Searching For The Lord

Jer. 29:13, 14, "Ye shall seek me and find me when ye shall search for me with all your heart. And I will be found of you, saith the Lord." Here is an old text, written many years ago, but I feel it is so important for us today. I see so many people today whom God begins to convict of sin and their need of Him—and I believe God talks to almost all people at some time in their lives—make some start at searching for Him, but sad it is that many search in vain and fail to find Him because they fail to look in the right place and manner. Please notice the text as we notice some examples of old in God's Word.

Dear reader, this is a very important text. First, people must desire to find him as Jesus said in Matt. 5:6, "Blessed are they which do hunger and thirst after righteousness: for they shall be filled." And as David said in Psa. 42:1, "As the hart panteth after the water brooks, so panteth my soul after thee, O

God." And in Song of Solomon 3:1-3 the writer wanted to find him whom his soul loved so much he sought him in the night, on the streets, and went forth asking about Him. In other words, he put forth much effort until he found Him whom his soul loved. Surely we must want him bad enough to start searching for Him. And now here is the important part of this little message.

After people start searching for the Lord, many times they look or search in the wrong place or have the wrong purpose and quit before they really find Him. Now let us look at Psa. 42:4-6. Here David was surely in earnest about finding the Lord. He said he went with the multitude to the house of God. It may be that some of them knew God, but in the next verse we see his soul was still cast down. He had not found Him. Dear soul, you may go to church with the multitude and yet not find God. Many people are doing that today. They think just because they go to church on Sunday with some of God's people, they are all right, but go on for years and never really find God, a personal God. Dear soul, you are going to meet God personally. That is why it is so important for you to find Him personally. Read Job 19:27. Job said, "I shall see him for myself." And in Romans 14:11, 12, Paul said every one of us shall give an account of himself to God. So do not stop short of finding Him a personal Saviour. Then in Luke 2:44 is an example so true today. Here were some people looking for Jesus and they supposed him to be among the kin folks. Oh, so many people today do this. Sometimes when the Lord talks to them, they get under conviction and start searching for the Lord. It is sad, but they start looking for him to be among the kinfolks. Maybe they have a mother or father or brother or some kin who belong to some church, making a cold profession. They just join in with them and suppose the Lord is with them, but many times the kin have gone on many years' journey without the Lord. And if the blind lead the blind, both shall fall into the ditch, Jesus said. Oh, dear soul, you had better beware. How about it? Is your profession built on a family tree or have you searched for the Lord with all your heart until you found him? If not, do not stop, he may not be with the kin. You may have to do like the text, go back a long journey

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a long ways from the Lord, yet supposing him to be among them. It is such a common thing for people to join some church or creed just because father or mother belongs to it. Dear soul, father or mother, or any one else cannot answer for you. So you had better search until you find Him and forget all the old family tree. Many of the so-called churches today that once had God in them when your old mother or father lived, have gone on the rocks and wrecked, and God moved out, and He is not there any more. So just because you had a good mother or father in some church does not mean you can find the Lord there for yourself. Be honest, and if God is not with them, forsake them and do not hold on to some name or creed and be lost at the judgment. But be as the one in S. of Solomon 3:4 (Please read this text). He went on until he found Him whom his soul loved. Prove the Lord. We can find him yet today if we will not stop short of the text in Jer. 29:13.

Dear soul, be persistent like the Greeks were in John 12:20. They came on a long journey to see Jesus. The disciples tried to tell them about him, but they said, "Sirs, we would see Jesus." They insisted on seeing him personally. Dear soul, let us do the same. It is good to hear others tell about Him, but that is not enough. We want to find Him ourselves, personally; and we CAN, is the good news. Let us not stop short of our goal.

