Yield Not To Discouragement

In 2 Chron. 16:9, we read, "For the eyes of the Lord run to and fro throughout the whole earth, to shew himself strong in the behalf of them whose heart is perfect toward him."

The voice of Scripture bears out the fact that any one who retains a perfect heart toward God will never yield to discouragement although they may be called upon by the Lord to go through many severe and fiery trials in life.

Notice what God says about Job: "There was a man in the land of Uz, whose name was Job; and that man was perfect and upright and one that feared God and eschewed [turned from] evil."

God literally turned the devil loose on Job, and he took from him all his property and killed all of his children. Then Job said, "Naked came I out of my mother's womb, and naked shall I return thither: The Lord gave, and the Lord taketh away; blessed be the name of the Lord." Job did not yield to discouragement, but held his unwavering faith in God.

He "did not sin nor charge God foolishly." He proved true to God through this severe test. Then God allowed Satan to touch his bone and flesh, and he smote Job with sore boils from the sole of his foot to the crown of his head. While in this extreme suffering, his wife said unto him, "Dost thou still retain thine integrity? curse God and die." Hear what the man said who had a perfect heart. He did not receive discouragement, but said, "Thou speakest as one of the foolish women speaketh. What? shall we receive good at the hand of God, and shall we not receive Job did not sin in giving way to discouragement. Further along in the 23rd chapter, after he had suffered long in the affliction and his three friends vehemently accused him of doing evil and became miserable comforters to him, he looked to God and for the Lord and could not find him, could get no notice nor word from Him, for he said in the 8th verse, "I go forward, but he is not there; and backward, but I cannot perceive him: On the left hand where he doeth work, but I cannot behold him; he hideth himself on the right hand, that I cannot see him; but he knoweth the way that I take; when he hath tried me I shall come forth as gold." He just would not give way to the sin of discouragement, but held his faith strong in God. He possessed a perfect heart toward God and would not be moved to discouragement which would have put him on the side with Satan against God had he given way to it.

The three Hebrew children would not yield to discouragement when they were faced with the certainty of being thrown into the burning fiery furnace, but they held their faith in God and said to the king, "We are not careful to answer you in this matter. Our God whom we serve is able to deliver us from the burning fiery furnace; but if not, be it known unto thee, O king, that we will not serve thy gods nor worship the golden image which thou hast set up." They absolutely refused to be discouraged about the mat-Through their faithfulness, the king saw the form of the fourth, even Jesus walking with them in the burning fiery furnace. The king spake and blessed the God of the Hebrew children. He was made a believer, which never would have been if the Hebrew children had become discouraged and failed to be true and firm.

Daniel also shewed a perfect heart toward God when he was threatened to be put in the lions' den if he worshiped or asked a petition of any other but the king. It did not discourage him at all, but with his window open, he knelt down with his face toward Jerusalem and prayed three times a day as usual. When they threw him into the lions' den, the Lord sent his angel and shut the lions' mouth, and he was not hurt. Because Daniel would not yield to discouragement, but held his faith in God, King Darius was made a believer in the God of Daniel and proclaimed it so to all the people.

When Paul and Silas were beaten and with bleeding backs thrown into the Philippian jail and their feet fastened in the stocks, did they become discouraged? No; but their hearts were perfect toward God, and they prayed and sang songs in that awful condition. God honored their faith in Him and sent an earthquake. They were loosened and freed, and the jailer and all his house believed and got saved. If they had become discouraged and down-hearted, there would have been no earthquake, and the jailer and his family would not have been saved.

With all the persecutions, revilings, beatings, and being put to death on the cross, Jesus did not get discouraged, but when dying he still loved God and the souls of men, and said, "Father, forgive them, for they know not what they do." Jesus is our example, and we should follow in his steps.

Jonah became discouraged at the thought of going to the great city of Nineveh and preaching to them the gospel that God had given to him. He tried to run away from the Lord, but God knew just where he was. God chastized him by letting a big fish swallow him. He was in much affliction in the fish's belly, the waters compassed him about and the weeds of discouragement were wrapped around his head, and when his soul fainted within him he remembered the Lord. He came to himself and prayed unto the Lord, saying, "They that observe lying vanities forsake their own mercy." When you listen to the lies of Satan and become discouraged, you put yourself on the side of Satan against God, and he cannot have mercy and help you out in that condition. God says, "All things work together for good to them that love God." Rom. 8:28. When you yield to discouragement, by that act you are saying that you do not believe God's Word and you have listened to Satan's lying vanities and put yourself out of the reach of God's mercy until you confess and repent from the heart. When Jonah confessed that he had yielded to lying vanities and repented, the fish got sick and God had it to throw Jonah out on to the dry land.

