Redemption Through His Blood

In Hebrews 7:25 we read, "Wherefore He [Christ] is able to save them to the uttermost that come unto God by Him, seeing he ever liveth to make intercession for them."

The word "uttermost" carries the meaning of the highest and greatest degree, giving us the knowledge that man who is fully saved need have no doubt about it in the least, for he has come unto God through Christ who has given himself up into the hands of sinners as a perfect sacrifice before God and man and has brought to every believer a perfect salvation or deliverance from sin.

In Col 1:14 we read, "In whom we have redemption through his blood, even the forgiveness of sins." You will find nearly the same words in Eph. 1:7.

Redemption means, in a biblical sense, deliverance from sin and evil; for as Paul says in Romans 7:14, speaking of his condition when under the law in sin, that he was "carnal, sold under sin." A man in sin has sold himself to Satan by giving way to the lusts of the flesh in selfishness, greed, and worldly conformity, and often lying, stealing, drinking, gambling, committing adultery, practicing witchcraft (fortune telling and superstitions) together with open rebellion against light and knowledge of what God doth require of him in this life. People in this way sell out to the devil and become slaves to their master (Satan) and are in a state where it is impossible for them to save themselves from this condition of servitude. In this condition, their souls are lost and the wrath of God is upon them, the penalty of sin hanging over their heads is eternal death and destruction. For the wages of sin is death and destruction to the one who continues to abide therein; but the gift of God (Christ and salvation) is eternal life through Jesus Christ our Lord. Read Romans 6:23. According to Isaiah 59: 1, 2, his iniquities have separated him from God, and his sins have hid the face of God from him and God will not hear him nor favor him in that state.

What must a man do when he has himself separated from God in this sinful condition? The Bible plainly gives the answer. We shall give you the written word of God that will give you a clear understanding as to how to get saved and be a possessor of this uttermost salvation which Christ has brought to man by His spotless and blameless blood sacrifice on Calvary's cross.

In Prov. 28:13, we read, "He that covereth his sins [will not confess them] shall not prosper [not be favored of God]: but whoso confesseth and forsaketh [quits] them shall have mercy." God will have mercy on one who confesses his sins and forsakes them, and He will forgive him.

In Isaiah 55:6, we read, "Seek ye the Lord while he may be found, call ye upon him while he is near." He is near when he is convicting you of your sins. When you have knowledge in your soul that you are doing wrong and ought to turn from your sins and do right, then God is near. Call upon Him then in confession and repentance. He also says, "Let the wicked forsake his way, and the unrighteous man his thoughts: and let him return unto the Lord, and he will have mercy upon him; and to our God for he will abundantly pardon." To abundantly pardon would be in harmony with having an uttermost salvation as you go on to perfection.

In 2 Cor. 6:10 Paul tells us that godly sorrow worketh repentance to salvation. Godly sorrow is upon you when you become sorry and sad because you have sinned and rebelled against a just God and thereby have grieved Him away from you. In this state you could easily confess, repent, and ask God to forgive you. He says in His Word that he is faithful and just to forgive you and to cleanse you from all unrighteousness, 1 John 1:9. As you look to Jesus and believe on the blood sacrifice that he has made for you, the wrath of God will be lifted from you. Your sins and iniquities will be taken away and you will have peace with God through your believing on the Lord Jesus Christ.

In Romans 10:9, we read, "That if thou shalt confess with thy mouth the Lord Jesus, and shalt believe in thine heart that God hath raised him from the dead, thou shalt be saved." In Eph. 2:8, we read, "For by grace are ye saved, through faith [faith in the work that Christ has accomplished for you thru the sacrifice of His blood and his death]; and that not of your selves: it is the gift of God." You cannot save yourself; it is the gift of God (Christ) that saves your soul.

In conclusion, let us turn and read the record given of the thief on the cross, and see how he found favor with God. You will find it in Luke 23:39. It reads: "And one of the malefactors [a malefactor is a sinner and a criminal] which were hanged railed on him, saying, If thou be the Christ, save thyself and us." This man wanted to be saved, but did not humble his heart and confess his guilt, therefore Christ answered him not. Now listen to the one that found favor with the Lord in that agonizing hour. "But the other answering rebuked him, saying, Dost thou not fear God, seeing thou art in the same condemnation?" When one will not humble down before God in repentance and confession, he manifests a lack of reverence and godly fear. Notice now-"And we indeed justly; for we receive the due reward of our deeds." Do you see the humility? Now notice this man's belief in Christ as an innocent man. The just was dying for the guilty and his blood being innocent he could atone for and save the guilty, for he had done no sin, but was bleeding and dying for us sinners who are absolutely unable to save ourselves. Hear the last words of this thief (sinner) "But this man hath done nothing amiss. And he said unto Jesus, Lord, remember me when thou comest into thy kingdom." The Lord forgave him and saved his soul right there. He said, "Today shalt thou be with me in Paradise."

