Childlikeness With God

A writing of Brother C. E. Orr's "Except ye be converted and become as little children, ye shalt not enter the kingdom of heaven."

Matt. 18:3. Blessed is the man who is childlike with God. God is a Father to His children and it pleases Him to have them regard Him as such. A father who is able will supply the needs of his child and desires the child to rely upon him fully to do so. All are ready to acknowledge that God is able, but not all have the childlike trust and reliance. It is not so difficult for God's children to trust in Him in the greater things and needs of life as it is in the little things, but this is the opposite of childlikeness. A child looks to the father for help in all the little things. If it has a tangle in the string and cannot get it out it soon goes to father or mother for help. God wants us to be just that childlike with Him.

God has promised to supply your every need. Read Matt. 6:33; Heb. 13:5-6; Phil. 4:19. Do not these promises include the little needs as well as the greater ones? If you had a cancer on your body you would trust God to heal you. If you had need of two cents to buy a postage stamp, do you in childlikeness, take this need to God in prayer? To be childlike with God is to take all the little needs of everyday life to Him in prayer. A brother was walking along the streets of Chicago carrying a bundle. The bundle came undone. He was in need of a string. He asked the Lord to get him a string, and on casting his eye along the sidewalk, there lay, only a few feet away. just the string he needed. A sister lost her scissors. She asked her heavenly Father to help her find them and found them immediately. At one time a brother owed a debt of 75 cents. He prayed earnestly that he might have that amount by the time he promised to pay it. While walking across a field soon after, he found a one dollar gold piece. Some one might ask how came the gold piece to be there, but this did not concern the brother any more than how came the coin in the mouth of the fish that Peter caught. Just a week ago a brother lost the key to his car and also the one to his mail box, as they were both on the same ring. He prayed the Lord to help him find them, but he did not find them at once. The night following the loss he prayed on awakening in the night that God would help him to find the keys. Then came to his mind the thought, "Does God concern Himself with so small a matter?" He then remembered such texts as "the hairs of your head are all numbered;" "if we give a cup of cold water we shall be rewarded," and many other similar texts, and a sweet consciousness that God did concern Himself in such matters, came into his soul. The next morning he found the keys when not actually looking for them and in a place where he would not have looked for them. After finding them he remembered laying them there.

To have this childlike reliance and familiarity with God makes everyday life sweet and precious. It is needful, however, that we beware lest we get fanatical and presumptious. Wise parents will let their children go to the limit of their ability to untangle their own thread. God will be careful not to encourage indolence or neglect in His children. He will help them to meet all their promises and obligations if made in His order. Those who are contracting debts here and there and making failure after failure to pay when due, have not learned the precious secret of childlikeness with God. They are leaving God out of life. "Consider what I say and the Lord give thee understanding."

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EDITORIALS

"We know that whosoever is born of God for born from above] sinneth not; but he that is begotten of God keepeth himself, and that wicked one toucheth him not. And we know that we are of God, and the whole world lieth in wickedness." 1 John 5:18, 19, In these two verses we have the sacred and eternal Word of God delivered to us. The first thought in these two verses of holy writ make us know that if we are of God we do not sin. A person who is committing sin is not of God even though he might profess to be of God. He may even be a preacher but not one sent of God. He who is committing sin has no life of God in his soul. To profess to be the Lord's while in a sinning state will not only be deceiving your own soul but also all that hear you. Joining and being in good standing with any of the many humanly organized churches will save no man's soul. You will have to personally and individually know that your soul has been begotten of God and His life has become your life. There is no such thing as a sinning Christian in the family of God which constitutes His Body, the Church.

The second thought in these two verses is that we are to be begotten of God. To be begotten of God has a thousand times stronger meaning than just merely water baptism. Water baptism can save no soul only in a figurative sense, and that figure tells a lie unless you have been begotten of God. To be begotten of God means a spiritual birth. It means that you have been born of the Father of Spirits and are His child and thereby inherit His love and care in this world and eternal inheritance with Him in the glory world. This is why Paul in Eph. 5:30, says, "For we are members of his body, of his flesh, and of his bones." Spiritually speaking we are connected with him even as man and wife are bound together.

