these last days spoken unto us by his Son, . . ."

The gospel is the power of God unto salvation unto every one that believeth. Rom. 1:16.

"But though we, or an angel from heaven, preach any other gospel unto you than that which we have preached unto you, let him be accursed." Gal. 1:8.

Paul shunned not to declare the whole counsel of God. Acts 20:20, 21, 27.

Jesus said, "Man shall not live by bread alone, but by every word that proceedeth out of the mouth of God." Matt. 4:4.

They who hear the gospel and believe and take up their cross to follow in the steps of Jesus are the ones he chooses, or are the chosen. Some only follow part of the way. When tribulation or persecution ariseth because of the Word, by and by he is offended. And some let the cares of this world and the deceitfulness of riches choke the Word, and they become unfruitful. Matt. 13:21, 22.

In John 6:60, 66, we read where many of Christ's disciples said, "This is a hard saying, who can hear it?" And many of his disciples went back and walked no more with him. But the faithful ones are they who count the cost and pay the price, give up all, take up their cross daily and follow on to the end, enduring temptation, persecution, and many hard trials. They count not their lives dear unto themselves; live not for themselves, but for others. As Paul says, "I am crucified with Christ: nevertheless I live; yet not I, but Christ liveth in me: and the life which I now live in the flesh I live by the faith of the Son of God, who loved me, and gave himself for me." Gal. 2:20.

"For though we live in the flesh, we do not war after the flesh." 2 Cor. 10:3.

He that loveth his life shall lose it, and he that hateth his life in this world shall keep it unto life eternal." John 12:25.

These are the called, and chosen, and faithful. (Revelation 17:14). —Cora Brant

BIBLE STUDY

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A DOUBTING AND DISOBEDIENT PEOPLE

December 2, 1951

Printed Portion.....Numbers 14:1-11.

Num. 14:1. And all the congregation lifted up their voice, and cried; and the people wept that night.

2. And all the children of Israel murmured against Moses and against Aaron: and the whole congregation said unto them, Would God that we had died in the land of Egypt! or would God we had died in this wilderness!

3. And wherefore hath the Lord brought us unto this land, to fall by the sword, that our wives and our children should be a prey? were it not better for us to return into Egypt?

4. And they said one to another, Let us make a captain, and let us return into Egypt.

5. Then Moses and Aaron fell on their faces before all the assembly of the congregation of the children of Israel.

6. And Joshua the son of Nun, and Caleb the son of Jephunneh, which were of them that searched the land, rent their clothes:

7. And they spake unto all the company of the children of Israel, saying, The land, which we passed through to search it, is an exceeding good land.

8. If the Lord delight in us, then he will bring us into this land, and give it us; a land which floweth with milk and honey.

9. Only rebel not ye against the Lord, neither fear ye the people of the land; for they are bread for us: their defence is departed from them, and the Lord is with us: fear them not.

10. But all the congregation bade stone them with stones. And the glory of the Lord appeared in the tabernacle of the congregation before all the children of Israel.

11. And the Lord said unto Moses, How long will this people provoke me? and how long will it be ere they believe me, for all the signs which I have shewed among them?

Memory Verse: If we confess our sins, he is faithful and just to forgive us our sins, and to cleanse us from all unrighteousness. 1 John 1:9.

Practical Truth: A spirit of fear and a lack of faith may lead to disastrous results.

COMMENTS AND APPLICATION

The Israelites were much discouraged because of t_{ie} way. Num. 2:4. Jesus said, "I am the way." John 14:6. The Israelites were woefully lacking in faith in God. This is the tenth time and when they wanted to make a captain and return to Egypt they crossed the dead line with God. He decreed that all who had been numbered for war from 20 years old and upward should perish in

the wilderness. They were numbered for war and God himself was on their side to fight for them, but they did not accept the responsibility with Moses, a chosen man of God, for a leader. In their heart of unbelief they perished in the very place where they had done all their complaining. Note, even after they had done all their murmuring and complaining, the longsuffering of God when he says in verse 11 "How long." He still wanted to show them mercy. For us who are Christians the application is plainly stated in 1 Cor. 10:1-13. When Christians want to follow the world after they get saved, here is a plain warning to them found in Psa. 106:15, "And he gave them their request; but sent leanness into their soul." "For God hath not given us a spirit of fear; but of power, and of love, and of a sound mind." 2 Tim. 1:7.

MOSES' CHARGE TO THE PEOPLE

December 9, 1951

Printed Portion......Deuteronomy 30:15-20; 31:1-3; 33:27-29a.

Deut. 30:15. See, I have set before thee this day life and good, and death and evil;

16. In that I command thee this day to love the Lord thy God, to walk in his ways, and to keep his commandments and his statutes and his judgments, that thou mayest live and multiply: and the Lord thy God shall bless thee in the land whither thou goest to possess it.