In Luke 24:5 is another example. Here the women were looking for Jesus in the wrong place. The angel said, "Why seek ye the living among the dead? He is not here," he is a living Christ. Oh, dear soul, so many today are seeking the Christ among the dead, spiritually speaking. Beware! These churches (socalled) of the day are just dead places, so to speak in a spiritual sense. They are just man-made organizations full of dead people spiritually; and you cannot find Jesus in such dead places. He is a living Christ, and must be sought among the living. These old dead formal churches (so-called) whose members have taken on the world, its pride and fashions, are a stench in the nostrils of our God. So beware! He is not among the dead.

Now let us notice John 6:24. Here some people were seeking or searching for Jesus and put forth much effort and crossed a great lake. When they found him, he said to them, "You seek me not because of the miracles, but because ye ate of the loaves and were filled." Verse 26. They had the wrong purpose, a selfish one. We see this today in many. They want a personal gain out of Christ. They want to gain some praise of men or honor one of another, or some vain glory, etc. Beware! This will not work. Read James 4:3 and Acts 8:18. This tells of a man named Simeon who wanted the Holy Ghost, but Peter warned him that his heart was not right in God's sight. Beware, dear soul! Just what is our purpose for seeking the Lord? We must have a pure purpose as in S. of Sol. 3:1-4, "By night on my bed I sought him whom my soul loveth: I sought him, but found him not. I will rise now, and go about the city in the streets, and in the broad ways I will seek him whom

from your kin to find Jesus. Many people have gone my soul loveth: I sought him, but I found him not. The watchmen that go about the city found me: to whom I said, Saw ye him whom my soul loveth? It was but a little that I passed from them, but I found him whom my soul loveth: I held him and would not let him go, . . ." We must seek Jesus because we love him. Our souls must pant and thirst for Him as in Psa. 42:1, 2, "As the hart panteth after the water brooks, so panteth my soul after thee, O God. My soul thirsteth for God, for the living God; when shall I come and appear before God?"

> Dear soul, have you found him yet? Are you searching for Him? If not, you should start now, and do not stop short of my text, Jer. 29:13, 14. You can find him precious to you and he said, "I will never leave thee nor forsake thee," praise His name! Just get right down to business with him and begin to surrender your all to him and he will come and be a personal Saviour to you. He will be your God and you will be his son or daughter (Heb. 8:10).

-:::-Superfluity

James 1:21 tells us to lay aside all superfluity. and when it says ALL it means along every line. In the home or on the car or on the body. The Greek dictionary gives the word superfluity as "to superabound in quanity or quality; be in excess; to cause to super-abound or excell; be more abundant; be the better; enough to spare; exceed; excell; increase." The Word of God tells us in Prov. 3:6, "In all thy ways acknowledge Him and He shall direct thy paths." The Lord wants us to acknowledge Him in our buying as well as other things.

Some folks told me one time that they needed to buy some furniture for the house. The woman wanted to pray about it, but the man said they did not have time to pray. They went on and bought their furniture without praying about it. They said they felt like they lost one hundred dollars in the deal.

Some people seem to think just because they have the money, they can buy whatever they want. But He says to acknowledge Him in all our ways. I am sure that if God was acknowledged, some people would be more careful and more economical in their buying.

When we build a meeting house, we say we want it durable and plain, so we should feel the same way about our homes and furnishings.

The Greek says that superfluity is to superabound in quantity or quality. Superabound means more than enough or more than sufficient. In Isa. 23:18 He says for "her merchandise shall be for them that dwell before the Lord, to eat sufficiently and for durable clothing." From the looks of the furnishings in some of the homes of people who call themselves saints of God, it doesn't look like God has been acknowledged in their buying. It looks more like a wealthy person's home than an humble saint of God.

After the Day of Pentecost they had all things common and they had great power with God. Oh, saints of God, how careful we ought to be! If we don't watch and pray, we will let the cares of life and the comforts of the home crowd out Jesus.

