# His Body, The Church

Our text is found in Col. 2:24, where Paul speaks of Christ's body, which he says is the church. Following this verse he speaks of it as a mystery that has been hid for ages, but is now made manifest to His saints. In the 27th verse he makes it plain that the

mystery is "Christ in you the hope of glory."

In the 28th verse he said he was warning every man, and teaching every man in all wisdom; that he may present every man perfect in Christ Jesus.

This same exhortation is certainly good for all believers in Christ today that they may be found without sin before God. We find in Eph. 5:30 that we who are saved from sin are members of his body, of his flesh, and of his bones. When one who is justified and holy, presents his body to God as a living sacrifice, which is his reasonable service (Rom. 12:1) this takes in his fleshly body and bones as well as his soul. This harmonizes with what Paul wrote in 1 Thess, 5:23, 24: "And the very God of peace sanctify you wholly; and I pray God your whole spirit and soul and body be preserved blameless unto the coming of our Lord Jesus Christ. Faithful is he that calleth you, who also will do it." Brethren and sisters, let us believe God's Word and measure to it in its fulness that we can truly be a member in His body, which is the church, a clean vessel, sanctified and meet for the Master's use, and be a real possessor of the joys of full salvation, having a clear hope of glory in the soul.

The church, which is His body, is high above this world and its human religions, and is a clean institution without spot of wrinkle or any such thing, functioning in the world by the power of God, and is not subject to human regulations, but is divinely organized and spiritually governed by Christ who is the head of the Church of, and in, God; and all we who are saved and living clean before God are only members in that body, yielding ourselves unto God for Him to work in us both to will and to do of his good pleasure (Phil. 2:13).

In Col. 1:12, Paul writes thus: "Giving thanks unto the Father, which has made us meet to be partakers of the inheritance of the saints in light: who hath delivered us from the power of darkness [Satan's kingdom] and has translated us into the kingdom of his dear Son." One definition for translate is to transfer. In the large cities travelers on the electric cars are often given a ticket with a transfer so they can get off the car that they are on and get on a car that will take them to their desired destination. So it is with sinners in this world. They are all traveling to the judgment bar of God with sin and transgression upon them, which carries the penalty of death and

destruction upon it, and in that day will hear words similar to those recorded in 2 Thess. 1:8, 9: "In flaming fire taking vengeance on them that know not God, and obey not the gospel of our Lord Jesus Christ: who shall be punished with everlasting destruction from the presence of the Lord, and from the glory of his power." A sinner who desires to get on the right road that leads home to heaven and to God, needs to be transferred or translated to a heavenly car on the Highway of Holiness which Christ has purchased for you and offers to you freely if you will only allow yourself to be convicted and accept his poffered mercy.

In the 35th chapter of Isaiah the prophet wrote of this highway, and it is called the Way of Holiness in the eighth verse. The statement is made that the unclean (or unsaved) shall not pass upon this highway, but the Redeemed shall walk there. God will keep them clean and in the holy way as they yield unto Him. He says no lion shall be there (No man or woman with a lion-like nature is on this highway of holi-That nature will have to be destroyed by the blood before they can be translated onto this highway.) No ravenous beast shall go up thereon. Such shall not be found there. All ugly natures of every sort will have to be destroyed out of man by the blood before they can get up on this highway. Then he says, "But the redeemed shall walk there." Those redeemed by the blood of the Lamb of God shall walk on this highway of holiness. Verse ten: "And the ransomed [blood-washed souls] of the Lord shall return, and come to Zion [the church, His body] with songs and everlasting joy upon their heads: they shall obtain joy and gladness, and sorrow and sighing shall flee away."

There is not a sinner nor an unclean soul on the Highway of Holiness, which leads to heaven and to God. The church, which is His body is a clean body of saved and cleansed people that function in the world but are not of the world and its religions. It is governed by the Lord himself. He sets the members in the body as it pleases Him. 1 Cor. 12:18; and we are many members, but one body. This being a spiritual body of people, it cannot become defiled and destroyed, but is strong and will stand forever. Jesus told Peter that the gates of hell shall not prevail against IT (Matt. 16:18). If any member or members defile themselves, they will automatically be thrown off even as the natural body throws off unneeded substance.

We have seen the Body do this many times in the past forty years of travel on this Highway of Holiness. Those that become compromisers with the world and defile themselves are thrown off spiritually, and those who become fanatic and extreme and contentious have been thrown off many times and having received delusions they go on professing, but traveling with the crowd of lost professors. God takes care of his church and does not leave it to others. The ministers can do nothing about the matter only as God may be pleased to work in and through them to his glory and good pleasure. The Lord usually does it in very simple ways.