The next thought is that we are diligent to keep ourselves in His loving ways and receive His grace and attention so that the wicked one cannot and does not touch us or move us to sin or to do evil. In the 19th verse the thought is that we cast aside all doubt and fear and know that we are of God. Then from this blood sheltered protection of God we look out on the world of people and see the whole world lying in wickedness, and also a multitude of professed church members. Satan has thousands of preachers in the world by whom he is telling the people that they cannot live free from sin in this world; and thus they put the lie on God as though Satan had more power than God and we would have to sin, for God has no power to keep us from sinning. Shame on the devil's preachers. They surely do need to be begotten of God so they could come in contact with the greater power.

Liquor and tobacco advertising, shooting, robbery and murder are very prominently displayed, so we are told by those who have made investigation. People who live in a house with the tail of the serpent protruding from its roof are being poisoned day by day. The children growing up under such environment will have their minds and hearts so filled with evil and wicked things that it will be almost impossible for God to get any sober, heavenly thoughts into their minds. Oh, the shame of this wicked generation of unbelievers! This year of 1958 will no doubt go down on record with more crimes committed by teenagers than any previous year. As the children read its contents, the Spirit of God has a chance to stamp the truth upon their tender minds to stay with them through life. This paper is sent out every quarter and the cost is only 60 cents a year, or five papers or more to one address is only 40 cents for each paper per year. Every child should have this paper to read each week. Some adults have been saved through reading it.

Pray for us as we labor on for the Lord. We expect to keep at it until the Lord says, "It is enough, come up higher."

Now to purify means to cleanse, and so there must have been something there that had to be cleansed out of the heart in sanctification, or the Word of God would not have said so. Dear ones, there are other Scriptures that bear this out also. We believe that in justification all our actual sins that we have committed are all washed away with the precious blood of Jesus, and that in sanctification the Holy Ghost, through the blood of Jesus, comes in and cleanses away that old Adamic nature that we are not responsible for, and then gives us power to live a holy life. Heb. 10:14, "For by one offering he hath perfected for ever them that are sanctified."

THE CHURCH OF GOD

Who Organizes The Church?

The word "organize" is not in the scriptures. It is defined in the dictionary as follows: "To furnish with organs; to arrange in parts; to form in due order."

God's church is furnished with organs, arranged in parts, and in due order; hence, is an organic structure. But who is the organizer of the same? Who furnishes it with organs? Answer: "For to one is given by the Spirit the word of wisdom; to another the word of knowledge by the same Spirit; to another faith by the same Spirit; to another the gifts of healing by the same Spirit; to another the working of miracles; to another prophecy; to another discerning of spirits; to another divers kinds of tongues; to another the interpretation of tongues; but all these worketh that one and the selfsame Spirit, dividing to every man severally as he will."—1 Cor. 12:8-11.

"Now ye are the body of Christ, and members in particular. And God hath set some in the church, first apostles, secondarily prophets, thirdly teachers, after that miracles, then gifts of healing, helps, governments, diversities of tongues."—Verses 27, 28.

Other scriptures also show the harmonizing of the body of Christ, by the hand of God and through the Spirit. But those given above are sufficient. One thing, however, we mention, and that is, the laying on of hands by the elders in ordaining elders, etc. That this pertains to the organization of the church, we freely allow. But it is never called organizing the church. God ordains by way of qualifying and choosing, and his ministers ordain in the sense of recognizing the divine call, and dedicating thereunto. This order is clearly seen in Acts 13:1-4.

Succession of authority down through a course of ecclesiastical lords is all a superstitious delusion; a dragon power. Those whom God saves, baptizes with power, and commissions by the Holy Spirit have the only ecclesiastical authority instituted of God, and this comes direct from heaven, and not through any imaginary line of predecessors.