Some people are more eager to talk about and to show you their nice furnishings than they are to talk about Jesus. It seems the more comfortably people are fixed, the less spiritual they are. If we don't pray much and live an humble life, we will drift into a state where we will buy the best for ourselves and give God the left overs. There needs to be more dying out to self. The Spirit of God in people will teach them to be temperate in all things. 1 Cor. 9:25, "And every man that striveth for the mastery is temperate in all things. Now they do it to obtain a corruptible crown, but we an incorruptible." 1 Corinthians 6:19, 20, "What? Know ye not that your body is the temple of the Holy Ghost, which is in you, which ye have of God. And ye are not your own? For ye are bought with a price, therefore glorify God in your body and in your spirit, which are God's.'

Col. 3:17, "And whatsoever ye do, in word or deed, do all in the name of the Lord Jesus, giving thanks to God and the Father by him." 1 Cor. 10:31. "Whether therefore ye eat, or drink or whatsoever ye do, do all to the glory of God." If we live up to these scriptures, we will do all to please the Lord. Our eating and drinking and putting on of apparel or building, furnishing, buying a car, or whatever it might be should all be done in the name of the Lord. If the Lord is not acknowledged in these things, self will have its way. Even if we have money with which to buy things, we should seek God to know how He would have us spend it, that would be to his glory. I am sure that in many cases Jesus has been crucified and self has been pleased. We are going to have to give an account of the way that we spend our money.

When Jesus fed the multitude, he gathered up the fragments that were left, that nothing be wasted. The Word of God also teaches us plainness and to buy things that are durable. Pride has caused many people to ride over the Word of God and to go on and buy things in order that self might be pleased.

Think of Jesus, how humble, plain, and common he was, and he tells us to follow in his footsteps. Jesus also lived for others. Our whole motive in life should be to please Him in all things. Superfluity and covetousness goes right along together. Paul said he brought every thought into the obedience of Christ. Self has got to be crucified.

The judgment day is drawing nigh. Soon Jesus will be coming. If we haven't been faithful over the few things that he has entrusted in our hands here, how can he make us ruler over many things? Oh, saints of God, we need to lay up more treasures in heaven and less for self. —Murphy Allen

An Exclusive Christ

Jesus is the sovereign, universal King, and "only Potentate." He only is the Christ of God; he is the Savior of men, neither is there salvation in any other. "Ask of me," saith God in the covenant made with his Son in the untold ages of the past—"ask of me, and I shall give thee the heathen [Gentile nations] for thine

inheritance, and the uttermost parts of the earth for thy possession." Psa. 2:8. Not only is he Lord over all the earth, but "when he bringeth in the first begotten into the world, he saith, And let all the angels of God worship him." Heb. 1:6. Jesus is King over heaven and earth, yea, throughout the vast universe. His kingdom, therefore, is an exclusive kingdom; it leaves no place for any other. It is the stone that breaks all other powers to pieces, and fills the whole earth.

His church is likewise exclusive. It is only to be expected that the Savior who gave his precious life to redeem us from sin, would jealously guard his redeemed church, and that any counterfeit would receive no recognition from him. The Word of truth acknowledges no church besides the one founded by the Saviour, and it is therefore our duty to recognize only this one. This church is the body of saved believers—"his body" (Eph. 1:22, 23; Col. 1:18, 24).

The Spirit of God of the Bible is an exclusive Spir-It repels and rejects every other spirit. God's it. children have all been "baptized by one Spirit into one body, and have been all made to drink into one Spirit" (1 Cor. 12:13). This all-searching and eternal Spirit in the hearts of the redeemed of the Lord takes cognizance of what kind of spirits dwell in the hearts and bodies of others who claim to be the worshipers of God. If of opposite character, there is no fellowship. If all are in possession of the pure and gentle Spirit and nature of God, the blessed elements of heaven, their hearts flow joyfully together; and this is fellowship, pure and heavenly, and the source of much happiness. Thus the Spirit of God endorses himself and excludes all others.