My brothers and sisters, the church is not going

down, neither is it being defiled and corrupted. All such as that belongs to humanly-organized churches of men. The one true holiness church, which is his body, is a clean institution and is just as clean as Christ is himself, for it is His body of cleansed and clean souls in this world but not of the world, and they have been translated out of the power of darkness into the kingdom of His dear Son. They hear His voice and obey Him. They have washed their robes and made them white in the blood of the Lamb of God which taketh away the sin of the world.

Do not worry nor be troubled about the confusing things that seem to exist, for the devil would make some believe that they are in the church, but it is just God at work throwing off those that go wrong and become fault-finders and contentious about many things, accusing perhaps God's established ministers and trying to cause loss of confidence to drag as many others down as possible. Just have patience and let God work and He will throw off all those that become obnoxious to Him. He will cause the church to shine as never before. If you allow yourself to be over-much troubled, it will work darkness in your own soul and you will not be able to see the true holiness church of God shining in her splendor in this dark and sinful world of human religions. The enemy often uses clever tactics to ruin your soul while he makes you think you are some special vessel in the Lord's hands to straighten out things as you think. Do you know of one person who will say that the devil gives them their dreams and visions? As a rule, when people have dreams and visions, they say the Lord gave them, when it may be Satan deceiving them to bring ruin to their souls and those whom they may influence. Let us live so clean of fault-finding and surmising that when we have a vision or a dream it will be of God and will lead to edification of believers and the unity of God's people.

All lovers of the truth will endeavor to keep the unity of the Spirit in the bond of peace and will have fellowship with all others who love peace and make peace. Those who are fault-finders and sow discord, make division and confusion among the children of God and are manifesting carnality. Christ makes division between the sinner and the saved, but he is not the author of discord and confusion among the children of God.

The church of the living God, the body of Christ, is shining brightly in this dark world but the darkness is comprehending it not; and so religious professors grope on in darkness, confusion, and superstition, and they try to get others to think that the church is gone to pieces and all is chaos and confusion. Jesus said, "If therefore the light that is in thee be darkness, how great is that darkness!" Matt. 6:23. Putting darkness for light confuses and darkens the soul insomuch that the spiritual eye and ear cannot see and hear good.

We feel like ending this article with the words written by the apostle Paul found in Col. 3:12-15: "Put on therefore as the elect of God, holy and beloved, bowels of mercies [tender mercy], kindness, humbleness of mind, meekness, longsuffering; forbearing one another, and forgiving one another, if any

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man have a quarrel against any; even as Christ forgave you, so also do ye. And above all things, put on charity [divine love] which is the bond of perfectness. And let the peace of God rule in your hearts, to the which ye are called in one body; and be ye thankful."

The above scriptures denote the character of the graces of God which are at work in his body the church which edifies itself in love and reproduces the life of Christ among men and worldly religious institutions who make up the darkness in the kingdom of Satan, which is the enemy of true holiness and Christ, who was crucified.

# Justification, Sanctification

Here are two words that are much used in the teachings found in the New Testament, and every child of God should know the meaning of each word and what it stands for as an experience in his soul and in his walk with God in this time world.

The types and shadows in the Old Testament point to the justified and the sanctified state of our experiences under grace since Christ has come and ushered in the Holy Spirit or Holy Ghost dispensation.

In Exodus 26:13, 24, we can read about the building of the literal temple, which is a type or shadow of the spiritual house, which house we are when in Christ Jesus. Heb. 3:6. It says they hung up the vail, and "the vail shall divide unto you between the Holy and the most Holy place." Thus we find that the literal temple had a holy place and a most holy place, prefiguring our justified state and our sanctified state when in Christ Jesus as a spiritual house. The priests who represented the Israelite people that foreshadowed the spiritual house built by Christ, were allowed to go into the holy place, but were not allowed to go into the most holy place. The high priest was allowed to go into the most holy place once a year, but not until he had offered up a blood sacrifice for his sins and for the sins of the people. When Jesus was dying on the cross and yielded up the spirit, it is written (Matt. 27:51), "And behold the veil of the temple was rent in twain from the top to the bottom." In this we see that Christ being crucified tore the vail apart and those that are holy in a justified state can enter into the most holy place and be cleansed from all the impurity of the fall and be infilled by the Spirit of truth, the Comforter, which Jesus says is the Holy Ghost. (John 14:17, 26).

Some are quite confused as to what constitutes the experience of a justified person and a sanctified, Holy-Spirit-baptized person under grace. Therefore we deem it good by the directing of His Spirit to set before you some Biblical truths on this subject.