Voting for officers only belongs to Babylon formality, where God is not present to work "all in all," by the selfsame Spirit, dividing to every man severally as he wills.

The church, then, is organized by the Lord, who sets all the members in the body as it pleases him, and distributes the gifts and callings by his own wisdom to all the members of the body. Men may organize a human compact, but never the divine body of Christ, which is the church. Thus said the Lord: "And who, as I, shall call, and shall declare it, and set it in order for me, since I appointed the ancient people? and the things that are coming, and shall come, let them show unto them."—Isa. 44:7.

This is to the point. God himself "appointed the ancient people" to their several places in the body, and who will now presume to take upon himself the prerogative of the Almighty? "Every man is brut-

ish by his knowledge; every founder is confounded by the graven image: for his molten image is falsehood, and there is no breath in them. They are vanity, the work of errors; in the time of their visitation they shall perish. The portion of Jacob is not like them; for he is the former of all things: and Israel is the rod of his inheritance; the Lord of hosts is his name."—Jer. 51:17-19.

The sect-founders are confounded, because their structures "have no breath"—no life. They call them churches, but it "is falsehood," the work of error. But God's true church is the former of all things, the primitive church that Jesus bought with his own blood, and built before the rise of the first sect of the apostasy.

He that builds a house organizes the same. But if other men were to come and saw the same house into four parts, and throw each off its foundation, such work would be disorganizing the building, and destroying the same. Just so, should God, by the pure Word and Spirit, fully save, say four hundred souls in one city, he would organize and temper all together in one body. But should four preachers, representing as many sects, each form his schismatic organism there of equal members, each would have the impudence to report to his conference that he had organized a church there of one hundred members, while the facts would be, they, like the parties cleaving the house asunder, would really disorganize and disintegrate the church. Thus, we see that the organizing sects, the work of men, is the disorganizing of the church, which is built of God. then, the church is organized by the Lord, it follows that all so-called churches organized by men, lack the authentic seal of God, and are not his church, but unscriptural schisms.

From these and other scriptures, we see that the church is God's family, or household. And, since a man can have only one family, it follows that God has but one church. It would be an awful reflection on the holiness of God to have many wives and separate rival families, and they of the "nude and lude" character Bishop Foster ascribes to the modern sects. Therefore the multiplicity of sects, falsely called churches, are not God's church.

Does The Bible Teach The Unity of All Believers?

Yes. "Holy Father, keep through thine own name those whom thou hast given me, that they may be one, as we are. While I was with them in the world, I kept them in thy name."—Jno. 17:11, 12.

"Neither pray I for these alone, but for them also which shall believe on me through their word: that they all may be one; as thou, Father, art in me, and I in thee, that they also may be one in us: that the world may believe that thou hast sent me. And the glory which thou gavest me I have given them; that they may be one, even as we are one: I in them, and thou in me: that they may be made perfect in one; and that the world may know that thou hast sent me, and hast loved them, as thou hast loved me."—John 17:20-23.

"Now I beseech you, brethren, by the name of our Lord Jesus Christ, that ye all speak the same thing, and that there be no division among you; but that ye be perfectly joined together in the same mind and in the same judgment."—1 Cor. 1:10.

"For ye are all one in Christ Jesus."—Gal. 3:28. "Only let your conversation be as it becometh the gospel of Christ: that whether I come and see you, or else be absent, I may hear of your affairs, that ye stand fast in one spirit, with one mind striving together for the faith of the gospel." Phil. 1:27.

"Fulfill ye my joy, that ye be like-minded, having the same love, being of one accord, of one mind."
—Phil. 2:2.

"Now the God of patience and consolation grant you to be like-minded one toward another according to Jesus Christ: that ye may with one mind and one mouth glorify God, even the Father of our Lord Jesus Christ."—Rom. 15:5, 6.

"The multitude of them that believed were of one heart, and of one soul."—Acts 4:32.

