Are You A Christian?

First, we would ask: What is a Christian? There are several definitions that could be given. We shall give two or three here that are universally accepted.

Christian: 1. A disciple of Christ. 2. One who believes in Christ. 3. One whose life follows the teachings of Christ. "The disciples were first called Christians at Antioch" because they adhered to, and followed after the teachings of Christ.

Now our reason for writing this article is to cause those who may read it to think seriously upon the question and analyze it more thoroughly than most people seem to. We meet with many who take upon themselves the name of Christian, who seemingly by their ways and actions do not really understand what a Christian is. A Christian is one whose life has been changed by the power of God; he has been turned from the kingdom of darkness to the kingdom of light; he has been made a new creature, old things have passed away, and a new life has begun.

Now we shall ask a few questions. Think seriously as you read them. If these can be answered in the affirmative, well and good; if not, you should really be concerned about your state and appeal to God that he would grant unto you a revelation of your condition. Are you walking in the footsteps of Christ, who did no sin, neither was guile found in his mouth? Do you manifest the Spirit of Christ when you are reviled? Can you keep sweet and not revile, or strike back in a retaliating way? Do you submit the case to Him who judgeth righteously? to Him who has said, "Vengeance is mine, I will repay"? Are you a light? Do people get a better understanding of God and his way by beholding your conduct of life? Is your light shining in the midst of a preverse and crooked generation?

Are you saved from worldly pleasures; such as dancing, card playing, theatre going, beer drinking, foolish talking, intoxicants, revellings, and such like? The Word of the Lord says, "If any man love the world the love of the Father is not in him." Are you delivered from pride, and a love for the praise of men? A tree is known by its fruit. Whatever the nature of the tree is, that is the kind of fruit it will produce. Whatever the nature of the heart is, the same will come out in the life. A good tree can not bring forth evil fruit. A Christian is one who has been made a partaker of the divine nature and will produce the fruit of the Spirit as given in Gal. 5:22, 23: "But the fruit of the Spirit is love, joy, peace, longsuffering, gentleness, goodness, faith, meekness, temperance: against such there is no law."

A Christian has the spirit of love in his heart, a spirit of compassion, and is willing and ready to forgive an offender. One can not be a Christian who will not forgive those who have wronged him, nor can one be a Christian and carry an old grudge around. Such is not the fruit of the Spirit. The Spirit will always lead in the path of righteousness and peace. "As many as are led by the Spirit of God, they are the sons of God." Rom. 8:14. "Not every one that saith unto me, Lord, Lord, shall enter into the kingdom of heaven; but he that doeth the will of my Father which is in heaven." Matt. 7:21. It is not the one that says, "I am a Christian," but he who lives the life and obeys the Word of God, that will stand the test. If you, dear reader, are living for God each day, and if you are kept by his power, Amen. But if you are committing one known sin, you are not a Christian. No, you are not a Christian if you are committing sin. Jesus came to save his people from their sins.

LONELINESS

I have been thinking lately of the Scripture which says that as Jesus was alone praying, his disciples were with him (Luke 9:18). How many of us, like Jesus has found himself alone in the midst of a multitude? How many have said, If I do this or that, I will be the only one who does it? Dear young reader, God wants some who have perfect hearts (2 Chron. 16:9), who will stand alone for Him.

Loneliness is the cause of many sins today. The first I remember loneliness, I was in the first grade standing at the corner of the school house. A group of girls a few feet away stood pointing at my clothes and laughing. (My mother was a widow and my clothes were not as nice as theirs). That left an impression on my mind that never left me. Even yet it is hard to make friends if they seem cold or indifferent.

Some children, when tempted to feel lonely and left out of the pleasures the others enjoy, take to boasting. The devil makes them think if they tell others of the great things they can do, they will have companionship. (He is a liar). Some men and women love to boast. True happiness comes by letting another praise us (Pro. 27:2). David wrote in Psa. 37: 35 of the wicked spreading (boasting) himself like a green bay tree, yet he passed away.

Some children go off to themselves and create an imaginary companion and day dream of going places and doing things to suit their fancies, not knowing it is wrong, so do not go to God who will help them to cast down their imaginations (2 Cor. 10:5). They do not think of things God wants them to do for others.

I was talking to a divorced woman some time back. She had married for companionship. There was not love between them, so they disagreed, and the loneliness remained. She did not love any man, but went with them only as company to forget the loneliness in her heart. To remarry, commit adultery, can not rid us of loneliness. It only brings trouble and sorrow.