As literal Israel in their literal acts foreshadowed or typified the spiritual acts of us who are in Christ Jesus, therefore, considering their literal acts, we can come to a knowledge of our experiences in justification and also in sanctification.

The Israelite people getting freed from literal Egyptian bondage is typical of people now in sin

getting redeemed or freed from known transgressions in a spiritual sense. Pharaoh, who is a representative of Satan, held them in bondage literally just as Satan holds sinners today in bondage to sin and the world spiritually. The Egyptians were the only enemies that the Israelites knew at that time and when God was bringing them out with His strong arm of power Pharaoh's hosts followed them to capture them and bring them back under bondage; but God was stronger than Satan, and when they came to the Red Sea, God by the hand of Moses parted the waters and they crossed over on dry land. Pharaoh's hosts went down between the walls of water after them and God let the waters come together and drown Pharaoh's host.

The Israelites were exceedingly happy and rejoiced greatly because of the deliverance God had given them from their enemies. This deliverance typifies our justified state in Christ. They were happy because they were freed from the Egyptians, the only enemies they knew at this time. They died to them and were never in bondage to the Egyptians any more, neither did they ever see them again. Just so, when we humble ourselves before God in confession and repentance and look to him for forgiveness, he points us to the blood of Christ and by faith we are made free from all our sins and iniquities and we are made to rejoice and become happy and satisfied. We die to all that we know is wrong and God freely forgives us and justifies us and we have peace with God, as also reads the Scripture in Romans 5:1, "Therefore being justified by faith, we have peace with God thru our Lord Jesus Christ."

As the Israelites went on with God, being led by Moses, they found other enemies which came against them to work discouragement upon them, and it was needful for them to look to God for strength to gain victory over them and die to them, and thereby keep in favor with God (Exodus 17:13, 14). When God had brought them up to, or near, the Jordan River where they were to cross over and possess the Canaan land which he had promised them, the majority of them had become so weakened by the various enemies they met that they had not the faith needed to cross over Jordan, which is typical of our sanctification. When the twelve men were sent out to spy and to take note of the Canaan land, there were only two that had faith in God sufficiently to cross over and possess the promised land. The ten said the land was good, well watered, and the fruit was immense, but they looked at the walled cities and the men that were giants and their faith was so weak that they failed to see God greater than all their eyes beheld. They feared and shrank back from going over. God's wrath was kindled against these unbelievers and he sent them back into the wilderness for forty years and showed and proved his mighty power to them in numerous ways until those over twenty years old were dead (all but two), and then he brought them back to, or near, the Jordan River at a time when it was a mighty body of rushing water overflowing all its banks.

At that time Joshua was their leader, for God had placed him there in Moses' stead. Joshua said to the

people, "Sanctify yourselves: for tomorrow the Lord will do wonders among you." Joshua 3:5. The word sanctification has two meanings. One is to "set apart," and the other is to "cleanse or make holy." Literal Israel sanctified themselves by setting themselves apart or surrendering themselves to God to follow him in all they knew and did not know; so when God rolled back the waters of the mighty rushing Jordan River, they went right down in front of that great wall of water and crossed over into the Canaan land, and this crossing over the Jordan River into the Canaan land typifies our sanctification and infilling of the Spirit wherein we, too, can possess the spiritual Canaan land, and by the power of God and our continually yielding to his will we fight battles with the enemy and win victories and possess more and more of the sweets of spiritual Canaan today.

We find by reading the book of Joshua that he set up twelve stones in the midst of Jordan in the place where the feet of the Priests which bare the ark of the covenant stood. It says that they are there unto this day. Also Joshua commanded that one man out of each of the twelve tribes should take up a stone out of the midst of the Jordan and carry it on his shoulder and leave them there where "ye shall lodge this night." In Joshua 4:20, we read, "And those twelve stones, which they took out of Jordan, did Joshua pitch in Gilgal." The people were so happy and amazed at the mighty working power of God in making them able to cross over the overflowing Jordan River that they were setting up memorials that their children in years to come might know why those twelve stones were built together. They represented the mighty wonders that God performed in bringing them into the Canaan land that flowed with milk and honey. In a lesser sense they also served as Ebenezers to encourage their continued faith in God as doing mighty things for them in giving them victories in battles and enabling them to possess the land. No doubt, all who have spiritually entered into the most holy place into the Canaan land today have Ebenezers set up along as they have traveled toward that celestial city which they can look back to and take courage in the battles of life and press on, knowing that God cannot and will not fail, but that He possesses both the power and willingness to give us the victory and land us in heaven with God himself.