Sinner friend, you can have the same assurance in your soul today if you will humble down before God in confession and repentance and believe on the Lord Jesus Christ as one that has by his blood sacrifice atoned for your sins, and now you are free from guilt and condemnation because Christ died in your stead and appeased the wrath of God which was upon you and has brought you and God your heavenly Father together. By his blood, you can have redemption from all your sins and be at peace with God and ready for heaven and immortal glory. —Fred Pruitt.

Many are lost in sin that can be reached through the medium of the new inventions. I know of some that claim to be saints that would love to do away with the printed page in getting the truth to souls. It would certainly please the enemy to let him have the whole thing to use to keep all in deception and land their souls in the burning lake. The false prophets are so numerous and seem to have such control of the radio that it is almost impossible for a real Holy-Spirit-filled child of God to even have an opportunity to reach souls that way. Let us do all we can and in every way that God opens up to us to get the gospel to men and not be slothful in the business of God.

His Coming Draweth Nigh

In first Timothy 2:1, 2, we read, "I exhort therefore, that, first of all, supplications, prayers, intercessions, and giving of thanks, be made for all men; For kings and for all that are in authority; that we may lead a quiet and peaceable life in all godliness and honesty."

We find here a duty that is upon all saved people. Truly, kings and rulers and those in authority are in great need of the prayers and supplications of the redeemed, who are living in this world but are not of the world. The rulers and law makers of our own country are in great straits as to what should be done to insure peace in our land. Their faces are gathering blackness as war clouds are hanging over the nation. Sin and wickedness is to be seen and known in the high seats of our government, and on down to the very lowest. The people of the nation are in a turmoil, one crying, 'This is the thing to do," and another crying something else. None in number can be agreed as to what course to pursue. The nation is now in a war in Korea, which they would like to get loose from but cannot. Young men, the prime of our nations on both sides, are being slain and slaughtered by the awful weapons of carnal warfare, and that, seemingly with no hope of gaining any permanent victory, as they dare not move against the enemy in any way to gain victory and have peace, because the powerful Russian nation is backing up Chinese armies. They are practically in war now with Russia, and yet Russia is sitting back watching the Americans spend themselves and bring bankruptcy to our country.

This nation of ours whose citizens once had much light and knowledge and much of the fear of God upon their souls, has become corrupted and is as a stench in the nostrils of God, while a great part of the citizens profess to love Him. In the majority of the professed churches, the people are so proud, vain, and worldly minded that God will not even smell in their assemblies. Many of them have a self-righteousness not to be equaled by the haughty Pharisees in the day of Christ. Uncle Sam (as this nation is called) needs to get down before God in humble repentance and confession; but he is too self-conceited, haughty and proud to do this, so he has brought and is bringing the wrath of a sin-avenging God upon the nation. Sometimes God uses one wicked nation to punish another.

Several years ago, while at the Monark Springs, Mo. campmeeting, I had been fasting and praying, and humbling down before God. He gave me a vision of conditions existing. In the vision I saw a long body of soldiers in uniform marching east, and it seemed to me at the time that they were going to Germany and Europe. As I looked and beheld this large army marching, I saw other young men coming from different states. As they came, they were in civilian clothes, but when they got to where this large army was marching their clothes changed to soldiers' uniforms and they too marched east with the others.

I told this vision at the camp meeting. No doubt many who were there remember my speaking about it and saying that it looked like war with Russia. Since that time the United States has been sending soldiers to Europe and east in Korea, and at present have a large army stationed in Europe and Korea, and they are still going there.