When some people experience the terrible loneliness of a loved one forsaking them, they seek pleasure, go to dances, drink, and do the works of the flesh (Gal. 5:19-21) to drown their feelings of loneliness. They find no comfort because they seek not first the kingdom of God and his righteousness (Matt. 6:33), so they fill a suicide grave.

Loneliness is common to us, but God wants to make us able to bear it (1 Cor. 10:13). It is our attitude toward loneliness that determines whether we stand or fall.

The Bible tells of others whom God made more than conquerors (Rom. 8:37). Think how lonely Joseph was down in Egypt. He didn't sit down, pout, and say: "I wish I were at home enjoying father and mother." He went to work and became the best slave Potiphar had (Gen. 39:34). When he lost his second coat, in prison he could have said, "Mrs. Potiphar should be here." Here again the keeper put the prisoners in his hands (Gen. 39:23). He did as he (or God) pleased. He was past thirty and his first son came before he forgot his father's house (Gen. 41:46-51). He told his brothers that God sent him to Egypt; not they. (Gen. 45:8).

If Elijah was lonely while by the brook waiting for the ravens, he did not say, "God, send rain so I can show myself to the people." He remained true to God—and who has been known to have fire burn water as he did on Mt. Carmel? (1 Kings 18).

John the Baptist could have day dreamed in the wilderness, but who would have preached and straightened the way for Christ?

Christ felt lonely on the cross and cried: "My God, my God, why hast thou forsaken me?" (Matt. 27:46). He arose from the grave, forever to be on the right hand of God; and promised to be with every one who will do God's will unto the end (Matt. 28:19, 20). What better companion than Jesus can we want? No one can or will protect like Jesus.

God may call you, dear reader, to go somewhere for Him. It will make no difference if we are in the multitude or on a lonely isle, God will be there to comfort, bless, and protect. As long as we stand by God, he will stand by us. —A saint.

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To think is our great privilege and duty. Our time and our minds belong to God. We are to love God with all of the mind. He said, "Come now and let us reason together." Please read Acts 24:25. When Jesus said, "Beware of men," he meant for you to think. The Bride of Christ

"I will betroth thee unto me forever; yea, I will betroth thee unto me in righteousness, and in judgment and in loving-kindness and in mercies. I will even betroth thee unto me in faithfulness: and thou shalt know the Lord." Hosea 2:19, 20. The word "betroth" means to be engaged. He said He would betroth or engage us unto Him in righteousness and faithfulness. The Lord takes us unto himself to live in us and have His way in our lives. Romans 7:4: "Wherefore, my brethren, ye also are become dead to the law by the body of Christ; that ye should be married to another, even to Him who is raised from the dead, that ye should bring forth fruit unto God." We can not bear fruit unto God except we have been married to Christ, which means to be born again.

In Deut. 26:16-19, quote, "This day the Lord thy God hath commanded thee to do these statutes and judgments: thou shalt therefore keep and do them with all thy heart, and with all thy soul. Thou hast avouched the Lord this day to be thy God and to walk in His ways and to keep His statutes and His commandments and His judgments and to hearken unto His voice. And the Lord hath avouched thee this day to be His peculiar people as He hath promised thee and that thou shouldst keep all His commandments; and to make thee high above all nations which He hath made, in praise, and in name, and in honor; and that thou mayest be an holy people unto the Lord thy God."

Now we have before us the outline of our marriage to Christ, or being born again. He said He would betroth or engage us unto Him in faithfulness. Then we have avouched or affirmed (or promised) to keep His judgments and statutes and commandments and to hearken unto His voice. Then the Lord has avouched or affirmed to take us to be His peculiar people, and He said He would make us high above all nations in praise and name and honor. Truly, there is not a more noble or higher calling than to be the bride of Christ, to live, practice and preach His Word.

When we came to the Lord, we promised to trust Him for our bodies, and promised Him to forsake all other ways to follow His way. We promised Him that we would dress in modest apparel and walk in the light as it shines upon our pathway. We promised to take Him as our insurance company and look to Him to be our guide in life. Are we still keeping this agreement?

If anyone has failed in trusting God for their bodies and has turned over to man, or if we once dressed in modest apparel and have now gone back to dressing like the world, or if we have let down and have gone back to trusting in insurance companies, or if we have gone back into sectism—if we are guilty of any of these things, there is a need of repenting to God and confessing to the saints. We have done the saints wrong and have grieved the Lord. We cannot do these things and then just go on with a profession, not repenting and fixing them up. If anyone has been guilty of any of these things, we should get down on our knees and repent before God and confess to the saints, because we have betrayed their confidence.