Many today are doing things that are grievous in God's sight, not only by becoming discouraged, but also in many other ways they will not yield to God as they should, and they bring upon themselves many afflictions. They are, so to speak, in the fish's belly until they are humbled down to the point of confession and repentance and in this way put themselves fully on the side with God so he can have mercy and deliver them as he did Jonah. When you really get

everything clear between you and God, you then can by faith leap right out of the fish's belly and begin to give unto him the sacrifice of praise and thanksgiving due his name.

A discouraged, downhearted man is no witness for God in this world, but is witnessing for Satan, and by his actions is saying that it is a hard way, who can travel with the Lord and be happy and contented? Since God has revealed to me the great wrong of being discouraged, I resist it as from Satan; and as sin that would ruin my soul as other sins would.

Guard Your Sacrifice

We are instructed to present our bodies to God a living sacrifice which is our reasonable service. In olden times when the Jews offered sacrifices to God they were instructed to guard the sacrifice to keep the fowls away. I desire to tell of two especial fowls that you would need to guard against at present lest they steal your sacrifice. The first is a very greedy fowl and is swooping down on the people of God today and robbing them of their spirituality, of the grace of God, and devouring their sacrifice. It is feeding on the very vitals of their souls. It has been devised by the devil in a strong effort to destroy the saints. Its name is-LETHARGY. The devil once tried to destroy the Church of God with the fagot and the sword, but now he is trying to destroy it with a careless indifference. It is a fact that he is having more success in this attempt than in the first. Many a soul today is losing out from God through a cold unconcern. In the days of persecution God's people would go to meeting at the risk of their lives, but now they seem to enjoy going visiting somewhere even more than to meeting, and just a little indisposition of body keeps them at home. In those former days, a Bible was so expensive that the poor could not buy one. Then the saints were glad to get even one page of the blessed Book, and would conceal it somewhere about their clothing and hide away and read it over and over. Now most every one has a Bible, and those who have not can get one for a very small sum, but they have no time to read because they are so taken up with the cares of this life, and of visiting. In those earlier days men and women were put to death for their faith, and the testimony of Jesus Christ. They rejoiced to testify in the face of the flames, to the saving grace of God and of their love for Him. Now you have to wait and insist and beg to get folks to testify to Christ's saving power in a meeting when there is no one to molest them for such a testimony. This spiritual negligence and lethargy is the most deadly weapon the devil ever directed against the people of God.

People can not keep spiritual without great diligence. Read Heb. 6:11, 2 Pet. 3:14. O soul, be diligent. There is no other way to keep spiritual. You can not keep spots off of your soul without great earnestness.

The second fowl that is destroying sacrifices is that of dabbling with things that are questionable. If you are not sure that a certain action is right you had better not do the act until you are sure. If it is a question in your mind as to whether or not it is pleasing to God, go slow. These questionable things are dangerous to our spiritual life. I will relate an incident which occurred during the French and Indian war. An army was encamped on the border of a The guards one night had been placed on woods. duty. When it came time to relieve the first crew of sentinels, the captain took another set of men and started around to the different posts. When he came to one post in the woods the guard was not there. He knew that this man was a dependable one, and he could not believe that the man had deserted his post of duty. He left another guard in his stead. When he came the second time to relieve the guard, the man he had left in the place of the missing one was also missing. The captain was puzzled. He asked who would volunteer to stay on that beat. A man said he would stay and he would shoot the first thing that made its appearance or made a noise in the woods. Toward the end of his watch he heard a noise, and looking in the direction, he saw a hog eating acorns. He gave but little attention to the hog and continued to walk back and forth on his beat.