The religion of Jesus Christ is exclusive in its nature. It compromises with no other. It justly assumes to be the only true religion and announces all others to be of the devil. This very characteristic has chiefly elicited the persecutions that have befallen Christ and his church in all ages. Had Christ been willing to fuse with Jewry and endorse along side of his own laws the laws and traditions of the Jews, they would not have crucified him. Had the apostles grafted the new faith upon that Old Testament code that was ready to die and vanish away, then, says Paul, would the "offense of the cross have ceased."

At one time during the great persecution inflicted upon the saints of God by pagan Rome, the idolaters offered to spare the lives of the Christians and give them religious liberty if they would but acknowledge the pagan gods and religion as also being genuine. But this the Christians could not do even to save their lives. Nay, only the system of divine worship that Christ founded is of God. It alone is the truth, and every other is false. As it was then, so it is now: to confess any religion but Christianity and any creed but the New Testament is to deny Christ. To confess that there is any true church besides the one Jesus built is to make God a liar. To be honest in the sight of God and to stand upon the offensive foundation of the exclusive Christ and his exclusive church, kingdom, and religion, is what stirs the forces of opposition today and calls out what little persecution saints have (Continued on Page 7)

Editorials

By the time this "Faith and Victory" paper is printed and circulated out among the many readers, the summer campmeetings will have begun. We are expecting a harvest of souls in these meetings, for the gospel is the power of God unto salvation to every one that believeth. God has an army of good clean ministers who have the fear of God upon their hearts insomuch that they fearlessly declare the truth of the Word of God and preach the definite work of being justified by faith in Christ and his atonement, also the second definite work of being sanctified or cleansed from the sin nature and infilled with the Holy Spirit.

In justification one's actual transgressions are all forgiven and he has peace with God through the Lord Jesus Christ. One lives holy in a justified state and walks in all the light that God shines on his pathway, and in this way he keeps free from sin and condemnation. As he (or she) does this, there is a death going on in his soul, as he is dying out to selfish carnal ways and his soul is growing in grace and in knowledge of the Lord Jesus Christ. The Adamic transmitted sin is dormant more or less as the presence of God gives him power to do His will. By doing the will of God and growing in grace one will soon find that his soul needs something more from God, which is the cleansing from the sin nature, so the soul can be made pure and most holy, giving one power and more freedom to bear the fruits of the Spirit and opening the understanding to the deeper truths of God's holy Word.

In the book of Joshua 3:5, we read where Joshua commanded the people to sanctify themselves just before they crossed over the overflowing Jordan River. for tomorrow He would do wonders. This is typical of our sanctification. Today, in order to be ready for God to sanctify us, we first sanctify ourselves, which means that we die to everything that we know and that which we do not know, setting ourselves apart to be God's sacred property. Then we are in a condition for God to do wonders and sanctify us by sending the Holy Spirit into our hearts, cleansing us and making us most holy, and we love to obey the Scripture found in Col. 3:2, "Set your affections on things above, not on things on the earth. For ye are dead and your life is hid with Christ in God." Read the next verse and you can see why this is needful.

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It seems there never was a time when this literal world was in such a "jittery, topsy-turvey" condition. The rulers of the nations are puzzled and know not what to do. They are all in a strained condition and seem ready to fly at one another's throats. War, war is filling the air, and they are inventing such deadly weapons to destroy life and property that it looks like if the power, strength, and energy were turned loose that it would destroy the inhabitants from off the face of the earth; but according to the Bible, man will not destroy the earth completely, but God himself will do that.

While the world is in a turmoil and greatly perplexed concerning peculiar things that are taking place, we also find that the religious spiritual elements are greatly disturbed and peculiar winds of doctrines are blowing many off their feet, so to speak, which leaves them without any solid foundation, and it takes some time for some to get their bearings again and get settled on the true Rock with the company of true holiness people, which is His Body, the church. There seems to be quite a number at this present time who have become estranged from the Body. They have a desire in their hearts to get back in fellowship with the Body of true believers and hardly know what steps to take.