17. But if thine heart turn away, so that thou wilt not hear, but shalt be drawn away, and worship other gods, and serve them;

18. I denounce unto you this day, that ye shall surely perish and that ye shall not prolong your days upon the land, whither thou passest over Jordan to go to possess it.

19. I call heaven and earth to record this day against you, that I have set before you life and death, blessing and cursing: therefore choose life, that both thou and thy seed may live:

20. That thou mayest love the Lord thy God, and that thou mayest obey his voice, and that thou mayest cleave unto him: for he is thy life, and the length of thy days: that thou mayest dwell in the land which the Lord sware unto thy fathers, to Abraham, to Isaac, and to Jacob, to give them.

31:1. And Moses went and spake these words unto all Israel.

2. And he said unto them, I am an hundred and twenty years old this day; I can no more go out and come in: also the Lord hath said unto me, Thou shalt not go over this Jordan.

3. The Lord thy God, he will go over before thee, and he will destroy these nations from before thee, and thou shalt possess them: and Joshua, he shall go over before thee, as the Lord hath said.

33:27. The eternal God is thy refuge and underneath are the everlasting arms: and he shall thrust out the enemy from before thee; and shall say, Destroy them.

28. Israel then shall dwell in safety alone: the fountain of Jacob shall be upon a land of corn and wine; also his heavens shall drop down dew.

29. Happy art thou, O Israel: who is like unto thee, O people saved by the Lord, the shield of thy help, and who is the sword of thy excellency!

Memory Verse: The eternal God is thy refuge, and underneath are the everlasting arms. Deut. 33:27.

Practical Truth: Before every man there is set a way of life and a way of death.

COMMENTS AND APPLICATION

In this lesson Moses makes final appeal to the people and sets before them "Life and good, and death and evil." He commands them to love the Lord their God, to walk in his ways and keep his commandments so the Lord could bless them. He warned them of what would take place if they turned away from God. He says, "Therefore choose life, that both thou and thy seed may live." verse 19. Love, obey and cleave to the Lord. Verse 20. These are good words for all of us.

Barnabas in Acts 11:23, "Exhorted them all, with purpose of heart they would cleave to the Lord." Why, O why should any one turn away from the Lord after they have once known him? He has made the way so simple and given power to overcome all difficulties. Then to add to that, he says in 1 John 2:1 "And if any man sin, we have an advocate with the Father, Jesus Christ the righteous." 1 John 1:9 says, "If we confess our sins, he is faithful and just to forgive us our sins, and to cleanse us from all unrighteousness." So if we do sin he has made a way for us to come back. Surrender fully to God. "If God be for us, who can be against us?" Rom. 8:31. God is our refuge.

THE CONQUEST OF CANAAN

December 16, 1951

Printed Portion.....Joshua 1:1-7; 6:1-5, 20.

Josh. 1:1. Now after the death of Moses the servant of the Lord it came to pass, that the Lord spake unto Joshua the son of Nun, Moses' minister saying,

2. Moses my servant is dead; now therefore arise, go over this Jordan, thou, and all this people, unto the land which I do give to them, even to the children of Israel.

3. Every place that the sole of your foot shall tread upon, that have I given unto you, as I said unto Moses.

4. From the wilderness and this Lebanon even unto the great river, the river Euphrates, all the land of the Hittites, and unto the great sea toward the going down of the sun, shall be your coast.

5. There shall not any man be able to stand before thee all the days of thy life: as I was with Moses, so I will be with thee: I will not fail thee, nor forsake thee.

6. Be strong and of a good courage: for unto this people shalt thou divide for an inheritance the land, which I sware unto their fathers to give them.

7. Only be thou strong and very courageous, that thou mayest observe to do according to all the law, which Moses my servant commanded thee: turn not from it to the right hand or to the left, that thou mayest prosper whithersoever thou goest.

6:1. Now Jericho was straitly shut up because of the children of Israel: none went out, and none came in.

2. And the Lord said unto Joshua, See, I have given into thine hand Jericho, and the king thereof, and the mighty men of valour.

3. And ye shall compass the city, all ye men of war, and go round about the city once. Thus shalt thou do six days.

4. And seven priests shall bear before the ark seven trumpets of rams' horns: and the seventh day ye shall compass the city seven times, and the priests shall blow with the trumpets.

5. And it shall come to pass, that when they make a long "last with the ram's horn, and when ye hear the sound of the trumpet, all the people shall shout with a great shout; and the wall of the city shall fall down flat, and the people shall ascend up every man straight before him. 20. So the people shouted when the priests blew with the trumpets: and it came to pass, when the people heard the sound of the trumpet, and the people shouted with a great shout, that the wall fell down flat, so that the people went up into the city, every man straight before him, and they took the city.