Can anybody look upon this picture and not see an awful contrast between it and the dark picture of the present-day sect confusion? Do the members of the different sects have the same care one for another? Behold, they are not of one mind, nor of one judgment; they are not one in name, nor creed, nor body; they are not of one heart, nor of one soul, nor of one spirit, nor yet of one faith; they have not one mouth, nor do they speak the same things. They are never one, except it be in opposing Bible salvation. As God confounded the babel-builders, and they all became divided, and of different tongues, so he has sent his thunderbolts of wrath upon Rome, the mother of harlots, and has knocked off several hundred Protestant fragments, each one of which speaks the peculiar dialect of its creed. The church, compared with a human body, is required to have but one mouth, which means perfect harmony in all her teaching. If we were to allow that the multiplicity of sects are the church, then a human monstrosity, having several hundred mouths, and every mouth speaking contrary to every other mouth, would be necessary to symbolize it. As the body of Christ has but one mouth and speaks the same things, it is very evident that the jargon confusion of sect tongues does not represent his body, and is not his church.

What Experience Perfects Us In Oneness?

Ans. Entire sanctification, or perfection.

In connection with his prayer for oneness, the Savior prayed the Father to sanctify the disciples, and all that would believe on him through their word, which includes us. "And the glory which thou gavest me I have given them; that they may be one even as we are one: I in them, and thou in me, that they may be made perfect in one."—John 17:22, 23. Sanctification, perfection, and the glory of Christ, all relate to the same experience, and this makes God's children one. "For both he that sanctifieth and they who are sanctified are all of one: for which cause he is not ashamed to call them brethren."—Heb. 2:11.

"And he gave some, apostles; and some, prophets; and some, evangelists; and some, pastors and teachers; for the perfecting of the saints, for the work of the ministry, for the edifying of the body of Christ: till we all come in the unity of the faith, and of the knowledge of the Son of God, unto a perfect man, unto the measure of the stature of the fullness of Christ."—Eph. 4:11-13.

"Forasmuch as ye know that ye were not redeemed with corruptible things, as silver and gold, from your vain conversation received by tradition from your fathers; but with the precious blood of Christ, as of a lamb without blemish and without spot."—1 Pet. 1:18, 19.

The salvation of the Lord, which qualifies us for heaven, makes us one on earth. A religion of divisions will deceive the soul. The chief object of God's ministers is to "perfect the saints." And when perfected in love and holiness, they come into the "unity of the faith which was once delivered unto all the saints." The blood of Christ not only purifies from "all sin" and "all unrighteousness," but also sweeps away all erroneous doctrines. The Comforter guides into all truth, which involves the removal of all error. It is true that cleansing from error is not as instantaneous as from sin. But the pure in heart have perfect fellowship, even though all previously educated errors have not yet disappeared. There is therefore no real cause of division but sin. Therefore to cry against sects and divisions without first being wholly sanctified, and then leading people into this precious paradise of holy love, is nothing but confusion mocking confusion; or Satan buffeting Satan, as the devil flogged the sons of Sceva. All efforts of union but that of God's holiness is like pounding cold crooked pieces of iron against each other to make them fit together. The more blows the more crooks and differences. Put them into a furnace of white heat, and they will lose their cold, stiff, crooked individuality, and flow into one mass. That is God's way of uniting his people, in the fire of the Holy Spirit. All tinkering up platforms of union is wasted time. Each effort has only molded another sect calf for the people to worship and wrangle over. Freedom from sin knits together in love. But all merely strapped-up unions are bundles bound together to be burned. Bible salvation is all that is needed. This obtained, both union of heart and soul, and harmony in outward worship and life, will follow as a result or fruit of the Spirit. When "baptized by one Spirit into the one body," and made to drink in the one divine Spirit in his fullness, there will be no trouble to "worship God in Spirit and in truth." For all such "know the truth, and the truth makes them free." On the plane of Bible holiness, no outward observances are made a test, in fact nothing is made a test of fellowship. For holy men "judge not from appearance, but judge righteous judgment." "If we walk in the light, as he is in the light, we have fellowship one with another, and the blood of Jesus Christ his Son cleanseth us from all sin."-1 Jno. 1:7. Fellowship is of the Spirit (Phil. 2:1), and exists where heart-purity exists. It