The first thing they need to realize is that in being led off and separating themselves from the saints in light, they have brought grief to all the saints. They need to humble down and confess and ask forgiveness of God and of all the saints in order to restore confidence and fellowship. Those that would come back without any humbleness and confession would be likely to do the same thing over if the enemy worked up a divisional spirit in any leader. In calling souls to himself, Christ said, "I am meek and lowly in heart." Any one that is meek and lowly in heart would naturally be broken up because of grieving the saints and aiding in division. If they are not in this condition it would not be safe for them to be turned loose among the sheep and lambs of the Lord's flock. It seems, from past observation, that it is hard for anyone who strays away to see what great wrong they have done in dividing themselves from the saints and aiding some leader that has gone astray and talks and speaks evil of the meek and lowly saints of God, to ever get humble enough to come back the Bible way. It seems that "Barabbas," spiritually speaking, stands between them and the saints and will not allow them to humble sufficiently to clear up the whole thing so the saints can have that needed restored confidence and fellowship. We are praying for every one, as their souls are precious in the sight of God. We would love to throw our arms around them and welcome them, if we can see that meek and lowly spirit being manifested; but for them to come in without manifesting the meek and lowly Spirit of Christ, our receiving them would only be aiding them in deceiving their own souls and preparing the way for later trouble.

to endure in these last days. This persecution, however, may yet assume degrees of severity. But, my soul says, Let it come as the providence of God shall permit, and he will overrule it to his glory, to the more perfect purging of his sanctuary, and to the spiritual improvement of his remnant.

The sects would not mind our using the title given by the mouth of the Lord, namely, "the church of the living God," if we would only confess that all the sects are likewise churches of God—sister churches. But this would be confessing a falsehood. The Lord owns no sisterhood of sects, but ascribes "mystery Babylon" to Rome and her family of harlot daughters. This statement seems at first thought to be a hard saying. The Lord give us eyes to see and ears to hear that we may receive the truth with unprejudiced hearts.

The Bible gives no place for a plurality of brotherhoods in Christ. "But one is your Father, and all ye are brethren," one family in heaven and earth (Eph. 3:15). "For as we have many members in one body, and all members have not the same office: so we, being many, are one body in Christ, and every one members one of another." Rom. 12:4, 5. Only "one body in Christ." As we discern that body and know that God has inducted us into the same, it would be dishonesty in the sight of God and a base, cowardly compromise to please men, to admit that several hundred other bodies are also in Christ. Yea, it would be making God a liar, since his Word says there is one body in Christ, only one.

John Winebrenner was too honest a man to sanction such a lie. Hence he taught an exclusive church of God, and as a result met with persecutions from the sects, who were unchurched by the Word of God. He and those with him, however, did not possess sufficient light to avoid forming another sect. This they did when they organized themselves together in general and annual eldership incorporations. Though they called themselves the church of God, they soon found themselves without that Bible holiness and that identity with the body of Christ which authorized an

exclusive use of the sacred title, "The Church of God." And finding themselves no more that divine body than other bodies organized by men, and becoming more and more destitute of godliness, they felt the inconsistency in crying "sect" to their sister sects. So they dropped all opposition, confessed in plain words in their organ, that all the other sects were churches of God also, and consequently they are now received in peace in the Babel sisterhood.

But in the last few years God has raised up a people who fully discern the body of Christ. They have taken their stand upon the platform of "all truth," as it is in Christ Jesus. By the process of salvation they have been taken into the one fold of Christ (John 10: 9); the Lord himself added them to his own body, the church (Acts 2:47). They teach and accept no condition of membership in the church other than those conditions found in the Word of God. And by a life of perfect obedience to the divine will and of faith toward God, they have this witness that they please God and are abiding in the one and only church of God, which is the body of Christ and which includes all the saved in heaven and earth. With perfect consistency and loyalty to God they resist every spirit but that which they have received of God; reject every other church (so called) but that which Christ built upon the rock; and say to all honest disciples of Christ who have been falsely taught and taken by men into men's churches, "Come out of her," "Come out from among them." Though this is the point of offense and persecutions, yet by the grace of God we will not compromise the truth to save our lives.