Memory Verse: As I was with Moses, so I will be with thee: I will not fail thee, nor forsake thee. Josh. 1:5.

Practical Truth: The help of God is vitally important in new ventures for the advancement of his kingdom.

COMMENTS AND APPLICATION

One of the main points in this lesson, and is repeated, to observe is that the Lord kept telling Joshua to "be strong and of a good courage." He told him, "I will not fail thee, nor forsake thee." He commanded him to do all according to the law, all the law, not just a part of it. (Worldly professors say there are nonessentials, don't believe them.) When we do all the law out of love to God we can have the assurance then that God is with us and that will give us the courage needed to carry us to the desired haven. God has promised to be with those who obey him and we have many records in the Bible where he did that very thing. There is no place for compromise; that is where we get our feet started off the narrow way. We need, greatly need the "whole armour of God." Read prayerfully Eph. 6:10-18. In Rom. chapters 9-11 we read of the justice of God's rejection of Israel. They claimed to be the seed of Abraham but Jesus told them that they were not the seed of Abraham or they would have done the works of Abraham, they would not hear God's words because they were not of God, even though they claimed to be. There were many who did not cross over Jordan but died in the wilderness because of unbelief, and there are many who do not enter sanctification today and go on unto perfection because of unbelief. They do not love God above every thing else in this world. Oh, surrender to God. Read Rom. 12:1-2. "Little children, keep yourselves from idols." 1 John 5:21.

Luke 1:46. And Mary said, My soul doth magnify the Lord,

COMMENTS AND APPLICATION

Josh. 24:1. And Joshua gathered all the tribes of Israel to Shechem, and called the elders of Israel and for their heads, and for their judges, and for their officers; and they presented themselves before God.

2. And Joshua said unto all the people, Thus saith the Lord God of Israel, Your fathers dwelt on the other side of the flood in old time, even Terah, the father of Abraham, and the father of Nachor: and they served other gods.

3. And I took your father Abraham from the other side of the flood, and led him troughout all the land of Canaan, and multiplied his seed, and gave him Isaac.

7. And when they cried unto the Lord, he put darkness between you and the Egyptians, and brought the sea upon them, and covered them; and your eyes have seen what I have done in Egypt: and ye dwelt in the wilderness a long season.

8. And I brought you into the land of the Amorites, which dwelt on the other side Jordan; and they fought with you: and I gave them into your hand, that ye might possess their land; and I destroyed them from before you.

14. Now therefore fear the Lord, and serve him in sincerity and in truth: and put away the gods which your fathers served on the other side of the flood, and in Egypt; and serve ye the Lord.

15. And if it seem evil unto you to serve the Lord, choose you this day whom ye will serve; whether the gods which your fathers served that were on the other side of the flood, or the gods of the Amorites, in whose land ye dwell: but as for me and my house, we will serve the Lord.

16. And the people answered and said, God forbid that we should forsake the Lord, to serve other gods;

17. For the Lord our God, he it is that brought us up and our fathers out of the land of Egypt, from the house of bondage, and which did those great signs in our sight, and preserved us in all the way wherein we went, and among all the people through whom we passed:

18. And the Lord drave out from before us all the people, even the Amorites which dwelt in the land: therefore will we also serve the Lord; for he is our God.

Memory Verse: Choose you this day whom ye will serve. Joshua 24:15.

Practical Truth: There is nothing more important in life than to choose the Lord and to help others to do so.

COMMENTS AND APPLICATION

Our closing lesson of the quarter sums up a number of the lessons we have studied as Joshua relates what took place from Abraham on down to Moses, of Moses bringing the Israelites out of Egypt and on down through the wilderness. By the time of this lesson it seems rather strange that Joshua needed to ask the Israelites to "Put away the gods which your fathers served on the other side of the flood and in Egypt." (24:14.) They needed a sermon on the text "Buy the truth and sell it not." Prov. 23:23. They did not seem to be making much progress spiritually. Yes, it seems strange when God had done so much for them by delivering them out of Egypt, guiding them with a pillar of cloud by day and fire by night, and giving them every thing they needed. At the time when they were murmuring and complaining, their love for God should have grown stronger; but instead of that Joshua had to use pressure to get them to the place where they would say "Therefore will we also serve the Lord; for he is our God." (24:18.)

For us in this day we have a scripture that we should embrace, "Not slothful in business; fervent in spirit; serving the Lord." Rom. 12:11. "Hereby perceive we the love of God, because he laid down his life for us: and we ought to lay down our lives for the brethren." 1 John 3:1(" Perseverance in loving and doing for God will keep u: from going back to any of the idols of this sinful, dark world. C. W.