When we take the oath of holy matrimony, we promise our companion to be true to him or her and forsake all others and keep ourselves unto them alone so long as we shall live. When we became married to Christ, we also made these promises to Him. If we have broken our promises to the Lord, we need to find an altar of prayer and fix things up before God and man. And if we have betrayed the saints and grieved God, we need to come back and prove ourselves.

In Col. 1:18, quote, "And He is the head of the body, the church: who is the beginning, the firstborn from the dead; that in all things He might have the preeminence." The Lord is going to have the first place in our hearts or He will have no place at all. He has engaged us unto Him in faithfulness. And if we have not been faithful, we have broken our agreement with the Lord, and He is no more obligated to bless our souls.

Rev. 19:7-9, quote, "Let us be glad and rejoice, and give honor to Him: for the marriage of the Lamb is come and His wife hast made herself ready. And to her was granted that she should be arrayed in fine linen, clean and white: for the fine linen is the righteousness of saints. And He said unto me, Write, blessed are they which are called unto the marriage supper of the Lamb, And he saith unto me, These are the true sayings of God." S. of Sol. 6:9, "My dove, my undefiled is but one; she is the only one of her mother. She is the choicest one of her that bare her." The Lord has only one church; she has been washed and made clean by the blood of Jesus. We must stay clean and pure from all the contamination of the world, as God will not dwell in an unclean temple.

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Editorials

King Saul became disobedient and sinned against God and fell in battle and lost his soul. Outlandish women caused Solomon to sin and he became an idol worshiper. We have no record that he ever got back to God. Jonah listened to lying vanities and tried to run away from the Lord and got into great trouble. He finally wanted God to take his life away, saying, "It is better for me to die than to live."

King Herod sinned against God by taking the life of one of God's ministers. He also captured Peter and meant to kill him, but God undertook, frustrated the plans of Herod and preserved Peter alive. Herod made an oration to a certain part of his subjects and the people praised him as a god. God sent his angel and smote him with worms which ate him and he died a horrible death.

Judas sinned against Christ and died a horrible death and went to torment.

Oh, professing friend, do not believe the devil's preachers and keep on sinning more or less in life; for you will be sure to hear the words in that great day, "Depart from me, ye workers of iniquity," and will be turned into hell where the worm dieth not and the fire is never quenched. The preacher that deceived you into believing a lie will be there also. What an awful day that will be when you will find your soul in that burning lake with no hope of ever getting out. The soul will always be suffering the torments of dying and can never die. Oh, how sad the thought.

When we consider the plans and purposes of God from the beginning of creation and see how his big hand has been working to bring about and to fulfill all prophecy, it becomes a marvelous thing in our sight. As He opens up the Scriptures to our understanding, we begin to know how little we do really know and how great and mighty God is, even beyond our comprehension. It has been said that, "The old Testament is God's will concealed and the New Testament is God's will revealed." The more we understand the Scriptures the greater knowledge we have of this statement being true.

When we consider Solomon's Temple as typifying the church of God or the kingdom of God, which we saved people live in today, it teaches us many things as to what the church or kingdom is and its workings and how God planned this centuries and centuries before even we came into existence. Then we think how clearly the building of the literal temple typifies the building of the spiritual house, church or kingdom which we saved people make up today. You can read in the third chapter of Hebrews what is stated concerning the holy brethren; for it is plainly stated in the sixth verse that holy brethren are Christ's house. He could have used the words church, temple, or kingdom and not have changed the meaning at all.

It took Solomon seven years to build the literal temple which prefigured the real temple or house of God; but it only took Jesus three and one-half years to build his house or temple and get it ready to occupy.

Solomon gathered material from different places to build the temple that foreshadowed the real. Just so, Jesus gathered material from different places and called men from different occupations to follow him and become stones, or timbers, in his building.

He began the building of his house or kingdom immediately after he began to preach the gospel of the kingdom, and was calling men to leave all and follow him. When John began to preach, being the forerunner of Christ, he said, "Repent ye, for the kingdom of heaven is at hand." When Jesus began to preach. he said. "The time is fulfilled [not some future time, but now] and the kingdom of God is at hand: repent ye and believe the gospel." Mark 1:15. In Luke 16:16 we read, "The law and the prophets were until John: since that time the kingdom of God is preached, and every man presseth into it." Here the Lord positively says the kingdom of God is preached since John. When he chose the twelve apostles, who were stones in the building, material that he had gathered for his house, and was fitting them into his