All sects are associated on a plane of sisterly non-exclusiveness. To teach one God, one Lord, one body, and then to continue in a divided condition is to be subject for the scorn of unbelievers and to make it difficult to reach the lost. None of the sects holds a divine charter for its existence; hence none challenges the right and title of another. In other words, all are without foundation in the Word of God; therefore they argee not to question each other's foundation. All have glass houses, hence must not throw stones at one another. But we repeat that in these last days God has raised up a people who believe the Word of God and act accordingly. Christ has but "one fold," one church; and, knowing we are saved into this one fold, we must in order to be consistent before God and to act out his Word, ignore every other (so-called) fold or church.

With a view of destroying the work of God, the enemies of Ezra and of Nehemiah proposed to join with them in building the temple and the wall. But they answered them, "The God of heaven, he will prosper us; therefore we his servants will arise and build: but ye have no portion, nor right, nor memorial, in Jerusalem." Neh. 2:20.

They were then an exclusive people unto the Lord, and their reformation at Jerusalem was a grand type of the present reformation, in which God is restoring a pure church, the bride, the Lamb's wife. "As the Lord liveth, what the Lord saith, that will I say." It would be bigotry for one sect to say, "We

are the church, and all the rest are frauds." But for God's true saints, who "follow the Lamb whithersoever he goeth," and belong only to him, and adhere only in "his body, which is the church," and which includes all saved men in heaven and earth, in or out of sect folds-for such to talk of other churches would be inconsistent and God-dishonoring, yea, confusion. Therefore be sure you are right, then go ahead in holiness of heart and life. "Noah condemned the whole world." One man mounted on eternal truth can safely defy all the devotees of human creeds and systems on earth. There is "one God." Amen. Then all others are idols. "One body." Amen. Then all sect bodies are excluded. "One Spirit." Then all spirits not in fellowship with the pure in heart are not of God. "One Christ," then all others are antiChrist. -D. S. Warner

To Whom Does It Belong?

To whom does this breath that I breathe belong? To whom does this strength that keeps me going belong? To whom does this money that I have inherited, this salary I am earning, this home I am building, these savings I have in the bank belong? When I speak of them, I call them mine, but whose are they? Printed Portion......Romans 1:8-17; 2:1-2; 3:21-22a.

Rom. 1:8. First, I thank my God through Jesus Christ for you all, that your faith is spoken of throughout the whole world.

9. For God is my witness, whom I serve with my spirit in the gospel of his Son, that without ceasing I make mention of you always in my prayers;

10. Making request, if by any means now at length I might have a prosperous journey by the will of God to come unto you.

11. For I long to see you, that I may impart unto you some spiritual gift, to the end ye may be established;

12. That is, that I may be comforted together with you by the mutual faith both of you and me.

13. Now I would not have you ignorant, brethren, that oftentimes I purposed to come unto you, (but was let hitherto,) that I might have some fruit among you also, even as among other Gentiles.

14. I am debtor both to the Greeks, and to the Barbarians; both to the wise, and to the unwise.

15. So, as much as in me is, I am ready to preach the gospel to you that are at Rome also.

16. For I am not ashamed of the gospel of Christ: for it is the power of God unto salvation to every one that believeth; to the Jew first, and also to the Greek.

17. For therein is the righteousness of God revealed from faith to faith: as it is written, The just shall live by faith.

2:1. Therefore thou are inexcusable, O man, whosoever thou art that judgest: for wherein thou judgest another, thou condemnest thyself; for thou that judgest doest the same things.