About two weeks ago I was in bed and it was near the break of day when the Lord gave me another vision. I saw the moon, a full moon, up in the sky, and it was dark. I called the attention of someone who was with me to it and we talked about it, wondering why the moon would be so dark. Presently, as we were looking at it there was a big irregular black spot which appeared just east of the moon. We wondered at the sight and became amazed. Suddenly it began to move toward the moon. It came crashing across the moon and left a big streak and blotted out the moon entirely. We gazed at it for awhile and then all disappeared. It was so vivid on my mind that I was greatly troubled about it as to what the meaning was of such a horrible sight. I mentioned it to the brethren that were here and told them that God undoubtedly wanted to get some truth to us by such a scene. I wanted to know the interpretation of it.

We went into the living room for morning worship and I spoke of it again for it was so firmly fixed upon my mind, and I was wondering what it all meant. While we were having worship, the Lord brought the interpretation to my mind like this: The moon that was so dark represented this country in its dark spiritual and sinful condition. It once had light as moonlight in comparison to sunlight, but now that light has become darkness and has brought the wrath of God upon the nation. The black spot that appeared represented Russia and its converted countries, which was irregular in shape and exceedingly black, denoting their black spiritual condition also. But the horror of it was, it moved across the darkened moon that reperesented this country and the whole thing was inky blackness.

The prophecies of the Bible are true and all this is plainly prophesied in the sacred word of God if properly understood; but the spiritually blind leaders have the people as a whole blinded to the truth and they are rushing headlong into the devil's traps. There are more communists (which is a cover for atheism and infidelity) in this country than there were in Russia when their government was overthrown. And this nation is rapidly going communistic and being engulfed by that old dragon power which is spoken of in Revelation 12:9, "That old serpent, called the Devil and Satan, which deceiveth the whole world." He was cast out into the earth and his angels with him. In the 20th chapter of Revelation he is mentioned again. It says he was bound for a thousand years, a long period of time. In Daniel 3:17, we read what they said: "If it be so, our God whom we serve is able to deliver us from the burning fiery furnace, and he will deliver us out of thine hand O king. But if not, be it known unto thee, O king, that we will not serve thy gods, nor worship the golden image which thou hast set up." Communism Vs. Christianity

When the Pilgrims came to the shores of America, their first act was to kiss the soil of the new land with a prayer of thanksgiving to God.

Through nearly three centuries America has been a God-fearing nation. The Constitution of the United States was born in prayer. Nearly every one of the great American universities was founded by men who loved God and served Him.

In contrast, on May 5, 1818 in the city of Treves, Germany, Karl Marx, the prophet of communism was born. As a young man, Marx issued the flaming Communistic Manifesto which was to become the bible of the proletariat everywhere. Said Marx, "Let the governing classes tremble before the communistic revolution." Thus was born communism with its hatred for God and for the rights of free men.

There you have it... in today's world it is either communism or Christianity. Christianity teaches the immortality of the soul, the fact of God, the Saviourhood of Christ and the authenticity of the Holy Scriptures. But communism cries out against "the treacherous influences of such myths and illusions."

But America, beware! Beware of communism . . .yes! but let us fear also outright godlessness. At this moment materialistic godlessness is eating its way into the vitals of the American way of life. Take a look at the following:

Godlessness in our government—It has been proved that murderous gangs control politics in high government places. Men who promote prostitution, gambling, and murder are actually linked with local and national politics.

"Neither is there salvation in any other; for there is none other name under heaven given among men, whereby we must be saved . . . But as many as received Him [Christ, individually], to them gave He power to become the sons of God, even to them that believe on His name" (Acts 4:12, John 1:12).

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BIBLE STUDY

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"OUR BELOVED BARNABAS"

March 2, 1952

Printed Portion.....Acts 4:36-37; 9:26-27; 11:19-26.

Acts 4:36. And Joses, who by the apostles was surnamed Barnabas, (which is, being interpreted, The son of consolation,) a Levite, and of the country of Cyprus,

37. Having land, sold it, and brought the money, and laid it at the apostles' feet.

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9:26. And when Saul was come to Jerusalem, he assayed to join himself to the disciples: but they were all afraid of him, and believed not that he was a disciple.

27. But Barnabas took him, and brought him to the apostles, and declared unto them how he had seen the Lord in the way, and that he had spoken to him, and how he had preached boldly at Damascus in the name of Jesus.

11:19. Now they which were scattered abroad upon the persecution that arose about Stephen traveled as far as Phenice, and Cyprus, and Antioch, preaching the word to none but unto the Jews only.