He noticed that the hog kept getting nearer, but being only a hog it was useless to shoot it. Finally it came quite near. Then he remembered that he had said that he would shoot the first thing that made its appearance. He raised his gun and fired and a big Indian rolled out of the hog skin. The thing looked harmless, but it would have been the death of this soldier as it had the two before if he had not put the thing itself to death. The devil will bring some things around to you in an innocent sort of way, and have them appear very harmless; but, my dear brother, they will get your spiritual life if you give them place. They will rob you of your consecration to God. They will steal away your sacrifice. They will get your soul.

Unanswered Prayer

It has been said by ministers that the Lord will answer YES or NO or WAIT. In the Bible are some examples, as the man who had the legion of devils

cast out. He wanted to go with Jesus but Jesus said NO. "Go home and tell what great things the Lord hath done for thee." You may say, But he answered the request of the devils two times in not sending them into the deep but sending them into the swine. And he granted the request of the people to depart out of their coast, then why not answer the request of this man? Jesus had something better for him, for he opened the way by his testimony, into the hearts of the people to receive Jesus when he returned. Then we have Martha's and Mary's experience, calling for Jesus when their brother was sick, when Jesus said WAIT to them (in his actions if not in words) for he tarried two days before starting to them. they thought he was too late. But this worked out for a greater benefit to all of them—the resurrection of Lazarus. The denial or delay meant more to them than if Jesus would have given or granted their request. God knows best, and we can trust Him to give us what He sees will be best for us.

Then we have Paul as another example. He sought the Lord thrice that he would remove the thorn from his flesh, but God said NO but that His grace was sufficient for Paul. We are told that it worked out for him a far greater weight of glory. Paul said, "When I am weak, then am I strong. My strength is made perfect in weakness." So we need to be submissive to God. When he says NO, just say amen; and when He says WAIT, just say amen, and call on Him for grace to bear anything that will bring more glory to His name. Then I am sure it will work out better for us as it did for Paul and the others. When Jesus says NO, we must trust Him to give us something better, as He did these.

In my own experience the Lord gave me YES for my answer for the healing of my eyes, but also WAIT. I did not realize why at the time, but it has worked out a great benefit spiritually, for which I thank Him. I am still waiting as patiently as I know how, and waiting expectantly. Please pray for me that my faith may not waver. According to the natural, my eyes are getting dimmer, but that does not daunt my faith.

I trust this will be a help to someone to see that our dependence is alone in God and the responsibility rests on us to pray the prayer of faith for ourselves, and not to depend too much on other saints. Whether He says YES, NO, or WAIT, let us trust Him fully and faithfully.

Little Things

Dear young reader, have you ever thought: "How great a matter a little fire kindleth," and "the tongue is a fire" (James 3:5-6)? As fire when seen going astray causes alarm, so words unfitly spoken should. A little unkind thought may grow and cause a few little words spoken in anger to wound a loved one until he (or she) never recovers. Have you thought when you did not like the actions of someone that it may be the reaction of an unkind word you spoke? How many idle words and deeds will be given an account of in the day of judgment (Matt. 12:36)? The little lessons are the hardest to learn. 1 Thess. 12:36 tells us to study to be quiet. For "in the multitude of words there wanteth not sin" Prov. 10:19. "Be still and know that I am God." Psa. 46:10.

In Song of Solomon it is written that the little foxes spoil the vines. Satan does not tempt us to do great big sins until he captures and binds us by little things that annoy every day and sap our spiritual life. If we do unkind things, say unkind words, think unkind thoughts, they will grow and we shall reap the unkindness we have sown.

When we ask God for something, it may be a little thing that keeps the answer from coming as in the case of Naaman when the testimony of a little maid caused him to seek healing for leprosy. When he was told such a little thing to do, he became angry. But healing did not come until he obeyed. 2 Kings 5.

The same spirit that was in Ananias and Sapphira (Acts 5:1-11) is in the world today. This spirit says, "Keep back a little of the truth, a little part due the other party." One man refused to take a nickel back which he received in too much change as a boy. Victory did not come.

If we stay little in our eyes, God can use us. If we get puffed up we may be as Saul. When he was little in his own eyes the Lord anointed him king over Israel (1 Sam. 15:17). After he ruled awhile he fought God, wanted Jonathan to reign instead of David, as God appointed. Chap. 20:30-31. Later he filled a suicide grave (chap. 31:4).