We read in 1 Sam. 7:12 where Samuel set up an Ebenezer after God had given him a wonderful, marvelous victory in battle with the Philistines. It is good for us to not forget what great and mighty acts the Lord has performed for us in the past that our courage may be strong in Him.

As the crossing of literal Israel over Jordan is typical of our sanctification and infilling of the Spirit, it will be good for us to take note of what they did literally as we have the same experiences spiritually and have to make the same consecration and manifest a great faith in God to come into this wonderful experience or inheritance and to continue therein.

We notice that the first thing they did was to sanctify themselves, and that is just what we have to do. In getting justified we die to all the enemies and

wrongs that we know. We give them up and God's presence and peace is with us and the impurity received through the fall is held dormant more or less by the presence and power of God; and as we yield to God and look to him for grace and strength, we live free from sin and condemnation, have peace from God through Christ, and as we grow in grace and knowledge of God and faith increases, the Lord will soon bring us to the Jordan River, or to the knowledge of our need of being sanctified, cleansed from the impurity and made holy; in other words, the need of entering into the most holy place. Knowing that we have many enemies and many battles ahead to fight and to win, we feel our need, and as the Israelites sanctified themselves, we also sanctify ourselves unto God, consecrating to follow him through all that we know and through all that we do not know. When God sees that this consecration is complete, he brings us across Jordan spiritually speaking, by cleansing us and making us most holy and infilling us with the Holy Spirit, giving us power to continually keep yielded to his will so he can work in us both to will and to do of his good pleasure. This brings a joy from heaven in our souls greater than ever, and we are sealed with the Holy Spirit of promise, which is the earnest of our inheritance until the redemption of this body, which is his purchased possession. Eph. 1:13, 14. We also have access by faith into this grace wherein we stand, and rejoice in the hope of the glory of God. And not only so, but we glory in tribulations also: knowing that tribulation worketh patience; and patience experience; and experience hope; and hope maketh not ashamed because the love of God is shed abroad in our hearts by the Holy Ghost which is given unto us." Glory be to his name.

There are some confusing teachings going on in Christendom concerning justification and also the experience of sanctification, or the baptism of the Holy Ghost. Some are extreme in one way and some are extreme in other ways. Some are teaching that you get all the cleansing the soul needs or has in justification. This teaching is not Biblical, for we have proved by the Bible that the literal house, which typifies the spiritual house, which we are, was built with a holy and a most holy place. The most holy place was not opened until Christ shed his blood upon Calvary's cross. In the 15th chapter of Acts, Peter definitely states, speaking of the household of Cornelius, the Gentiles receiving the Holy Ghost, that "God, which knoweth the hearts, bare them witness, giving them the Holy Ghost, even as he did unto us; and put no difference between us and them, purifying their hearts by faith." This is a definite truth that the hearts were purified as they received the Holy Ghost. The fact that it is stated in Acts 2:3 that there appeared unto them cloven tongues like as of fire, and it sat upon each of them, conveys to our minds the cleansing by the blood that took place as they were receiving the Holy Ghost, for fire typifies cleansing or purifying. The tongues of fire was on them first and the Holy Ghost followed right into their souls, giving them power to win victories and live in spiritual Canaan land. -Fred Pruitt

# Some Erroneous Teachings Exposed

There is a doctrine being taught that the disciples were not born again while they were with Christ before His crucifixion. This teaching is not sound nor Biblical; for the Lord said of himself that God had given him power over all flesh, that he should give eternal life to as mary as God had given him (John 17:2); also that He had power to forgive sins (Matt. 9:6). In the resurrection of Lazarus from the dead, which is typical of our salvation, He proved that he had now power to give life to men. In John 11:25 Jesus told Martha, "I am the resurrection and the

life: he that believeth in me, though he were dead, yet shall he live." The disciples certainly did believe in Him and expressed it many times. Peter believed it so strongly that he said openly unto Him, "Thou art the Christ, the Son of the living God." Matt. 16:16.

In the first chapter of John it is made plain that the disciples were born again, because they had believed in him and had received him as the Christ. Listen to what the holy scriptures say in John 1:12, "But as many as received him, to them gave he power to become the sons of God, even to them that believe on his name." The disciples had received him and had believed on his name; and to be sons of God, it was needful that they be born again. The next verse makes it exceedingly plain that they were born of a spiritual birth, for it reads thus, "Which were born not of blood, nor of the will of the flesh, nor of the will of man, But of God." He makes it plain that it was not a fleshly birth, but a spiritual birth.