building, he gave them power against unclean spirits to cast them out, and to heal all manner of sickness and all manner of disease. He commissioned them and said unto them. "And as ve go, preach saving, the kingdom of heaven is at hand" (or kingdom of God). When he sent out the seventy, he said, "And heal the sick that are therein, and say unto them, the kingdom of God is come nigh unto you. These disciples had been born again. John 1:13. For Jesus had power to forgive sins and give eternal life to as many as believed on him. They were a part of the house or kingdom which he was building. In the 13th chapter of Matthew we read how he was teaching them as to what the kingdom of God was like. Among other things he said that the kingdom of heaven was like a grain of mustard seed which a man took and sowed in his field. He also said it was like unto leaven which a woman used in her meal and the whole was leavened. Daniel, prophesying of the kingdom, said, "And in the days of these kings [of which the Roman Empire was one, which was in power when Jesus began to build and set up his kingdom] shall the God of heaven set up a kingdom, which shall never be destroyed: and the kingdom shall not be left to other people; but it shall brake in pieces and consume all the kingdoms, and it shall stand forever." Ĩn the next verse he speaks of the stone that was cut out of the mountain without hands that did the smiting and breaking into pieces. This stone represented Christ. The stone is spoken of again in the 34th verse.

The mustard seed and the leaven spoken of in the parables represented Christ. The disciples and the seventy were born again, and they were being fitted into his building or kingdom and were a part of it. Jesus was their king and the teacher and builder. He told the people: "Behold, the kingdom of God is within you." When Christ is with you or in you, you are a part of the kingdom and will manifest Christ and his teachings to others.

Almost all the people who heard and saw Jesus did not understand about his kingdom, but he told the disciples. "But blessed are your eyes, for they see: and your ears for they hear." Matt. 13:16. And he went on to say: "For verily I say unto you, that many prophets and righteous men have desired to see those things which ye see, and have not seen them; and to hear those things which ye hear, and have not heard them." The disciples, being born again, were seeing the kingdom of God, which righteous men under the law could not see nor hear. When the Lord got his house or kingdom built and ready to occupy, just as he came into Solomon's temple or house so he did in this. It is said the glory of the Lord filled the temple; so also when the Lord Jesus had his temple, house, or kingdom built, the prophecy of Malachi was fulfilled where it says: "And the Lord whom ye seek, shall suddenly come to his temple, even the messenger of the covenant whom ye delight in: behold he shall come saith the Lord of hosts." Malachi 3:1. On the day of Pentecost the Lord came into his temple, or his kingdom, with power. The tongues of fire sitting upon each of them typified the cleansing as the Holy

Ghost came in. The kingdom, temple, house, or church, was set up and began to function, having the laws of God put into their minds and written upon the fleshly tables of their circumcised hearts. This kingdom or church or temple shall never be destroyed. We saved people live in it here and when we put on a glorified body we shall continue to live in it in heaven. Glory be to God!

When Solomon's temple was in the building and one would ask: "What building is that?" the answer would be, "That is the temple that Solomon is building, but it is not finished." When Jesus was gathering his disciples from different places and sending them out to preach the gospel of the kingdom, they could truly be looked upon as the kingdom, but it was not finished yet to be occupied as it was on the day of Pentecost when it was set in motion. Then the Lord entered in the form of the Holy Ghost, which gave great power to the disciples, for he was living in and possessing each one. Blessed be the name of the Lord!

A QUESTION ANSWERED

Please explain the appearance of Samuel in the cave of Endor (1 Sam. 28). Is this a literal appearance of Samuel or is it a manifestation of Satan?

It was not Samuel, for a number of reasons:

God had refused to speak to Saul through any of the regular channels—1 Sam. 28:6.

God would not reverse Himself and speak or allow His prophet to speak through any channel which He Himself had banned (1 Sam. 28:9).

Samuel, a man of God, would certainly not come at the beck and call of a witch whose activities he had opposed and resisted during his entire earthly ministry. The witch did not see Samuel, but only an impersonation of him.

If it was not Samuel, who was it? It was a demon. Proof that demons can appear in the garb of righteousness is given us in 2 Cor. 11:14, 15.

Demons are fond of inhabiting human bodies and impersonating human beings. "And he said, My name is Legion, for we are many" (Mark 5:9).

The demon impersonating Samuel gave, it is true, an accurate prophecy, but he merely told the truth in this instance in order to make the deception perfect.

It must be remembered that Satan and his demons can do only what God **permits** them to do. See Job 1:12 and 2:6. Hence the demon in this instance was not permitted to tell anything but the truth.—Sel.

What About Tithing?