When the widow made Elijah a little cake, there was no way to obtain meal to make more; but she believed God to the saving of her household and the raising of her son from death (1 Kings 17). We will never know the comfort and cheer a word, visit, tele-

phone call, letter, card, or smile has brought to some lonely heart. Jesus honored the widow's mite (Luke 21:1-4).

Prov. 30:24-28 speaks of four little things that are wise. God wants us to be as wise as they. First: As ants, we should prepare in blessings (summer) when things are going well for trials ahead. Second: As conies, we should build our house on the Rock, Christ Jesus. Third: As locusts, we have no earthly king, but the love of God binds us together in one band. Fourth: As spiders, we can carry the gospel to forbidden places through faith in God.

Love is a little word of four letters, but has more compelling power than any other word. God so loved the world that he gave his Son. When we get our hearts filled with God's love for mankind, He will help us to pray, to do, to go, or to send (maybe all) something to help humanity. Most professing Christians know VERY, VERY LITTLE about divine LOVE. Dear young reader, it is our privilege to seek more divine love. It will help us to think of the little things that will help others and do them.

IMPROVEMENT PROJECTS ON NATIONAL **CAMPGROUND**

The 18th annual National Campmeeting of the Church of God which closed on July 31st at Neosho (Monark Springs), Mo. counted the largest attendance so far. On the first Sunday around 500 were in attendance, and between 200 and 300 resided on the grounds throughout the meeting. Facilities on the grounds to care for those attending were taxed almost to the limit, and it was clearly evident in every department that much larger additions and improvements must be made before the meeting next

In the business meeting several improvements were suggested and discussed. The three most urgent needs are as follows: (1) Construction of a wing on east side of tabernacle to provide for more seating capacity. (2) Construction of a mouse and squirrel proof storage room for the tents, mattresses, bedding and cots. (3) Construction of modern, sanitary restrooms, washrooms and showers. By almost a unanimous vote of those attending the business meeting, the last named project for sanitary facilities was expressed to be the most urgently needed. In fact, if the health department would inspect our present facilities, they might close the meeting completely. Therefore, this improvement will be completed first, provided the funds are supplied. This project is the most expensive and is estimated to cost around \$3,000.00. However, if ALL those who attended or are interested in the National Campmeeting will make an offering for these improvements by Nov. 15th this year, they will be ready for use at the next campmeeting. It will be necessary to start the work this autumn in order to complete the project by the proper time.

In 2 Cor. 9:7 the Apostle Paul sets forth a purpose plan in gospel giving. "Every man according as he purposeth in his heart, so let him give; not grudgingly or of necessity: for God loveth a cheerful giver." Saints with a 100 per cent consecration will be listening for the Lord to tell them how much to purpose to give or pledge for these projects in His great cause.

Let us be prompt and send our offerings and pledges as soon as possible to Bro. Ralph Beisly, R. 5, Coffeyville, Kans. The trustees will get the work started on these projects as soon as the means are provided.

COMMENTS AND APPLICATION

"Then Zerubbabel - - and Joshua - - the high priest, with all the remnant of the people, obeyed the voice of their God, and the words of Haggai the prophet, as the Lord their God had sent him, and the people did fear before the Lord" (Hag. 1:12). The Lord said, "Consider your ways" (Hag. 1:5, 7); and Haggai told them the Lord's message - - "I am with you, saith the Lord" (Hag. 1:13). The Lord also told Zechariah to say unto them, "Turn ye unto me, saith the Lord of hosts, and I will turn unto you, saith the Lord of hosts" (Zech. 1:3). "Thus saith the Lord; I am returned to Jerusalem with mercies" (Zech. 1:16), "and the Lord shall yet comfort Zion, and shall yet choose Jerusalem" (Zech. 1:17). These are wonderful promises to the returned who had been captives, but notice the part that they were to take in the matter. They were to turn unto the Lord, and then He could turn to them. We do well to turn as God says, then He can say to us. "I have caused thine iniquity to pass from thee" (Zech. 3:4). Truly it is "not by might, nor by power, but by my spirit, saith the Lord of hosts." What would a Christian do without the Spirit of God? Nothing. Paul says, "Now if any man have not the Spirit of Christ, he is none of his" (Rom. 8:9). That is plain language.