In Matt. 19:28 we read, "And Jesus said unto them [His disciples], Verily I say unto you, that ye which have followed me [past tense] in the regeneration, when the Son of man shall sit in the throne of his glory, ye also shall sit upon twelve thrones, Judging the twelve tribes of Israel." Webster's Dictionary, which gives us the meaning of words, says that regenerate means to cause to be reborn spiritually or spiritually born. This makes it Biblically certain that they were already born spiritually. Jesus was God incarnate and he had power to give the disciples spiritual life, and His presence was with them when he sent them out to preach the kingdom of God, heal the sick, and even cast out devils.

In justification His presence is with us, which is the Spirit of truth (Read St. John 14:17), and we have peace with God; but in sanctification He dwells in us in fulness and possesses us and rules supreme. He told the disciples that they were not of the world even as he was not of the world. They had left all and followed him and believed his word, received reproof, and sometimes rebukes from him, but did not turn away. We must remember that there had been no prophet among the people before John and Jesus came for the space of four hundred years and awful darkness enveloped the people and the disciples had much to learn although in heart they were no longer of the world even as Christ was not of the world. They were not perfect in knowledge as Christ, but their hearts were with Him and just as fast as they received light and knowledge, they walked in it, and so were not of the world.

Again in the 15th chapter of John we find that the Lord makes it plain that the disciples were attached to the Vine and he was the true Vine. Let us read, beginning at the third verse, "Now ye are clean through the word which I have spoken unto you." The disciples were living up to all the knowledge that the Lord had thus far imparted unto them, so he said, "Ye are clean through the word which I have spoken unto you." This also denotes that there is some cleansing in a justified state, preparatory for the purging or purifying in sanctification, as Jesus makes plain in the second verse.

The 4th verse reads thus, "Abide in me, and I in you, as the branch cannot bear fruit of itself, except it abide in the vine; no more can ye except ye abide in me. I am the vine, ye are the branches." This proves that the disciples were clean as far as they had gone in a justified state and that they were already branches in the true Vine, which is Christ. Beyond a shadow of a doubt, they were born again, as Jesus had power to cause such to take place.

Another theory that some hold to is that the disciples were sanctified some time between the time of the Lord's crucifixion and the day of Pentecost, but we have no Bible to sustain such a theory. The disciples had far more than a law experience when with Jesus, even though they did make some blunders and mistakes, but when we consider the awful darkness that was upon the people, we can understand that they were learning quite fast and would not turn away from Him. I am persuaded that the disciples had a better experience in their justified state after the Lord was crucified and was resurrected to life again and they could be with Him and talk to Him about the things concerning the kingdom of God. They had so increased in peace and love and devotion to the Lord that they were fully ready for the Day of Pentecost when the impurity was cleansed away completely and they were filled with the Holy Ghost and had entered into the most holy place, equipped to fight the battles in the Canaan land and win victories, possessing more and more of the land spiritually speaking.

To apply Scriptures to the justified state which belongs to those who have entered into the most holy place, would be confusing to many of the Lord's lambs, and perhaps to some of his sheep. One can get into an extreme attitude in that way; and on the other hand, to use the seventh chapter of Romans as though Paul were giving his experience under grace as a justified man would be extreme in the other way. The fact is, in the seventh chapter of Romans Paul is giving his experience while in sin under the law. Paul was well versed in the law of God, and he delighted in it, but that indwelling sin, which he makes so plain, would cause him to sin and to do and do the things that he did not want to do. This state is not true in justification under grace, as one must live holy in a justified state in order to be ready for the purifying and cleansing in sanctification. What we might call little sins are big sins in the sight of God; therefore sin had become exceedingly sinful to Paul while living in sin under the law. God forbid that any of God's ministers should hold such a low standard for justification under grace. When Paul had found Christ, he says, "There is therefore now no condemnation to them which are in Christ Jesus, who walk not after the flesh, but after the spirit. For the law of the Spirit of life in Christ Jesus has made me free from the LAW of sin and death." Brethren, and sisters, let us keep balanced up in the Lord and not go to extreme one way or the other, but stand on the solid teaching of the Holy Bible and be satisfied.

Some of the present day "newly-come-up" shoots make me think of the summer dried weed piles that I used to burn when a boy. They make a big blaze

for a short time, but that which is not founded on the Word of God will not last long. The Word of God will stand when the world and earth is on fire. Let us build on the sure foundation. A justified person is living before God without any condemnation, else they are not ready for the purifying in sanctification. When in a justified state under grace, one is not a wretched man, but he has peace with God through Christ, and the gentle Spirit of Christ will convince them that they need to go on to perfection and be cleansed and purified from all the effects of the fall and be filled with the Holy Spirit of promise. All glory, praise, and honor be unto the Lamb of God that taketh away the sin of the world.