We know Abraham tithed of old (Genesis 14:20), but that was under the old dispensation. We, the church are not under the old dispensation, but under the new. We are Abraham's seed of promise. For the promises were not to Abraham nor to his seed through the law, but through the righteousness of faith. For if they which are of the law be heirs, faith is void and the promise made of none effect. Abram was a God-fearing man. God called him, telling him to "get thee out of thy country." (Gen. 12:1). You see the fear of the Lord is the beginning of knowledge; but fools despise wisdom and instruction (Prov. 1:7). Abraham gave a tenth part of all to Melchesidec, being by interpretation King of righteousness and after that also King of Salem, which is, King of peace. "Abraham by faith when he was called to go out to a place which he should after receive for an inheritance, obeyed; and he went out, not knowing whither he went. By faith he sojourned in the land of promise, as in a strange country, dwelling in tabernacles with Isaac and Jacob, the heirs with him of the same promise: For he looked for a city which hath foundations, whose builder and maker is God." Which is the church, the new heaven and the new earth, which John saw in Revelation 21:1, the holy city, new Jerusalem, coming down from God out of heaven, the bride, the Lamb's wife (V, 9). This is the new dispensation of the New Testament church.

When God asked Abraham to offer up Isaac (his only son of promise) Abraham proved his willingness to obey God even in this. God told Abraham, "I know that thou fearest me, seeing thou hast not withheld thy son, thine only son from me." (Gen. 22:16, 17) "In blessings I will bless thee, and in multiplying I will multiply thy seed as the stars of the heavens . . . and in thy seed shall all the nations of the earth be blessed; because thou hast obeyed my voice."

If we, today, will only seek God with all our heart we will be found of him, and then we are counted Abraham's seed. In the old dispensation the chosen people of God, being carnally minded, chose to be like the people of the world. They did not want to be of the lowly and poor in spirit. They refused to choose the man of God to guide and direct them, so they wanted Samuel to make them a king to judge them like other nations. That displeased Samuel (Sam. 7:5, 6), so he prayed to the Lord and the Lord said unto Samuel: "Harken unto them in all that they say unto thee: for they have not rejected thee, but they have rejected me, that I should not reign over them." The Lord told Samuel to tell them what would be forced upon them. The king would take a tenth of their seed and of their vineyards, a tenth of their sheep, and so on (Sam. 8:15-17). But they wanted their way and turned from God to choose a king. We find it just the same at present, also in the time of the scribes and Pharisees. People will not have Christ; they choose to follow blind guides. It doesn't make any difference how hard they are tasked, they will take their way and want to be called the seed of Abraham. Some are like the scribes and Pharisees, pay tithes and omit the weightier matters of the law, judgment, mercy, and faith. Those people said they were Abraham's seed; but Christ, the author and the finisher of our faith, said they were not. Even so today, people are saying, "We are free born, we are Abraham's seed, or the church," but they are following the traditions of their fathers and not the traditions of the apostles and of the Bible.

We that worship the Lord must worship him in Spirit and in truth, for God seeketh such to worship "Therefore being justified by faith, we have him. peace with God through our Lord Jesus Christ: By whom also we have access by faith into this grace wherein we stand, and rejoice in hope of the glory of God." (Rom. 5:1, 2). "For the grace of God that bringeth salvation hath appeared to all men, Teaching us that, denying ungodliness and worldly lusts, we should live soberly, righteously, and godly in this present world" (Titus 2:11, 12). So let us hear the conclusion of the whole matter: "Fear God, and keep his commandments: for this is the whole duty of man. For God shall bring every work into judgment, with every secret thing, whether it be good, or whether it be evil" (Eccl. 12:13, 14).

We are God's people in this dispensation, Abraham's seed, heirs of the promise. All we are and all we have is surrendered to God—not tithes only. We who surrender all have the promise of inheriting "all things; and I will be his God, and he shall be my son." Rev. 21:7. These are the ones who have their names written in the Book of life. "Whosoever was not found written in the Book of life was cast into the lake of fire." Rev. 21:15. —Sister Hattie Hines

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JEHOSHAPHAT'S RIGHTEOUS LEADERSHIP

May 1, 1955

2. And he placed forces in all the fenced cities of Judah, and set garrisons in the land of Judah, and in the cities of Ephraim, which Asa his father had taken.

3. And the Lord was with Jehoshaphat, because he walked in the first ways of his father David, and sought not unto Baalam;

4. But sought to the Lord God of his father, and walked in his commandments, and not after the doings of Israel.

5. Therefore the Lord stablished the kingdom in his

hand; and all Judah brought to Jehoshaphat presents; and he had riches and honour in abundance.