STRUGGLE FOR SURVIVAL

Printed PortionNehemiah 5:6-9, 21-23; 12:27, 43.

Neh. 4:6. So built we the wall; and all the wall was joined together unto the half thereof: for the people had a mind to work.

- 7. But it came to pass, that when Sanballat, and Tobiah, and the Arablans, and the Ammonites, and the Ashdodites, heard that the walls of Jerusalem were made up, and that the breaches began to be stopped, then they were very wroth,
- 8. And conspired all of them together to come and to fight against Jerusalem, and to hinder it.
- 9. Nevertheless we made our prayer unto our God, and set a watch against them day and night, because of them.

- 43. Also that day they offered great sacrifices, and rejoiced: for God had made them rejoice with great joy: the wives also and the children rejoiced: so that the joy of Jerusalem was heard even afar off.

Memory Selection: And they said, Let us rise up and build. So they strengthened their hands for this good work. Nehemiah 2:18.

Practical Truth: Leaders with vision are needed who can inspire others to cooperate in work for the advancement of the kingdom of God..

COMMENTS AND APPLICATION

"The people had a mind to work" (v. 6). Much of the battle of life is to have a decision to make an effort by the help of God. Notice the way Sanballat and Tobiah, the Arabians, Ammonites, and the Ashodites had of expressing their envy and jealousy toward God's work and wanted to hinder it (vs. 7, 8). So they did with our Savior. They delivered him to Pilate because of envy (Matt. 27:18). But Nehemiah was a man of prayer-"Nevertheless we made our prayer unto our God" (v. 9). God brought their council to naught, in answer to their prayer (v. 15). Notice how their enemies worked. To start with they ridiculed God (Neh. 2:19; 4:2-3), then they were going to use violence but Nehemiah prayed (4:8, 11), then they used slander (6:6-7). Intimidation is another way (6:10), but that too was refused by Nehemiah, for God was his helper and he did not need to hide.

The enemy of our souls has many, many ways of trying to get the true Christian to get into his net, but constant prayer to God will give victory in every case. "But thanks be to God, who giveth us the victory through our Lord Jesus Christ" (I Cor. 15:57). "Therefore, my beloved brethren, be ye steadfast, unmoveable, always abounding in the work of the Lord, forasmuch as ye know that your labor is not in vain in the Lord" (I Cor. 15:58).

GOD'S CALL TO RIGHTEOUSNESS

Printed Portion: Malachi 3:1-6, 13-18.

- 1. Behold, I will send my messenger, and he shall prepare the way before me: and the Lord, whom ye seek, shall suddenly come to his temple, even the messenger of the covenant, whom ye delight in: behold, he shall come, saith the Lord of hosts.
- 2. But who may abide the day of his coming? and who shall stand when he appeareth? for he is a refiner's fire, and like fullers' soap:
 - 3. And he shall sit as a refiner and purifier of silver:

and he shall purify the sons of Levi, and purge then as gold and silver, that they may offer unto the Lord an offering in righteousness.

4. Then shall the offering of Judah and Jerusalem be pleasant unto the Lord, as in the days of old, and

as in former years.

- 5. And I will come near to you to judgment; and I will be a swift witness against the sorcerers, and against the adulterers, and against false swearers, and against those that oppress the hireling in his wages, the widow, and the fatherless, and that turn aside the stranger from his right, and fear not me, saith the Lord of
- 6. For I am the Lord, I change not; therefore ye sons of Jacob are not consumed.
- 13. Your words have been stout against me, saith the Lord. Yet ye say, What have we spoken so much against thee?
- 14. Ye have said, It is vain to serve God: and what profit is it that we have kept his ordinance, and that we have walked mournfully before the Lord of hosts?
- 15. And now we call the proud happy; yea, they that work wickedness are set up; yea, they that tempt God are even delivered.
- 16. Then they that feared the Lord spake often one to another; and the Lord hearkened, and heard it, and a book of remembrance was written before him for them that feared the Lord, and that thought upon his name.
- 17. And they shall be mine, saith the Lord of hosts, in that day when I make up my jewels; and I will spare them, as a man spareth his own son that serveth him.
- 18. Then shall ye return, and discern between the righteous and the wicked, between him that serveth God and him that serveth him not.