# Endure Hardness

In 2 Tim. 2:3, 4, the Apostle Paul exhorts Timothy to endure hardness as a good soldier of Jesus Christ. No man that wareth entangleth himself with the affairs of this life. Thus to endure hardness is a command. The word hardness is defined by Webster's dictionary as a state or quality of being hard in all its senses; firmness; obduracy; rigor. And we are commanded to have not only one good quality but to strive for masteries so that we can pass our spiritual examination and be one hundred per cent qualified for service. The race is not to the swift or mighty, but to him that endures to the end. In these last days it takes more than ordinary strength to stem the tide, as it has been said: "Any dead duck can go with the tide, but it takes a live duck to swim against it." It takes the power of the God head and the unction of the Holy Spirit to enable us to endure such hardness as we are commanded. Nothing short of a full and complete surrender will qualify us for this great battle. Sometimes the way becomes so rough and steep and slippery that a tenderfoot will be seeking for something easier, but we are commanded to endure hardness as a good soldier.

A good soldier forsakes home and loved ones and all that is dear to him until the battle is ended. Sometimes he is wounded and is in the hospital for months, and after his recrute he returns to the battle front to face the foe again and may get those tender wounds bruised. Sometimes he has to wade and ford rivers and climb mountains and hills, and yet like the little brook, he presses onward.

So my fellow traveler to eternity, let us take fresh courage. God's promises are all true, and his grace is all sufficient. He will never leave us; and he has promised to keep us in the hour of temptation, which will come upon all the world to try them that dwell upon the earth. Rev. 2:10.

God's true people are the fewest of all people. We will meet with false brethren and professors, but very few to encourage us or that are willing to cut clean. They want to hold the world in one hand and the church in the other. Jesus said, "Ye cannot serve God and mammon." It means a clean cut—cut every shore line. Today the professing religious bodies are going hand in hand with the world, dancing, excess, drinking, smoking, cursing, backbiting, and it is ut-

terly impossible to mark them out from the world by their walk and conversation, yet they are claiming to be Christians. May God help us to awaken to our responsibility, and, like Jeremiah, cry out: "Oh, that my head were water and mine eyes a fountain of tears that I might weep" for the lost and ruined world! (See Jer. 9:1).

Going back to Brother Paul's exhortation: If a man strive for masteries, yet is he not crowned except he strive lawfully. The husbandman must first be partaker of the fruit.

The Bible is a wonderful Book, a lamp to our feet and a light to our pathway. I am glad to be able to say like the Psalmist of old (Psa. 66:16), "Come and hear all ye that fear God and I will declare what he has done for my soul." On Jan. 28, 1942 my burden was so great that it weighed me down and I cried to the Lord in my distress and he heard my cry and spoke peace to my soul. I had been a backslider for over twenty years. A voice sweetly spoke to me and told me to look in 2 Chron. 15:12, and they entered into a covenant to seek the Lord God of their fathers with all their soul; and there and then I obeyed that voice; and thus I can say like the Psalmist, He has done great things for me. And I am in a school learning day by day to endure hardness as a good soldier. I want to obtain that crown of righteousness which Paul said was laid up for him and for all who love God with the whole heart, and are willing to lay aside every weight.

Reader, our reward is sure if we strive lawfully. Do not look for your reward in this life, for in this world ye shall have tribulation and be hated of all men for his name's sake. But listen to his comforting words to the disciples: "Be of good cheer, I have over come the world." Praise be to His name! He is the great conqueror. He conquered death, our last enemy and we hear the Revelator proclaiming the glad tidings: "I am he that was dead, and, behold, I am alive for ever more. Amen! And have the keys of Death and Hell." Again my heart is made glad and I am compelled to say, Glory to His name! His name shall be called Wonderful Counsellor, the Mighty God the Everlasting Father, the Prince of Peace. Isa. 9. Hear the prophet portray his majestic power-a Counsellor. He needs no prime minister or vice president to instruct Him. He took upon himself the whole war against Beelzebub and fought him to a conqueror's throne and sits in majestic power there at the Father's right hand as our Mediator and Advocate. He will be returning for his true and faithful soldiers who have endured hardness to reward them with a crown of righteousness. My humble prayer is that these words may be of encouragement to some poor discouraged soldier, that he may take courage and be determined to endure hardness as a good soldier of Jesus Christ. -H. # NATIONAL CAMPGROUND NOTICE

The attendance at the National campmeeting at Monark Springs (Neosho), Mo. increased again this year, and the facilities for caring for the folk were barely adequate, even though eleven new cabin units had been erected since

last campmeeting. Present plans are to purchase more ground adjoining the campground, for more parking, building and camping space. The saints desire also to enlarge the tabernacle for more seating capacity and provide adequate modern rest rooms. With the Lord's blessing, this can be done by next campmeeting if the saints will sacrifice and put forth the effort.