6. And his heart was lifted up in the ways of the Lord: moreover he took away the high places and groves out of Judah.

7. Also in the third year of his reign he sent to his princes, even to Benhail, and to Obadiah, and to Zechariah, and to Nethaneel, and to Michaiah, to teach in the cities of Judah.

2 Chron. 17:9. And they taught in Judah, and had the book of the law of the Lord with them, and went about thoughout all the cities of Judah, and taught the people.

2 Chron. 19:4. And Jehoshaphat dwelt at Jerusalem: and he went out again through the people from Beersheba to mount Ephraim, and brought them back unto the Lord God of their fathers.

5. And he set judges in the land throughout all the fenced cities of Judah, city by city,

6. And said to the judges, Take heed what ye do: for ye judge not for man, but for the Lord, who is with you in the judgment.

7. Wherefore now let the fear of the Lord be upon you; take heed to do it: for there is no iniquity with the Lord our God, nor respect of persons, nor taking of gifts.

Memory Selection: . . . Deal courageously, and the Lord shall be with the good. 2 Chronicles 19:11.

Practical Truth: Holy Spirit leadership is a necessity to God's kingdom.

COMMENTS AND APPLICATION

Like an oasis in a desert comes Jehoshaphat as king in Judah. He was indeed a man of faith and action. The Lord was with him because he walked in the ways of the Lord and not Baalim (vs. 3, 4). The words "lifted up" (v. 6) has the thought of encouragement rather than pride or arrogance as found in other parts of the Bible. (2 Chron. 26:16), so that he encouraged himself in the ways of the Lord. He sent his princes and priests and levites throughout his realm to teach the "book of the law" (vs. 7, 9), "and taught the people."

Many times among ministers and others has the twentieth chapter of 2 Chronicles been referred to as to this king in a predicament, and how he managed himself when everything was strong against him. Three nations were making warfare against him; the Amonites and Moabites and those from Mount Seir (v. 10), or Edomites. First, he "set himself to seek the Lord, and proclaim a fast" (v. 3). Read Matt. 17:17-21); second, his prayer of absolute dependence upon God, "Neither know we what to do: but our eyes are upon thee" (v. 12). Note how "all Judah stood before the Lord" (v. 13); then third, how God sent one of their own number "in the midst of the congregation --"Ye shall not need to fight in this battle." Note how that "none escaped" (v. 24). Read 2 Chron. 20:1-30.

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JOASH REPAIRS THE TEMPLE

May 8, 1955

2 Chron. 24:4. And it came to pass after this, that Joash was minded to repair the house of the Lord.

2 Chron. 24:8. And at the king's commandment they made a chest, and set it without at the gate of the house of the Lord.

9. And they made a proclamation through Judah and

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Jerusalem, to bring in to the Lord the collection that Moses the servant of God laid upon Israel in the wilderness.

10. And all the princes and all the people rejoiced, and brought in, and cast into the chest, until they had made an end.

11. Now it came to pass, that at what time the chest was brought unto the king's office by the hand of the Levites, and when they saw that there was much money, the king's scribe and the high priest's officer came and emptied the chest, and took it, and carried it to the place again. Thus they did day by day, and gathered money in abundance.

12. And the king and Jehoiada gave it to such as did the work of the service of the house of the Lord, and hired masons and carpenters to repair the house of the Lord, and also such as wrought iron and brass to mend the house of the Lord.

13. So the workmen wrought, and the work was perfected by them, and they set the house of God in his state, and strengthened it.

14. And when they had finished it, they brought the rest of the money before the king and Jehoiada, whereof were made vessels for the house of the Lord, even vessels to minister, and to offer withal, and spoons, and vessels of gold and silver. And they offered burnt offerings in the house of the Lord continually all the days of Jehoiada.

Memory Selection: ..Come near and bring sacrifices and thank offerings unto the house of the Lord. 2 Chronicles 29:31.

Practical Truth: Offerings help in the growth of the work of the Lord.

COMMENTS AND APPLICATION

Before the time of Joash, the rulers of the kingdom were wicked; especially Athaliah, who usurped the throne and destroyed all the "seed royal of the house of Judah" (2 Chron. 22:10). Her son, who reigned before her was as wicked as she was, and the result was that spiritual life declined in Judah.

So we see a great need for repairing the house of God, which takes place in this lesson for today. Note how Joash was "minded" to repair. This reminds us of Rutn who was "steadfastly minded" (Ruth 1:18). What goes on in the mind has much influence upon what we do, and will have full sway unless it is rejected as not worth considering. The best place to have our mind is on the Lord. (Isa. 26:3; Rom. 8:6). The people of Judah rejoiced (v. 10) to help in the repairing of the temple, and workmen were hired to see to it that the place was stengthened (v. 13), and other things that were needed were furnished.