20. And some of them were men of Cyprus and Cyrene, which, when they were come to Antioch, spake unto the Grecians, preaching the Lord Jesus.

21. And the hand of the Lord was with them: and a great number believed, and turned unto the Lord.

22. Then tidings of these things came unto the ears of the church which was in Jerusalem: and they sent forth Barnabas, that he should go as far as Antioch.

23. Who, when he came, and had seen the grace of God, was glad, and exhorted them all, that with purpose of heart they would cleave unto the Lord.

24. For he was a good man, and full of the Holy Ghost and of faith: and much people was added unto the Lord.

25. Then departed Barnabas to Tarsus, for to seek Saul:

26. And when he had found him, he brought him unto Antioch. And it came to pass, that a whole year they assembled themselves with the church, and taught much people. And the disciples were called Christians first in Antioch.

Memory Verse: He was a good man, and full of the Holy Ghost and of faith. Acts 11:24.

Practical Truth: In carrying on his work, God needs men who are full of the Holy Ghost and of faith.

COMMENTS AND APPLICATION

Barnabas was a good man because he had God in him, but no one is good without God. Jesus was called "Emmanuel, which being interpreted is, God with us." Matt. 1:23. Men of the world are often times called good because they act like it in so many ways, but the God-life in the soul is what makes them truly good, so they will meet with God's approval.

Barnabas showed his unselfishness in selling his property so as to help the poor saints at Jerusalem. He endeared himself to Saul of Tarsus by helping him to get acquainted with the saints at Jerusalem so they would not be afraid of him. They did not believe he was a disciple. He also helped the saints at Antioch and "Exhorted them all, that with purpose of heart they would cleave unto the Lord." The Bible says he was a good man.

Most of the terms used to speak of God's children in the Bible are: disciples, brethren, saints, or believers, but the name Christian was not much used in the New Testament and was applied to them at Antioch. It means "A follower of Christ." "As they ministered to the Lord and fasted." Job considered God's word and work more than his "necessary food." Job 23:12. We should too.

PAUL, A PRISONER FOR CHRIST

March 9, 1952

Printed Portion.....Philippians 3:4b-17.

Phil. 3:4b. If any other man thinketh that he hath whereof he might trust in the flesh, I more:

5. Circumcised the eighth day, of the stock of Israel,

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of the tribe of Benjamin, an Hebrew of the Hebrews; as touching the law, a Pharisee;

6. Concerning zeal, persecuting the church; touching the righteousness which is in the law, blameless.

7. But what things were gain to me, those I counted loss for Christ.

8. Yea doubtless, and I count all things but loss for the excellency of the knowledge of Christ Jesus my Lord: for whom I have suffered the loss of all things, and do count them but dung, that I may win Christ,

9. And be found in him, not having mine own righteousness, which is of the law, but that which is through the faith of Christ, the righteousness which is of God by faith:

10. That I may know him, and the power of his resurrection, and the fellowship of his sufferings, being made conformable unto his death;

11. If by any means I might attain unto the resurrection of the dead.

12. Not as though I had already attained, either were already perfect: but I follow after, if that I may apprehend that for which also I am apprehended of Christ Jesus.

13. Brethren, I count not myself to have apprehended: but this one thing I do, forgetting those things which are behind, and reaching forth unto those things which are before,

14. I press toward the mark for the prize of the high calling of God in Christ Jesus.

15. Let us therefore, as many as be perfect, be thus minded: and if in any thing ye be otherwise minded, God shall reveal even this unto you.

16. Nevertheless, whereto we have already attained, let us walk by the same rule, let us mind the same thing. 17. Brethren, be followers together of me, and mark

them which walk so as ye have us for an ensample.

Memory Verse: This one thing I do, forgetting those things which are behind, and reaching forth unto those things which are before, I press toward the mark for the prize of the high calling of God in Christ Jesus. Phil. 3: 13-14.

Practical Truth: A follower of Christ should be willing to suffer for his sake.

COMMENTS AND APPLICATION

Paul was a Jew by birth, free born a Roman citizen and a Greek by culture and study. His work that God called him to do, was an apostle to the Gentiles. He was much burdened for his own countrymen, the Jews, but they would not have him, so he said, "Lo, we turn to the Gentiles." Acts 13:26.