Space on the present ground is sufficient to build five more cabin units under one roof like those built last year. The building would be 12 feet wide and about 50 feet long. One of the saints, a carpenter near the grounds, has agreed to furnish the labor and material for these units at \$1.35 per square foot floor space, provided orders for all five units are received. The first order for a 12 x 12 unit has been received, and as soon as four more are received, then the orders will be turned to the carpenter. The units will be of native rough oak frame, not sealed except partitions, concrete floor, composition shingle roof and siding, two windows and screens, door and screen door, with two coats of paint on windows and doors. The price for 8 x 12 is \$129.60; 10 x 12 is \$162.00; and 12 x 12 is \$194.40. If you want a unit, send your order promptly with cash, stating size wanted, to Bro. Ralph Beisly, R. 5, Coffevville, Kansas. Offerings for the much-needed improvements on the campground may be sent to Bro. 1 Tim. 6:6. But godliness with contentment is great gain.

- 7. For we brought nothing into this world, and it is certain we can carry nothing out.
- 8. And having food and raiment let us be therewith content.
- 9. But they that will be rich fall into temptation and a snare, and into many foolish and hurtful lusts, which drown men in destruction and perdition.
- 10. For the love of money is the root of all evil; which while some coveted after, they have erred from the faith, and pierced themselves through with many sorrows.

### COMMENTS AND APPLICATION

"The love of money is the root of all evil," i.e., all kinds of evil that have to do with money. There are sins that originate in other things. The word ALL has to do primarily with money in this lesson. Contentment is not gained by having money; neither is it gained when one is poor and desires to be rich, but coupled together with godliness "is great gain." The chief result of covetousness is to make one have discontent.

The primary requisite to contentment is to do as the Macedonian brethren did as expressed in 2 Cor. 8:5 "first gave their own selves to the Lord." The life that is surrendered to God and holds nothing back that God requires of him is indeed the happiest person by far in this world where money has a very large place in the ordinary thinking of mankind.

After one is born again and has the life of Christ in the soul (Col. 1:27), it is necessary to "Fight the good fight of faith." that we retain Christ in the soul for there are many things that can and will take him from the heart when yielded to. Riches do not bring happiness as many suppose, but on the contrary, their possession brings anxiety, worry, and cares innumerable.

# COURAGE FOR CHRISTIAN LIVING September 13, 1953

- 2 Tim. 1:3. I thank God, whom I serve from my forefathers with pure conscience, that without ceasing I have remembrance of thee in my prayers night and day;
- 4. Greatly desiring to see thee, being mindful of thy tears, that I may be filled with joy;
- 5. When I call to remembrance the unfeigned faith that is in thee, which dwelt first in thy grandmother Lois, and thy mother Eunice; and I am persuaded that in thee
- 6. Wherefore I put thee in remembrance that thou stir up the gift of God, which is in thee by the putting on of my hands.

# COMMENTS AND APPLICATION

Coupled together with the Holy Spirit, the Bible is of great use in our Christian living. John 20:31 says "But these are written that ye might believe that Jesus is the Christ, the Son of God; and that believing ye might have life through his name." Again in 2 Cor. 3:6 we have, "the letter killeth, but the spirit giveth life," and in John 14:26. "The Holy Ghost—shall teach you all things." So then in order for the Bible to help us as stated in Psa. 119:105. "Thy word is a lamp unto my feet, and a light unto my path," we certainly need the help of the Spirit to illuminate it so we have clear light for our pathway.

Since "All scripture is given by inspiration of God," then we can see four very important purposes for us; teaching is foremost for we need to be taught before we can perform, then we need reproof to show us the right way, correction when we make mistakes, and fourth we need instruction in righteousness. In order for our soul to grow we must have a portion of this help from day to day. And as God builds this house and gives us life every day we can grow into him and he in us. James 1:22 gives us very plain language, "But be ye doers of the word, and not hearers only."

## COUNSEL FOR CHRISTIANS

#### September 20, 1953

Titus 2:7. In all things shewing thyself a pattern of good works, in doctrine shewing uncorruptness, gravity, sincerity.