is the conscious blending of hearts filled with the same holy Spirit. One may have been led into all truth, the other not. This does not interrupt fellowship. Nevertheless it is the duty of such as "know the truth," in meekness to instruct others who do not. Ignorance of some truth does not destroy fellowship, but resisting the truth does; because it forfeits salvation. We must not sanction people's errors, but if saved, show our love and fellowship to them, so long as they do not get the evidence that their wrong doctrines have become wilful, or they have in some way lost salvation. Then fellowship ends, but love and kindness still continue in faithful efforts for their salvation. To ignore fellowship simply because of some doctrinal error is bigotry. To agree to disagree, or to put on an equality truth and error, is babel confusion. To know the truth is our privilege; to teach the truth, our duty; but to have fellowship with the pure and upright of heart is an involuntary and spontaneous fact. Sects are the result of carnality; nothing but perfect holiness destroys carnality, and thus removes both sectism and its cause. The fire of God's love saves the soul, harmonizes all hearts that receive it, leads them into perfect and uniform obedience to all truth, and drives afar all who refuse to pass through its purging fire, and gain the plane of holy fellowship.

A beautiful, intelligent young lady went to a tent meeting where the power of God was present. Sinners were being saved and saints being edified. The Spirit of God brought conviction to this young woman and tears began to flow down her cheeks. She wiped them away with her handkerchief.

Her father, a wealthy farmer, stood on the outside with others. He looked across the tent and saw his daughter weeping. He remarked to a friend: "If my daughter goes to the front I will wade blood to my neck to take her out of there." But a young man was standing by her side and she did not go that night. The father got into his auto and drove home, and the young man took the young lady home in the buggy. When she got inside she saw him-a big, 240 pound father-walking the floor, and she knew that something was wrong. She said, "Papa, what is the matter with you? Why are you not in bed?" answered, "I have stayed up to give you your orders." She asked, "Papa, what in the world have I done?" He replied, "I looked across that tent tonight and I saw you weeping, saw you have your handkerchief up to your eyes. May, if you go to that front altar, I will wade through blood to my neck to take you out of there; and when I get you home, I will wear out a hickory over your back."

He put it down so strong that she knew he meant what he said. She began to weep and went to her room, and there in the darkness she settled it that she would not go with God. She closed her fists and said: "Oh, God, I will never seek Thee! Take this feeling away from me! Oh, God, lighten my heart! I do not want to feel this way. I will never seek Thee! She had been in bed three days, when, on Thursday afternoon, she sent for her mother to come up, and said, "Mamma, I am sure that you and papa do not know my condition, and I want you to send for a doctor. I am in an awful condition and I am going to die." The mother was excited, and said, "I will, I will!"

She had the family physician come, and he felt her pulse and took her temperature. He touched the big, strong father on the shoulder and asked him to come outside to the automobile. He loved the family. They had been kind to him. He said, "You have been true to me, and I must be true to you. You have called me too late. Your daughter will soon be in eternity, and if you have anything to tell her, tell her at once. It is no use for me to tell you that I can help her, or to call for more doctors. In a few hours she will be gone." Listen! The neighbors a mile away heard that father. What do you suppose was the first thing he thought of? I know-the night that he conquered his daughter and made her settle with God. He left the automobile and came in wringing his hands. He fell at her bedside and said, "Oh, May! Oh, May! Seek the Lord, May, pray! Give your heart to God! Pray, May, pray!" She put her hand on his face and said, "Papa, please do not taunt me with the Name of God-please do not mention His Name to me. My heart has been like a stone since the night you gave me my orders. I went to my room, and I asked God to leave me, and God took me at my word."

Then she told him that she was conscious that her doom was sealed, and that from the beginning of her illness she knew she was going to die. She said, "Papa, what time is it?" He answered, "Four o'clock in the afternoon." She said, "How slowly these hours are passing away! But, just think! I am going to a place where there is no time."