Paul wrote about half of the books in the New Testament, which are full of spiritual food for all Christians. Here are a few of the teachings of Paul that will be inspiring to us as we let the Holy Spirit sink the truths down into our hearts: "But none of these things move me." "For when I am weak then am I strong." "But this one thing I do,—I press toward the mark for the prize." "The letter killeth but the Spirit giveth life." "Where the Spirit of the Lord is there is liberty." "The wisdom of the world is foolishness with God." "Study to show thyself approved unto God, a workman that needeth not to be ashamed." "Be instant in season and out of season." "That I may know him and the power of his resurrection." The resurrection brought us our justification (Rom 4:25), heavenly citizenship (Eph. 1:19-20), assurance of our "resurrection" (1 Cor. 15:20-22), and a source of fruitfulness (Heb. 13:20-21).

TIMOTHY, A DEPENDABLE FOLLOWER March 16, 1952

Printed Portion.....Acts 16:1-3; Philippians 2:19-24; 2 Timothy 2:1-5.

Acts 16:1. Then came he to Derbe and Lystra: and, behold, a certain disciple was there, named Timotheus, the son of a certain woman, which was a Jewess, and believed; but his father was a Greek:

2. Which was well reported of by the brethren that were at Lystra and Iconium.

3. Him would Paul have to go forth with him; and took and circumcised him because of the Jews which were in those quarters: for they knew all that his father was a Greek.

Phil. 2:19. But I trust in the Lord Jesus to send Timotheus shortly unto you, that I also may be of good comfort, when I know your state.

20. For I have no man likeminded, who will naturally care for your state.

21. For all seek their own, not the things which are Jesus Christ's.

22. But ye know the proof of him, that, as a son with the father, he hath served with me in the gospel.

23. Him therefore I hope to send presently, so soon as I shall see how it will go with me.

24. But I trust in the Lord that I also myself shall come shortly.

2 Tim. 2:1. Thou therefore, my son, be strong in the grace that is in Christ Jesus.

2. And the things that thou hast heard of me among many witnesses, the same commit thou to faithful men, who shall be able to teach others also.

3. Thou therefore endure hardness, as a good soldier of Jesus Christ.

4. No man that warreth entangleth himself with the affairs of this life; that he may please him who hath chosen him to be a soldier.

5. And if a man also strive for masteries, yet is he not crowned, except he strive lawfully.

Memory Verse: Let no man despise thy youth; but be thou an example of the believers, in word, in conversation, in charity, in spirit, in faith, in purity. 1 Tim. 4:12.

Practical Truth: Self-control and a willingness to suffer hardship, if need be, for Christ's sake is needed to make anyone a dependable follower of Jesus Christ.

COMMENTS AND APPLICATION

Timothy had a good grandmother and mother who gave him a good training. 'God must have directed Paul to this young man for his after-life shows that he was the one for the duties that Paul was about to leave to some one else. God is still needing young consecrated workers that will seek the welfare of the kingdom of God and not their own selfish interests. Those who begin work in the Lord's vineyard must guard their spiritual life day by day, by humbly seeking to know the Holy Spirit's leading in all they do for Christ.

In our day the Sunday School hour (out of 168 hours) is the only time that many children have to learn about God and his ways. There are many children that do not have that. There are a few, like Timothy that have a Christian home where it is the daily habit of the parents to train their children in Bible living. When parents want to know how to raise their children, the word of God is full of good wholesome instruction, especially the books written by young Timothy, who Paul terms his "Own son in the faith." The Holy Spirit being the one to do the interpreting of the scriptures, children and youth be instructed aright.

LYDIA, WHO OPENED HER HEART AND HOME

March 23, 1952

Printed Portion......Acts 16:6-15, 40.

Acts 16:6. Now when they had gone throughout Phrygia and the region of Galatia, and were forbidden of the Holy Ghost to preach the word in Asia,

7. After they were come to Mysia, they assayed to go into Bithynia: but the Spirit suffered them not.

8. And they passing by Mysia came down to Troas.

9. And a vision appeared to Paul in the night; There stood a man of Macedonia, and prayed him, saying, Come over into Macedonia, and help us.

10. And after he had seen the vision, immediately we endeavoured to go into Macedonia, assuredly gathering that the Lord had called us for to preach the gospel unto them.

11. Therefore loosing from Troas, we came with a straight course to Samothracia, and the next day to Ne-apolis:

12. And from thence to Philippi, which is the chief city of that part of Macedonia, and a colony: and we were in that city abiding certain days.