- 8. Sound speech, that cannot be condemned; that he that is of the contrary part may be ashamed, having no evil thing to say of you.
- 3:1. Put them in mind to be subject to principalities and powers, to obey magistrates, to be ready to every good work,
- 2. To speak evil of no man, to be no brawlers, but gentle showing all meekness unto all men.
- 3. For we ourselves also were sometimes foolish, disobedient deceived, serving divers lusts and pleasures, living in malice and envy, hateful, and hating one another.
- 4. But after that the kindness and love of God our Saviour toward man appeared.
- 5. Not by works of righteousness which we have done, but according to his mercy he saved us, by the washing of regeneration, and renewing of the Holy Ghost;
- 6. Which he shed on us abundantly through Jesus Christ our Saviour;
- 7. That being justified by his grace, we should be made heirs according to the hope of eternal life.
- 8. This is a faithful saying, and these things I will that thou affirm constantly, that they which have believed in God might be careful to maintain good works. These things are good and profitable unto men.
- 9. But avoid foolish questions, and genealogies, and contentions, and strivings about the law; for they are unprofitable and vain.
- 10. A man that is an heretic, after the first and second admonition reject;
- 11. Knowing that he that is such is subverted, and sinneth, being condemned of himself.

Memory Verse: And let ours also learn to maintain good works for necessary uses, that they be not unfruitful. Titus 3:14.

Practical Truth: A renewed life through Christ is accompanied with good works.

## TORS COMMENTS AND APPLICATION

As portrayed in these verses, what a contrast there is between the unregenerated person and the regenerated. In verse " we have a frightful picture of the person who is in bondage to sin and his evil passions; hating, hated, and hateful. Certainly the Christian needs much counsel after having his nature changed from hate to love to live consistently a Christian life after the pattern given in the scripture before us. In the place of rioting, righteousness: instead of malice, mercy. Violence gives place to gentleness, hatred to love. These changes in the outward life are manifestations of the new nature which we have received "but according to his mercy he saved us, by the washing of regeneration, and renewing of the Holy Ghost." The old, corrupt element in our nature is washed away, the regenerated soul brought into new purity of life. The one who has been regenerated and his heart made pure by the blood of Christ will, sooner or later show by his actions that he is changed even though he have some things yet in his life that need purging out according to John 15:2. So we have here in verse 8 "that they which have believed in God might be careful to maintain good works." It requires a life kept clean to do that.

#### A SLAVE BECOMES A BROTHER

Philemon 8. Wherefore, though 1 might be much bold in Christ to enjoin thee that which is convenient,

- 9. Yet for love's sake I rather beseech thee, being such an one as Paul the aged, and now also a prisoner of Jesus Christ.
- 10. I beseech thee for my son Onesimus, whom I have begotten in my bonds:
- 11. Which in time past was to thee unprofitable, but now profitable to thee and to me:
- 12. Whom I have sent again: thou therefore receive him, that is, mine own bowels:
- 13. Whom I would have retained with me, that in thy stead he might have ministered unto me in the bonds of the gospel:
- 14. But without thy mind would I do nothing; that thy benefit should not be as it were of necessity, but willingly.
- 15. For perhaps he therefore departed for a season, that thou shouldest receive him for ever;
- 16. Not now as a servant, but above a servant, a brother beloved, specially to me, but how much more unto thee, both in the flesh, and in the Lord?
- 17. If thou count me therefore a partner, receive him as myself.
- 18. If he hath wronged thee, or owest thee ought, put that on mine account;
- 19. I Paul have written it with mine own hand, I will repay it: albeit I do not say to thee how thou owest unto me even thine own self besides.
- 20. Yea, brother, let me have joy of thee in the Lord: refresh my bowels in the Lord.
- 21. Having confidence in thy obedience I wrote unto thee knowing that thou wilt also do more than I say.

#### COMMENTS AND APPLICATION

We have before us the tender regard Paul had for Philemon. Paul had been where Philemon lived and preached there and Philemon had been converted. Now while Paul was in Rome and in bonds, the slave of Philemon got converted under Paul's ministry. This letter to Philemon is to adjust the difference between what he was before he left him and what he is now since he has been saved. Paul wants Philemon to accept him back as a brother in the Lord now and that whatever he had done that was wrong for him to forgive his runaway slave and receive him back as a brother. Note the tender regard that Paul manifests for both parties; how delicately he handles this situation and tries to bring a peaceable reconciliation between them.

Our Lord Jesus has done much for us in bringing us back to a righteous God who has been offended and his wrath is on the children of disobedience but when Christ hung on the cross in our stead and brought pardon to us, which we could not do for ourselves, we now have no fear to meet our God in peace. "Christ hath redeemed us from the curse," Gal. 3:13. We are now free. C. W.