There is a good lesson here for those who are letting down in their spiritual life. It needs repairing. Don't put it off until later, as the old devil would have you do, but get "steadfastly minded" in the work of restoring favor with God and your labor will not be in vain. (1 Cor. 15:58).

UZZIAH'S STRENGTH AND FAILURE

May 15, 1955

Printed Portion 2 Chronicles 26:3-5; 16-21.

2 Chron. 26:3. Sixteen years old was Uzziah when he began to reign, and he reigned fifty and two years in Jerusalem. His mother's name was Jecoliah of Jerusalem. 4. And he did that which was right in the sight of the

Lord, according to all that his father Amaziah did.

5. And he sought God in the days of Zechariah, who

had understanding in the visions of God: and as long as he sought the Lord, God made him to prosper.

2 Chron. 26:16. But when he was strong, his heart was lifted up to his destruction: for he transgressed against the Lord his God, and went into the temple of the Lord to burn incense upon the altar of incense.

17. And Azariah the priest went in after him, and with him four score priests of the Lord, that were valiant men:

18. And they withstood Uzziah the king, and said unto him, it appertaineth not unto thee, Uzziah, to burn incense unto the Lord, but to the priests the sons of Aaron, that are consecrated to burn incense: go out of the sanctuary; for thou hast trespassed; neither shall it be for thine honour from the Lord God.

19. Then Uzziah was wroth, and had a censer in his hand to burn incense: and while he was wroth with the priests, the leprosy even rose up in his forehead before the priests in the house of the Lord, from beside the incense altar.

20. And Azariah the chief priest, and all the priests, looked upon him, and, behold, he was leprous in his forehead, and they thrust him out from thence; yea, himself hasted also to go out, because the Lord had smitten him.

21 And Uzziah the king was a leper unto the day of his death, and dwelt in a several house, being a leper; for he was cut off from the house of the Lord: and Jotham his son was over the king's house, judging the people of the land.

Memory Selection: But the Lord is in his holy temple: let all the earth keep silence before him. Habakkuk 2:20.

Practical Truth: A Christian must be diligent in the service of the Lord and not falter by the way.

COMMENTS AND APPLICATION

Uzziah is one of many that have failed after they have won their way through difficulties and plenty of hard work. He "did that which was right in the sight of the Lord" (v. 4). Also it says, "He sought God" (v. 5). That is what he should have kept doing. We, in our day can hear it said, "O, have a little pride about you." This was the trouble in the case of Uzziah, but the trouble is that once pride gets a start, there is no end to it but destruction. (Prov. 16:18). It is as easy to let down in seeking after God in humility and be deceived by the devil until pride in some manner will enter in and undo all that is accomplished. No wonder the Bible is so full of warnings along this very line.

Notice how very persistent he was in his wanting to burn incense in that eighty priests withstood him, and it was not until God struck him that he was willing to stop, which shows how quick the devil is when he has charge to make one to go wrong. After that, he dwelt in a several house—God's judgment against him.

Jesus said, "Watch and pray, that ye enter not into temptation" (Matt. 26:41). This is a good antidote. While the devil would have us to do things quickly, God tells us, "Wait on the Lord - - - wait I say on the Lord" (Psalms 27:14).

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HEZEKIAH ATTEMPTS RECONCILIATION

May 22, 1955

Printed Portion 2 Chronicles 30:1, 6-13.

2 Chron. 30:1. And Hezekiah sent to all Israel and Judah, and wrote letters also to Ephraim and Manasseh,

that they should come to the house of the Lord at Jerusalem to keep the passover unto the Lord God of Israel.

2 Chron. 30:6. So the posts went with the letters from the king and the princes throughout all Israel and Judah, and according to the commandment of the king, saying, Ye children of Israel, turn again unto the Lord God of Abraham, Isaac, and Israel, and he will return to the remnant of you, that are escaped out of the hand of the kings of Assyria.

7. And be not ye like your fathers, and like your brethren, which trespassed against the Lord God of their fathers, who therefore gave them up to desolation, as ye see.

8. Now be ye not stiffnecked, as your fathers were, but yield yourselves unto the Lord, and enter into his sanctuary, which he has sanctified forever: and serve the Lord your God, that the fierceness of his wrath may turn away from you.

9. For if ye turn again unto the Lord, your brethren and your children shall find compassion before them that lead them captive, so that they shall come again into this land: for the Lord your God is gracious and merciful, and will not turn away his face from you, if ye return unto him.