Printed PortionMark 9:14-29

- 14 And when he came to his disciples, he saw a great multitude about them, and the scribes questioning with them.
- 15. And straightway all the people, when they beheld him, were greatly amazed, and running to him saluted him.
- 16. And he asked the scribes, What question ye with them?
- 17. And one of the multitude answered and said, Master, I have brought unto thee my son, which hath a dumb spirit;
- 18. And wheresoever he taketh him, he teareth him: and he foameth, and gnasheth with his teeth, and pineth away: and I spake to thy disciples that they should cast him out; and they could not.
- 19. He answereth him, and saith, O faithless generation, how long shall I be with you? how long shall I suffer you? bring him unto me.
- 20. And they brought him unto him: and when he saw him, straightway the spirit tare him; and he fell on the ground, and wallowed foaming.
- 21. And he asked his father, How long is it ago since this came unto him? And he said, Of a child.
- 22. And ofttimes it hath cast him into the fire, and into the waters, to destroy him: but if thou canst do any thing, have compassion on us, and help us.
- 23. Jesus said unto him, If thou canst believe, all things are possible to him that believeth.

Practical Truth: Unusual results may be expected when faith in God is strong.

COMMENTS AND APPLICATION

When Jesus and three of His disciples came down from the mountain where He was transfigured and had talked with Moses and Elias, they were faced with a situation which had baffled the other disciples. This indeed seemed to the nine to be a hopeless case. But no situation is too great for Jesus to take care of. Jesus is the one we must have on hand when any need arises. Paul affirmed this when he said, "I can do all things through Christ which strengtheneth me." Phil. 4:13. The lack of Jesus' presence and power caused the disciples to stand helpless in the face of evil forces that had possession of this boy.

Jesus saw a lack of faith in the disciples and also the father. Notice the father said, "If thou canst." Jesus said, "If thou canst believe." Too often we expect others

to exercise all the faith for us, do all the fasting, and get under the burden, but Jesus let this father know that "All things are possible to him that believeth." How often through the ministry of Jesus we hear him say, "Thy faith hath made thee whole." "As they went they were made clean." "He went his way, ... washed, and came seeing." "According to your faith be it unto you."

Notice that Jesus said that some cases need fasting and prayer before help is received.

JESUS DEMANDS COMPLETE COMMITMENT

Printed PortionMark 10:17-27

- 17. And when he was gone forth into the way, there came one running, and kneeled to him, and asked him, Good Master, what shall I do that I may inherit eternal life?
- 18. And Jesus said unto him, Why callest thou me good? there is none good but one, that is, God.
- 19. Thou knowest the commandments, Do not commit adultery, Do not kill, Do not steal, Do not bear false witness, Defraud not, Honour thy father and mother.
- 20. And he answered and said unto him, Master, all these have I observed from my youth.

Practical Truth: Being a real Christian involves giving ourselves unreservedly to Christ and following Him.

COMMENTS AND APPLICATION

We do appreciate how this man showed his earnestness and great desire to inherit eternal life in hurrying to Jesus and kneeling before Him, thus recognizing Him to be the One who could help him. We love to see people come to Jesus, but it is sad when we read how this man was not willing to do all that Jesus asked of Him. How true it is today with people who start out for God with great zeal but then soon they begin to cool off. What is the matter? God has required of them something they are not willing to measure to. One brother, the other night, said he lost out with the Lord because he wasn't willing to pray in public. Oh, God is calling for all. He is wanting us to love Him with all our heart, soul, mind, and strength.

It seemed this man was a good, moral man. Jesus loved the good He saw in him. It pleases God for people to use the will power God has given them to refrain from doing evil, but that will not save. Jesus says, "Ye must be born again." He told this young man to "sell, give, come, take up the cross, and follow me." This was the cost that was too great for him to pay. Great joy was just in reach of him but self got in the way. Eternal life was his, only for the doing. "If ye be willing and obedient, ye shall eat the good of the land." Isa. 1:19. God has good things in store for all who will surrender all to Him. Notice how Jesus said not to trust in riches.