2. But we are sure that the judgment of God is according to truth against them which commit such things.

3:21. But now the righteousness of God without the law is manifested, being witnessed by the law and the prophets;

22a. Even the righteousness of God which is by faith of Jesus Christ unto all and upon all them that believe.

Memory Verse: I am not ashamed of the gospel of Christ: for it the power of God unto salvation to every one that believeth. Rom. 1:16.

Practical Truth: Righteousness comes to a sinner through personal trust in Christ as his Saviour.

COMMENTS AND APPLICATION

It is impossible for man, by his human efforts to pull himself up to God. Man within himself is an utter failure in achieving righteousness for only the righteousness of God is what counts. The Christian is given a way by faith in Christ to obtain righteousness that will last throughout all eternity. Listen to what God has to say in 1 Cor. 1:30, "But of him are ye in Christ Jesus, who of God is made unto us wisdom, and righteousness, and sanctification, and redemption." God's judgments are righteous judgments because God knows the heart of man. Psa. 19:9 and John 2:25.

Holiness could never be communicated to sinful creatures, such as are born into the world (Rom 3:23), except through the mediation of a holy person. Hence it was of necessity that the Son of God should come. 2 Cor. 5:21. The penalty of sin must be paid. Rom. 3:23. The nature of the sinner must undergo a transformation. John 3:3. The sinner must be covered with a righteousness which he could not earn, but it comes "by faith of Jesus Christ unto all and upon all them that believe" verse 22. Righteousness, then is imputed to them that believe in the atoning work; "According to his mercy he saved us." Read Titus 3:4-7.

Printed Portion......Romans 12:1-2, 9-21.

Rom. 12:1. I beseech you therefore, brethren, by the mercies of God, that ye present your bodies a living sacrifice, holy, acceptable unto God, which is your reasonable service.

2. And be not conformed to this world: but be ye transformed by the renewing of your mind, that ye may prove what is that good, and acceptable, and perfect, will of God.

9. Let love be without dissimulation. Abhor that which is evil; cleave to that which is good.

10. Be kindly affectioned one to another with brotherly love; in honour preferring one another;

11. Not slothful in business; fervent in spirit; serving the Lord;

12. Rejoicing in hope; patient in tribulation; continuing instant in prayer;

13. Distributing to the necessity of saints; given to hospitality.

14. Bless them which persecute you: bless, and curse not.

15. Rejoice with them that do rejoice, and weep with them that weep.

16. Be of the same mind one toward another. Mind not high things, but condescend to men of low estate. Be not wise in your own conceits.

17. Recompense to no man evil for evil. Provide things honest in the sight of all men.

19. Dearly beloved, avenge not yourselves, but rather give place unto wrath: for it is written, Vengeance is mine; I will repay, saith the Lord.

20. Therefore if thine enemy hunger, feed him; if he thirst, give him drink: for in so doing thou shalt heap coals of fire on his head.

21. Be not overcome of evil, but overcome evil with good.

Memory Verse: Let love be without dissimulation. Abbor that which is evil; cleave to that which is good. Rom. 12:9.

Practical Truth: Where the law of God rules, there will be a consistent pattern of Christian behavior.

COMMENTS AND APPLICATION

In our Christian behavior, our first duty is to God himself. In our scripture before us we have the presentation of our bodies "a living sacrifice" and the first thing that is mentioned is that they should be holy. Take note of this as there are many that say that "My body sins but my soul does not." Satan could not invent a bigger lie than that. When God expects us to live holy lives undoubtedly he will make it possible for us to do so. Ponder 1 Thess. 5:23, where he includes the body with the soul and spirit. Having been presented to God, the body should be kept holy for him and wholly for him to be used for him.

Our next duty in our Christian behavior is toward others. As one has said "God first, others second, me last." Then the key word that will fit all the doors is love. Love to God and love to our fellowman, and God can Page Sixteen

give us that love. Love never grumbles, rather it is patient in tribulation. Love is ever prayerful and is ever ready to forgive and have sympathy for others. Love is peaceable, and desires to "Live peaceable with all men." That does not mean that we are to compromise with evil, for God requires of us to live a holy life before him and that will win others. Read Luke 1:71-75 and Titus 2:11-14.