13. And on the sabbath we went out of the city by a river side, where prayer was wont to be made; and we sat down, and spake unto the women which resorted thither.

'14. And a certain woman named Lydia, a seller of purple, of the city of Thyatira, which worshipped God, heard us: whose heart the Lord opened, that she attended unto the things which were spoken of Paul.

15. And when she was baptized, and her household, she besought us, saying, If ye have judged me to be faithful to the Lord, come into my house, and abide there. And she constrained us.

40. And they went out of the prison, and entered into the house of Lydia: and when they had seen the brethren, they comforted them, and departed.

Memory Verse: A woman that feareth the Lord, she shall be praised. Proverbs 31:30.

Practical Truth: Women have done much in advancing the kingdom of God through entertaining God's laborers, especially pioneers.

COMMENTS AND APPLICATION

Paul had definite directions from the Holy Spirit before he went over to Macedonia. First, he was forbidden of the Holy Ghost to preach the word in Asia; then they assayed to go into Bythinia: but the Spirit suffered them not. When the call did come for them to go, they were whole-hearted and prompt to do so. To those who love God, a call for spiritual help from those who desire to know and act upon the truth, the cost of doing God's will is nothing compared to the joy that God gives to them who obey him lovingly. God will clear the way and give us the ability to do our duty.

Paul preached the word later in Asia but the time was not yet for it says of Lydia "Whose heart the Lord opened, that she attended to the things spoken of Paul." So the time was ripe there. She attended the prayer meeting, she heard the word preached, the Lord opened her heart, she gave heed unto the things that were spoken, she and her household were baptized, and then she became hospitable and opened her home to the missionaries. Before Paul and his party left they came again to her house and comforted the brethren and departed. Paul wrote a letter to the believers there at a later time.

LUKE, THE HISTORIAN

March 30, 1952

Printed Portion.....Luke 1:1-4; Acts 1:1-2; 16:10;

Colossians 4:14; 2 Timothy 4:11.

Luke 1:1. Forasmuch as many have taken in hand to set forth in order a declaration of those things which are most surely believed among us,

2. Even as they delivered them unto us, which from the beginning were eyewitnesses, and ministers of the word;

3. It seemed good to me also, having had perfect understanding of all things from the very first, to write unto thee in order, most excellent Theophilus,

4. That thou mightest know the certainty of those things, wherein thou hast been instructed.

Acts 1:1. The former treatise have I made, O Theophilus, of all that Jesus began both to do and teach,

2. Until the day in which he was taken up, after that he through the Holy Ghost had given commandments unto the apostles whom he had chosen:

16:10. And after he had seen the vision, immediately we endeavoured to go into Macedonia, assuredly gathering that the Lord had called us for to preach the gospel unto them.

Col. 4:14. Luke, the beloved physician, and Demas, greet you.

2 Tim. 4:11. Only Luke is with me. Take Mark, and bring him with thee: for he is profitable to me for the ministry.

Memory Verse: Ye shall receive power after that the Holy Ghost is come upon you: and ye shall be witnesses unto me both in Jerusalem, and in all Judaea, and in Samaria, and unto the uttermost part of the earth. Acts 1:8.

Practical Truth: A person with ability may serve God effectively through his writings.

COMMENTS AND APPLICATION

Paul did not need Luke as a physician along with him, for Jesus was and is the healer of all manner of diseases. His work was as a historian to record "All that Jesus began to do and teach." Acts 1:1. The subject matter of the book of Acts is what Jesus continued to do and teach through his Holy Ghost filled apostles. Luke, in mentioning Jesus, often speaks of him as the Son of man, bringing out the fact that Jesus did put himself on an equality with mankind so as to be near all their needs with his compassion for the multitude. Jesus was and still is a true friend to sinners, and those who will come to him with strong decision, he will be their Saviour.

The all important subject they discussed during the forty days after the resurrection of Christ was; "The things concerning the kingdom of God." After the day of Pentecost this work advanced rapidly as the apostles gave themselves, "Continually to prayer, and to the ministry of the word." Acts 6:4. "God wrought special miracles by the hands of Paul." Acts 19:11. God is still using his ministers to perform miracles when they lay holy hands on handkerchiefs, send them to the sick and they are healed, which proves the Bible to be true, "Jesus Christ the same yesterday, and today, and forever."