JESUS EMPHASIZES THE COST OF GREATNESS

- 35. And James and John, the sons of Zebedee, come unto him, saying, Master, we would that thou shouldest do for us whatsoever we shall desire.
- 36. And he said unto them, What would ye that I should do for you?
- 37. They said unto him, Grant unto us that we may sit, one on thy right hand, and the other on thy left hand, in thy glory.

Practical Truth: The kind of greatness which is real in God's sight is within our reach.

COMMENTS AND APPLICATION

God does not measure greatness like the people of the world, or even as we might. Some may think the greatest person is the one who is always a leader in doing things or who is always up before the people. Jesus says, "the chiefest shall be the servant of all." Those who are busy doing the little things, speaking words of cheer and comfort here and there, working in the unseen places or doing what others will not do, are often blessed in a greater measure in their souls than those who seem to be on the surface doing a lot for God. In a building, the unseen parts are what support the seen. Many a prayer warrior, is the cause of great things being accomplished for God. It may be that no one knows how much they pray. How happy it makes me feel when someone tells me they are praying for me. Without prayer nothing can be accomplished for God. It is only when God works through us that any good will be done. If we do in our own wisdom or strength, nothing will be accomplished. We need to

care for others more than ourself. We must be dependable, follow the leadership of the Spirit, be loyal, and be humble.

The poet said, "He drank the whole cup while we took but one sup." Jesus suffered but we, too, must be willing to suffer with Him. We are "Joint-heirs with Christ, IF SO BE that we SUFFER with him." Rom. 8:17. James drank of the cup. He was killed with the sword. John was cast on the Isle of Patmos. Are we willing to "drink of the cup?"

JESUS REVEALS HIS AUTHORITY

- 12. And Jesus went into the temple of God, and cast out all them that sold and bought in the temple, and overthrew the tables of the moneychangers, and the seats of them that sold doves,
- 13. And said unto them, It is written, My house shall be called the house of prayer; but ye have made it a den of thieves.
- 23. And when he was come into the temple, the chief priests and the elders of the people came unto him as he was teaching, and said, By what authority doest thou these things? and who gave thee this authority?
- 24. And Jesus answered and said unto them, I also will ask you one thing, which if ye tell me, I in like wise will tell you by what authority I do these things.
- 25. The baptism of John, whence was it? from heaven, or of men? And they reasoned with themselves, saying, If we shall say, From heaven; he will say unto us, Why did ye not then believe him?
- 26. But if we shall say, Of then; we fear the people; for all hold John as a prophet.
- 27. And they answered Jesus, and said, We cannot tell. And he said unto them, Neither tell I you by what authority I do these things.

Memory Verse: He taught them as one having authority. Matt. 7:29.

Practical Truth: Christ's divine right to command us should result in careful obedience on our part.

COMMENTS AND APPLICATION

The people were astonished at the authority of Jesus. No doubt many of those in authority desired to see the traffickers driven out of the temple but lacked the influence and grace. Jerome, an early church father, said that of all the signs of Jesus' career, to him this was the the most wonderful—that singlehanded and in spite of the opposition of the authorities, Jesus could have driven out so large a crowd of traffickers, which feat scarcely a whole troop of soldiers could have accomplished. This act displeased the chief priests because of jealousy and their pride being injured at someone else doing something they could not do themselves. Do we, today, rejoice when we see God using others? Then are we better than the chief priests and elders? God help us.

Jesus did not answer the question concerning His authority. But we know his authority over man and all things is well-founded. He is the Son of God, and as such, all things have been put under His feet (Eph. 1:22). He is the Creator. "Without him was not anything made that was made." John 1:3. Jesus is all-powerful. "All power is given unto me in heaven and in earth." Matt. 28:18. God has authority over us but we being created as free-moral agents, have the same choice as the men in our lesson. We can submit to it or reject it.