10. For we are his workmanship, created in Christ Jesus unto good works, which God hath before ordained that we should walk in them.

13. But now in Christ Jesus ye who sometimes were far off are made nigh by the blood of Christ.

14. For he is our peace, who hath made both one, and hath broken down the middle wall of partition between us;

15. Having abolished in his flesh the enmity, even the law of commandments contained in ordinances; for to make in himself of twain one new man, so making peace;

16. And that he might reconcile both unto God in one body by the cross, having slain the enmity thereby:

17. And came and preached peace to you which were afar off, and to them that were nigh.

18. For through him we both have access by one Spirit unto the Father.

19. Now therefore ye are no more strangers and foreigners, but fellow citizens with the saints, and of the household of God;

20. And are built upon the foundation of the apostles and prophets, Jesus Christ himself being the chief corner stone; 21. In whom all the building fitly framed together

groweth unto an holy temple in the Lord:

22. In whom ye also are builded together for an habitation of God through the Spirit.

Memory Verse: Now therefore ye are no more strangers and foreigners, but fellow citizens with the saints, and of the household of God. Eph. 2:19.

Practical Truth: There are no national or racial barriers to fellowship with Christ.

COMMENTS AND APPLICATION

Salvation is free, it is the gift of God and we are saved by grace and not of works. Our works can not possibly save us but after we are saved we can show by our works that we are saved from sin and saved unto righteousness. If a man goes on in his sins and claims to be a Christian, he deceives himself, for those who are born of God do not "commit sin" 1 John 3:9. The Christian is "Made nigh by the blood of Christ." "The blood, the blood, The precious blood of Jesus, The blood will work a perfect cure, Will cleanse the heart and keep it pure, The blood, the blood, The precious blood of Jesus." (127 in Evening Light Songs). It is "through faith in his blood" that we have "propitiation" (Merciful favor), Rom. 3:25.

As the individual is made pure and holy in his sight so is the church of the living God "Not having spot, or wrinkle, or any such thing; but that it should be holy and without blemish" Eph. 5:27. No one can get into God's church without getting saved from sin and no one can stay in God's church without living a holy life and keeping free from sin. The great idea of our great salvation is to live free from sin and then Christ can dwell in the heart. 1 Cor. 3:16, 17.

Eph. 4:1. I therefore, the prisoner of the Lord, beseech you that ye walk worthy of the vocation wherewith ye are called,

Practical Truth: Christian growth is both a privilege and a duty.

COMMENTS AND APPLICATION

As we yield ourselves unto God (Rom. 6:13), we may expect scourging and chastening. Heb. 12:6. "For whom the Lord loveth he chasteneth, and scourgeth every son he receiveth." We may expect purging for John 15:2 says "And every branch that beareth fruit, he purgeth it, that it may bring forth more fruit;" that we may be kept as sons, Heb. 12:7 and "that we might be partakers of his holiness" Heb. 12:10; and be purified, and made white, and tried, Dan. 12:10. The above scriptures show something of our growth in grace as Peter tells us, 2 Pet. 3:18 "But grow in grace, and in the knowledge of our Lord and Saviour Jesus Christ;" so as we have the word of Christ dwelling in our hearts and put it into practice we will "Walk worthy of the vocation."

In order for us to be a perfect man and come to the "Measure and of the stature of the fulness of Christ" we need very much to walk "With all lowliness and meekness, with longsuffering, forbearing one another in love; endeavoring to keep the unity of the Spirit in the bond of peace." Now, since it is Jesus who is the head of the church and it is he that has promised to be with us to the end as we yield unto him, then let us yield unreservedly to his control and he will bring joy to the soul.