10. So the posts passed from city to city through the country of Ephraim and Manasceh even unto Zebulun: but they laughed them to scorn, and mocked them.

11. Nevertheless divers of Asher and Manasseh and cf Zebulun humbled themselves, and came to Jerusalem.

12. Also in Judah the hand of God was to give them one heart to do the commandment of the king and of the princes, by the word of the Lord.

13. And there assembled at Jerusalem much people to keep the feast of unleavened bread in the second month, a very great congregation.

Memory Selection: - - - For the Lord your God is gracious, and merciful, and will not turn away his face from you, if ye return unto him. 2 Chronicles 30:9.

Practical Truth: People who are spiritually alive find joy in worship in God's house and are eager to bring others there also.

COMMENTS AND APPLICATION

Hezekiah was a good king. His work of reconciliation was commendable for he went about it in the right manner to produce harmony between the north and south of Israel. He called all of them together to turn again to the Lord God of Abraham, Isaac, and Israel (v. 6). This was wisdom to do this for it would stir up their minds as to how God had dealt so graciously with their forefathers, and would quicken them to do as he asked them to "yield yourselves unto the Lord, and enter into his sanctuary, which he hath sanctified forever: and serve the Lord your God, that the fierceness of his wrath may turn away from you" (v. 8). He also used other reasons that God was gracious and merciful and will not turn his face from you, if ye turn unto him (v. 9).

While there were a number of them that "laughed them to scorn, and mocked them" (v. 10), yet there were many that "humbled themselves" (v. 11) to do the commandments of the king by the word of the Lord (v. 12).

The same thing is being done in this day, for there are some that believe and some that believe not. We are to do as God told Ezekiel, "To speak unto them, and tell them" (3:11) "whether they will hear, or whether they will forbear."

HEZEKIAH MEETS A CRISIS

May 29, 1955

Printed Portion 2 Chronicles 32:1-8; 32-33.

2 Chron. 32:1. After these things, and the establishment thereof, Sennacherib king of Syria came, and entered into Judah, and encamped against the fenced cities, and thought to win them for himself.

2. And when Hezekiah saw that Sennacherib was come, and that he was purposed to fight against Jerusalem,

3. He took council with his princes and his mighty men to stop the waters of the fountains which were without the city: and they did help him.

4. So there were gathered much people together, who stopped all the fountains, and the brook that ran through the midst of the land, saying, Why should the kings of Assyria come, and find much water?

5. Also he strengthened himself, and built up all the wall that was broken, and raised it up to the towers, and another wall without, and repaired Millo in the city of David, and made darts and shields in abundance.

6. And he set captains of war over the people, and gathered them together to him in the street of the gate of the city, and spake comfortably to them, saying,

7. Be strong and courageous, be not afraid nor dismayed for the king of Assyria, nor for all the multitude that is with him: for there be more with us than with him:

8. With him is an arm of flesh; but with us is the Lord our God to help us, and to fight our battles. And the people rested themselves upon the words of Hezekiah king of Judah.

2 Chron. 32:32. Now the rest of the acts of Hezekiah, and his goodness, behold, they are written in the vision of Isaiah the prophet, the son of Amoz, and in the book of the kings of Judah and Israel.

33. And Hezekiah slept with his fathers, and they buried him in the chiefest of the sepulchres of the sons of David: and all Judah and the inhabitants of Jerusalem did him honour at his death, and Manasseh his son reigned in his stead.

Memory Selection: Our help is in the name of the Lord, who made heaven and earth. Psalm 124:8.

Practical Truth: One must depend upon God at all times, especially in time of need.

COMMENTS AND APPLICATION

"God is our refuge and strength, a very present help in trouble" (Ps. 46:1). Hezekiah was put to it to know what to do in this crisis, but he still had God to help him. Of course he did what he could in stopping the waters without the city, but as to the protection of himself and his realm, he was looking to God. "And for this cause Hezekiah the king, and the prophet Isaiah the son of Amoz, prayed and cried to heaven" (2 Chron. 32:20). God always hears prayer. He may not answer in the way we might expect, but earnest prayer is what God is looking for, and in this case the angel that the Lord sent cut off all the mighty men of valor so that the king of Assyria returned with shame of face to his own land (2 Chron. 32:21). After this, Hezekiah was sick and he prayed to the Lord. He also had pride in his heart" (2 Chron. 32:26). "God left him, to try him, that he might know all that was in his heart" (2 Chron. 32:31).

As God sent the prophet Isaiah in the time of disaster among the people of Judah, so he sends the Lord Jesus to us when we are in distress or in need of special help. So it pays big to put God first in every thing.