Memory Selection: Have we not all one father? hath not one God created us? why do we deal treacherously every man against his brother . . .? Mal. 2:10.

Practical Truth:....God has made possible righteous living on part of all, and that is what he expects of us.

COMMENTS AND APPLICATIONS

The dictionary definition of righteousness is "doing what is right". So when God calls for a righteous life he means for us to do right. An effort should be made.

The human is prone to a life of ease, (Amos 6:1) God expects more—we are to seize,

Lay hold upon eternal life, (I Tim. 6:12) The blessings then will be rife.

In order for a man to do right, the Lord must clean out the wrong first. "He shall baptize you with the Holy Ghost, and with fire." (Matt. 3:11) Fire is needed to burn out the dross and take away everything that is offensive to a righteous and holy God. That is the only remedy for anyone, "For all have sinned and come short of the glory of God" (Rom. 3:23). The prophet asks the question, "But who may abide the day of his coming?" (v. 2) "He shall sit as a refiner and purifier" v. 3. So then as gold is tried in the fire to bring out the pure gold, the Christian is also put through trials and tests in this life for without holiness no man shall see the Lord (Heb. 12:14). As Judah tried to excuse themselves in the time of Malachi, so there are many today trying to excuse themselves; but God is still looking down and knows the thoughts and intents of the heart (Heb. 4:12). He sees those who actually

serve him (Mal. 3:18).

NEW RESPECTS FOR GOD'S LAW September 25, 1955

Printed Portion:..... Ezekiel 20:19-20; Neh. 9:1-3; 10:32, 35, 39,

Ezekiel 20:19. I am the Lord your God; walk in my

statutes, and keep my judgments, and do them;
20. And hallow my sabbaths; and they shall be a sign between me and you, that ye may know that I am the Lord your God.

Neh. 9:1. Now in the twenty and fourth day of this month the children of Israel were assembled with fasting, and with sackclothes, and earth upon them.

- 2. And the seed of Israel separated themselves from all strangers, and stood and confes ed their sins, and the iniquities of their fathers.
- 3. And they stood up in their place, and read in the book of the law of the Lord their God one fourth part of the day; and another fourth part they confessed, and worshipped the Lord their God.

Neh. 10:32. Also we made ordinances for us, to change ourselves yearly with the third part of a shekel for the service of the house of our God;

- 35. And to bring the firstfruits of our ground, and the firstfruits of all fruit of all trees, year by year, unto the house of the Lord:
- 37. And that we should bring the firstfruits of our dough, and our offerings, and the fruit of all manner of trees, of wine and of oil, unto the priests, to the chambers of the house of our God; and the tithes of our ground unto the Levites, that the same Levites might have the tithes in all the cities of our tillage.
- 39. For the children of Israel and the children of Levi shall bring the offering of the corn, of the new wine, and the oil, unto the chambers, where are the vessels of the sanctuary, and the priests that minister, and the porters, and the singers: and we will not forsake the house of our God.

Memory Selection: I am the Lord your God; walk in my statutes, and keep my judgments, and do them. Ezekiel 20:19.

Practical Truth: Diligent attention to God's Word will result in spiritual quickening.

COMMENTS AND APPLICATIONS

We have another lesson on the "do" part of our obligation to Almighty God. This part of that lesson cannot be overemphasized for God has a right to tell us what to do, that we may be pleasing in His sight. Our memory selection is quite in keeping with the vows made by the people at that time when they heard the law and made preparations to obey. Truly, we as Christians need to obey God's law as well as have faith.

James in the 2nd chapter enlarges upon the works and faith of a Christian. Truly, we prove ourselves by what we do. It is a good thing to have daily Bible reading, with a determination to do daily the things we read. The Holy Spirit can teach us all things (John 14:26) and help us understand what we read, so that he can apply it to our soul as the living Word of God.

Evidently the Holy Spirit was at work here in Nehemiah the 9th chapter when they had fasting and sackcloth and earth upon them showing their true devotion and then making confession of their sins, and the iniquity of their fathers. Such work of humility before God is bound to produce results. God is looking for those that will do so. "To this man will I look, even to him that is poor and of a contrite spirit, and trembleth at my word. Isa. 66:2.
